NOW IT'S TIME FOR THE BREAKDOWN

The No. 25 University of Cincinnati football team heads to Houston, Texas for the first time since 2015, facing the Cougars at 3:30 p.m. ET in TDECU Stadium. The game will be televised by ESPN and air on 700 WLW AM. The Bearcats (4-1, 1-0 AAC) moved into the Top-25 this week, checking in at No. 25 in Associated Press poll. Houston is 2-3 (0-1 AAC) coming off a bye week with wins vs. Prairie View A&M and North Texas and losses to Oklahoma, Washington State and Tulane.

THE SERIES

Saturday marks the rekindling of a series which got started in 1957. Houston leads the all-time series 15-10 with a 10-4 edge in Houston. Cincinnati has won five of the last seven meetings, including two of three in Texas.

THE COACHES

LUKE FICKELL, the 2018 American Athletic Conference Coach of the Year, is in his third season at Cincinnati. The 42nd head coach in program history, Fickell took the reins in December 2016 after 15 years at his alma mater, Ohio State. A veteran of nearly 20 years in the FBS ranks, Fickell was a part of nine Big Ten Conference titles (seven as a coach, two as a player) and two national championship squads with 16 postseason games and 13 NFL Draft selections under his belt.

DANA HOLGORSEN is in his first season at Houston after spending the previous eight years as the head coach at West Virginia. The second-winningest coach in WVU history, he has a career mark of 63-44. Prior to his time at WVU, he was an OC at Oklahoma State, Houston and Texas Tech along with stops at Wingate, Mississippi College and Valdosta State.

STREAKS, STORYLINES, SIDEBARS ...

- · The Bearcats play their 132nd football season in 2019. UC's program dates to 1885 and is one of the 10 oldest in the NCAA FBS. UC has won a league title five times in the last 12 years and has played 10 bowl games in the past 13 years.
- UC has won four-straight American Athletic Conference FB Team Academic Excellence Awards in 2015, 2016, 2017 6 2018.
- Cincinnati was the only school in the country in 2018-19 to tally 11 football wins, including a bowl win, and earn 24 or more wins in baseball, men's and women's basketball and volleyball.
- UC, picked second in the AAC preseason media poll, had 11 wins a year ago, marking only the third time in program history the feat has been achieved (2008, 2009). The Bearcats returned more than 85% of the roster, over 5,000 yards of total offense, 10 of the Top-15 tacklers and 14 starters from the 2018 squad.
- The 2019 roster features players from 14 states and six countries with 72 hailing from Ohio and 26 from the Cincinnati area. Forty-five percent of the roster (53/117 players) is made up by freshmen and redshirt freshmen.
- UC will not play consecutive home or road games this season, the first time in the modern era it has occurred.
- UC is 15-3 since the start of the 2018 campaign and moved into the national rankings this week, sitting at No. 25 (AP).
- UC's 27-24 win over then No. 18/19 UCF was its first victory over a ranked team since 2012 and first at home since 2009.
- The win snapped UCF's streak of 19 consecutive wins over conference teams and the Knights' string of scoring 30 or more points in 31-straight games, the longest NCAA FBS streak since 1936.
- With the victory over UCF, UC posted its ninth-consecutive home win and sixth in a row at Nippert Stadium in AAC games.
- LB Jarell White and P James Smith earned AAC Defensive and Special Teams POTW, respectively. Smith dropped five punts inside the 20 and 4 inside the 10 while White had 7 tackles, a TFL, a forced fumble and a key 4th-quarter INT.
- QB Desmond Ridder has completed 62% of his passes and ranks No. 4 in the AAC in passing efficiency with a 144.2 rating.
- · UC's top three backs, Michael Warren II (4.7), Tavion Thomas (4.8), Gerrid Doaks (5.7) and Ryan Montgomery (5.4) all average over four ypc. Warren became the 13th UC player with 2,000-yards or more with his 133-yards against UCF.
- TE Josiah Deguara has a reception in 18-straight games and is UC's leading receiver with 17 rec. for 247 yds and three TDs. WR Alec Pierce has averaged 19.2 yards per catch on 15 receptions for 288 yards and two TDs.
 - The defense has rung up 36.0 tackles for a loss, 13.0 sacks and nine turnovers (5 interceptions & 4 fumble recoveries).
- · S Darrick Forrest leads the team in tackles with 42 stops. He had a career best 16 tackles against UCF.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Requests for official working media credentials should be directed to the UC Sports Communications Office. All requests should be received no later than noon, four days prior to the game. Visit the football page at GoBEARCATS. com to request credentials online. Season credentials will be available for pickup prior to the first game. No credentials will be mailed after Tuesday preceding the game. Thereafter, credentials may be picked up on gameday at the media will call located by gate 6.

SCOUTING PASSES

Professional scouts may obtain credentials through UC's Sports Communications Office. Scouts will be issued seating in the press box on a space-available basis.

SIDELINE PASSES

The University of Cincinnati follows NCAA guidelines regarding media representatives on the sidelines. Photographers and videographers are permitted to shoot between the 25-yard lines and the goal lines on both sidelines and behind the restraining line in the end zone.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

In an effort to become environmental friendly, UC will not print stats during the game with the exception of halftime boxes and postgame books. In-game stats can be found at Cincinnati.StatBroadcast.com. If you require printed stats, please alert a member of the UC atheltics communications staff at the end of each quarter and we will bring to you.

Pregame food service is available beginning approximately two hours prior to kickoff, while beverages are available throughout the contest. This service is provided as a courtesy to working media. In addition, concession areas are available within the stadium confines. Wireless internet is available in the press box at Nippert Stadium.

WEEKLY MEDIA LUNCHEON

UC holds a weekly media luncheon each Tuesday in the second floor Bob Goin Team Room of Richard E. Lindner Center. Lunch is served at 11:30 a.m., selected players are available for one-on-one interviews from 11:45-noon, and head coach Luke Fickell takes the podium at noon. Players will be made available at the discretion of the coaches.

PRACTICES

During a typical Saturday game week, media may interview players and coaches immediately following practice on Tuesday. Practice is generally closed to the public. Anyone hoping to observe practice should contact UC Sports Communications in advance. Failure to do so may result in an individual's removal from the venue. During regular-season practices, unless otherwise noted, still and television photographers will be allowed to shoot stretching and the first 20 minutes (four periods).

INTERNET POLICIES

Live updating of websites, blogs and social network feeds is not allowed during practices.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

The UC locker room will remain closed following all football games. Media should request players through UC Sports Communications during the fourth quarter. Media will be allowed to enter the field (for home games) late in the fourth quarter but will not be allowed to conduct interviews with UC football players on the field (home or away). Only the originating television and radio networks will be allowed to conduct interviews on the field.

There will be a 10-15 minute cooling off period between the end of the game and start of the postgame interview sessions. Coach Fickell will address the media in the designated interview area following home games. Players will be brought into the interview area as soon as possible.

Postgame availability on the road will be determined on gameday. Please see football contact Ryan Koslen for details.

AMERICAN ATHLETIC TELECONFERENCE

The American Athletic Conference will coordinate a weekly teleconference of the league's 12 head football coaches. Media members who wish to access the teleconference should contact Chuck Sullivan at the American Athletic Conference for the phone number. For those who are not able to participate during the live teleconference, an archive of Monday's call will be available on the American Athletic Conference website at www.TheAmerican.org, normally within an hour of the call's completion.

CONNECTION

 UC OL coach Ron Crook was on UH HC Dana Holgorsen's staff at West Virginia from 2013-16 along with UH assistants Shannon Dawson (2013-14) and Tyron Carrier (2016).

BECAUSE THE NIGHT

- UC's 27-24 win over then No. 18/19 UCF on Oct.
 4 was one for the books. The come-from-behind victory propelled UC into the national rankings, earning the No. 25 slot in the Associated Press poll.
- The win snapped UCF's streak of 19 consecutive wins over conference teams and the Knights' string of scoring 30 or more points in 31-straight games, the longest NCAA FBS streak since 1936.
- UC had the second-largest crowd (40,121) and largest student attendance (7,825) in stadium history.

WORLD WIDE FUNK

- LB Jarell White was all over the place during the win over UCF, earning AAC Defensive POTW honors.
- He totaled seven tackles, one for a loss, a forced fumble and interception. His interception came on UCF's first drive of the fourth quarter which saw the Knights driving deep into UC territory. White picked off a tipped ball at the UC 6-yard line which led to a 6:18 clock-killing drive to help close out the win. UC forced four turnovers and limited UCF's electric running attack to 3.0 yards per carry after they entered averaging 5.3 yards per rush.

SHOOT TO THRILL

- P James Smith put together one his best games of the season against UCF and was tabbed as the AAC Special Teams POTW.
- Smith punted eight times for an average of 40.0 yards per boot and a long kick of 50 yards. His true impact was in field position as he dropped five balls inside the 20-yard line and four inside the 10. UCF's Otis Anderson, who entered the game as the AAC's leading punt returner, was limited to two returns for six yards with six fair catches. Of the eight drives off UC punts, UCF started seven inside the 22-yard line.

KEEPING THE FAITH

- On the heels of its thrilling 27-24 win over then No. 18/19 UCF, UC moved into the national rankings, earning the No. 25 spot in the Associated Press poll.
- UC is No. 26 in the Amway/USA Today Coaches poll.
- UC was last ranked in the final polls of the 2018 season, checking in at No. 23 in the coaches poll and No. 24 in the AP poll following an 11-2 season. The team's last in-season ranking occurred entering week 11 of the 2018 campaign, when UC was No. 19 in the AP, No. 20 in the coaches poll along with the school's first appearance in the College Football Playoff rankings (No. 24).

THE ENCORE IS ROCKING

- UC has outscored its opponents by a 138-107 margin on the season, but the most compelling numbers come in the third quarter where the Bearcats hold a 55-17 edge after halftime.
- UC got an interception on UCLA's first drive of the third quarter and have forced punts on foes first post-halftime drive in the other four games this season.

TRUCK YEAH

- At the end of third quarter of the UCF game, Michael Warren II broke a run for 61 yards to bring his game total to 115 at the time.
- With that run, he broke the 2,000-yard rushing mark for his career, becoming the 13th player in Bearcats history to reach the milestone.
- Warren finished the night with 133 yards rushing, marking his second 100-yard rushing game of the season (vs. Miami).
- Warren also hit the century mark for the ninth time in his career, tying him for seventh on the program's alltime Top 10 ledger.
- Warren has 24 career rushing TDs and 26 overall TDs, ranking t-5th and t-6th in the record book, respectively.
 DeMarco McCleskey (1998-2002) (37 rush/41 total) leads both categories.

ANOTHER BRICK IN THE WALL

- In its four wins this season, the UC defense has been strong, holding opponents to an average of 16.2 points per game and 276.0 yards of total offense per game, 94.2 rushing and 181.8 passing.
- Offensively, UC has gone 16-of-20 in the red zone in its wins and has outscored opponents 114-38 since trailing Miami (OH) 10-0 after the first quarter of the 124th Battle for the Victory Bell on Sept. 14.

THE WRITING'S ON THE WALL

 TeamRankings.com lists UC's strength of schedule as No. 12 in the NCAA FBS behind Auburn, Stanford, Notre Dame, Ohio State, South Carolina, Michigan State, Michigan, Texas A&M, Northwestern, Oregon and Georgia.

CROWD CHANT

- The UCF game marked the fourth Nippert Stadium sellout since the 2015 renovation and expansion, the first under HC Luke Fickell and the first since Sept. 15, 2016, a Thursday night game against #6/#7 Houston
- The announced crowd of 40,121 is the second-highest called attendance in Nippert Stadium history behind the 40,140 against UConn October 24, 2015
- The student attendance of 7,825 was a stadium record

BLUE SKY MINE

- P James Smith had one his best games of the season against UCF, punting eight times for a 40.0 ypp average.
- Where Smith influenced the game was in field position, dropping five punts inside the 20 and four inside the 10.
- Smith was a finalist for the 2018 Ray Guy Award, a First-Team All-AAC selection and three-time All-America honoree (FWAA & Phil Steele - 2nd, AP - 3rd) in 2018.
- Smith averaged 46.6 yards per punt, ranking fourth in the NCAA FBS and setting the second-best punting season in UC history, just off Kevin Huber's school record mark of 46.9 ypp from 2007.
- Smith had a career-long kick of 72 yards at Temple, dropped 25 kicks inside the 20, had 16 boots of 50 yards or more and has only recorded two career touchbacks.
- Smith hails from Wangaratta, Australia, which is a mere 9,683 miles from Cincinnati. He grew up playing Australian Rules FB, is a product of Prokick Australia.

A CHANGE IS GONNA COME

• The 27-24 win over then No. 18/19 UCF is the first for the Bearcats over a ranked team since the 2012 season when Cincinnati downed #25 Virginia Tech, 27-24, in a neutral site game at FedEx Field in Landover, Maryland. UC had lost the previous 10 times against ranked foes between the VT and UCF games. The last time the Bearcats won a home game over a ranked foe came in 2009 when UC downed #23 West Virginia, 24-21.

KNIGHTS IN WHITE SATIN

- The UC defense did something not many teams have done to UCF and that is limit their points and yards.
- UCF entered the game averaging 49.0 points per contest, 232.6 yards rushing, 336.0 yards passing and 568.6 total yards, but against the Bearcats, the Knights were limited to 24 points (-25), 126 yards rushing (-106.6), 297 yards passing (-39) and 423 total yards of offense (-145.6).

EVERYDAY IS A WINDING ROAD

 UCF entered the game with four total turnovers on the year. The Bearcats' defense forced four turnovers tonight, including three interceptions and one fumble recovery. This season, the Knights' largest number of turnovers in one game was a pair of interceptions at Pittsburgh, their only other loss this year.

BURNING DOWN THE HOUSE

 With the victory over UCF, the Bearcats posted their ninth-consecutive home win and their sixth in a row at Nippert Stadium in conference games.

DON'T CALL IT A COMEBACK

VEADO

• The comeback from a 16-10 halftime deficit against UCF was the 12th come-from-behind win under Head Coach Luke Fickell. UC also came back and won against Miami (OH) after trailing by 10 early. UC put together seven comefrom-behind wins in 2018, earning victories after facing deficits at UCLA (10), vs. Ohio (21), vs. Tulane (4), at SMU (2) and vs, Virginia Tech in the Military Bowl (3). The Bearcats had three comebacks in 2017, winning after trailing by 11 at Miami (OH), three at Tulane and seven against UConn.

- Bearcats Insider, a show on FOX Sports Ohio covering UC Athletics debuted in August 2018.
- The 30-minute show airs weekly on FSO as hosts Dan Hoard and former Bearcats quarterback Tony Pike discuss the most recent game and upcoming matchup as well as feature interviews with coaches and players.
- New episodes will air Wednesdays; check local listing for times and replays.

DOUBLE DUTY

- UC radio voice Dan Hoard also serves as the play-byplay man for the NFL's Cincinnati Bengals, making him part of a select group.
- Hoard joins Bill Hillgrove (Pittsburgh Panthers & Steelers) and Gene Deckerhoff (Florida State/Tampa Bay Buccaneers) as the only broadcasters in the country to handle radio play-by-play duties for both an NCAA FBS and NFL team.
- ESPN CFB commentators Dave Pasch (Arizona Cardinals) and Bob Wischusen (NY Jets) are NFL playby-play radio voices.

CHANGE

- The 24-yard field goal kicked by UCF on the opening drive marked the first time this season the Bearcats defense have allowed points on the opening possession.
- Previously, UC recovered a fumble by UCLA and forced its next three foes – Ohio State, Miami & Marshall – to punt.

SNAP HAPPY

 The Bearcats handed UCF their first loss in AAC play since the 2016 season, halting the Knights' 17-game undefeated streak in league action (19 games counting two AAC Championship Games).

TAKE IT TO THE LIMIT

- The UC defense limited UCF to just 24 points, the fewest the Knights have scored in 2019 (L, 34-35 at Pittsburgh) and the fewest UCF has scored in a league game since November 19, 2016, a 35-20 home loss to Tulsa.
- The point total is also the lowest in an AAC road game since a 31-24 loss at Houston on October 29, 2016.
- UCF had scored 30 or more points in 31-straight games prior to Oct. 4.

DANCING IN THE STREET

- In the third quarter against UCF, Ahmad Gardner pickedoff a UCF pass and returned it 16 yards for a score, putting UC ahead, 20-16, with 5:08 to play in the stanza.
- The interception is the first for Gardner, who entered the game with one career tackle to his credit
- The last time a UC player tallied a pick-six came last year against ECU when Arquan Bush accomplished the feat.

HEY MAN, NICE SHOT

- Cam Jefferies intercepted UCF's Dillon Gabriel in the second quarter and returned the ball 57 yards.
- The pick was the third of his career and his first with UC.
- The 57-yard return is the longest of the season and the second-longest play overall behind only the 73-yard scoring run by Michael Warren II against Miami.

BETWEEN THE LINES

 UC had a new look on the left side of the offensive line against UCF as LT Chris Ferguson and LG Jeremy Cooper missed the game with leg injuries. Darius Harper made his first career start at left tackle and Vincent McConnell made his first career start at left guard.

COUNTRY ROADS

 UC finished the Marshall game with 525 total yards of offense, its highest output of the year (420 vs. Miami) while rushing for 230 yards and throwing for another 295. The rushing total stands as the second-highest amount for the year (238 vs. Miami) while the passing yardage is the highest for the year (242 vs. UCLA).

SIMPLY RED (ZONE)

- Entering the Marshall game, UC was 5-of-12 on the year in the red zone, all five of which were touchdowns.
- Over the last two games (@ Marshall, vs. UCF), the Bearcats are a perfect 11-for 11, scoring nine TDs and two field goals.

THE TURNING POINT

 UC scored in all four quarters against Marshall for the second time this year after doing so against UCLA in the opener. Included in that scoring was a pair of touchdowns in the first quarter, marking the first time UC has posted multiple scores in the opening stanza this year (7 vs. UCLA, 0 at Ohio State, 0 vs. Miami).

START ME UP

 Cincinnati scored on its opening drive of the game at Marshall – a 13-yard pass from Desmond Ridder to Rashad Medaris – to give UC its second opening-drive score of the year and its first since the UCLA game. Between the game with Bruins and the MU contest, UC punted on each of the other three opening drives.

SHUT YOU DOWN

UC led Marshall 28-0 at halftime, marking the first time
the Bearcats had not allowed its opponent to score in a
half this year. Additionally, the 28 points scored by UC
in the first half mark the most the team has tallied in a
single half this year, surpassing the 21 scored on Miami
in the third quarter. The previous high for points in the
first half came against the RedHawks as well with 14
scored last time out

LET'S GET IT STARTED

 UC opened the game scoring the first 45 points before Marshall found the end zone in the fourth quarter. That run of points is the longest of the year, surpassing the 28-point run the Bearcats used against Miami to turn a 10-0 deficit into a 28-10 lead

LEARNING TO FLY

 Prior to the Marshall game, UC had scored just one TD through the air in the opening half of play (Ridder 16 yards to Deguara vs. UCLA) and scored multiple touchdowns in the opening half just once (Warren II runs of 8 and 1 vs. Miami). Ridder connected on three passing strikes in the first half to surpass both of those.

GOING LONG

 UC's second drive of the Marshall game resulted in WR Alec Pierce pulling down a 17-yard pass from QB Desmond Ridder and took 19 plays and 8:48 of possession, both of which are the longest of the season for UC. The previous longs were 12 plays (a Michael Warren II 8-yard rushing touchdown against Miami) and 5:49 of possession (a 21-yard reception by Warren from Ridder in the fourth quarter against UCLA).

25 OR 6 TO 4

 WR Alec Pierce had a big game at Marshall, pulling in six passes for 108 yards – including a 46-yard reception – and one score. Not only did he haul in his first career score, he also recorded his first 100-yard game. Previously, his best performances saw him catch four passes for 93 yards at Ohio State. He has now recorded a catch in all five games.

TALL-STARS

- QB Desmond Ridder finished the Marshall game with 221 yards on 18-of-22 passing and four touchdowns while also running for 48 yards to account for 269 of the team's offense. His four scoring throws ties a career high [vs. ECU, 11/23/18] and stands as his third career game with three or more passing touchdowns after he threw for three – all in the first quarter – last year vs. Alabama A6M (9/15/18).
- Ben Bryant came in of relief of Ridder late in the third quarter and went 3-of-4 for 74 yards while also rushing for nine yards on three carries. Of those 74 yards, 56 came on a big pass play to Tre Tucker. Overall, Bryant nearly doubled his career yardage output as he entered the game 6-of-11 for 75 yards in his career.

PLAY IT AGAIN ...

- TE Josiah Deguara picked up right where he left off in 2018 and has been one of UC's leading receivers all season long.
- At Marshall, he finished the night with 44 total yards and two touchdowns that included three catches and 42 yards with one touchdown in the receiving game. The final two yards and score came on a fumble recovery, the first of his career. On the play, Ridder was sacked and fumbled the ball, which rolled toward the two-yard line. Deguara scooped up the loose ball and moved into the end zone to get the score and his first two rushing yards (no rush attempt is credited statistically on the fumble recovery). The last time the Bearcats recovered a fumble as last year in the Military Bowl against Virginia Tech when Khalil Lewis recovered a fumble in the end zone for a score.
- Deguara has a reception in 18-straight games.

YOUTH OF THE NATION

 Nearly 20 freshmen have seen action for UC, including six first-year players, S Jacob Dingle, CB Ahmad Gardner, CB Justin Harris, DE Steven Hawthorne, LB Brody Ingle, RB Ryan Montgomery, S Jaquan Sheppard and WR Tre Tucker.

ENTERING THE CHARTS

- Three Bearcats recorded their first career TDs at Marshall with two others tallying their first of the season. The three recording their first collegiate touchdowns included Alec Pierce (17-yard pass from Ridder) in the first quarter; Bruno Labelle (4-yard pass from Ridder) in the second quarter; and Michael Kopaygarodsky (1-yard rush) in the fourth quarter. Additionally, Rashad Medaris (13-yards from Ridder) in the first quarter and Tavion Thomas (1-yard rush) in the third quarter also secured their first scores of 2019.
- Kopaygarodsky, who missed last season with a knee injury, finished the night with 19 yards on five carries.
 Entering the game, he carried the ball five times in his career for 26 yards and no scores.

TUBTHUMPING

- In the Marshall game, UC had four plays of 20 yards or more, including three in the air and one on the ground.
- The biggest play was a 56-yard strike from QB Ben Bryant to WR Tre Tucker, UC's longest passing play of the year and the second-longest offensive play overall (Michael Warren II, 73-yard rushing TD vs. Miami).

BAD TO THE BONE

Following LB Bryan Wright's strip-sack with 10:28 left
In the first half vs. Miami, the UC defense went into
lockdown mode. Miami tallied 167 yards and 10 points
on its first four drives of the game, but on its final nine
drives, UC held the RedHawks to 76 yards and three
points while also stopping them on their final eight
third-down attempts.

READY TO START

- Defensively, Cincinnati has not allowed points to be scored this year on any of the opening drives in the first and second half of a game. In the opponent's first possession of the first half, UC has forced one fumble and three punts. In the second half, the first possessions ended in an interception and three punts.
- On the offensive side, UC has scored four times on its opening eight possessions, with scores in both halves against Marshall and second-half TDs vs. UCLA and Miami The other four possessions ended in punts

FOR WHOM THE BELL TOLLS

- With the win over Miami (OH), Cincinnati pulled to within one game of tying the all-time series with Miami as the RedHawks lead, 59-58-7.
- Miami has been tied for or held the series lead since 1916 and the series was last tied in 1953.
- The Bearcats also closed in on tying the series when it is played in Cincinnati as MU leads, 44-42-5.
- UC has won 14 in a row in the Battle for the Victory Bell.

A THOUSAND MILES

- Late in the third quarter against Miami (OH), QB
 Desmond Ridder connected with WR Thomas Geddis
 on a 62-yard TD pass, UC's longest scoring play of the
 year and Geddis' career-long reception.
- Geddis' TD was his first in almost one year as his last score came September 15, 2018, on a 29-yard pitchand-catch with Ridder against Alabama A&M.

МММ МММ МММ

 After being shutout at Ohio State, the Bearcats rebounded with their largest amount of points in a game this year. That came after a slow start in which UC trailed, 10-0, following the first quarter. From there, the Bearcats scored 28 in a row with RB Michael Warren II's rushing touchdown at the start of the second quarter snapping a scoreless streak of five quarters.

TRUCKIN'

- RB Michael Warren II finished the Miami (OH) game with 113 yards on the ground with three scores while also pulling in five catches for 45 yards. His three scores on land ties his career-high that he set twice last year (at UCLA, vs. USF) and marks his eighth career game with two or more rushing TDs in a game. He also now has eight career games of 100-yards on the ground.
- Warren broke the century mark with the aid of a 73-yard scoring run, which stands as his second longest carry behind an 81-yard jaunt last year. For his career, Warren has tallied 24 rushing touchdowns and is tied for fifth on the program's career Top 10 ledger with both Mike Boone (2014-17) and Reggie Taylor (1983-86).
- In UC's past two meetings with Miami, Warren has been nearly unstoppable, averaging almost five yards per carry (4.9), tallying 204 yards on 41 carries with five touchdowns after amassing 113 yards and three TDs in 2019 and 91 yards and two scores last year in a monsoon at Paul Brown Stadium

PAPA'S GOT A BRAND NEW BAG

- Michael Pitts and Malik Vann each recorded 2.0 sacks and MLB Bryan Wright added 1.0 to give the Bearcats 5.0 sacks vs. Miami (OH). The trio combined for 41 yards of losses with those five sacks as well.
- Under Luke Fickell, this is the third time the Bearcats have posted five quarterback sacks in a single game after doing so last year at UCLA and at home against Navy with today's loss yardage the most of those three games following 37 yards against the Midshipmen and 25 from the Bruins.
- Dating back to 2001, the 5.0 sacks vs. Miami (OH) ties for the 11th-most in single game. And, since 2009, the Bearcats have sacked a Miami quarterback 5.0 or more times in a single game now five times, including 10.0 in 2014 and 5.0 in 2013, 2016 and 2019.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

 OL Chris Ferguson, OL Morgan James and LB Perry Young were elected by their teammates to represent the Bearcats as captains in 2019. TE Josiah Deguara and LB Bryan Wright have served as game captains.

SHUT OUT THE LIGHT

- UC was blanked 42-0 at No. 5 Ohio State on Sept. 7, the first shutout since a 38-0 loss to West Virginia on Nov. 9, 2005, a span of 170 games.
- The road shutout was not the most lopsided for UC, but it does fall on the same day as that instance as UC lost at Penn State, 81-0, on Sept. 7, 1991.

RUNNIN' DOWN A DREAM

- Just before halftime against UCLA and following an interception by QB Desmond Ridder, TE Josiah Deguara made a TD-saving tackle after a 66-yard INT return.
- HC Luke Fickell said: "What you saw from us is who we really are. A team that can fight it out and grind it out and find a way to be successful. I think the greatest epitome of that might just be the play right before the half. To see Josiah Deguara run 60 or so yards, never give up, get a guy down and give us the opportunity to not lose complete momentum of the entire game. That's what we pride ourselves on. It will be the first play we watch (on tape) as a team. Some of those guys won't want to watch it, but the reality is it's how we learn, how we learn from what effort and attitude really is."

PLACE AT THE TABLE

- LB Darrian Beavers, OL Jeremy Cooper, S Ja'Von Hicks, OL Lorenz Metz, WR Alex Pierce, DT Elijah Ponder, DE Myjai Sanders and DT Jabari Taylor all made their first UC starts against UCLA.
- Beavers previously started five career games at UConn and the rest made their first collegiate starts.

THE SOUND OF SILENCE

- QB Desmond Ridder looked every part of his 2018 AAC ROTY self against UCLA, but was missing something ...
- The sophomore signal caller lost his voice early in the second quarter, forcing UC to go to non-verbal signals.
- UC practices daily with loud music playing, like many other teams, forcing regular work on similar issues.
- He had a solid opener, completing 12 of his first 16 passes and going 4-5 on 3rd-down attempts for first downs.
- He finished the game 18-of-26 for 242 yards, two TDs, an interception and 34 yards rushing.

THE NEW ISLAND OF MISFIT TOYS

- As was the case in 2018, there's a story behind the makeup of UC's offensive line.
- The starting five in the first game consisted of LT Lorenz Metz, LG Jeremy Cooper, C Jakari Robinson, RG Morgan James and RT Chris Ferguson.
- Metz is a German with two years of club football experience prior to coming to UC in January 2018.
- Cooper is a RS freshman who played in four games in 2018.
- Robinson was thrust into the lineup a year ago after Garrett Campbell was injured at UConn.
- James is a 29-year old former hockey player who didn't play football prior to joining UC as a walk-on.
- Ferguson is a sixth-year senior from the Bahamas who
 played a year of HS football and never set foot on the
 field at UC until the 2018 opener at the Rose Bowl where
 he started and hasn't come off the field since.

SPEED OF SOUND

- Freshman WR Tre Tucker had a 28-yard kickoff return in the season opener, the state champion track athlete's first collegiate appearance.
- Tucker's PRs of 10.41 in the 100m and 6.80 in the 60m would both rank No. 4 all-time in UC's TF record book.

STEALING PEOPLE'S MAIL

- UC's defense came up with four turnovers against UCLA with two fumble recoveries (Marcus Brown/Ja'Von Hicks) and two interceptions (Hicks & Perry Young).
- There were firsts all around it was the first recovery for both Brown and Hicks and the first interception for both Hicks and Young.

KICK IN THE DOOR

- K Sam Crosa scored his first points for the Bearcats making a field goal and three extra points against UCLA.
- The graduate transfer arrived at UC in the summer of 2019 from Western Illinois and won the job in training camp by virtue of his consistency. For his career, Crosa is 24-29 on field goals and 92-97 on PATs.

THE FIRST CUT IS THE DEEPEST

- Never let the toughness of LS Zach Wood be questioned.
- Wood underwent surgery for appendicitis prior to the Alabama A&M game in 2018, only missed a week and was medically cleared prior to the Ohio game a week later and snapped with no problem.

THE GRAND RETURN

- RB Ryan Montgomery had a number of career highs against Miami (OH), setting marks for rush attempts (5), rushing yards (35), longest rush (26), punt returns (5) and punt-return yards (57).
- He was a standout prep at Franklin HS outside of Dayton where the highly-touted RB had almost 2,700 yards rushing and 47 TDs his last two seasons as a prep. He originally committed to UC in 2018 but deferred his enrollment to the 2019 class due to an injury.

M*A*S*H* 513

 UC has bitten by the injury bug as DE Blake Bacevich, LB Kyle Bolden, OL Jeremy Cooper, RB Charles McClelland, S James Wiggins and OL Colin Woodside all suffered injuries which will keep them out for an extended period.

INTO THE WOODS

- S Darrick Forrest has been a model of consistency since entering the starting lineup a year ago and led UC with nine tackles against UCLA.
- He tallied 49 tackles a year ago and has made at least one tackle in each of the last 19 games.

- RB Michael Warren II became UC's 11th 1,000-yard rusher in 2018, the first since George Winn in 2012 (1,334).
- Reggie Taylor achieved the feat three times (1984-86) and James Bettis (1980-81), Allen Harvin (1978, 1982), David Small (1991-93) and Isaiah Pead (2010-11) all did it twice.
- · Warren tallied 1,329 yards and a school-record 19 TDs.
- Warren's 2018 effort was the third-best tally in school history behind DeMarco McCleskey's 1,361 yards in 2002 and George Winn's 1,334 yards in 2012.

DON'T STOP ME NOW

- UC DC/LB coach Marcus Freeman was named one of the nation's Top-40 assistant coaches to watch in 2019 by The Athletic's Bruce Feldman.
- The Bearcats third-year defensive coordinator engineered one of the top defenses in the nation a year ago as UC led the American Athletic Conference in total defense, scoring defense and rushing defense in 2018, finishing No. 9 in the FBS in scoring defense.

TOUGH SLEDDING EARLY

- The Bearcats face a daunting early-season schedule, with its five of its first six opponents earning bowl eligibility in 2018 with a combined record of 51-26.
- Only two other schools in the American Athletic Conference will feature an opening six-game slate against teams with a combined opponents record above .500 and both are in the AAC West Division, Houston (55-22) and Tulane (41-34).

NEW FACES - COACHES

 WR Coach Mike Brown and DL Coach Chad Wilt joined the staff during the offseason, replacing Joker Phillips (Maryland) and Steve Stripling (retirement), respectively. Brown was previous on staff at his alma mater, Liberty, after a standout playing career and three years in the NFL with the Jacksonville Jaguars. Wilt came to UC from Army West Point where ehe helped coach the Black Knights to 29 wins from 2016-18 with three wins over arch-rival Navy, three postseason bowl wins and a pair of Commander in Chief's Trophies.

COME AS YOUR ARE

- LB Joel Dublanko was UC's top special teams player in 2018, recording nine stops on kickoff and punt coverage.
- Dublanko recorded 27 stops on the season also seeing time at middle linebacker. He is a native of Aberdeen, Washington, a mere 2,416 miles from Cincinnati.

FIND YOUR WAY BACK

- LB Perry Young has returned from a torn ACL suffered against Navy last year. Young earned First-Team All-AAC honors despite only playing eight games.
- One of the leaders of UC's defense, he had a seasonhigh nine tackles twice, against Tulane and at Temple and also totaled 2.5 tackles for a loss and a 27-yard fumble return. UC's defense led the American in total defense, scoring defense and rushing defense, finishing no. 9 in the FBS in scoring defense.

IMPACT OF THE 2018 REDSHIRT RULE

 NCAA legislation a year ago permitted teams to play true freshmen in up to four games while allowing them to retain first-year eligibility. UC took full advantage of the rule with 15 SAs seeing some playing time in 2018, including J Blake Bacevich, LS Blake Bammann, QB Ben Bryant, CB Arquon Bush, OL Jeremy Cooper, WR Wyatt Fischer, OL Lorenz Metz, LB Mick Oakes, OL Dylan O'Quinn, WR Yanez Rogers, OL Colin Truett, LB Ty Van Fossen, CB Taj Ward, TE Josh Whyle and OL Colin Woodside.

OPPORTUNITY KNOCKS

- Chris Ferguson scooped a fumble vs. Tulane in 2018 and ran for six yards his first recovery and offensive yards.
- A senior from Nassau, Bahamas, he had never played a down of football for UC prior to the 2018 opener at UCLA and started 12 games a year ago at right tackle.
- Ferguson has played both OL and DL during his UC career. Born in the Bahamas, he moved to Orlando, at the age of 18, was originally a basketball player and had only one HS football season before coming to UC.

STUCK IN THE MIDDLE WITH YOU

- LB Bryan Wright made the move to middle linebacker in 2018 after previously playing at DE.
- He made 13 starts and totaled 55 tackles, which ranked third on the squad. Wright had a career day at UCLA, finishing with 3.0 TFL, 2.0 sacks and a forced fumble to earn AAC Defensive Player of the Week honors.
- He totaled a career-best nine tackles against Ohio, finished with eight at SMU, had six stops against Tulane and made five tackles and recovered a fumble in the Military Bowl win over Virginia Tech.
- In 2017, he made six starts, recording 15 tackles and 2.5 TFLs, before suffering a season-ending shoulder injury.
- Wright was a prep QB at Howard HS in Wilmington, Delaware and won a state championship in basketball.

MEN WITHOUT HATS

- TE Bruno Labelle, a native of Quebec, Canada, had a dream of playing NCAA FBS football since he was young.
- Discovered by the Bearcats during a summer prospect camp, Labelle earned a scholarship offer and enrolled at UC in January 2016, going through spring ball.

FORMER BEARCATS ON STAFF

 QB coach Gino Guidugli and CB coach Mike Mickens are not the only former Bearcats on the coaching staff. OL coach Ron Crook had a previous stint at UC, while Pat Lambert (defensive GA) played for the Red & Black.

RIGHT HERE, RIGHT NOW

- Head Coach Luke Fickell, in his third year at UC, was named the 2018 AAC Coach of the Year after leading UC to its third 11-win season in school history.
- He was a semifinalist for the George Munger Award and tabbed for the watch lists for the Dodd Trophy and Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach the Year awards.

POLLING DATA

Entering week 11 of the 2018 season, UC earned its first-ever ranking in a College Football Playoff poll (No. 24), its highest ranking in the Associated Press poll since 2009 (No. 19) and highest rank in the Coaches Poll since Oct. 2012 (No. 20).

- For the past 21 years, the UC football has called the Higher Ground Conference and Retreat Center in West Harrison, Ind., its preseason training home.
- The 280-acre facility is located about 30 miles from campus and has served as the Bearcats training camp location since the lead up to the 1999 season.
- Among many amenities, Higher Ground features a pair of 100-yard artificial turf practice fields, including a new surface installed in 2017, ample living and meeting spaces and no distractions from football.

GET OFF MY LAWN

- OL Morgan James enters his final CFB season as a 29year old, the graybeard of the Bearcats roster.
- James does not have the traditional background of a college football player. He did not play in high school and spent time after graduation playing hockey in the Southern Professional Hockey League.
- The big man was an enforcer on ice. His first exposure playing football came when he joined the Bearcats during training camp in the fall of 2015.

SAME OLD SONG AND DANCE

 UC returned OC Mike Denbrock and DC Marcus Freeman in 2019, the third straight year UC has had the same primary coordinators. It's a rarity in Clifton and last happened 13 seasons ago when DC Pat Narduzzi and OC Don Treadwell manned the sidelines from 2004-06.

MOVIN' ON UP

 Twelve UC student-athletes started the career as walkons and have been elevated to scholarship players since Head Coach Luke Fickell's arrival in late 2016.

HOMEGROWN

- Since Head Coach Luke Fickell's arrival in Cincinnati in late 2016, the recruiting focus has shifted to the State of Cincinnati, a 50-mile radius around campus along with a 300-mile radius which covers Ohio and more.
- During Fickell's first spring in 2017, 11 scholarship players hailed from Ohio and entering the 2019 campaign, the number has jumped to 40 Ohio scholarship players.

SPINNING THE OLDIES

 Nippert Stadium, has been the Bearcats playing site since 1901 and the stadium underwent construction in 1915, making it one of the oldest active stadiums in the NCAA FBS. Penn's Franklin Field (1895) takes the honor as the oldest playing site and stadium in Division I.

 UC was the only school in the country in 2018-19 to tally 11 football wins, including a bowl win and earn 24 or more wins in baseball, MBB, WBB and VB.

GUESS WHAT'S BACK?

 UC returned more than 85% of its roster, over 5,000 yards of total offense, 10 of its Top-15 tacklers and 14 starters from the 2018 squad.

FOLSOM PRISON BLUES

- TE Josiah Deguara put together a career season in 2018 which culminated in Second-Team All-AAC honors.
- Deguara, from Folsom, California, was UC's second-leading receiver on the year with 38 receptions for 468 yards and five touchdowns. Those numbers are the best for a UC tight end since Travis Kelce finished with 45 receptions for 722 yards and 8 TDs in 2012. Deguara entered the season with 15 catches for 145 yards and no scores. He had a career-best 112-yard day with a TD at UConn, had a reception in every game and caught three or more balls in seven games.
- He took part in the 2019 NCAA Career in Sports Forum this summer (June 6-9) in Indianapolis, Ind. Nearly200 student-athletes nationwide were invited to learn and explore potential careers in sports.

IT'S A LONG WAY TO THE TOP

- Cincinnati has won over 65% of its football games since 2007, ranking atop the American Athletic Conference and among the Top-20 teams in the NCAA FBS.
- Cincinnati is 15-3 since the start of the 2018 campaign.

IF YOU BUILD IT, THEY WILL COME

- UC is bucking a nationwide enrollment trend, according to the National Student Clearinghouse Research Center.
- While college enrollment across the land is down, UC recently reported a fall 2019 semester headcount of 46.388 students its seventh-consecutive increase
- UC's overall enrollment, undergraduate (35,498) and first-year students (7,805) are all school-record marks.

- The University of Cincinnati serves as an economic powerhouse for the Queen City, with more than 15,000 employees, 45,000 students, 300,000 living alumni and countless Bearcats fans.
- Among the state's five counties in southwestern Ohio, UC generates a whopping \$3.3 billion annual impact.
- The campus community is also credited with an \$8.5 million annual impact thanks to volunteerism and community engagement.

WHAT'S NEW ON GAMEDAYS IN 2019?

A HOME TO COME TO

- The Bearcats have added over 2,500 new season ticket holders over the summer along with nearly 40% of the incoming freshmen class making ticket purchases.
- It marks the largest yearly ticket increase since the 2010 season, following UC's 12-1 campaign in 2009.
- Season sales are trending towards the third-best total in UC history, behind 2010 and 2015 (return to Nippert).

- Fans in their seats before kickoff of the UCF game took part in a pregame light show using their smartphones, thanks a partnership with CUE.

- UC has added several new, exciting fan experience enhancements to game days at Nippert Stadium for the 2019 football season.
- Among are: additional tailgating options, sponsored social-gathering spaces, new concessions items, fansfirst pricing concessions stand and a season-long DJ for in-game entertainment

THE ARENA TAILGATE

- UC will open Fifth Third Arena four hours before kickoff to serve as an additional tailgating destination for fans.
- The Armory Bar will be operational with domestic and craft beers on tap and mixed drinks.
- Concessions will be available, and both the menu and drink offerings will be catered to the kickoff time.
- Admission is free and game tickets are NOT required to enjoy the tailgate. It closes 30 minutes before kickoff.

HONORING THE 2009 BEARCATS

- UC will honor one of its greatest teams, the 2009 Bearcats football squad, throughout the 2019 season.
- The 2009 Bearcats, who had a perfect 12-0 regular season, won the BIG EAST Conference Championship and played in the 2010 Allstate Sugar Bowl, will be inducted into the James P. Kelly Sr. UC Athletics Hall of Fame alongside the Voice of the Bearcats, Dan Hoard.
- The weekend of October 18-19, 2019 will feature the annual Legion of Excellence dinner on Friday and an in-game recognition during the football game against Tulsa on Saturday, Oct. 19 in Nippert Stadium. The team will be welcomed back to Cincinnati and former Head Coach Brian Kelly will attend the Saturday recognition.
- UC is created a dual bobblehead of the game-winning Tony Pike to Armon Binns 29-yard touchdown which capped a 45-44 come-from-behind win at Pitt on Dec. 5, 2009. The memento also includes an audio component which will play the radio and TV calls of the TD pass from the Voice of the Bearcats, Dan Hoard, and ESPN's Sean McDonough.
- Hoard enters his 20th season as the Voice of the Bearcats in 2019, handling the play-by-play duties for the football and men's basketball teams and hosting weekly radio and television programs. One of UC's greatest ambassadors, Hoard's voice and approachable manner have made him a legend among Bearcats fans, coaches, student-athletes and staff over the years.

Carson Field at Nippert Stadium has been the venerable home of the University of Cincinnati football team since 1901 and provides the Bearcats with one of the best home-field environments in college football.

The third-oldest NCAA FBS stadium entered a new era in 2015 following the completion of a 20-month, \$86-millon, privately funded renovation and expansion project. The reopening of Nippert Stadium coincides with the 100th anniversary of the 1915 original construction of the facility.

UC has used the Nippert site as a playing field since 1901, making it the second-oldest playing site in the nation for college football behind Penn's Franklin Field (1895).

Among NCAA FBS schools. Nippert is the third-oldest stadium still in use, behind Bobby Dodd Stadium (Georgia Tech - 1913), Davis Wade Stadium (Mississippi State - 1914) and ahead of Ole Miss' Vaught-Hemingway Stadium (1915) and Wisconsin's Camp Randall Stadium (1917)

Through numerous renovations, the structure situated in the middle of the Clifton campus has retained its early-century brickwork, wrought-iron gates, and trim giving Nippert a comfortable old-time stadium charm and appeal, while remaining a classic showplace for college football.

Both east and west concourses were completely renovated and widened and fans will find new concession stands and restrooms throughout the stadium, including ADA accessible seating and facilities. Concession stands feature the usual stadium staples along with offerings from premium local vendors. Nearly 75 permanent point-of-sale concession locations are available on gamedays.

East-side patrons with seats in Herschede-Shank Pavilion will notice the skywalks connecting O'Varsity Way to the upper deck, allowing them to bypass the main concourse and have a guick and easy route to and from their seats. Electronic ribbon boards will be installed on the face of the press box and Herschede-Shank

Pavilion. These feature statistics, graphics, out-of-town scores and more.

All the seating benches are covered by red and silver Perma-Can vinyl bleacher covers by Hussey Seating. The covering gives the bleachers a different look and includes a CPAW painted in the south end zone student section.

The most striking changes, however, sits five stories above the west concourse. At 105,000 square feet and 130 yards long. the five-story West Pavilion rises out of the stadium concourse in glass and angles which contain a host of new premium seating along with state-of-the-art press facilities.

The curvature of the facility matches that of Herschede-Shank Pavilion on the east side of the stadium and contains four levels: a press and operations level, suite level, scholarship club level, and natio suites mezzanine level.

UC went from having nearly no premium seating options to the addition of 1.100 scholarship club seats and 53 indoor and outdoor suites of varying sizes. A skywalk connects Tangeman University Center to the West Pavilion with premium area customers able to access the facility on gameday from the other side of campus.

In addition, three new lighting poles were installed along with new lights on existing poles and on the roof facing of the press box. The stadium lighting averages 165 footcandles, a vast improvement over the previous number.

The 2015 project was the latest in a series of enhancements that began in 1916 when construction began on a permanent brickand-concrete stadium structure, which was completed, sectionby-section, as funds were raised.

In 1936, the playing field was lowered 12 feet to allow spectator seating to increase to 24,000.

The Reed Shank Pavilion was added in 1954 to bring the capacity to 28,000. In 1991, the capacity was upped to 35,000 through extending the upper deck, now called the Herschede-Shank Pavilion.

In 2005, a permanent grandstand added new and improved seating and gameday locker rooms in the North end zone along with a new videoboard, doubling the previous display.

Artificial turf was first installed in 1970 and in 2000, the stadium became one of the first in the U.S. to utilize FieldTurf, a grass-like synthetic surface.

Prior to the 2013 season, UBU Sports' Speed Series S5-M synthetic turf system was installed as the playing surface at Nippert. The stadium's field orientation was shifted slightly north and west to even out the sideline areas and add a run-off area around the south end zone.

The stadium served as home for the Cincinnati Bengals, in 1968 and 1969, while their original permanent home at Riverfront Stadium was being constructed. It is currently the home field for FC Cincinnati, a professional soccer team in the United Soccer League.

The playing surface was widened and a new perimeter wall was constructed following the 2016 season, giving Nippert the ability to play host to international friendly matches on a FIFA regulation

Nippert has also served as a venue for concerts by Britney Spears, Michael Jackson, NSYNC, Janet Jackson, KT Tunstall, The North Mississippi All-Stars, The Roots, the Cincinnati Opera Company and many more.

Two US Presidents have spoken at the stadium. On Oct. 16, 1936. President Franklin Roosevelt, running for a second term. appeared at Nippert Stadium and spoke from an open car in the rain to a crowd estimated at 15,000 and on Nov. 2, 2008, President Barack Obama held a campaign rally at Nippert two days before the 2008 Presidential Election to an estimated 27,000 attendees.

USA Today named Nippert as the best home-field venue in the former BIG EAST Conference and ESPN's Scott Van Pelt cited Nippert as a "one of the gems of college football'.







WHAT'S IN A NAME?

- During the season-ending clash with rival Miami (Ohio) in 1923, Jimmy Nippert sustained a spike wound injury and died a month later from blood poisoning. His grandfather, James N. Gamble of Procter and Gamble, provided the funds needed to complete the horseshoe-shaped structure, and the James Gamble Nippert Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Nov. 8, 1924.
- The stadium's founder was Arch Carson, who as captain and principal organizer played a significant role in starting football on the UC campus in 1885. In 1901 as physical director of the university, Carson guided the construction of the field which was later named for him -- the playing surface is still called Carson Field.

HEAD COACH LUKE FICKELL

THIRD YEAR • OHIO STATE '97

The University of Cincinnati football team opened a new era in December 2016 with the hiring of Ohio native Luke Fickell, the Bearcats 42nd football head coach.

The 20-year veteran of the FBS coaching ranks took the reins of the UC program after spending 16 years at his alma mater, Ohio State. His impressive resume includes being on the staff of two national championship winning teams, seeing 14 of his players selected in the NFL Draft, and coordinating outstanding defenses over 12 seasons as a co-coordinator or defensive coordinator.

Entering his third season at UC, Fickell led one of the more remarkable turnarounds in school history in 2018, rebounding from a 4-8 inaugural campaign with the third 11-win season in school history and a win in the Military Bowl. The 2018 American Athletic Conference Coach of the Year, Fickell was a semifinalist for the George Munger Award and was tabbed for the watch lists for the Dodd Trophy and Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach the Year awards.

Establishing his T.E.A.M. culture on the Clifton Hts. campus, standing for Together Everyone Achieves More, UC has emerged as one of the teams to watch in the American, especially on defense where the 2018 Bearcats led the league in rushing defense, scoring defense and total defense and ranked among the Top-15 in the NCAA FBS in all three categories.

Fickell was hired on Dec. 10, 2016 and has been a tireless advocate for the UC program, speaking at numerous events and schools to continue to build the Bearcats brand inside the State of Cincinnati, the 50-mile radius surrounding campus.

An excellent recruiter with strong Ohio, Midwest and Florida relationships, a national presence and a discerning eye for talent, Fickell has put together back-to-back-to-back impactful recruiting classes at Cincinnati. He was named the American Football Coaches Association assistant coach of the year in 2010 and he was named a "top recruiter" in 2012 by both Rivals and ESPN.

The former standout football player, college graduate, NFL player, husband and father is most-noticed as a developer of talent.

His NFL Draft selections include first-round picks A.J. Hawk, Bobby Carpenter, Ryan Shazier and Darron Lee, NFL standout James Laurinaitis, along with Joshua Perry, Anthony Schlegel, Larry Grant, Marcus Freeman, Austin Spitler, Ross Homan and Brian Rolle and most recently UC players Cortez Broughton and Korey Cunningham.

No stranger to championship-level football, Fickell was a part of nine Big Ten Conference titles (seven as a coach, two as a player), two national championship squads and 15 postseason games, including two College Football Playoff appearances.

From 2005-2016, Fickell-coached defenses at Ohio State ranked among the NCAA FBS Top-40 in yards-per-play allowed, averaging a ranking of No. 17 and earning its highest rank of No. 3 in 2016



Fickell's coaching career began at Ohio State. After spending a year on the injured reserve list with the New Orleans Saints, he was hired in 1999 as a graduate assistant at OSU by his college coach, John Cooper.

Fickell's first full-time coaching position came in 2000 under Lee Owens at Akron, spending two years as defensive line coach. Jim Tressel brought him to Ohio State as special teams coordinator in 2002 and he also worked with the defensive front on the BCA National Championship squad. He was named linebackers coach in 2004, and added co-defensive coordinator duties to his resume in 2005.

In May of 2011 he was asked to take over an Ohio State program staggered by the loss of its head coach, the unexpected departure of a star quarterback and on the cusp of NCAA penalties, and against stacked odds, he led the Buckeyes to a bowl game. Prior to his appointment to serve as head coach, he had been promoted to assistant head coach in March 2011.

He returned to his role as defensive coordinator and linebackers coach in 2012. Over five seasons, coaching under UC alumnus Urban Meyer, Fickell's defensive units were a big reason the Buckeyes went 61-5 and won the 2014 College Football Playoff National Championship.

Fickell was one of the founders of the 2nd & 7 Foundation in 1999 with teammates Ryan Miller and Mike Vrabel. The foundation promotes reading by providing free books and positive role models to kids in need while encouraging young athletes of the community to pay it forward.

A native of Columbus, Ohio, Fickell is a graduate of DeSales High School, where he was a three-time, undefeated state wrestling champion.

Fickell played for the Buckeyes from 1992-96, redshirting the first year and then starting the next four seasons at nose guard. He started a then school-record 50 consecutive games between 1993 and 1996.

He graduated from Ohio State in 1997 with a degree in exercise science. Fickell and his wife Amy have six children: Landon, Luca, twin sons Aydon and Ashton, and twin sons Laykon and Lucian.
