POSTSEASON HONORS

OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Malcolm Perry • Sr. • QB • Navy • Clarksville, Tenn.

Perry is the second Navy player to be named as The American's Offensive Player of the Year, joining quarterback Keenan Reynolds (2015). Perry leads The American in rushing at 150.3 yards per game, a number which ranks second nationally, and has registered 10 100-yard games in 2019, including each of his last nine contests. Perry enters the AutoZone Liberty Bowl with 1,804 rushing yards and 21 touchdowns. He has broken Navy's single-season rushing record of 1,587 yards, held since 1983 by Napoleon McCallum. Perry has also passed for 1,027 yards and six touchdowns against three interceptions.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Quincy Roche • Jr. • DE • Temple • Randallstown, Md.

Roche finished the 2019 regular season as The American Athletic Conference leader with 13.0 sacks and 18.0 tackles for loss, ranking fifth nationally in sacks and 10th in tackles for loss. He needs 1.5 sacks to tie The American's single-season record of 14.5 sacks, held by Louisville's Marcus Smith (2013) and ECU's Nate Harvey (2018). Roche also became The American's career leader in sacks (26.0) in three seasons, surpassing the old mark of 25.5 sacks by Houston's Steven Taylor from 2013-16. Roche is the second Temple player to be named as The American's Defensive Player of the Year, joining former Owl linebacker Tyler Matakevich, who won in 2015.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYERS OF THE YEAR

Dane Roy • Sr. • P • Houston • Bunyip, Australia

Roy is the second punter in league history, and the first Houston player, to be chosen as The American's Special Teams Player of the Year (former Memphis punter Tom Hornsey and former Houston return specialist Demarcus Ayers shared the award in 2013). Roy is one of three finalists for the Ray Guy Award as the nation's top punter after he led The American in 2019 with a 46.9-yard average, which ranks second on the conference's single-season chart. Roy set a school record with 2,531 yards, hit 22 punts of at least 50 yards and pinned opponents inside the 20-yard line 30 times on 54 punts.

Antonio Gibson • Sr. • WR/KR • Memphis • Stockbridge, Ga.

Gibson becomes Memphis' sixth winner of The American's Special Teams Player of the Year honor in the conference's first seven seasons, joining Hornsey (2013), kicker Jake Elliott (2014-15) and return specialist Tony Pollard (2016-17). Gibson enters the Goodyear Cotton Bowl as The American's leader in kickoff returns, averaging 28.8 yards per attempt. He gained 633 yards on 22 returns, including a 97-yard touchdown, and set the conference's single-game record with 386 all-purpose yards in the Tigers' divisional win against SMU

ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

Kenneth Gainwell • RFr. • RB • Memphis • Yazoo City, Miss.

Gainwell is the second Memphis player in three seasons to be named as The American's Rookie of the Year, joining 2017 winner T.J. Carter. Gainwell ranks eighth nationally in all-purpose yards (1,957) and is 14th nationally in rushing yards (1,338), leading all freshmen in both categories. His rushing average of 109.6 yards per game trails only Perry among American Athletic Conference players, while he finished the regular season as the league leader in all-purpose yards (156.1 ypg).

COACH OF THE YEAR

Ken Niumatalolo • Navy

Niumatalolo was chosen by his peers as The American's Coach of the Year for the third time (2015, 2016) after he orchestrated a seven-win improvement for Navy from 2018 to 2019. The Midshipmen, who were picked fifth in the six-team West Division in The American's preseason ranking, went 7-1 in conference play to tie for first in the final West Division standings. The Midshipmen enter the AutoZone Liberty Bowl at 10-2 overall and are ranked No. 21 in this week's national polls.

American Athletic Conference teams are a combined 32-7 this season (.821) against unranked opponents in nonconference games.

A League Of Our Own

American Athletic Conference teams are a combined 28-1 (.966) against opponents from outside the power conferences/Notre Dame this season.

Conference Call

American Athletic Conference teams are 6-0 against Conference USA this season. The American is 4-0 against the Sun Belt, 3-0 against the Mountain West and 1-1 against the MAC. Teams from The American are 4-1 against FBS independents in 2019.

To Be The Best ...

American Athletic Conference teams have played nine games against top-25 opponents in 2019. Conference teams have faced three top-10 teams this season.

Exclusivity

The American, the Big Ten, and the SEC are the only FBS conferences that have at least four 10-win teams this season. If UCF defeats Marshall in the Bad Boy Mowers Gasparilla Bowl, The American would have five 10-win teams.

Home Is Where The Wins Are

UCF has won 21 straight home games, trailing only Clemson (22) for the longest home winning streak nationally. Cincinnati has won 13 straight home games, which ranks seventh nationally.

Ground Troops

Navy leads the nation in rushing, averaging 363.7 rushing yards per game.

Two Steps Back

UCF leads the nation in tackles for loss, averaging 9.3 TFL per game. SMU is third at 8.8, while USF is fifth at 8.3.

A Dozen Wins

Memphis has won 12 games for the first time in program history.

Orwellian

SMU has registered its first 10-win season since 1984.

Bowling League

The American has seven bowl-eligible teams in 2019. UCF, Cincinnati, Memphis, Navy, SMU, Temple and Tulane will be continuing their seasons in bowl games. The American has had at least seven teams in bowl games in each year of the league's 12-team alignment, which began in 2015.

What A Guy

Houston P Dane Roy was named as one of three finalists for the Ray Guy Award as the nation's top punter. Roy becomes the second American Athletic Conference player in as many years to be named a Ray Guy Award finalist, joining Cincinnati P James Smith, who made the final cut in 2018.

Finally

Memphis QB Brady White is one of five finalists for the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, which is given to the nation's top quarterback who is a senior, or a fourth-year junior on schedule to graduate with his class.

It's East vs. West

The American's West Division finished the 2019 season with an 11-7 head-to-head record against the league's East Division, marking the second time in the five-year history of the conference's two-division format that the West had the better head-to-head record. West Division teams hold a 49-41 all-time lead against East Division opponents since 2015.

Cincinnati is 21-5 since the start of the 2018 season. SMU is 16-6 in its last 22 games. UCF is 34-4 since the start of the 2017 season.

Malcolm In The Mid

Navy QB Malcolm Perry set an American Athletic Conference single-game record with 304 rushing yards in the Midshipmen's win against Army. Perry ranks second nationally in rushing at 150.3 yards per game, trailing only Oklahoma State's Chuba Hubbard, who is at 161.3 ypg.

Best In Class

Memphis RB Kenneth Gainwell is ranked 14th nationally in rushing at 111.5 yards per game. Gainwell is the only freshman running back ranked among the top 50 players in rushing.

Passing Fancy

SMU QB Shane Buechele is sixth nationally in passing yards (3,626).

Paper Or Plastic?

Temple DE Quincy Roche is sixth nationally in sacks with 13.0 total sacks and an average of 1.08 per game. SMU LB Patrick Nelson is eighth with 12.0 sacks and 1.00 per game.

The Grind

THE GAME

In 1941, the affiliation with the Southwest Conference began, with the SWC voting to send its champion annually to the Classic as the host institution ... The Cotton Bowl Classic has been part of the College Football Playoff semifinal rotation since 2015 ... The game was played at its namesake stadium in Dallas from 1937 to 2009 before moving to AT&T Stadium in 2010 ... Among current members of the American Athletic Conference, SMU has gone 2-1-1 in the Cotton Bowl, while Houston is 2-2 and Navy is 1-1 ... Memphis will be the first team to compete while a member of The American ... Penn State will be the sixth Big Ten squad to play in the Cotton Bowl ... Big Ten teams are 4-1 all-time in the game.

Penn State is making its 50th bowl appearance in program history ... The Nittany Lions have 29 bowl wins, which ranks fourth among FBS teams, trailing only Alabama (40), USC (34) and Georgia (31) ... Penn State brings a 29-18-2 bowl record into this year's Cotton Bowl ... The Nittany Lions are 2-0-1 all-time in the Cotton Bowl, having played in the 1948, 1972 and 1974 games ... Tulane is playing bowl games in consecutive seasons for the second time in program history as the Green Wave secured bowl eligibility by winning six of its first nine games in 2019 ... The Green Wave will make its 13th bowl appearance ... Tulane is 5-7 in its previous bowl games following last year's 41-24 win against Louisiana in the Cure Bowl ... The Green Wave's bowl history includes an appearance in the 1932 Rose Bowl as well as two Sugar Bowl appearances ... Tulane opened the 2019 season with five wins in its first six games and narrowly missed out on a top-25 national ranking, but the Green Wave closed the regular season by dropping five of its last six contests ... Tulane averaged 39.2 points in its first six games, but was held to 27.5 ppg in its final six ... The six teams to have defeated Tulane this season are all playing in bowl games ... Tulane ranks second in The American in rushing at 249.8 yards per game and has rushed for at least 100 yards in 52 consecutive games ... QB Justin McMillan has thrown for 2,229 yards and 14 touchdowns and is the leading rusher with 701 yards and 12 TDs ... The Green Wave has four running backs with at least 300 rushing yards this season, led by RB Corey Dauphine, who has 569 yards and seven touchdowns on 70 carries (8.1 avg.) ... RB Darius Bradwell was limited by injury to nine games and has 448 rushing yards with two TDs ... RB Amare Jones has rushed for 353 yards and four touchdowns and has 29 catches for 310 yards and a TD ... WR Darnell Mooney is the leading receiver with 45 catches for 670 yards and five touchdowns ... WR Jalen McCleskey, a transfer from Oklahoma State, has 35 catches for 494 yards and three TDs ... The defense is led by LB Patrick Johnson, a two-time all-conference selection who has 33 tackles with 3.0 sacks and 7.0 tackles for loss ... The leading tackler is LB Chase Kuerschen, who has 69 stops ... S Larry Brooks leads the team with three interceptions ... Tulane has scored three defensive touchdowns, with two pick-six scores and a fumble return for a TD ... K Merek Glover has hit 10 of his 14 field goal attempts, while P Ryan Wright, a 6-3, 255-pound punter, has averaged 40.6 yards on 46 punts.

Southern Miss is 11-14 all-time in bowls after a 45-13 loss to Florida State in the 2017 Independence Bowl ... The last bowl win for Southern Miss was a 28-21 decision against Louisiana in the 2016 New Orleans Bowl ... Head coach Jay Hopson has had a winning season in each of his four years with Southern Miss, leading the Golden Eagles to 28 wins since 2016 ... Navy quarterback Malcolm Perry, who ranks among the top five players nationally in both rushing yards and rushing touchdowns, has been chosen as the 2019 American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year, while Temple defensive end Quincy Roche, the league leader in sacks and tackles for loss, was named as The American's Defensive Player of the Year by the league's 12 head coaches.

Houston punter Dane Roy and Memphis return specialist Antonio Gibson were chosen as The American's Special Teams Players of the Year. Memphis running back Kenneth Gainwell was named as Rookie of the Year, while Navy head coach Ken Niumatalolo was selected as Coach of the Year.

Perry becomes the second Navy player to be named as The American's Offensive Player of the Year, joining quarterback Keenan Reynolds (2015). Perry leads The American in rushing at 136.4 yards per game, a number which leads all quarterbacks nationally, and has registered nine 100-yard games in 2019, including each of his last eight contests. Perry enters the annual Army-Navy game with 1,500 rushing yards and 19 touchdowns.

Roche finished the 2019 regular season as the American Athletic Conference leader with 13.0 sacks and 18.0 tackles for loss, ranking fifth nationally in sacks and 10th in tackles for loss. He needs 1.5 sacks to tie The American's single-season record of 14.5 sacks, held by Louisville's Marcus Smith (2013) and ECU's Nate Harvey (2018). Roche also became The American's career leader in sacks (26.0) in three seasons.

Roy is the second punter in league history, and the first Houston player, to be chosen as The American's Special Teams Player of the Year (former Memphis punter Tom Hornsey and former Houston return specialist Demarcus Ayers shared the award in 2013). Roy is one of three finalists for the Ray Guy Award as the nation's top punter after he led The American in 2019 with a 46.9-yard average, which ranks second on the conference's single-season chart.

Gibson becomes Memphis' sixth winner of The American's Special Teams Player of the Year honor in the conference's first seven seasons, joining Hornsey (2013), kicker Jake Elliott (2014-15) and return specialist Tony Pollard (2016-17). Gibson enters the postseason as The American's leader in kickoff returns, averaging 29.5 yards per attempt. He gained 561 yards on 19 returns, including a 97-yard touchdown, and set the conference's single-game record with 386 all-purpose yards in the Tigers' divisional win against SMU.

Gainwell is the second Memphis player in three seasons to be named as The American's Rookie of the Year, joining 2017 winner T.J. Carter. Gainwell ranks fifth nationally in all-purpose yards (1,873) and is 11th nationally in rushing yards (1,381), leading all freshmen in both categories. His rushing average of 115.1 yards per game trails only Perry among American Athletic Conference players, while he finished the regular season as the league leader in all-purpose yards (156.1 ypg).

Niumatalolo was chosen by his peers as The American's Coach of the Year for the third time (2015, 2016) after he orchestrated a six-win improvement for Navy from 2018 to 2019. The Midshipmen, who were picked fifth in the six-team West Division in The American's preseason ranking, went 7-1 in conference play to tie for first in the final West Division standings. The Midshipmen enter the annual Army-Navy game at 9-2 overall.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is a big success. Fans, including many who are new to the sport, enjoy it. The first College Football Playoff semifinals and national championship were the three most-viewed programs in cable television history.

Every Game Counts

The playoff preserves the excitement and significance of college football's unique regular season where every game counts.

Four Teams

The selection committee ranks the teams based on the members' evaluation of the teams' performance on the field, using conference championships won, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, and comparison of results against common opponents to decide among teams that are comparable.

Two Games, One Goal

The kickoff of the new year belongs to college football, with two semifinal games rotating annually among the Cotton Bowl, Fiesta Bowl, Orange Bowl, Peach Bowl, Rose Bowl and Sugar Bowl. The two teams winning the playoff semifinals compete for the College Football Playoff National Championship. That game is in a different city each year, always on a Monday night.

Universal Access

Every FBS team has equal access to the College Football Playoff based on its performance. No team automatically qualifies.

Governance

University presidents and chancellors from all 10 FBS conferences and Notre Dame serve on the CFP Board of Managers and govern the administrative operations, with commissioners (the Management Committee) managing the event. A small staff in the playoff office in Irving, Texas, carries out the detailed responsibilities.

Selection Committee

A talented group of high-integrity individuals with experience as coaches, student-athletes, college administrators and journalists, along with sitting athletics directors, comprise the selection committee. Members of the committee are: Rob Mullens (chair), Frank Beamer, Paola Boivin, Jeff Bower, Joe Castiglione, Herb Deromedi, Ken Hatfield, Chris Howard, Bobby Johnson, Ronnie Lott, Gene Smith, Todd Stansbury, and Scott Stricklin.

Selection Committee Responsibilities

- Rank the top 25 teams and assign the top four to semifinal sites.
- Assign teams to New Year's bowls
- Create competitive matchups
- Attempt to avoid rematches of regular-season games and repeat appearances
- Consider geography

Participants In New Year's Bowls

Both participants in the Orange, Rose and Sugar Bowls are contracted outside the playoff arrangement (Big Ten and Pac-12 to Rose Bowl; SEC and Big 12 to Sugar Bowl; ACC to Orange Bowl against the highest ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten and Notre Dame). If a conference champion qualifies for the playoff, then the bowl will choose a replacement from that conference. When those bowls host the semifinals and their contracted conference champions do not qualify, then the displaced champion(s) will play in one of the other New Year's bowls.

When not hosting semifinals, the Cotton, Fiesta and Peach Bowls will welcome displaced conference champions and the top-ranked champion from a non-contract conference. The highest-ranked available teams will fill any other berths. The selection committee will make the pairings.

The American Bowl Lineup

In addition to the College Football Playoff and New Year's Bowls, The American has either a primary or secondary affiliation with nine bowl games for 2019 season. The American works annually with its member schools and bowl partners to create the most sensible and attractive postseason matchups.

The **Military Bowl presented by Northrop Grumman** takes place at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium in Annapolis, Maryland, while the events and activities surrounding the game are based in Washington, D.C. The American Athletic Conference will face an opponent from the Atlantic Coast Conference in 2019.

The **TicketSmarter Birmingham Bowl** takes place at Legion Field in Birmingham, Alabama. The American/Big East has partnered with the bowl since its inception in the 2006 season. The American Athletic Conference will face an opponent from the Southeastern Conference.

The **Bad Boy Mowers Gasparilla Bowl** is played at Raymond James Stadium in Tampa, Florida. Conference USA will provide the opponent for The American's team in the 2019 season.

The **Cheribundi Boca Raton Bowl** began in 2014 and is played at FAU Stadium in Boca Raton, Florida. The American representative will play a team from the Mid-American Conference in 2019.

The **Tropical Smoothie Cafe Frisco Bowl** will be played for the third time in 2019. An American Athletic Conference team will face an opponent to be determined at Toyota Stadium in Frisco, Texas.

The **AutoNation Cure Bowl** made its debut in 2015 at Exploria Stadium in Orlando, Florida. An American Athletic Conference team will be paired against an opponent from the Sun Belt Conference. Net proceeds from the game will benefit the Breast Cancer Research Foundation.

The **SoFi Hawaii Bowl** is played at Rainbow Stadium on the campus of the University of Hawaii. The American Athletic Conference will face the Mountain West in a Christmas Eve matchup.

In addition to the conference's primary bowl affiliations, The American holds secondary partnerships with the **AutoZone Liberty Bowl** in Memphis, Tennessee, and the **Walk-On's Independence Bowl** in Shreveport, Louisiana, as well as with other ESPN-owned bowls.
