Judges deny O'Bannon petition

The NCAA captured another win in the Ed O'Bannon case. On December 16th, the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals denied the O'Bannon petition for a rehearing before a bigger panel of judges. Earlier this year, a separate judge panel upheld U.S. District Judge Claudia Wilken's decision that NCAA rules restricting payments to college athletes violate antitrust laws, but decided that players shouldn't be paid up to \$5,000 per year in compensation for the use of their names, images on video games, etc. The lawyers for O'Bannon requested another type of review with a larger group of Ninth Circuit judges to rehear portions of the case in the coming weeks.

Fifth Third Arena Project Approved



The UC Board of Trustees approved the \$87 million renovation project for Fifth Third Arena. Some improvements to the facility include: a 360-degree seating bowl, an HD scoreboard, ribbon boards, sound system, an LED lighting system, new concession facilities, a new upper-level concourse, a new main entrance and plaza with new ticketing and guest services. The renovated arena will also include an upgraded locker room and an upgrade to all suites. The arena will also decrease its capacity from 13,176 to just over 10,000. Construction will begin after the 2016-17 season.


