# BEARCATS ENTER 2012 LOOKING FOR FOURTH BIG EAST CROWN IN FIVE YEARS

### TEAM 125 ...

- » The University of Cincinnati football team, under the direction of third-year head coach Butch Jones will play its 125th season of football in 2012.
- » The Bearcats program dates to 1885 and ranks as one of the 10 oldest in major college football and following a 10-3 campaign in 2011, holds an all-time mark of 561-553-51.
- » UC has won three of the past four BIG EAST Championships and has played in a bowl game in five of the past six seasons.
- » Jones, the 2011 BIG EAST Conference Coach of the Year, enters his third season with the Bearcats program and his sixth as a collegiate head coach.
- » He has won three conference championships (2007, 2009 at Central Michigan, 2011 at Cincinnati).
- » The Bearcats have won 55 games over the last six years, the most among current members of the Big East.
- » UC returns 13 starters and 43 letterwinners from the 2011 squad that won its third BIG EAST Conference title in four years and will have to replace seven offensive starters and four defensive starters in the lead up to the 2012 season.
- Some of the key returnees are: QB Munchie Legaux (749 yards, 5 TD, 4 INT), RB George Winn (219 yards, 2 TD), RB Jameel Poteat (108 yards, TD), WR Anthony McClung (49 catches, 683 yards, 6 TD), WR Kenbrell Thompkins (44 catches, 536 yards, 2 TD), RG Austen Bujnoch, RT Eric Lefeld, RT Sean Hooey, DE Walter Stewart (44 tackles, 11 TFL, 6 sacks), DE Dan Giordano (35 tackles, 9 TFL, 5 sacks), LB Maalik Bomar (61 tackles, 3.5 TFL), LB Nick Temple (35 tackles, 2.5 TFL), SS Drew Frey (1st Big East, 73 tackles, 2 INT), CB Deven Drane (42 tackles, 3 INT), CB Cameron Cheatham (59 tackles, 3 INT), PK Tony Miliano (17-25 FG), P Pat O'Donnell (1st Big East, 43.8 avg.), RB/KR Ralph David Abernathy IV (26.5 avg., TD) and DB Chris Williams (46 tackles, 4.5 TFL).

# ALL OF THE LIGHTS ...

- » UC will open the 2012 campaign against BIG EAST Conference rival Pittsburgh in a Thursday night ESPN primetime matchup under the lights in historic Nippert Stadium.
- » The Bearcats will begin the season with a conference opponent for the first time since 2009 against Rutgers.
- » UC is 3-2 all-time in season-opening league games, and has won five consecutive BIG EAST openers with a 5-2 all-time

mark in openers as a member of the league.

» UC has gone 9-7 in its past 16 lid lifters and is 78-38-10 in 124 openers all time.

### LOOKING AHEAD ...

- » The Bearcats will report back to campus on Aug. 7 and depart almost immediately for the Higher Ground Conference & Retreat Center in West Harrison, Ind.
- » UC will open practice at Higher Ground on Aug. 8 and return to campus on Aug. 25 following a 19-day stay in the woods.
- Cincinnati opens the season with a bye week and will play its first game against Pittsburgh on Thursday, Sept. 6 inside Nippert Stadium.
- » After playing Delaware State on Sept. 15, UC will have its second bye of the season ahead of a matchup against Virginia Tech at FedEx Field in Landover, Md., a UC home game.
- The Bearcats will play 10-straight weeks to close the season but will not face a true road game until playing Toledo on Oct. 20 in the Glass Bowl and BIG EAST foe Louisville on Oct. 28 at Papa John's Cardinal Stadium.

# YOUNGSTERS TAKING OVER ...

- » When UC Head Coach Butch Jones has been making reference to being a young football team entering 2012, he's not making it up.
- Sixty-four student athletes are at a sophomore level or below with only 40 upperclassmen.
- The freshmen class of 28 individuals makes up the largest group, which grows to 43 players including redshirts.

# FROM I-71 South (Columbus)

I-71 south to Exit 3 - Taft Road (Taft is one-way going west).

Stay on Taft approximately seven blocks to the intersection of Jefferson Avenue. University Plaza will appear on the right.

Turn right at the University Plaza onto Jefferson Avenue.

At the first light, turn left on Corry Street.

Corry and Calhoun Garages are on the left.

### FROM U.S. 50 (Portsmouth and East)

U.S. 50 to Taft Road (Taft is one-way going west).

Stay on Taft to the intersection of Jefferson Avenue.

Turn right at the University Plaza onto Jefferson Avenue.

At the first light, turn left on Corry Street.

Corry and Calhoun Garages are on the left.

# FROM I-75 North or South

Take Exit 3 - Hopple Street. At the end of the ramp (stop light) turn left (east).

Cross over interstate and through Central Parkway. Hopple eventually becomes Martin Luther King Drive, the campus will appear on the right.

At the sixth light, turn right onto Jefferson Avenue.

At the second light, Corry Street, turn right.

# FROM I-74 (Indianapolis and West)

# **GAMEDAY PARKING**

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### **MEDIA CREDENTIALS**

Requests for official working media credentials should be directed to the UC Sports Communications Office. All credential requests should be received no later than noon, two days prior to the game. For more information, contact UC Sports Communications at 513.556.5191. Season credentials will be available for pickup prior to the first game. No credentials will be mailed after Tuesday preceding the game. Thereafter, credentials may be picked up on gameday at the media will call located on the west side of Fifth Third Arena at the ticket windows.

# **SCOUTING PASSES**

Professional scouts may obtain credentials through UC's Sports Communications Office. Scouts will be issued seating in the press box on a space-available basis.

# **SIDELINE PASSES**

The University of Cincinnati follows NCAA guidelines regarding media representatives on the sidelines. Photographers and videographers are permitted to shoot between the 23-yard lines and the goal lines on both sidelines, or anywhere behind the restraining line in the end zone.

# PRESS BOX SERVICES

Complete stats, scoring summaries, running play-by-play, quickie stats and post-game notes and quotes are provided by the UC Sports Communications Office. Pre-game food service is available beginning approximately two hours prior to kickoff, while beverages are available throughout the contest. This service is provided as a courtesy to working media. In addition, concession areas are available within the stadium confines. Wireless internet is available in the press box at Nippert Stadium. Members of the UC Sports Communications staff will be available to assist you. There is no access fee.

# **UC WEEKLY MEDIA LUNCHEON**

The Bearcats hold a weekly media luncheon each Tuesday in the second floor Bob Goin Team Room of Richard E. Lindner Center. Lunch is served at 11:30 a.m., selected players are available for one-on-one interviews from 11:45-12:15, and head coach Butch Jones takes the podium at 12:15.

### **PRACTICES**

During a typical Saturday game week, media may interview players and coaches immediately following practice on either Tuesday or Wednesday. Practice is generally closed to the public. Anyone hoping to observe practice should contact UC Sports Communications in advance. Failure to do so may result in an individual's removal from the venue. During regular-season practices, unless otherwise noted, still and television photographers will be allowed to shoot stretching and the first 20 minutes (four periods). At the conclusion of practice, head coach Butch Jones will address the media on the field. First-year players, including freshmen and transfers, will be made available to the media only after they have made a significant contribution or at the coach's discretion.

# **WEB VIDEO CONTENT**

Per UC's multimedia contract with IMG College, UC coaches, players, and administrators are not permitted to take part in one-on-one interviews or feature stories that will be made available exclusively for internet distribution.

# INTERNET POLICIES

Live updating of websites, blogs and social network feeds is not allowed during practices.

### POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

The UC locker room will remain closed following all football games. Media should request players through UC Sports Communications personnel for the media room during the fourth quarter. Media will be allowed to enter the field (for home games) late in the fourth quarter but will not be allowed to conduct interviews with UC football players on the field (home or away). Only the originating television and radio networks will be allowed to conduct interviews on the field.

Coach Jones will address the media in Room 3200 of the Campus Recreation & Wellness Center following home games. Players will be brought into the interview area as soon as possible.

Postgame availability on the road will be determined on gameday. Please see football contact Ryan Koslen for details.

# **BIG EAST TELECONFERENCE**

Head Coach Butch Jones will participate in the BIG EAST Conference's weekly football coaches media teleconference each Monday, beginning Aug. 27 and running through Nov. 26. 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### **RADIO**

University of Cincinnati fans have had no trouble tracking the Bearcats due to their radio network.

700 WLW begins its 19th season as the Bearcats' broadcast partner. The station's 50,000-watt signal can project UC games to 38 states and a third of Canada, and worldwide via 700WLW.com, making it possible for UC football fans to hear every game.

WLW augments the broadcast coverage with pregame and postgame programming. Additionally, head coach Butch Jones is featured on an hour-long call-in show each week from the original Montgomery Inn, allowing Cincinnati fans to meet the coach and ask their questions up close and personal.

# **ON-AIR TALENT**



DAN HOARD – Play-by-Play

Dan Hoard is in his 13th season as the Voice of the Bearcats, handling the play-by-play duties for the football and men's basketball teams. Hoard, also the radio announcer for the Cincinnati Bengals, first served as UC's over-theair voice in 1996 and handled the play-by-play on the local television telecasts from 1996-2000. # **TELEVISION**

When it comes to television, the University of Cincinnati has one of the most extensive television packages in the country as its partners cover not only the state of Ohio, but the nation.

Seven BIG EAST Conference members are located in the top 12 media markets (DMAs), and 12 members are located in the top 34, covering over 25 percent of all U.S. markets - by far, the largest coverage of any conference. Since its inception in 1979, the BIG EAST Conference has prided itself as a creative innovator in television and publicity concepts.

The BIG EAST has continued that tradition today by providing student-athletes at its 16 member institutions with unparalleled exposure through new landmark agreements with its two primary television partners: ESPN and CBS Sports. The specifics from each of the league's television agreements are outlined below.

The 2011-12 academic year marks the sixth year of a six-year agreement between the BIG EAST Conference and ESPN, Inc. for men's and women's basketball and football. Both founded in 1979, ESPN and the BIG EAST have enjoyed a relationship that has existed for the lives of both entities. The current landmark men's and women's basketball and football contracts have ensured a long-term continuation of that relationship. The number of guaranteed BIG EAST Conference appearances in these sports has been expanded to unprecedented levels under these pacts. Further, they ensure that the BIG EAST will continue to have a solid foothold in national and regional television and new media exposure in the foreseeable future.

In addition, the BIG EAST Network, produced by ESPN Regional Television (ERT) will continue to distribute its Game of the Week package to a nationally syndicated audience, reaching more than 30 million homes. The package is carried by WKRC Local 12 in Cincinnati.

UC is in a multi-year agreement with FOX Sports Ohio that makes the network the exclusive regional cable home of UC football. Programming includes game telecasts, preseason and postseason specials, game replays on Sunday nights, and a weekly coaches show titled 'Bearcats Sports Weekly With Butch Jones'.










# **NIPPERT STADIUM**



Entering its 111th season, Carson Field at Nippert Stadium is the venerable home of the University of Cincinnati football team and provides the Bearcats with one of the best home-field environments in college football.

Nippert Stadium has been home to Bearcats football since 1901, making it the fourth-oldest playing site and fifth-oldest stadium in college football.

The Bearcats have established program attendance standards over the last five seasons. UC drew a total of 30,246 fans in 2007 before setting back-to-back-to-back regular season average records with program-best clips of 31,965, 33,957 and 35,067 in 2008, 2009 and 2010, respectively.

Through numerous renovations, the structure situated in the middle of the Clifton campus has retained its early-century brickwork, wrought iron gates, and trim giving Nippert a comfortable old-time stadium charm and appeal, while remaining a classic showplace for college football. On Nov. 27, 2009 in a game against the University of Illinois, a crowd of 35,106 filled the stadium, setting a single-game attendance record for the fourth time in 2009.

Early-century brickwork combined with wrought iron gates and trim give Nippert a comfortable old-time stadium charm and appeal, while continuing renovations have enabled it to remain a classic showplace for college football.

The last major renovation occurred in 2005 when a new, permanent grandstand added new and improved seating in the North endzone. Underneath the structure are new game locker rooms for both the Bearcats and the visiting team.

The scoreboard features a new video board, nearly twice as large as the previous display, while the playing field is a new installation of FieldTurf, the grass-like artificial turf.

The stadium's founder was Arch Carson, who as captain and principal organizer played a significant role in starting football on the UC campus in 1885. In 1901 as physical director of the university, Carson guided the construction of the field which was later named for him -- the playing surface is still called Carson Field.

In 1916, construction began on a permanent brick-and-concrete stadium structure, which was completed, section-by-section, as funds were raised.

During the season-ending clash with rival Miami (Ohio) in 1923, Jimmy Nippert sustained a spike wound injury and died a month later from blood poisoning. His grandfather, James N. Gamble of Procter and Gamble, provided the funds needed to complete the horseshoe-shaped structure, and the James Gamble Nippert Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Nov. 8, 1924.

In 1936, the playing field was lowered 12 feet to allow spectator seating to increase to 24,000. The Reed Shank Pavilion was added in 1954 to bring the capacity to 28,000. In 1991, the capacity

was upped to 35,000 through extending the upper deck, now called the Herschede-Shank Pavilion, and a new pressbox was constructed.

Artificial turf was first installed in 1970 and in 2000, the stadium became one of the first in the U.S. to utilize FieldTurf, a grass-like synthetic surface.

The stadium served as home for the American Football League expansion team, the Cincinnati Bengals, in 1968 and 1969, while their eventual

permanent home at Riverfront Stadium was being constructed.

Along with this, the stadium has served as a venue for concerts by Britney Spears, Michael Jackson, NSYNC, Janet Jackson, KT Tunstall, The North Mississippi All-Stars, The Roots, the Cincinnati Opera Company and many more.

On November 2, 2008, President Barack Obama held a campaign rally at Nippert two days before the 2008 Presidential Election to an estimated 27,000 attendees.

The University is currently exploring options for future expansion and renovations to ensure that Nippert Stadium maintains its place as one of the great venues in college football.

# PRESEASON NOTEBOOK

# O'DONNELL NAMED TO RAY GUY WATCH LIST ...

- Pat O'Donnell was named to the watch list for the 2012 Ray Guy Award, which honors the nation's top collegiate punter and is presented by the Augusta Sports Council.
- UC led the BIG EAST in net punting behind the kicking of O'Donnell, a First-Team All-BIG EAST Conference selection in 2011 as a sophomore.
- O'Donnell, a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award a year ago, finished with a net punting average of 43.8 yards per kick, including 26 kicks dropped inside the 20 and a league high 17 boots of 50 yards or more.
- O'Donnell also handled the kickoff duties, averaging 64.2 yards per kick and giving the opponent and average starting field position on the 27-yard line.
- Earlier this summer, O'Donnell was named an All-American Athlete by the National Strength and Conditioning Association (NSCA).
- Below is a look at how O'Donnell ranks with other 2011 Ray Guy semifinalists entering the 2012 campaign.

# BATTLING IT OUT UNDER CENTER ...

- » One of the primary position battles is going on at quarterback. Jones must find a new starter to replace graduated two-time All-BIG EAST standout Zach Collaros.
- Munchie Legaux (New Orleans, La./Edna Karr) started three games in 2011 when Collaros went down with an injury, leading UC to a 2-1 mark and throwing for 749 yards and five touchdowns.
- Brendon Kay (Marine City, Mich./Marine City) has been hampered by injuries during his UC career. But the 6-4, 237-pound senior is healthy and pushed Legaux for reps during 15 spring practices.
- Patrick Coyne (Cincinnati, Ohio/Badin) redshirted in 2011 but showed great growth during the spring.

# FAMILY LEGACY ...

- Sophomore running back Ralph David Abernathy IV has a family name that should ring a historical bell.
- Abernathy's late grandfather, Ralph Jr., was a leader in the American Civil Rights Movement, a minister and a close friend of Dr. Martin Luther King. Ir.
- His father, Ralph III is a former Georgia State Senator.
- Abernathy IV ran back 39 kicks for 1,034 yards and a touchdown a year ago, averaging 26.5 yards per return.
- His 90-yard kickoff return for a touchdown helped turn the momentum in the AutoZone Liberty Bowl and the 31-24 win over Vanderbilt.

# LATE ADDITIONS ADD DEPTH TO ROSTER ...

The University of Cincinnati football team added three student-athletes, wide receiver Braxton Lane (Tyrone, Ga./ Sandy Creek HS), linebacker Jeff Luc (Port St. Lucie, Fla./ Treasure Coast/Florida State) and defensive lineman Elijah

- Shuler (North Brandford, Conn./North Brandford/Pierce CC), to its 2012 roster during the summer.
- Lane is a freshman who spent the last three years playing professional baseball, Luc is a junior transfer from Florida State who will sit out the 2012 season due to NCAA regulations and Shuler is a junior-college transfer from Pierce College in Los Angeles, Calif.
- Lane is a 5-11, 192 pound speedster out of Sandy Creek HS in Georgia, the same high school that produced another current UC wideout, sophomore Alex Chisum. Lane, a high school All-America baseball player, spent the past three seasons (2009-2011) in the Texas Rangers' minor league system playing in the Arizona League and for the Spokane Indians and Hickory Crawdads. He was selected in the seventh round of the 2009 Major League Baseball Draft by the Rangers with the 214th overall selection.
- Luc played in 19 career games at Florida State, tallying 23 career tackles and three tackles for loss. In 2011, he played in 11 games and recorded 15 tackles and two tackles for loss. He was a highly-touted prospect out of Treasure Coast HS, ranked as the No. 1 inside linebacker in the country by Rivals.
- Shuler joins the Bearcats after a year at Pierce College and another at Mt. Ida College. He saw time in 15 junior-college games, earning five starts and totaling 51 tackles, including 30 solo stops, 4.5 tackles for a loss and 2.5 sacks along with a QB hurry and a fumble recovery.

### NEW FACES ON THE COACHING STAFF ...

- » The Bearcats added two new faces to the coaching staff in the offseason, welcoming running backs coach Roy Manning and cornerbacks coach Shannon Morrison to the staff.
- » Manning is in his second tour of duty in Clifton, having served as a graduate assistant during the 2010 season. He spent 2011 at the University of Michigan.
- » Morrison, a 16-year coaching veteran who has been a defensive coordinator at five different schools, spent the 2011 season at Memphis and was most recently at Holy Cross.
- » Along with the additions, there were some staff responsibilities changed. John Jancek becomes the defensive coordinator and will continue to mentor the linebackers. Mark Elder has moved to defense to coach the safeties and will also add the role of special teams coordinator while TJ Weist adds the duties of recruting coordinator.

# THE KIDS ARE ALRIGHT ...

- UC's 2012 signing class was ranked as the best in the BIG EAST Conference by Sporting News.
- The signing class features 16 defensive players and 14 on the offensive side.
- UC added recruits from nine different states, including 11 student-athletes from the State of Ohio, 10 from within the Tri-State area and five products of Indianapolis. The Bearcats added commitments from California (1), Florida (6), Illinois (1), Michigan (1), Pennsylvania (1) and Tennessee (2).

# **GETTING AN EARLY START ...**

- » The Bearcats added new faces to the spring roster, welcoming nine early enrollees to campus, all high school seniors who enrolled at UC in January.
- » The first-year student-athletes, Kevin Brown (Indianapolis, Ind./Lawrence Central), Deionte Buckley (Indianapolis, Ind./Warren Central), Jonathan Burt (Indianapolis, Ind./ Warren Central), Errol Clarke (Miami, Fla,/Central), Bennie Coney (Plant City, Fla/Plant City), DeShawn Dowdy (Akron, Ohio/North), Marcus Foster (Troy, Ohio/Troy), Trenton

Norvell (Daytona Beach, Fla./Seabreeze) and Josh Posley (Indianapolis, Ind./Warren Central), took part in winter conditioning and spring football.

# LOOKING AT THE NUMBERS ...

- Over the past five seasons, UC ranks among the Top-20 teams in the country in terms of average Bowl Championship Series rankings.
- Brett McMurphy at CBSSports.com recently broke down the top teams in the BCS standings over the last five years.
- McMurphy gave each team a point ranking depending on where they finished: 25 for 1st, 24, for 2nd, etc.
- UC ended up ranked No. 16 based off of a 22nd place finish in 2007, 12th in 2008 and third in 2009.
- During that span, UC has won three BIG EAST Conference titles, played in two BCS bowl games and made two other bowl trips while racking up four 10-win seasons.
- UC was the only BIG EAST Conference program ranked and finished ahead of Arkansas (19th), West Virginia (t-20th), Michigan State (22nd) and Auburn (25th).

# CLASS OF THE BIG EAST? ...

- Cincinnati is the only BIG EAST Conference program with more than one double-digit win season over the last five years, with the Bearcats racking up four 10-win campaigns.
- The Bearcats have won 55 games over the last six years, also the most among current members of the Big East.
- The rest, in order: Rutgers (49), South Florida (47), Pittsburgh (44), Connecticut (42), Louisville (41), Temple (36) and Syracuse (26).

# NFL BEARCATS ...

- With NFL training camps getting started, 21 former UC players are getting shots to play at the next level, including seven members of UC's 2011 BIG EAST Conference Championship squad.
- The NFL Bearcats are: LB Connor Barwin (Houston), WR Armon Binns (Cincinnati), TE Brent Celek (Philadelphia), DE Trent Cole (Philadelphia), WR Mardy Gilyard (Philadelphia), TE Ben Guidugli (St. Louis), WR Vidal Hazelton (Cincinnati), P Kevin Huber (Cincinnati), DT John Hughes (Cleveland), C Jason Kelce (Philadelphia), OT Jeffrey Linkenbach (Indianapolis), DT Ricardo Mathews (Indianapolis), S Haruki Nakamura (Carolina), RB Isaiah Pead (St. Louis), TE Adrien Robinson (New York Giants), LB JK Schaffer (Jacksonville), DE Monte Taylor (Philadelphia), CB Brandon Underwood (Oakland), LS Mike Windt (San Diego), DT Derek Wolfe (Denver) and WR DJ Woods (Tennessee).
- OG Trevor Canfield (New York Jets) and DE Mike Wright (New England) retired during the offseason.

# LOOKING BACK AT 2011 ...

- UC was the most improved NCAA FBS AQ team in 2011, finishing with a 10-3 mark and a Top-25 final ranking, as well as returning to postseason play, knocking of SEC foe Vanderbilt in the 2011 AutoZone Liberty Bowl, the program's first bowl win over a BCS opponent.
- UC was the only school in the country to win a conference championship and its league team academic award and is one of two teams to win three conference titles in the last four years (Oregon).
- Eight student-athletes earned All-BIG EAST accolades in 2011, including BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Year Isaiah Pead and BIG EAST Co-Defensive Player of the Year

# PRESEASON NOTEBOOK

- Derek Wolfe. Wolfe, a senior defensive tackle, earned spots on five All-America teams, making him UC's sixth All-American since 2007.
- JK Schaffer was named the 2011 American Eagle Outfitters BIG EAST Football Scholar-Athlete of the Year, the secondstraight UC player to win that honor, leading 23 UC student-athletes on the Academic All-BIG EAST squad.
- The Bearcats were one of the most improved defenses in the nation in 2011, leading the NCAA FBS in tackles for a loss (8.62), ranking second in sacks (3.46), sixth in rushing defense (96.23) and 20th in scoring defense (20.31). UC led the BIG EAST and ranked ninth nationally in turnover margin (0.92) while the Bearcats' 33 turnovers gained was tied for fourth nationally.
- » Offensively, UC averaged 385 yards per game, ranking No. 2 in the BIG EAST in rushing offense (178.5 ypg) and scored an average of 33.3 points per game.
- » Pead closed out his career with back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons, the first UC running back to accomplish that feat in nearly 25 years.

- The Bearcats enter 2012 with the task of replacing some stalwart student-athletes from the past season.
- Players who exhausted their eligibility include: QB Zach Collaros (2nd Big East, 1,940 yards, 15 TD, 10 INT), RB Isaiah Pead (1st Big East, OPOTY, 1,259 rushing yards, 12 TD, 319 receiving yards, 3 TD), WR D.J. Woods (37 catches, 450 yards, 2 TD), TE Adrien Robinson (12 catches, 183 yards, 3 TD), LT Alex Hoffman (2nd Big East), LG Randy Martinez (1st Big East), C Evan Davis, DT Derek Wolfe (1st Big East, DPOTY, 70 tackles, 21.5 TFL, 9.5 sacks), DT John Hughes (51 tackles, 12.5 TFL, 5 sacks), LB J.K. Schaffer (1st Big East, 114 tackles, 13 TFL, 4.5 sacks, 3 INT, 3 FF) and FS Wesley Richardson (71 tackles).

# MITCH'S MISSION ...

- » The Bearcats recently helped Mitch's Mission raise \$20,000 for Cincinnati Children's Hospital to send children from the Cancer and Blood Diseases Institute at Cincinnati Children's to summer camp at Camp Joy in Clarksville, Ohio for a week.
- » In February, nearly 500 people, including head coach Butch Jones and 120 student-athletes from all of the Bearcats' programs, celebrated the second annual Mitch's Mission Playdate With The Bearcats at UC's CWRC.
- » Playdate participants had access to amenities of the beautiful CWRC, including swimming in the lazy river, rockclimbing and basketball.
- » In addition, those on hand for the playdate took part in carnival type games like the football toss and were able to interact with all the UC student-athletes and coaches on hand. Several autograph sessions took place along with

- face painting, food and music.
- » Mitch's Mission grew out of the relationship between the UC Bearcat football team and Mitch Stone, a young cancer patient who was adopted by the team during their 2009 record-breaking season. Today, Mitch is healthy and cancer-free. With help from the team, Mitch's family started Mitch's Mission so that they could continue helping kids facing similar health challenges.

# STREAKING AT HOME IN NON-LEAGUE PLAY ...

- UC has won 21 straight home non-conference games at Nippert Stadium, dating back to a 30-24 win over Temple in three overtimes on Sept. 20, 2003.
- UC is 15-0 on the home turf in non-conference play since the 2007 season.

### **NIPPERT STADIUM ...**

- Construction began on UC's home field, Nippert Stadium in 1916 and was completed in 1923.
- UC has used the Nippert site as a playing field since 1902, making it the second-oldest playing site in the nation for college football behind Penn's Franklin Field (1895).
- Among NCAA FBS schools, Nippert is the third-oldest stadium still in use, behind Bobby Dodd Stadium (Georgia Tech - 1913), Davis Wade Stadium (Mississippi State -1914) and ahead of Wisconsin's Camp Randall Stadium. which was built in 1917.
- Head coach Butch Jones calls Nippert the 'Wrigley Field' of college football.

# GOING STREAKING ...

- UC had a 14-game Nippert Stadium winning streak snapped in 2010 against USF. The streak dated back to the 2008 season.
- Spanning the 2008-09 seasons and the first two home games at Nippert in 2010 (UC played Oklahoma at Paul Brown Stadium), marked the first time in UC history the Bearcats went undefeated at home in back-to-back seasons.
- The school-record streak of 15-straight wins was set during a span from Nov. 8, 1952-Nov. 13, 1954.
- Ten of the Top 12 crowds in Nippert history, including a stadium record of 35,106 against Illinois in 2009, have occurred since 2007.

# **BEARCAT OLYMPICS ...**

- When Head Coach Butch Jones arrived on the UC campus in January of 2010, he instituted the Bearcat Olympics.
- The offseason program features players grouped into nine teams that compete in a number of activities, including academics, community service, and workouts.
- The culmination of the program's winter conditioning schedule, Night of Champions is one of the key components of the Bearcat Olympics.

# **CHANGING BODIES**

- Asst. AD/Sports Performance Dave Lawson has led an overall change of body type for the Bearcats.
- Two of the biggest benefactors of the change have been DE Walter Stewart and OL Andre Cureton.
- When he arrived at UC, Stewart was a 216-pound OLB. Today he takes the field as a 247-pound DE.
- Cureton went the opposite way, arriving at UC at 364 pounds. He suited up on opening day at 295 pounds.

When Lawson arrived at UC, there were only four Bearcats who could crack 400 lbs. on the bench press, a number that now is over 18.

# TAKE ME TO HIGHER GROUND ...

- For the past 13 years, the UC football has called the Higher Ground Conference and Retreat Center in West Harrison, Ind., its preseason training home.
- The 280-acre facility is located about 30 miles from campus and has served as the Bearcats training camp location since the lead up to the 1999 season.
- Among many amenities, Higher Ground features a pair of 100-yard FieldTurf practice fields, ample living and meeting spaces and no distractions from football.

# **OFF-CAMPUS TRAINING SITES ...**

- The University of Cincinnati is one of seven schools who spend time at an off campus site during football training camp.
- The Bearcats will report in this season and immediately depart for West Harrison, Ind., giving UC a 19-day stay at the Higher Ground Conference & Retreat Center, it's longest during Coach Butch Jones' tenure.

# **SEMESTER CONVERSION ...**

- When UC begins the academic term on Aug. 27, 2012 the Bearcats will move from a quarter to semester system for the first time since the 1960s.
- The quarter system divides the academic year into 10week periods. The semester system divides the year into fall and spring semesters, each with about 14 weeks of instruction in addition to a summer session with about 14 weeks of instruction.
- Fall semester will begin in late August and end in mid-December. Spring semester will begin in early January and end in late April. Summer session will begin in early May and end in early August.
- One benefit is that UC students will be on hand to attend early season football games in Nippert Stadium.

# A BRIEF HISTORY OF UC ...

- The University of Cincinnati, Ohio's premier urban research university, traces its origins to 1819.
- Today, the University of Cincinnati is classified as a Research University (Very High Research Activity) by the Carnegie Commission and is ranked as one of America's top 25 public research universities by the National Science Foundation.
- U.S. News has ranked UC in the Top Tier of America's Best Colleges. The Chronicle of Higher Education calls UC a "research heavyweight."





# HEAD COACH BUTCH JONES

SIXTH SEASON OVERALL | THIRD AT CINCINNATI

**B**utch Jones, the 2011 BIG EAST Coach of the Year, enters his third season with the Bearcats.

With the Bearcats' win in the 2011 regular-season finale against Connecticut, Jones earned his third conference championship as a head coach (2007, 2009 at Central Michigan, 2011 at Cincinnati) and his 40th career victory.

Jones, who was named the head coach at UC on Dec. 16, 2009, holds a 41-24 career mark, a 27-10 record in conference play, has four bowl appearances and three league championships to his credit in five seasons as a collegiate head coach. In 2011, UC was the only program nationally to win both its conference championship as well as the league's team academic award.

Since arriving in Cincinnati, Jones has made an immediate impact, building a staff of championship-level coaches and teachers, as well as an atmosphere of competition and family, while also overseeing an academic program of great success. Jones and his staff have shown the ability to produce NFL-ready talent as well, sending 11 players to the NFL over the past three years.

UC was the most improved NCAA FBS AQ team in 2011, finishing with a 10-3 mark and a Top-25 final ranking, as well as returning to postseason play, knocking of SEC foe Vanderbilt in the 2011 AutoZone Liberty Bowl, the program's first bowl win over a BCS opponent.

Eight student-athletes earned All-BIG EAST accolades in 2011, including BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Year Isaiah Pead and BIG EAST Co-Defensive Player of the Year Derek Wolfe. Wolfe, a senior defensive tackle, earned spots on five All-America teams, making him UC's sixth All-American since 2007. JK Schaffer was named the 2011 American Eagle Outfitters BIG EAST Football Scholar-Athlete of the Year, the second-straight UC player to win that honor, leading 23 UC student-athletes on the Academic All-BIG EAST squad.

The Bearcats were one of the most improved defenses in the nation in 2011, leading the NCAA FBS in tackles for a loss (8.62), ranking second in sacks (3.46), sixth in rushing defense (96.23) and 20th in scoring defense (20.31). UC led the BIG EAST and ranked ninth nationally in turnover margin (0.92) while the Bearcats' 33 turnovers gained was tied for fourth nationally.

Offensively, UC averaged 385 yards per game, ranking No. 2 in the BIG EAST in rushing offense (178.5 ypg) and scored an average of 33.3 points per game. Pead closed out his career with back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons, the first UC back to accomplish that feat in nearly 25 years. His 3,288 career yards rushing and 27 rushing touchdowns rank him third all-time.

QB Zach Collaros became only the second UC QB all-time to tally 6,000 yards passing and 50 passing touchdowns. He leaves UC as the school's all-time leader in completion percentage (.619) and was 485-of-783 for 6,278 yards and 51 touchdowns.

The Bearcats' overall team GPA for the fall 2011 quarter was a 2.73 which is a significant improvement over the in-season GPA of 2.69 the Bearcats posted in the fall of 2010. Forty-three student-athletes achieved a 3.0 GPA or better while 23 student-athletes earned spots on the Dean's List, with quarter GPAs of 3.4 or above.

UC was honored with the 2010-11 BIG EAST Team Academic Excellence Award. Nineteen players were named Academic All-BIG EAST and John Goebel earned the 2010 American Eagle Outfitters BIG EAST Football Scholar-Athlete of the Year award.

In 2010, the Bearcats led the BIG EAST in scoring offense (27.1 ppg), total offense (417.3 ypg), passing offense (260.7 ypg), first downs (21.9 pg), third-down conversions (45.6 pct.) and touchdown passes (27). Wide receiver Armon Binns and quarterback Zach Collaros were both First-Team all-BIG EAST selections while five other teammates earned All-BIG EAST honors.

In addition to their success in the classroom, Jones-coached squads have shown a great ability to close out games, sporting identical 32-1 marks when holding a lead at halftime or entering the fourth quarter.

Prior to leading the Bearcats, Jones spent three seasons at Central Michigan University, leading the Chippewas to a pair of Mid-American Conference Championships and three-straight bowl appearances from 2007-09 and a postseason Top-25 ranking.

A native of Saugatuck, Mich., and former offensive coordinator at CMU, Jones went 27-13 over three seasons as head coach at CMU, including a 22-3 mark in league games. The Chippewas won a pair of MAC Championships (2007, 2009), played in three-straight bowl games and earning a postseason ranking of No. 23 in 2009. He is the only coach in CMU history to lead the team to consecutive bowl games and is the first in MAC history to do it in his first three seasons as head coach.

Prior to becoming CMU's head coach, Jones spent a total of 11 seasons as an assistant at the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision level. He served as the offensive coordinator at three different schools, spanning eight seasons, and worked directly with 24 all-conference selections in 15 years as a full-time position coach.

A 1990 graduate of Ferris State University where he was a twoyear letterman on the football team, Jones broke into the coaching ranks while still an undergraduate by serving as intern for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers from 1987-89.

Jones and his wife Barb are the parents of three children: Alex, Adam, and Andrew.

CINCINNATI (AP) - Isaiah Pead ran for Cincinnati's first two touchdowns, and Zach Collaros threw for the next four—all in the first half—leading the Bearcats to a 72-10 victory over Austin Peay.

The Bearcats dominated, scoring the third-most points in their history.

Cincinnati scored on six of its seven first-half possessions. Pead ran 40 yards for a touchdown on the Bearcats' first play. He also scored on a 13-yard run and finished with 87 yards.

Collaros, the Big East's top returning passer, played only the first half and was 12 of 19 for 134 vards. His 34-yard pass to D.J. Woods completed a 95-yard drive in the second quarter. Collaros also threw a pair of touchdown passes to Anthony McClung in the last 39 seconds of the first half for a 41-0 lead.

Their opener in head coach Butch Jones' second season was much better, though played in front of a crowd of 23,282. Last year, they went to Fresno State and got beat 28-14 in 94-degree heat, wearing down as the game went along. No such problems on Saturday in 93-degree weather against an overmatched opponent.

Cincinnati won the coin toss, and freshman Ralph David Abernathy IV returned the kickoff 60 yards. On the Bearcats' first play, Collaros handed off to Pead and threw a downfield block on safety Amius Smith, opening the way for the Big East's top returning runner to go 40 yards

The Bearcats had a 14-play, 95-yard drive in the second quarter that left the Governors' defense running on fumes. Collaros threw a 34-yard pass to D.J. Woods, who ran past cornerback Sheldon Wade to make the catch for a 27-0 lead.

Collaros threw a 39-yard touchdown pass to McClung with 39 seconds left, and Cincinnati recovered a fumble on the kickoff. Austin Peay dropped seven defenders into pass coverage, but Collaros found McClung wide open in the middle of the field for a 29-yard touchdown that made it 41-0.

Cincinnati went with its reserves in the second half.

CUDING CHWWYDA

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. - The University of Cincinnati football team fell to University of Tennessee 45-23 Saturday before a Neyland Stadium crowd of 94,207.

After Cincinnati tied the score 14-14 midway through the first quarter, Tennessee produced 21 straight points to build a lead the Bearcats were unable to overcome.

Cincinnati halfback Isaiah Pead rushed for 155 yards on 14 carries to lead the Bearcats attack. Senior guarterback Zach Collaros went 21-34 for 230 yards and two touchdowns. Senior receiver D.J. Woods had a team-high nine receptions for 111 yards. Junior receiver Kenbrell Thompkins, a one-time Volunteer signee, recorded career highs in catches (four) and receiving yards (58).

On the opening possession of the game, the Bearcats needed just three plays to score after Pead took his first carry down the right sideline for a 65-yard touchdown.

Tennessee responded with a seven-play scoring drive on their first possession, punctuated by a two-yard TD run by tailback Marlin Lane that tied the score 7-7 with 9:53 remaining in the first quarter.

Volunteers place kicker Michael Palardy recovered his own on-side kick on the ensuing kickoff to give Tennessee possession. Four plays later, Bray threw a 33-yard streak down the left sideline to sophomore receiver Justin Hunter for a touchdown.

Trailing 14-7, Cincinnati went on a five-play, 80-yard drive that ended with a Collaros touchdown pass to tight end Adrien Robinson, tying the score 14-14 with 6:38 left in the first quarter.

Cincinnati made the first defensive stop of the game after senior defensive back Dominique Battle forced Lane to fumble, which was recovered by UC linebacker Ben Pooler at the Bearcats 28-yard line. Cincinnati could not capitalize on the turnover and punted for the first time for either team on its third possession.

Through the first quarter both teams combined for 342 yards, including Pead's 104 yards rushing on five attempts, his sixth career 100-yard performance.

CINCINNATI - Following a stellar performance by the defense, the University of Cincinnati football team defeated Akron 59-14 at Nippert Stadium. Wide receiver DJ Woods led the offense with two catches for 62 yards, while linebacker Clemente Casseus paced the defense with five tackles. Zach Collaros was 10-of-16 for 157 yards as one of four quarterbacks who saw action.

The Bearcats got off to a quick start with the help of senior running back Isaiah Pead, who touched the ball multiple times before capping a nine-play, 60-yard drive with a one-yard rushing touchdown. It marked the third-straight game he recorded a rushing touchdown and was the third-consecutive game UC scored on its opening drive.

Derek Wolfe got to UA quarterback Clayton Moore, knocking the ball loose and springing Maalik Bomar to run it back 54 yards for a touchdown with 8:21 remaining in the first.

On Akron's second possession, senior defensive back Dominique Battle intercepted a pass from Moore and scored his first-career touchdown on a 36-yard run, giving Cincinnati the 21-0

After the Zips were forced to punt, the Bearcats marched down the field, yet again, on its next drive, which was highlighted by a 50-yard reception by senior wide receiver DJ Woods. Collaros pitched in another rushing touchdown - his first of the season - to make the score 28-0.

The defense recorded its third touchdown of the day when Camerron Cheatham picked off Moore and ran it back 53 yards to make the score 49-0 heading into the locker room.

Akron threatened to score on the opening drive of the second half, but Deven Drane denied any Zips' points by catching his first-career interception in the end zone with 10:38 left on the clock.

Following a field goal by freshman kicker Tony Miliano, the two teams traded two possessions each before freshman running back Jameel Poteat ran in his first-career touchdown - a seven-yard rush - to make the score 59-0.

CINCINNATI - After a dominating defensive performance, the University of Cincinnati football team (3-1) defeated the NC State Wolfpack (2-2), 44-14, at Nippert Stadium.

Two of UC's touchdowns came from takeaways, while the defensive held NCSU to -26 rushing yards. Isaiah Pead lit up the offense, recording his second 100-yard rushing game of the season with 167 yards, while Zach Collaros went 25-of-34 for 263 yards and two touchdowns, in addition to two rushing touchdowns.

Following one scoreless possession each, Pat O'Donnell kicked a 76-yard punt - the second longest in Bearcat history - pinning the ball at NC State's 3-yard line. Just as the Wolfpack was gaining yardage, Drew Frey made his first pick of the year, which eventually allowed Pead to continue his streak, putting Cincinnati's first points on the board for the fourth-consecutive game.

Kenbrell Thompkins converted a third-and-17 situation with a 44-yard reception and the Bearcats found themselves in the endzone a second time to give the hosts the 14-0 lead with 8:34 remaining in the first quarter.

JK Schaffer continued the defensive domination when he grabbed an interception with one minute remaining in the first quarter and then, as if by second nature, Collaros and company brought it in for another touchdown to make it 21-0.

Later on, Tony Miliano capped a nine-play, 54-yard drive with a 26-yard field goal to give Cincinnati the 24-7 edge heading into the locker room.

UC didn't show any signs of letting up in the second half, as sophomore wide receiver Anthony McClung single-handedly gave the Bearcats 57 yards on the drive and allowed for a 48-yard field goal by Miliano to increase the lead, 27-7.

After a scoreless NCSU drive, Cincinnati began its longest drive of the evening, which was highlighted by a 25-yard touchdown pass to Pead.

**OXFORD, Ohio** - Isaiah Pead ran for a pair of touchdowns, and Cincinnati's dominating defense opened the second half with a goal-line stand that set up a 27-0 victory over Miami of Ohio.

Cincinnati (4-1) has won the last six games in the nation's oldest nonconference rivalry, played 116 times since 1888. The Bearcats' defense made this one a reference point--Cincinnati's first shutout in Oxford since a 22-0 victory in 1898.

The Bearcats overcame a season-high four turnovers, including Zach Collaros' two end-zone interceptions and his fumble at the Miami 12-yard line. Collaros was 16 of 30 for 251 yards and scrambled 15 times for 89 yards against a defense that emphasized pass coverage.

It was Cincinnati's first shutout since a 31-0 win over Eastern Kentucky on Sept. 2, 2006. The Bearcats' last shutout in the rivalry--played for the "Victory Bell" traveling trophy--was 17-0 in Cincinnati. Miami finished with minus-3 yards on 38 rushes. Miami hadn't been shut out at home since 1983, the year Yager Stadium opened.

Cincinnati's defense opened the second half with a goal-line stand that crushed Miami's chances of a comeback. Zac Dysert surprised Cincinnati with a 66-yard pass down the middle to Nick Harwell, who was tackled at the 1-yard line by safety Drew Frey. After two runs lost a yard, Harwell was called for pushing off to get open on a catch in the end zone. Mason Krysinski hooked a 34-yard field goal try, starting a celebration on the Bearcats sideline.

Three plays later, Collaros completed a 72-yard pass to tight end Adrien Robinson, who made a juggling at-the-knees catch while safety Pat Hinke interfered with him. Pead's 3-yard run made it 13-0.

Cincinnati then put it away with two touchdowns in an 89-second span. Pead scored on a 4-yard dive, and linebacker J.K. Schaffer returned the ball 17 yards for a touchdown off a bad snap on a punt attempt for a 27-0 lead late in the third quarter.

**CINCINNATI** - The University of Cincinnati beat the Louisville Cardinals 25-16 at Paul Brown Stadium to win the Battle for the Keg of Nails for the fourth-straight year. It was a career-high day for senior defensive lineman Derek Wolfe, who had a career-best in tackles (11) and tackles for loss (2.5) in front of 40,971 fans for homecoming weekend – the third largest home crowd in UC history.

The windy field conditions provided a battle of its own for senior quarterback Zach Collaros, who went 18-of-26 for 152 yards and relied heavily on senior running back Isaiah Pead, who finished with 20 carries for 153 yards – his eighth career 100-plus rushing game. Collaros pitched in an additional 22 yards on 13 rushes.

The UC offense got off to a slow start, but the defense managed to hold the Cardinals to two field goals to make the score 6-0 after the first 15 minutes.

After a scoreless 10 minutes to start the second quarter, UC forced Louisville to a three-and-out on its own seven-yard line. The Bearcats got the ball back in UofL's territory, where it began its first productive drive of the afternoon – a four-play, 37-yard scoring drive capped with a 26-yard touchdown pass to Woods to give the Bearcats the 7-6 lead with five minutes left in the half.

Cincinnati's offense began clicking on all cylinders as they marched 53 yards down the field to UofL's one-yard line. Faced with a fourth-and-goal situation, Collaros ran it for the touchdown to pull within two of the guests, 16-14, after three.

Cincinnati wasted no time adding points, this time in way of Pead, who ran 50 yards to the endzone to make it his sixth-straight game with a rushing touchdown. Following the 16-second drive, senior tight end Adrien Robinson caught a two-point conversion pass to make it, 22-16, with 12:13 remaining.

Freshman kicker Tony Miliano tacked on an 21-yard field goal in the final minutes to make the final score 25-16.

TAMPA, Fla. - Zach Collaros threw for three touchdowns and ran for two fourth-quarter scores, helping Cincinnati come from behind in the closing minutes Saturday to stay atop the BIG EAST Conference standings with a 37-34 victory over South Florida.

The senior quarterback finished a seven-play, 70-yard game-winning drive with a 2-yard TD run with 12 seconds remaining. Collaros also scored on a 3-yard run and threw a 30-yard TD pass to Alex Chisum to help Cincinnati (6-1, 2-0) wipe out a 10-point deficit early in the final quarter and finished 26 of 41 passing for 389 yards.

B.J. Daniels threw for 409 yards and three TDs for South Florida (4-3, 0-3). His 10-yard scoring pass to Andre Davis put the Bulls ahead 34-30 with 1:27 remaining.

However, that was more than enough time for Collaros to pull out Cincinnati's fifth straight win. Collaros threw TD passes of 6 yards to Isaiah Pead and 21 yards to Adrien Robinson in addition to his fourth quarter throw to Chisum, who made a leaping catch before tumbling in the end zone. Kenbrell Thompkins had six receptions for 114 yards, including a 33-yarder that helped the Bearcats get into position for the winning score.

Daniels' scoring throw to Griffin finished a 10-play, 80-yard drive and was the first offensive touchdown allowed by Cincinnati's defense in 10 quarters. Murray's TD on the opening drive of the second half gave the Bulls a short-lived 17-10 lead that Collaros erased with a six-play, 80-yard march that Thompkins kept alive with a 39-yard reception on third-and-2 from the Bearcats 40.

South Florida regained the lead on Bonani's second field goal of the game. Daniels, who completed 31 of 47 passes, put the Bulls up 27-17 with his TD pass to Shields late in the third quarter.

Collaros was 4 of 6 for 69 yards on the winning drive. Thompkins' 33-yard reception gave the Bearcats a first down at the South Florida 22. Collaros also threw 21 yards to Anthony McClung on the march.

PITTSBURGH, Pa. - Butch Jones' rebuilding plan at Cincinnati is ahead of schedule. Way ahead. Zach Collaros threw for 214 yards and ran for two touchdowns as the Bearcats took firm control of the Big East race with a 26-23 win over Pittsburgh on Saturday.

Isaiah Pead rushed for 118 yards and Tony Miliano kicked four field goals for Cincinnati (7-1, 3-0 Big East), which won its sixth straight to take a major step toward winning the program's third conference title in four years.

Not bad for a program picked to finish fifth in the league in the preseason. Seems like a long time ago now.

Cincinnati appeared to be in serious trouble after the Panthers took a 23-13 lead midway early in the third quarter on Tino Sunseri's 4-yard toss to tight end Hubie Graham.

Yet Cincinnati rallied doing what it's done all season: Forcing opponents into careless turnovers and turning them into points.

Pitt led by a touchdown late in the third quarter when Sunseri appeared to scramble for a first down. The ball popped out, however, and the Bearcats recovered at the Pitt 27. Cincinnati needed just three plays to tie it at 23, with Collaros plunging over from 3 yards out for his second touchdown of the game.

It took the Bearcats all of three plays to get it back again. Sunseri tried to throw the ball in double coverage and instead it wound up deflecting into the hands of Camerron Cheatham, who returned it to the Pitt 26.

The pick led to Miliano's fourth field goal of the game, and the Bearcats held on. Barely.

The Panthers had one last chance as Sunseri frantically drove them from the Pitt 11 to the Cincinnati 33 with 14 seconds remaining. Harper came on to send the game to overtime. His 50-yarder never had a chance, sailing wide ride and sending the Bearcats storming onto the field.

CINCINNATI - The No. 23/18 University of Cincinnati football team (7-2, 3-1 BIG EAST) was handed its first BIG EAST loss when it was defeated by West Virginia (7-3, 3-2 BIG EAST), 24-21, on Saturday afternoon in Paul Brown Stadium. It was the largest conference crowd in UC history with 48,152 fans.

Senior quarterback Zach Collaros went 7-of-11 for 70 yards before leaving the game due to injury midway through the second quarter, while backup quarterback Munchie Legaux completed 10-of-21 passes for 144 yards and one rushing touchdown.

Collaros was injured on a sack in the end zone. The senior fumbled and it resulted in a WVU TD. Senior running back Isaiah Pead finished with 19 rushes for 113 yards and two touchdowns, while senior JK Schaffer leads with nine tackles. The UC defense had 18 tackles for loss against WVU.

After trailing for the majority of the game, the Bearcats had a chance to tie things up as time expired, but a blocked Tony Miliano field goal resulted in the West Virginia victory.

The Bearcats forced the Mountaineers to a three-and-out on the opening possession and took quick control of the ball game in a three-play, 54-yard drive capped by a 40-yard rush by Pead to give UC the early lead just one minute in.

A blocked field goal by sophomore Deven Drane sparked a momentum shift at the 8:48 mark of the third guarter. Legaux ran it 65 yards to the WVU 31-yard line to begin the ensuing drive, but the Mountaineers stopped the scoring drive and Miliano's field goal attempt went wide left to keep the score 17-7.

Legaux pulled the Bearcats back into the game with 4:25 remaining in the third quarter with the help of Pead, who tacked on 45 yards to pull UC within three, 17-14. As the Mountaineers were driving down the field on its next possession, junior defensive lineman Walter Stewart recovered a WVU fumble, allowing Pead to add another touchdown to give the hosts their first lead since its first touchdown, 21-17.

PISCATAWAY, N.J. - Rutgers' Jawan Jamison rushed for a career-high 200 yards and two touchdowns and surprising Rutgers moved into a share of first place in the Big East Conference with a 20-3 victory over Cincinnati.

Cincinnati

Picked to finish last in the conference's preseason poll, Rutgers (8-3, 4-2) limited Cincinnati to a season-low 225 total yards while holding sophomore Munchie Legaux to 158 yards passing in his first start for the injured Zach Collaros.

Jamison carried 34 times and scored on runs of 12 and 1 yard as the Scarlet Knights handed the Bearcats (7-3, 3-2) their second straight loss and snapped a five-game losing streak against them. It also avenged a 69-38 loss last season, a game in which Cincinnati had 661 yards in total offense.

The victory moved Rutgers into a tie for first place in the league with Louisville (6-5, 4-2), which beat Connecticut Saturday. Cincinnati, West Virginia and Pittsburgh are a half game back.

Tony Miliano cut the deficit to 7-3 with a 47-yard field goal after Cincinnati could generate only 18 yards in eight plays after getting the ball at the Rutgers 48 following a short punt.

Rutgers pushed the lead back to seven points when San Te capped a 23-play, 82-yard second-quarter march that consumed close to 10 minutes. Chas Dodd (19 of 33 for 173 yards) converted three third-down passes on the drive and Jamison converted two other third downs with short runs.

After getting a first and goal at the Bearcats 1, Cincinnati brought down fullback Michael Burton for a 4-yard loss and Rutgers had to settle for three points.

Jamison pushed the lead to 17-3 midway through the third quarter capping an 11-play, 94 yard drive on which he has runs of 22 and 29 yards with his short TD run.

JK Schaffer tied a season high with 13 tackles to lead the UC defense which spent over 38 minutes on the field.

**SYRACUSE**, **N.Y.** - University of Cincinnati senior running back Isaiah Pead had 246 all-purpose yards and a pair of touchdowns to help lead the Bearcats to a 30-13 win over Syracuse.

Pead finished with a career-best nine catches for a career high 112 yards, 80 yards rushing, and a pair of punt returns, the first of his career, for 54 yards. He had a 24-yard rushing touchdown on the first offensive play of the third quarter and also scored on a 69-yard strike from sophomore quarterback Munchie Legaux.

Pead cracked the 1,000-yard mark for the second-straight season, becoming the first Cincinnati back to do so in 25 years. He also became just the third UC player to eclipse 3,000-career rushing yards.

Legaux, making his second collegiate start in place of an injured Zach Collaros, teamed with fellow sophomore QB Jordan Luallen to keep the Orange defense off balance.

Legaux finished 13-of-22 for 169 yards, two touchdowns and no interceptions. Luallen ran the ball eight times for 77 yards, a 9.6 yards per carry average, which included a 48-yard scamper that put the Bearcats on the 1-yard line.

Syracuse was unable to gain any kind of field advantage the entire game, starting no better than its own 26. The Bearcats did, though, and none better than on the second-half kickoff.

Freshman Ralph David Abernathy IV returned the kick 71 yards, failing to beat the only defender left between him and the end zone as kicker Ross Krautman made a saving tackle at the Orange 24. It went for naught when Pead scored on the next play for a 17-6 lead.

Another freshman, kicker Tony Miliano connected on field goals of 27, 22 and a career-long tying 48 yards while punter Pat O'Donnell played a key role with four punts for an average of 54.0 yards per kick. He dropped three balls inside the 20-yard line with only one touchback and had a long kick of 61 yards.

**CINCINNATI** - The University of Cincinnati football team (9-3, 5-2 BIG EAST) won the BIG EAST Conference Championship for the third time in four years when it defeated Connecticut (5-7, 3-4 BIG EAST), 35-27.

The defense was the story all afternoon, which recorded 13 tackles for loss and six sacks. Senior linebacker JK Schaffer led with 11 tackles, giving him 104 for the season, while senior defensive tackle Derek Wolfe has 10 tackles, a career-best 5.0 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks. The defense scored two touchdowns against the Huskies, bringing its season total to six.

On the offensive side, sophomore quarterback Munchie Legaux and sophomore wide receiver Anthony McClung finished with career highs. Legaux completed 15-of-35 passes for a career-best 217 yards and three touchdowns, while McClung had a career-high 142 yards and two touchdowns on eight catches.

On the Huskies opening possession, two penalties pinned the visitors as their own five-yard line. Faced with third-down, Stewart took the ball directly from quarterback Johnny McEntee's hands in the end zone to give the hosts the early 7-0 lead less than five minutes into the game.

The UC defense continued to dominate, this time by way of junior safety Drew Frey, who picked off McEntee and ran it in for his first career touchdown to give the Bearcats the 14-0 lead with just over one minute remaining in the first quarter.

The offense followed suit on its next possession, as Legaux marched his team down the field in a six-play, 58-yard drive, capped by a 22-yard touchdown to freshman wide receiver Alex Chisum to increase the Cincinnati lead, 21-0, with 13:13 left in the half.

UC kept rolling as Legaux connected with McClung three times on its next possession, including a 13-yard touchdown pass to make it 28-3 with less than two minutes remaining.

The teams exchanged possession before Connecticut concluded the half with a 46-yard field goal to make the score 28-6 heading into the locker room.

MEMPHIS, Tenn. - University of Cincinnati Head Coach Butch Jones rang the bell on the AutoZone Liberty Bowl trophy, eager to get the Bearcats' party started.

Isaiah Pead ran for 149 yards and a TD, and Ralph David Abernathy IV's 90-yard kickoff return early in the fourth quarter put Cincinnati ahead to stay as the Bearcats edged Vanderbilt 31-24.

The Bearcats (10-3) capped the season with their third straight victory by snapping a twogame skid in bowl games. It was their first bowl win since downing Southern Miss in the 2007 PapaJohns.com Bowl. They also notched their fourth 10-win season in the past five years, bouncing back from 4-8 in 2010 during Jones' first season.

The Commodores led 21-17 when Abernathy became the first Cincinnati player to return a kickoff for a TD in the program's 13 bowl appearances.

Abernathy is the grandson of the civil rights leader who was in Memphis with Martin Luther King when he was assassinated in 1968 at the Lorraine Motel, a few miles away from the Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium.

Vandy's Archibald Barnes blocked Tony Miliano's 39-yard field goal with 3:58 left, giving the Commodores the ball with plenty of time to go ahead. Nick Temple picked off Larry Smith's pass with 3:15 remaining, and Pead sealed the victory with a 12-yard TD run with 1:52 left.

Pead was the game's MVP, and the senior finally got to celebrate a bowl win.

George Winn also scored on a 69-yard TD run when he replaced Pead, while the BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Year got his helmet fix. Jones credited equipment manager Todd McMinn as an unsung hero with Winn scoring on the longest run of his career.

Zach Collaros completed one of the more remarkable comebacks in college football, starting under center 47 days following surgery to correct a broken right ankle on Nov. 14. Collaros threw a touchdown pass and was 12 of 29 for 80 yards passing, moving around well.

The Bearcats led 14-7 at halftime and couldn't take advantage of two Vanderbilt turnovers in the third quarter. J.K. Schaffer was UC's defensive MVP, finishing with nine tackles, including one for a loss and a sack.


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
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# **HISTORY & RECORDS**

#### BEARCATS FOOTBALL HISTORY







The University of Cincinnati football team, under the direction of third-year head coach Butch Jones will play its 125th season of football in 2012.

The Bearcats program dates to 1885 and ranks as one of the 10 oldest in major college football and following a 10-3 campaign in 2011, holds an all-time mark of 561-553-51.

UC has won three of the past four BIG EAST Championships, played in a bowl game in five of the past six seasons and won 55 games over the last six years, the most among current members of the BIG EAST Conference.

In 2010, UC reached as high as No. 3 in all three major polls (Associated Press, USA Today, Bowl Championship Series).

UC's football program is one of the nation's oldest - only Rutgers (1869), Michigan (1879), Navy (1880), and Minnesota (1883), among NCAA Division I institutions, predate Cincinnati, which began the sport in 1885.

UC has been involved in several historic college football milestones starting with Dec. 8, 1888. That day, the Bearcats and Miami (Ohio) University engaged in the first college football game played in the state of Ohio, launching a rivalry that is tied for the oldest in the game among major universities — North Carolina vs. Wake Forest began playing that same year. The Battle for the Victory Bell is the fifth-most played rivalry series in college football.

A few years later in 1897, UC received an invitation to visit New Orleans to play a football game as a reward for a successful season. The game was a precursor to the current postseason football bowl games.

In the 1930s, a UC football player wore a device with his helmet to protect his broken nose. The device was a forerunner of the now standard face mask. The first soccer-style place kick was also attempted by a Bearcat, Hank Hartong, in the early 1960s.

Coaching luminaries have patrolled the sidelines at Cincinnati. College Football Hall of Fame coach Frank Cavanaugh began his 24-season career at UC. Sid Gillman, a member of the College and NFL Halls of Fame, was the architect of one of the top eras of Cincinnati football history. He directed the Bearcats to three conference titles and a pair of bowl game appearances during his six seasons (1949-54) before leaving for the professional ranks. Cincinnati, with Gillman developing the passing offenses which would make him successful in the pro ranks, became known for its aerial attack in the early 1950s. That notoriety continued long after his departure.

In 1968, the Bearcats were the nation's top passing team with quarterback Greg Cook leading the NCAA in total offense, while receiver/kicker Jim O'Brien captured the national scoring title. A year later, Cook earned Rookie of the Year honors as a Cincinnati Bengal, and two years later, O'Brien kicked the game-winning field goal for the Baltimore Colts in Super Bowl V.

With more than 100 players advancing into the professional ranks and nine earning Super Bowl wins, 41 earning all-America honors, and 11 garnering academic all-America recognition, Cincinnati football has clearly made an important impact on college football with its long history of accomplishments.

- >> **BOWL-CATS** Cincinnati has been to nine bowl games over the last 12 seasons and 13 in the program's 124 seasons. UC played in the first Bowl Championship Series game in school history, taking on Virginia Tech in the 75th FedEx Orange Bowl on Jan. 1, 2009.
- >> **ALL-AMERICA TRADITION** Forty-one Bearcats have earned All-America recognition. Mike Woods garnered first-team honors in 1977, earning him an appearance on Bob Hope's television special. Punter Kevin Huber became the first two-time First-Team Associated Press all-American in UC history when he earned the honor in 2007 and 2008.
- >> "THE TOE" Jonathan Ruffin received the Lou Groza Award as the nation's top kicker in 2000 after booting a record 26 field goals. He was presented the award by ESPN's Chris Fowler. Ruffin was also a consensus all-American that year.
- >> TROPHY GAMES The Bearcats are involved in three trophy games. Cincinnati's annual clash with the Miami RedHawks is the nation's eighth-oldest and 11th longest running rivalry in NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision. The winner of the yearly fall battle claims the Victory Bell. The winner of the UC-Louisville contest takes home the Keg of Nails, while the winner of the UC-Pittsburgh game stakes claim to the recently created River City Rivalry Trophy. UC currently holds all three trophies.
- >> UPSET CATS UC football has been dangerous to top teams over the years, knocking off the likes of No. 8 Wisconsin, 17-12, at home in 1999, going to defending national champion Penn State in 1983 and upending the Nittany Lions, 14-3, and dominating Virginia Tech, 16-0, in 1995 while allowing just 41 yards of offense. However, possibly the biggest upset in UC history came in 2006 as the Bearcats beat its highest-ranked opponent in Nippert Stadium history, blowing away then-No. 7 Rutgers, 30-11.
- >> CHAMPIONSHIP FOOTBALL With a 47-18 record since the 2007 season, the Bearcats have become relevant on the national stage once again. In 2008, UC claimed the BIG EAST Conference title, the school's first outright conference crown since 1946. The Bearcats climbed as high as No. 12 in the Associated Press, and USA Today Top 25 polls on the way to a school-record 11 wins. In 2009, UC set a school-record with 12 wins, finished No. 3 in the final Bowl Championship Series rankings, won its second-straight BIG EAST crown, and played in the Allstate Sugar Bowl. The Bearcats played in four straight bowl games for the first time in school history. In 2011, UC won its third BIG EAST crown in four years and finished ranked in both the final Associated Press and USA Today Coaches polls.

#### **BEARCATS FOOTBALL HISTORY**

- **1885** UC fielded its first football team under the organization of Arch Carson, who served as the first coach. The team won a pair of games over a club from neighboring Mt. Auburn.
- 1888 Cincinnati and Miami faced off in Oxford for the first college football game in the state of Ohio. The game ended in a scoreless tie but launched a rivalry that is tied for the honors of being the oldest among major college schools.
- 1897 Following a 7-1-1 season--the lone loss was to the fabled Carlisle Indians--Cincinnati was invited to celebrate New Years in New Orleans and play a contest against the host Southern Athletic Club. A day after their victory, the Bearcats accepted a challenge from LSU and also defeated the Tigers.
- 1898 Frank Cavanaugh, immortalized as the Iron Major, began his head coaching career at Cincinnati. He was elected to the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame at the conclusion of his illustrious career.
- 1901 Cincinnati played its first home game at the current site of Nippert Stadium, defeating Hanover, 18-0.
- 1912 Cincinnati scored a school-record 124 points in a shutout win over Transylvania. Ike Stewart and Bob Heuck each tallied six TDs and Alonzo Wells kicked 12 PATs, all UC records.
- 1914 Cincinnati teams first used the nickname Bearcats.
- 1915 Construction began on permanent stadium seating and facilities.
- 1922 George McLauren, another UC mentor to be elected to the College Football Hall of Fame, began his four-season tenure as UC's head coach.
- 1923 Nippert Stadium was the site of the first night football game in the Midwest as Cincinnati defeated Kentucky Wesleyan, 17-0. In the season-ending game vs. Miami, Jimmy Nippert sustained a spike wound and died a month later of blood poisoning. His grandfather, James Gamble, donated the money needed to finish the stadium construction.
- 1924 Nippert Stadium was dedicated.
- 1933 UC won the first of two straight Buckeye Athletic Association titles.
- 1934 UC played its first Homecoming game, defeating Marshall, 7-0.
- 1935 The Bearcats' first NFL players, Bill Feldhaus (Detroit) and Ray Nolting (Chicago), lead UC to a 7-2 record before embarking on their nro careers.
- 1942 UC hosted No. 2 Georgia at Nippert Stadium. The Bulldogs won, 35-13, and won the Rose Bowl a few months later. The other lone blemish on UC's 8-2 record was to Sugar Bowl victor Tennessee.
- 1943-44 Football suspended due to World War II.
- 1946 Cincinnati defeated defending Big 10 Conference champion Indiana in the season opener en route to a 9-2 record. The season was capped by the Bearcats' first bowl appearance. UC defeated Virginia Tech. 18-6. in the Sun Bowl.
- 1947 UC won its first Mid-American Conference championship. The Bearcats won four crowns in their six-year association with the league.
- 1949 Sid Gillman took over as head coach and promptly piloted UC to a Mid-American Conference title and a win over Toledo in the Glass Bowl. Tom O'Malley's 1,617 passing yards led the nation.
- 1950 The Bearcats advanced to the Sun Bowl but are edged by West Texas State, 14-13.

- **1951** UC posted an all-time best record of 10-1. Gene Rossi and Bob Stratton became the first Bearcats to earn all-America recognition.
- **1953** Cincinnati led the nation in both total offense (409.5 yards per game) and total defense (184.3), a feat accomplished by only three other teams in college football history.
- **1954** Sid Gillman left for the Los Angeles Rams after directing UC to an 8-2 ledger. In six seasons under the eventual college and pro hall of fame coach, the Bearcats posted a 50-13-1 record and won three Mid-American Conference titles.
- **1956** UC led the nation in punt return average, averaging 17.7 yards per
- 1959 Dave Canary became the first of 11 Bearcats to earn academic all-America honors. Canary eschewed pro football possibilities to pursue a successful acting career and became a regular in several TV series. Teammates Jack Lee and Jim Leo were named MVP of the Senior Bowl and College All-Star games, respectively.
- **1963-64** Cincinnati won back-to-back Missouri Valley Conference titles under Chuck Studley, who went on to become head coach of the Houston Oilers. UC compiled a 14-6 record during those two seasons.
- 1968 Cincinnati led the nation in passing offense, averaging 335.8 yards per game. Greg Cook led the nation in total offense, amassing 3,210 yards, while receiver/kicker Jim O'Brien was the nation's leading scorer with 142 points.
- **1970** Bob Bell became the second Bearcat in as many seasons to be a first-round selection in the NFL Draft.
- 1976 Cincinnati defeated Arizona State and Vanderbilt en route to a 9-2 ledger. Co-Captain Mike Woods earned first-team all-America honors and was a second-round draft pick by the Baltimore Colts.
- **1983** UC opened the season with a 14-3 upset of defending national champion Penn State at Beaver Stadium.
- 1985 The Bearcats upset a pair of 1984 bowl teams, Virginia Tech and Boston College.
- **1986** UC hosted the No. 1 Miami Hurricanes at Nippert Stadium. The Hurricanes validated its ranking with a 45-13 win.
- 1992 Nippert Stadium reopened to full use following an extensive renovation. The Bearcats hosted No. 8 Penn State in the season opener, and nearly pulled off the upset before falling, 24-20.
- 1995 Robert Tate led the nation in kickoff return average, averaging 34.3 yards on 15 returns. Tate was named both Offensive and Special Teams MVP in Conference USA.
- **1996** Cincinnati began competition in Conference USA. The Bearcats posted back-to-back crowds of 30,729 for Kentucky and 30,887 for Miami University, breaking the old stadium attendance record.
- 1997 Cincinnati ended a draught of 47 seasons without a bowl game appearance when it was selected to play in the inaugural Humanitarian Bowl. The Bearcats defeated Utah State, 35-19, to finish the year at 8-4.
- 1999 Cincinnati upset No. 8 Wisconsin, 17-12 in Nippert Stadium.
- **2000** UC won five of its last six games to finish second in Conference USA and earn a bid to play Marshall in the Motor City Bowl. Jonathan Ruffin became a first consensus first-team all-America choice and received the 2000 Lou Groza Award after leading the nation in field goals.

- 2001 The Bearcats opened the season against No. 25 Purdue in front of a sellout Nippert Stadium crowd. UC won its first four league games en route to a second-place finish in Conference USA and second straight trip to the Motor City Bowl. Quarterback Gino Guidugli is named the C-USA Freshman of the Year after setting school and league freshman records by throwing for 2,573 yards and 16 touchdowns.
- **2002** Cincinnati set school and Conference USA single-game attendance marks when 66,319 packed Paul Brown Stadium to see UC play eventual national champion Ohio State. UC won its final five league games to claim a share of the C-USA title, its first league championship since 1964. Quarterback Gino Guidugli threw for 3,543 yards, one of five season records set by the sophomore. UC earned a bowl bid for a record third straight year, playing in the New Orleans Bowl.
- 2004 The Bearcats recovered from a 2-4 start to win five of their last six games, including a convincing 52-24 victory over No. 21 Southern Miss. UC was selected for the Fort Worth Bowl where the Bearcats defeated Marshall, 32-14.
- 2005 Cincinnati began play in the BIG EAST Conference
- 2006 The Bearcats posted a 7-5 regular-season mark, playing a schedule that featured five teams ranked in the Top 10 at the time they faced UC. After a couple of near misses against those ranked foes, UC downed No. 7 Rutgers, 30-11, before a national television audience. Cincinnati earned a berth in the inaugural International Bowl in Toronto, Ont. The UC squad earned a 27-24 win over Western Michigan.
- 2007 The program equaled the school single-season record for wins, posting a 10-3 record and earning a No. 17 ranking in the final Associated Press poll. It marked the first time UC ended the season among the nation's Top 25 programs. Three Bearcats earned all-America honors, including punter Kevin Huber, who was the school's second consensus selection.
- 2008 The Bearcats had a banner season that included 11 wins, the program's first BIG EAST Conference Championship, a final ranking of No. 17 in both the Associated Press and USA Today Top 25 polls, and a Bowl Championship Series appearance in the 75th FedEx Orange Bowl on Jan. 1, 2009. Five UC players earned all-America honors while punter Kevin Huber became the first two-time First Team Associated Press all-America selection in school history.
- 2009 Cincinnati ran off a school-record 12-straight wins, achieved a best-ever ranking of No. 3 in the country (AP/USA Today/BCS) and won is second-straight BIG EAST Conference Championship before falling to Florida in the 2010 Allstate Sugar Bowl. Wide receiver Mardy Gilyard re-wrote parts of the UC record book on the way to earning AFCA First-Team All-America honors.
- 2010 In 2010, the Bearcats led the BIG EAST in scoring offense (27.1 ppg), total offense (417.3 ypg), passing offense (260.7 ypg), first downs (21.9 pg), third-down conversions (45.6 pct.), and touchdown passes (27). Wide receiver Armon Binns and quarterback Zach Collaros were both First-Team All-BIG EAST selections while five other teammates earned All-BIG EAST honors. Nineteen players were named Academic All-BIG EAST and John Goebel earned the 2010 American Eagle Outfitters BIG EAST Football Scholar-Athlete of the Year award.
- 2011 UC was the most improved NCAA FBS AQ team in 2011, finishing with a 10-3 mark, a Top-25 final ranking, winning its third BIG EAST Conference title in four years and knocking off SEC foe Vanderbilt in the 2011 AutoZone Liberty Bowl, the program's first bowl win over a BCS opponent. Eight student-athletes earned All-BIG EAST accolades in 2011, including BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Year Isaiah Pead and BIG EAST Co-Defensive Player of the Year Derek Wolfe. Wolfe, a senior defensive tackle, earned spots on five All-America teams and IK Schaffer was named the 2011 American Eagle Outfitters BIG EAST Football Scholar-Athlete of the Year.







#### **BEARCATS COACHING LEGACY**







The University of Cincinnati has been well-represented on the lists of professional and college coaching greats, a legacy which continues into 2012 with a proliferation of former Bearcats mentors, assistant coaches and players in the NFL, CFL and major university ranks.

Sid Gillman has long been the standard-bearer for Bearcat coaching greats. Gillman, whose 50-13-1 record in his six seasons in the late 1940s and early 1950s is one of the winningest marks at UC, is one of the few coaches to earn induction into both the college and professional football halls of fame. His UC success vaulted him into the NFL, with the Los Angeles Rams.

Two other members of the College Football Hall of Fame, Frank Cavanaugh, George Little, launched their head coaching careers at UC. Cavanaugh, the legendary "Iron Major" for his accomplishments as a coach and war hero at Army, in 1898, and Little, who earned fame at Michigan and Wisconsin, in 1914-15. Former UC assistants Dick MacPherson and Don Nehlen are also in the College Football Hall of Fame. MacPherson, a UC assistant in the early 1960s, concluded a distinguished career at Syracuse. Nehlen, on the 1963 UC staff, was West Virginia's winningest coach following his 21 seasons there.

One-time Bearcat mentors Homer Rice (1967-68), and Chuck Studley (1961-66) were NFL head coaches at Cincinnati and Houston, respectively, as were former assistants Leeman Bennett (Atlanta) and Jack Faulkner (Denver).

Nick Skorich, a member of the UC Athletic Hall of Fame for his football prowess in the 1940s, was head coach of the Philadelphia Eagles and Cleveland Browns.

Twenty-seven former UC players or assistants went on to head coaching jobs in the college or NFL ranks and a trio of former Bearcats assistants, John Harbaugh (Baltimore Ravens), Rex Ryan (New York Jets), and Mike Tomlin (Pittsburgh Steelers) are current NFL head coaches. Harbaugh was a UC assistant from 1989-96, Ryan from 1996-97, and Tomlin was on the UC staff from 1999-2000.

Both Harbaugh and Tomlin have assistants on their staff with UC ties. Amos Jones (1999-2002) is an assistant special teams coach in Pittsburgh. Jerry Rosburg (1992-95) serves on Harbaugh's staff in Baltimore as the Assistant Head Coach/Special Teams and has coached in the NFL for over 10 years. Don Martindale (1997-98), a former UC defensive line coach, joined the Ravens staff in 2012 coaching the inside linebackers and senior offensive assistant Craig Ver Steeg was on the UC staff from 1990-93 and has coached nearly 30 years at all levels of football.

The Cleveland Browns staff features two former UC letterwinners in linebackers coach Bill Davis (1985-88) and offensive line coach George Warhop (1981-82). Davis is in his 18th season as an NFL assistant, previously serving as defensive coordinator for the Arizona Cardinals and San Francisco 49ers. Warhop, a center during his time at UC, has coached in the NFL for 16 seasons during stints for the Browns, Arizona Cardinals, Dallas Cowboys, and St. Louis Rams.

Bob Wylie has four decades of coaching football under his belt that includes 18 years at the professional level. He coached at UC in the mid 1990s and spent time as the Oakland Raiders offensive line coach. He currently works for Blesto and is consulting with EA Sports on the Madden Football video game franchise.

Former UC offensive line coach Larry Zierlein (1997-2000) recently wrapped up a 40-year coaching career that included nearly 10 years in the NFL and a win in Super Bowl XLII I with the Pittsburgh Steelers in 2008.

Former UC aide Bill Sheridan (1989-91) is defensive coordinator for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers while Tracy Rocker (1997) enters his second season with the Tennessee Titans after a storied collegiate career that included a stint with 2010 National Champion Auburn. Former linebackers coach William Inge (2008-09) is in his first season as an assistant defensive line coach with the Buffalo Bills.

Former defensive coordinator Mark Duffner (1977-80) was a collegiate head coach at Holy Cross and Maryland before coaching in the NFL for the Cincinnati Bengals and Green Bay Packers. He is currently the Jacksonville Jaguars linebackers coach.

In Canada, former Bearcats player and coach Dave Ritchie directed British Columbia and Winnepeg to Grey Cup titles, the Canadian Football League's Super Bowl, and former UC quarterback Danny Barrett spent six years as the head coach of the Saskatchewan Roughriders (2000-06). Barrett is now the running backs coach at UCF.

UC's representation in the college coaching ranks is highlighted by a trio of former assistants. Paul Dietzel, an aide to Gillman in 1949-50, directed LSU to the national title in 1958 and later coached at Army and South Carolina. Other UC assistants to garner head coaching positions include Foge Fazio (Pittsburgh), Mark Duffner (Holy Cross, Maryland), Chuck Stobart (Toledo, Utah, Memphis), Lou West (Indiana State) and Ron Zook (Florida, Illinois).

Joe Morrison, a standout as a Bearcats player and later for the New York Giants in the NFL, achieved similar success during his 15 seasons as a major college head coach. Urban Meyer, a Bearcat in the mid-1980s and later a student assistant coach, carved out an impressive career at Florida following successful stints at Bowling Green and Utah, spent a year as a college football analyst for ESPN and is now the head coach at Ohio State.

Eight former UC assistants are current head coaches at the collegiate level, including Rick Christophel (Austin Peay), Dan Enos (Central Michigan), Jeff Filkovski (Marietta College), Jimbo Fisher (Florida State), Joker Phillips (Kentucky), Charley Molnar (Massachusetts), Don Treadwell (Miami OH) and Jeff Quinn (Buffalo).

Fisher has a pair of former Bearcats on his Florida State staff in Greg Hudson (Assistant Head Coach/Defense Florida State) and Eddie Gran (Associate Head Coach/Special Teams Coordinator/RB),

Several former UC assistants are coordinators at NCAA FBS schools including former UC letterwinner Dana Bible (Offensive Coordinator NC State), Tim Banks (Illinois Defensive Coordinator), Bob Diaco (Defensive Coordinator Notre Dame), Pat Narduzzi (Defensive Coordinator Michigan State) and Joe Tresey (Defensive Coordinator Youngstown State).

Tom Rossley, who set many UC receiving records, spent nearly four decades in the coaching ranks at the college and NFL levels, including a stint as head coach at SMU and six seasons as the offensive coordinator for the Green Bay Packers. He most recently was the quarterbacks coach at Texas A&M.

Former assistant Harry Hiestand (1987-93) spent five years with the Chicago Bears and now serves as the offensive line coach at Notre Dame.



Bearcats edged Vanderbilt 31-24 ... Zach Collaros completed one of the more remarkable comebacks in college football, starting under center 47 days following surgery to



incinnati's proud bowl history includes a number of firsts, possibly including the first postseason bowl game.

The Bearcats, according to records, played a pair of postseason games in 1897 against the Southern Athletic Club and Louisiana State University.

In recent years, UC's postseason destinations have taken them to Texas, Canada, Alabama, Miami, and New Orleans.

The Bearcats have played the part of college football vagabond over the years, spending 65 seasons as an independent with no bowl tie ins.

Since joining Conference USA in 1996, UC has played in nine postseason games, including a pair of Bowl Championship Series contests in 2009 and 2010.

The Bearcats are 6-6 all-time in 12 postseason appearances and are 3-2 in their last five bowls.

The post-World War II influx of veterans into colleges rejuvenated college athletics, and with that came a surge of new bowls. Cincinnati capped a successful 1946 season with a trip to the Sun Bowl in El Paso, Texas. There, the Bearcats defeated Virginia Tech, 18-6.

UC made appearances in the Glass Bowl in Toledo in 1949 and returned to the Sun Bowl at the end of the 1950 campaign.

After 47 years without a bowl appearance, Cincinnati's drought was broken when the Bearcats played in the inaugural Humanitarian Bowl in Boise, Idaho in 1997.

With Conference USA developing alliances with five bowls, the Bearcats made three straight bowl appearances in 2000, 2001 and 2002—the first two in the Motor City Bowl in Detroit and the third in the New Orleans Bowl.

In 2004, UC was selected to represent Conference USA in the PlainsCapital Fort Worth Bowl, the teams' fourth bowl appearance in five years. UC defeated Marshall, 32-14, in that contest.

In 2006, Cincinnati earned its first BIG EAST Conference bowl appearance after knocking off Connecticut in the season finale. In unusual circumstances following Mark Dantonio and his staff's departure to Michigan State before the bowl game, UC hired Brian Kelly from Central Michigan who came in and in just 34 days prepared UC and defeated Western Michigan University, 27-24, in the inaugural International Bowl in Toronto, Ontario.

Following an impressive 9-3 regular season in 2007 - which included three wins against top-25 opponents, the Bearcats had the opportunity to face former Conference USA foe Southern Mississippi in the Papajohns.com Bowl, in Birmingham, Ala. Victory number 10, a 31-21 win at Legion Field, marked just the second 10-win season in Bearcats history (UC's 1951 squad finished 10-1).

In addition, the Bearcats were ranked No. 17 in the final AP poll, the first time in school history.

With the move to the BIG EAST Conference, a Bowl

Championship Series league, doors have opened for UC to play in some of the game's most prestigious bowls and the Bearcats have taken advantage of those opportunities, participating in a pair of BCS games over the past three seasons.

On the heels of 11 wins in 2008 and UC's first BIG EAST Championship, the Bearcats earned a spot in the 75th FedEx Orange Bowl, their first New Year's Day Bowl appearance since 1951 against Virginia Tech from the Atlantic Coast Conference.

The Bearcats followed up their 2008 successes by winnings their second-straight BIG EAST Championship in 2009 after a perfect 12-0 regular season. Climbing to No. 3 in the final Bowl Championship Series rankings, UC earned a spot in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl against the Florida Gators, coached by UC alum Urban Meyer.

Cincinnati put together a 10-3 season in 2011, capped by a BIG EAST Conference Championship and AutoZone Liberty Bowl Trophy when it beat Vanderbilt, 31-24. It was UC's fourth 10-win season in the past five years.

#### A BOWL HISTORY NUGGET ...

While the NCAA Official Football Records recognizes the Rose Bowl, started in 1902, as being the first collegiate bowl game, former UC athletic director Bill Schwarberg points to a bowl appearance by Cincinnati that pre-dates the Rose Bowl by five years.

Citing a record in the University's McMicken Review, Schwarberg indicated that following the 1897 season, Cincinnati was in fact the first institution from Ohio to make a trip south to play in a postseason game.

Cincinnati posted a 7-1-1 record that year, which included a 34-0 win over Ohio State. The lone team to beat UC was the powerful Carlisle Indians.

Shortly after Thanksgiving a travel party of 14, which included the substitutes and the coach and manager, departed for New Orleans to play a game there on New Year's Day. Hosted by the Southern Athletic Club, accounts of the game have UC winning with ease by a score of 16-0.

At a victory party that evening, players from Louisiana State challenged the Bearcats to a game the next day in Baton Rouge.

UC accepted the challenge and overwhelmed the LSU team, 28-0.

If this was indeed UC's first bowl game, it was 49 years before the Bearcats again experienced postseason play.

niversity of Cincinnati Head Coach Butch Jones rang the bell on the AutoZone Liberty Bowl trophy, eager to get the Bearcats' party started.

Isaiah Pead ran for 149 yards and a TD, and Ralph David Abernathy IV's 90-yard kickoff return early in the fourth quarter put Cincinnati ahead to stay as the Bearcats edged Vanderbilt 31-24.

The Bearcats (10-3) capped the season with their third straight victory by snapping a two-game skid in bowl games. They also notched their fourth 10-win season in the past five years, bouncing back from 4-8 in 2010 during Jones' first season.

But the 2011 BIG EAST Conference co-champs had to work to put away Vanderbilt (6-7), a team that tied for fourth in the Southeastern Conference's East Division, despite forcing three turnovers and coming up with two sacks. The Commodores led 21-17 when Abernathy became the first Cincinnati player to return a kickoff for a TD in the program's 13 bowl appearances.

Abernathy is the grandson of the civil rights leader who was in Memphis with Martin Luther King when he was assassinated in 1968 at the Lorraine Motel, a few miles away from the Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium.

Pead was the game's MVP, and J.K. Schaffer was UC's defensive MVP, finishing with nine tackles, including one for a loss and a sack.

#### **2010 ALLSTATE SUGAR BOWL**

No. 5 Florida 51, No. 3 Cincinnati 24 Jan. 1, 2010 • New Orleans, La.

he University of Cincinnati football team, reeling from the resignation of former head coach Brian Kelly, saw its perfect season blemished with a loss to Florida in the 2010 Allstate Sugar Bowl.

Tim Tebow threw for a career-high 482 yards and three touchdowns, ran for 51 yards and another score, and fifth-ranked Florida (13-1) overwhelmed No. 4 Cincinnati (12-1) 51-24 inside the Louisiana Superdome.

Cincinnati, who donned white helmets for the game for the first time since 1966, was playing in its second straight BCS game. Kelly resigned in early December to take the head coaching job at Notre Dame.

Quarterback Tony Pike completed 27 of 45 passes for 170 yards and three scores, all in the second half when the outcome was no longer in doubt.

UC was held to a season low 246 yards of total offense, including a season low 170 passing yards by the Gators defense.

Mardy Gilyard finished the game with seven receptions, giving him 204 career receptions which ties Dominick Goodman and LaDaris Vann as the UC record holders in career catches.

Florida finished with a Sugar Bowl-record 659 yards of total offense

Mardy Gilyard had 255 all-purpose yards and a touchdown catch, but it was not enough as No. 21 Virginia Tech knocked off No. 12 Cincinnati, 20-7, in the 75th FedEx Orange Bowl.

Gilyard had seven receptions for 158 yards and a touchdown, along with 97 kickoff return yards for Cincinnati (11-3), which had its sixgame winning streak snapped. Tony Pike threw for 239 yards and a touchdown, but had his night marred by four interceptions and getting stopped on a fourth-and-goal in the fourth quarter.

The Bearcats took the opening kickoff, sent their spread offense onto the field, and made the Hokies look very confused. Pike found Gilyard for a 38-yard pickup on the third play from scrimmage, and they hooked up for a spectacular 15-yard touchdown three plays later.

Facing a third-and-9 from the right hash, Pike waited before lofting a fade to the far left of the end zone. Gilyard took off on a sprint, made a diving catch as he sailed out of bounds and managed to just barely drag his right toe on the turf painted in Virginia Tech's colors for a 7-0 UC lead.

The Hokies defense held UC to 137 yards, stifled the Bearcats running game (eight carries, 11 yards) over the remainder of the half, and battled their way to a 10-7 lead by intermission.

Darren Evans, the game's MVP, had 28 carries for 153 yards and a

Terrill Byrd led the UC defense with 11 tackles, including 10 solo stops, four tackles for a loss, and a sack, Brandon Underwood had six tackles, including a sack and an interception.

**B**en Mauk shrugged off mistakes and Southern Miss defenders, helping No. 20 Cincinnati make another entry in an impressive season.

The hard-to-tackle Mauk passed for 334 yards and four touchdowns, and DeAngelo Smith intercepted three passes, leading the Bearcats to a 31-21 victory over Southern Miss in the Papajohns.com

The victory gave UC (10-3) its second 10-win season and first since 1951, virtually assuring a spot in the final rankings for the first time.

Mauk, the game's most valuable player, completed 30-of-52 passes and overcame three interceptions to become only the third Bearcats player to have a 3,000-yard passing season.

Mauk, who also rushed for 41 yards and frequently broke loose from defenders to make plays, threw three touchdown passes during an 8-minute span extending into the second half.

Cincinnati stopped punter Britt Barefoot on a fake punt on fourthand-1 from his own 29 and Mauk hit Earnest Jackson for a 29-yard TD strike on the next play for a 21-7 lead. Mauk struck again with a 10-yarder to Antwuan Giddens and set up a 22-yard field goal by Jake Rogers in the final seconds of the third quarter to put the Bearcats up 31-14.

Young cut into the lead again with a 5-yard touchdown pass to Chris Johnson but Southern Miss could not recover an onside kick or convert a fourth-and-1 play on its next possession.

Dominick Goodman was named the game's Most Outstanding Player. Butler Benton led UC rushing attack with 62 of the team's combind 126 yards against the Broncos—a defense that was ranked fifth nationally defending the run.

John Bowie put UC on the scoreboard first when he gathered in a tipped pass and returned it 25 yards for a touchdown in the first quarter. On Cincinnati's next drive, Davila connected on a 21-yard TD toss to Goodman. Goodman later hauled in a second touchdown pass in the second quarter.

The Broncos' defense got the ball right back and Cubit tossed a 30-yard scoring pass to close the gap to 24-14. A miscue by the UC offense—Davila's pass was deflected and intercepted with 23 seconds to play in the half— setting up Nate Meyer's 29-yard field goal.

he Bearcats played in their first-ever bowl game in school history, earning an 18-6 victory over Virginia Tech in the 12th annual Sun

Both teams struggled offensively in the first half, due largely in part to the three inches of snow that fell in El Paso the day before

The Bearcat offense dominated play in the second half. UC outrushed the Gobblers, 369 to 34 for the game, scoring all three touchdowns on the ground.

After a scoreless first half, Cincinnati took the second half kickoff and drove 75 yards for the game's first score, a 13-yard run by sophomore Harold Johnson. After holding Virginia Tech to just three plays on offense in the next possession, the Bearcats regained possession and drove 52 yards for the second score, taking a 12-0 lead on junior fullback Hugo Sabato's one-yard run.

Virginia Tech cut the lead to 12-6 early in the fourth quarter when Ralph Beard capped off a 55-yard drive with a three-yard touchdown

Johnson emerged as the defensive leader for the Bearcats, intercepting a pass in the end zone late in the third quarter to stop a potential game-tying drive.

With time running out, Tech drove into Cincinnati territory, before Johnson made his second interception, returning it deep into Gobbler territory. Three plays later, Don McMillan scored on a quarterback sneak from three yards to provide the final margin.

Cincinnati finished the season with a 9-2 record, including wins over defending Big Nine champions Indiana and Michigan State.
