# THE UNIVERSITY

The University of Cincinnati traces it origins to 1819, the year in which Cincinnati College and the Medical College of Ohio were chartered. In 1870, the City of Cincinnati established the University of Cincinnati, which later absorbed the earlier institutions. In 1906, the University of Cincinnati created the first cooperative education program in the United States through its College of Engineering. For many years, the University was the second-oldest and second-largest municipal university in the country. In 1968, UC became a "municipally sponsored, state affiliated" institution, entering a transitional period culminating on July 1, 1977 when UC became one of Ohio's state universities. The University by the Carnegie Commission, and is ranked as one of America's Top 25 public research universities.

### **Cincinnati Firsts**

UC has been the source of many contributions to society, including:

- the first oral polio vaccine
- the first electric organ
- the first observations of the National Weather Service
- the first safe anti-knock gasoline
- · the first antihistimine
- the first use of lasers to remove brain tumors
- the first bachelor's degree program in nursing and first emergency medicine residency program
- the first degree program offered via satellite

### **Cincinnati Sports Firsts**

- Cincinnati hosted one of the first night football games in the United States in 1923
- George Smith, captain of the 1934 football team, wore a device to protect a facial injury, a forerunner of the facemask
- In 1961, Hank Hartong became college football's first soccer-style kicker
- UC was the first school to make five consecutive appearances in the men's basketball Final Four, 1959-63



# RICHARD E. LINDNER VARSITY VILLAGE



The future arrived for the University of Cincinnati athletics program in May, 2006 with the completion of the Richard E. Lindner Varsity Village.

The extensive renovation and upgrade of all of UC's athletics facilities, and the construction of some new venues, positions the Bearcats' sports programs to compete among the nation's best.

The term "village" aptly applies because the close proximal location and interconnection of the facilities provides ease of use and access to services for all of the sports teams

and their student-athletes, similar to that of a small town.

There was nothing small about the vision for Varsity Village, a \$105 million project, over half of which was privately financed.

The centerpiece of the project was the construction of the Richard E. Lindner Center, to serve as the home for all of the sports programs as well as the centralized support services.

Located between Nippert Stadium and Fifth Third Arena, the Lindner Center is a futuristic eight-story structure which houses

offices, locker rooms, and reception and meeting space for each of the sport programs. The administrative services and support areas are also housed in the building.

The emphasis of the Lindner Center programming is on the student-athlete. One entire floor of the building is devoted to the Nancy Hamant Academics Center, which contains study facilities for UC's 560 student-athletes, including over 70 computer stations.

Varsity Village is named in honor of Cincinnati philanthropist and businessman Richard E. Lindner, who gave the founding gift to get the project started.

A new athletics training center, equipped with state-of-the-art diagnostic and treatment equipment, including three hydrotherapy pools, is included in the Lindner Center. The University Health Services for students has been relocated to the Lindner Center and provides expanded medical coverage conveniently located for UC student-athletes. An MRI diagnostic center is also part of the building.

Space for strength and conditioning training in the adjacent Fifth Third Arena has doubled to 18,000 square feet and has been furnished with the latest in weight training equipment. A new 12,000-square foot practice gymnasium will ease the scheduling of workouts and practices.

While the Lindner Center provides for the present and future of UC athletics, it also recognizes and celebrates UC's proud past. The ground level of the five-story atrium features the George and Helen Smith Museum detailing the history of both the athletics program and the University. Sports histories are portrayed in graphic murals and on video screens. Terminals in the Jack Twyman Traditions Lounge enable former student-athletes and their families to look up photos and records of their participation. A five-story trophy case houses the Bearcats' championship memorabilia.

The unique building was designed by signature architect Bernard Tschumi. UC graduate Eva Maddox (DAAP 1966)



orchestrated the design of the museum.

Varsity Village created three new sports venues and made significant upgrades and enhancements to two others.


The new baseball stadium, named for late Cincinnati Reds owner and area philanthropist Marge Schott, opened late in the 2004 season. UC's tennis program benefits from a new on-campus tennis center. The swimming and diving teams have a new training and competition home, the Keating Aquatics Center, in the nearby new student recreation center.

UC's track and soccer complex was totally renovated and permanent seating for 1,400 was added, along with a press box, and reopened as the Ben and Dee Gettler Stadium.

Nippert Stadium, which has been the home to UC football, and the activities of just about every other outdoor sport since 1902, has undergone significant improvements in seating and other accoutrements for the spectators, such as expanded concourses and concessions areas, and a new video board. Teams benefit from field-level game day locker rooms and a grass-like FieldTurf artificial playing surface.

Even UC's Marching Band benefited with the creation of the Rockwern Band Center.

Landscaping has created a major walkway, O'Varsity Way, that leads visitors through the heart of Varsity Village. The Raymond D. Sheakley Lawn and Victory Plaza provide gathering and activities space for UC fans attending events.

# **SPORTS MEDICINE**

The University of Cincinnati's sports medicine program is responsible not only for helping student-athletes make speedy recoveries from injuries, but in preventing injuries from occurring. UC's sports medicine program is a comprehensive approach to the injury care and the wellness of the University's over 500 student-athletes, utilizing state-of-



the-art diagnostic and treatment equipment with the latest methods in the care and prevention of injuries. Its objectives are simple: to prevent injuries, to rehabilitate injuries, to adjust to the stress following injuries and to educate student-athletes about various wellness issues.

The goal is to get UC's athletes back in the classroom and back on the playing field functioning at 100 percent capacity. The goal is attained in several ways. New student-athletes are carefully examined before they

participate to detect potential problems. Student-athletes are afforded state-of-the-art therapeutic care.

The opening of the Richard E. Lindner Athletics Center in May 2006 provided a new, state-of-the-art sports medicine facility that caters to the needs of UC's student-athletes. Features of the facility include over 4,000 square feet of space for treatment and taping, spacious office suites for training staff and physicians, a physicians exam area, pharmacy, and x-ray facilities. A highlight is the hydrotherapy facility which has a three-level, 5,000 gallon, two-treadmill exercise pool, and two 12-person whirlpools (one for hot and one for cold therapy). The sports medicine facility is located one floor below the new University Health Services Center, providing easy access to physicians and services. University Radiology has an MRI diagnostic center as part of the new complex.

UC's athletics training staff, under the direction of Jeff Carrico, is the backbone of the sports medicine program. Trainers are present at every practice and event to monitor the health of the student-athletes and respond to injuries.

Dr. W. Kenneth Stephens, a fellow in the American College of Sports Medicine and member of the American Medical Society for Sports Medicine, has served as the Bearcats' team physician for the past 29 years. UC's University Health Service provides a staff of medical professionals accessible to student-athletes 24 hours a day.

Dr. Angelo Colosimo and the staff of the University Orthopaedics Associates of Cincinnati is on call to address orthopedic injuries, performing all orthopedic surgeries and supervising post-operation rehabilitation programs.

The UC Medical College provides nationally-recognized specialists who are immediately accessible. University Hospital, a nationally-recognized medical center, is immediately adjacent to the campus, providing UC student-athletes the absolute best in health and medical care.



With the opening of the Richard E. Lindner Athletics Center, the Bearcats utilize an 18,000-square foot strength training facility. The new center includes over \$1 million in Hammer Strength equipment and a fivelane running track.

The mirror-covered room is trimmed in red and black and features a tuflex floor made especially for weight training facilities. The modernized weight facility is highlighted by a quadraphonic sound system.

Paul Longo is the director of UC's strength training and conditioning facility while Dave Andrews serves as the strength and conditioning coach for UC's Olympic sports. Andrews has a proven record of success developing student-athletes and helping them achieve their full potential.

Strength and conditioning is on-going. Programs are tailored to enable athletes to maintain strength during the peak physical demands of a playing season and increase strength through more extensive training during the off-season.





# EAST CONFERENCE

n 2007-08, the BIG EAST will be in its third academic year as a 16-member conference. While many outside the league were curious and sometimes skeptical of the long-term prospects of the largest Division I-A conference, the student-athletes concentrated on their tasks at hand and continued the league's proud tradition of

BIG EAST teams earned plenty of recognition at the highest levels in 2006-07. In basketball, the Georgetown men's team and the Rutgers women's team each advanced to their respective Final Fours with Rutgers playing in the national championship game.

The 2006 football season was the BIG EAST's best ever. Louisville, West Virginia and Rutgers all finished in the top 12 in the final national polls. The BIG EAST posted a 5-0 bowl record and won the ESPN Bowl Challenge Cup.

On the diamond, the Louisville baseball team played its way to the College World Series. In softball, DePaul also participated in the College World Series. The Notre Dame women's soccer team advanced to the NCAA title game and the Connecticut field hockey team made it to the Final Four.

The BIG EAST took the men's and women's M.A.C. Hermann Trophy, the top individual award in soccer. The winners were Joseph Lapira and Kerri Hanks, both of Notre Dame.

The goals of the BIG EAST have never changed. The league aims and expects to compete at the highest level and does so with integrity and sportsmanship.

The BIG EAST became the nation's largest Division I-A group in 2005-06 when five new members began competing.

The new schools were: University

of Cincinnati, DePaul University, University of Louisville, Marquette University and the University of South Florida.

BIG EAST institutions reside in nine of the nation's top 34 largest media markets, including New York, Chicago, Philadelphia, Washington, D.C., Tampa, Pittsburgh, Hartford, Milwaukee and Cincinnati. With its newest members, BIG EAST markets will contain almost one fourth of all television households in the U.S.

Since opening its doors in 1979, the league has won 25 national championships in six different sports and 124 student-athletes have won individual national titles.

The BIG EAST has always been able to boast that some of its best students are also some of its best athletes. More than 350 studentathletes have earned academic all-America honors. Last year in football, Brian Leonard of Rutgers won the Draddy Award, known as the academic Heisman. In addition, Rhema Fuller of Connecticut and Jay Henry of West Virginia were named national scholar-athlete award winners by the National Football Foundation.

Louisville field hockey standout Jessica Javelet, the 2006 BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Year, was named first team academic all-America. The Louisville team, which earned a berth in the NCAA Championship, was recognized by the National Field Hockey Coaches Association for the highest team GPA in the nation for a second straight year.

The BIG EAST has continued its basketball success in the 21st century. In 2003-04, Connecticut became the first school in NCAA history to win the men's and women's NCAA titles in the same season. In '02-03, the BIG EAST became the first conference in NCAA history to

win the men's and women's titles in the same year when the Syracuse men and the Connecticut women took home the NCAA crowns. In men's basketball, BIG EAST squads have won three of the last nine NCAA championships. BIG EAST women's teams have taken five of the last eight NCAA titles.

Proactive movement has been a signature strategy for the conference that was born in 1979. The BIG EAST continually turns challenges into opportunities to become stronger.

In the spring of 2001, the BIG EAST added women's lacrosse and rowing to its growing list of sports. The first women's golf championship was held in the spring of 2003.

The BIG EAST became a reality on May 31, 1979, following a meeting of athletic directors from Providence College, St. John's, Georgetown and Syracuse Universities. Seton Hall, Connecticut and Boston College completed the original seven school alliance.

While the membership has both increased and changed, the focus of the BIG EAST has not wavered. The conference reflects a tradition of broad based programs, led by administrators and coaches who

> place a constant emphasis on academic integrity. Its student athletes own significantly high graduation rates and their record of scholastic achievement notably show a balance between intercollegiate

> > athletics and academics. Any successful organization needs outstanding leadership. Michael Tranghese, the league's first full-time employee, and for 11 years the associate to Dave Gavitt, became Commissioner in 1990. In his first year, he

administered the formation of The BIG EAST Football Conference.

CONFERENCE

The league has long been considered a leader in innovative concepts in promotion and publicity, particularly regarding television. Those efforts have resulted in unparalleled visibility for BIG EAST student athletes. The conference has enjoyed long-standing relationships with CBS, ESPN, Inc. and ABC.

While BIG EAST basketball games are regular sellouts at campus and major public arenas, including the annual men's BIG EAST Championship in Madison Square Garden, attendance figures also are significant in soccer, women's basketball and baseball games.

More than 550 BIG EAST student-athletes have earned all America recognition and dozens have won individual NCAA national championships. The BIG EAST has been well represented in U.S. or foreign national and Olympic teams. Several athletes earned gold medals in each of the last five summer Olympiads.

The BIG EAST has its headquarters in Providence where the conference administers to more than 5,500 athletes in 23 sports.

BIG EAST Championships in every sport within the next five years, continued leadership by UC student-athletes in academics, and community engagement are the main goals of CATAPULT, an action plan for University of Cincinnati athletics unveiled by athletics director Mike Thomas.

Thomas' five-year vision for UC's 18-sport intercollegiate program was launched on the six-month anniversary of his hiring as AD. The plan focuses on three main initiatives: winning BIG EAST team championships, high-level academic achievement, and a comprehensive integration with the



Greater Cincinnati Community.

"It is critically important for our student-athletes, past, present and future, along with our coaches, staff, alumni and fans to know that we are 100 percent committed to being a championship program within the BIG EAST," said Thomas. "Setting specific goals will keep all of our stakeholders focused on where we need to go. The title of the program, CATAPULT, is truly symbolic of what our department is poised to do over the next five years, which is to leap over the rest of the BIG EAST, all the way to the top."

### **CHAMPIONSHIPS**

UC will win a BIG EAST championship in every sport within the next five years. The Bearcats picked up their first BIG EAST championship in 2006 as the men's soccer team captured the regular-season title.



### **ACADEMICS**

UC student-athletes will set the pace academically by continuing to lead the general student body in graduation rates and over a fiveyear period outperform the general student body in grade point average. UC student-athletes are graduating at a 61 percent rate, exceeding the 48 percent rate of the school's general student body and on par with the national student-athlete rate of 62 percent. In the most recent compilation of grade point averages, UC student-athletes posted an accumulated grade point average of 2.90 while the overall GPA of the UC student body was 3.04.



### **TOGETHER**

UC student-athletes, coaches and staff will respect and honor the privilege of competing as Cincinnati Bearcats. All participants recognize that UC's goals cannot be achieved without engaging the UC family and the Cincinnati community.





# **ACADEMIC SERVICES**

### **Nancy Hamant Academic Center**

The opening of the Richard E. Lindner Athletic Center pays huge dividends for student-athletes in terms of academics, as the building houses the spacious Nancy Hamant Academic Center on the entire fifth floor.

Named in honor of the longtime faculty athletics representative, the Hamant Academics Center gives student-athletes a variety of ways to fulfill their study needs. The large study room is furnished to accommodate a variety of study habits and features 34 work areas. There are also 14 tutor rooms for more focused attention and five group meeting rooms.

Additionally, the center includes a computer lab, equipped with 71 work stations, that provide a wide range of computer and word-processing activities, as well as access to the internet.



The Academic Services Office works with coaches, faculty and administrators to help make the student-athlete's academic and athletic experience as enriching and rewarding as possible. The office helps student-athletes keep abreast of the eligibility requirements of their particular colleges, assists with the coordination of class schedules, and monitors their progress in their respective programs and toward graduation.

Weekly meetings with academic advisors are set up for all first-year student-athletes to better monitor their academic progress and assist with adjustment to college. Tutoring and educational assistance are also readily accessible.

### The UC TEAM Approach

To help new student-athletes adjust to college life, Cincinnati utilizes a mentorship program which pairs new student-athletes with members of the local community who are committed to helping the student-athletes enjoy their first year of college.

UC TEAM, an acronym for University of Cincinnati Together in Excellence for Athletes through Mentoring, familiarizes student-athletes with UC's academic culture, helps them focus on responsibilities, and ultimately enriches their personal development and experience at the university.

### Services Provided for Student-Athletes

**Academic Advising:** The UC Academic Services staff provides information regarding policies, procedures, course selection, selection of major and minor areas of study as well as NCAA and university guidelines for adequate academic progress.

**Priority Registration:** Student-athletes meet with an advisor in their college in order to obtain a check sheet and a graduation plan. The student-athlete then meets with an athletic academic advisor during priority registration in order to register for the quarter. Priority registration allows student-athletes to register for classes around practice and competition schedules.

**Counseling:** Individual work is done with studentathletes with specific concerns such as decisionmaking, adjustment to college, communications, relationships, test-anxiety and necessary study skills. Appropriate referrals are made to other campus resources.

**Monitoring Academic Progress:** Progress reports are used to gather classroom performance information from professors. This information is shared with the student-athlete and his/her coach so everyone can keep abreast of the current academic progress.

**Tutorials:** Services are provided for one-on-one and small group tutoring. Student-athletes may submit requests for a tutor assignment in most courses.

Career Development and Placement: The interests and strengths of each student-athlete are continually measured to prepare the student-athlete for a career beyond college. In addition to aiding career exploration and placement, this program provides assistance in securing vacation employment opportunities and internships.

## **2008 OUTLOOK**

The Bearcats 2008 track and field teams will look for improvement and consistency in the chase for the BIG EAST title.

#### SPRINTS/HURDLES

Freshmen Natasha Burse and Mandi Boykin will make an immediate impact in the short sprints. Burse is also the Bearcats' top threat in the 200 meters, while junior Camron Turner will look to earn a spot in the BIG EAST Championships. Sophomore Ashley Arnold returns after a successful freshman season in the 400 meters. Joining Arnold will be junior Courtney Wicks to give the Bearcat women a strong group of competitors in the 400 meters.



For the men, sophomores Dayo Igeleke and Jordan McPherson are the runners to watch for in the short sprints. Igeleke finished third in the 100 meters and fifth in the 200 meters at the BIG EAST Championships as a freshman and qualified for the regional championships. Antione Drakeford, Kyle Thomas and Chase Van Cura are the top scorers in the 400 meters.

Senior Monica Hundley, who holds the school record in both the indoor 60 meter hurdles and the outdoor 100 meter hurdles will look to close her career with a BIG EAST title and a trip to the NCAAs. Sophomore Sharika Thompson competed in the U.S. Junior Nationals last summer and has the ability to place in the conference meet in the intermediate hurdles. Versatile freshman Kaylon Eppinger will be expected to push the veterans in the hurdles.

The men will be led by senior captain Isaac Hendricks and juniors Kasey Waaland and Dominick Davolio. Freshman Mario Cannon, a two-time conference and district champion in high school, will provide support.

#### MIDDLE DISTANCE

Freshman Myeeah Scott looks to make an instant impact in the middle distance events, while sophomores Tamara Masters and Courtney Hentz aim to improve over last year's marks.

For the men, senior captain Alex Ramsey looks to return to form after missing the 2007 season due to injury. Senior Brad Neumann, sophomores Sam Knue and Jon McClelland and freshman Jason Berling all have the ability to advance to the BIG EAST meet.



#### DISTANCE

Sophomore Lilian Jelimo and freshman Jill Glassmeyer provide the Bearcats with two BIG EAST-quality scorers, no small feat when taking into account the impressive distance resume of the BIG EAST Conference.

Senior John Dixon and junior Randy King will lead the men's distance events. They led UC's cross country team this fall and will be supported by freshman Tommy Morgan. David Adams, Bill Keckeis, Rick King and Kyle Lang will lead the Bearcats' steeplechase efforts.

#### **JUMPS**

In the long jump, UC will look to freshman Natasha Burse from Garland, Texas to make an immediate impact for the women's team. Senior Ije Obiorah returns as a solid veteran presence with the ability to score at the conference meet. Sophomore Boudine Bouma is a versatile athlete who can also contribute at the BIG EAST level.

The Bearcat men will turn to seniors Cameron Widget and Tim Poirier for scoring in the long jump. Heralded freshman Jordan McPherson, a high school all-American and three-time state champion, will provide an instant impact.

Senior Tim Poirier and junior Lane Raney are the men's triple jump representatives.

The loss of Renee Hein to graduation means the loss of a three-time conference champ and four-time NCAA qualifier. UC will look to freshman Kaylon Eppinger, Bouma and senior Melissa Brankamp for scoring in the high jump.



The high jump will be one of the strongest events for the men as sophomores Ryan Beltz, Anthony Busellato and Brandon Fitch, a BIG EAST qualifier in 2007 as a freshman, return. McPherson, who cleared 6' 11" in high school, and fellow frosh state champ Mike Foley will give the Bearcats five BIG EAST quality jumpers.

Brittany Klima, the 2007 BIG EAST outdoor champion, returns for her senior season as the outdoor school record holder. Tara Meier, who holds the indoor mark and won the 2007 BIG EAST indoor title, will compete as a redshirt senior during the outdoor season only. Sophomores Stefanie Ponte and Audrey Schnur will compete for BIG EAST qualifying marks.

For the men, Shane Shockey returns after missing last season due to injury. Sophomore Elliot Vocke joins Shockey to create a formidable duo in the vault.

#### **THROWS**

Lisa Klotz is the top returner in the throws. She qualified for the BIG EAST Indoor and Outdoor Championships last season and will be counted on to score in both the shot put and weight/hammer throw. Sophomore Krystal Barnhill and freshman Catherine Earl will provide support. Sophomore Brittany Pessell will make an impact in the javelin.

The men are led by junior captain lan Jarman, a regional qualifier in the hammer throw in 2007. Senior Ryan Flynn and juniors Chad Hanson and John Martin also return as BIG EAST qualifiers. A group of talented freshmen - Kyle Borton, Adam Chambers, Troy Cooper and Chris Littleton - will be counted on for points. Freshman Brian Zimmerman gives UC a threat in the javelin.



#### **MULTIS**

The Bearcats boast three young pentathletes/heptathletes in Jasmine Cotten, Boudine Bouma and freshman Chelsea Gerken. Cotten finished sixth in the pentathlon at the BIG EAST Indoor Championships as a freshman and placed fourth at the 2007 U.S. Junior National Championships last summer. Bouma won the event at the AII-Ohio Indoor Championships and senior Melissa Brankamp has steadily improved every season and is poised to reach the BIG EAST meet in her final year.

Keller Schnier, son of head coach Bill, is the top decathlete for the men. Schnier finished fourth at the 2007 All-Ohio Championships and will look to place at the BIG EAST Championships in his senior season. Caleb Gaus gives the Bearcats a second capable decathlete.

Since Bill Schnier's arrival at the University of Cincinnati, the

Bearcat track and field program has progressed into one of the most competitive in the country.

Entering his 28th season at the helm of the Bearcats, Schnier looks to take the team to the top of the BIG EAST. He led the 2006 squad to a fifth-place finish at the BIG EAST Championships in its first year in the conference.

The Conference USA Coach of the Decade for both cross country and track, Schnier has led the men's team to 12 conference titles and did not finish lower than third at a conference championship meet since 1986 until 2006 when the Bearcats joined the BIG EAST.

Since arriving in 1980, Schnier has seen 126 of his athletes earn individual conference championships. He has qualified 17 athletes for the NCAA Championships and mentored five all-Americans. A 13-time conference coach of the year, Schnier was named Ohio Cross Country Coach of the Year in 1995.

UC added women's track in 1996 and in just three years, Schnier led the Bearcats to a best-ever fourth place finish at the C-USA in-

door championship in 1999. He also garnered two third place finishes in cross country in 1998 and 1999. He turned the reigns of the women's program over to longtime assistant Jim Schnur in 2001.

Of Schnier's athletes, 15 have won the prestigious Jimmy Nippert Award, honoring the most outstanding male senior student-athlete. He has also coached three winners of the Helen Norman Smith award, honoring the top female student-athlete.

A 1966 graduate of Capital University in Bexley, Ohio, Schnier played baseball for two years before switching to track and eventually setting the school's half-mile record, which still stands. Schnier earned master's degrees from both Wright State and Indiana University in 1977 before earning his doctorate in human performance from Indiana in 1987. He taught history for seven years while coaching cross country and track and field at Trotwood Madison High in Trotwood, Ohio, before heading back to collegiate coaching, accepting an assistantship at Indiana.

Schnier is married to the former Kathy Henn. The couple has three children: Lorraine (28), Ellen (24) and Keller (23). Keller is a decathlete for the UC track and field team.

Susan Seaton oversees both the men's and women's throwers for the University of Cincinnati program and also serves as the assistant coach for the men's team.

Seaton, who joined the UC staff in 2004-05, has already brought success to the Bearcats. Two of her athletes, Steve Kahle (shot put) and Jo Young (hammer) were crowned Conference USA Outdoor Champions in 2005. The Bearcats also recorded three NCAA Mid-East Regional qualifying marks, one NCAA Championship qualifying mark and four school records.

Seaton previously served six years as assistant coach at the University of Wisconsin. She coached student-athletes to four Big Ten crowns, two All-American honors, four NCAA qualifiers and eight school records.

Prior to her stint at Wisconsin, Seaton served for three years as an assistant coach at Northern Arizona University where she produced three All-Americans, 12 conference champions and five NCAA qualifiers.

Seaton was a standout athlete for the East German junior track and field team and competed in various track and field events for over 15 years. At the prime of her career she was a javelin specialist and took third place at the 1989 East German Amateur National Championships and finished in second place at the 1986 National Club Championships.

A native of Saalfeld, Germany, Seaton earned her bachelor's of science from the German College of Sports Science in 1991 and a masters of science in exercises science from the University of Leipzig in 1994. Seaton is USATF Level II certified and a 2005 graduate of the NCAA Women Coaches Academy.

Susan and her husband, Robert, reside in College Hill, Cincinnati, and are parents to sons Patrick (21) and Aidan (1).

A member of the Cincinnati coaching staff since 1984, Jim Schnur was named the head women's track and field coach in 2001. He actively coaches the jumping and

multi events for both programs while striving to build the women's team into a highly competitive program on the national level.

The 2007 season was arguably the best in school history, as the Bearcats captured four BIG EAST Championships - two each during the indoor and outdoor seasons - and sent three qualifiers to the NCAA Championships.

During the 2005 season, the women's team qualified two athletes for the NCAA Championships for the first time in school history and has sent three women to the NCAA Championships over the last four years. He also trained UC's first woman all-American, Mimi Merrill, who placed eighth in the 2001 Indoor NCAA Track and Field Championships in the 20-pound weight throw. Schnur has seen 17 indoor and 21 outdoor school records fall during his tenure as head coach.

Focusing on the multi events, Schnur has built Cincinnati into a dominant force in the decathlon and heptathlon. The Bearcats won six Conference USA decathlon titles in the 10 years of affiliation with the league. He has guided three former walk-on decathletes to the NCAA Championships, including all-American Chris Wineberg in 2004.

Schnur graduated from Cincinnati in 1978 with a degree in psychology. He represented UC in seven NCAA Championships in track and field, competing in the 400 meters (five times) and the decathlon

events and has responsibilities throughout the program including recruiting, team travel and team training.

He finished eighth in the event at the 2004 NCAA Championships, earning the school's first All-American honors in the decathlon. He also holds the UC record in the heptathlon and finished fifth in the event at the U.S. National Championships in 2005 and 2006.

After graduating in 2004 with a bachelor's of science in mechanical engineering, Wineberg was a part-time assistant with the Bearcats while continuing to train and compete on the national level.

A native of South Vienna, Ohio, Wineberg is married to former UC track star Mary Danner. The two were wed in the summer of 2006 and reside in Cincinnati.

Schnur began his career at UC as the sprints and field events coach in 1984. He has personally coached over 90 Conference Champions during his tenure here. He has mentored 10 NCAA Qualifiers and two All-Americans while at UC.

Academic achievement is also stressed under Schnur's watch. Since taking the reigns of the women's program, 57 Bearcats have earned Conference USA Commissioner's Honor Roll accolades, which recognizes those student-athletes who have maintained a cumulative 3.0 grade point average, and over 180 Bearcat (3.0 GPA, quarter) and Topcat (3.5) Scholar honors were awarded in 2005 alone.

Schnur is married to the former Denise Wanner. The couple has four children: Kelly (24), Katie (22), Audrey (19), and Jason (17).







#### WOMEN DOMINATE FIELD EVENTS:

Senior Renee Hein swept the high jump at both the indoor and outdoor BIG EAST championships, capturing the field event MVP honors at the indoor meet. Juniors Tara Meier and Brittany Klima complemented Hein's winnings by capturing the indoor and outdoor pole vault titles, respectively. Hein also made her third and fourth appearances (indoor and outdoor) at the NCAA championships, the most by a female UC track and field athlete. Senior Ashley Wilhelm set school record in two field events (long jump, javelin) and was UC's first female outdoor all-American in the heptathlon.

#### WILHELM CLOSES PHENOMENAL CAREER:

Senior Ashley Wilhelm wrapped up her collegiate career on a record-breaking note in 2007, set three school records and becoming just the second female track and field athlete in school history to earn all-Americaa honors. She was the first to be named an outdoor all-American. Wilhelm holds the school record in the heptathlon, long jump, javelin and pentathlon and was named the UC Track and Field MVP as well as the UC Department of Athletics Female Athlete of the Year in 2007.

#### **KEEPING THEIR MIND ON TRACK:**

Seniors Andrew Smith and Ashley Wilhelm were named to the ESPN The Magazine Academic all-District first and second teams, respectively. Smith got the nod for the second straight year after finishing third in the high jump at the BIG EAST Championships and carrying a 3.82 GPA in industrial management. Wilhelm was an all-American on the track and held a 4.0 in the secondary education graduate program.

Junior Dominique Davis was named an Arthur Ashe Sports Scholar for the second straight year. This award is named after the late tennis legend to honor minority student-athletes that excel not only in their respective sport and in the classroom but also being a positive figure in the community.

Senior Jake Richards was the 2007 recipient of the Jean Stephens Memorial Award, which recognizes a UC student-athlete who demonstrates commitment to team, department and the university. A full Cincinnatus Scholarship recipient, he was co-president of C-PAWS in 2005-06, a member of the University's SAAC, and has been awarded the Men of Metro Service Honorary.





#### **HUNDLEY'S BREAK OUT YEAR:**

Junior Monica Hundley shattered the school records in the indoor 60 meter hurdles (8.72) and outdoor 100 meter hurdles (13.74) in 2007. A regional qualifier in the 100 meter hurdles, Hundley also moved into third on UC's all-time list in the indoor 60 meter dash (7.80) and second in the outdoor 100 meter dash (12.00).

#### MEN SEND DEPTH TO REGIONAL MEET

The Men's squad sent seven to the NCAA Mideast Regional Championships meet including senior Justin Conway and junior Isaac Hendricks in the 4x100 meter relay, freshman Dayo Igeleke in the 100 and 200 meters, sophomore Ian Jarman in the hammer throw, senior Bob Kendall in the 400 meters, sophomore Troy Lammers in the 400 meter hurdles and senior Kevin Schwarz in the 3,000 meter steeplechase.

#### **FRESHMEN STEP UP:**

Freshman Dayo Igeleke made an immediate impact on the men's squad, finishing third in the 100 and fifth in the 200 meters at the BIG EAST Championships. A regional qualifier in the 200 meters, the freshman was a three-time event champion and qualified for the USATF Junior Nationals over the summer.

Freshman Jasmine Cotten was an instant contributor in a number of events for the Bearcats. Cotten held UC's second-best marks in the heptathlon, long jump, the outdoor 200 meters, the outdoor 800 meters and was also a member of the 4x100 and 4x400 meter relays. She finished second in the pentathlon at the All-Ohio Indoor Championships and second in the heptathlon at the All-Ohio Outdoor Championships. Cotten also qualified for the USATF Junior Nationals, finishing fourth in the heptathlon.

#### **LIKE A BROKEN RECORD:**

Ten school records were broken in 2007, all by the women's team.

- Ashley Wilhelm staked her claim to three UC marks: heptathlon (5,515), long jump (20'2") and javelin (139'2").
- Renee Hein set the indoor (6' 1-1/2") and outdoor (6' 0-3/4") high jump marks.
- Monica Hundley topped the UC charts in the indoor 60 hurdles (8.72) and the outdoor 100 hurdles (13.74).
- Brittany Klima set the school mark in the outdoor pole vault (12' 9-1/2").
- Tara Meier set the indoor pole vault mark (12' 11-3/4").
- The women's indoor 4x400 relay squad posted a school-record 3:48.25.




