## THE STORYLINES . . .

- Tulsa is in its 120th season of football this year, as college football celebrates its 150th year.
- Tulsa has the smallest FBS enrollment with 3,297 undergraduate students, while Cincinnati has an enrollment of 44,783 students.
- Cincinnati is ranked 21st in the AP poll, marking the third time this season that the Hurricane will face a top-25 team.

## THE SERIES . . .

- This is the 34th meeting between Tulsa and Cincinnati as the Hurricane lead the series 17-14-2.
- \* The last time the two teams met was in Tulsa on Nov. 25, 2016 as the Hurricane claimed a 40-37 victory in overtime.
- Tulsa's win in 2016 snapped a 5-game losing streak against the Bearcats.
- The two teams were also members together of the Missouri Valley Conference in the 1950s and '60s.
- Cincinnati has a 10-6-0 record at home in the series.



## FIRST & TEN . . .

- Tulsa went 2-2 in non-conference games this year.
- 2 of Tulsa's losses are to top-25 teams – #18 Michigan State and #24 SMU.
- Tulsa's 8 AAC opponents have combined for a .723 winning percentage with an overall 34-13 record through 7 weeks this season.
- Tulsa's strength of schedule according to Cody Kellner's Points Index this week is ranked 24th nationally, the second-highest in the American Athletic Conference behind #19 Cincinnati.
- In the first 5 games of the season Tulsa faced an undefeated opponent each week ... Tulsa handed San Jose State and Wyoming their first losses.
- Tulsa has seven 2018 bowl participants on its 2019 schedule — Michigan State, Oklahoma State, Cincinnati, Memphis, Tulane, UCF and Houston.
- Tulsa's win at San Jose State snapped a 13-game road losing streak ... before that, Tulsa's last true road win was at UCF, 35-20, on Nov. 19, 2016.

## AMONG TOP-10 IN THE AMERICAN . . .

- A number of Tulsa players rank among the top-10 in the American Athletic Conference statistics:
- LBs Cooper Edmiston and Zaven Collins rank 1 and 3 for tackles with 56 and 48, respectively ... safety Brandon Johnson is 5th with 47 total stops.
- DE Trevis Gipson ranks 3rd for TFLs (8.5) and 6th for sacks (4).
- CB Reggie Robinson ranks 5th for total passes defended (6) and SAF Bryson Powers is 2nd for fumbles forced (2).
- RB Shamari Brooks is the AAC's 5th leading rusher (77.3 ypg).
- QB Zach Smith ranks 3rd for passing average (269.7 ypg) and total offense (258.2 ypg), and 7th for pass efficiency (127.1).
- WR Keylon Stokes is 5th for receiving yards (77.8 ypg), 6th for all-purpose yards (115.8 ypg) and 8th for receptions per game (4.5); while WR Sam Crawford, Jr., is 9th for receiving yards (61.7 ypg).
- Thomas Bennett is 6th for punting (42.7), Jacob Rainey is 5th for field goals per game and 9th for kick scoring.



## PHILIP MONTGOMERY IN FIFTH YEAR LEADING TULSA FOOTBALL PROGRAM . . .

- Philip Montgomery is in his fifth season with a 23-33 overall head coaching record.
- Montgomery completed his second season in 2016 leading the Tulsa football program to a 10-3 record.
- He became the 29th head coach in school history on Dec. 11, 2014.
- Montgomery claimed his first career head coaching victory in the 2015 Tulsa season opener with a 47-44 overtime win over FAU.
- In his first year, Montgomery led Tulsa to six wins and to the 2015 Camping World Independence Bowl.
- Before coming to Tulsa, he spent seven years at Baylor, where he spent the final three seasons as the offensive coordinator/QB coach.

## PLAYER NOTES . . .

- WR Keylon Stokes has had all 3 of Tulsa's 50+ yard receptions this season.
- Keylon Stokes had his first career multiple TD game with 2 receiving TDs at SMU ... he has caught at least one TD pass in 3 different games.
- LBs Zaven Collins and Cooper Edmiston each had double-digit tackles against Navy ... Collins had 13 and Edmiston 12.
- Edmiston now has 16 career 10+ tackle game and Collins has 6 in his 2 seasons.
- DE Trevis Gipson has 8.5 TFLs among his 22 total tackles this year ... he had 2 TFLs at Michigan State, 2.5 TFLs at San Jose State, 2 TFLs vs. Wyoming and 2 TFLs at SMU
- WR JuanCarlos Santana had career-highs of 9 receptions for 98 yards vs. Navy.
- RB Shamari Brooks had 95 yards at SMU to surpass the 2,000-yard plateau for career rushing yards ... he now has 2,118 career rushing yards to rank 14th on the school's all-time rushing chart.
- Brooks had back-to-back 100+ yard rushing games with 140 yards at San Jose State and 107 against Oklahoma State.
- SAF Brandon Johnson had his first career double-digit tackle game with 12 stops at SMU ... his previous high was 9 stops in the season opener.
- QB Zach Smith's 354 yards passing against Wyoming was the first 300+ passing game for a Tulsa quarterback since the 2016 Miami Beach Bowl when Dane Evans threw for 374 yards against Central Michigan.
- Smith has 2 games with 300+ passing yards this year and 5 for his career.
- Smith had thrown 128 straight passes without an INT until the SMU game ... he had gone 3 games – San Jose State, OSU and Wyoming – without throwing an INT.
- It took Tulsa until the 12th game last year to have a 100+ receiver, while it happened in just the second game this season ... now Tulsa has had 3 games this year with a 100-yard receiver.
- Tulsa had back-to-back games – SJS and OSU – with a 100-yard receiver for the first time since the 2016 season – Sam Crawford, Jr. and Keylon Stokes.
- In back-to-back games, CB Reggie Robinson had an interception vs. Oklahoma State and a blocked field goal and fumble recovery against Wyoming.

## TEAM NOTES . . .

- Tulsa has had 6 passes for 40 yards or more in the last 4 games – OSU, Wyoming, SMU, Navy – while last year Tulsa had just 5 passes for 40+ yards for the entire season.
- The Hurricane has scored 65 points in the 2nd quarter this year, while totaling 75 points in the remaining 3 quarters, including overtime.
- Tulsa's passing total has increased over the past 3 games – averaging 318 yards per game compared to 224 average passing yards in the first 3 contests.
- Tulsa has blocked a kick in 2 games this year – Reggie Robinson II blocked a field goal against Wyoming and Zaven Collins blocked a PAT at SMU.

### FIRST-TIME STARTERS . . .

- Through 6 games, Tulsa has had 11 different players receive their first career start.
- The first-time starters in the season opener were: NG Jaxon Player, OT X'Zauvea Gadlin, TE Denzel Carter, WR Sam Crawford, Jr. and QB Zach Smith ... plus kickers Zack Long on kickoffs and Jacob Rainey on placements
- In the second game, OG Dante Bivens, C Gerard Wheeler and TE James Palmer made their first starts.
- DE Cullen Wick started on defense in the 4th game of the season against Wyoming for his first career start.
- Tulsa had no first time starters in the 3rd (OSU), 5th (SMU) and 6th (Navy) games.

### WATCH LISTS . . .

- DOAK WALKER AWARD ... the junior running back duo of Shamari Brooks and Corey Taylor II were named to the list for nation's top RB.
- BRONKO NAGURSKI AWARD ... for the second straight year, senior linebacker Cooper Edmiston was named to the award given to the nation's top defender.
- RAY GUY AWARD ... The nation's 5th leading punter from 2018, Tulsa's Thomas Bennett, was named to the Ray Guy Award Watch List.
- PAUL HORNUNG AWARD ... Keylon Stokes was named to the Paul Hornung Award Watch List, given annually to the nation's most versatile player.
- EARL CAMPBELL TYLER ROSE AWARD ... receivers Keenen Johnson and Keylon Stokes, both from Texas, were named to the award that goes to the nation's top offensive player with ties to the state of Texas.

### COOP LEADS THE AMERICAN . . .

- Cooper Edmiston, a 4th year senior, has a team-leading 56 tackles this year, while also leading the American Athletic Conference in tackles.
- He now has 16 career double-figure tackle games ... he had a season-high 12 stops vs. Navy, 11 tackles at San Jose State and 10 stops at SMU.
- Edmiston was named the American Athletic Conference's Defensive Player of the week for his performance against Wyoming, when he totaled a team-high 9 tackles and forced a fumble late in the game to secure Tulsa's 3-point win.
- Edmiston has 3 double-digit tackle games this year, 7 in 2018 and 6 in 2017 ... he had a career-best 17 stops at UConn in 2017.
- Edmiston's 293 career tackles ranks him 12th on the FBS' active tackles list.
- He led Tulsa last year with 113 tackles, 3 interceptions and 3 fumble recoveries ... he also had 3 fumbles caused.
- Last year, Edmiston ranked among the nation's top-40 leaders in 5 different defensive categories — fumbles recovered (6th), interceptions (16th), interceptions per game (17th), forced fumbles (31st) and total tackles (36th).
- In The American, Edmiston ranked 2nd for tackles and interceptions, 3rd for fumble recoveries and 4th for forced fumbles.
- His 5 career fumble recoveries is just one shy of the school's all-time record.

### BROOKS GAINS OVER 2,000 CAREER YARDS . . .

- Shamari Brooks went over the 2,000 career rushing yards when he gained 95 yards against SMU ... he entered the game needing 32 yards for 2,000.
- He now has 2,118 career yards to rank 14th overall on Tulsa's all-time rushing list.
- Brooks became just the 16th Tulsa player to gain over 2,000 career rushing yards.
- Brooks had back-to-back 100+ rushing games in the second and third games this year, giving him 10 career 100+ rushing games.
- He had 140 yards on 29 carries at San Jose State in the second game of the year, and then had 107 yards and 2 TDs on 29 carries vs. Oklahoma State.
- After a zero-rushing output on 6 carries vs. Michigan State, the #1-ranked returning run defense in 2018, Brooks averaged 92.8 yards over the last 5 games.
- Brooks' 21 career rushing TDs ranks 10th on the school's all-time chart.

### COMEBACK WINS . . .

• Since Philip Montgomery took over as head coach in 2015, Tulsa has had 11 games in which the Hurricane has trailed and come back to win . . . in the 2015 season, 11 points against SMU was the biggest deficit that Tulsa came back to win . . . Tulsa also trailed by 10 points vs. FAU in the season opener, and twice against Tulane to come back to win . . . in 2016, Tulsa had its biggest come-from-behind win in school history and second-biggest in NCAA Division I history (now 3rd), trailing 31-0 at Fresno State in the second quarter and winning 48-41 in overtime . . . Tulsa has had 4 com-from-behind wins in the last 3 seasons, including a 4th quarter comeback win in the final 5 minutes v. Wyoming in 2018.

### REGGIE BLOCKS . . .

- Senior Reggie Robinson II blocked his first FG of the season and second of his career in a 3-point win over Wyoming.
- Robinson now has four combined blocked kicks for his career, including two blocked PATs vs. Navy (9/30/17 and 11/17/18), and a FG vs. Tulane (10/22/16).
- Prior to his block against Wyoming, the last time Tulsa blocked a FG was when LB Zaven Collins blocked a FG against SMU (11/24/18).

### TREVIS . . .

- Senior defensive end Trevis Gipson has been effective in creating lost yardage plays by opposing offenses.
- Of his 23 tackles this year, Gipson has 8.5 TFLs for -40 yards, including 4 sacks for -27 yards . . . 37-percent of his stops this year have gone for lost yardage.
- He has had at least 2 TFLs in 4 games this season.
- Gipson was a menace for the Michigan State offense in the season opener, putting pressure on the Spartans quarterback throughout the night.
- Among Gipson's 4 tackles in that game, he totaled 2 TFLs for -10 yards, one sack for -10 yards and was credited with 2 QB hurries.
- A week later, he had 4 tackles, 2.5 TFLs for -13 yards and one sack for -9 yards at San Jose State.
- Gipson had 2 TFLs for -8 yards, including one sack for -5 yards against Wyoming.
- Among his 4 stops at SMU, Gipson had 2 TFLs for -9 yards and one sack for -6 yards.
- In his career, Gipson has 19 TFLs for -82 yards and 9 sacks for -57 yards.

### 100-YARD RECEIVERS . . .

- In 2018, it took Tulsa until the season finale to have a 100-yard receiver, while this year it happened in the second game . . . now Tulsa has 3 100-yard receiving games this year.
- For the first time since 2016, Tulsa had consecutive games with a 100-yard plus receiver.
- Sam Crawford, Jr. had 9 catches for 137 yards and one touchdown at San Jose State and a week later Keylon Stokes had 7 receptions for 109 yards and one TD vs. Oklahoma State.
- Stokes added a 100-yard receiving game with 101 yards and 2 TDs at SMU.

### WRs GETTING THE BALL . . .

- After the first 2 games, 52-percent of the passes caught by Tulsa wide receivers came from 2 players – Sam Crawford, Jr. and Keylon Stokes.
- The duo totaled 22 receptions for 450 yards, while the remainder of the receiving corps caught 20 passes for 172 yards.
- However, in the last 3 contests, the trio of Keenen Johnson, Josh Johnson and JC Santana stepped up also as key targets.
- Crawford and Stokes receptions are down to 32-percent of all the receivers' receptions over the last 3 games.
- Stokes and Crawford have combined for 387 yards on 21 receptions, while Keenen Johnson, Josh Johnson and JC Santana have combined for 43 receptions for 512 yards in the last 3 games.
- Each of these five WRs have led Tulsa in receptions in at least one game, while 4 – Crawford, Stokes, Keenen Johnson and Santana – have led at least one game in receiving yards . . . Josh Johnson's 92 yards at SMU only trailed Stokes' 101 yards at SMU by 9 yards.

## SMITH THROWS FOR 300 IN BACK-TO-BACK GAMES . . .

- Junior Zach Smith got the call as the starting quarterback for the season opener at Michigan State.
- Smith and sophomore Seth Boomer, who started 8 games last year, competed for the starting QB spot during fall camp.
- In 6 games, Smith has thrown for 1,618 yards, 10 TDs and 269.7 yards per game.
- He had consecutive 300+ passing games with 354 yards and 2 TDs vs. Wyoming, and a game later threw for 346 yards and tied a career-high of 4 TD passes vs. SMU.
- He was named to the American Athletic Conference's weekly honor roll for his performance against Wyoming.
- He began the year completing 16-of-27 passes for 153 yards and one TD in the opener against Michigan State
- A week later, Smith completed 75-percent (21-28) of his passes for 283 yards at San Jose State.
- Smith completed 57-percent of his passes for 228 yards and one TD against Oklahoma State.
- Smith played in 18 games at Baylor in 2016 and 2017, while starting 10 of those contests ... he put up career numbers at Baylor of 2,997 yards, 21 TDs and a 55.6 completion percentage ...
- Smith now has 4,615 passing yards and 31 TDs in 25 career games between Tulsa and Baylor.
- Smith has 13 career passes for 50+ yards in his career, including 3 this year.
- Smith had a career-high 463 yards and 4 TDs on 33-of-50 passes against No. 3 Oklahoma in 2017.

## RUNNING DUO GOES OVER 3,000 FOR CAREER . . .

- The RB duo of Shamari Brooks and Corey Taylor II has combined for 3,307 yards and 38 touchdowns in their careers, going over the 3,000-yard mark when they combined for 125 yards against Wyoming.
- \* The pair has also combined for 15 100+ rushing games in their careers.
- Brooks has 10 career 100+ rushing games in 25 contests, while Taylor has 5 100+ rushing games in 22 career contests.
- The tandem of Brooks and Taylor has combined for 624 rushing yards this season.
- Last year, the duo combined for 1,813 of Tulsa's 2,406 rushing yards for 75-percent of Tulsa's run game, as well as scoring 18 of Tulsa's 23 rushing TDs.
- Brooks totaled 967 yards and 7 TDs in 11 games played, while Taylor gained 846 yards and 11 TDs, also in 11 games.
- Brooks had a career-high 164 yards and 2 TDs in his first career start against UConn in 2017, while Taylor had a career-high 152 yards at Houston in 2018.

## CRAWFORD STEPS UP . . .

- Sophomore Sam Crawford's first real playing time at receiver came in the opener at Michigan State ... most all of his playing time in 2018 came on special teams.

- On the year, Crawford has 26 receptions for Tulsa's second-most receiving yards with 370 yards and 2 TDs.

### STOKES SURPASSES 1,000 CAREER YARDS . . .

- Junior Keylon Stokes has 1,185 career receiving yards in 27 games.
- He surpassed 1,000 career yards with a 4-reception, 93-yard game vs. Wyoming.
- Stokes has 3 career 100-yard receiving game, all coming within the last 6 games, dating back to the 2018 season finale ... he had his second career 100+ receiving game with 109 yards on 7 receptions against Oklahoma State ... he also had 101 yards and 2 TDs on 5 receptions this year vs. SMU.
- He now has team-highs of 27 receptions for 467 yards and 4 TDs this year.

### LINEBACKER ZAVEN COLLINS BACK AFTER FRESHMAN ALL-AMERICA SEASON . . .

- Sophomore LB Zaven Collins was named to the *USA Today* and Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) Freshman All-America Teams last year as a red-shirt freshman.
- He became the 9th Tulsa player to earn Freshman All-America honors, all coming since the 2003 season.
- The 6'4", 256-pound linebacker moved into the starting WILL linebacker spot in the 3rd game last year vs. Arkansas State due to a Robert Revels III injury ... moving over from his back-up role at the MIKE position.
- In his 10 starts, Collins totaled 79 tackles, 9.5 TFLs for -31 yards, 3 QB hurries, 3 PBU, one fumble recovery, one forced fumble and one INT.
- Collins ended the year with 85 total tackles.
- He opened 2019 with an 8-tackle and 1 TFL performance at Michigan State.
- Collins had his first-double-digit tackle game this year with a team-high 13 stops vs. Navy, giving him six double-figure tackle games for his career.
- This year, Collins ranks second on the team in tackles with 48 stops, 2 PBUs, one QB hurry, one TFL and one blocked kick.

### A YOUNG O-LINE . . .

- A year ago, Tulsa came into the season with a total of 98 starts between three offensive line seniors — center, left guard, right tackle — and left following the 2018 campaign with 128 starts.
- This season, the Hurricane came into 2019 with 27 starts among 4 different players – Chris Ivy, Jr. (12) at LT, Chris Paul (8) at RG, Tiller Bucktrot (4) at RG and Dylan Couch (3) at LG.
- This year, Tulsa has started 7 different players in the first 6 games ... in the second game, Gerard Wheeler started at center and Dante Bivens moved into the starting RG position ... Ivy, Paul and RS-freshman X'Zauvea Gadlin have played the entirety of all 6 games ... Wheeler and Bivens has started the last 5 games.
- Tulsa's current starting offensive line – Ivy, Paul, Wheeler, Bivens and Gadlin – has 48 career starts between them.

### LAST MINUTE SAVE . . .

- Tulsa claimed a 24-21 4th quarter comeback win over Wyoming.
- Wyoming took a 21-17 lead with 5:25 left on the game clock, then Tulsa took possession and went 75 yards in 7 plays in 1:59 for a 24-21 lead at the 3:26 mark.
- Wyoming drove to the Tulsa 10-yard line before Cooper Edmiston forced a fumble that was recovered by Reggie Robinson II at the 3-yard line for the win.
- It was Robinson's first fumble recovery of the season and second of his career.

### TOUGH-GOING AGAINST #1-RANKED RUN DEFENSE . . .

- Michigan State came into the season as the NCAA's returning leader against the run, allowing only 72 rushing yards per game.
- The Spartans returned their starting defensive front with 94 career starts, going against a young Tulsa offensive line with just 27 starts between them.
- MSU stifled Tulsa's run game to a new opponent record low of -73 yards on the ground on just 25 rushing attempts.

### DEFENSE IN THE OPENER . . .

- Tulsa held Michigan State to 8 possessions of gaining less than 10 yards.
- Tulsa had 6 TFLs against Michigan State, including one sack.
- Tulsa's defense had two huge 4th down stops in the first half vs. Michigan State – the 1st holding MSU on 4th & 1 at the Tulsa 27-yard line (Brandon Johnson & Kendarin Ray) and the 2nd time holding MSU on 4th & 1 at the TU-9 (Manny Bunch – and ended the game with a total of 3 4th down stops.
- Tulsa's defense gave up just 19 points (1 TD, 4 FGs) at Michigan State... the remaining 9 points were scored off of a safety and fumble recovery.
- The Hurricane held MSU to 108 rushing yards and a 2.7 average per carry.
- Three MSU drives started within the Tulsa 40-yard line (24, 36 and 30-yard lines) ... Tulsa held the Spartans to field goals on each of those possessions.
- In the final 32 minutes of the game, the Tulsa defense gave up only a field goal against the Spartans.

### RETURNING PRODUCTION . . .

- Tulsa returned 24 lettermen on defense, including 8 starters and 9 more players who have started at least one career game coming into the season.
- Tulsa's defense returned 79% of its tackles, 87% of its TFLs, 86% of its sacks, 78% of its interceptions, 73% of its pass break-ups, 92% of its forced fumbles and 82% of its fumble recoveries.
- The Hurricane had 17 lettermen returning to the offensive side of the ball, including 6 starters and 3 additional players who started games last year.
- On offense, Tulsa returned 85% of its rushing yards, 66% passing yards, 66% receiving yards, 76% of total offense, 71% of all-purpose yards, 57% scoring and 75% of its touchdowns.

### DEFENSIVE COMPARISONS . . .

- In 2018, Tulsa's defense showed immense improvement from a season earlier.
- Tulsa held opponents to 121.2 yards less in total offense, 89.3 yards less in passing, 31.9-yards less in rushing and 10.4 less points.
- The Hurricane finished the 2018 season ranked 8th in NCAA for fewest passing yards allowed, 10th for 4th down conversions, 22nd for fumbles recovered, 41st for pass efficiency defense and 44th for red zone defense
- Tulsa did not allow an opponent to gain over 500 yards of total offense in 2018, as compared to 7 games in 2017.
- After 6 games this year, Tulsa has held the opposition to 396.2 yards of total offense.

## WHY GOLDEN HURRICANE?

Enter the name Howard Acher as the Tulsa head coach in 1922. When he took over the position, Acher saw great potential in his team and wanted to publicize it by creating a new identity with a new nickname. Sports writers and others had called the school by any number of names from the Presbyterians to the Orange and Black, to the Kendallites.

After an opening day win against a strong Texas Christian University team in 1922, Acher put his mind to work. The press had claimed that the Kendall football team blew through its opponents like a tornado. So, it figured that Tornadoes, would be the nickname with "golden" added to identify the color of the uniforms. However, it was later found that Georgia Tech had claimed that name, so from tornado it was evolved meteorologically to a hurricane. Thus the squad voted, and the name "Golden Hurricane" became the new team moniker with the gold added because of the jersey color.

TU lived up to its nickname as the Golden Hurricane blew through the Texas A&M defense in the next game with pass after pass from quarterback Rex Thomas. TU won its first game as the Golden Hurricane by a score of 13-10.

## WHAT YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT TULSA'S FOOTBALL TRADITION . . .

- Tulsa was the first school to play in five straight New Years Day Bowl Games — Sun Bowl (1-1-42), Sugar Bowl (1-1-43), Sugar Bowl (1-1-44), Orange Bowl (1-1-45) and Oil Bowl (1-1-46).
- Ellis Jones, an All-American guard in 1945, was a one-armed player. He was the defensive standout for the College All-Star team vs. the Chicago Bears in 1945.
- Three former TU football players are enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio. They are Bob St. Clair, Jim Finks and Steve Largent.
- Two former Tulsa players finished runner-up in the Heisman Trophy voting — quarterback Jerry Rhome in 1964 and receiver Howard Twilley in 1965.
- Perhaps the greatest Tulsa football player of all-time is Glenn Dobbs (1940-42). He was also head coach of the Hurricane teams in the 1960's. Eighth Street which runs north of H.A. Chapman Stadium was dedicated as Glenn Dobbs Drive on Oct. 21, 2000. A statue of Dobbs was erected outside the stadium before the 2013 spring game.
- Former TU players — Glenn Dobbs, Howard Twilley and Jerry Rhome — are enshrined in the College Football Foundation Hall of Fame.
- Other former TU players went on to the NFL — Steve Largent, Drew Pearson, Rickey Watts, Don Blackmon, David Alexander, Jerry Ostroski, Gus Frerotte, Dennis Byrd, Tom Miner, Steve August and Gus Frerotte — to name a few.
- Coaching in the NFL — Tulsa has had four former players serve as head coaches in the NFL — Tommy Hudspeth (Detroit Lions); Sam Rutigliano (Cleveland Browns); Ray Rhodes (Philadelphia Eagles and Green Bay Packers); and Lovie Smith (Chicago Bears and Tampa Bay Buccaneers).
- Tulsa has three former players and two former coaches who have been inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame. The players are Glenn Dobbs, who also coached the Hurricane, Howard Twilley and Jerry Rhome ... the coaches are Francis Schmidt (1919-21) and John Cooper (1977-84).
