Xavier Jones • SMU • Sr. • RB • Spring, Texas
Jones rushed for 127 yards and three touchdowns on 16 carries to lead SMU to a 49-27 win against North Texas, improving the Mustangs to 2-0. Jones scored on touchdown runs of 24, 10 and 51 yards, turning in his second straight game with three TDs.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Patrick Nelson • SMU • Sr. • S • Chicago, Ill.
Nelson had seven tackles to go with 2.0 sacks and an interception in SMU's 49-27 win against North Texas. Facing an offense that had put up 51 points and 575 yards a week earlier, Nelson and the Mustangs limited the Mean Green to 396 yards and 27 points.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Dalton Witherspoon • Houston • Jr. • K • Moore, Okla.
Witherspoon scored 13 points, connecting on three field goals and four PATs to help Houston to a 37-17 win against Prairie View A&M. Witherspoon hit a career-best 46-yard field goal in the first quarter and added makes from 22 and 29 yards.

AMERICAN NOTEBOOK

Pow6rful Stuff

The American has registered 36 nonconference victories against other Power 6 opponents (including Notre Dame) since the start of the 2015 season, the first year of The American's current membership.

Pac Mentality

American Athletic Conference teams are a combined 5-0 against the Pac-12 since the start of the 2017 season.

Home Is Where The Wins Are

UCF has won 16 straight home games, trailing only Alabama (27) and Clemson (17) for the nation's longest active streak.

Comforts Of Home

American Athletic Conference teams are a combined 11-2 in home games this season.

First Of Many

ECU coach Mike Houston and Houston coach Dana Holgorsen earned their first head coaching victories at their respective institutions Saturday. Holgorsen and the Cougars topped Prairie View A&M, while Mike Houston and ECU were winners against Gardner-Webb.

Nice To Have You

Temple set two program records in Rod Carey's first game as head coach. The Owls had 507 passing yards and 695 total yards in its 56-12 win against Bucknell.

One And Only

UCF is the only team in FBS football that has only one loss since the start of the 2017 season. UCF is 27-1 since 2017.

Double Thud

Houston and Memphis have both blocked two punts in the 2019 season. Those two schools, along with Penn State, are the only FBS teams with two blocked punts so far.

One Step Forward ...

UCF leads the nation with 65 first downs through two games.

... Two Steps Back

UCF also leads the nation in tackles for loss, averaging 14.0 TFL through two games.

Security Instruments

Despite their having run 161 offensive plays (second in The American), UCF has not committed a turnover in 2019.

Perfection

The American Athletic Conference has five of the 52 remaining unbeaten teams in FBS (UCF, Memphis, Navy, SMU, Temple).

Almost There

SMU is 2-0 for the second time in three seasons. The Mustangs are looking for their first 3-0 start since 1984.

Power Play

American Athletic Conference teams have gone 5-0 against Conference USA, the Mountain West and the Sun Belt this season. Teams from The American are 14-3 against opponents that are not ranked in the top 25.

Keeping Up With Jones

SMU RB Xavier Jones has scored three touchdowns in each of the Mustangs' first two games. Jones' six touchdowns trails only Wisconsin RB Jonathan Taylor, who has eight TDs in 2019.

Quite A Turnaround

UConn is averaging 26.0 points and 271.0 yards allowed on defense through two games. The Huskies did not allow fewer than 444 yards against any of their 12 opponents in 2018 and only held one opponent to fewer than 38 points.

Signal Callers

Ten of The American's 12 teams return their primary starting quarterback from last season. Only UConn and SMU entered the 2019 season without their primary starter from last year.

By The Thousands

The American saw 10 players rush for at least 1,000 yards last season – the most in conference history and the most of any conference in 2018. Six of those players return in 2019. By comparison, The American had one 1,000-yard rusher in 2013 and two in 2014.

Rank And File

The American Athletic Conference placed two teams in the final national polls for the second consecutive season and the fourth time in the league's six-year history in 2018. UCF was ranked No. 11 in the final AP poll and No. 12 in the coaches' poll, while Cincinnati was No. 24 in the AP ranking and No. 23 in the coaches' poll.

Play On

The American placed seven teams in bowl games in the 2018 season (UCF, Cincinnati, Houston, Memphis, USF, Temple, Tulane). The American has had at least seven teams in bowl games in each of the last four seasons.

This Is Our House

Home teams were a combined 30-18 in American Athletic Conference games in 2018. UCF, Temple and Cincinnati all went 4-0 in conference home games. UCF has won eight consecutive conference home games.

It's East vs. West

The American's East Division finished the 2018 season with a 10-8 head-to-head record against the league's West Division, marking the first time in the four-year history of the conference's two-division format that the East had the better head-to-head record. West Division teams hold a 38-34 all-time lead against East Division opponents since 2015.

Prognostication

The 2018 season was the first in which both preseason favorites in The American's East (UCF) and West (Memphis) divisions went on to win division titles.

Conference Call

UCF has won 18 consecutive games against American Athletic Conference opponents since the start of the 2017 season. That is the longest active winning streak nationally for any team in its conference. Clemson ranks second with 14 straight wins against ACC teams, while Alabama has defeated 10 straight SEC opponents.

This Goes To 11

Cincinnati registered its third 11-win season in school history in 2018. The Bearcats had previously won 11 games in 2008 and scored 12 wins in 2009.

New Wave

Tulane won five of its last six games of the 2018 season as the Green Wave played in a bowl game for the first time since 2013 and scored its first bowl victory since the 2002 Hawaii Bowl.

Best Behavior

Navy finished the 2018 season ranked second nationally in fewest penalties (3.69) and penalty yards per game (30.0).

Keep an eye on these American Athletic Conference players, who could challenge for All-America honors in 2019.



Richie Grant, S

All-conference first team selection in 2018 who registered a team-high 109 tackles with six interceptions.



Michael Warren II, RB

Rushed for 1,353 yards and 19 touchdowns, finishing second in The American in rushing at 112.8 yards per game.



Kevin Mensah, RB

Turned in a 1,000-yard season in 2018 (1,042 yards) and has the benefit of a veteran offensive line in 2019.



Holton Ahlers, QB

Emerged as the Pirates' starter midway through the season and led the team in both passing (1,785 yards, 12 TD) and rushing (592 yards, 6 TD) as a freshman.



Mitchell Wilcox, TE

Had 43 receptions for 540 receiving yards and two touchdowns on his way to all-conference first team honors in 2018.



Isaiah Wright, WR

The 2018 American Special Teams Player of the Year scored three special teams touchdowns and was the Owls' third-leading receiver last season.



D'Eriq King

Set an American Athletic Conference record with 50 touchdowns last season (36 passing, 14 rushing) before a season-ending injury.



Patrick Taylor Jr., RB

Rushed for 1,122 yards and 16 touchdowns in 2018 and should see the bulk of the Tigers' carries this season.



Malcolm Perry, QB

Returns to the quarterback spot and has turned in back-to-back 1,000-rushing-yard seasons.



James Proche, WR

Led The American with 93 receptions, 1,199 receiving yards and 12 touchdown catches last season.



Patrick Johnson, DE

Registered 15.5 tackles for loss and 10.5 sacks last season; leads a deep and talented Green Wave defensive line.



Cooper Edmiston, LB

Led the team in tackles (113) and had a hand in seven takeaways in 2018 (four interceptions, three fumble recoveries).

Washington State is off to a 2-0 start after the Cougars took a 59-17 win against Northern Colorado Saturday in Pullman, Washington ... The Cougars are 2-0 for the third consecutive season ... Washington State opened the season with a 58-7 win against New Mexico State, marking the sixth time in program history that the Cougars have registered consecutive 50-point games and the third time under eighth-year head coach Mike Leach ... COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is a big success. Fans, including many who are new to the sport, enjoy it. The first College Football Playoff semifinals and national championship were the three most-viewed programs in cable television history.

Every Game Counts

The playoff preserves the excitement and significance of college football's unique regular season where every game counts.

Four Teams

The selection committee ranks the teams based on the members' evaluation of the teams' performance on the field, using conference championships won, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, and comparison of results against common opponents to decide among teams that are comparable.

Two Games, One Goal

The kickoff of the new year belongs to college football, with two semifinal games rotating annually among the Cotton Bowl, Fiesta Bowl, Orange Bowl, Peach Bowl, Rose Bowl and Sugar Bowl. The two teams winning the playoff semifinals compete for the College Football Playoff National Championship. That game is in a different city each year, always on a Monday night.

Universal Access

Every FBS team has equal access to the College Football Playoff based on its performance. No team automatically qualifies.

Governance

University presidents and chancellors from all 10 FBS conferences and Notre Dame serve on the CFP Board of Managers and govern the administrative operations, with commissioners (the Management Committee) managing the event. A small staff in the playoff office in Irving, Texas, carries out the detailed responsibilities.

Selection Committee

A talented group of high-integrity individuals with experience as coaches, student-athletes, college administrators and journalists, along with sitting athletics directors, comprise the selection committee. Members of the committee are: Rob Mullens (chair), Frank Beamer, Paola Boivin, Jeff Bower, Joe Castiglione, Herb Deromedi, Ken Hatfield, Chris Howard, Bobby Johnson, Ronnie Lott, Gene Smith, Todd Stansbury, and Scott Stricklin.

Selection Committee Responsibilities

- Rank the top 25 teams and assign the top four to semifinal sites.
- Assign teams to New Year's bowls
- Create competitive matchups
- Attempt to avoid rematches of regular-season games and repeat appearances
- Consider geography

Participants In New Year's Bowls

Both participants in the Orange, Rose and Sugar Bowls are contracted outside the playoff arrangement (Big Ten and Pac-12 to Rose Bowl; SEC and Big 12 to Sugar Bowl; ACC to Orange Bowl against the highest ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten and Notre Dame). If a conference champion qualifies for the playoff, then the bowl will choose a replacement from that conference. When those bowls host the semifinals and their contracted conference champions do not qualify, then the displaced champion(s) will play in one of the other New Year's bowls.

When not hosting semifinals, the Cotton, Fiesta and Peach Bowls will welcome displaced conference champions and the top-ranked champion from a non-contract conference. The highest-ranked available teams will fill any other berths. The selection committee will make the pairings.

In addition to the College Football Playoff and New Year's Bowls, The American has either a primary or secondary affiliation with nine bowl games for 2019 season. The American works annually with its member schools and bowl partners to create the most sensible and attractive postseason matchups.

The **Military Bowl presented by Northrop Grumman** takes place at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium in Annapolis, Maryland, while the events and activities surrounding the game are based in Washington, D.C. The American Athletic Conference will face an opponent from the Atlantic Coast Conference in 2019.

The **Birmingham Bowl** takes place at Legion Field in Birmingham, Alabama. The American/Big East has partnered with the bowl since its inception in the 2006 season. The American Athletic Conference will face an opponent from the Southeastern Conference.

The **Bad Boy Mowers Gasparilla Bowl** is played at Raymond James Stadium in Tampa, Florida. Conference USA will provide the opponent for The American's team in the 2019 season.

The **Cheribundi Tart Cherry Boca Raton Bowl** began in 2014 and is played at FAU Stadium in Boca Raton, Florida. The American representative will play a team from the Mid-American Conference in 2019.
