University of Hawaii to spend an extra \$500k on athletic stipends

The University of Hawaii is digging deeper into the school's \$4-million deficit with new cost-of-attendance numbers for student athletes. Hawaii plans to spend about a half a million dollars on cost-of-attendance stipends for student-athletes, which will be accepted by the NCAA.

The athletics department has money in its budget for stipends that will be given to student-athletes for the first time. How the stipends will be given is still being discussed.

"It really comes down to, how comprehensive is your plan going to be? Are you going to take care of all the programs at a lesser amount or invest more in a limited amount of programs?" said AD David Matlin.

Hawaii estimates to pay in full for the extra cost of attending, the stipend would be about \$4,000. With 248 student-athletes, that adds up to \$992,000.

Matlin also said, he expects to spend half of that number, possibly less. He's tilting toward offering under \$2,000, which would cost a total of \$496,000. Hawaii officials are hoping to get more funding through fundraisers and other related events. The school will decide how to divide the new stipends by the fall.

According to Barnes, there is no truth to reports of academic misconduct at Texas



Tennessee Men's Basketball Coach Rick Barnes feels very certain there will be no issue when it comes to the reports of academic misconduct while at the University of Texas. In early June, The Chronicle of Higher Education released an article citing three cases of alleged academic misconduct by three of Barnes' former Texas players. Monday was the first time Barnes addressed the allegations related to his previous school.

"I think the reason I haven't said anything about it is because, if you read the (Chronicle of Higher Education) article, from my point of view, there's no legs to it," Barnes said. "That's why. Again, I think Texas has said everything that's needed to be said. I'm sure they will proceed with whatever they think they have to do there. It was made clear I had no involvement in it, which I knew."

On June 16, The University of Texas announced an analysis of the academic services department. Gene Marsh, who is a former chairman of the NCAA infractions committee, came after the article reported that two former players received impermissible assistance from the academic department and one former player cheated on an exam. If the NCAA investigates the Longhorns and finds proof of academic dishonesty, Rick Barnes could face possible NCAA sanctions at Tennessee.

The University of Tennessee has had some bad luck lately with Men's Basketball and the NCAA. Donnie Tyndall was fired after just one season with the Volunteers. The NCAA cracked down on him for his misconduct at Southern Miss.

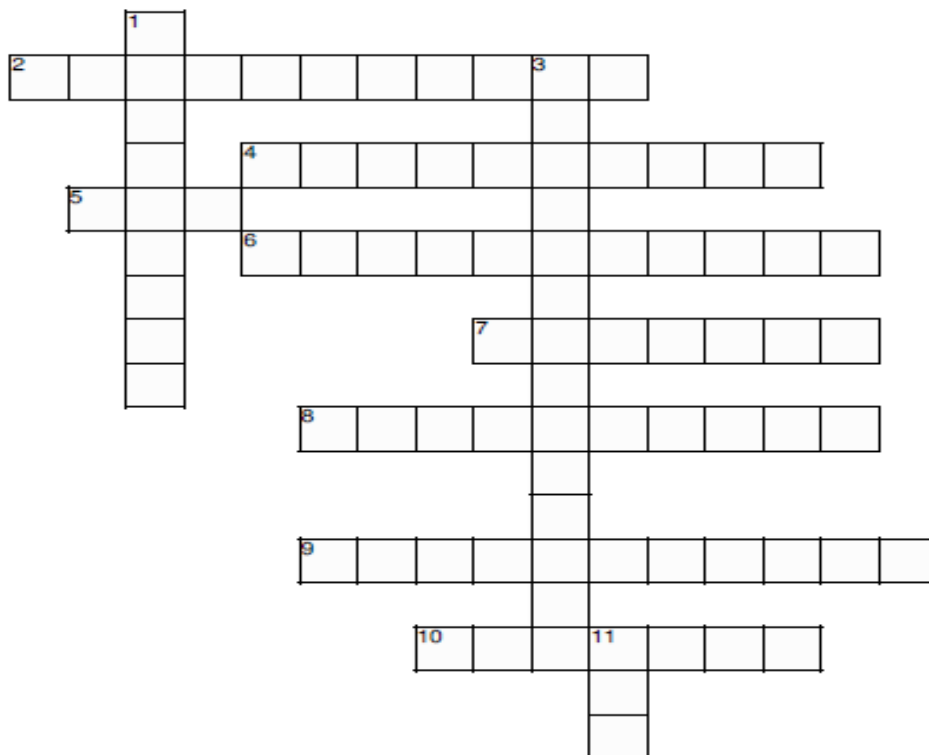

According to NCAA Bylaw 13.02.2.5, A dead period is a period of time when it is not permissible to make in-person recruiting contacts or evaluations on or off the institution's campus or to permit official or unofficial visits by prospective student-athletes to the institution's campus. It remains permissible, however, for an institutional staff member to write or telephone a prospective student-athlete during a dead period.

You can update your templates one of two ways:

Via Email to Support:

1. Send an email to support@jumpforward.com describing the overall look you would like for your template.
2. Attach the pictures you would like to use and any other graphic you would like to include to give the graphics design team as much information as possible.

Via the Support Tab:

1. Login to JF and along the top hover over SUPPORT.
2. Click on REQUEST NEW GRAPHIC.
3. Complete the form as completely as possible in order to give the graphics design team as much information as possible.
