NO. 21 CINCINNATI HOSTS NO. 19 TULANE, CAN CLINCH AAC CHAMPIONSHIP HOSTING HONORS

- No. 21 Cincinnati, the two-time defending American Athletic Conference champion, welcomes No. 19 Tulane to Nippert Stadium for a "Black Friday" top 25 matchup. The winner will host the AAC Championship.
- · UC will celebrate Senior Day on Friday, honoring 28 players who are either four-year, fifth-year or sixth-year players.
- Cincinnati's four-year players bring a 42-7 record into the game, while the fifth-year seniors are 53-9 and Wilson Huber and Jabari Taylor, UC's two sixth-year players, are 57-17, arriving and redshirting during Luke Fickell's first season in 2017.
- The Bearcats forced four turnovers and allowed only 202 yards in a 23-3 victory at Temple on Saturday night in Philadelphia.
 Kicker Ryan Coe drilled three field goals, extending his streak to nine consecutive field goals made, while running back Ryan Montgomery and wide receiver Tre Tucker scored first-half touchdowns.
- QB Ben Bryant left with an injury late in the first half with UC ahead 17-3 and did not return. Backup quarterback Evan Prater saw his most significant action of the season, completing 12-of-17 passes for 125 yards and providing several dazzling runs.
- · The win gave Cincinnati five consecutive nine-win seasons for the first time in the 135-year history of the program.
- The Bearcats bring a 32-game win streak in Nippert Stadium into the matchup the second-longest home win streak in the nation, behind Clemson (40), and the 19th longest streak in college football history.
- Cincinnati is 31-4 since the start of 2020 and 53-9 since the start of 2018 both marks rank in the Top 5 in the nation.

N THE POLLS

- The Bearcats are ranked No. 21 in both the AP and the Coaches' poll, and No. 24 in the CFP Rankings.
- Tulane is ranked No. 19 in the AP Poll, No. 20 in the Coaches' poll and No. 19 in the CFP Rankings.

RACE TO AAC CHAMPIONSHIP COMING DOWN THE STRETCH

- At 6-1 in the AAC, the Bearcats and Green Wave are tied for first in the AAC with UCF (5-2) and Houston (5-2) tied for third
 and still in contention to make the AAC Championship Game.
- The AAC Championship Game participants and host team will be decided by league record with head-to-head breaking any ties and CFP rankings the next tiebreaker.
- If both UCF and Houston win next week, the teams will be tied for second at 6-2 with the loser of the UC-Tulane matchup. To
 break the three-way tie, the AAC will take the highest ranked team to win in the final week (using the CFP rankings from Nov.
 22, or, if no team that wins is ranked, the average of four computer rankings that will come out Sunday morning.)

RECENT HISTORY VERSUS TULANE

- The Bearcats defeated Tulane, 31-12, in New Orleans in 2021 behind two touchdown catches from tight end Josh Whyle. UC led 14-12 at halftime and pulled away with 17 unanswered points in the second half to move to 8-0.
- UC won 37-21 the last time the Green Wave came to Nippert Stadium in 2018.
- Luke Fickell's first-ever AAC win came against Tulane in New Orleans in a 17-16 win on Nov. 4, 2017, in which the Green Wave missed a 36-yard go-ahead field goal in the waning minutes.

SETTING THE PACE ON DEFENSE

- Senior linebacker Ivan Pace Jr. ranks second in the nation in TFLs (19), ninth in sacks (nine) and ninth in tackles (107). He was named a finalist for the Butkus Award on Tuesday.
- Pace Jr. leads a Blackcats defense that ranks fifth in the country in yards per play (4.43), 19th in passing defense (188.6), 21st in scoring defense (19.7) and 22nd in total defense (323.5). The Bearcats ranks second in the country with four defensive TDs.
- Redshirt freshman Dontay Corleone (93.9) and Pace Jr. (93.0) are two highest-graded defensive players in all of college football according to PFF.

YOU'VE GOT TO PUNT IT UP

Sophomore punter Mason Fletcher is a Ray Guy Award semifinalist. His 46.74 average ranks third in the nation, while UC's net
punting average of 44.88 ranks second. He has two punts downed at the 1-yard line and 27 punts inside the 20.

NUMBERS AND NOTES ...

- · Four-year Cincinnati football student-athletes have a 100% graduation rate under head coach Luke Fickell.
- · Led by sixth-year senior Wil Huber's second selection, six Bearcats were named Academic All-District on Tuesday.
- · Cincinnati has won at least nine games in five consecutive seasons for the first time in school history.
- The Bearcats will look to win 10 games for the 10th time in school history and the fourth time under Fickell.
- Fickell is currently tied with Brian Kelly (3) for the most 10-win seasons in UC history.
- UC has won a league title seven times in the last 14 years and has played in 12 bowl games in the past 15 years.
- · Cincinnati is 659-597-50 (.524) all-time.

PRACTICES

During a typical Saturday game week, media may interview players and coaches immediately following practice on Tuesday. Practice is generally closed to the public. Anyone hoping to observe practice should contact UC Athletics Communications in advance. Failure to do so may result in an individual's removal from the venue. During regularseason practices, unless otherwise noted, still and television photographers will be allowed to shoot stretching and the first 30 minutes (six periods).

PRESS BOX SERVICES

All media members will be provided with access to game notes via GoBEARCATS.com. At the guarter breaks and halftime, quickie stats and drive charts will be printed and distributed via email. Following the game, a complete postgame statistics package will be distributed via email and will contain a scoring summary, final team statistics, final individual statistics, complete play-by-play, drive charts for both halves, halftime statistics, defensive statistics, substitution chart, postgame quotes from both head coaches and players and postgame notes.

LIVE STATS

Live in-game statistics will be available via StatBroadcast.

Wireless Internet is available in the press box at Nippert Stadium, Members of the Athletics Communications staff will be available to assist you. There is no access fee.

WEEKLY MEDIA AVAILABILITY

Head Coach Luke Fickell will be available to the media every Tuesday at noon ET during the season with the exception of UC's bye week. The press conference is streamed live on GoBearcats.com. Players will be made available at the discretion of the coaching staff.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Requests for official working media credentials should be directed to the UC Sports Communications Office. All requests should be received no later than noon, four days prior to the game. Visit the football page at GoBEARCATS.com to request credentials online.

Season credentials will be available for pickup prior to the first game. No credentials will be mailed after Tuesday preceding the game. Thereafter, credentials may be picked up on gameday at the media will call located by gate J in the lobby of the Steger Student Life Center.

On gameday, media should park in Clifton Court Garage and enter Nippert Stadium through Gate J.

SCOUTING PASSES

Professional scouts may obtain credentials through UC's Athletics Communications Office. Scouts will be issued seating in the press box on a space-available basis.

SIDELINE PASSES

The University of Cincinnati follows NCAA guidelines regarding media representatives on the sidelines. Photographers and videographers are permitted to shoot between the 25-yard lines and the goal lines on both sidelines and behind the restraining line in the end zone.

AAC ON ESPN+

In Spring 2019, the AAC and ESPN agreed to a 12-year media rights extension beginning in 2020-21. In football, in addition to The American's games continuing to appear on ESPN networks, select conference-controlled games will be available exclusively on ESPN+.

BEARCATS INSIDER TV SHOW

NUMBERS TO KNOW

Cincinnati has 31 plays from scrimmage of 30+ yards, which ranks tied-for-12th in the nation. WR Tyler Scott (8) and Charles McClelland (6) lead UC in 30+ plays.

Cincinnati ranks second the country with four defensive touchdowns this season. Defensive linemen Jabari Taylor and Dominique Perry have fumble recovery TDs, while Ja'Von Hicks and Deshawn Pace have pick-sixes.

UC has won 32 straight games at Nippert Stadium - the second-longest win streak in the nation behind only Clemson (40). UC's last loss at home since Nov. 10, 2017.

Cincinnati now has two kick returners who each have returned kickoffs for touchdowns after Jadon Thompson took one back 100 yards vs. ECU. He joins Tre Tucker who has two career kickoff return TDs.

TE Josh Whyle has 15 career touchdown reception. His 14-yard TD catch at UCF set the UC career mark for TDs by a TE, breaking a tie with Brent Celek (2003-06). Whyle had two TDs at Navy in 2021.

Junior WR Tyler Scott is a big-play threat. His average TD catch is for 44.6 vards. He has 14 career TDs and all have gone for at least 20 yards. He had a 75-varder vs. Indiana and a 76-yarder vs. ECU this season.

Cincinnati punter Mason Fletcher ranks third nationally with a 46.8 punting average. He is nearing the UC singleseason mark of 46.90 set by Kevin Huber in 2007. Huber is the current punter for the Cincinnati Bengals.

HOMETOWN HEROS

- A dozen players from Cincinnati appeared on the seasonopening two-deep on offense and defense.
- 26 players from Ohio are also on the initial two-deep.
- This speaks to head coach Luke Fickell's recruiting philosophy to heavily recruit "the State of Cincinnati" and the 50-mile radius around campus.

NOTING THE GREEN WAVE

- · No. 19 Tulane is coming off a 59-24 victory over SMU on Senior Day last Thursday night in New Orleans.
- QB Michael Pratt had three passing touchdowns and three rushing touchdowns versus the Mustangs, while standout running back Tyjae Spears rushed 13 times for 121 yards and two scores to lead a ground attack that had 310 yards.
- Tulane rebounded from a 38-31 loss at home to UCF on Nov. 12. The Green Wave's only other loss was to Southern Mississippi, 27-24, at home on Sept. 24.
- Tulane had a 17-10 victory at Kansas State on Sept. 17.
- Tulane ranks in the nation's Top 25 in scoring offense (35.1, No. 25) and scoring defense (19.5, No. 18, No. 1 AAC).
- Spears has 996 rushing yards and leads the AAC with 14 TDs, while Pratt has 20 passing TDs and 10 rushing TDs.
- Punt returner Jha'Quan Jackson leads the AAC with a 13.1 average.

NOTING THE RANKINGS

- · Cincinnati earned its first ever win over a Top-10 team on the road with its 24-13 victory at No. 9 Notre Dame on Oct. 2, 2021.
- Since the start of 2020, UC is 5-3 against ranked opponents.
- The Bearcats' highest-ranked win to date was over No. 7 Rutgers (30-11) in 2006, with its highest on the road coming at No. 9 Notre Dame (besting 2009 at No. 14 Pitt).
- The squad's other top-10 win came in 1999 against No. 9 and eventual Rose Bowl champion Wisconsin.
- Fickell is 6-10 against ranked foes at UC, including an 0-1 mark in 2022, 2-1 record in 2021 (Notre Dame, Houston) and a 3-1 mark in 2020 (Army, SMU and Tulsa), while also defeating UCF in 2019.

BEARCATS RE-LOADING ...

- Led by Luke Fickell, the reigning consensus National Coach of the Year, and 12 returning starters, the Bearcats are the two-time defending AAC Champions and are coming off of a 13-1 season that culminated in a trip to the 2021 College Football Playoff.
- With a 53-9 mark since the start of 2018, Cincinnati's 85.5% winning percentage ranks among the nation's Top 5 in that span.

LAST TIME OUT

- · Led by a stifling defense that forced four turnovers and touchdowns from Tre Tucker and Ryan Montgomery, the No. 25-ranked Cincinnati football team defeated Temple, 23-3, on Saturday at Lincoln Financial Field.
- · Starting quarterback Ben Bryant left the game with and injury late in the second quarter with UC leading 17-3 and did not return, paving the way for extended action from backup Evan Prater, who entered the contest with 5:59 remaining in the first half and steadied the offense, completing 12-of-17 passes for 127 yards and logging several dazzling runs.
- The Bearcats' defense held Temple to just 202 yards and forced seven punts.
- Safeties Bryon Threats and Jacob Dingle both had interceptions, and junior linebacker Jaheim Thomas tallied six tackles and two TFLs.
- Montgomery rushed a career-best 14 times for 58 yards and a score.

• UC is 31-0 when leading after the first quarter under Fickell. The Bearcats are 16-16 when trailing at the end of the first quarter. UC is 45-2 when leading at halftime under Fickell.

THE FICKELL ERA

- · University of Cincinnati football head coach Luke Fickell has elevated the Bearcats' football team to the top of college football.
- · Hired as the 42nd football head coach in UC history on Dec. 10, 2016, Fickell holds a 57-17 (.767) record in his six years at the helm of Cincinnati.
- · His 32-9 mark since 2018 ranks among the Top 5 records in the nation during that span.

- He has already surpassed Rick Minter for the most wins (57) in Cincinnati history.
- After leading UC to a 13-1 record, a second straight AAC Championship and a College Football Playoff appearance, Fickell collected eight national coach of the year honors in 2021, including the The Home Depot National Coach of the Year, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year, the Stallings Award, the Eddie Robinson Award and the Dodd Trophy as well as accolades from the AFCA, Walter Camp Foundation and Sporting News.
- Fickell has watched 16 Bearcats earn a selection in the NFL Draft, including a school-record nine draft picks in 2022, and captured AAC Coach of the Year honors three times (2018, 2020, 2021).
- Cincinnati Bearcats four-year football players have a 100% graduation rate since Fickell joined the team as head coach.
- · Fickell and his wife Amy have six children: Landon, Luca, twin sons Aydon and Ashton, and twin sons Laykon and Lucian.

NATION'S 2ND-LONGEST HOME WINNING STREAK

Cincinnati has won 32 consecutive games at Nippert Stadium - the second-longest home win streak in the nation, behind only Clemson (40). UC hasn't lost at home since Nov. 10, 2017 to Temple.

NON-OFFENSIVE TDS RACKING UP IN 2022

- Cincinnati ranks second in the nation with four defensive touchdowns through the first 11 games (interceptions by Ja'Von Hicks and Deshawn Pace, fumbles by Jabari Taylor and Dom Perry).
- · Jadon Thompson added a 100-yard kick return touchdown against ECU to give UC five non-offense TDs on the season.
- · UC has 20 non-offensive TDs under Fickell, all over the last five years. That 2018 squad that had five included scores by then-freshmen Wil Huber and Arguon Bush. The 2019 team had four, with two more in 2020 and three in 2021.

BEARCATS EDGE ECU

- · UC scored all three of its touchdowns on 55-plus yards, beginning with Jadon Thompson's 100-yard kick return, to defeat ECU. 27-25.
- Coe connected on a 21-yard FG with 9:42 left that proved to be the game-winner. The Bearcats forced a fourth-down incompletion with less than two minutes left to seal it.
- · Tyler Scott's 76-yard touchdown reception helped him to a seven-catch, 140-yard game, his fourth over the century mark this season. Tre Tucker also had a 55-yard TD reception

BEARCATS BOUNCE BACK AGAINST NAVY

- · In a game where possessions were limited due to Navy's run-heavy triple-option offense, redshirt senior quarterback Ben Bryant finished 25-of-35 for 299 yards and two touchdowns to lead UC to a 20-10 victory over Navy in Nippert Stadium.
- · Junior WR Tyler Scott tied a career-best 10 receptions for 139 yards, his third career-game over the century mark.
- Senior linebacker Ivan Pace Jr. led the Blackcats defense against Navy's rushing attack with 14 tackles, one sack and 2.0 TFLs, while redshirt freshman Dontay Corleone tallied a career-best 11 tackles.

UC FALLS AT UCF DESPITE BIG GAME FROM TUCKER

Ben Bryant finished 24-of-45 for 298 yards and a touchdown, while senior wide receiver Tre Tucker tallied a game-high 10 receptions for 110 yards, but UCF's RJ Harvey recorded his second rushing touchdown of the game with 48 seconds remaining to lift UCF to a 25-21 victory over the Bearcats in Orlando. The Knights ended the Bearcats' conference-record-tying 19-game AAC win streak.

SPECIALISTS TO THE RESCUE IN DALLAS

- · Mason Fletcher's first punt at SMU went for 84 yards, six more than the previous school-record (Mike Connell's 78 against Louisiana-Lafayette in 1976).
- Not to be outdone, Ryan Coe connected on his first five field goal attempts (30, 25, 52, 44, 31) to get his own record. The last Bearcat with four was Andrew Gantz at Memphis in 2015. Coe was 4-for-7 entering the day, and the 52-yarder was his first attempt of 50-plus at UC. He made four of 50plus at Delaware over the previous two years.
- Fletcher collected AAC Special Teams Player of the Week honors for a second time, while Coe was named a Lou Groza Star of the Week.

BLACKCATS LIVE IN THE BACKFIELD AT TULSA

- Cincinnati's famed defense put on a dazzling display in the Tulsa backfield in UC's last road game, a 31-21 victory over the Golden Hurricane, tying an AAC record with 11 sacks while producing 15 TFL.
- · The former was the team's most since 2007 at Syracuse, while the latter had not been accomplished since 2002 versus UAB. UC held Tulsa to 36 rushing vards, which came after Tulsa had 262 one week prior at Ole Miss and 297 in Nippert Stadium in 2021.
- · QB Ben Bryant threw for 166 yards, while RB Corey Kiner rushed for a career-high 106 and junior linebacker Deshawn Pace secured his first career pick-six.
- The Bearcats were 3-for-3 on fourth down, tving for the most conversions since Fickell became the head coach in 2017.

CHEER CINCINNATI

- UC serves as an economic powerhouse for the Queen City, with more than 15,000 employees, 48,000 students, 300,000 living alumni and countless Bearcats fans.
- Among the state's five counties in southwestern Ohio, UC generates a whopping \$3.3 billion annual impact.
- UC is the 18th-oldest public institution in the United States and traces its origins to the founding of the Medical College of Ohio and Cincinnati College in 1819.

COE PROVES TO BE A WEAPON

- Senior kicker Ryan Coe has made 15 of his last 16 FG attempts and nine straight after going 3-for-3 to earn AAC Special Team POTW in the 23-3 win over Temple.
- On the season, he is 18-of-22 (81.8%).
- · He is perfect on PATs in 2022 and his 95 points rank second in the AAC.
- · His 81.8 percentage makes him the most accurate FG kicker for a career in UC history - minimum 20 attempts.

HUBER FAMILY CAPTAINS

- · Sixth-year senior linebacker Wil Huber already had a master's in finance and a real estate certificate heading into his first year as UC's starting middle linebacker.
- He added captain to his resume, joining his dad, former UC tight end Daryl Huber (1988 captain), as what is believed to be the first father-son captain duo in Cincinnati football history.
- · Daryl Huber caught 51 passes for 519 yards and two scores from 1985 to 1988.
- · Wil Huber is seventh on UC with 50 stops and third with 5.5 TFLs in 2022.

PACE'-ING THE DEFENSE

- · Senior LB Ivan Pace, Jr. ranks second in the nation in TFLs (19.0). The Cincinnati Colerain HS product also ranks No. 9 nationally in sacks (9.0) and tackles (107).
- · He is the nation's second-highest graded defensive player and top LB through 12 weeks per PFF (93.0).
- Pace Jr. now ranks in the Top 10 in single-season school history in TFLs (19.0, 8th) and sacks (9.0, sixth).
- · "He's a fireball," Luke Fickell said. "He goes. I think we are going to continue to use him in different ways but find ways that we can kind of let him go, that's where he's dynamic. We're alad we aot him."
- · In Week 4, he was outstanding against Indiana, tallying 15 tackles, 4.5 TFLs (fifth-most in UC history), 2.5 sacks and three QB hurries en route to AAC Defensive Player of the Week, Bednarik National Player of the Week and PFF Defensive Player of th Week honors.
- · He ranked 10th nationally with 125 tackles for Miami (OH) in 2021. He had six sacks to tie the NCAA record in a single game in 2019.
- · He led UC with 12 tackles and 3.5 TFLs in his UC debut at Arkansas to open 2022, earning AAC honor roll accolades.
- · His brother, Deshawn Pace, a dynamic defensive playmaker, finished sixth in the conference and third on the team with 94 tackles in 2021 while also adding nine for loss and a team-high four interceptions.

YES. THAT'S CORRECT HE HAD SIX SACKS IN A GAME

- Ivan Pace Jr. had six sacks in a single game, to tie an NCAA record, while starring for Miami (Ohio) in 2019.
- He played in 22 games for the Redhawks from 2019-2021, making 193 tackles, 25.5 TFLs and 11 sacks.
- His lone interception came against Eastern Michigan, when he picked off Ben Bryant in 2021.

BLACK CATS DEFENSE AMONG THE NATION'S BEST

- Cincinnati football has always hung its hat on its Blackcats' defense under head coach Luke Fickell since his arrival in 2017. UC has finished in the nation's Top 25 in scoring defense each year since 2018 with three Top 10 finishes.
- UC is currently 21st (19.7) in 2022.
- · The Bearcats rank as the nation's fourth stingiest scoring defense since 2018 and 2020.

FLETCHER RANKS AMONG NATION'S BEST PUNTERS

- · Sophomore P Mason Fletcher ranks third in the nation and second in the AAC with a 46.8 average.
- · 27 of his 51 punts (53%) have been downed inside the 20-yard line with 12 downed inside the 10.
- $\bullet~$ He has 14 punts of 50+ and three 60-yarders, including a school and AAC record 84 on his first SMU attempt. His 65.0 average at SMU also set AAC and UC records
- and gave Fletcher AAC Special Teams honors.
- He averaged 46.5 on six punts against ECU, placing three inside the 20 with a long of 56 and no touchbacks.
- Against Navy, he averaged 49.8 on four punts, with two 50-yarders, three inside the 13, including his second punt downed at the 1 this season.
- · In his USF game, Fletcher had a punt downed inside the 1-yard line and all three of his punts were downed inside the 13.
- · He has two touchbacks this season (one on the 84-yarder) and 34 of his 51 punts have not been returned.
- · UC's net average of 44.88 ranks second in the nation.
- Fletcher was also named to the Ray Guy Award Watch List and the Ray Guy National Punter of the Week on Oct. 6.
- He also earned AAC Special Teams Player of the Week after booting a career-long 67-yarder and averaging 48.2 yards per attempt against Miami (Ohio) in Week 3.
- · The Melbourne, Australia native faced his brother, Max Fletcher, a freshman punter for Arkansas, in the season opener at Arkansas. Mason and Max's parents, Dustin

and Suzanne, flew from Australia for the game. It marked the first time in nearly two years that Mason had seen his brother and mother. Fletcher's father, Dustin, a 23-year veteran in Australian Rules Football, came to the Cotton Bowl last season.

REACHED THE AAC WIN STREAK

- · Cincinnati tied UCF for the most consecutive AAC regular season wins (17) and most consecutive AAC wins overall, including conference championship games, (19) before falling to UCF, 25-21.
- UCF won 17 regular season and 19 overall AAC games from 2017 to 2019. The Knights' streak was snapped on Oct. 4, 2019 at Cincinnati to the Bearcats.

TYLER SCOTT IS A BIG-PLAY MACHINE

- · Junior wide receiver Tyler Scott caught three touchdowns, all in the first half, of 32, 34 and 75 yards in the Indiana win. Only 10 other receivers at UC have had three in a game, and he is the only one to do so in one half.
- He had touchdowns of 38 yards and 27 yards versus Navv.
- · Scott has 14 touchdowns in his career (nine this year), and all are on receptions of 20-plus yards for a 44.6 average. Scott, who clocked a 4.29 40-yard dash in high school, hauled in an 81-yard score from Desmond Ridder on the first pass of the 2021 season for his first end-zone trip.
- Scott leads UC in all catches (53), receiving yards (888) and touchdowns (9), ranking 11th nationally in the latter. In 2021, he had 30 catches for 520 yards and five scores.
- · Incredibly, 12 of his 14 career TDs have come at Nippert Stadium with the other two coming at Paycor Stadium (versus Miami OH in Cincinnati) and at Tulsa.
- His nine touchdowns are already the seventh-most TD catches in a single season in UC history. The school record is 13 by Marcus Barnett in 2007. (see record book at end of notes).
- The last two home games, Scott has 17 catches for 279 yards and three touchdowns.

SCOTT THE FIRST IN FIVE YEARS

 Tyler Scott's 61-yard touchdown catch in the first quarter at Tulsa marked the fourth straight game with a touchdown for the junior receiver from Akron. Ohio. He was the first Bearcat to accomplish that feat since Kahlil Lewis opened the 2017 season with a touchdown catch in the first four games.

SCOTT. PACE JR. SWEEP AAC AWARDS AFTER INDIANA

- · Tyler Scott, joining Ivan Pace Jr. as first-time AAC Players of the Week, had a 10-catch, 185-yard, three-touchdown performance (all-career highs) against the Hoosiers. He tied the UC single-game record for touchdown receptions and became the first Bearcat to have three TD receptions in a single half. He caught touchdowns of 75 yards, 34 yards and 32 yards in the final 16 minutes of the first half as Cincinnati jumped out to a 38-10 lead.
- Pace Jr. was everywhere leading the UC defense to stifle an Indiana offense that ran 104 plays, but generated only 3.3 yards per play. Pace Jr. tallied 15 tackles, 4.5 TFLs, 2.5 sacks and three QB hurries.

DON'T FORGET ABOUT JADON THOMPSON

- · While No. 21 is lighting up defenders, No. 20, Jadon Thompson, has quietly emerged on the scene this season.
- He has 22 catches for 366 yards this season, with seven of those for 20-plus yards. Over his first two years, he had 20 grabs for 266 yards.

- Thompson also set season-longs for catches twice against Navy. His first-career touchdown was a 28-yard catchand-run against South Florida, complete with a curl-route, shake-and-bake around multiple defenders.
- · Thompson's second-career kickoff return was a 100-yard touchdown for UC's first points in the 27-25 ECU win, the Bearcats' first-such score since Tre Tucker at Indiana in 2021. Thompson's first attempt was on the opening kick.

WR DUO BOTH GO OVER 100 AGAINST REDHAWKS

- Tyler Scott (119) and Tre Tucker (105) each went over 100-yards receiving vs. Miami (Ohio).
- · It marked the first time that the Bearcats have had two 100-yard receivers in the same game since Devin Gray (143) and Thomas Geddis (104) did so at Tulsa in 2016.

THREE'S (100-YARD RUSHING) COMPANY

- Corey Kiner's 109-yard output at Tulsa marked UC's third different 100-yard rusher on the season. Myles Montgomery had 104 against Kennesaw State, while Charles McClelland went for 101 against Miami (OH) and later had 179 vards against USF.
- · It is UC's first instance since 2020 when Gerrid Doaks, Jerome Ford and Desmond Ridder accomplished the feat. The last time UC had three RBs do so was 2018 (McClelland, Michael Warren II, Tavion Thomas).

TRANSFERS PROVIDE SPARK IN DEBUTS AT ARKANSAS

- · Cincinnati's first 17 points at Arkansas came by way of first-year transfers, highlighted by starting QB Ben Bryant (Cincinnati, EMU, back to Cincinnati).
- · Corey Kiner (LSU) pulled UC within 14-7 on the second half's opening drive with a 5-yard dive into the endzone, ultimately leading the team with 59 yards on 12 carries.
- Nick Mardner's (Hawaii) first catch as a Bearcat was a 35-yard strike from Bryant four minutes later, making it a 21-14 deficit.
- · Ivan Pace (Miami, OH) turned heads with team-highs of 12 tackles and 3.5 TFLs, including a thunderous, unblocked sack in the fourth quarter. It marked the most TFLs for a Bearcat since Darrian Beavers in 2020 at UCF.
- Ryan Coe (Delaware) also kicked a 26-yard field goal.
- To cap it off, Bryant's fourth-quarter connection with Leonard Taylor was his second in a UC uniform, with the other going to Taylor in 2019 at Memphis.

FORMER WALK-ON JOE HUBER STARTS AT RT

- · Former walk-on right tackle Joe Huber won the right tackle job in camp and has started all 10 games.
- The RS sophomore engineering major earned his first start at No. 19 Arkansas. The 6-5, 310-pounder starred at Jerome High School in Dublin, Ohio.

BRYANT QB1, ALSO A TRIPLET

- · Ben Bryant, who started his career at Cincinnati in 2018, returned to Clifton, following his season as the starter at Eastern Michigan. After a close competition in fall camp with redshirt sophomore Evan Prater, Bryant won the job.
- The 6-3, 220-pounder from La Grange, III., passed for 325 yards and two scores on 26-of-43 attempts with one pick in the season-opener at Arkansas.
- · He passed for a career-best 354 yards and four touchdowns (all in the first half) in the 45-24 win over Indiana.
- · In 2022, he is 213-of-348 (61.2%) for 2,731 yards and 21 touchdowns with seven INTs.
- He has three 300+ passing games in 2022 and multiple passing TDs in eight of 11 games.

THE HOME WIN STREAK

- · Cincinnati has won a remarkable 32 consecutive games at Nippert Stadium — the nation's second-longest active streak behind Clemson (40).
- The 32-game streak is the 19th longest home win streak in college football history and the fourth-longest streak since 2000.
- · Cincinnati hasn't lost at home in over five years, since a 35-24 loss to Temple on a Nov. 10, 2017 in a Friday niaht aame.
- The Bearcats started the streak with a 22-21 win over UConn in the final game of Luke Fickell's debut season on Nov. 25, 2017. UConn missed an extra point to tie the game following an unsportsmanlike penalty for taunts after the Huskies scored what looked like the game-tying touchdown with no time left in regulation.
- · Cincinnati finished 4-8 that first season under Fickell. That fourth win came due to a missed extra point, but helped spark one the top stretches for any college football program in the nation. Since beating UConn on the final game of 2017, the Bearcats are 52-9 overall and 32-0 at home with two AAC Championships, two undefeated regular seasons, two New Year's Six Bowl berths and a College Football Playoff Appearance.
- Two Bearcats have been on the team for the entire streak. Sixth-year team captains - linebacker Wilson Huber and defensive tackle Jabari Taylor. Both players redshirted in 2017. They are full-time starters for the first time in 2022.

- · His 21 passing TDs rank third in the AAC.
- Bryant started one game for UC in 2019, passing for 229 yards and one TD on 20-of-32 attempts at Memphis.
- He played in 16 games at UC as a backup before transferring.
- · He is also a triplet and his father, Sean, grew up in Cincinnati before attending Eastern Michigan where he played football.

LEARN MORE ON PRATER

- Bryant's backup is Evan Prater, a redshirt sophomore from Cincinnati, who starred at Wyoming High School where he won Ohio's Mr. Football Award in 2019.
- Prater has seen extensive action twice this season, leading UC to a comeback victory in the fourth quarter against USF and playing the final 36 minutes at Temple.
- Prater has completed 18-of-25 passes (72%) for 238 yards with no touchdown and no picks in 2022.
- He has been outstanding with his legs, too, rushing for 113 yards on 18 carries (6.3), totals that include sacks.
- He is 23-of-36 for 276 yards, 2 TDs and 1 INT in his career with 222 yards and three scores on the ground.

MCCLELLAND'S STORY CONTINUES TO SHINE

- Charles McClelland has overcome two ACL tears in his Cincinnati career after showing promise in 2018, when he rushed for 495 yards (7.7 ypc) and four touchdowns.
- He has 777 ushing yards (5.9 ypc) and six TDs in 2022, while his 6.3 ypc career-average is third in UC history (Roger Stephens, 6.65 from 1946-48).
- · He had 86 total yards on nine touches at Arkansas.
- He rushed for 101 yards and two touchdowns on a careerhigh 18 carries versus Miami (Ohio).
- His 61-yard run at Tulsa was a career-long and Cincinnati's longest rush of 2022, while his 35-yard TD rush with 9:24 left against South Florida was the game-winner. His 179 yards on 21 carries were both career-highs and UC season-bests.
- The 76-yard rushing score against SMU was his careerlong as well as matching a UC season-long play from scrimmage.
- He missed the 2019 season due to a preseason knee injury and suffered the same fate after playing the first four games in 2020.

TOP 10 SCORING DEFENSE IN 2020, 2021 AND ..

- Cincinnati has had one of the nation's top 10 scoring defenses each of the last two seasons and three of the last four years, ranking No. 5 in 2021 (16.9) and No. 8 (16.8) in 2020. UC ranked No. 24 (20.6) in 2019 and No. 8 in 2018 (17.2)
- UC is allowing 19.7 ppg through 11 games in 2022.

TIGHT END TANDEM

• The Bearcats returned arguably the nation's top tight end tandem in seniors Leonard Taylor and Josh Whyle. Whyle, a third-team PFF All-American in 2020 and a Honorable Mention All-AAC selection from La Salle High School in Cincinnati, has 15 touchdown catches over the last three years. The duo combined for 10 TD receptions in 2021 with Taylor, a former prep quarterback from Springfield, Ohio, hauling in four scores. This year, they have 49 catches and five touchdowns combined.

THE 'NICKEL' IS BACK TO LEAD PASS DEFENSE

• Senior defensive backs Arquon Bush and Ja'Von Hicks return to lead the Cincinnati pass defense. Bush, who started at nickelback last season, has made 34 career starts and tallied 114 tackles, 22 pass breakups and nine interceptions in five seasons. Bush starts at field cornerback this season. Hicks has started 39 games at safety. He led the AAC with five interceptions in 2019 and he has nine picks in this career, including a 45-yard pick-six versus Kennesaw State.

TUCKER LOOKS TO LEAD

• Senior wide receiver Tre Tucker has already proven to be one of the nation's top kick returners after leading the AAC with a 29.9 kick return average en route to all-conference honors in 2020. He has two career kick return touchdowns, running for a score versus USF in 2020 and a momentum-shifting 99-yard score at Indiana in 2021. The 5-9, 175-pounder from Akron, Ohio, also leads UC with 45 receptions in 2022.

BRIGGS READY TO BREAK OUT

- Senior nose tackle Jowon Briggs is ready to breakout. The 6-1, 313-pounder is called the strongest player on the team by head football strength coach Brady Collins. He's also a married father of two, who starred at Walnut Hills High School in Cincinnati. A former four-star recruit and Under Armor All-America, he started his career at Virginia before transferring back home last season. He rotated at defensive end in 2021 and finished with 42 tackles, including three sacks. He is also an accomplished singer.
- In 2022, he has started every game and ranks fourth on the team with 52 tackles. He blocked a kick vs. Navy.
- He was named to the PFF National Team of the Week after he spearheaded UC's 11-sack, 15-TFL performance at Tulsa during Week 5.

DAY ONE READY CAMPAIGN

- The Day One Ready Campaign launched in November 2021 as a \$100 million fundraising initiative to prepare for the university's upcoming move to the Big 12.
- The Day One Ready Campaign will raise money to directly boost the Bearcats' abilities to enhance the student-athlete experience and compete for championships in its new conference.
- The construction of a new indoor practice and performance facility on campus is a key project of the campaign.

HARD TICKET TO COME BY

- Cincinnati football officially sold out of season tickets for the 2022 football season, selling more than 23,500 to set a new school record in June.
- It's the first time in history that UC has sold out of season
- Last season, UC set a record with just over 22,000 season tickets sold.
- Cincinnati has sold out 10 consecutive home games dating back to the third home game of 2021, as well.

BEARCATS SECURE VICTORY BELL SERIES LEAD

- Cincinnati won its 16th straight against Miami (Ohio) on Sept. 17 to take the series lead in the nation's oldest nonleague rivalry, and second-oldest overall, for the first time since 1915. The Bearcats and RedHawks first played in 1888.
- Cincinnati overcame two 10-point deficits in the first half against the RedHawks, trailing 10-0 and 17-7, before scoring 31 unanswered points en route to the victory. It was UC's biggest comeback since overcoming a 14-0 deficit at Indiana on Sept. 17, 2021. UC held Miami to just 67 yards in the second half and 1-for-11 on third down.
- QB Ben Bryant completed his first 12 passes and finished with 337 yards and two TDs, while Ivan Pace, Jr. paced the defense with eight tackles and two TFLs.
- Senior CB Arquon Bush had his eighth career INT and Charles McClelland rushed for 101 yards and two TDs.
- The game was played at Paycor Stadium home of the NFL's Bengals - and Miami was the home team.

COMMUNITY SHOWS UP FOR COLLEGE GAMEDAY

- ESPN College GameDay came to Cincinnati for the firsttime in school history on Saturday, Nov. 6, 2021.
- Originating from The Commons at the heart of UC's campus, the show featured a live interview with head coach Luke Fickell and a behind-the-scenes segment on the Regreats
- Cincinnati was the 78th different school and the 94th different city to host GameDay during the show's 35 seasons. In addition, it was the fourth time that GameDay originated from the home site of an American Athletic Conference program, having travelled to Memphis (2019), UCF (2018) and Temple (2015) in recent seasons.
- Approximately 15,000 fans attended the event in an incredible show of support for the Bearcats.

ENTER SEVEN TRANSFERS

QB Ben Bryant (Eastern Michigan)

Bryant spent three seasons as a backup quarterback at UC before starring at Eastern Michigan where he threw for over 3,000 yards this past fall. His only start for UC came on the road at No. 18 Memphis, where he played valiantly in place of Desmond Ridder in a 34-24 loss, throwing for 229 yards, while tossing one touchdown and rushing for another score.

LB Ivan Pace, Jr. (Miami [Ohio])

Pace collected Mid-American Conference Defensive Player
of the Year honors in 2021 from Pro Football Focus and
All-MAC First Team honors after leading the conference
and ranking 10th in the nation with 125 tackles. Pace
had an NCAA-record-tying six sacks in a win over
Akron in 2019. He will get to team with his younger
brother Deshawn Pace, who led the Bearcats with four
interceptions and finished with 94 tackles and 9.5 TFLs
during his sophomore season.

WR Nick Mardner (Hawaii)

Mardner totaled 46 receptions for team highs of 913 yards and five touchdowns at Hawaii in 2021. A native of Mississauga, Ontario, Canada, he tallied 62 receptions for 1,270 yards and eight touchdowns with an impressive 20.5 yard per catch average for his career with the Rainbow Warriors.

OL Dartanyan Tinsley (Kentucky Christian)

 The 6-5, 315-pounder collected First Team All-National Christian College Athletic Association (NCCAA) honors in 2020-21 and grabbed First Team All-Mid-South Conference Appalachian Division accolades in back-toback seasons (2020-21).

K Ryan Coe (Delaware)

 Coe connected on 12 of 15 field goals with a long of 51 in 2021. He nailed 12 field goals, including a 54-yarder in an FCS Playoff game in 2020-21 — the longest field goal by any kicker in the CAA that season.

RB Corey Kiner (LSU)

Earned valuable reps as a true freshman at LSU, totaling 79 carries for 324 yards (4.1 per carry) and two touchdowns...
 Had 11 and 12 carries the first two weeks against McNeese and Central Michigan, with rushes of 23 and 26 yards respectively, and scoring in each game. Also had 10 carries at Ole Miss and 14 in the Texas Bowl against Kansas State.

Had season-high 74 yards against CMU, as well as 56 against McNeese and 53 versus K-State, Four-star prospect (7th RB, 163 nationally) while earning Ohio Mr. Football honors at Cincinnati's Roger Bacon HS.

DL Noah Potter (Ohio State)

Spent 2019-21 seasons at Ohio State. Did not see game action in 2021. Appeared in four games in 2020, totaling two tackles. Played in four games as a true freshman in 2019 before redshirting. OSU Scholar-Athlete in 2019 and 2020, as well as Academic All-Big Ten in 2020. Four-star prospect and No. 6 player in Ohio by 247Sports.

AAC'S TOP RECRUITING CLASS AGAIN

- · Cincinnati signed 19 players on National Early Signing Day on Dec. 15, 2021. The Bearcats' class was rated No. 25 by ESPN and No. 33 by 247Sports on Early Signing Day, marking the highest-rated class in the American Athletic Conference and the highest-ranked in school history. UC did not sign any prep players during the later signing day in February.
- · The 2022 Class is represented in 10 different states, including eight from Ohio and three from Florida.
- · Of the 19 high school signees, three were consensus four-star recruits.
- · Eight signees were early enrollees (RB Stephen Byrd, WR Jojo Bermudez, OL Luke Dalton, DB JQ Hardaway, DB Kalen Carroll, DB Ken Willis, LB Cincear Lewis, DT CJ Doggette).

FREAKS LIST

- · UC boasted three members of Bruce Feldman's annual "Freaks" list for the second-straight season.
- Speedy wideout Tyler Scott boasts a 40-time of 4.29, turning him ino a big-play machine in 2021. At 5-foot-11 and 185 pounds, Scott squatted a very impressive 600 and did 16 reps at 225 pounds on the bench press, maxing out at 345. Scott also has a vertical jump of 40 1/2 inches and an 11-foot broad jump.
- Fellow wide receiver Tre Tucker has a lot of power for his size, squatting 600, while standing 5-foot-9 and weighing 185. Tucker recorded a broad jump of 10'10 and a vertical of 36 1/2 inches.
- · Josh Whyle, a Mackey Award Watch List nominee and 2020 PFF All-American rounded it out. With his huge frame, 6-foot-6 and 250 pounds, he clocked a 4.65, 40 while topping out at 20 mph on the GPS. Not only does he have speed for a big man, but also has a 35 1/2-inch vertical and a broad jump of 10-3 1/2.

FOOTBALL HISTORY

HISTORICALLY SPEAKING

The University of Cincinnati football program dates to 1885 and ranks as one of the 10 oldest in major college football and holds an all-time mark of 657-597-50 entering its 135th season. UC has won a conference championship seven times in the last decade while playing in the postseason in 13 of the last 16 years. UC played in the American Athletic Conference title game for the first time in 2019 and won the championship game in a 2020 and 2021. The Bearcats have tallied 46 wins since 2018, which ranks among the top five teams in the FBS. In 2010, UC reached as high as No. 3 in all three major polls (Associated Press, USA Today, Bowl Championship Series) - only to be topped by the No. 2 ranking (Associated Press) in 2021.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF RUN IN 2021

The Bearcats authored the greatest season in school history in 2021, starting 13-0, rising to as high as No. 2 in the AP poll, winning a second consecutive AAC Championship and advancing to the College Football Playoff. Cincinnati fell to Alabama the CFP Semifinals at the Cotton Bowl Classic, but not before beating Indiana and No. 9 Notre Dame on the road, as well as routing Houston for the league title. The historic win over the Fighting Irish was Cincinnati's first-ever win over a Top-10 opponent on the road. UC's first-ever back-to-back 50-point games followed the road wins. Cincinnati also hosted ESPN College GameDay for the first time ever in a season that featured the most prolific offense in school history and one of the nation's most stout defenses. Led by Desmond Ridder, who set the school-record with 87 career touchdown passes and won 44 games (third-most in FBS history), Cincinnati set school records for touchdowns (70) and points scored (516). The Bearcats had the nation's top pass defense, which was led by First Team All-America cornerbacks Ahmad "Sauce" Gardner (No. 4 pick in 2022 NFL Draft) and Coby Bryant (Thorpe Award winner). Head Coach Luke Fickell was named the consensus national Coach of the Year. winning eight awards from national organizations. The season culminated with a school-record nine players selected in the 2022 NFL Draft, which ranked third in the country and cemented Cincinnati as one of the country's premier college football programs.

SIMPLY "SAUCE"

Cornerback Ahmad "Sauce" Gardner burst on the scene for a pick-six in an upset of UCF as a true freshman and never looked back, becoming the first Bearcat position player to collect consensus All-America honors before becoming the highest drafted player in UC history when he was selected with the No. 4 pick by the New York Jets in the 2022 NFL Draft. The two-time First Team All-American and unanimous AAC Defensive Player of the Year famously never allowed a touchdown pass over more than 1,000 coverage snaps in his three-year career.

COBY BRYANT IS UC'S FIRST JIM THORPE AWARD WINNER

Cornerback Coby Bryant returned for a fifth "bonus" season in 2021, granted by the NCAA due to the pandemic. The Cleveland, Ohio, native took full advantage of it. A team captain, he was named the Paycom Jim Thorpe Award winner as the nation's top defensive back in 2021 as he led the Bearcats to the College Football Playoff and finished his career with 45 passes defended and 10 interceptions.

RECORD-BREAKING RIDDER

Quarterback Desmond Ridder capped his Cincinnati career (2017-2021) with 44 wins, the third most in FBS history, two AAC Championships, two AAC Offensive Player of the Year Awards, an appearance in the College Football Playoff and countless school records, including most touchdown passes (87), most total yards (12,418), AAC TD responsibility (115) and most rushing touchdowns by a UC QB (28). He finished eighth in Heisman Trophy voting in 2021.

A TOWER OF STRENGTH

UC's football program is one of the nation's oldest — only Rutgers (1869), Michigan (1879), Navy (1880), and Minnesota (1883), among NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision institutions, predate Cincinnati, which began the sport in 1885.

THE ROCK OF TRUTH

UC has been involved in several historic college football milestones starting with Dec. 8, 1888. That day, the Bearcats and Miami (Ohio) University engaged in the first college football game played in the state of Ohio, launching a rivalry that is tied for the oldest in the game among major universities - North Carolina vs. Wake Forest began playing that same year. The Battle for the Victory Bell is the fifth-most played rivalry series in college football.

ALWAYS ON THE SIDE OF INNOVATION

A few years later in 1897, UC received an invitation to visit New Orleans to play a football game as a reward for a successful season, a precursor to the current postseason football bowl games.

BOWL-CATS

Cincinnati has been to 17 bowl games over the last 21 seasons and 22 in the program's 134 seasons, UC played in the first Bowl Championship Series, now New Year's Six, game in school history, taking on Virginia Tech in the 75th FedEx Orange Bowl on Jan. 1, 2009. The Begreats returned to the New Year's Six in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl on Jan. 1. 2021 in Atlanta. In 2021. Cincinnati advanced to the College Football Playoff Semifinals at the 86th Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic in Arlinaton, Texas, on Dec. 31, 2021.

WE ENGINEER BETTER

In the 1930s, a UC football player wore a device with his helmet to protect his broken nose. The device was a forerunner of the now standard face mask. The first soccer-style place kick was also attempted by a Bearcat, Hank Hartong, in the early 1960s.

THE CHART TOPPERS

In 1968, the Bearcats were the nation's top passing team with quarterback Greg Cook leading the NCAA in total offense, while receiver/kicker Jim O'Brien captured the national scoring title. A year later, Cook earned Rookie of the Year honors as a Cincinnati Bengal, and two years later, O'Brien kicked the game-winning field goal for the Baltimore Colts in Super Bowl V.

ALL-AMERICA TRADITION

Forty-seven Bearcats have earned All-America recognition. Mike Woods garnered first-team honors in 1977, earning him an appearance on Bob Hope's television special. Punter Kevin Huber became the first two-time First-Team Associated Press all-American in UC history when he earned the honor in 2007 and 2008. In 2021, Ahmad "Sauce" Gardner become the first position player to earn consensus All-America honors. He was a two-time First Team All-America selection in 2020 and 2021.

"THE TOE"

Jonathan Ruffin received the Lou Groza Award as the nation's top kicker in 2000 after booting a record 26 field goals. He was presented the award by ESPN's Chris Fowler. Ruffin was also a consensus All-American that year.

OUR CRADLE OF COACHES

Coaching luminaries have patrolled the sidelines at Cincinnati. College Football Hall of Fame coach Frank Cavanaugh began his 24-season career at UC. Sid Gillman, a member of the College and NFL Halls of Fame, was the architect of one of the top eras of Cincinnati football history. He directed the Bearcats to three conference titles and a pair of bowl game appearances during his six seasons (1949-54) before leaving for the professional ranks. Cincinnati, with Gillman developing the passing offenses which would make him successful in the pro ranks, became known for its aerial attack in the early 1950s. That notoriety continued long after his departure. Current head coach Luke Fickell enters his sixth year with the program having already taken the program to unprecedented heights, including two AAC Championships, two Top 10 finishes and a College Football Playoff apperance, He is a three-time AAC Coach of the Year and the 2021 consensus National Coach of the Year.

LIDSET CATS

Cincinnati has been dangerous to top teams over the years, knocking off the likes of No. 8 Wisconsin. 17-12, at home in 1999, upending defending national champion Penn State in 1983 14-3 on the road, and dominating Virginia Tech, 16-0, in 1995 while allowing just 41 yards of offense. However, possibly the biggest upset in UC history came in 2006 as the Bearcats beat its highestranked opponent in Nippert Stadium history, blowing away then-No. 7 Rutgers, 30-11. Although not technically an underdog when the No. 7-ranked Bearcats beat No. 9 Notre Dame in South Bend. Ind., in 2021, the game marked the first-ever win over a Top 10 team on the road.

CHAMPIONSHIP FOOTBALL

Between 2008-12, UC became the only FBS AQ school to earn four conference championships in five seasons. The 2008 BIG EAST Conference Championship was the school's first since 1956. UC finished with a school-record 12 wins in 2009 and finished No. 3 in the Bowl Championship Series standings. The 2008 and 2009 squads made the first two BCS appearances in school history, playing in the Orange and Sugar Bowls, respectively. The Bearcats added BIG EAST titles in 2011 and 2012 along with their first American Athletic Conference title in 2014. UC made a school-record five-straight bowl appearances between 2011-15, playing in the Liberty, Belk - twice, Military and Hawai'i bowls. The 2020 season saw UC return to the Top-10 in all three national polls, AP, USA Today and College Football Playoff, for the first time since 2009, including UC's highest CFP ranking, No. 7 on Nov. 22 and 28, 2020. Cincinnati kept the momentum going in 2021, finishing 13-1 en route to a second straight AAC title and its first appearance in the College Football Playoff.

CARSON FIELD AT NIPPERT STADIUM



- During the season-ending clash with rival Miami (OH) in 1923, Jimmy Nippert sustained a spike wound injury and died a month later from blood poisoning.
- His grandfather, James N. Gamble of Procter and Gamble, provided the funds needed to complete the horseshoe-shaped structure, and the James Gamble Nippert Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Nov. 8.
- The stadium's founder was Arch Carson, who as captain and principal organizer played a significant role in starting football on the UC campus in 1885. In 1901 as physical director of the university, Carson guided the construction of the field which was later named for him -- the playing surface is still called Carson Field.

CARSON FIELD AT NIPPERT STADIUM HAS BEEN THE VENERABLE HOME OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CINCINNATI FOOTBALL TEAM SINCE 1901 AND PROVIDES A PHENOMENAL HOME-FIELD ENVIRONMENT.

HARD TICKET TO COME BY

- · Cincinnati football officially sold out of season tickets for the 2022 football season, selling more than 23,500 to set a new school record in June.
- It's the first time UC has ever sold out of season tickets.
- · Last season, UC set a record with just over 22,000 season tickets sold.

A MODERN CLASSIC

- · The third-oldest NCAA FBS stadium entered a new era in 2015 following the completion of a 20-month, \$86-millon. privately funded renovation and expansion project.
- The post-renovation season in 2015 coincided with the 100th anniversary of the original 1915 construction.
- · UC has used the Nippert site as a playing field since 1901, making it the second-oldest playing site in the nation for college football behind Penn's Franklin Field (1895).
- Among NCAA FBS schools, Nippert is the third-oldest stadium still in use, behind Bobby Dodd Stadium (Georgia Tech - 1913), Davis Wade Stadium (Mississippi State - 1914) and ahead of Ole Miss' Vaught-Hemingway Stadium (1915) and Wisconsin's Camp Randall Stadium (1917).
- Through numerous renovations, the structure situated in the middle of the Clifton campus has retained its early-century brickwork, wrought-iron gates, and trim giving Nippert a comfortable old-time stadium charm and appeal, while remaining a classic showplace for college football.

FOR THE FANS

- Both concourses were renovated and widened and now feature nearly 75 permanent point-of-sale concession locations are available on game days.
- · Concession stands feature the usual stadium staples along

- with offerings from premium local vendors, including Frisch's, Montgomery Inn and Skyline Chili.
- Enhancements were added in 2019, including: new tailgating spots, social gathering spaces, fans-first pricing and a season-long DJ for in-game entertainment.

THE WEST PAVILION

- · The most striking changes sit five stories above the west concourse. At 105,000 square feet and 130 yards long, the West Pavilion rises out of the stadium concourse in glass and angles which contain a host of new premium seating along with state-of-the-art press facilities.
- The curvature of the facility matches that of Herschede-Shank Pavilion on the east side of the stadium and contains four levels; the Margaret & Michael Valentine press and suite level, suite level, scholarship club level, and patio suites mezzanine level.
- UC went from having nearly no premium seating options to the addition of 1,100 scholarship club seats and 53 indoor and outdoor suites of varying sizes. A skywalk connects Tangeman University Center to the West Pavilion with premium area customers able to access the facility on gameday from the other side of campus.

FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- The Cincinnati Bengals played at Nippert from 1968-69 and MLS' FC Cincinnati played there until 2021.
- Nippert has served as a venue for numerous concerts and events, including speeches by US Presidents, Franklin D. Roosevelt (1936) and Barack Obama (2008).

ESPN COLLEGE GAMEDAY COMES TO UC IN 2021

"The best atmosphere this year (2021) for College GameDay was at Cincinnati. Man, they were so fired up. They were fired up for their team. They were fired up for the validation that having GameDay come to campus brings, and they were absolutely electric. I mean there were thousands of people for as far as you could see back on the main quad area on campus at UC not far from Nippert Stadium...Cincinnati was a great, great stop this year." College GameDay Host Rece Davis (2021)

Thousands of Cincinnati fans attended ESPN College GameDay Built by The Home Depot on Nov. 6, 2021. The three-hour college football pregame show aired live from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. from "The Commons" in front of Tangeman University Center adjacent to MainStreet at the center of the University of Cincinnati's West Campus. College GameDay's first-ever visit to Cincinnati registered 1,826,000 viewers, tops among Saturday morning college football pregame shows with 2,376,000 viewers in the final hour in what was essentially a three-hour commercial for the University of Cincinnati and the football program. The weekend also served as UC's homecoming and Cincinnati defeated Tulsa, 28-20, at Nippert Stadium that night.

HEAD COACH LUKE FICKELL | SIXTH SEASON

2021 NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

University of Cincinnati football head coach Luke Fickell has elevated the Bearcats' football team to the top of college football in less than five years.

Hired as the 42nd football head coach in UC history on Dec. 10, 2016, Fickell, an Ohio native, led Cincinnati to back-to-back 11-win campaigns in 2018 and 2019 and an undefeated regular season that culminated with a Peach Bowl berth in 2020, before leading the Bearcats to the greatest season in school history in 2021. He guided the Bearcats to an appearance in the College Football Playoff Semifinals at the Cotton Bowl and the first-ever 13-0 regular-season record in school history.

It's no surprise Fickell collected eight national coach of the year honors in 2021, including the The Home Depot National Coach of the Year, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year, the Stallings Award, the Eddie Robinson Award and the Dodd Trophy as well as accolades from the AFCA, Walter Camp Foundation and Sporting News.

Fickell has watched 16 Bearcats earn a selection in the NFL Draft, including a school-record nine draft picks in 2022, and captured AAC Coach of the Year honors three times (2018, 2020, 2021). He has firmly established his T.E.A.M. (Together Everyone Achieves More) culture on Cincinnati's Clifton Hts. campus, graduating players and instilling discipline and consistency on and off the field.

Fickell holds a 55-17 (.764) record in his six years at the helm of Cincinnati, making him the winningest coach in UC history. His 51-9 mark since 2018 ranks among the Top 5 records in the nation during that span.

In 2021, the Bearcats finished as the nation's only undefeated team in the regular season and as the No. 4 seed in the College Football Playoff, capturing a spot in the CFP Semifinals at the 86th Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic in Arlington, Texas. Cincinnati battled No. 1 Alabama tough before ultimately falling to the defending national champions at AT&T Stadium.

UC also secured a No. 2 ranking early in the fall in the Associated Press Poll – their highest ranking in school history. Cincinnati defeated No. 9 Notre Dame, 24-13, in South Bend, Ind., for its first-ever road victory over a Top 10 team, before rattling off back-to-back 50-point games for the first time in school history in dominant wins over Temple (52-3) and UCF (56-21). The Bearcats' capped the season by defeating No. 16 Houston, 35-20, for their second consecutive AAC Championship title.

Cincinnati set school records for points (516) and touchdowns (70) in 2021 and extended the nation's second-longest home winning streak to 27-straight at Nippert Stadium.

UC proved to be one of the nation's most complete teams, ranking in the Top 10 in scoring offense (39.2, 8th) and scoring defense (16.1, 4th) in the regular season.

Fickell's Bearcats saw 12 players earn All-AAC First Team honors, including two-time conference offensive player of the year senior quarterback Desmond Ridder and unanimous defensive player of the year junior cornerback Ahmad "Sauce" Gardner.

Additional honors were given to senior cornerback Coby Bryant, who became the first Bearcat to win the Jim Thorpe Award, given to the nation's top defensive back, while senior linebacker Darrian Beavers was a finalist for the Butkus Award, given to the nation's top



linebacker. Gardner collected several All-America First Team honors and became the Bearcats' third consensus All-American all-time.

With Fickell at the 2022 NFL Draft in Las Vegas to support him, Gardner became the highest drafted Bearcat when he was selected by the New York Jets with the fourth overall pick of the first round on April 28. Five Bearcats in all were drafted in the Top 100 picks and UC's nine selections were the third-most in the country behind only national champion Georgia (15) and LSU (10). The draft was further proof that no program in the country is on par with Fickell's Cincinnati squad when it comes to development. Only fifth-round pick Jerome Ford, who transferred to UC from Alabama, was rated higher than a three-star by recruiting services entering college.

Fickell has firmly established his T.E.A.M. (Together Everyone Achieves More) culture on Cincinnati's Clifton Hts. campus, graduating players and instilling discipline and consistency on and off the field.

Cincinnati's four-year football players have a 100% graduation rate since Fickell arrived and four Bearcats collected Academic All-America honors in 2021 - the most of any team in the country.

Community service is a foundational pillar of Fickell's Cincinnati program. UC football players visit local elementary schools to mentor at-risk youth weekly and participate in countless reading events at schools.

Fickell is one of the founders of the 2nd & 7 Foundation, which promotes reading by providing free books and positive role models to kids in need while encouraging young athletes in the community to pay it

A native of Columbus, Ohio, Fickell played football at Ohio State and graduated in 1997 with a degree in exercise science.

Fickell and his wife Amy have six children: Landon, Luca, twin sons Aydon and Ashton, and twin sons Laykon and Lucian.




MIKE TRESSEL
