## Bearcats Seek Redemption vs. USF

- The University of Cincinnati will be out to rebound from last week's loss to BIG EAST Conference leader and No. 13 West Virginia when the Bearcats visit USF on Saturday for a 12 noon contest at Raymond James Stadium. The game will be televised regionally by ESPN Regional as the BIG EAST Game of the Week.
- The Bearcats, 4-5 overall and 2-3 in BIG EAST play, will be trying to keep their hopes for bowl eligibility alive in Saturday's contest while the Bulls, 5-3 overall and second in the BIG EAST at 3-1, will be out to become bowl eligible. That is a reversal of roles when the two teams met in Cincinnati last November. UC clinched its winning season with a 45-23 victory which sent USF to only its second losing season in the program's history.
- In USF, which blanked Syracuse, 27-0, last Saturday, the Bearcats will be facing a team similar to West Virginia, to which they lost, 38-0, on Nov. 9. Like the Mountaineers, the Bulls boast a potent rushing attack, ranked 10th in this week's NCAA stats. USF is averaging 234.8 yards on the ground. Andre Hall has been responsible for 123.8 of that average to rank fourth nationally in rushing. Also like West Virginia, the Bulls also rely on a strong defense. USF is ranked No. 18 in total defense allowing 305.8 yards per game. The Bulls are No. 37 vs. the rush (128.9), No. 13 in passing defense (176.9) and No. 14 in scoring defense (17.9).
- Cincinnati freshman Mike Mickens continues to rank among the leaders in passes defended. The first-year cornerback is tied for fourth nationally, averaging 1.56 passes defended per game.
- Sophomore Anthony Hoke is ranked No. 20 nationally in forced fumbles (.20) and Kevin McCullough is No. 58 in tackles for loss (1.19).
- The game matches one of the oldest Division I-A football programs against the nation's newest team. Cincinnati, which launched football in 1885, is preceded by only Rutgers (1869), Michigan (1879), Navy (1880) and Minnesota (1883) in terms of longevity. USF, which made its football debut in 1997 at the I-AA level and achieved I-A status in 2000, is the nation's newest I-A team.
- Bearcat senior Chet Ervin could become Cincinnati's all-time punter during Saturday's contest. Ervin needs six more punts to reach the UC career record of 236 and 194 yards to top the yardage mark of 9,244.

## UC vs. USF

The teams began playing in 2003 and have split the two games in which they have faced off thus far. USF won, 24-17, in double overtime in Tampa in 2003 with UC retaliating with a 45-23 victory in Cincinnati last season.

## About USF

- The Bulls boast the nation's 10th-ranked rushing offense, averaging 234.8 yards per game. Andre Hall, ranked fourth nationally in rushing (123.8 yards per game) and 13th in all-purpose yards (153.1), leads that attack.
- USF is No. 18 in the latest NCAA rankings for total defense, allowing 305.8 yards per game. The Bulls are No. 37 in rushing defense and No. 13 in pass defense.
- USF is No. 9 nationally in sacks, averaging 3.38 per game, and No. 25 in tackles for loss (7.13). Stephan Nicholas is No. 29 individually in sacks (.75).
- USF is the nation's newest Division I-A football program. USF football debuted in 1997 at the I-AA level, and achieved I-A status in 2000.
- USF has had just two losing seasons—its first and its most recent—in its grid history. The Bulls are 60-36, which includes a 40-20 record as a Division I-A team.
- The Bulls have relied upon football-rich Florida in building their team. Only eight players on this year's roster are from out-of-state.

## Last Meeting

Gino Guidugli passed for a career-best 377 yards to lead Cincinnati to a 45-23 victory in Cincinnati on Nov. 20, 2004. USF got off to a 10-7 lead but UC rallied to tie the game at 17-all in the second quarter. With 1:25 remaining in the first half, Bill Poland hauled in a 49-yard touchdown pass from Guidugli to put the Bearcats in front for good. UC rolled up 577 yards in total offense.

## Last Time in Tampa

DeJuan Green broke free for a 25-yard touchdown run in the second overtime and Lee Roy Selmon Jr. intercepted a Cincinnati pass to lift USF to a 24-17 victory in Tampa on Oct. 31, 2003. The Bearcats held the upper hand through most of the contest, scoring first on Mike Daniels' 2-yard pass from Gino Guidugli and taking a 10-7 lead with Chet Ervin's 38-yard field goal. USF tied the contest with a 30-yard field goal by Santiago Gramatica with 3:33 to play. The two teams traded touchdowns in the first overtime.

Gino Guidugli passed for a career-high 377 yards and three touchdowns in his final home game to lead Cincinnati to a 45-23 win over South Florida. The victory made the Bearcats, 6-4, bowl-eligible. USF, led by Andre Hall's 155-yard rushing day, got on the

board first with a 44-yard field goal, and following a 3-yard TD run by Richard Hall, took a 10-7 lead on Andre Hall's 4-yard run.

Butler Benton burst through a seam for a 48-yard TD run early in the second period to regain the lead for the Bearcats. Kevin Lovell added a 27-yard field goal. A fumble by Richard Hall—UC's first in four games—was recovered in the end zone for a game-tying touchdown by USF's Craig Kobel. The Bearcats regained the lead a minute later on Guidugli's 49-yard TD pass to Bill Poland to take a 24-17 lead at the half.

The Bearcats pulled away in the second half on a 22-yard scoring run by Bradley Glatthaar and

Guidugli TD tosses of 17 yards to Doug Jones and six yards to Brent Celek. Guidugli finished with 30 completions in 36 attempts to post the 15th 300-yard passing game of his career. Hannibal Thomas was on the receiving end of 10 of those passes, matching his career high, for 162 yards, his fourth 100-yard receiving game.

UC's 577 yards total offense matched the sixth highest single game effort in school history.

Steve Slaton rushed for four touchdowns and the West Virginia defense stymied Cincinnati for a 38-0 blanking of the Bearcats.

Slaton gained 129 yards on 25 carries as the Mountaineers ground out 297 rushing yards on UC. West Virginia's defense may have played the more dominant role in the outcome of the game. UC was held to just 269 yards of total offense, and a mere 62 yards on the ground.

Excluding the game-ending drive, when a Hail-Mary pass put Cincinnati on the WVU 5-yard line with time expired, the Mountaineers allowed UC to penetrate midfield only three times. The

Bearcats reached the Mountaineer 37 on their first possession, but suffered a tackle for loss and eventually punted.

Slaton scored on a 4-yard run to cap a 9-play, 81-

yard drive on West Virginia's first possession. The Mountaineers had scoring drives of 89 and 59 yards in the second quarter, both culminating in Slaton TD bursts. The redshirt freshman tallied from 33 yards out in the third quarter. Quarterback Pat White, who contributed 111 yards rushing, completed 7-of-12 passes for 100 yards and a 15-yard TD toss to Darius Reynaud.

While the Bearcats surrendered 406 yards in total offense, there were some individual performances of note. Sophomore safety Haruki Nakamura recorded 12 tackles for the third time this season and had a sack and a quarterback hurry. Freshman linebacker Corey Smith turned in eight tackles and a TFL. Chet Ervin punted eight times for a 40.5-yard average.

- **Kevin McCullough** was named Defensive Player of the Week following Cincinnati's win over Syracuse on Oct. 29. McCullough scooped up a fumble and returned it 17 yards for what proved to be the winning touchdown, and recorded five tackles, 1.5 sacks and two tackles for loss.

**Mickens Tops in Pass Defense**

First-year freshman cornerback **Mike Mickens** is ranked fourth nationally in passes defended. Mickens has 13 break-ups and one interception in nine games this season, giving him an average of 1.56 passes defended.

Mickens continues to add to his impressive resume as a first-year defensive back. The Greater Dayton area product (Huber Heights, Ohio/Wayne High) had three pass break-ups in the Oct. 22 loss to Louisville, the second straight game in which he had three PBUs. His interception in the closing minutes of UC's Oct. 15 win vs. Connecticut ended the Huskies final scoring threat and preserved the 28-17 victory. Mickens, who also had seven tackles vs. Louisville, is UC's fourth-leading tackler with 39 stops.

**Other Defensive Dandies**

- Junior linebacker **Kevin McCullough** is tied for No. 58th nationally in tackles for loss with 1.19.
- Sophomore linebacker **Anthony Hoke** is 20th nationally in forced fumbles, averaging .33.
- Freshman defensive tackle **Thomas Claggett**, and sophomore linebacker **Anthony Williams** are tied for No. 74 in forced fumbles with a per-game average of .22.

### Roberts Rolls

Senior defensive end **Adam Roberts** played a large role in Cincinnati's last two victories. Roberts keyed UC's defensive dominance in the Bearcats' 28-17 win over Connecticut on Oct. 15 by recording five tackles, all solo, and had a pair of sacks and a pass breakup. In the 22-16 win over Syracuse on Oct. 29, Roberts had three TFLs among four tackles. With Syracuse 3rd-and-goal on the UC 2, Roberts threw Orange running back Damian Rhodes for an 8-yard loss to force Syracuse into a field goal in the third quarter. Roberts is second at UC with 8.5 TFLs and leads the Bearcats with four sacks.

### Corey Seeks Freshman Honors

Playing on a defense stocked with freshman standouts, **Corey Smith** is making a bid for conference and national all-freshman honors. The 6-1, 215-pound outside linebacker is Cincinnati's leading tackler with 64 stops and is third on the squad with 7.0 tackles for loss. Smith recorded 13 total tackles, including nine solo stops, vs. Western Carolina—a season high by a Bearcat defender. He has recorded 29 tackles over his last four games.

### Glatthaar Scoring Streak Halted

**Bradley Glatthaar** had compiled a streak of six consecutive games in which he had scored at least one touchdown this season. The sophomore running back had scored seven TDs in UC's first six games. Going back to the 2004 season, Glatthaar had scored a touchdown in 10 of the Bearcats' last 12 games.

Glatthaar turned in the second century rushing performance of his career when he gained a personal-best 123 yards on 15 carries and scored two touchdowns in the Oct. 15 win over Connecticut. He scored on runs of 9 and 72 yards, the latter a career long.

Glatthaar became the first Bearcat to rush for over 100 yards this season when he recorded 107 yards in a career-high 18 rushing attempts in the Sept. 17 win over Western Carolina.

### Good Efforts from Goodman

Freshman **Dominick Goodman** is emerging as a multi-faceted threat. Though he has played in only seven of the Bearcats' nine games, Goodman has quickly climbed into second place for UC in all-purpose yards. He has amassed 504 yards, 22 as a rusher, 134 as a receiver and 348 via kickoff returns.

In last week's game vs. West Virginia, Goodman piled up 105 all-purpose yards, 59 on three pass receptions, 38 on three kickoff returns and eight on a pair of runs.

In the Oct. 29 win over Syracuse, Goodman had nine yards on two carries and picked up a pair of first downs, caught two passes for 11 yards and had a 19-yard kickoff return.

Goodman was one of the bright spots for the Cincinnati offense in the Sept. 28 loss at Miami (Ohio), piling up 141 all-purpose yards, gaining 64 yards on five pass receptions and returning four kickoffs for 77 yards. Goodman snagged

a 24-yard pass from Dustin Grutza in the second quarter, UC's longest pass play of the night. He then hooked up with Nick Davila four times for 50 yards on the Bearcats' final scoring drive, and scored when he made a leaping catch of a deflected pass on a four-yard TD.

### Tight Ends are Top Targets

The Bearcat tight ends have been the big play performers in the Cincinnati passing attack to date. Junior starter **Brent Celek** is third on the team in receptions with 25 and third in receiving yardage with 264. Celek caught a 47-yard touchdown pass from Dustin Grutza in the Oct. 8 game vs. Pittsburgh, the longest reception of Celek's career. Freshman backup **Connor Barwin** is fifth in receiving yardage with 135 on six catches.

### Celek Upping Numbers and Credentials

**Brent Celek** has already eclipsed the numbers he piled up last season as a receiver from the tight end position. Celek, who is third on the team in both receptions and receiving yards, has made 25 catches for 264 yards. A year ago, he amassed 22 receptions for 254 yards. The one statistical category in which he trails last year's pace is in touchdown receptions. In 2004, Celek set a UC record for TD catches by a tight end with eight. The junior has two this season.

Celek is compiling the third-best season by a Cincinnati tight end. Joe Koynock caught 44 passes for 496 yards in 1990, which stand as UC records for a tight end. Kris Bjorson had 40 receptions for 409 yards in 1991.

### Eastlake Builds on Streak

**Steve Eastlake**, one of the few veterans on the Bearcat offense, will try to extend a personal streak in Saturday's contest vs. USF. The 6-6, 305-pound senior will be making his 34th consecutive start at left tackle, a position at which he has been a fixture since 2003. For a point of comparison, all other offensive linemen have a combined total of 37 games of starting experience.

### Freshmen Lead Bearcat Defense

Cincinnati has the youngest defensive unit in the nation. The Bearcats have started six first-year freshmen, and as many as five at a time. Those starting true frosh are tackles **Terrill Byrd** and **Thomas Claggett**, end **Trevor Anderson**, outside linebacker **Corey Smith**, cornerback **Mike Mickens** and safety **Cedric Tolbert**. Northern Illinois, which has started up to four true frosh, is the only Division I-A team which comes close.

Byrd, Smith and Mickens have been starters all season. Anderson has made six starts and Claggett has had three starts. Tolbert started the Western Carolina game.

Those freshmen are holding their own. Smith leads the team in tackles (64) and is third in tackles for loss (7.0). Mickens is fourth in tackles (47) and leads the team in passes broken up (13). Claggett is second at UC in forced fumbles (2) and with 17 tackles is climbing that list.

## Bearcats in the NFL

The University of Cincinnati is again well-represented in the National Football League this season. Thirteen former Bearcats earned spots on NFL rosters with the close of preseason practice, six of them from the 2004 UC squad which posted a 7-5 record and won the Fort Worth Bowl.

Former Bearcat defensive ends Trent Cole and Andre Frazier earned roster spots at Philadelphia and Pittsburgh, respectively. Mike Wright, another member of the 2004 defensive front, is with the two-time defending Super Bowl champion New England Patriots. Tyjuan Hagler, also a member of that UC defense, is with Indianapolis. Cornerback Daven Holly is with Chicago. Offensive lineman Kyle Takavitz is with Cincinnati.

The veteran of the UC football alumni in the NFL is Jason Fabini, who is beginning his eighth year as a starting offensive lineman with the New York Jets. Troy Evans and Antwan Peek are in the fourth and third seasons, respectively, with the Houston Texans.

There are 17 assistant coaches in the NFL with UC ties, either as former players or members of Bearcat coaching staffs. Three former players are in this group; Billy Davis, defensive coordinator at San Francisco; Tom Rossley, assistant coach at Green Bay; and George Warhop, an assistant at San Francisco.

### Nakamura Gets Them By The Dozen

Sophomore Haruki Nakamura turned in his third 12-tackle performance of the season in the Nov. 9 West Virginia game. Nakamura, who had five solo stops, posted a sack and was credited with a quarterback hurry. The Bearcat free safety set a career high with 12 tackles in the Sept. 10 game at Penn State, and matched that total on Sept. 28 vs. Miami (Ohio). Nakamura is second on the team in tackling with 63 total stops.

### Dominic Ross Makes Key Plays

Junior **Dominic Ross** put together the two best performances of his college career during Cincinnati's games vs. Western Carolina and Miami. Ross, who did not start the Western Carolina game, replaced the injured Cedric Tolbert in the fourth quarter and made two interceptions, one on the 2-yard line to stop WCU's go-ahead scoring drive with 5:46 to play. His second pick, in the final minute, clinched the 7-3 victory. In UC's Sept. 28 contest at Miami (Ohio), Ross

made a career-high 13 tackles, six of them solos, and had a tackle for loss.

### Derick Ross Reaches Millennium Mark

Cincinnati senior wide receiver **Derick Ross** has topped the 1,000-yard mark in career receiving yardage. The senior enters his final two games with 1,027 yards on 72 career catches. He is the Bearcats' leading receiver this season with 27 receptions for 290 yards.

### Sack Attack

Pressuring the quarterback has been a key to Cincinnati's defensive success. The Bearcats have recorded 11 sacks in their past two victories over Connecticut and Syracuse. UC has made 15 sacks in its four victories.

UC notched six sacks in the Oct. 15 win over Connecticut, the most since UC had six vs. East Carolina last season (Sept. 25, 2004). Senior **Adam Roberts** and freshman **Trevor Anderson** each recorded two sacks, with **Thomas Claggett** and **Anthony Hoke** contributing one each. The Bearcats had five sacks, with linebacker **Kevin McCullough** leading the way with 1.5, in the Oct. 29 win over Syracuse.

### Many Happy Returns

The Bearcats enjoyed one of their most productive games in terms of kickoff returns vs. Miami (Ohio) on Sept. 28.

- **Marshwan Gilyard** nearly broke off a return for a touchdown. The first-year freshman was dragged down after a 60-yard return, the longest since Tedric Harwell took a kick back 71 yards vs. West Virginia in 2002. Gilyard is averaging a team-high 27.8 yards on five returns.
- **Dominick Goodman** returned four kickoffs for a total of 77 yards, which featured a 27-yard return. Goodman is averaging 19.1 yards on 11 returns this season.
- In the punt return department, **Mike Daniels** tied a UC single game record when he returned seven punts in the

Sept. 17 game vs. Western Carolina. He compiled 47 yards on those seven returns.

• **Haruki Nakamura**, who took over the punt return duties when Daniels was sidelined by injury, is averaging 9.3 yards on nine returns.

### Young Bearcats See First Action

Over the first nine games, a total of 30 Bearcats have seen their first college game action. Ten are first-year freshmen and 12 others are redshirt freshmen. Nine of those frosh have been starters: true freshmen Trevor Anderson (Detroit, MI/Crockett Tech) at defensive end, Terrill Byrd (Cincinnati, OH/Colerain) and Thomas Claggett (Temple Hills, MD/Frederick Douglas), at defensive tackle, Corey Smith (Salem, NJ/Salem) at outside linebacker, Mike Mickens (Huber Heights, OH/Wayne) at cornerback, Cedric Tolbert (Xenia, OH/Xenia) at safety, and redshirt freshmen Dustin Grutza (Maysville, KY/Mason County) at quarterback, Trevor Canfield (Cincinnati, OH/Western Hills) at offensive guard, and Ryan Manalac (Pickerington, OH/Pickerington) at middle linebacker.

UC had starters returning at eight positions—tackle Steve Eastlake, tight end Brent Celek and fullback Doug Jones on offense; end Adam Roberts, cornerback Antoine Horton and Dominic Ross and JaJuan Hall, who shared the strong safety position on defense; along with punter Chet Ervin and kicker Kevin Lovell. Only two schools have fewer returning starters, Navy with six and Marshall with seven.

UC projected five senior starters on offense and defense, entering the 2005 season, second fewest to Rice which has three projected senior starters.

### Looking Ahead

Cincinnati closes out the 2005 regular season with a visit to Rutgers on Nov. 26. Kickoff from Rutgers Stadium is 1:00 p.m. The game will be televised regionally by Fox Sports New York.

### Dantonio Second-Winningest Rookie Head Coach

Cincinnati's Mark Dantonio had the second-best record of any of the new 13 Division I-A head coaches in 2004, and the best among first-time head coaches. Dantonio directed UC to a 7-5 record, including a win over Marshall in the Fort Worth Bowl. Only Mike Price, who led UTEP to an 8-4 season, had a better record.

One other coach has taken Cincinnati to a bowl game in his initial season at the helm—the legendary Sid Gillman. That puts Mark Dantonio, who leads the Bearcats into the BIG EAST Conference this season, in pretty select

company.

Dantonio has been in good company throughout his coaching career, having served as an assistant coach for Nick Saban, Jim Tressel and Earle Bruce—coaches who have directed teams to conference championships, postseason bowls, and national championships.

Thirteen Bearcats earned all-conference honors. Six members of that team participated in the NFL Pre-Draft Combine, and three were ultimately drafted. Dantonio, who was named head coach at Cincinnati on Dec. 23, 2003, became the first head coach in 23 years to pilot a team to a winning season in his initial campaign at UC. The Bearcats' 7-5 record included a 5-3 mark in Conference USA, good enough for a second place finish, and a win over Marshall in the PlainsCapital Fort Worth Bowl.

The manner in which the Bearcats achieved that success speaks well for the Dantonio's coaching abilities. The Bearcats had fallen to a 2-4 start, but the new coach maintained confidence in his team and helped UC turn things around with an impressive four-game winning streak late in the season.

Dantonio is ideally suited hold the reigns of the University of Cincinnati football program. He has compiled nearly a quarter of a century of coaching experience, during which he has played integral roles in building winning programs. He has crafted defensive units which have been nationally recognized. And he has built a reputation for the close bonds that he builds with the players he coaches and the staff mem-

bers with whom he works.

He has strong Midwest ties. An Ohio native who has spent half of his coaching career in the state, he has been effective recruiting its top talent.

Dantonio had served as the defensive coordinator at Ohio State the previous three seasons, where he helped craft the defense which was the backbone of the Buckeyes success.

Dantonio has compiled 23 seasons of coaching experience in the college ranks, 12 of them in the state of Ohio, where he earned all-state football honors as a senior at Zanesville High.

Prior to his stint at Ohio State, Dantonio spent six seasons (1995-2000) as secondary coach at Michigan State, serving as associate head coach in 2000.

Dantonio served as defensive backs coach at Kansas for four seasons (1991-94). His work helped the Jayhawks produce an 8-4 record and defeat BYU in the Aloha Bowl in 1992. A 1979 graduate of South Carolina, Dantonio began his coaching career as an assistant at Westside High in Anderson, S.C. In 1980, he served as graduate assistant at Ohio University. He spent the 1981 season as a graduate assistant at Purdue and was defensive coordinator at Butler County (Kan.) Community College in 1982.

Dantonio was a member of Earle Bruce's Ohio State football staff in 1983 and 1984, helping the Buckeyes to the Fiesta and Rose bowls. He spent the 1985 season as the secondary coach at Akron where he coached under Jim Dennison, helping the Zips to an 8-3 record and an appearance in the Division I-AA playoffs.

Dantonio joined Jim Tressel's staff at Youngstown State. The Penguins made three trips to the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs during his five seasons there, and posted a perfect 11-0 regular season record in 1990, when Dantonio was YSU's defensive coordinator.

When Tressel became head coach at Ohio State, Dantonio joined him as the Buckeyes' defensive coordinator.

Dustin Grutza passed for two touchdowns and ran for a third, and the Cincinnati defense came up with a game-deciding stop in the final seconds as the Bearcats opened the 2005 season with a 28-26 win over Eastern Michigan.

Grutza, a redshirt freshman making his college debut, directed touchdown drives on UC's first two possessions, connecting with Antwan Giddens for 10 yards and Greg Moore for 38 yards. He finished with 176 yards, completing 17 of 26 pass attempts.

UC's defense had troubles with EMU's explosive offense and the Bearcats fell behind, 20-14, at the half. Grutza showed his running ability, putting Cincinnati back in the lead with a 21-yard scamper on the first possession of the third quarter. The Bearcat defense stiffened, holding the Eagles to 29 yards in the third quarter. Bradley Glatthaar extended the lead with an 11-yard run early in the fourth quarter,

but Eastern responded with a TD and cut the margin to two points.

Facing a fourth-and-1 from their 48 with 55 seconds to play, the Bearcats elected to go for the first down which would have allowed them to run out the clock. Butler Benton was stopped short. With 21 seconds to play, the UC defense was faced with the challenge of holding EMU on a fourth-and-1 situation. The Bearcats held to clinch the victory.

UC rolled up 469 yards in total offense, 293 on the ground. Glatthaar, with 75 yards on 14 carries, topped four runners who gained 50 or more yards.

Penn State's veteran defense limited the Bearcats to 31 net yards rushing as the Nittany Lions downed Cincinnati, 42-24. UC suffered four turnovers and PSU turned the miscues into three touchdowns. The first of those TDs came 3:29 into the contest when an interception by Dustin

Grutza set up a 25-yard scoring drive, capped by Michael Robinson's 1-yard run. UC's offense got untracked early in the second quarter to produce a 24-yard field goal by Kevin Lovell, but the Nittany Lions closed the half with an 80-yard drive capped by Robinson's 3-yard pass to Patrick Hall.

Robinson struck for a pair of long passes in the third quarter, a 59-yard TD strike to Justin King and a 41-yard toss to Derrick Williams which set up a 1-yard run by Austin Scott. Grutza closed the third period with a 27-yard TD pass to Derick Ross. Penn State struck for two more touchdowns in the fourth quarter. Grutza retaliated with a 64-yard scoring drive capped by Bradley Glatthaar's 2-yard run with 39 seconds to play. After recovering an on-side kick,

junior college transfer Nick Davila hit Earnest Jackson with a 5-yard TD pass with 18 seconds to play.

Frequently avoiding the Penn State rush with his scrambling ability, Grutza passed for 286 yards, completing 27 of 47 passes. Brent Celek had seven catches for 73 yards, both career highs. Haruki Nakamura had a career-best 12 tackles in addition to an interception and a fumble recovery.

Special teams miscues proved to be Cincinnati's undoing in a 38-20 loss to Pittsburgh. Those miscues started on the opening kickoff of UC's first-ever BIG EAST Conference game when the Bearcats surrendered a 69-yard kickoff return to Terrell Allen. UC's defense responded to the challenge and held Pitt to a field goal.

In the second quarter, a blocked punt set up a Pitt six-yard TD drive, quarterback Tyler Palko taking it the final five yards. A penalty on the ensuing kickoff put UC on its 15 where an interception led to another field goal and a 16-0 halftime deficit.

The Bearcats showed life in the third quarter with a 5-play, 73-yard scoring drive, keyed by Dustin Grutza's 56-yard hook-up with Earnest Jackson. The Panthers retaliated with a touchdown almost as quickly, Rashad Jennings' 13-yard run capping a six-play, 52-yard drive, and later in the quarter took a 30-7 lead with a 79-yard punt return by Darrell Revis.

Grutza rallied UC with TD passes of 47 yards to Brent Celek and 22 yards to Jackson. The freshman finished with 180 yards on 9-of-19 passing. Bradley Glatthaar, who scored UC's first TD on a five-yard run, had 63 yards in 16 carries.

The game was fairly even statistically. Pitt outgained UC, 321-312, in total offense. The Bearcats actually had two more first downs than the Panthers and owned an edge in time of possession.
