Highlights

- Today's captains were redshirt senior guard Dylan O'Quinn, senior wide receiver Tre Tucker, sixth-year senior defensive lineman Jabari Taylor and sixth-year linebacker Wil Huber.
- UC won the coin toss and deferred to the second half.

Offensive Notes

- RS sophomore offensive lineman Gavin Gerhardt, redshirt sophomore right tackle Joe Huber and redshirt freshman wide receiver Will Pauling made their first career starts.
- Charles McClelland's 35-yard rush late in the second quarter was his longest since a career-long 55-yard rush in the 2018 season finale.
- Corey Kiner's 5-yard touchdown run on the second half's opening drive was his first as a Bearcat after having two as a true freshman at LSU in 2021.
- Nick Mardner's 35-yard touchdown grab at 6:50 in the third quarter was his first reception and score as a Bearcat. He had eight touchdowns while averaging 20.5 yards per catch at Hawaii the previous three years.
- Evan Prater made his season debut with an eight-yard keeper on the first play of the fourth quarter.

Defensive Notes

- Ivan Pace, Wilson Huber, Ja'quan Sheppard, Bryon Threats, and Taj Ward make their first career starts.

- True freshman cornerback JQ Hardaway made his collegiate debut at 4:36 in the third quarter.
- Eric Phillips' fumble recovery inside the Arkansas 5 was the first of his career.

Special Teams Notes

- Mason Fletcher had two punts downed inside the Arkansas 10, as well as producing a career-long 54-yarder in the first quarter.
- Tre Tucker tied a punt-return career-high attempts with two attempts (37 yards).

Odds and Ends

- The Bearcats dropped to 650-596-50 all-time in their 135th season of college football.
- The attendance of 74,751 was the seventh-largest in the stadium's history.
- Luke Fickell dropped to 48-16 at Cincinnati and 6-10 against Top 25 opponents.
- Cincinnati is now 22-3 since the start of the 2020 season and 44-8 since the start of the 2018 season. Both marks rank among the Top 5 in the nation.
