CINCINNATI FACES MARSHALL FRIDAY IN GLOBAL SPORTS CHALLENGE FINALE

The University of Cincinnati (3-1) welcomes Marshall (4-0) to Fifth Third Arena on Friday for the finale of the Global Sports Challenge. The game starts at 7 p.m. and will be televised by ESPN3.

The Bearcats are coming off a 71-43 home win against Northwestern State on Monday. UC senior forward Yancy Gates registered his 15th career double-double with 18 points and 11 rebounds to lead four UC players in double figures. Marshall earned a 69-64 victory over UNC-Wilmington on Tuesday. Senior guard Damier Pitts led all scorers with 21 points on 7-of-12 shooting from the field to go with five assists.

UC owns a 19-11 advantage in the all-time series with Marshall, including a 15-2 mark in Cincinnati.

The Marshall game concludes UC's play in the four-game Global Sports Challenge, an NCAA-exempt event. The Bearcats have posted wins against three other event participants, including Alabama State (65-40 on Nov. 13), Jacksonville State (73-59 on Nov. 15) and Northwestern State (71-43 on Nov. 21).

STREAKS, STORYLINES, SIDEBARS

- ▶ Yancy Gates leads the Bearcats in scoring (14.5 ppg) and rebounding (9.8 rpg) through four games with two double-doubles this season. He was tabbed to the All-BIG EAST Second Team in the preseason.
- ▶ The Bearcats have held their last nine regular-season nonconference opponents under 60 points since a 92-72 home win over Utah Valley State (12/11/10).
- ▶ UC is allowing 49.5 points through four games. The Bearcats led the BIG EAST at 59.6 points allowed last season.
- ▶ The Bearcats have registered 32 blocks through three games this season (8.0 per game). Justin Jackson leads all

UC players with 11 rejections.

- ▶ The Bearcats were picked to finish fifth in the BIG EAST according to the league's coaches.
- ▶ UC is the only team in the nation to increase its win total in each of the last five seasons (11 in 2006-07, 13 in 2007-08, 18 in 2008-09, 19 in 2009-10 and 26 in 2010-11).
- ▶ UC is coming off a 26-9 record in 2010-11, its most wins in a season since 2001-02 (31).
- ▶ Current UC athletic trainer Jeff Carrico was inducted into the Marshall University Sports Medicine Hall of Fame in 2009 for 10 years of service. He has been at UC since 2007.

SCOUTING MARSHALL

- ▶ Marshall is 4-0 to begin a season for the first time since a 10-0 start to the 1999-2000 campaign. The Thundering Herd own wins over Alabama State (67-49), Jacksonville State (58-44), Northwestern State (83-61) and UNC-Wilmington (69-64).
- ▶ Marshall has standout guard play with sophomore De-Andre Kane (16.5 points per game, 23-of-43 shooting from the field [53.5 percent]) and senior Damier Pitts (13.0 points, team-high 4.3 assists per game)
- ▶ Junior forward Dennis Tinnon leads the Herd in rebounding at 7.5 per contest.
- ▶ Pitts scored in double figures in 21 of the 25 games he appeared in last season and averaged 4.7 assists.
- ▶ Kane was named Conference USA Freshman of the Year last season, averaging 15.1 points and 5.6 rebounds.
- ▶ Marshall earned a 22-12 overall record and 9-7 league mark last season. The Herd lost to Ohio in the first round of the CollegenSiders.com Tournament to end the year.

THE MARSHALL SERIES

- ▶ Cincinnati leads the Marshall series 19-11, including a win in the last meeting, a 79-75 decision at Fifth Third Arena on Nov. 21, 2000.
- ▶ The Bearcats lead the series 15-2 in Cincinnati while the Thundering Herd own a 9-4 advantage in games played in Huntington, W. Va.
- ▶ Cincinnati owns a 172-93 (.635) record against current members of Conference USA: Central Florida (1-0), East Carolina (7-0), Houston (22-1), Marshall (19-11), Memphis (36-31), Rice (1-1), Southern Miss (17-13), SMU (2-1), Tulane (21-13), Tulsa (20-11), UAB (15-10) and UTEP (1-1).

UC ATHLETIC TRAINER HAS TIES WITH MARSHALL

- ▶ Current UC men's basketball athletic trainer Jeff Carrico spent 10 years with the Thundering Herd medical staff (1997-2007), including the final eight where he served as head athletic trainer at Marshall.
- ▶ Carrico was inducted into the Marshall University Sports Medicine Hall of Fame in February 2009.
- ▶ Carrico has served at UC since August 2007 and is a member of the College Athletic Trainers Society and the Greater Cincinnati Athletic Trainers Association.

LOOKING BACK AT UC'S TIME IN CONFERENCE USA

- ▶ Cincinnati was a member of Conference USA for 10 years from the start of the 1995-1996 season through the 2004-05 campaign.
- ▶ The Bearcats won the regular season championship eight times during their stay, including in each of their first seven seasons.
- ▶ UC won four C-USA tournaments.
- ▶ The Bearcats were undefeated (16-0) in the league during the 1999-2000 season with Kenyon Martin as a senior.
- ▶ Three Bearcats led the league in scoring average: Danny Fortson (21.4 ppg in 1997), Kenyon Martin (18.9 ppg in 1999-2000) and Steve Logan (22.0 ppg in 2001-02).
- ▶ Fortson was named C-USA Player of the Year in 1996 and 1997. Kenyon Martin won the award in 2000. Steve Logan won the award in 2001 and 2002.
- ▶ UC head coach Bob Huggins earned C-USA Coach of the Year honors three consecutive seasons from 1998 through 2000.

BEARCATS ON DEFENSE

- ▶ Cincinnati led the BIG EAST Conference, allowing 59.6 points per game in 2010-11. The Bearcats are allowing 49.5 points through four games this season.
- ▶ The Bearcats have held their last nine nonconference regular-season opponents under 60 points since a 92-72 home win over Utah Valley State (12/11/10).
- ▶ The Bearcats have recorded 32 blocks this season (8.0 per game). Justin Jackson leads all UC players with 11 rejections this season. UC posted nine blocked shots against Jacksonville State after recording 10 blocks against Alabama State in the season opener.
- ▶ UC has held two of its four opponents under 30 percent shooting for the game. Alabama State shot 18-of-62 (29.0 percent) from the field in the season opener. Northwestern State made 15-of-54 (27.8 percent) attempts from the field on Monday.
- ▶ UC has limited its opponents to 23.8 percent shooting (15-of-63) from beyond the three-point arc this season. UC's first two opponents, Alabama State and Jacksonville State, were a combined 6-of-35 from three-point range.
- ▶ UC allowed only 14 first-half points to Alabama State on Nov. 13, the fewest points scored in a first half by a Bearcat opponent during the Mick Cronin era.
- ▶ The 40 points allowed to Alabama State were the third fewest surrendered by a Cronin-coached squad at UC behind only 34 to Dayton (11/27/10) and 39 to Howard (11/10/07).

RETURN TO SENDER

- ▶ The 2011-12 Cincinnati defense has accounted for 32 blocks through three games this season (8.0 per game).

- ▶ At the current pace, the Bearcats would set the school's single-season record for blocks previously held by the 2004-05 team (226). This season's team is on schedule for 248 rejections by the end of the regular season.
- ▶ Here's a look at the number of blocks compiled by UC teams during the Cronin era:

UC TIP-INS

- ▶ Yancy Gates has recorded two double-doubles in four games this season, posting 15 points and 11 rebounds against Alabama State and 18 points and 11 rebounds against Northwestern State. Gates ranks second among active BIG EAST players with 15 career doubles-double behind Seton Hall's Herb Pope (23 through Nov. 21). Gates had seven double-doubles last season.
- ▶ Yancy Gates has scored in double figures in 12 of his last 13 games dating back to a 21-point effort at Providence (2/19) last season. He managed eight points against Jacksonville State on Nov. 15.
- ▶ Cincinnati produced a season-high 16 points off the bench against Northwestern State on Monday. Ten of those points came from freshman guard Ge'Lawn Guyn, who was 3-of-4 from the field with a pair of three-pointers and two free throws.
- ▶ The Bearcats have outrebounded every opponent this season, owning a 165-117 (+12.0) margin. UC recorded its largest rebounding margin this season on Monday against Northwestern State, outrebounding the Demons 44-26 (+18).
- ▶ Yancy Gates leads the Bearcats with 9.8 rebounds per game. Justin Jackson is second, averaging 8.0 rebounds.
- ▶ UC saw its 20-game regular-season home win streak against nonconference opponents snapped in its 56-54 loss to Presbyterian. The previous such loss came in a 76-66 setback to Xavier (12/13/08).
- ▶ Sean Kilpatrick led all UC players with 19 points against Presbyterian. It marked the 10th time in the sophomore's career his has led the squad in scoring and the first time this season.
- ▶ After missing four of his first five three-point attempts this season, Kilpatrick made 4-of-6 three-point tries against Presbyterian. It was his seventh career game with three or more three-pointers. He led UC in three-point shooting last season at 37.7 percent (46-of-122 shooting).
- ▶ Cashmere Wright scored 23 points and Dion Dixon added 20 against Jacksonville State. The duo became the first UC teammates to score 20 or more points in the same game since Yancy Gates (25) and Dixon (21) against USF on March 9, 2011.
- ▶ Dixon scored 20 points against the Gamecocks, his fourth career 20-point game (20 vs. Dayton [11/27/10], 23 at Miami-Ohio [12/21/10], 21 vs. USF [3/9/11]). He made 4-of-6 three-point attempts.
- ▶ Dixon played a career-high 40 minutes against JSU, the first Bearcat to play the entire 40 minutes since Deonta Vaughn on March 3, 2010 against Villanova.
- ▶ Wright tallied 23 points, six rebounds, and four assists

SEASON NOTES

BEARCATS IN 111TH VARSITY SEASON

- The 2011-12 campaign marks the 111th season of varsity basketball at the University of Cincinnati. The Bearcats own a 1,610-946 all-time record (.630). UC entered the season ranked 21st in the nation for most wins by a college basketball program.

50TH ANNIVERSARY OF 1961-62 NATIONAL TITLE

- The 2011-12 campaign marks the 50th anniversary of UC's 1961-62 national championship team. It marked the Bearcats second of back-to-back national titles after claiming the 1960-61 crown.
- Paul Hogue scored a game-high 22 points and grabbed a game-high 19 rebounds while Tom Thacker poured in 21 points, Tony Yates added 12 points and Ron Bonham contributed 10 points in UC's 71-59 win over Ohio State in the 1962 national title game.
- The Bearcats finished with a 29-2 overall record, but had to defeat Bradley 61-46 in the Missouri Valley Conference playoff to reach the NCAA Tournament. UC went on to defeat Creighton (66-46), Colorado (73-46) and UCLA (72-70) before topping Ohio State.
- The Bearcats had defeated Ohio State, 70-65, in the 1961 national title game.

- Cincinnati entered last week ranked No. 20 in both the Associated Press and the USA/Today ESPN Coaches polls released Nov. 14. It was the highest the Bearcats had been ranked in both polls since being ranked No. 19 in the each poll during week 4 of the 2009-10 season.
- Cincinnati entered the 2011-12 season ranked in both preseason polls, earning a No. 21 listing by the Associated Press poll and a No. 22 ranking by the USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll.
- It marked the Bearcats' first preseason ranking in the AP Poll since garnering a No. 18 ranking prior to the start of the 2003-04 campaign.
- The preseason ranking was the highest UC had been listed the coaches' poll since the 2003-04 season when it was listed No. 19.

NORTHWESTERN STATE RECAP: UC 71, NSU 43

- Four Cincinnati players scored in double figures led by Yancy Gates, who registered his 15th career double-double with 18 points and 11 rebounds, as the Bearcats cruised past Northwestern State 71-43 at Fifth Third Arena.
- Sean Kilpatrick scored 13 points and hit two three-pointers, Dion Dixon added 12 points and Ge'Lawn Guyn netted 10 points for his first career double-digit scoring game.
- The Bearcats limited the Demons to 6-of-25 shooting in the first half to build a 31-16 lead at intermission. Dixon scored 11 of his 12 points in the first half while Justin Jackson grabbed seven rebounds before halftime.
- A 13-0 run with seven minutes remaining in the game gave UC a 60-33 lead and sealed the victory.
- UC shot 54.3 percent in the second half. The Bearcats out-rebounded the Demons 44-26 for the game.

- ▶ UC went to its fifth consecutive Final Four the following season, 1962-63, losing to Loyola (Ill.) in overtime, 60-58, in the national championship game.
- ▶ The 2011-12 Bearcats will be donning throw-back jerseys throughout the season in honor of the 1962 championship team.

BEARCATS TABBED FIFTH IN BIG EAST BY ITS COACHES

- ▶ Cincinnati was projected fifth in the BIG EAST Conference by the league's coaches at the preseason Media Day, Oct. 19 in New York City.
- ▶ The fifth-place preseason ranking for the Bearcats is their highest since joining the BIG EAST in 2005-06. UC received 169 points overall.
- ▶ Connecticut and Syracuse tied for first place atop the poll with 209 points. The Huskies received seven first-place votes while the Orange garnered five. Louisville was third with 201 points and three first-place votes. Pittsburgh was fourth with 188 points and one first-place vote.

GATES NAMED TO BIG EAST SECOND TEAM

- ▶ Senior forward Yancy Gates was tabbed a second-team all-conference selection by the league's coaches at BIG EAST Media Day on Oct. 19 in New York City.
- ▶ Gates ranks fifth in rebounds (6.9), sixth in field goal percentage (.511) and eighth in blocks (1.3) among all returning BIG EAST players.

BEARCATS BOAST EXPERIENCED RETURNERS

- ▶ The Bearcats return seven letterwinners, including their four leading scorers from last season:

THOMAS WILL REDSHIRT 2011-12 CAMPAIGN

- ▶ UC freshman forward Shaquille Thomas has had his initial eligibility waiver approved by the NCAA and has been granted a full financial scholarship.
- ▶ Thomas will be cleared for practice activities at the conclusion of the fall quarter in mid-December.
- ▶ The 2011-12 academic year will be considered a redshirt season for Thomas, who will have four years of eligibility to play for the Bearcats starting in the fall of the 2012-13 school year.
- ▶ Thomas comes to UC after playing two seasons at NIA Prep in Newark, N.J., where he averaged 28 points and eight assists during the 2010-11 campaign.
- ▶ He was tabbed a four-star prospect by Rivals.com and Scout.com and the 81st-best player nationally by Rivals.com.
- ▶ He is the nephew of long-time NBA veteran Tim Thomas.
- ▶ Cronin quote: "We are very happy that Shaq has been cleared to attend the University of Cincinnati. He is a wonderful young man as well as a great player. Obviously, we wish he could play this season, but the circumstances dictate he must focus on academics. I know Shaq plans on using this year to work on improving each day. It is nice to know we will have one of the best freshmen in the country playing for us next season."

- ▶ Advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in six seasons, losing in the third round to eventual national champion Connecticut.
- ▶ Recorded its highest win total in 10 seasons, finishing 26-9. It marked the most victories by the Bearcats since posting a 31-4 mark in 2001-02.
- ▶ Achieved its most wins in the BIG EAST Conference since joining the league
- ▶ Led the BIG EAST conference and finished ninth in the nation in scoring defense, allowing 59.6 points per game.
- ▶ Started the 2010-11 season 15-0, its best start in a season since 1998-99.
- ▶ Yancy Gates finished eighth in the league in field goal shooting (51.1 percent) and 10th in rebounding (6.9).
- ▶ Gates averaged 15.8 points, 8.1 rebounds, shot 59.3 percent from the field and 69.8 percent from the free-throw line during the final nine games of the season.
- ▶ Sean Kilpatrick (9.7 points, 3.2 rebounds, 37.7 percent 3pt-FG shooting) was named to All-BIG EAST Rookie Team.

Since taking the reins of the University of Cincinnati men's basketball program in late March 2006, Mick Cronin has been busy assembling his program piece by piece from the ground up: stressing the importance of academic success, collecting talented recruits, and increasing the Bearcats victory total every season.

After a 2010-11 campaign that saw the Bearcats advance to the NCAA tournament for the first time in six seasons; record their highest win total since the 2002 campaign; achieve their most BIG EAST Conference wins in school history; secure an incoming recruiting class tabbed among the Top 25 in the nation; and receive the prestigious "Public Recognition Award" for their outstanding Academic Progress Rate, followers should be eager for the future of UC basketball.

Over Cronin's five years at Cincinnati, the team has shown improvement each step of the way, becoming the only program in the nation to increase its overall win total each season (11 in 2006-07, 13 in 2007-08, 18 in 2008-09, 19 in 2009-10 and 26 in 2010-11).

A native of the Queen City and 1997 graduate of UC, Cronin long has owned a passion for Cincinnati and the sport of basketball. As a child he used to follow his father, Hep, a highly successful local high school coach, around the gyms throughout the city. When his promising playing career at LaSalle High School was cut short due to a knee injury, Cronin set his sights on coaching. He punched his own ticket coaching varsity and junior varsity high school basketball, spending time as a video coordinator, and then as an assistant coach for the likes of Rick Pitino and Bob Huggins. His hard work and dedication made him one of the nation's top recruiters and one of the most highly sought after coaches when he accepted his first head coaching position in 2003 at Murray State University.

Cronin honed his skills as a head coach for three years at Murray State, compiling a 69-24 record and earning a pair of berths to the NCAA tournament. In his debut season as head coach, Cronin directed the Racers to a school-best 28-6 record,

the Ohio Valley Conference tournament championship, and an NCAA tournament appearance. His 28 wins are the sixth most in NCAA history for a first-year head coach. He earned OVC Coach of the Year honors two seasons later, guiding Murray State to another OVC crown, league tournament crown and NCAA Tournament appearance with a 24-6 overall record and 17-3 conference mark in 2005-06.

During 12 years as an assistant and head coach Cronin built a reputation for his ability to evaluate and recruit top talent. In his stint at UC as an assistant coach from 1997-2001, Cronin made an immediate impact by recruiting several top players, including NBA Draft selections Steve Logan (Golden State); DerMarr Johnson (Atlanta); Pete Mickeal (Dallas); Kenny Satterfield (Dallas); and Jason Maxiell (Detroit). Those players helped build a recruiting base that included two top 5- and a top 10-rated classes over Cronin's final three seasons. His work paid dividends for UC as it compiled a 108-26 record, five C-USA regular-season titles, and a pair of tournament crowns.

Following the 2000-01 season, Cronin became the associate head coach and recruiting coordinator at Louisville, under Rick Pitino. In his very first year, Cronin helped attract a top-10 ranked recruiting class, including Francisco Garcia, who went on to earn 2003 C-USA Freshman of the Year and was eventually drafted by Sacramento. National sports publications took notice ranking Cronin as the top assistant coach in the nation in 2002-03 by Athlon and the top assistant in Conference USA by Lindy's. That same year, The Sporting News named him the top recruiting assistant in the nation and the top assistant in C-USA.

Mick is the second generation of the Cronin family in the coaching ranks. His father compiled more than 400 victories in his high school coaching career and is recently retired from being a Major League Baseball scout for the Atlanta Braves.

Mick Cronin resides in Cincinnati with his five-year old daughter, Samantha.

Senior forward Yancy Gates recorded his 14th career double-double with 15 points and 11 rebounds to lead the University of Cincinnati men's basketball team to a 65-40 win over Alabama State University at Fifth Third Arena.

UC's top four returning scorers – Gates, senior guard Dion Dixon (14 points), sophomore guard Sean Kilpatrick (13) and junior guard Cashmere Wright (10) – each posted double-digit point totals to lead a balanced offensive attack.

Kilpatrick narrowly missed his first double-double after grabbing a career-best nine rebounds.

Cincinnati (1-0) relied on its pressure half-court defense to force Alabama State into 17 turnovers, which were converted into 19 points. Additionally, UC totaled 10 blocks and eight steals while holding the Hornets to a 29 percent field-goal percentage.

The Bearcats went into halftime with a 35-14 lead, the fewest points they've allowed in the first half under head coach Mick Cronin. The previous low during Cronin's tenure was 15 points, which was achieved twice (Nov. 22, 2008 vs. Western Illinois and Nov. 10, 2006 vs. Howard).

Cincinnati quickly jumped out to an 18-2 lead after starting the game with an 8-0 run and, after Alabama State made its first basket, a 10-run.

Alabama State (0-2) was led offensively by senior guard Kenderick Washington, who scored a game-high 18 points.
