UC WELCOMES MIAMI (OHIO) FOR 127TH BATTLE FOR THE VICTORY BELL

- · Cincinnati hosts Miami (Ohio) for the 127th Battle for the Victory Bell on Saturday at 7 p.m. at Nippert Stadium.
- The UC-Miami series is the oldest non-conference college football rivalry with the first game being played on Dec. 8, 1888.
- The Bearcats will look to extend its 16-game win streak in the historic series and will have momentum after picking up a hardfought statement victory at Pitt, 27-21, on Saturday night at Acrisure Stadium.
- Cincinnati has the nation's highest home winning percentage (96.3%, 26-1 record) since the start of 2019 tying Clemson (96.3%, 26-1). Alabama is just behind at 92.9% (26-2) since 2019. UC has won 33 of its last 34 home games overall.
- The game will be televised on Big 12 Now via ESPN+ and over radio on 102.7 FM WEBN.

STATEMENT VICTORY AT PITT

- Running back Corey Kiner rushed for a career-high 153 yards and one touchdown to lead Cincinnati to a 27-21 victory at Pitt in the renewal of the River City Rivalry.
- The Bearcats' defense held Pitt to just 10-of-32 passing and tallied five sacks and eight TFLs. Linebacker Jack Dingle matched a career-high seven stops and a game-clinching sack in the fourth quarter, the first of his career.
- Redshirt senior cornerback Justin Harris made his first career start in his 35th career game, tying the school record with four
 pass breakups against the Panthers. He is tied for the national lead with six passes defended (five PBUs, one INT).
- Cincinnati raced out to a 10-0 lead at Pitt thanks to explosive rushes and back-to-back three-and-outs from the defense as QB
 Emory Jones tossed a touchdown pass to TE Payten Singletary and Kiner had a career-long 68-yard rush.
- UC led 27-7 with 9:38 left in the third and proved too tough down the stretch holding off Pitt, who closed the deficit to 6.

NATION'S OLDEST NON-LEAGUE RIVALRY RETURNS

- Saturday marks the 127th meeting in the "Battle for the Victory Bell" between Miami (OH) and Cincinnati. The Bearcats lead
 the RedHawks 60-59-7 all-time. UC has won 16 straight games in the matchup and hasn't lost to the RedHawks since 2005.
- The "Victory Bell" is a traveling trophy that the winner gets to keep for the year.
- UC's win last season at Paycor Stadium marked the Bearcats' first lead in the series since 1915.
- The "Battle for the Victory Bell" is the nation's oldest FBS non-league rivalry and second-oldest FBS rivalry overall.
- Last season, Cincinnati scored 31 straight points in a 38-17 win at Paycor Stadium home of the NFL's Cincinnati Bengals. Tre
 Tucker and Tyler Scott both tallied 100 yards receiving. Jowon Briggs and Bryon Threats added sacks, while Mason Fletcher
 boomed a 67-yard punt and averaged 48.2 on five punts.
- The last time the two teams played in Nippert Stadium, UC won 49-14 in 2021 as Desmond Ridder found Tyler Scott for an 81-yard TD bomb on the second play from scrimmage in the season opener.

BEARCATS CELEBRATE 100 YEARS OF NIGHT GAMES

- Cincinnati has a storied history of "Nippert at Night" games. In 1923, UC hosted the first-ever night game in the Midwest with Carson Field serving as the site for a 17-0 win over Kentucky Wesleyan on Sept. 29, 1923. It is believed to be the first major college football night game in the country. (Learn more on Page 5).
- The Bearcats' victory over Pitt on Saturday marked the 14th straight overall night game (5 p.m. kick or later) win for UC.
 Cincinnati hasn't lost a night game since falling at UCF in 2018.
- UC has won nine straight night games at Nippert Stadium, as well. The Bearcats haven't lost a night game at Nippert Stadium since a 35-24 loss to Temple on Nov. 10, 2017.
- Since 2006, Cincinnati holds a 39-12 record in "Nippert at Night" games for a 76.5% winning percentage.

NUMBERS AND NOTES ...

- Opposing quarterbacks are completing just 40.4% (23-57) of passes against UC's defense which is ranks first in the nation.
- Cincinnati ranks 12th in the nation in total offense (519.0) and 19th in rush offense (222.50).
- RB Corey Kiner leads the Big 12 and ranks sixth in the country in rushing yards per game (129.0).
 QB Emory Jones is completing over 75% of his passes and his 199.14 passer rating ranks No. 7 in the country.
- Jones has 57 career total TDs, two 7-TD games, two 300-yard passing games, 22 starts and two P5 conference POTW awards.
- The Bearcats went to back-to-back NY6 Bowls from 2020-21, and were the only G5 team to advance to the CFP (2021).
- · Cincinnati is 661-599-50 (.524) all-time and is playing its 136th football season in 2023 (since 1885, one of 10 oldest in FBS).
- UC returned only one starter on offense: center Gavin Gerhardt, who started all 13 games in 2022.
- Fifth-year senior Jowon Briggs is married and just had his third child on Friday, Aug. 25, with his wife, Nyjae. He was a First Team All-AAC defensive tackle in 2022. A Cincinnati native, he started his career at Virginia before transferring to UC in 2021.
- P Mason Fletcher and DT Dontay "The Godfather" Corleone were preseason All-Big 12 picks. Both players were Third Team All-Americans from the AP in 2022. Corleone was the nation's highest graded defensive player last fall, according to PFF.
- Defensive Coordinator Bryan Brown's Louisville defense led the nation with 50 sacks in 2022.

PRACTICES

During a typical Saturday game week, media may interview players and coaches immediately following practice on Tuesday. Practice is generally closed to the public. Anyone hoping to observe practice should contact UC Athletics Communications in advance. Failure to do so may result in an individual's removal from the venue. During regularseason practices, unless otherwise noted, still and television photographers will be allowed to shoot stretching and select periods.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

All media members will be provided with access to game notes via GoBEARCATS.com. At the quarter breaks and halftime, quickie stats and drive charts will be printed and distributed via email. Following the game, a complete postgame statistics package will be distributed via email and will contain a scoring summary, final team statistics, final individual statistics, complete play-by-play, drive charts for both halves, halftime statistics, defensive statistics, substitution chart, postgame quotes from both head coaches and players and postgame notes.

LIVE STATS

Live in-game statistics will be available via StatBroadcast.

INTERNET

Wireless Internet is available in the press box at Nippert Stadium. Members of the Athletics Communications staff will be available to assist you. There is no access fee.

WEEKLY MEDIA AVAILABILITY

Head Coach Scott Satterfield will be available to the media every Tuesday at noon ET during the season with the exception of UC's bye week. The press conference is streamed live on ESPN+ and @GoBearcats. Players will be made available at the discretion of the coaching staff.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Requests for official working media credentials should be directed to the UC Sports Communications Office. All requests should be received no later than noon, four days prior to the game. Visit the football page at GoBEARCATS.com to request credentials online.

Season credentials will be available for pickup prior to the first game. Credentials may be picked up on gameday at the media will call located at the TUC.

On gameday, media should park in Clifton Court Garage and enter Nippert Stadium through Gate J.

SCOUTING PASSES

Professional scouts may obtain credentials through UC's Athletics Communications Office. Scouts will be issued seating in the press box on a space-available basis.

SIDELINE PASSES

The University of Cincinnati follows NCAA guidelines regarding media representatives on the sidelines. Photographers and videographers are permitted to shoot between the 25-vard lines and the goal lines on both sidelines and behind the restraining line in the end zone.

Behind 337 yards and two touchdowns from quarterback Ben Bryant and a second-half shutout, Cincinnati used 31 unanswered points to run away from Miami (Ohio) 38-17. Charles McClelland tallied his third career 100-yard game with 101 yards on 18 carries and two touchdowns. Tyler Scott (8-119) and Tre Tucker (7-105) became the first Bearcats receiving duo with 100-plus yards as Scott also connected with Bryant for a 41-yard touchdown.

FOR WHOM THE VICTORY BELL TOLLS

- · The Victory Bell is the oldest NCAA FBS non-league rivalry and second-oldest FBS rivalry overall.
- · The first game, on Dec. 8, 1888, was the first college football game played in the state of Ohio.
- North Carolina and Wake Forest played their first game on Oct. 18, 1888, but have only played each other 108 times and not every season.
- The original bell hung in Miami (Ohio)'s Harrison Hall and was used to ring in Miami (Ohio) victories.
- The current trophy is a replica of the original bell and is kept in possession of the winning team each year.
- · One side is painted red and black and shows Cincinnati's victories. The other side is red and white and shows Miami's victories.
- · Wisconsin-Minnesota (131), Georgia-Auburn (127) and North Carolina-Virginia (127) are the only rivalries that have been played more. Oregon-Oregon State has also been played 126 times.

100 YEARS OF NIPPERT AT NIGHT

- This season marks the 100th anniversary of Cincinnati playing what is believed to be the first major college football night game in the country.
- Cincinnati started playing football in 1885 but moved the program to campus in Clifton in 1901. In 1906, UC invented co-operative education, which meant student-athletes on the football team were working downtown during the day. They needed a way to keep practicing when players were on a co-op rotation, so they erected a crude system of lights at Carson Field (where the team still plays today) in 1909. This allowed student-athletes to return to campus from co-op jobs and practice at night. In 1910, a more permanent setup was installed. The team painted the football white in order to see it better in the dark. In 1921 the university upgraded to a more modern incandescent lighting system which was, fittingly, designed by electrical engineering student Jack Silverman as his co-op thesis.
- In 1923, UC took it a step further, staging a regular-season game under the lights—the September 29 season opener against Kentucky Wesleyan. As the Bearcats won the game 17-0, the college football world took notice that the experiment had worked. It was the first college football game played under lights in the Midwest and believed to be the first major college football night game in the country.
- Cincinnati celebrates the 100th anniversary of night football this season, on the same field where the idea was pioneered in 1923

26-1 AT HOME: BEST IN THE NATION

- UC is tied with Clemson for the national lead with a 26-1 (96.3 percent) home record since 2019.
- The EKU win and white-out also marked UC's 12th-straight sellout, and Scott Satterfield became the third-straight UC coach to win his debut. AD John Cunningham presented him a commemorative ball in the locker room postgame.

CINCINNATI DEFEATS RIVAL PITT

- UC's 27-21 win at Pittsburgh was its third-straight against the Panthers, fifth out of the last six and third-straight in Heinz Field/Acrisure Stadium.
- Corey Kiner ran for a career-high 153 yards, which included a 68-yard rush that was both his career-long and UC's biggest of the young season. Emory Jones also threw two touchdown passes.
- The ever-stingy Bearcats defense held Pitt to 10-of-32 passing (31.3), their best mark since UCLA and Dorian Thompson-Robinson went 8-for-26 in the 2019 opener, a 24-14 UC win.
- Senior Justin Harris had four pass breakups in his first start, and Jack Dingle had a career-high seven tackles. Dingle's first-career sack came on Pitt's final fourth-down attempt.
- Cincinnati improved to 4-2 since 2018 in road games against P5 opponents (wins against Pitt, Notre Dame, Indiana, UCLA).

BEARCATS THRIVE AT NIGHT

- Saturday's 27-21 road win at Pittsburgh, a game in which UC led the 2021 ACC champs by 20, was UC's 14thstraight night win. The streak began in the 2019 opener against UCLA at home.
- In fact, UC has won nine-straight Nippert Stadium night games dating back to 2018. Included in that was a game-ending field goal for the 2020 AAC title and perfect regular season.

KINER CRACKS 100 FOR THIRD TIME

- Cincinnati native and 2020 Ohio Mr. Football honoree
 Corey Kiner has game-highs of 105 and 153 yards
 against EKU and Pitt to open the season, the latter being
 a career-high that he surpassed by halftime.
- It was his third-career 100-yard game (106 at Tulsa in 2022). His 68-yard first-quarter run was a career-long as well. He had just 16 carries over his final four games last year.
- Kiner had 79 carries for 324 yards and two TDs for LSU as a freshman in 2021.

JUSTIN HARRIS: 4 PBU IN FIRST START

- Senior cornerback Justin Harris accomplished a rare feat: tying a school record in his first-career start.
- His four pass breakups marked the most since Linden Stephens in 2017 against Miami (Ohio). Former UC and current Notre Dame assistant Mike Mickens also had four in 2006 against Rutgers.
- Harris, playing in his 35th career game, had also suffered a spinal fracture in kickoff coverage against Murray State in Week 2 of the 2021 CFP season, causing him to miss the rest of the way.
- · Harris' interception in the 2023 season opener was his first.

DRIVES AND DOWNS

- Cincinnati has been a driving machine this season, with 10 of its 11 first-half drives so far resulting in a score. Eight have been touchdowns.
- The Bearcats are also 4-for-4 on fourth downs, one of six teams nationally to be perfect on that many attempts. They were 2-for-2 in each of the first two games.

SATTERFIELD ERA STARTS FAST

- Cincinnati scored the ninth-most points (66) in school history, totaled the seventh-most yards (667) and tossed for the sixth-most passing yards in school history (438) in the season-opening 66-13 win over EKU - its last time at Nippert Stadium.
- The first TD of the Satterfield era couldn't be more fitting. On fourth-and-5 from midfield, Satterfield dialed up a 49-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Emory Jones to wide receiver Xzavier Henderson for the first score of the season.

JONES' NAMED BIG 12 POTW

- Jones was named the Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week and Newcomer of the Week on Monday following his seven-touchdown performance in his Bearcats' debut on Saturday in the 66-13 victory over EKU.
- Jones had more touchdown passes (five) than incompletions (four) and finished 19-of-23 for 345 yards and five touchdowns with no interceptions through the air.
 He added two rushing scores and 26 yards on the ground.
- While at UF, he was the SEC Co-Offensive Player of the Week following a standout performance in a win over Tennessee in 2021. He led the Gators to a 38-14 victory over the Volunteers by totaling 209 yards and two touchdowns passing and 144 yards rushing.
- Saturday marked the second seven-touchdown game of Jones' career, as well. He totaled seven touchdowns (six passing, one rushing) during a 550-total-yard performance against Samford in 2021.

NUMBERS TO KNOW

Cincinnati has claimed 14-straight night game wins (5 p.m. or later), including nine in a row at home that dates back to 2018. The Bearcats are seeking their 13thstraight sellout too.

Wide receiver/kick returner Braden Smith is 6-for-11 for 190 yards and two touchdowns in his career. His only pass attempt this season came at Pitt: a 30-yard completion to 2022 Louisville teammate Dee Wiggins.

Cincinnati's 667 total yards vs EKU is the seventh-highest total in school history and marked the most since UC tallied 741 yards vs. Alabama A&M in 2018. The total ranks fifth in college football in 2023.

JONES FEEDS EVERYONE

- · Emory Jones' 49-yard, 4th-and-5 touchdown pass on the opening drive to former Florida teammate Xzavier Henderson was a sign of things to come.
- Jones accounted for a school-record 7 TDs (5 pass, 2 rush), and all five passes were to different receivers. The last UC QB with 5 passing TDs was Gunner Kiel in 2015 vs UCF.
- · He also he had three more TDs accounted-for than the next-closest Bia 12 auarterback in Week 1.
- Henderson postgame said "I have to call him the lunch lady today, because he was feeding everybody."

THAT'S A LOT OF YARDS

- · Freshman Barry Jackson Jr. scored on a 65-yard catch-andrun from redshirt-sophomore Brady Lichtenberg on his firstcareer reception, capping a historic offensive performance.
- The 667 yards were seventh in school history, while the 66 points were ninth and the most since 2013. The program record for the latter is 124 against Transylvania in 1912.
- Satterfield now has 12 games of 600-plus yards as a head coach. While at Louisville, he had 687 against Duke in 2021 and 600-plus against Boston College and Syracuse in 2019 (full listing on page 10).

VICTORY BELL: OLDIE AND A GOODIE

- · Cincinnati and Miami (Ohio) have the fifth-longest rivalry (126 games), and it is the oldest in Division I west of the Allegheny Mountains.
- Cincinnati, which leads 60-59-7, has won 16-straight dating back to 2006 (no 2020 contest).
- UC won 38-17 inside the Bengals' Paycor Stadium, as well as 49-21 in the 2021 opener to kick off the CFP season.

THE X-FACTOR

- · Senior WR Xzavier Henderson totaled a career-best 149 yards on a career-best-tying seven catches, including the first TD of the 2023 season for the Bearcats - a 49-yard touchdown on a 4th-and-5 pass from Emory Jones. He added 26 yards on kick returns to lead all Big 12 players with 174 yards of all-purpose yards during Week 1 action
- He was PFF's highest-graded receiver (92.5) in Week 1.
- · A transfer from Florida, he led the Gators in receptions (38) in 2022 and was a coveted recruit who held offers from Alabama, Georgia and LSU among others. He won the Florida 4A state 400m title in a blazing fast 46.77 time and was a U.S. Army All-American.

GET TO KNOW THE BEARCATS

· The University of Cincinnati Department of Athletics competes at the highest level of intercollegiate athletics with the vision to reach Next Level Success for all 18 varsity teams and more than 450 student-athletes. The Bearcats have a proud athletics history, winning eight national championships and 118 conference titles. The Cincinnati men's basketball team is among the 15

- winningest programs all-time, while the football team became the first non-Power Five program to compete in the College Football Playoff in 2021. Olympic gold medalist volleyball player Jordan Thompson, NBA Hall of Famer Oscar Robertson and Major League Baseball legend Sandy Koufax are among the several luminaries who have competed as Bearcats.
- The Bearcats entered a new era as a Power Five School on July 1 when they officially joined the Big 12 Conference, positioning Cincinnati among the nation's premier athletics programs.
- · Off the field, UC student-athletes continue to find success, collectively posting a 3.4 GPA in spring 2023 with 78% earning spots on the Honor Roll.
- Under the leadership of Director of Athletics John Cunningham, and supported by more than 150 full-time staff members, UC Athletics' mission is to connect our community, enhance our university and impact the lives of student-athletes as they prepare to change the world on and off the field.

THIS IS BIG

- · Cincinnati joined the Big 12 on July 1, 2023, along with UCF. Houston and BYU.
- · After 25 years as a football independent (1970-1995), Cincinnati joined Conference USA in 1996 before becoming a member of the BIG EAST in 2005 and then The American in 2013.

AN ELITE PROGRAM BY THE NUMBERS

- · Any way you look at it over the last five, 10, 15 and 20 years - Cincinnati has proven to be one of the nation's top programs.
- · UC ranks as the sixth-winningest program in the FBS since 2018 (last five years) with a 55-11 (83%) mark. Cincinnati joins Alabama (63), Georgia (61), Clemson (60) Ohio State (56), Notre Dame (55) and Oklahoma (51) as the only teams to average at least 10 wins per season since
- · Cincinnati is the 14th winningest program since 2013 (the last 10 years) with a record of 88-41 (68%), winning three conference championships and advancing to eight bowls, including two New Year's Six bowls in that time frame.
- The Bearcats became the first-ever "Group of Five" team to advance to the College Football Playoff in 2021, defeating No. 9 Notre Dame on the road and finishing undefeated in the regular season along the way.
- Since 2008, Cincinnati has the 12th-most wins in college football (last 15 years) with a 134-59 (69%) mark. The Bearcats have won an astounding seven conference championships over the last 15 years with only Oklahoma (nine), Ohio State (eight), Alabama (eight) and Clemson (seven) matching that feat. UC also has four NY6 bowl appearances and three AP Top 10 finishes in that time.
- Cincinnati (2021) is one of only 15 teams ever to play in the College Football Playoff and join Oklahoma (2016, 2019, 2020) and TCU (2022) as the only current Big 12 teams to ever qualify for College Football's Final Four.

CFP+MF4 APPEARANCE

- · Cincinnati is one of 11 schools one of two in the Big 12 with Oklahoma - to have a Men's Final Four and College Football Playoff appearance in it's athletic history.
- · Cincinnati became the first non-Power 5 team to make

the College Football Playoff after finishing as the nation's only undefeated team in 2021 and has advanced to six Men's Final Fours.

LOOKING AT THE 2023 SCHEDULE

- · The Bearcats joined the Big 12 on July 1, setting up what will be the most exciting football schedule in school history.
- · Cincinnati hosts seven games at Nippert Stadium.
- Cincinnati's first conference game as a member of the Big 12 will be a marquee matchup against Oklahoma on Sept. 23 inside Nippert Stadium.
- Other highlights include renewing old BIG EAST rivalries with road contests at Pitt and West Virginia.

NOTING THE 2023 SCHEDULE

- · EKU (Sept. 2): Cincinnati claimed its 22nd-straight homeopening win behind 667 yards (seventh in school history) and 66 points (ninth-most). QB Emory Jones accounted for school-record 7 TDs while throwing TD passes to five different receivers.
- Pitt (Sept. 9): Cincinnati defeated its old Big East rival for the third-straight time in what was the first meeting since 2012. Corey Kiner ran for a career-high 153 yards, surpassing his career-high by halftime, and UC built a 27-7 lead before staving off Pitt's rally.
- Miami (Ohio) (Sept. 16): The Battle for the Victory Bell remains the longest continuous non-conference rivalry in FBS college football and the oldest rivalry in the FBS with the first game played in 1888. UC leads 60-59-7.
- · Oklahoma (Sept. 23): Sooners' first trip to Nippert Stadium; two of only 15 programs to appear in CFP meet for first time since 2010. UC and OU are two of only seven teams to win 50 games since 2018.
- BYU (Sept. 29): Big 12 newcomers previously had homeand-home series in 2015 and 2016 with the Cougars winning both matchups.
- Iowa State (Oct. 14): First meeting
- Baylor (Oct. 21): First meeting
- Oklahoma State (Oct. 28): Fourth all-time meeting and first since 1983.
- UCF (Nov. 4): Bearcats have won three of the last four matchups, but dropped the 2022 contest in Orlando. The Bearcats and the Knights spent recent years as the top two G5 teams. UCF won 25 straight games and two AAC titles in 2017 and 2018. Cincinnati actually handed UCF its first AAC loss in three years in a historic 27-24 Friday night win in 2019 which propelled the Bearcats to backto-back league titles and AP Top 10 finishes in 2020-21.
- Houston (Nov. 11): 29 meetings are the most among any 2023 opponent; UC has won three in a row from 2019-21, including the 2021 AAC Championship Game which secured the first ever 13-0 start in school history.
- West Virginia (Nov. 18): Former Big East rivals meet for 21st time and first since 2011.
- · Kansas (Nov. 25): Cincinnati won 34-7 in Nippert Stadium in 1997, one of two matchups all-time.

SATTERFIELD SYNOPSIS

- · Cincinnati head coach Scott Satterfield begins his first spring at the helm of the Bearcats. He was hired as UC's 43rd head coach on Dec. 5, 2022.
- Satterfield brings an outstanding 77-48 record (.616) in 10 years as a head coach at Louisville and Appalachian

State, holding a winning mark in seven seasons in addition to a 4-1 record in bowl games.

- He led the Mountaineers from the FCS to the FBS and to three straight conference titles.
- · He lifted the Cardinals up from a 2-10 campaign in 2018 to an 8-5 record in his first season in 2019.
- · A Durham, N.C., native, Satterfield was the 2018 Sun Belt Coach of the Year at Appalachian State before earning 2019 ACC Coach of the Year honors after leading the Cardinals to a six-win improvement in his first year.
- Satterfield has deep ties to App State, serving as an assistant coach (1998-08) and quarterback for the Mountaineers (1991-95), helping lead his alma mater to three NCAA Division I FCS national titles and eight conference championships along the way.

OFFENSIVE FIREPOWER UNDER SATTERFIELD

- Scott Satterfield's offenses have been among the nation's best during his time at Appalachian State, Louisville, and now, Cincinnati.
- The Satterfield-led 66-point offense explosion against EKU is tied for the second most points scored in his coaching career and is the sixth time his offense has scored more than 60 points in a game. In his second year at the helm of Appalachian State (2014) he led the Mountaineers to a 66-0 victory over Campbell. His most recent 60-point win was during his tenure at Louisville as the Cardinals defeated Duke 62-22 in 2021.
- It also marks the 12th time a Satterfield-coached team has amassed 600 yards of total offense in a game.

TWO ALL-AMERICANS RETURN

- Redshirt sophomore defensive tackle Dontay Corleone burst onto the national scene in 2022, earning Third Team All-American honors from the Associated Press and Pro Football Focus. He was famously nicknamed "The Godfather," and rated PFF's top defensive player in the country for 2022 (94.7) and the No. 2 returning interior defensive lineman for 2023. His 94.7 percent run-grade was the best by PFF since Micah Parsons in 2019 and the fifth-highest for a single season by a defensive lineman, edge or linebacker since 2014. The Cincinnati Colerain High School product tallied 45 tackles, 5.5 TFLs, three sacks, two fumble recoveries and two forced fumbles in 2022
- Corleone was also named the No. 7 draft-eligible DT underclassman by The Athletic's Dane Brugler in the presenson.
- Junior Mason Fletcher also collected Third Team All-American honors from the AP and was a Ray Guy Award finalist. He will arguably the top returning punter in the country after earning AAC Special Teams Player of the Year honors and ranking fifth in the country with a 46.2 average. The Melbourne, Australia native booted 14 50+ punts and his long of 84 yards set against SMU shattered the Cincinnati and AAC record for longest punt.

WEALTH OF KICK AND PUNT RETURNERS

- Cincinnati returns fifth-year running back Ryan Montgomery, whose 684 punt return yards rank third in school history. He is joined by several transfers with solid special-teams resumes.
- Defensive back D.J. Taylor, a three-year letterwinner at Arizona State, had a 107-yard KR score against Arizona in 2020 while ranking third in the nation with a 36.9-yard average.
- Braden Smith had a 30-yard punt return against Kentucky in 2022 and a career-long 49-yard touchdown versus EKU in 2021.

 Xzavier Henderson had 34 punt and nine kickoff returns in his three years at Florida, including returns of 48 yards against Missouri and 28 at Texas A&M in 2022. He also returned a punt 33 yards against FAU in the 2021 opener.

DON'T FORGET ABOUT ERIC PHILLIPS

Preseason All-America redshirt sophomore nose tackle
Dontay "The Godfather" Corleone and senior defensive
end Jowon Briggs get the bulk of the media attention, but
Eric Phillips has proven to be star in his own right. Entering
his second year as a starting defensive end, the Cincinnati
native finished with 2 TFL, a sack and forced fumble versus
EKU. For his career, he has 11 TFL and five sacks, all over
the last two seasons.

GRZESIAK LEADS DEFENSE IN DEBUT

- Another solid Week 1 performer was Daniel Grzesiak, rated the 20th-best available transfer by The Athletic's Max Olson, who had a team- and career-high seven tackles in his UC debut, including a strip-sack and fumble recovery on the same play. The Los Angeles native came by way of Utah State and Nevada before then.
- Taj Ward also had a career-high six tackles, while Justin Harris and Bryon Threats earned their first and third-career interceptions, respectively.

UC DEFENSE SHOULD CAUSE HAVOC

- Cincinnati associate head coach / defensive coordinator Bryan Brown's defense should cause havoc after his Louisville team led the nation with 50 sacks in 2022.
- Brown has plenty of weapons at his disposal with All-American nose tackle Dontay Corleone and fellow all-conference defensive lineman Jowon Briggs pairing with newcomer Daniel Grzesiak, an edge rusher who transfers in from Utah State where he had had 8.5 sacks last season, and sixth-year senior defensive end Malik Vann (nine career sacks) to lead the Bearcats' front seven.
- Brown's Cardinals defense also finished third in turnovers forced (30), seventh in TFLs (97) and 11th in points allowed (19.2) in 2022.

CHEF MYLES MONTGOMERY

- Redshirt sophomore running back Myles Montgomery, one
 of the fastest players on the team, has proven that he is
 ready to take on a larger role this fall after totaling 14
 attempts for 120 yards and a touchdown in six games in
 2022.
- Another element to his game, even if off the field, is his cooking.
- This fall, he said his favorite thing to make is pasta and that
 he is trying to perfect steak. He also previously cited his pot
 roast, potatoes and carrots as a staple. He and tight end
 Chamon Metayer, a classmate and fellow Floridian, were
 roommates, with Montgomery saying teammates would
 always come over for different meals the two cooked.

WHO IS NEW AT QUARTERBACK

 Cincinnati signed transfer quarterback Emory Jones in the early signing period in December. He has started 20 games at Arizona State and Florida, and thrown for 4,880 yards and 33 touchdowns over 45 career games. He started 12 games at Florida in 2021 and finished with 2,734 yards and 19 touchdowns to go along with 758 yards and four touchdowns on the ground.

- Brady Drogosh, a 6-4 true freshman, joins the Bearcats as a four-star recruit and Michigan's No. 1 prospect. He was named Michigan's Mr. Football in 2022 after throwing for 2,264 yards and 35 touchdowns to go along with 1,340 rushing yards for De La Salle Collegiate.
- RS sophomore Brady Lichtenberg went 4-for-4 for 93 yards as the second-stringer against EKU, his first-career passing attempts. He hit freshman Barry Jackson Jr. for a 65-yard score late in the game.

BRADEN SMITH TAKES TO THE AIR

- · Louisville transfer wide receiver Braden Smith is not only a 4.4 40-yard dash extraordinaire; the 23-year-old is a certified pilot. He took up the journey shortly after his three-catch, 45-yard Fenway Bowl performance against Cincinnati in December.
- · Smith's long-term goals include flying cargo for UPS or FedEx, but says he remains open to airlines.
- "I just enjoy the thrill of being hands-on and being in control and going through procedures and things of that nature," Smith said to the Cincinnati Enquirer. "The first time I went up I was kind of shakin' at the knees. I didn't know what to expect. Luckily, I had a really good instructor and was able to keep flying. I got more confident with it, and once I was able to get my license, I really built up that confidence in myself."
- Smith, who had a 48-yard touchdown catch in his debut against EKU, had 59 receptions for 653 yards for Louisville from 2020-22 after transferring from Northwest Mississippi CC.

SMITH A PILOT ON THE FIELD, TOO

- Braden Smith's 30-yard completion on a WR pass to 2022 Louisville teammate Dee Wiggins, which set up a touchdown at Pitt, was a familiar sight.
- For his career, Smith is 6-for-11 with 190 yards and two touchdowns. He was also a quarterback in high school.

SINGLETARY BECOMING TD MACHINE

- · Senior tight end Payten Singletary hauled in his thirdcareer TD to put UC ahead 7-0 in the Pitt win, and he has three scores on eight career catches.
- · Of Emory Jones' seven touchdown passes, two have gone to Singletary and the other five to first-year transfers.
- · UC has won every game in which Singletary has a score (2021 Miami (Ohio) and 2023 EKU/Pitt).

NEW FACES AT WIDE RECEIVER

- · The Cincinnati wide receiver room returns just one scholarship receiver in redshirt junior Chris Scott, but it added loads of experience to offensive coordinator/wide receivers coach Brad Glenn's room.
- O Braden Smith (Louisville) Appeared in 29 games as a wide receiver and kick specialist for Louisville, where he hauled in 59 receptions for 653 yards and two touchdowns from 2020-22 after transferring from Northwest Miss. CC.
- 2 Dee Wiggins (Louisville) Veteran who brings 22 games of starting experience during stints at Louisville and Miami. Spent four seasons at Miami from 2018 to 2021 where he appeared in 40 games at wide receiver. Totaled 791 receiving yards on 62 receptions for seven touchdowns as a Hurricane. Played three games at Louisville in 2022 before a season-ending injury.
- 3 Evan Prater (QB at UC) Started two games behind

- center for the Bearcats in 2022 and was previously a backup for Desmond Ridder. Moved to wide receiver this summer. Had 166 yards on the ground as a quarterback and is a natural athlete.
- 8 Xzavier Henderson (Florida) Led Florida with 38 receptions in 2022, while also totaling 410 receiving yards and two touchdowns. He appeared in 35 games, recording 73 catches for 835 yards and five touchdowns with the Gators from 2020-22. Former teammate of UC starting quarterback Emory Jones.
- 9 Aaron Turner (UConn) Appeared in all 25 games for UConn from 2021-22, totaling 90 receptions for 759 yards and three touchdowns, in addition to 75 more yards on the ground. Led the Huskies in receptions, his second straight season with a team-high in catches, yards and touchdowns in 2022, finishing with 57 catches for 527 yards and three scores after hauling in in 33 catches for 232 yards in 2021.
- 11 Donovan Ollie (Washington St.) Experienced receiver who brings 24 career starts, 70 receptions, 807 yards, four touchdowns and two years of eligibility to the Bearcats following four seasons as a member of the Washington State program. Made 11 starts and appeared in 12 games in 2022, tallying 43 receptions for 491 yards and three scores. Overlapped one season with the late Mike Leach, whose Texas connections brought him to Pullman.
- · 14 Barry Jackson (High School) Four-star recruit according to Rivals and one of the top 50 prospects in the state of Georgia according to 247Sports.
- 84 Sterling Berkhalter (NC A&T) Cincinnati native who played in 16 games with 13 starts over two seasons (2021-22) at North Carolina A&T. Totaled 35 receptions for 476 vards and two scores. Made 10 starts in 2022, tallvina 28 receptions for 414 yards and both career touchdowns. Attended Georgia Prep Academy prior to college.

CONTINUING THE PACE

- · Deshawn Pace moved from linebacker to the "Star" DB position in Bryan Brown's defense. The "Star" is a hybrid nickel back / linebacker position meant to utilize Pace's elite athleticism.
- · Pace is poised to be a leader on UC's defense following a productive last two seasons. He started 12 games over 2021-22, tallying 157 tackles and 14.5 for loss to go with five interceptions. He was also an AAC Honorable Mention performer during the 2021 CFP season as sophomore.
- · In 2021, he finished sixth in the AAC with 94 tackles, while adding nine TFLs and a team-high four interceptions as a playmaking force on the best team in program history.

HALL OF FAME BLOODLINES

- Redshirt-sophomore safety Antwan Peek Jr. is following in his father's Cincinnati Athletics Hall of Fame footsteps.
- · The elder Peek is UC's all-time leader in sacks (27.0), tackles for loss (56.0), forced fumbles (17) and blocked kicks (7). He was a third round pick (No. 67 overall) by the Houston Texans in the 2003 in the NFL Draft and played five seasons in the NFL, including four with the Texans and one with the Browns, finishing with 28 starts.
- Peek, a walk-on who was put on scholarship, was cited by Satterfield prior to the season-opener as someone to
- "The guy that's kind of stuck out this August camp was Antwan Peek. He's a guy who was down the depth chart and now after the spring, he's number two safety. He a guy

that will get to play, I mean he's going to get some good playing time."

HE COULD BE THE NATION'S BEST

- · Junior punter Mason Fletcher ranked fourth in the nation and second in the AAC with a 46.2 average and was named to the Ray Guy Award watch list, in addition to multiple Preseason All-America honors.
- · He has six punts for a 40.5-yard average in 2023, with three inside the 20.
- 29 of his 62 punts (47%) in 2022 were downed inside the 20-yard line with 12 downed inside the 10.
- He has 14 punts of 50+ and three 60-yarders, including a school and AAC record 84 on his first SMU attempt.
- · His 65.0 average at SMU also set AAC and UC records and gave Fletcher AAC Special Teams honors.
- The Melbourne, Australia native faced his brother, Max Fletcher, a freshman punter for Arkansas, in the 2022 season opener at Arkansas. Mason and Max's parents, Dustin and Suzanne, flew from Australia for the game. It marked the first time in nearly two years that Mason had seen his brother and mother. Fletcher's father, Dustin, a 23-year veteran in Australian Rules Football, came to the Cotton Bowl last season.

HARD TICKET TO COME BY

- Cincinnati football officially sold out of season tickets for the 2023 football season, selling more than 25,300 to set a new school record in August.
- · It's the second time in history that UC has sold out of season tickets.XF
- · Last season, UC set a record with just over 22,000 season tickets sold.
- · Cincinnati has sold out 12 consecutive home games dating back to the third home game of 2021, as well.

LT AN AEROSPACE ENGINEER

- · The offensive line is a cerebral position, and redshirtjunior offensive lineman John Williams has proven it as he pursues a starting job at left tackle.
- Williams, an aerospace engineering major, played in 12 of 13 games last year and 12 more in 2021, including

- starting the first three for the eventual CFP Bearcats. He cites NASA and Boeing as two places he would like to work for once his career is over.
- "I do take a good amount of pride in it," he told Sports Illustrated about his heavy academic balance. "It's hard to juggle, and I'll say I don't sleep much, but I like to work hard and it is what it is."

BUFORD HAS SEEN THE BEST

- · Redshirt junior and Kentucky transfer Deondre Buford claimed the starting right tackle spot.
- · The Detroit native, who went to the same Martin Luther King HS as Ahmad "Sauce" Gardner, appeared in all 13 games for UK in 2022 at both guard and tackle, while earning a pair of starts. One of those was against defending and eventual national champion Georgia.

THE LONE RETURNING STARTER ON OFFENSE

- The coaching change and transfer portal has made for a completely different offensive depth chart this season.
- Redshirt-junior center Gavin Gerhardt is the only returning offensive starter, having taken on all 13 games last year and proving to be one of the Bearcats' best on the line. He snapped for two quarterbacks with vastly different styles and paved the way for three different running backs to tally 100-yard rushing games.
- Not only that, he was emerging as a starting guard in 2022 fall camp before a season-ending injury to incumbent center Jake Renfro.

ANDERSON JR. GOES FROM NB2 TO CB1

- Redshirt junior Sammy Anderson Jr. has made quite the impression on his new defensive coaches, poising himself to be a breakout performer.
- He previously backed up sixth-year nickel Taj Ward but has since moved over to a starting cornerback role. He credits position coach Kerry Coombs, one of two assistants to stay on from Fickell to Satterfield, as a key influence in staying at Cincinnati, even referring to him as a father figure.
- Last year was Anderson Jr.'s first as a main contributor, appearing in all 13 games while rotating with Ward as the first-string nickel. He finished with 19 tackles, 2.5 TFLs and once forced fumble, as well as earning his first corner start in the Wasabi Fenway Bowl.

CARTER BROWN STAYS PERFECT

- Arizona State transfer Carter Brown was 9-for-9 on PATs in his debut (second-most in UC history as well), remaining perfect on all 45 tries of his career.
- · He has made all three field goal attempts this year (including two of 46 and 47 yards), putting him 7-for-9 from 40-plus in his career.

DUAL-THREAT DROGOSH

- True freshman quarterback Brady Drogosh turned heads in his first collegiate spring and fall camp, despite coming in as arguably UC's top high-school signee.
- · The Warren, Mich., native was a consensus four-star recruit and rated the No. 1 player in the state, a top-five quarterback and top-50 national prospect by On3. While the 6-foot-4, 215-pound gunslinger has displayed a fluid throwing motion, he also unleashed a 99-yard touchdown run in a fall-camp scrimmage at Nippert Stadium in front of several fans.
- He and redshirt-sophomore Brady Lichtenberg have battled for the No. 2 spot behind Emory Jones.

BEARCATS IN SEASON OPENERS

· Cincinnati has won 22-straight home openers, beginning with an overtime win over TCU in 2002. This season was a 66-13 win over Eastern Kentucky.

FREAKS LIST

- · UC boasted three members of Bruce Feldman's annual "Freaks" list for the third-straight season.
- Tyler Scott, Tre Tucker and Josh Whyle earned the honors in 2022, while Desmond Ridder, Alec Pierce and Mviai Sanders garnered 2021 nods. All six are now on NFL rosters.
- Defensive lineman Jowon Briggs, an eclectic music persona with the piano, guitar, bass, drums, sax, flute, cello, violin, viola, harmonica and his tenor voice, squatted 700 in high school. He deadlifted 655 this offseason and did 31 bench-press reps at 225. He also hit 18.6 MPH and 4.89 in the pro shuttle.
- Fellow defensive lineman Dontay Corleone benches 485, squats 605 and deadlifts 700. He can also hit 18 MPH on the GPS with a 4.68 pro shuttle, something only one other 300-pound defensive lineman could do faster at the NFL Combine.
- · Deshawn Pace, the 6-2, 212-pound senior star (hybrid nickel/linebacker) hit 21.21 MPH with a speedy 1.51 10yard split. He also benches 340 pounds and can do 25 pull-ups.

BEARCATS FIND NFL SUCCESS

- · Cincinnati has seen 16 Bearcats drafted since the start of 2021 - second-most in the Big 12 in that time span. The list includes Ahmad "Sauce" Gardner, who was selected fourth overall by the New York Jets in 2022 and went on to earn All-Pro and NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year honors.
- · While Gardner took the NFL by storm as a rookie, Travis and Jason Kelce turned in dominant seasons once again. The brothers, who both starred for the Bearcats more than a decade ago, each earned All-Pro and faced off in Super Bowl LVIII. The Kansas City Chiefs won the league crown and Travis Kelce was joined by fellow Bearcat Bryan Cook, a rookie safety.

TAKE ME TO HIGHER GROUND

- · For the past 25 years, the UC football has called the Higher Ground Conference and Retreat Center in West Harrison, Ind., its preseason training home.
- · The 280-acre facility is located about 30 miles from campus and has served as the Bearcats training camp location since the lead up to the 1999 season.

· Higher Ground has two 100-yard turf practice fields, including a new surface installed in 2017, ample living and meeting spaces and no distractions from football.

CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY

- · UC won the 2021 and 2020 AAC Championships, its 15th and 16th league titles, for its first two since 2014 and first outright crowns since 2009.
- UC played in its third-straight AAC title game in 2021.
- Each of the last two were played at Nippert Stadium. UC toppled No. 16 Houston in 2021 after defeating No. 23 Tulsa on Cole Smith's game-ending 34-yard field goal. That first game, played on Saturday, Dec. 19 at Nippert Stadium, marked the latest date a game was played in Nippert since a matchup vs. Xavier on Dec. 7, 1918.






CARSON FIELD AT NIPPERT STADIUM

CARSON FIELD AT NIPPERT STADIUM HAS BEEN THE VENERABLE HOME OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CINCINNATI FOOTBALL TEAM SINCE 1901 AND PROVIDES A PHENOMENAL HOME-FIELD ENVIRONMENT.

HARD TICKET TO COME BY

- · Cincinnati football officially sold out of season tickets for the first time ever prior to the 2022 football season, selling more than 23,500 to set a new school. The Bearcats accomplished the feat again in 2023.
- · The Bearcats are currently on single-game sellout streak spanning 11 contests entering 2023.

A MODERN CLASSIC

- · In 1915, construction was completed on the first sections of a brick and concrete structure to replace the wooden stands and continued for several seasons as funds were raised.
- · In 1924, the completed structure was dedicated as James Gamble Nippert Memorial Stadium with a capacity of 12.000.
- · UC has used the Nippert site as a playing field since 1901, making it the second-oldest playing site in the nation for college football behind Penn's Franklin Field (1895).
- · Among NCAA FBS schools, Nippert is the third-oldest stadium still in use, behind Bobby Dodd Stadium (Georgia Tech - 1913), Davis Wade Stadium (Mississippi State - 1914) and ahead of Ole Miss' Vaught-Hemingway Stadium (1915) and Wisconsin's Camp Randall Stadium (1917).
- Through numerous renovations, the structure situated in the middle of the Clifton campus has retained its early-century brickwork, wrought-iron gates, and trim giving Nippert a comfortable old-time stadium charm and appeal, while remaining a classic showplace for college football.
- The third-oldest NCAA FBS stadium entered a new era in 2015 following the completion of a 20-month, \$86-millon, privately funded renovation and expansion project.
- · The post-renovation season in 2015 coincided with the 100th anniversary of the original 1915 construction.

FOR THE FANS

- · Both concourses were renovated and widened and now feature nearly 75 permanent point-of-sale concession locations are available on game days.
- Concession stands feature the usual stadium staples along with offerings from premium local vendors, including Frisch's, Montgomery Inn and Skyline Chili.
- Enhancements were added in 2019, including: new tailgating spots, social gathering spaces, fans-first pricing and a seasonlong DJ for in-game entertainment.

WHAT'S IN A NAME?

- During the season-ending clash with rival Miami (OH) in 1923, Jimmy Nippert sustained a spike wound injury and died a month later from blood poisoning.
- His grandfather, James N. Gamble of Procter and Gamble, provided the funds needed to complete the horseshoe-shaped structure, and the James Gamble Nippert Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Nov. 8, 1924.
- The stadium's founder was Arch Carson, who as captain and principal organizer played a significant role in starting football on the UC campus in 1885. In 1901 as physical director of the university, Carson guided the construction of the field which was later named for him -- the playing surface is still called Carson Field.

THE WEST PAVILION

- · The most striking changes sit five stories above the west concourse. At 105,000 square feet and 130 yards long, the West Pavilion rises out of the stadium concourse in glass and angles which contain a host of new premium seating along with state-of-the-art press facilities.
- The curvature of the facility matches that of Herschede-Shank Pavilion on the east side of the stadium and contains four levels: the Margaret & Michael Valentine press and suite level. suite level, scholarship club level, and patio mezzanine level.
- UC went from having nearly no premium seating options to the addition of 1,100 scholarship club seats and 53 indoor and outdoor suites of varying sizes. A skywalk connects Tangeman University Center to the West Pavilion with premium area customers able to access the facility on gameday from the other side of campus.

TQL PARTNERSHIP BOLSTERS NIPPERT STADIUM

- · Total Quality Logistics (TQL), the second-largest freight brokerage firm in North America and Cincinnati's largest private company, and UC announced in January 2023 a longterm strategic partnership that will include field level and stadium signage and logo assets for TQL as well as specific investment to the Bearcats' indoor practice and performance facility project.
- TQL's logo will appear on Carson Field in two places.
- While field surface branding typically results in renaming the venue, as a Cincinnati company, TQL has chosen to not name the field. It will continue to be named Carson Field in honor of Dr. Arch Carson, who organized the first football team at the university in 1885 and is known as the Father of UC Football.

HEAD COACH SCOTT SATTERFIELD | FIRST SEASON

2018 SUN BELT AND 2019 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR

Bringing a history of success as the leader of two programs, Scott Satterfield was hired as Cincinnati football's 43rd head coach on Dec. 5, 2022.

Satterfield holds a 76-48 record (.612) in 10 years as head coach at Louisville and Appalachian State, earning a winning mark in seven seasons and a 4-1 record in bowl games. He led the Mountaineers' transition to the Football Bowl Subdivision and to three straight conference titles and four bowl appearances from 2013 to 2018 before taking over the Cardinals in 2019.

Employing an explosive offensive attack, Satterfield led Louisville to three bowls in four seasons. He lifted the Cardinals from a 2-10 campaign in 2018 to an 8-5 record in his first season in 2019.

A Durham, N.C., native, Satterfield was the 2018 Sun Belt Coach of the Year at Appalachian State before earning 2019 ACC Coach of the Year honors after leading the Cardinals to a six-win improvement

Satterfield, who is 50, led Appalachian State from the FCS into the FBS as the head coach after serving as an assistant coach (1998-08) and augrterback for the Mountaineers (1991-95), helping lead his alma mater to three NCAA Division I FCS national titles and eight conference championships along the way. Famously, Satterfield was the offensive play-caller and guarterbacks coach for App State's historic 34-32 upset of No. 5 Michigan to open the 2007 season.

Under Satterfield, Louisville was the only team in the country to average more than 200 yards rushing and 200 yards passing each vear from 2019 to 2022.

Additionally, Satterfield's rushing attacks have averaged more than 200 yards and ranked in the nation's top 30 in all eight years he has been an FBS head coach.

While at Louisville, he compiled a 25-24 record and saw 32 players collect All-ACC honors. Six Cardinals were selected in the NFL Draft during Satterfield's tenure as well, including 2023 selections YaYa Diaby (third round), Yasir Abdullah (fifth round) and Kei'Trel Clark (sixth round).

Louisville quarterback Malik Cunningham signed a guaranteed free-agent contract with the New England Patriots in 2023.


In 2022, Satterfield led Louisville to a 7-5 mark and saw 13 players collect all-conference accolades. The Cardinals appeared in the College Football Playoff Rankings and beat two Top-25 teams. Louisville led the nation in total sacks (50), finished third in takeaways (30) and ranked 11th nationally and tops in the ACC in scoring defense (19.2).

The 2021 Louisville squad was led by a potent offense that averaged 31.6 points per game and ranked 21st nationally with 446.2 yards of total offense per game. Cunningham proved to be one of the country's top dual-threat quarterbacks, rushing for 1,031 yards and an ACC-leading 20 touchdowns while passing for 2,940 yards and another 19 scores.

Louisville was also explosive in 2020, leading the nation with nine plays of 60+ yards and six plays of more than 70 yards while ranking fifth in the ACC in total offense (444.2).

In 2019, Satterfield guided Louisville to the biggest turnaround in college football, increasing the Cardinals' win total by six and vaulting UofL to the Top 25 in total offense and rushing in his first year. Individually, a pair of Cardinals posted the best statistical seasons in school history, Javian Hawkins broke the school record for rushing yards (1,525) by a running back, while wide receiver Tutu Atwell set the Louisville record for receiving yards (1,276) and tied the school mark with 12 TD catches.

Satterfield guided his alma mater to three consecutive Sun Belt



Conference Championships and an impressive 51-24 record from 2013 to 2018. The Mountaineers held a 38-10 conference mark over six seasons, including a 34-6 record over five seasons in the Sun Belt.

Along the way, he became the first coach to lead a school from the FCS level to FBS and immediately earn three-consecutive bowl wins. Satterfield directed Appalachian State to three-straight conference titles and led the program to four straight bowl appearances.

In 2018, Satterfield led Appalachian State to a 10-2 record and an in-season ranking of No. 25 in the AP poll, capping the season with a 30-19 victory over Louisiana to give the Mountaineers a win in the first-ever Sun Belt Conference Championship Game, securing a thirdstraight league title.

In 2017, during a 9-4 season that included a 7-1 run through the Sun Belt, the Mountaineers ranked among the Top 20 teams nationally in several categories, including No. 2 in fewest sacks allowed (eight).

The 2015 season saw the Mountaineers finish 11-2--the 11 wins marking the highest total ever by an FBS program in its first season of bowl eligibility. App State completed the transition from the FCS to FBS by ranking among the Sun Belt's top two in 19 statistical categories and defeating Ohio, 31-29, in its first-ever bowl game, the Camellia BowL.

The 2015 campaign came on the heels of a breakout season in 2014. when Satterfield led the Mountaineers to an impressive 7-5 record in their first full season in the FBS ranks.

He took over the reins at his alma mater in 2013.

Satterfield helped Appalachian State win three consecutive FCS national championships in 2005, 2006 and 2007 as the quarterbacks coach and primary play-caller.

Among his many highlights as an assistant in Boone, N.C., he mentored two-time Walter Payton Player of the Year and FCS All-American Armanti Edwards. He helped lead the Mountaineers to the historic 34-32 upset at No. 5 Michigan to open the 2007 season.

Overall, he won six conference championships as an assistant and two as a player.

Satterfield started 27 games at quarterback for Appalachian State. He collected first-team all-conference honors in 1995 after passing for 1,461 yards and rushing for 649 more to help lead the Mountaineers to the only undefeated, untied regular season (11-0) in school history and a 12-1 final record. He graduated with a degree in physical education

Satterfield and his wife. Beth, a former track & field athlete at App State, have a daughter, Alli, and two sons, Bryce and Isaac.
