### Things to Look For This Week...

- DE Quincy Roche is tied for 7th in FBS and tied for 1st in the AAC with 9.5 sacks so far this season. He has 22.5 career sacks, the second most by any Temple defensive end.

- WR Jadan Blue tied with Auburn WR Seth Williams for the most receptions by a player in FBS last week with 13. He is also the first Temple player to have three 10+ reception games in a season.

- Temple has played four road games at Cincinnati since 1986, they have all been at night.

- Temple is 4-2 against Cincinnati in the AAC era, winning the last four in a row by a combined score of 127-80.

### Game 11: Temple (7-3, 4-2) vs. #17 Cincinnati (9-1, 6-0) Cincinnati, OH | Nippert Stadium | November 23, 2019

#### THIS WEEK

The Owls are 7-3 and 4-2 in the conference after taking down Tulane, 29-21, on Saturday in a hard fought battle. The Owls head to #17 Cincinnati to take on the Bearcats in a game that will be key in determining the American Athletic Conference East Division winner and place in the conference championship game. Kickoff is set for Saturday, November 23, at 7:00 p.m. ET and will air on ESPN2 and can be heard on 610 ESPN.

#### LAST WEEK

Against Tulane, QBs Anthony Russo and Todd Centeio both tossed touchdowns as WR Jadan Blue (12-131-1) and TE Kenny Yeboah (5-63-2) had career days. DE Quincy Roche (12 tackles, six TFLs, three sacks, and a forced fumble) put on a defensive show as the Owls fought hard in the victory. Kicker Will Mobley tied a career-best as well as he was perfect on three field goal attempts. Roche set an AAC record with six TFLs in the game and has 6.5 sacks in the last two games. He ranks seventh in FBS and tied for first in the AAC with 9.5 sacks.

The front four continued to cause problems for opposing quarterbacks and have been bringing the pressure as of late. The defense continues to lead the FBS with 59 QB hits and 246 total QB pressures this season, according to Pro Football Focus. The Owls held the Green Wave to 130 yards passing and SAF Ayrton Monroe grabbed his first career interception to end the first half and prevent Tulane from scoring before halftime. WR Jadan Blue had back-to-back 10+ reception and 100+ yard games. Blue and WR Branden Mack have four 100+ yard receiving games apiece this year.

#### LAST TIME VS. CINCINNATI

The last time Temple and Cincinnati faced off was on October 20, 2018. Cincinnati came to Philadelphia ranked #20 and 6-0 on the season. The Owls were able to suffocate the Bearcats on offense and limit dual-threat QB Desmond Ridder to 111 yards through the air and nine yards rushing. QB Anthony Russo threw two interceptions late in the game, but led a seven play 75-yard drive capped off by a 20-yard touchdown pass with 49 seconds left in the game to force overtime. Russo followed that drive up with a 25-yard touchdown to WR Isaiah Wright to take the lead. The defense held strong in OT and LB Shaun Bradley ended the game with an interception on a third-and-long. Temple handed Cincinnati its first loss of the season, 24-17.

#### LAST TIME VS. CINCINNATI @ NIPPERT STADIUM

The last time Temple and Cincinnati faced off Nippert Stadium was on November 10, 2017. The Owls took down the Bearcats 35-24. QB Frank Nutile ran and threw for a touchdown. Isaiah Wright returned a kickoff 98-yards for a touchdown. RB David Hood led the ground game with 108 yards on 23 carries. Kicker Aaron Boumerhi kicked two field goals in the methodical victory.

#### UP NEXT

Temple will host UConn for Senior Day and the final game of the season on Saturday, November 30, 2019. Kickoff is set for 3:30pm and will air on CBSSN, 610 ESPN, and WHIP Radio.

## TEMPLE TUFF

Wearing a single-digit jersey is considered to be one of the highest honors an Owl can earn. These are awarded to the student-athletes deemed by their teammates to be the toughest members of the team. Three players carried over the honor from 2018: Sean Bradley, Matt Hennessy, and Chapelle Russell. Franklin, Mack and Wright earned theirs at the beginning of camp this season. Fair earned his honorary single-digit about halfway through camp. Archibong, Graham-Mobley, and Jones all received their single-digits on the final day of camp. The NCAA prohibits offensive linemen from wearing numbers outside of 50-79 in a game so Hennessy will still wear #58 and Fair #70 in games. #9 was given to Roche following non-conference play. ## This Week

### UNDER PRESSURE

Temple's defensive line has gotten to the QB at an unprecedented rate this season. DE Quincy Roche followed up his 3.5 sack performance against USF with a three sack and AAC record six TFL game in a 29-21 win over Tulane last week. The defense ranks first in FBS with 59 QB hits and 256 total pressures this year. Against Tulane, the Owls were first in the conference with 31 QB pressures. (Pro Football Focus)

### SPREAD THE LOVE

Temple's receivers; Branden Mack (4), Jadan Blue (4), and Isaiah Wright (1), have combined for nine 100+ yard receiving games this season. Nine 100+ yard receiving games is a program record and is tied for fifth in FBS and tied for first in the conference with SMU. The Owls are one of four FBS teams to have multiple receivers with four 100+ receiving yard games (LSU, Minnesota, and Washington State).

### BLOCK PARTY

Not only has the defensive line been getting a ton of pressure, but they are also have been excellent at getting a hand up to bat down a pass. DE Quincy Roche and DT Khris Banks both lead the conference defensive linemen with three batted passes a piece. The team ranks first in the conference with 10 total.

### BREAKOUT WIDEOUT

Redshirt sophomore WR Jadan Blue had three catches in eight games played in 2018. In Carey and Uremovich's offense this season, Blue is on his way to rewrite the Temple record books. Through 10 games, Blue has 67 catches for 803 yards and three touchdowns. The record for receptions in a season is 74 set by Zamir Cobb in 2003. Gerald Lucear holds the mark for receiving yards in a season with 964 set in 1979. He has had 10+ catches in three games this season including two consecutive games and four 100+ yard games.

### STRAIGHT FLUSH 3♦, 4♦, 5♦

The Owls will have the deck stacked in their favor on defense this season. The three linebackers: Chapelle Russell, Sam Franklin, and Shaun Bradley all sport the single-digits and will all be starting next to each other. The straight flush will be one of the most experienced and best linebacker units not only in the conference but in the FBS. They have also added another single-digit to the unit. Isaiah Graham-Mobley was wearing #8 before his season ending injury. Although he breaks up the straight, four single-digits going to linebackers is a true testament of how good the Owls are at the position.

### IN THE TRENCHES

The Owls offensive line has shown that it is one of the most experienced and well-rounded groups in the conference. The offensive line ranks first in the conference in QB pressures allowed. Temple QBs have been kept clean on 86.43% of dropbacks. Center Matt Hennessy has allowed just four QB pressures in over 650 snaps this season which ranks fourth in FBS and first in the AAC. (Pro Football Focus)

### WHO'S GOT THE POWER?

Temple is one of three "Group of Five" teams (Western Kentucky and Houston) to have four wins over Power Five opponents under four different head coaches since 2010.

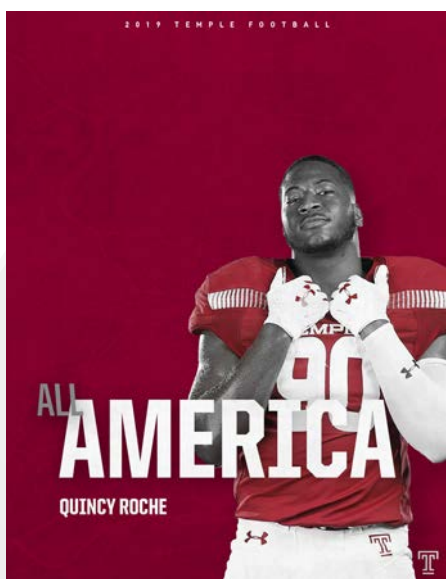
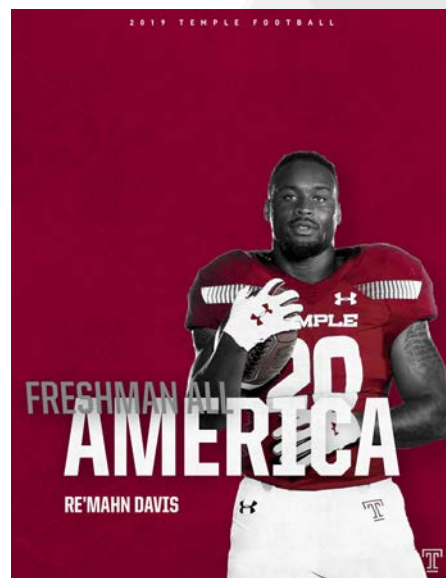
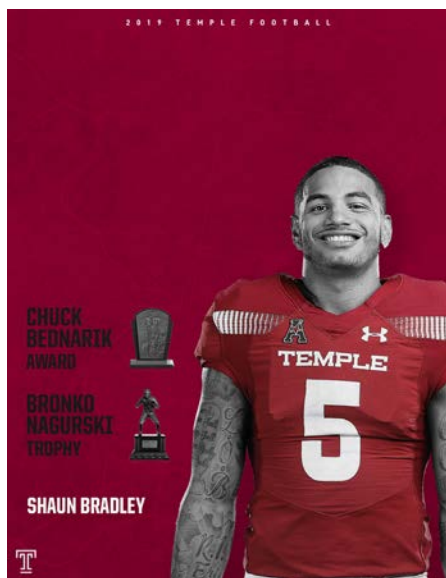

## Team

### TEMPLE TUFF

The phrase "Temple Tuff" is synonymous with the fight and grit of Temple's football team. However, it was coined by legendary Temple basketball coach John Chaney whose teams also were noted for their hard-nosed, lunch-pail passion by which they played.

### BEST OF CLASS

Temple's senior class currently has 31 victories. With three more wins, they can be the second all-time winningest class in school history.

### WINNING IS CONTAGIOUS

It's safe to say that Temple football has gone through a resurgence since moving to the American Athletic Conference, and Rod Carey aims to continue that narrative. During his tenure as head coach at NIU, Carey amassed 64 wins from 2012-2018 with an average just over eight wins per season.

### GOING BOWLING

Temple football has been to eight bowl games in the program's history, including a current streak of four in a row. The Owls are now officially bowl eligible for the last six consecutive seasons under three different coaching staffs. This is the longest streak of bowl eligibility in program history.

### UNITED NATIONS

Temple has 11 countries represented on this year's roster: Sweden (Isaac Moore, Victor Stoffel), Cameroon (Arnold Ebiketie, William Kwenkeu), Canada (Remy Bikowski), Cuba (Jose Barbon) Dominican Republic (J.D. Gomez), Jamaica (Nickolas Madourie), Liberia (Edward Saydee), Nigeria (David Nwaogwugwu), Turks and Caicos (Yvandy Rigby), Uganda (Simon Abedimungu), and the United States. Temple has the most countries represented and the second most foreign born players in the nation with 12 total.

### FROM WAY BACK WHEN

Offensive coordinator Mike Uremovich and defensive coordinator Jeff Knowles go back way before either of them began coaching football. The two grew up together and were high school classmates and teammates at Providence Catholic High School in New Lenox, Illinois. The team went on to finish undefeated and win a state championship in 1994.

### TWO PRINCES

The Spin Doctors weren't referring to Temple when they recorded their smash hit. Temple has three sets of brothers on its roster (Dioubate, Picozzi, Prince) including one set of twins (Jason and Jeremy Prince). Only four FBS programs have more sets of brothers (Clemson, Georgia Tech, Michigan State, Nebraska) and the Princes are one of 10 sets of twins.

## Rod Carey

### MIDWEST TO THE MID-ATLANTIC

For his entire football career Rod Carey has called the Midwest home. Carey was born in Wisconsin and played center for the Indiana Hoosiers. He began his coaching career at the University of Minnesota and has coached in Wisconsin, Illinois, and North Dakota. Following a successful career in the Midwest, Carey now will make his mark in the mid-Atlantic at Temple.

### SMART, TOUGH, RELENTLESS

Carey, his staff, and the players abide by the mantra: Smart, Tough, Relentless. This attitude not only applies for their preparation and play on the field but in the classroom and in life. Carey wants all of his players to attack their goals on the field and in the classroom under the guidelines of the S.T.R. motto.

### MAC-DOMINATION

In 2012 two things happened, Temple departed the MAC Conference, and Rod Carey began his tenure as head coach at Northern Illinois. Because of the departure, Temple never got a taste of Carey's Huskies, but they were the top dogs in the MAC. Carey and company won four MAC West championships (2013-2015, 2018) and two MAC championships (2014 and 2018.) Carey was the offensive coordinator for the 2012 season when the Huskies won the MAC and was elevated to head coach before they played against Florida State in the Orange Bowl. He was the offensive line coach in the 2011 season when the Huskies won the MAC and had an 11-3 overall record winning the GoDaddy.com Bowl.

### FIRST-YEAR SUCCESS

"Transitions aren't about what you can change. It's about what you can keep," said Carey. His first career game as head coach was the 2013 Orange Bowl against Florida State. Carey was named the head coach prior the bowl and started his first full season as head coach with bang. NIU went undefeated in the regular season and scored at least 30 points in every game except a 27-20 win over Akron. Carey's offense ranked fifth in the country following the season. He has now kept up with the same trend at Temple, winning six of nine games including wins over two ranked opponents so far.

## Offense

### BOMBS OVER BROAD STREET

Temple has had much success throwing the football in 2019. The Owls threw for 3,273 yards overall, the second most in school history in 2018. So far, the Owls have thrown for 2,574 yards through 10 games this season. The Owls also set a single-game program record for most passing yards in a game (507 vs. Bucknell). Russo ranks 43th in FBS with 2,258 passing yards this season.

### DUEL THREAT QBs

QB's Anthony Russo and Todd Centeio have given a new meaning to duel-threat this year, together they make the duel-threat. The two have both been implemented into the game plan this season and force teams to prepare for two different kinds of quarterbacks. Although Centeio has only seen a limited amount of snaps, he provides a spark to offense and has thrown a touchdown pass in back-to-back weeks.

### PARTY OF TWO

Redshirt senior Jager Gardner and true freshman Re'Mahn Davis have been the main ball carriers for the Owls this season. In nine games played, Davis has 148 carries for 724 yards and a five touchdowns. His best game so far came against ECU when he ran for 157 yards and a touchdown on 24 carries. Gardner has a career-best 131 carries for 561 yards and five touchdowns. His best game came against USF when he ran for 133 yards on 25 carries as Davis was held out with an injury.

### POWER-I-WRIGHT

Although listed as a wide receiver, Isaiah Wright is a multi-dimensional threat who has been known to lineup in the backfield, especially in Wildcat formation. Wright scored in four different ways (receiving TD, rushing TD, punt return TD, kick return TD) in back-to-back seasons, the first FBS player to do so in a decade. Wright already has a career-high five receiving touchdowns this season and is well on his way to career-highs in receptions and yards in a season.

## OWL SCHOLARS

In an effort to recognize the outstanding academic accomplishments of Temple University's student-athletes, Temple Athletics introduced the Owl Scholars Program in the Fall of 2016. Through team apparel, student-athletes on all of Temple's 19 sports regularly have the opportunity to wear items that represent their athletic lives while on campus or in the classroom; the Owl Scholars Program aims to accomplish the reverse - provide an easily identifiable symbol of academic success for student-athletes to wear on their respective field or court of competition.

The Owl Scholars Patch has been designed to pay homage to the rich history of the Temple Owls, while invoking images of the infamous speech of Temple

University's founder Russell Conwell, Acres of Diamonds. The three stars above the regal owl symbolize the three different ways a student-athlete can earn the honor of having the patch included on their uniform/game warm-up:

- 1) 3.0 semester GPA in previous term
- 2) 3.0 cumulative GPA prior to beginning of semester
- 3) Successfully completed his/her undergraduate degree at Temple

- 52 football players will wear the patch this season.



## JADAN IS GIVING THEM THE BLUES

Redshirt sophomore WR Jadan Blue has had a breakout season and continued his success through 10 games. Blue has tallied 67 catches for 803 yards and three touchdowns. He is eight catches away from breaking Zamir Cobb's record for catches in a season set back in 2003 with 73. He is also 162 yards away from being the single-season receiving yards leader. Gerald Lucera set the Temple record with 964 yards in 1979.

## RETURN OF THE MACK

Redshirt junior Branden Mack had a breakout season in 2018 and came into 2019 as one of the big targets for the Owls. After ten games, Mack has 49 catches for 698 yards and five touchdowns. Mack has four 100-yard receiving games so far this season and has been a constant threat in big passing situations.

## IT STARTS UP FRONT

Temple returns the core of the offensive line for the 2019 season. This includes Rimington Trophy watch list nominee Matt Hennessey, Outland Trophy watch list nominee and second team all-AAC guard Jovahn Fair, ECAC 2018 rookie of the year Adam Klein, and standout sophomore Isaac Moore. This group has started a combined 118 games in their careers. The game experience on the line across will aim to keep QBs off the ground and open up wide running lanes for the backs. Among centers who have played at least 650 snaps this season, Hennessey is tied for fourth in FBS and first in the AAC in QB pressures allowed, only allowing four so far this year.

## Defense

### KNOWLES KNOWS DEFENSE

Despite the coaching change in the winter, both the Temple defense and new coordinator Jeff Knowles are on the same page about what the defense should look like. So far this season, the Owls rank third in red zone defense and are one of the best third down defenses in the country, the Owls rank 40th in FBS in 3rd down conversion defense. Teams have failed to convert on third down against Temple over 64.4% of the time.

### SEASONED BACKERS

The Owls returned one of the best and most experienced linebacker corps in the nation. Shaun Bradley, Chapelle Russell and Sam Franklin are all in their final season. Red-shirt junior Isaiah Graham-Mobley season has ended due to injury, but Audley Isaacs has been rotating in as well. Bradley, Russell, and Franklin have combined for 161 of the 670 tackles (24%) made by the Owls this season.

### FOLLOW THE LEADER

Senior MLB Shaun Bradley's on field production allowed for him to become a vocal leader on defense for the past three seasons. In 2017 he led the team with 85 stops. That led to Bradley earning one of the coveted single-digit jerseys and first-team All-AAC honors. So far this season, he leads the team with 65 tackles. He also has seven TFLs, a fumble recovery and three pass breakups.

### BALL MAGNET

Graduate LB Chapelle Russell seemed to always be in the right place at the right time in 2018. Russell's play-making abilities helped him amass 70 tackles, 5 TFLs, and 1.5 sacks last season. However, the most impressive feat he accomplished was leading the country with five fumble recoveries including one scoop and score to ice the comeback win over USF last season. This season, Russell has continued to be a force in the middle of the defense. He has 46 tackles, five TFLs, and a PBU so far this season.

### THE SAM OF ALL TRADES

LB Sam Franklin was the do-it-all guy for the Owls on defense last season. Franklin lined up at multiple positions including LB, DE, and NKL on defense. Because of his versatility, Franklin was able to complete the "defensive cycle." Franklin had at least on tackle, TFL, interception, sack, forced fumble, and fumble recovery last season. This year, Franklin has 50 tackles and 5.5 TFLs, and two fumble recoveries in 10 games played.

### BULL RUSHING ROCHE

DE Quincy Roche has proved to be one of the premier pass rushers in the nation over the second half of this season. Roche has had 6.5 sacks over the past two games and set an AAC record with six TFLs against Tulane. Roche has 9.5 sacks this season which is tied for seventh best in the nation and tied for first in the conference.

## SECONDARY RELOADED

Despite losing single-digit CB Rock Ya-Sin to the NFL and single-digit SAF Delvon Randall, one may think the Owls are lacking on the perimeter. This however just isn't the case. The Owls picked up right where they left off. Developing players into great defensive backs like CB Linwood Crump and SAF Benny Walls. The Owls also landed Baylor transfer and New Jersey native Harrison Hand who recorded his first career interception as an Owl against Maryland and grabbed another against Memphis before forcing a fumble on the QB at the beginning of the fourth quarter. He also had a pick against SMU. The Owls also added graduate transfer Ayrton Monroe from Penn State. Monroe is having his best season with 45 tackles and one TFL. He had his first career interception against Tulane last week that prevented a score before halftime.

## EASY PICKIN'

Temple recorded a conference-best 18 interceptions in 2018, their fifth straight season recording 10-or-more interceptions. The Owls are the only team in the AAC to record 10-or-more interceptions the last five years straight. So far this season, the Owls have six interceptions: three by Harrison Hand (Maryland, Memphis, and SMU), one by CB Christian Braswell (in the first series against Buffalo), one by SAF Benny Walls (returned 65-yards against Georgia Tech), and SAF Ayrton Monroe (in the endzone against Tulane).

## WILD BOYZ

Temple's defensive line has been dubbed with the nickname "Wild Boyz" over the past decade and the unit has lived up to the special billing. Two NFL first round draft choices - Muhammad Wilkerson (2011, NY Jets) and Haason Reddick (2016, Cardinals) - and a handful of other pro players have learned their trade at Temple. In 2019, Michael Dogbe (Cardinals, 6th round) joined the brotherhood. In 2018, Julian Taylor (49ers, 6th round), Jacob Martin (Seahawks, 7th), and Sharif Finch (Titans, FA) joined that fraternity. DTs Karamo Dioubate and Daniel Archibong lead a solid young group who hope to follow in their footsteps. DT Khris Banks and Ifeanyi Majieh have had breakout seasons as well.

## FINER THINGS IN LIFE

DT Ifeanyi Majieh has had his best season since earning the starting job to begin the year. In nine games played, he has 39 tackles, 9.5 TFLs, a forced fumble, and six sacks. Among interior defenders, his six sacks rank fifth in FBS and first in the AAC.

## A-E-I-O-U

Former Temple basketball player Bill Mikvy lives in school folklore as "The Owl Without a Vowel." Now Temple University can also claim "The Owl with Every Vowel." Senior DT Karamo Dioubate's surname is complete with all five vowels. Karamo's brother, Mahmud, joined the team this season as a part of the 2019 recruiting class.

## Special Teams

### THREE PART GAME

Often teams forget that some of the most important parts of the game occur during special teams. The Owls proved that by scoring on special teams in seven games a year ago. It had been nearly four years since they scored in all three phases of the game and the Owls did it three times in 2018 (Maryland, USF, and UConn). Prior to that was Sept. 20, 2014 vs. Delaware State.

### HUNT THEM DOWN

The kickoff team this season has been quite the highlights for the Owls' special teams. Kicker Jacob LaFree has been booting the ball on kickoffs and the defense has been one of the best in FBS at limiting large returns. The Owls rank 28th in FBS and third in the conference in kickoff return defense, allowing just an average of 18.47 yards per return. These limited returns allow the defense to work with a long field behind them.

## Miscellaneous

### CONFERENCE SCHEDULING

Because of UConn's departure from the American Athletic Conference, the conference scheduling is going to look complexly different now that there won't be two divisions within the conference. In 2020, Temple will play Cincinnati, ECU, USF, and SMU at home and UCF, Memphis, Navy, and Tulane on the road. Dates for these games are TBD. Temple's non-conference opponents in 2020 will feature Idaho (9/12), and Rutgers (9/19) at home and Miami (9/5) and UMass (10/10) on the road.

### POWERFUL SCHEDULING

With 15 games scheduled against Power 5 schools between 2020-2028, Temple has more future opponents against those schools than any other institution outside of those conferences. The Owls have at least one game in each of those nine seasons. Among the list of future opponents are: Boston College, Duke, Georgia Tech, Miami (ACC); Penn State, Rutgers, Maryland (Big Ten); Oklahoma (Big 12).

### YOU'RE KILLING ME SMALLS

Prior to a recent Thursday night game at ECU, Temple student video manager, "Macho Scottie" Smalls, in his best WWE superstar Randy "Macho Man" Savage impersonation, challenged announcer Pat McAfee to a punt off. McAfee, a former NFL punter, upped the ante and said that if Smalls could punt the ball 30-yards, he would donate \$10,000 to Smalls' charity of choice. 34-yards later, Smalls' social media profile more than doubled as did the benefit for the Boy's and Girl's Clubs when Temple head coach Rod Carey matched McAfee's donation to the charity.

### BEASTS OF THE NORTHEAST

If you want to go to the NFL, go to Temple. In the past four years, the Owls have had more players drafted or signed by NFL teams of any program in the northeast. Temple is the only team outside of the Power 5 conferences to have multiple players drafted to the NFL in each of the past four seasons. This year alone, Temple had six players sign with NFL teams and are currently in training camp: Rock Ya-Sin (Colts), Ryquell Armstead (Jaguars), Michael Dogbe (Cardinals), Chris Myarick (Dolphins), Jaelin Robinson (Falcons), and Ventell Bryant (Bengals). Temple currently has 19 active players in the NFL.

### DID YOU KNOW?

Temple holds a 92 year old NCAA college football record? In 1937, Temple played in an NCAA-record four scoreless tie games in one season. No school has matched that since.

## TEMPLE AT A GLANCE...

Temple is in the 4th largest media market in the country, with over 2.9 million TV homes according to Nielsen. The designated market area (DMA) is 7.6 million.

Temple is located in a region of 6.53 million people, and is only 95 miles from NYC and 120 miles from Washington, D.C. In fact, more than 40% of the US population is within a day's drive from Philadelphia.

Temple is the 26th largest public University in the country with over 41,000 students founded in 1884 and has 404 academic programs including five professional schools of law, medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, and podiatry.

Temple is a Research I institution, a Carnegie Classification in 2015 as the highest level and ranked by US News and World Report at 115 (6th) with an overall graduation rate of 70%, and has a full time retention rate for undergraduate students at 89%.

Temple is one of 11 institutions in the country with multi-year APR scores of 970 or greater for all teams including a 2015 multi-years APR score of 971.

Temple has over 300,000 alumni around the world including over 170,000 alumni that live in the Philadelphia DMA.

Temple's athletic department has 19 sports and 500 student-athletes.

Temple has been bowl eligible eight out of the last 10 years. The Owls finished 10-4, won the AAC Eastern Division and were ranked in the Top 25 twice in the past four seasons. They won the AAC Championship in 2016 and the Gasparilla Bowl in 2017.

Temple posted the largest attendance gain during the 2015 season, playing in front of an average home crowd of 44,159, an increase of 20,789 per game. This excitement led ESPN to bring their popular pregame show, College Gameday, to Philadelphia.

The Temple game played against Notre Dame in 2015 had a 3.9 national rating and an 18.1 local rating. It was ABC's highest ranking game ever in the Philadelphia area which is impactful given the market is the 4th largest in the country.

Temple's athletic facilities are among the finest in the country. The football team plays its games in the NFL stadium operated by Super Bowl 52 Champion Philadelphia Eagles and there are ongoing discussions to build an on campus football stadium as well. The basketball arena is a state-of-the-art facility with a capacity crowd of 10,000. Over the last five years Temple has spent over \$50 million for athletics multipurpose facilities with all the athletic facilities being state-of-the-art.

The University itself has over \$400 million planned for capital projects over the next five years including a \$170 million state of the art library set to open this fall.

# POSITION-BY-POSITION

## QUARTERBACKS

Quarterbacks coach **Craig Harmon** oversees the unit in his first season at Temple. Harmon coached the quarterbacks on Rod Carey's staff at NIU from 2016-2018. So far this season the Owls have passed for 2,574 yards and 21 touchdowns.

**Anthony Russo** started his first career game against Maryland in 2018 and held down the job for the remainder of the season. The redshirt junior is 14-6 as a starter with 4,821 passing yards and 32 touchdowns in his career. Russo became the first Owl ever to throw for 400+ yards in a game twice when he went 31-52 for 444 yards and four touchdowns against #9 UCF in 2018 and went 32-41 for 409 yards and four touchdowns against Bucknell to start the 2019 season. Russo threw 14 touchdowns last season and already has 18 this year with two games to go.

Redshirt sophomore **Todd Centeio** has provided a spark for the offense coming in on certain drives for the Owls this year. Centeio threw a touchdown to TE Kenny Yeboah against USF and Tulane. He also provides the Owls with a solid running option out of the backfield. Temple will continue to use two QBs to force teams to prepare for both guys.

**Trad Beatty** redshirted in 2018 and was a key member of preparing the Owls as the scout team QB.

Redshirt junior **Matthew Vitale** (Haddonfield, N.J. / Diablo Community College) transferred and walked-on to the team during camp.

The 2019 recruiting class welcomes **Kennique Bonner-Steward** (Fayetteville, N.C. / William A. Hough) to the quarterback room.

## WIDE RECEIVERS

Pass game coordinator and wide receivers coach **Thad Ward** heads the unit in his first season at Temple. Ward coached the running backs at the University of Illinois for the past three seasons. He also was a member of Carey's NIU staff from 2013-2015.

Senior **Isaiah Wright** has made a huge impact within the Owls' offense during his career with the team. Wright is first on the team in all-purpose yards this season (957). He has 43 catches for 413 yards and a team best five touchdowns. He also has five carries for 48 yards.

Redshirt junior **Branden Mack** has 49 catches for 698 yards and five touchdowns in 2019. He has posted four 100+ yard receiving games so far this season.

**Jadan Blue** was a highly-touted member of the 2017 recruiting class and redshirted before getting reps last season. This season, Blue has four 100-yard receiving performances. He has 67 catches for 803 yards and three touchdowns. He has had back-to-back 10+ reception and 100+ yard games.

Senior **Randle Jones** has proved to be a speedy deep threat who allows the Owls to take shots down field and extend drives. Jones had been out with an injury but made an appearance and caught a touchdown against UCF.

Redshirt senior **Travon Williams** found a variety of ways to make an impact on the field. He played in 12 games in 2018 and was awarded a scholarship after the win against USF. He had the longest reception in the nation during week one catching an 89-yard touchdown pass from Centeio. He has five catches for 121 yards and a touchdown this season.

Redshirt sophomore **Jeremy Jennings** was a part of the 2018 recruiting class and saw limited snaps at running back in 2018. He has moved to receiver and also gets reps on special teams.

**Jose Barbon**, **Kadas Reams**, **Jordan Smith** and **Ronnie Stevenson** all were a part of the 2018 recruiting class and redshirted last year. Barbon made his first career catch against Bucknell and has six catches for 59 yards on the season.

Redshirt juniors **Thomas Mattioni** and **Eric Kiewlak** joined the unit as walk-ons in 2017. Mattioni made his first career catch against Bucknell.

Redshirt sophomore **Jeremy Prince** was added as a walk-on last spring.

The 2019 recruiting class welcomes **De'Von Fox** (Maple Heights (OH) High) and **Kwesi Evans** (Parkville, Md. / St. Frances Academy).

Junior **Mike Mitchell** (Saylorsburg, Pa. / ASA College (Brooklyn)), freshmen **Will Adam** (Boston, Mass. / Lawrence Academy), **Conner Basinger** (Uniontown, Pa. / Laurel Highlands), and **Ryan Reeder** (Glenside, Pa. / Roman Catholic) walked on to the team following camp.

## RUNNING BACKS

Running backs coach **Gabe Infante** leads the backs in his first job at the collegiate level. Infante came from St. Joe's Prep where he had a tremendous amount of success leading local Philadelphia players to multiple state championships. Infante was named the 2018 NFL High School Coach of the Year.

Redshirt senior **Jager Gardner** entered the year as the most experienced returning running back. He has shown bursts throughout his career and owns the Temple record with a 94-yard run from scrimmage. He has 131 carries for 561 yards and five touchdowns this season. His best game came against USF when he ran 25 times for 133 yards.

**Re'Mahn Davis** (San Francisco, Calif. / Blair Academy) was a 2019 mid-year enrollee, was ineligible for spring practice but made a splash during fall camp. Davis has split time with Gardner so far this season and they both have been productive in their respective roles. He leads the rushing attack with 148 carries for 724 yards and a five touchdowns in nine games played. He crossed the 100-yard milestone for the first time against Georgia Tech. Against ECU, Davis had a career-high 157 yards and a touchdown on 24 carries. Davis has the third most rushing yards by any true freshmen in the FBS. He also has eight catches for 104 yards and a touchdown.

**Tayvon Ruley** (Darby, Pa. / Penn Wood) also joined the program as a walk-on in the winter. He got some carries due to Davis being held out with an injury against USF. He has 12 carries for 42 yards this season.

**Kyle Dobbins** was a part of the 2018 recruiting class and redshirted last year. He had two carries for 11 yards against Bucknell. Redshirt junior **Jonny Forrest** saw a limited amount of carries last season and plays on special teams this season.

**Onasis Neely** (Enola, Pa. / East Pennsboro), who was part of the 2018 recruiting class but grayshirted, joined the team in January. He has since suffered a season ending injury in spring practice.

The 2019 recruiting class welcomes **Edward Saydee** (Philadelphia, Pa. / William Penn).

## TIGHT ENDS

The tight end group will be coached by co-offensive coordinator **Mike Uremovich**. He comes from Carey's NIU staff where he was the offensive coordinator for three seasons.

Redshirt junior **Kenny Yeboah**, a Mackey Award watch list member, picked up where he left off last season as one of the main tight ends for the Owls. Yeboah has 17 catches for 164 yards and four touchdowns in his nine games played.

Redshirt freshman **David Martin-Robinson** appeared in four games last season and maintained his redshirt status. He has four catches for 52 yards so far this season in ten games played. The Owls have used each TE in the passing game and for run blocking purposes.

**Aaron Jarman** and **Nick Picozzi** joined the team as freshmen a year ago and spent the 2018 season redshirting. Jarman was a part of the 2018 recruiting class while Picozzi was a walk-on. Jarman's first career catch was a 10-yard touchdown against Bucknell.

## SINCE 2014, TEMPLE FOOTBALL HAS...

2014

- Beaten a ranked team at home for the first time ever (#21 ECU in 2014)
- Beaten a ranked team in three consecutive seasons (2014-16) and again in consecutive seasons. (2018-19).
- Beaten an SEC team (Vanderbilt) for the first time in 76 years (Florida in 1938).
- Posted the largest margin of victory in 40 seasons—a 59-0 shutout over Delaware State.

2015

- Beat Penn State for the first time in 74 years and 40 tries.
- Started a season 7-0 for the first time ever (2015).
- Participated in bowl games in back-to-back years (2015-18).
- Became ranked in the Top 25 for the first time since 1979 (36 years).
- Had ESPN's College Gameday broadcast a Temple football game for the first time ever... from Philadelphia, no less.
- Played in Temple's first-ever ranked vs. ranked football games – vs. Notre Dame and at Houston.
- Ranked in the Top 25 for four consecutive weeks and for seven weeks total - both for the first time ever.
- Had a national award winner - Tyler Matakevich with the Bronko Nagurski and Chuck Bednarik Award for the first time since 1974 (when Steve Joachim won the Maxwell Award).
- Had a player earn first-team All-American honors for the first time since 1986 (Matakevich)
- Beaten a ranked team at home (#21 Memphis)
- Beat Cincinnati in 2015 for the first time in 30 years and six tries - and have now won four straight in the series.

2016

- Won three consecutive games on the road for the first time in 45 years.
- Posted back-to-back road game shutouts for the first time since 1925.
- Had three shutouts in a season for the first time since 1945.
- Won 20 games in a two-year span for the first time ever.
- Posted 10 wins for only the second and third times in program history (1979, 2015, 2016).

2017

- Had a player (Isaiah Wright) return a kickoff and punt for a TD in the same season (has not happened for Temple dating back to 2000. He also rushed, caught, and threw for a score becoming just the sixth player in 10 years to score those five separate ways. In 2018, he duplicated the feat of scoring via rush, receiving, punt return and kickoff return, becoming the only FBS player to do that in consecutive seasons in over a decade.

2018

- Had a player earn first-team All-American honors (Isaiah Wright).
- Beaten a ranked team at home (#20 Cincinnati)
- Posted the largest margin of victory ever against an FBS opponent (57-7 at UConn in 2018).

2019

- Beaten a ranked team at home (#21 Maryland and #23 Memphis).
- Become bowl eligible for six consecutive seasons for the first time in school history.
- Played four ranked teams in a season.

Junior transfer **Tyler Sear** came to Temple in the summer from cross-state foe, Pitt. Sear had some reps in both his first two seasons. He recently received a waiver and is eligible to play this season. Another junior transfer, **Jeremiah Nelson**, joined Temple as a walk-on in the summer before camp. He was fifth in the nation in points and ninth in rushing touchdowns for Nassau Community College in 2018. Since transferring, he has transitioned into a tight end for the Owls.

**Sam Kramer** joined the team as a walk-on in 2016 and has switched from LB to TE. Another redshirt junior transfer **Kaleb Prejean** (Manassas, Va. / Pasadena Community College) walked-on to the team in the summer.

### OFFENSIVE LINE

This year the offensive line unit is mentored by **Joe Tripodi**. He coached the offensive line for nine seasons at NIU, the last six under Carey, before coming to Temple.

Leading the unit is redshirt junior **Matt Hennessy** who holds down the middle of the line for the Owls. Hennessy earned all-ECAC first team honors and is regarded as one of the best centers in college football and is graded as such by Pro Football Focus. He has started nine of 10 games this season and continues to be one of the best centers in the nation.

Graduate **Jovahn Fair** provides experience to the line. Fair earned All-AAC second team honors for his performance in 2018 when he started every game at left guard. He has started every game this season as well. Redshirt junior **Vincent Picozzi**, an ECAC honorable mention in 2018, started at guard until an injury at USF ended his season.

Last season's ECAC Freshman of the Year, sophomore **Adam Klein**, remains at right tackle. Klein was the only freshman in the country to start at right tackle for at least nine games. He played in all 13 games. Sophomore **Isaac Moore** also played in all 13 games last season and they both have started every game this season.

Junior transfer **Joseph Hooper** joined the program in the summer. He started 12 games at left guard in 2018 for Butler Community College in Kansas. He started in place of Picozzi against USF.

Redshirt sophomore **Griffin Sestili** also returns for the Owls after appearing in eight games last season. Redshirt junior **Leon Pinto** returns and provides depth on the line.

Redshirt freshman **David Nwaogwugwu** joined the team last year and redshirted. He spent the year bulking up and now carries 295 lbs. on his 6-5 frame. He has helped take over at guard because of Picozzi's injury.

Redshirt sophomores **Andrew Eisenon** and **J.D. Gomez** return to provide additional depth on the line of scrimmage.

Freshman **Victor Stoffel** was a part of the 2019 recruiting class and joined the Owls in the winter as a mid-year enrollee. The 2019 recruiting class also welcomes **Jermaine Donaldson** (Voorhees, N.J. / Eastern Regional), **Chris Fowx** (Poughkeepsie, N.Y. / Archbishop Stepinac), and **Remy Binkowski** (Woodstock, Ontario / Fork Union Military Academy).

Freshman **Ronnie Ross** (Philadelphia, Pa. / La Salle College High) walked on in the summer.

### DEFENSIVE LINE

Leading the defensive line in 2019 is **Walter Stewart** who joined Carey at Temple after one season together at NIU. Stewart's defensive line was one of the best in the country and his coaching skills have translated into a dominate season so far for the Owls front four.

Leading the defensive line from the defensive tackle position in 2019 are senior **Karamo Dioubate** and redshirt junior **Daniel Archibong**. Dioubate and Archibong helped plug up the middle of the line in 2018 and set the tone up front for the Owls. They both will be playing nose tackle. Archibong has been a force in the middle all season. He has 19 tackles, 1.5 sacks, a PBU, and a blocked kick in ten games so far this season. Dioubate has registered 12 tackles, a TFL, and a sack in all ten games in 2019.

Redshirt sophomore **Ifeanyi Maijeh** has had a dominant start to the season, earning the starting roll because of his play during camp. He has 39 tackles, six sacks, and 9.5 TFLs so far this season. Redshirt freshman **Khris Banks** showed his potential in camp and is part of the defensive line rotation. Banks has 13 tackles, two TFLs, and three PBUs so far this season. He also is tied with DE Quincy Roche with the most passes batted down (3) in the conference.

Setting the edge at defensive end for the Owls this year are redshirt junior **Quincy Roche**, graduates **Zack Mesday**, **Dana Levine** and **DeAndre Kelly**, and redshirt sophomore **Arnold Ebiketie**. Roche has totaled 35 tackles, 9.5 sacks, 14.5 TFLs, five PBUs, two fumble recoveries, one forced fumble, and a blocked kick. Mesday had a breakout year in 2018 and picked up where he left off with 19 tackles, 5.5 TFLs, and 3.5 sacks. Levine has played in all ten games this season with 22 tackles, eight TFLs, 5.5 sacks, six QB hurries, and a forced fumble. Kelly appeared in ten games this season providing depth to the front four. He had a strip sack against Memphis that flipped the field for the Owls and another against USF that was recovered and taken for a touchdown. Ebiketie has played in ten games and has 12 tackles.

Junior **Kevin Robertson** transferred to Temple in the summer following a season at Fullerton (Calif.) College. He has played in four games this season. Redshirt junior **Nickolos Madourie** who was a force on the edge at Dakota College in 2017, has played in two game this season. Madourie rehabbed after surgery that left him sidelined for the 2018 season.

Redshirt freshmen **Evan Boozer**, **Layton Jordan**, **Travon King** and **Tyreke Young** were all a part of the 2018 recruiting class and all redshirted last season. Jordan and King are making the transition from linebacker to defensive line. King has five tackles this season. Boozer and Young sustained season ending injuries.

Sophomore **Shane Hogarth** walked on to the team in the winter. He transferred to Temple following a season at Delaware where he was sidelined with an injury.

The 2019 recruiting class welcomes **Simon Abedimungu** (Rockville, Md. / Richard Montgomery), **Wisdom Quarshie** (Sicklerville, N.J. / St. Joseph-Hammonton), and **Jacoby Sharpe** (Sugar Hill, Ga. / Lanier).

Redshrit freshman **Gabriel Gelves** (Merrick, N.Y. / Holy Trinity) joined the team as a walk-on following camp.

### LINEBACKERS

Defensive coordinator and linebackers coach **Jeff Knowles** leads the unit in 2019. Knowles joined Carey at Temple after being Carey's defensive coordinator for two seasons at NIU. He is assisted by **Tyler Yelk**, who was promoted to full-time coach in July. Yelk works with the outside linebackers.

The Owls' linebacker corps is one of the most experienced and deepest groups on the team. Seniors **Sam Franklin**, **Shaun Bradley**, **Chapelle Russell**, and **William Kwenkeu** help provide leadership at the second level and make a ton of plays. Bradley is one of the leaders on defense and is the teams leading tackler. So far this season, he leads the team with 65 tackles, seven TFLs and a three PBUs. Franklin played a variety of positions last season but he typically played outside linebacker or nickel. Franklin's high intensity helps dictate the mantra of the defense. The do-it-all backer has 50 tackles, 5.5 TFLs, and two fumble recoveries this season. Russell, who graduated in December but had a season of eligibility remaining, bounced back from a torn ACL in 2016-17 and played the entirety of the 2018 season. Through ten games this season, Russell tallied 46 tackles and five TFLs. Kwenkeu played in 11 games and had 33 tackles and a sack in 2018. He will be looking to redshirt this season but has played one game.

Redshirt junior **Isaiah Graham-Mobley** makes a huge impact on defense despite not being in a starting role. He was awarded a single-digit at the end of camp. He has 36 tackles, four TFLs, and a forced fumble so far in 2019. He was able to strip a Georgia Tech QB at the goal line, denying the Yellow Jackets an easy touchdown. He has been ruled out the rest of the season due to injury.

# POSITION-BY-POSITION

Redshirt junior **Boaz Pogue** transferred from Morehead State midway through 2017. He played in four games in 2018. Redshirt sophomore **Audley Isaacs** made his first career appearance in week two of 2018, and has remained on the field mostly on special teams.

Redshirt sophomore **George Reid** was a part of the 2017 recruiting class and redshirt his freshman year. In 2018, he appeared in six games and recorded three tackles at safety. He has since been shifted to a linebacker.

The 2019 recruiting class welcomes **Yvandy Rigby** (Egg Harbor Township, N.J. / Milford Academy), **Mahmud Dioubate** (Philadelphia, Pa. / Garden City Community College), and **Jordan Magee** (Dover (Del.) High).

Freshmen **Kenneth Anyaehie** (Naples, Fla. / Lely) and **Gage Panno** (Mt. Laurel, N.J. / Mercyhurst) joined the Owls linebacker corps as a walk-on in the summer.

## CORNERBACKS

Co-defensive coordinator and cornerbacks coach **Fran Brown** returns to Temple following two seasons at Baylor University with former Temple head coach Matt Rhule. This is Brown's seventh season at Temple.

Junior **Harrison Hand** came back home to the Philadelphia area after transferring from Baylor this winter. Hand was originally recruited by Brown to come to Temple, but followed him to Baylor and then came to Temple. Hand has 52 tackles, three interceptions, a forced fumble and four PBUs this season.

The Owls' stingy corners return a bunch of players and is another one of the deepest positions on the team. Senior **Linwood Crump** is the most experienced Owl in the secondary. Crump has played in four games this season and has been limited by an injury.

Redshirt sophomores **Ty Mason** and **Christian Braswell** also contributed to the cornerback position. Both were a part of the 2017 recruiting class and redshirted as freshmen. Both saw their first game action in 2018. Braswell has stepped up and taken the over the starting roles with hand. He had an interception against Buffalo and recovered a fumble against Georgia Tech, he has 24 tackles on the season. Mason has seen action in nine games, and plays a lot on special teams.

Redshirt junior **Freddie Johnson** switched from wide receiver to cornerback in the summer and has already played valuable snaps on defense. Johnson has 14 tackles so far this season.

Redshirt junior **Kimere Brown** made his first career start against Villanova in 2018. He had a solid 2018 season but unfortunately came down with a season ending injury during spring practice.

Redshirt junior **Aaron Adu** and redshirt sophomore **Josh Allen** walked on to the team in 2017 and have made an impact in the secondary on the scout team. Redshirt sophomore **Josh Jones** walked on to the team in the summer before the 2018 season. Jones switched to CB after playing QB at Highland Community College in Kansas for one season. Redshirt freshmen **Elijah Clark** was a part of the 2018 recruiting class and redshirted.

The 2019 recruiting class welcomes **Nate Wyatt** (Somerset, N.J. / St. Joseph - Metuchen).

## SAFETIES

The safeties are led by **Melvin Rice**, who comes from Carey's NIU staff where he worked with the cornerbacks for three seasons.

Senior **Benny Walls** is one of the leaders in the secondary. Walls had a career game against Georgia Tech when he returned a fumble 74-yards for a touchdown and grabbed an interception in the end zone and returned it 65 yards to flip the field for Temple. He had been out the past four games with an injury but returned to action against Tulane.

Graduate transfer **Ayron Monroe** is finishing his last season of eligibility with the Owls. Monroe transferred from Penn State to come play on Broad Street. He has 45 tackles in ten games and grabbed his first career interception against Tulane.

Redshirt junior **Amir Tyler** also contributed on defense this season. In nine games played, he has tallied 40 tackles, two TFLs, two PBUs, two forced fumbles, and a fumble recovery. He made his first career start against SMU.

Sophomore **DaeSean Winston** was a part of the 2018 recruiting class and played in his first career game against Villanova in 2018. Against Bucknell, Winston was the team's leading tackler with six. He has 19 tackles and a TFL this year.

Redshirt junior **Keyvone Bruton** has played in eight games in 2019 and helps provide a lot of depth and coverage in the third level of the defense

Redshirt senior **Anthony Cruz** joined the team in 2016 as a walk-on wide receiver. He moved to safety in 2018 and played in every game in the secondary and on special teams. Redshirt sophomore **Chauncey Moore** was a part of the 2018 recruiting class and redshirted at cornerback last season. He has since switched to safety.

Redshirt junior **Jason Prince** walked on to the team in 2018.

The 2019 recruiting class welcomes **M.J. Griffin** (Ypsilanti, Mich. / Saline) and **Thomas Joe-Kamara** (Dayton N.J. / South Brunswick).

Freshman **Joshua Irvin** (Middlesex N.J. / Immaculata) joined the team as a walk-on following camp.

## SPECIALISTS

The unit is led by **Brett Diersen** who joined Carey's staff this summer, it is the third time they have worked together. The Owls have prided themselves on dominating special teams and are one of the most successful teams at both blocking kicks and returning kicks for scores.

Redshirt freshman **Will Mobley** has seen action since the Buffalo game in 2018. Graduate transfer **Jacob LaFree** joined the Owls in the spring after kicking and punting at the University of Indianapolis. Mobley handles field goals and PATs while LaFree handles kickoffs. Mobley hit three field goals in the win against Memphis, one was a career-long 44-yarder. He matched his career long with another 44-yarder against USF. Against Tulane, he went 3-3 again to match his career best.

Sophomore **Adam Barry** joined Temple as a transfer punter from Independence Community College. Redshirt sophomore **Max Cavallucci** returns to the Owls following his walk-on redshirt freshman season.

Redshirt sophomore **Cole Lerch** was the long snapper in 2018, but is now the holder on PATs and field goals. Redshirt junior long snapper **Travis Malinowski** was added to the roster as a walk-on in the spring 2017. Malinowski does the snapping for PATs and field goals.

Freshman **Ronald Gaines** joined the Owls as a walk-on long snapper in the summer. He snaps the punts for the Owls. Redshirt freshman **Jake Horoshko** joined the team as a transfer long snapper from Monmouth.

2018 AAC Special Teams Player of the Year **Isaiah Wright** is the main kick and punt returner for the Owls. He was named a 2019 preseason All-American as a return specialist as well as a Paul Hornung Award nominee and honor list for his versatility on the field.

Rod Carey, who served six years as the head coach at Northern Illinois University, was named Temple University's head football coach on January 11, 2019.

Carey, who was named NIU's head coach in December 2012, coached the Huskies in six bowl games, including leading the Mid-American Conference power against Florida State in the 2013 Discover Orange Bowl. He compiled a 52-30 won-loss record at NIU with an impressive 38-10 record in conference play.

"We are very happy to announce that Rod Carey will take over as the next Temple head football coach," said Temple University Director of Athletics Dr. Patrick Kraft in January. "Rod is a proven winner with a history of success as a head coach at the FBS level. He has won four regular season titles and two MAC Championships at Northern Illinois while taking the Huskies to six bowl games, including the 2013 Orange Bowl. He has also recruited and coached All-American players at NIU."

"He possesses all of the qualities you want to see in a person and in a coach. He is a quality man of great character and a caring individual. He is the perfect person to keep Temple Football's momentum moving forward."

"Our football program represents a great source of pride for our university and the city of Philadelphia, as well as for more than 300,000 alumni around the world," said President Richard M. Englert at the time of Carey's hiring. "Coach Carey has a proven track record of success on the football field, and also in supporting the development of his players. We are confident he will also be successful here in representing Temple University, advancing our football program, and ensuring that our players continue to serve as leaders in the classroom, on the field, and in the community."

"I am really excited to lead the Temple University Football program and look forward to continuing its proud Temple TUFF tradition," said Carey at his introductory press conference. "I am extremely grateful to President Englert and Director of Athletics Dr. Patrick Kraft for the opportunity to take over one of the top programs in the American Athletic Conference. This program is on the rise, coming off a record-setting class, and I look forward to raising the bar for success even higher."

"I am also thankful to Northern Illinois University for the opportunity to lead the Huskies the past six years, and to former president John Peters and former athletic director Jeff Compher for their trust in hiring me in 2012 and current AD Sean Frazier for his support throughout my career there. As much as I am looking forward to this incredible opportunity at Temple, it is bittersweet leaving my NIU family."

Under Carey, NIU was the dominant program in the MAC from 2013-16, winning four West Division titles and two MAC Championship games.

Carey guided NIU to a perfect 12-0 regular season record in his first full year at the helm (2013), with that Huskies' team spending nine weeks in the AP poll and rising as high as 16. He followed that year by guiding NIU to an 11-3 record in 2014, tying for the West Division title and winning the MAC Championship with a 51-17 victory over Bowling Green.

Three of the next four seasons saw Carey lead the Huskies to eight-win campaigns with his teams winning two more West Division titles. In 2018, the Hus-



kies finished 8-6 overall, 6-2 in league play, and overcame a 29-10 third quarter deficit to defeat Buffalo, 30-29, in the MAC title game for its second conference championship under Carey.

Success has not just come in league play for Carey's teams as NIU posted a 4-2 mark against Big Ten opponents under his leadership. NIU's four wins during his tenure came against Iowa (2013), Purdue (2013), Northwestern (2014), and Nebraska (2017).

At NIU, Carey coached seven All-Americans, including defensive end Sutton Smith, who became the school's first two-time First Team All-American.

Carey rose quickly to the head coaching position upon his arrival on the NIU campus in 2011. After joining the staff as an offensive line coach, he added run game coordinator to his duties for the 2012 season and then became the offensive coordinator following the team's first game. Three months later, he was named the head coach.

Prior to his arrival at NIU, Carey served as the offensive line coach for three seasons (2008-10) at the University of North Dakota. His line paved the way for UND 1,000-yard rusher Josh Murray (1,146 yards) in 2008 and for the No. 2 running back in the Great West Conference a year later. The Fighting Sioux also passed for 2,000 yards in 2009.

In the shortest stint of his coaching career, Carey was the offensive line coach at Illinois State for the 2007 season. Prior to that, he served on the coaching staff at the University of Wisconsin-Stout for seven seasons (2000-06), where he was the offensive coordinator and offensive line coach.

A native of Wayzata, Minn., Carey began his collegiate coaching career at the University of Minnesota (1998-99) where he helped the Gophers to their first bowl game in over a decade with a trip to the 1999 Sun Bowl. Prior to UM, he spent four seasons in the high school ranks at his alma mater, Wayzata (Minn.) High School, from 1994-97.

A three-year starter at center for Indiana during his collegiate playing days (1990-93), Carey served as a team captain and won IU's Corby Davis Outstanding Offensive Player Award as a senior. He earned his bachelor's degree from Indiana in 1994.

Carey and his wife, Tonya, have two children, daughter Kennedy and son Charlie.

## TEMPLE DOMINATES BUCKNELL IN ROD CAREY'S FIRST WIN AS OWLS' HEAD COACH

PHILADELPHIA – In front of 26,378 fans at Lincoln Financial Field, the Temple Owls started off the 2019 season hot with a dominant 56-12 win over the Bucknell Bison. The Owls broke the single-season record for total yards (695) and passing yards in a game (507) and didn't allow a touchdown on defense. It is the largest opening day margin of victory (44 points) since 1969 at Rhode Island when the Owls beat the Rams 47-3.

### How it Happened

>Temple came out firing in the first quarter and scored on its opening drive of the season. After driving 67-yards into the redzone, QB Anthony Russo pitched a shovel pass to WR Jadan Blue to take the lead 7-0.

>The Owls' defense forced Bucknell to punt again. Temple then took advantage of its great defensive play by scoring on offense, marching 77 yards on 10 plays to push the score to 14-0 with five minutes left in the first quarter. The drive was capped off by an 11-yard touchdown run by RB Jager Gardner.

>The Owls got the ball back again after another Bison punt and drove down the field 77 yards. Gardner scored again, his first multi-TD game, on a one-yard punch-in to lengthen the lead to 21-0. Russo hit Blue for 37-yards to set up the score.

>Following another Bucknell punt, the Owls got the ball again deep in their own territory. Despite starting at their own 4 yard line, the Owls drove the length of the field and scored for the fourth time in a row to go up 28-0. Russo connected with WR Isaiah Wright in the corner of the end zone for a 12-yard score.

>Temple forced another punt on the following drive and set up its offense on its own 37 yard line. Bucknell quickly turned the tables and jumped a Russo pass, taking it back for a touchdown. A missed extra-point made the score 28-6 in favor.

>Following a punt by Temple, Bucknell hit another field goal to make it 28-9.

>Before the end of the half, Temple got the ball back and wasted no time scoring. Russo hit true freshman RB Re'Mahn Davis in the flat and he took it up the sideline 51 yards for a half-ending touchdown to bring the lead to 35-9.

>Bucknell opened up the second half with a 13-play drive that led to another field goal to make the score 35-12.

>Temple responded on the next drive with another touchdown pass from Russo. The junior QB hit TE Aar-



on Jarman for a 10-yard touchdown, the first reception and touchdown in the redshirt freshman's career. Temple led 42-12 halfway through the third quarter.

>The Owls' stout defense forced another three-and-out and capitalized on it with another touchdown. Wright broke off a 34-yard run to get the Owls over midfield. Davis finished a 7-yard carry for the score to make it 49-12.

>The teams traded punts to start the fourth quarter. Bucknell put together a long 15-play drive, but had nothing to show for it after the Owls stood strong in the red zone and forced a turnover on downs inside their own 10-yard line.

>Todd Centeio relieved Russo of QB duties and the Owls continued to attack on offense. Centeio hit Travon Williams down the sideline for an 89-yard touchdown to make it 56-12, and end

the scoring.

### NOTES

>Russo is the first Temple QB to throw for two 400+ yard games in his career.

>First career receiving and rushing touchdown for Davis in his first collegiate game becoming the first Temple freshman to rush for and catch a touchdown pass in a single game since Tanardo Sharps in 1999.

## FOOTBALL STANDS TALL ON DEFENSE, TAKES DOWN #21 MARYLAND

PHILADELPHIA – In front of 30,610 fans the Temple Owls defeated the #21 Maryland Terrapins 20-17 in a hard-nosed defensive battle at Lincoln Financial Field. Both Temple and Maryland were coming off high-scoring affairs, but the defenses were up to the challenge and showed their dominance. The Owls stood tall on the goal line three times, and prevented a last minute comeback to seal the victory. The Owls are now 2-0 to start the season.

### How it happened

> Maryland started the game with the ball first. They drove to midfield before Temple CB Harrison Hand intercepted a third-down pass to set the Owls up with great field position for their first offensive drive of the game.

> QB Anthony Russo connected with WR Branden Mack for 10-yards, then TE Kenny Yeboah for 15-yards, before finishing off the drive with a 29-yard touchdown to WR Isaiah Wright for a 7-0 lead.

> Temple forced another punt, but it was accidentally touched by an Owl and recovered by Maryland inside the redzone. Temple's defense stopped the Terrapins on the goal-line, forcing a turnover on downs.

> The Owls couldn't get much going from inside their own five yard-line and were forced to punt. An errant snap forced a safety and Maryland trailed, 7-2.

> On the following drive, Maryland drove to the Temple 25 yardline and missed a field goal wide left.

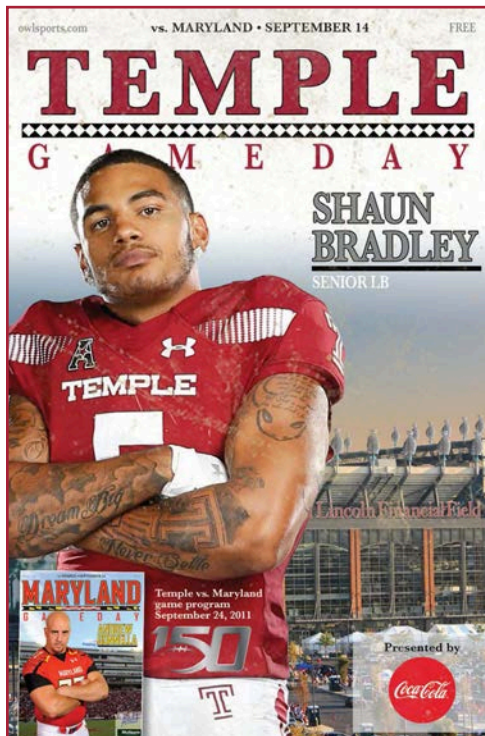
> The Temple defense gave the Terrapins fits throughout the second quarter. DT Ifeanyi Majieh was in the backfield early and often, forcing the Terrapins to punt. At the half, the Owls led 7-2.

> Maryland struck first in the second half. The Terrapins took the ball 86 yards on 11 plays and scored on a four-yard rushing touchdown to take the lead, 9-7 with 8:20 left in the third quarter.

> On the first play of the next drive, Russo connected with Jadan Blue down the sideline for a 79 yard touchdown to take the lead back, 13-9.

> The Owls forced a quick three-and-out, but thwarted their opportunity at a score with an interception. Maryland took advantage of the turnover and scored a touchdown. Majieh was able to get a hand on the extra-point, blocking it, to make the score 15-13 Maryland.

> The Owls had their next drive cut short on another fumble and Maryland took over as the third quarter ended.



> After forcing the Terrapins to punt on their next drive, the Owls put together a long scoring drive to take the lead back. RB tandem Jager Gardner and Re'Mahn Davis did the heavy lifting on the drive. The Owls got the ball into the redzone as Russo connected with Kenny Yeboah on a 7 yard bootleg pass. The Owls fooled the Terrapins with misdirection and Yeboah was alone in the corner of the endzone for the easy touchdown to give TU the 20-15 lead with 7:30 left to play.

> With five minutes remaining, the Terrapins were inside the Owls' five yardline and threatening to score. The defense had another goal line stand, stopping the Terrapins on consecutive runs from the one yardline to prevent the score.

> Following a Temple punt, the Owls defense had to hold strong again in their own redzone with three minutes left. It came down to another goal line stand and Temple stopped Maryland in its tracks and forced another turnover on downs.

> The Owls bled the clock and eventually took a safety as time expired to account for the final score in the 20-17 win.

### Notes

> Temple coach Rod Carey became just the second Owl coach to defeat a nationally-ranked team in his first season. He joins Bobby Wallace, who defeated #14 Virginia Tech, 28-24, on Oct. 17, 1998.

> Career long touchdown throw from Russo to Jadan Blue 79-yards.

> Blue now has back-to-back 100-yard receiving games, the first Owl to do so since Jalen Fitzpatrick in 2014.

## TEMPLE FALLS TO BUFFALO IN FIRST ROAD TRIP OF THE SEASON

**BUFFALO** – In front of 17,621 fans at UB Stadium the Temple Owls suffered their first loss, 38-22, to the Buffalo Bulls.

### How it Happened

>The Owls started off on defense and CB Christian Braswell quickly changed that with an interception, his first of the season.

>Working with a short field, Temple drove down the field and scored on its first drive for the third consecutive game. QB Anthony Russo connected with WR Isaiah Wright for a two-yard touchdown to make it 7-0. Wright also scored first against Maryland last week.

>Buffalo answered with a 52-yard field goal to make it 7-3. On the following Owls' drive, an errant snap on a punt gave Buffalo a short field to work with and the Bulls took advantage with a 4-yard TD rush to take the lead, 10-7.

>With nine minutes left in the half, Russo was stripped and Buffalo recovered the ball inside the red zone. Buffalo ran the ball in from seven yards out to extend its lead, 17-7.

>Late in the half, Buffalo used a 14-play, 84-yard drive capped by a two-yard touchdown to take a 24-7 half-time lead.

>On the opening drive of the second half, the Owls connected on their biggest play of the day - a 43-yard strike from Russo to WR Jadan Blue. The drive ended on an interception, the first of Russo's three in the half.

>Two third quarter picks led to good field position for Buffalo and the Bulls capitalized with another rushing touchdown to lengthen the lead 31-7.

>The Temple offense was able to string together a productive drive late in the third quarter that led to a 34-yard field goal by Will Mobley to cut the lead to 31-10.

>A tipped pass resulted in a pick-six for Buffalo to make the score 38-10, but Temple answered on the following drive. Wright returned the ensuing kickoff 51-yards to



give the Owls great field position on the Buffalo 40. Russo connected with WR Branden Mack for a 27-yard touchdown to make the score 38-16.

>Russo connected again with Mack for a 33-yard TD with two minutes remaining to cut the deficit to 38-22, but the Bulls recovered the ensuing onside kick and ran the clock out.

### DAVIS, STIFLING DEFENSE LEADS TO 24-2 WIN OVER FORMER COACH GEOFF COLLINS

PHILADELPHIA – Temple used a big play defense and two touchdowns from freshman Re'Mahn Davis to defeat visiting Georgia Tech, 24-2, Saturday in front of 31,094 at Lincoln Financial Field. Davis, who had 135 yards on 29 carries, became the first true Temple freshman running back to rush for over 100 yards since his teammate, senior Jager Gardner, accomplished the feat in 2015.

The Owls improve to 3-1 on the season while the Yellow Jackets, under the direction of Temple's former coach Geoff Collins, fall to 1-3.

#### How it Happened

> Senior S Benny Walls made two huge defensive plays, returning a fumble 74 yards for a third quarter touchdown and intercepting a pass in the end zone and bringing it back 65 yards to the Tech 35.

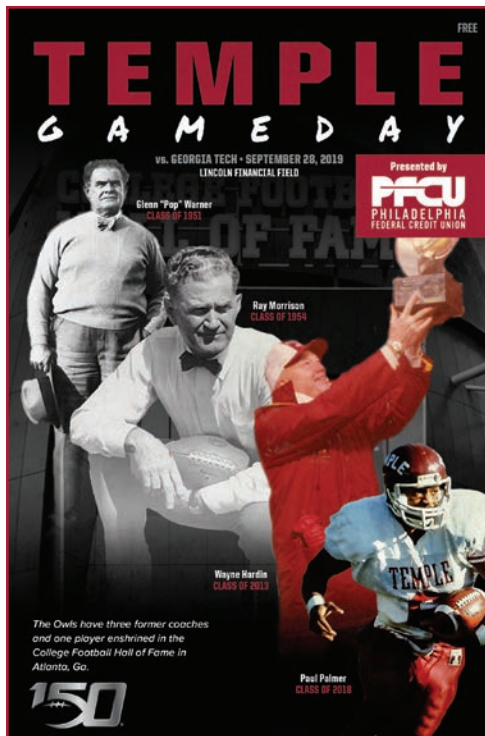
> It was the lowest point total allowed by Temple since the Owls shut out Tulane on Nov. 16, 2016.

Temple's defense set the tone early, holding Georgia Tech scoreless in the first half. The Owls limited the Yellow Jackets to six first downs over the first 30 minutes of play.

> The Cherry and White allowed only one sustained drive in the half, that being a 15-play, 85-yarder that ended when redshirt junior LB Isaiah Graham Mobley stripped Tech QB Tobias Oliver at the goal line on a third and nine play. The ball was recovered in the air by redshirt sophomore CB Christian Braswell for a touchback.

> The Owls offense started strong, marching down the field on their opening drive. A 38-yard reception by redshirt sophomore WR Jadan Blue set up a first and goal at the Georgia Tech 10. Three plays later redshirt junior QB Anthony Russo was picked off by Kaleb Oliver in the end zone to end the Owls' drive. Temple finally got on the scoreboard with its second drive of the second quarter. The Owls moved the ball 58 yards, all on the ground, with Davis capping the drive with an 18-yard touchdown off left tackle on 4th and one to put Temple in front 7-0.

> The Owls increased their lead to 14-0 on their next possession as Davis again rushed to paydirt, this time from one-yard out to cap a 13-play, 73-yard drive. Davis rushed for 17 yards on the drive while senior WR Isaiah Wright made the big play, a 26-yard reception to give the Owls the ball on the Georgia Tech 24.



> Redshirt sophomore DT Ifeanyi Maijeh stripped Oliver on the first drive of the second half. The fumble was recovered by Walls and returned 74 yards for the touchdown to give the Owls a 21-0 lead.

> On its next possession, Georgia Tech punted to the Temple one to set up a safety on the Owls' opening drive of the second half. Davis was tackled in the end zone on the first play to make the score 21-2.

> The Owls scored on their next possession, marching 47 yards on 11 plays with redshirt sophomore PK Will Mobley connecting on a 34-yard field goal to make it 24-2 with 55 seconds remaining in the third quarter. A 16-yard run down the right sideline by Gardner led the score.

> Walls made his second huge defensive play of the game, intercepting Georgia Tech QB James

Graham and returning it 65 yards to the Yellow Jackets 35 midway through the fourth quarter.

> Temple closed out its stellar defensive effort by stopping Georgia Tech on a 4th and two at its own 12. Maijeh tackled Dontae Smith for a one-yard loss to end the drive.

#### Notes

> Davis was the first Temple true freshman to rush for at least 100-yards since his counterpart, Gardner, did so against SMU in 2015.

> Temple's defense has only given up two touchdowns at home in 2019.

> The Owls stingy defense has shown up on third down. Georgia Tech was only able to convert 2-14 third downs and 2-4 fourth downs.

## Temple 27, ECU 17 Thursday, October 3, 2019 Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium, Greenville, N.C. TEMPLE POWERS ECU IN BLACKOUT GAME

GREENVILLE, N.C. – In the first conference game of the Rod Carey era, Temple took down ECU 27-17 in front of 33,253 fans at Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium. At kickoff, the temperature was 85 degrees, making it the hottest game played in October at ECU since 2000.

Despite early penalties on both sides of the ball, the Owls used a balanced attack on offense and continued to prove why they are one of the best defenses in the country. Temple has given up just two touchdowns over the last two games. RB Re'Mahn Davis had his second consecutive 100-yard rushing game and had a career best 157 yards on 24 carries for one touchdown. Both WR Isaiah Wright and Branden Mack broke the 100-yard receiving mark. The Owls allowed 3-14 third downs to be converted and only allowed 327 total yards of offense.

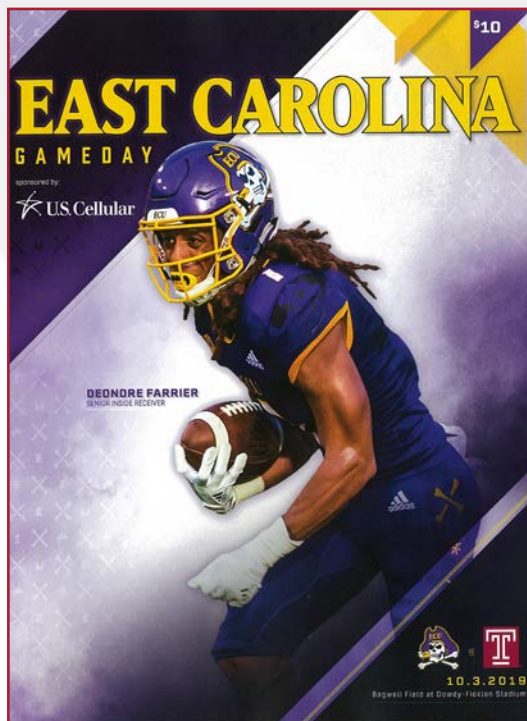
### How It Happened

>Temple started off slow committing a few costly penalties that allowed for ECU to move up the field easily. The Pirates scored first but the Owls answered with 17 points in the second quarter.

>Will Mobley put the Owls on the board first with a 29-yard field goal to cut the lead to 7-3. As a part of the game plan, QB Todd Centeio came in and started the final series of the first quarter. The plan proved to be successful as Centeio sparked the offense and Mobley finished off the drive with the field goal.

>On the following ECU drive, the Owls forced a three-and-out and capitalized on the quick turnaround. RB Jager Garnder finished off the 10-play drive with a nine yard touchdown run to take the lead 10-7.

>ECU immediately countered with a 39-yard field goal on the next drive to tie the game 10-10. Temple then added another score to break the tie. Wright set up the Owls with prime field position after a 55-yard return on the ensuing kickoff. Davis did the heavy lifting, but Russo hit WR Branden Mack down the sideline for a 22-yard



reception that set up Davis for a one-yard punch in touchdown to put the Owls up 17-10. The Owls took the 17-10 lead into halftime.

>The Owls stout defense held the Pirates scoreless in the third quarter. The Owls did tack on another touchdown on the final drive of the third. After forcing ECU to punt from its own end zone, Temple got the ball back at the ECU 49 yardline. With another short field, the tandem of Davis and Gardner continued to be a problem for the Pirates. The eight-play drive concluded with a Russo pitch-pass to Wright for a six yard touchdown.

>After another ECU three-and-out, the Owls were able to tack on another field goal. Mobley hit a season-long 39-yard field goal to length-

en the lead, 27-10 Temple.

>Following a 15-minute delay because of a light malfunction, ECU scored to make it 27-17 with under a minute to play. ECU then recovered an onside kick but Temple prevented a late-game comeback and hung on to win.

## TEMPLE CELEBRATES HOMECOMING WITH THRILLING 30-28 WIN OVER #23 MEMPHIS

PHILADELPHIA — Temple used a big-play defense and a well-rounded offense to defeat #23 Memphis, 30-28, in front of a Homecoming crowd of 34,253 fans at Lincoln Financial Field. Temple has now defeated two nationally-ranked opponents in a season for the first time in program history.

### How it Happened

>Temple's defense made big plays throughout the contest to stymie the Tigers attack. The Owls forced four Memphis turnovers and added two more turnovers on downs.

>Redshirt sophomore Ifeanyi Majieh pressured Tiger QB Brady White on a fourth-and-nine play with 1:50 remaining. The pressure forced his pass to TE Joey Magnifico to be incomplete following review.

>Following a three-and-out where Temple ran the clock down to 48 seconds, the Tigers had one last chance, but the Owls defense stayed strong.

### Recapping the Game

>For the fourth time this season, the Owls scored on their opening drive. Following a facemask penalty that put the ball at midfield, Russo found Mack for a 38-yard pass play to the Memphis 12.

>After Davis made three rushes to put the ball at the one his backfield mate, redshirt Gardner took it in for the score to make it 7-0.

>Temple's defense then took over, forcing consecutive turnovers on three Memphis possessions which led to three field goals by redshirt sophomore kicker Will Mobley.

>Junior CB Harrison Hand intercepted White at midfield to set up the first Mobley field goal, a 31-yarder to make it 10-0.

>Next was graduate student DE DeAndre Kelly sacking White and forcing a fumble that senior LB Sam Franklin recovered and ran back 32 yards to the Memphis 12.

>The Tigers defense held strong with Mobley connecting on a 29-yarder for a 13-0 lead.

>Following a 43-yard pass play from White to Kedarian Jones that put the ball on the Temple 15, redshirt senior DE Dana Levine stripped Tiger RB Austin Hall with redshirt junior DE Quincy Roche recovering the fumble at the Owls 19.

>Temple then marched 54 yards on 14 plays with Mobley hitting from 44 yards out to make it 16-0 with 12:43 left in the half.

>The Owls drove the ball to the Memphis 28 on their next offensive possession, but this time it was the Cherry and Whites turn to cough the ball up. A missed exchange in the backfield gave the Tigers the ball on their own 33.

>It took White just four plays to lead his team down the field with a 36-yard pass to Magnifico leading to a 14-yard TD reception by Damonte Coxie, making it 16-7.

>Temple answered with a nine-play, 75-yard drive capped by a 12-yard touchdown catch by senior Isaiah Wright to make it 23-7. Russo was four-of-six on the drive for 39 yards and the touchdown while Gardner (11 yards) and Davis (10) each had big first down rushes.

>Memphis was not done, however, as the Tigers took little time to add another touchdown, marching 75 yards on seven plays in a little over a minute. White completed four of five passes on the drive that was capped by a Kenneth Gainwell 25-yard touchdown.

### Second Half

>Memphis cut the Owls lead to two points, 23-21, on their opening possession of the second half. The Tigers used their longest drive, an 11-play, 95-yard possession that was capped by a 23-yard run to paydirt by Kaylan Watkins.

>After a three-and-out offensive possession by the Owls, the Tem-

ple defense came up with another fourth down stop. With the Tigers at their own 49, Hand and Majieh stopped all-purpose back Gainwell to turn the ball over.

>The Owls marched down to the Memphis 11 following a 30-yard shuttle pass from Centeio to redshirt sophomore Jadan Blue. The next play, however, was a gadget play where Mack through back to Centeio but the Tigers T.J. Carter stripped the Owls QB and recovered at the 7.

>Memphis again drove the ball down the field, moving it to the Temple 36 before Hand stripped White with redshirt junior safety Amir Tyler recovering at the Temple 45.

>Temple capitalized quickly, using five plays to increase its lead to 30-21 on a Russo 12-yard pass to Mack in the left corner of the end zone with 12:48 remaining. Gardner's 24-yard run set up the touchdown pass.

>The Tigers answered right back as White directed his offense on a seven-play, 75-yard drive ending with a three-yard White to Tyce Daniel touchdown pass.

>Russo led the Owls on a 12-play drive on the ensuing possession, but this time it was the Memphis defense that stood tall. The Tigers stopped Davis just short on a fourth-and-two from the Tigers 31.

>With momentum apparently on their side, the Tigers quickly moved the ball across midfield. The Temple defense then held, and on a fourth-and-nine, Majieh hurried White on his pass to Magnifico, which at first was ruled a catch and first down, but upon review it showed the ball hit the ground for an incomplete pass.

>The Tigers had one more chance with less than a minute to play, but again Temple's defense was up to the challenge, and the Owls held on for the 30-28 win.

### Notes

>First career strip sack for DE DeAndre Kelly.

>Ifeanyi Majieh has at least a half sack in every game this season.

>Second career interception as an Owl for CB Harrison Hand, he also had the game ending tackle.

>The last Temple head coach to start 5-1 was Wayne Hardin in 1979.

>This is the first time that Temple has beat two ranked teams in a season.

## TEMPLE FALLS ON THE ROAD TO #19 SMU WHO REMAINS UNBEATEN

DALLAS – The Temple Owls lost to the #19 SMU Mustangs, 45-21, Saturday evening. The Owls fall to 5-2 and 2-1 in conference play while the Mustangs move to 7-0 and 3-0 in the conference.

Temple struggled to keep the SMU passing offense in check and had a hard time getting its own offense going in the first half. The Owls continued to fight back, cutting the lead to 10 multiple times, but the Mustangs potent offense was able to fire back and maintain a lead throughout the second half.

### How It Happened

>SMU started the game with a quick score to take a 7-0 lead. QB Shane Buechele hit Reggie Roberson, Jr. for a 33-yard touchdown.

>Following a three and out for the Owls, SMU tacked on another field goal to extend the lead to 10-0. The Owls came up with a goal line stand at the beginning of the second quarter to prevent the Mustangs from scoring again.

>The Mustangs, however, increased their lead on a 75-yard TD catch by Roberson to make the score 17-0. Following a short kick, Temple started the next drive from its own 35 yardline. The Owls were able to put together some big plays that led to their first score of the game. Russo connected with WR Branden Mack down the sideline for 26-yards and again with TE Kenny Yeboah for 20-yards that got Temple down to the one yardline. RB Re'Mahn Davis finished the drive off with a one-yard touchdown run that made it a 17-7 game.

>Both teams traded punts before SMU scored again at the end of the half. A 10-yard touchdown pass from Buechele to James Proche made the score 24-7.

>The Owls started the second half from their own 42 yardline. Russo connected with WR Jose Barbon for a 24-yard pass on a third-and-12 that put Temple into SMU territory. Russo and Mack finished off the drive with a 25-yard touchdown pass to make the score 24-14.

>SMU countered on the next drive with another Buechele passing touchdown, this time a 10-yarder to Kylan Granson, to make the score 31-14.

>With under two minutes left in the third, CB Harrison Hand picked off a fourth down pass to give the Owls



the ball back. However, this play was mitigated by a fumble on the next play to give SMU the ball back. Temple's defense held strong despite the Mustangs getting the ball back inside the red-zone. SMU was forced to kick of a field goal and missed a 26 yarder to keep the score 31-14 at the end of the third quarter.

>Temple capitalized on the missed field goal with its longest drive of the day. Russo connected with WR Jadan Blue for 11-yards and 36-yards consecutively to get the Owls to the one yardline. Russo finished the drive off with a one-yard keeper to make the score 31-21 with 13 minutes to play.

>On the following drive, Buechele hit Roberson for a 60-yard touchdown, his third of the

day, to make it 38-21.

>The Mustangs tacked on another touchdown with seven minutes to play to make the score 45-21 and that would be the final score.

**HOME WIN STREAK ENDS AS TEMPLE FALLS TO UCF**

PHILADELPHIA — In a key American Athletic Conference East Division showdown, UCF broke away from Temple in the second half for a 63-21 win on Saturday night in front of 29,949 fans at Lincoln Financial Field. The Owls, which saw their eight-game home win streak come to an end, fall to 5-3 overall and 2-2 in AAC play. The Knights improve to 6-2 and 3-1 in conference play.

After tightly-contested first 30 minutes which saw UCF take a 28-21 lead into the locker room, the Knights broke things open in the third quarter, scoring four touchdowns on their six possessions while holding the Owls off the scoreboard. UCF tacked on another touchdown on its first possession to account for the final score.

#### How it Happened

>Temple took the opening kickoff and marched quickly down the field with an eight-play 70-yard touchdown drive to make it 7-0. Redshirt-junior QB Anthony Russo (12-24-2, 199 yds, 2 TDs) hit senior WR Randle Jones in stride down the right hash marks for a 32-yard touchdown. The other big play to set the score up was a Russo to senior WR Isaiah Wright 25-yard catch and run to the UCF 45.

>UCF answered that with a 76-yard, seven-play drive to even the score on a 20-yard touchdown reception by Jake Hescock touchdown. Knights QB Dillon Gabriel was four-of-four for 68 yards on the drive.

>UCF took the lead, 14-7, late in the first quarter on a 48-yards touchdown run by Arian Killins, Jr. It was the first play of the Knights drive after forcing a Temple punt from its own end zone.

>Redshirt sophomore QB Todd Centeio rotated in for a possession and led the Owls to midfield before UCF forced a punt. Temple downed the Adam Barry punt at the one, but two consecutive big plays, a 54-yard run by Otis Anderson (17 rushes, 205 yds, 1 TD) and a 25-yard reception by Gabriel Davis put the ball on the TU 13. Reserve QB Darriel Mack, Jr. finished the drive with a six yard TD run on a third and three play to put the Knights ahead 21-7.

>On the ensuing possession, Russo hit redshirt junior WR Branden Mack (5 catches, 104 yds) down the left sidelines for a 75-yard touchdown. Mack, who tied the TU single season record with his fourth 100-yard receiving game on the play, made the catch around the UCF 25 and then broke a tackle by Zaman Maxwell for the score. It was the longest TD reception of his career.

>UCF again answered, driving 75 yards on 11 plays with Gabriel hitting Tre Nixon for a 25 yard touchdown on a fourth-and-five play to make it 28-14.

>With Temple's drive stalled at its own 39, Barry punted to 43 yards to Anderson, who muffed it directly into the

hands of redshirt junior Isaiah Graham-Mobley at the UCF 18. Six plays later redshirt senior Jager Gardner carried it in from one-yard out to cut the deficit to 28-21 right before halftime.

>UCF pushed the lead back to two touchdowns early in the third quarter when Gabriel connected with Marvin Williams on a 73-yard touchdown to 35-21.

>Following a Temple punt to its own 40, Bentavious Thompson broke free on the second play of the drive for a 34-yard touchdown run to extend the UCF lead to 42-21.

>The Owls were stopped short on a fake punt on fourth and three at its own 32 which set up another UCF score. This time it was Otis Anderson who rushed 47 yards to paydirt to make it 49-21.

>UCF's Aaron Robinson picked off Russo on the Owls' next possession and it took just four plays before Thompson rushed it in from 11 yards out to increase the Knights lead to 56-21.

>Following another interception, UCF drove 70 yards on 11 plays with a four-yard touchdown catch by TE Jonathan MacCollister capping the drive.

>That accounted for all of the scoring as both teams cleared the benches for the remainder of the game.

## Temple 17, USF 7 Thursday, November 7, 2019 Raymond James Stadium, Tampa, Fla. DEFENSE DOMINATES USF IN 17-7 WIN AT USF

TAMPA – Temple's defense looked well rested after a bye week in posting a dominating performance in a 17-7 win over USF Thursday night in an ESPN primetime matchup at Raymond James Stadium. The Owls defense recorded nine sacks in the contest and Sam Franklin returned a fumble 39 yards for a touchdown. Jager Gardner reached a career-high with 133 yards rushing to lead the Cherry and White offense.

Temple (6-3, 3-2 in AAC) became Bowl eligible with the victory, marking the sixth straight season the program has accomplished the feat.

### Summary

>Besides Gardner, who also had a career-high with 25 carries, redshirt sophomore Jadan Blue set a new career high with 11 catches while amassing 121 yards.  
>Redshirt junior QB Anthony Russo completed 15-of-20 passes for 164 yards in directing the Temple offense.  
>Redshirt sophomore Will Mobley matched his career-long field goal with a 44-yarder.  
>Defensively, redshirt junior DE Quincy Roche led the sack attack with a career-high 3.5 of the team's nine sacks. Four other Owls each added one with the Temple also being credited for a team sack. The nine sacks were the most by Temple since a 10-sack game vs. Penn State in 2015.  
>Redshirt sophomore LB Audley Isaacs tied Roche for the team lead in tackles with a career-high six tackles.  
Recapping the Game

### First Quarter

>After extending USF's initial drive with a roughing the kicker penalty, Temple graduate DE Deandre Kelly forced a fumble with senior LB Shaun Bradley recovering on the Owls 29.  
>The Owls then drove 62 yards on 15 plays, eight coming on rushes by Gardner, before the Bulls held on a fourth-and-one on their own seven.  
>USF again moved the ball into Temple territory before Roche sacked QB Jordan McCloud for a six-yard loss on a third and eight to force a punt.  
>Following a TU three-and-out, the Bulls again drove into Owl territory before Temple held on a fourth-and-three from its own 35 to end a scoreless first quarter.

### Second Quarter

>Both teams' defenses forced three-and-outs to start the second quarter.  
>After a 21-yard pass play from Russo to WR Branden Mack, the Owls drive stalled at midfield. Redshirt junior Kenny Yeboah then made a big special teams play on sophomore Adam Barry's punt, keeping the ball from going into the end zone and pinning the Bulls at their own one.  
>LB Sam Franklin made a big hit to break-up a first down



pass and ending the Bulls drive at the USF 42. The play was initially ruled targeting on the field, but overturned by review.

>With redshirt sophomore QB taking over for a series, the Owls drove 80 yards to break the scoreless tie. Gardner provided the big play, breaking one down the left sideline for 57 yards to the USF 2. Three plays later, Centeio used play action to find a wide open Yeboah in the end zone to make it 7-0.

### Third Quarter

>Temple marched down the field on its opening drive courtesy of three pass plays from Russo to Blue for 37 yards. Then it was USF's time to come up with a big defensive play when Bentlee Sanders picked off Russo at the Bulls 10.  
>Arnold Ebiketie sacked McCloud to force a

three-and-out on the Bulls first possession of the half.  
>Centeio took over for Temple's second series of the half, but there was no magic this time. The Owls went three-and-out following a USF sack.  
>Christian Braswell stripped USF receiver Terrence Horne with Franklin scooping up the fumble and returning it 39 yards for the touchdown to make it 14-0.  
>USF quickly answered the Owls touchdown, marching 90 yards on seven plays with McCloud connecting with Bryce Miller on a 14-yard score to cut the Temple lead to 14-7 with just over a minute remaining in the quarter.

### Fourth Quarter

>The Owls extended their lead in the first minute of the fourth quarter as Mobley matched his career-long field goal with a 44-yarder to put Temple ahead 17-7. The big play on the drive was a 36-yard reception by Blue which moved the ball to the Bulls 36.  
>Temple's defense continued to dominate on USF's next possession, rattling off its seventh and eight sack of the contest to force a Bulls punt.  
>The Owls offense then ran off seven minutes of game clock, marching 74 yard on 13 plays before turning the ball over on downs at the USF 9 with just 2:06 remaining.  
>Roche then put the icing on his career day, combining with DE Dana Levine (1.5 sacks) for his final sack of the day. The Bulls then came up short on a 4th and 14 to end the game.

## BLUE, ROCHE, AND YEBOAH SHINE AS FOOTBALL TOPS TULANE

PHILADELPHIA — In front of 27,850 fans at Lincoln Financial Field the Temple Owls got back to their winning ways at home, taking down the Tulane Green Wave 29-21.

QBs Anthony Russo and Todd Centeio both tossed touchdowns as WR Jadan Blue (12-131-1) and TE Kenny Yeboah (5-63-2) had career days. DE Quincy Roche (12 tackles, 6.0 TFLS, 3.0 sacks, and a forced fumble) put on a defensive show as the Owls fought hard in the victory. Kicker Will Mobley tied a career-best as well as he was perfect on three FG attempts.

### How it Happened First Quarter

>The Owls started the game with a quick three-and-out and Tulane took over on its own 38 yard line. After a holding penalty negated a 34-yard run, Roche strip sacked Justin McMillan and recovered the fumble that set up Temple inside the red zone. The Owls settled for a 35-yard field goal to take the lead 3-0.

>On their next drive, Tulane drove down inside the Owls' red zone. On 2nd-and-13 DE Dana Levine blew up the backfield and forced a 12-yard loss. Tulane couldn't convert on third down and set up for a 47-yard FG attempt. The Owls stacked the line and Levine was able to block the kick and keep the Green Wave off the scoreboard.

### Second Quarter

>Centeio connected with WR Branden Mack for 10-yards to convert a third down and extend the drive on the first play of the second quarter. On the next play Centeio hit TE David Martin-Robinson for 32-yards to bring the Owls into Tulane territory. Centeio then found Blue for a 30-yard catch to get the Owls inside the red zone. Centeio hit Yeboah for a four-yard touchdown.

>After Temple forced a Tulane three-and-out, Russo returned under center. He immediately went back to Yeboah who beat a linebacker down the left sideline and made a 44-yard catch-and-run. The drive ended in another Mobley field goal, this time from 27-yard out.

>On the next offensive drive for Temple, Russo threw an interception that set up Tulane with a short field. Tulane cashed in with a touchdown and cut the lead to 13-7 on a five-yard dive up the middle with 2:20 left in the half.

>Tulane got the ball back with 34 seconds left in the half looking to score. The Green Wave got into Temple territory, but SAF Ayron Monroe intercepted a pass in the end zone to end the scoring opportunity and the half.

### Third Quarter

>The Owls started the second half by forcing Tulane to punt on its opening drive. Russo and Co. drove down the field 73 yards but were stopped short of the end zone again. Mobley tacked on his third field goal of the day, from 20-yards out, to give Temple a 16-7 lead.

>On the next drive, Tulane coughed the ball up again as SAF Amir Tyler knocked it loose with a big hit on the Tulane running back. The fumble was recovered by CB Christian Braswell and set up the offense on Tulane's side of the field.



>The Owls took advantage of the good field position and drove 47-yards for a score. Russo completed a three-yard pass to Yeboah for his second touchdown of the day. The extra point was no good but Temple took a 22-7 lead with 1:40 left in the third.

### Fourth Quarter

>As the fourth quarter began, Tulane converted a third-and-short to set up a first and goal from inside the five yard-line. It only took one play for the Green Wave to punch it in and cut the lead to 22-14.

>The Owls answered with another touchdown themselves. Russo targeted Blue for 12-, 14- and 19-yards. He found Blue a final time for a 16-yard score to make it 29-14.

>Tulane responded with another score. The Green Wave converted two fourth downs on the drive and punched the ball in to make the score 29-21.

>Following a punt, Temple's defense had to

hang tough to prevent Tulane from mounting a possible game-tying score. On a third-and-seven from Temple's 32 yardline, Roche made a huge seven yard stop that forced a fourth-and-14. The Owls held strong on defense and forced the turnover on downs with 2:38 left in the game. Nothing came of the offensive drive, and the Owls surrendered the ball with 1:34 left in the game.

>Tulane got the ball back and advanced up the field on a defensive pass interference. The Owls were able to hold off any comeback by the Green Wave on the last drive. Roche has two sacks in the final drive that helped seal the win for Temple, 29-21.

### Notes

>Roche's six TFLs is a Temple and American Athletic Conference record.

>Blue has had 10+ catches and 100+ yards receiving in back-to-back games. He is the first Owl to ever have three 10+ catch games in a season.

>SAF Ayron Monroe had his first career interception.
