Henderson rushed for 232 yards, including touchdown runs of 54 and 61 yards, in Memphis' 59-22 win against Georgia State. Henderson had his second straight 200-yard game.

**Blake Barnett • USF • Jr. • QB • Corona, Calif.**  
Barnett engineered USF's come-from-behind win against Illinois as he threw two fourth-quarter touchdown passes as part of a 411-yard performance that ranks second on the school's single-game chart.

## Three For Three

The American Athletic Conference, the Big Ten and the Big 12 are the only conferences that have had at least three 10-win teams in each of the last two seasons.

## Perfect 10

The American Athletic Conference has had three 10-win teams in each of the last two seasons. USF, Temple, Tulsa hit double figures in 2016, while UCF, Memphis and USF won at least 10 games each in 2017.

## Ground And Pound

The American Athletic Conference has two of the top five rushing leaders in this week's NCAA FBS ranking. Navy is second nationally at 358.0 rushing yards per game, while Memphis is fourth at 322.3 ypg.

## Ground And Pound (Part II)

Memphis RB Darrell Henderson leads the nation in rushing yards, averaging 173.7 yards per game. Navy QB Malcolm Perry is third nationally at 165.7 ypg.

## Any Way You Want It

UCF ranks second nationally in total offense, averaging 609.0 yards per game. Cincinnati ranks third nationally in scoring defense, allowing an average of 228.7 yards.

## Only 17

Cincinnati has held each of its first three opponents to 17 points or fewer, matching its total from last season.

## Road Warriors

Navy will travel 26,496 miles for its eight games away from Annapolis this season, the most mileage for any college football team in the continental United States.

## Matters Of Efficiency

Memphis scored touchdowns on its first eight possessions in its 66-14 win against Mercer. UConn scored touchdowns on its first six drives in its win against Rhode Island, while Cincinnati scored TDs on its first six possessions in its win against Alabama A&M.

## The Closers

Houston scored the last 28 points of the game in its 45-27 win against Rice. Tulsa scored the final 14 points of its 38-27 win against Central Arkansas. USF, meanwhile had the last 21 points of its 49-38 win against Georgia Tech and the last 18 points of its 25-19 win at Illinois.

## Separation Of Powers

In the last four regular seasons (2015-18), the American Athletic Conference is a combined 33-12 against teams from Conference USA, the MAC, the Mountain West and the Sun Belt.

## Repeat Performances

For the second consecutive season, The American is the only FBS conference to return its players of the year on offense (UCF QB McKenzie Milton), defense (Houston DT Ed Oliver) and special teams (Memphis WR Tony Pollard).

## Including Postseason

Including bowl games, The American has had a combined 62 games with more than one million television and streaming viewers since the start of the 2015 season. Cincinnati's win at UCLA in Week 1 was the first such game of the 2018 season.

## Heisman Hopefuls

UCF and Houston have launched formal Heisman Trophy campaigns on behalf of their most prominent players. Here is a look at how each has fared in 2018.

### McKenzie Milton • QB • UCF

Finished eighth in the Heisman voting in 2017. Of the seven players who finished higher in the voting, only Stanford RB Bryce Love (second) and Wisconsin RB Jonathan Taylor (sixth) return in 2018

Has completed 45 of 71 passes (63.4 percent) for 589 yards and six touchdowns and three interceptions.

### Ed Oliver • DT • Houston

Consensus All-America and Outland Trophy winner in 2017.

Tabbed as the No. 1 player in college football by ESPN, CBS Sports and Sports Illustrated

Has 24 tackles, 5.0 tackles for loss, six quarterback hurries and two passes defended in three games.

## Fifth Anniversary Team

Twenty-two players on NFL rosters are among the 30 current and former American Athletic Conference players who have been named to the American Athletic Conference Fifth Anniversary Football Team.



Voting for the team was conducted in late June and early July. The team was selected based on three components – a fan vote, a vote of local and national media members, and a vote of the conference's 12 football programs.

- UCF had 316 rushing yards against South Carolina State. Seven players finished with at least 33 rushing yards.
- The shutout of South Carolina State was UCF's first whitewash since another 38-0 win against the Bulldogs Sept. 3, 2016.
- UCF has converted 67 percent of its third down opportunities through two games (16 of 24).

- USF has gained at least 400 yards of offense in 12 consecutive games.

Thursday's game will be the fifth meeting between Tulsa and Tulane in a series that began in 1987 ... Tulsa won back-to-back meetings in 1987 and 1988, but Temple has taken the last two, including a 43-22 decision last season ... # COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is a big success. Fans, including many who are new to the sport, enjoy it. The first College Football Playoff semifinals and national championship were the three most-viewed programs in cable television history.

## Every Game Counts

The playoff preserves the excitement and significance of college football's unique regular season where every game counts.

## Four Teams

The selection committee ranks the teams based on the members' evaluation of the teams' performance on the field, using conference championships won, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, and comparison of results against common opponents to decide among teams that are comparable.

## Two Games, One Goal

The kickoff of the new year belongs to college football, with two semifinal games rotating annually among the Cotton Bowl, Fiesta Bowl, Orange Bowl, Peach Bowl, Rose Bowl and Sugar Bowl. The two teams winning the playoff semifinals compete for the College Football Playoff National Championship. That game is in a different city each year, always on a Monday night.

## Universal Access

Every FBS team has equal access to the College Football Playoff based on its performance. No team automatically qualifies.

## Governance

University presidents and chancellors from all 10 FBS conferences and Notre Dame serve on the CFP Board of Managers and govern the administrative operations, with commissioners (the Management Committee) managing the event. A small staff in the playoff office in Irving, Texas, carries out the detailed responsibilities.

## Selection Committee

A talented group of high-integrity individuals with experience as coaches, student-athletes, college administrators and journalists, along with sitting athletics directors, comprise the selection committee. Members of the committee are: Rob Mullens (chair), Frank Beamer, Paola Boivin, Jeff Bower, Joe Castiglione, Herb Deromedi, Ken Hatfield, Chris Howard, Bobby Johnson, Ronnie Lott, Gene Smith, Todd Stansbury, and Scott Stricklin.

## Selection Committee Responsibilities

- Rank the top 25 teams and assign the top four to semifinal sites.
- Assign teams to New Year's bowls
- Create competitive matchups
- Attempt to avoid rematches of regular-season games and repeat appearances
- Consider geography

## Participants In New Year's Bowls

Both participants in the Orange, Rose and Sugar Bowls are contracted outside the playoff arrangement (Big Ten and Pac-12 to Rose Bowl; SEC and Big 12 to Sugar Bowl; ACC to Orange Bowl against the highest ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten and Notre Dame). If a conference champion qualifies for the playoff, then the bowl will choose a replacement from that conference. When those bowls host the semifinals and their contracted conference champions do not qualify, then the displaced champion(s) will play in one of the other New Year's bowls.

When not hosting semifinals, the Cotton, Fiesta and Peach Bowls will welcome displaced conference champions and the top-ranked champion from a non-contract conference. The highest-ranked available teams will fill any other berths. The selection committee will make the pairings.

# BOWL PARTNERSHIPS

## The American Bowl Lineup

In addition to the College Football Playoff and New Year's Bowls, The American has either a primary or secondary affiliation with 12 bowl games during its current six-year bowl cycle, which ends following the 2019 season. The American works annually with its member schools and bowl partners to create the most sensible and attractive postseason matchups.

The **Military Bowl presented by Northrop Grumman** takes place at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium in Annapolis, Maryland, while the events and activities surrounding the game are based in Washington, D.C. The American Athletic Conference will face an opponent from the Atlantic Coast Conference each year in the current cycle.

The **Birmingham Bowl** takes place at Legion Field in Birmingham, Alabama. The American/Big East has partnered with the bowl since its inception in the 2006 season. The American Athletic Conference will annually face an opponent from the Southeastern Conference.

Conference USA will play in the game in 2015, 2017 and 2019, while the Atlantic Coast Conference provides the opposing team in 2014, 2016 and 2018.

The **Cheribundi Tart Cherry Boca Raton Bowl** began in 2014 and will feature an American Athletic Conference team three times during the six-year cycle at FAU Stadium in Boca Raton, Florida. The American representative will play a team from Conference USA in 2018.

The **Frisco Bowl** will be played for the second time in 2018 as the former Miami Beach Bowl was relocated to Toyota Stadium in Frisco, Texas. An American Athletic Conference plays in the bowl each year.
