FIRST AND TEN

- Miami football ranks first all-time in the Mid-American Conference in wins (714), conference wins (310), MAC Championships (16) and bowl wins (8).
- Historically, Miami's 714 career wins, ranks third all-time among Group-of-Five programs, behind just Navy (734) and Army (721). Appalachian State (654) if fourth and Central Michigan (644) rounds out the top five.
- Miami was 4-18 in Coach Martin's first 22 Mid-American Conference games. Since then, the RedHawks are 34-16 in their last 50 games versus schools from the MAC, the best record in the conference during that span.
- Miami has now had a .500 or better conference record in six of the last seven seasons, dating back to 2016. The RedHawks also captured the 2019 MAC Championship game and were a two-point conversion away versus Kent State from playing in the 2021 MACC.
- Martin, in his 10th year leading the RedHawks, has a new look on offense in 2023. Offensive Coordinator Pat Welsh returns for his 10th year with Martin, but his first as offensive coordinator. Defensively, Bill Brechin begins year two as the defensive coordinator (10th year at Miami). Special Teams Coordinator Jacob Bronowski is in his second year with the Red and White.
- Miami is 13-8 in one-score games, dating back to the 2018 campaign.
- In its last 53 contests, Miami has had a lead at some point in 46 of those games. The RedHawks had a lead at some point in all but one game in 2022.
- After competing in the 2022 Bahamas Bowl, the RedHawks have now been bowl eligible six of the last seven seasons. From 2006-15, Miami was bowl eligible just twice.

ABOUT CHUCK MARTIN

- Head coach Chuck Martin, who earned that title on Dec. 3, 2013, brings an impressive resume to Oxford, Ohio.
- Not only was he 74-7 in six years at Grand Valley State (2004-09), he has coached in seven national championship games in the past 20 seasons. Martin has an all-time head coaching record of 120-67.
- He has twice been named the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) National Coach of the Year and has been a coordinator on both sides of the ball.
- Martin was inducted into the Hall of Fame at Grand Valley State University on Oct. 23, 2015.

ABOUT CINCINNATI

Cincinnati enters Saturday at 2-0 overall with wins over Eastern Kentucky (66-13) and Pittsburgh (27-21). The Bearcats are averaging 519.0 yards per contest and are led by quarterback Emory Jones. Jones has thrown for 470 yards and seven touchdowns in two games. Defensively, Deshawn Pace is tops on the team with 11 tackles.

SERIES VS. BEARCATS

The Battle for the Victory Bell series, which started in 1888 with the first college football game ever played in the state of Ohio, is now 60-59-7 all time in UC's favor. Cincinnati has captured the last 16 meetings, with Miami's last win in the series coming in 2005.

• The "Battle for the Victory Bell" between Miami and Cincinnati is the longest-lasting collegiate football rivalry west of the Allegheny Mountains, first being played in 1888. It is also the fifth-most played rivalry in Division I (FBS only) with 126 all-time meetings and is the oldest non-conference rivalry in the nation.

• The first Miami/Cincinnati game was played in Oxford on Dec. 8, 1888 as the teams played to a scoreless tie. The game was the first college football game played in the state of Ohio.

• Due to COVID, the two teams did not play in 2020, ending a streak of consecutive years played, dating back to 1945. Miami/UC did not play in 1943 or 1944, but Miami and UC also played every year from 1909 through 1942. Of the 126 meetings, 54 have been decided by seven points or less, including the seven ties in series history.

• The series is currently scheduled to continue through 2029.

LAST MEETING

After Miami grabbed an early 10-0 lead, Cincinnati went on top for good just before halftime and pulled away for a 38-17 win over the RedHawks last September at Paycor Stadium in downtown Cincinnati. Aveon Smith threw two touchdown passes in the first half for Miami, while Ryan McWood made a game-high 13 tackles.

MEMORABLE MEETING

Ben Roethlisberger threw for 377 yards as Miami jumped out to a 28-0 advantage and held on to edge Cincinnati 42-37 in front of a sellout crowd at Yager Stadium on Sept. 27, 2003. The RedHawks captured the Victory Bell for the third straight season and Roethlisberger became the first quarterback in program history to amass three consecutive 300-yard passing games. The Bearcats cut a 25-point fourth-quarter deficit to a single possession down the stretch, but their fifth turnover of the game (a fumbled punt in the final minute) sealed the outcome for the Red and White.

GOOD THINGS COME TO THOSE THAT WAIT

The trip to Cincinnati is Miami's third straight road game to begin the year. Miami does not compete at home until Sept. 23. The last time Miami opened the year with three straight road games was 2003 (at Iowa, at Northwestern and at Colorado State).

REDHAWKS PICK UP 41-28 VICTORY AT UMASS

Brett Gabbert threw for 302 yards and Gage Larvadain finished with eight catches for 273 yards and three touchdowns as the Miami University football team downed the University of Massachusetts 41-28 on Saturday (and Sunday) in a contest that last nearly nine hours.

WEATHERING THE STORM

Miami's win over the Minutemen was scheduled to begin at 3:32 p.m., but moments before the coin toss, the game was delayed two hours and five minutes. Both teams returned to the field and played much of the first quarter before a second weather delay sent the teams back to the locker room for an addition three hours and 30 minutes. In all, the game was delayed for five hours and 35 minutes and concluded at 12:28 a.m.

OTHER TIDBITS FROM UMASS

- Rashad Amos rushed 23 times for 115 yards, his first 100-yard game as a RedHawk. It was also the first time Miami had 100-yard rusher since Aveon Smith did so at Buffalo last season.
- Larvadain's 273 receiving yards are the second-most in program history behind only Jack Sorenson's 283 receiving yards versus Ohio in 2021. Larvadain added a 99-yard reception, the longest catch in program history (previous long was 94 yards by Sly Johnson in 1999).
- UMass scored to make it 31-28 Miami with 11:08 in the contest. From that point, Miami's defense forced two three-and-outs and added an interception to secure the win.

BOUNCE BACK

Since early in the 2016 season Miami has lost back-to-back MAC games just twice in that span. In fact, Miami is now 13-2 following a MAC loss under Martin, dating back to Oct. 15, 2016.

MONSTERS OF THE MAC

Statistically, Miami had one of the best defenses in the MAC in 2022. The RedHawks were first in scoring defense (22.6), third in total defense (373.1) and first in rush defense (135.9). In all, Miami returns nine defensive starters from the 2022 squad.

GAME 3 • CINCINNATI

TAKE IT AWAY DEFENSE, TAKE IT AWAY

The RedHawks defense forced 22 turnovers in 2022, a season-best under coach Martin. Prior to the 2022 season, Miami had averaged 16 turnovers forced per season, with a high of 20 in 2019. Miami finished the 2022 season +11 in turnover margin, 12th best in the country. The RedHawks have already forced three turnovers in 2023, including two last week at UMass.

FIVE THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT NO. 5 BRETT GABBERT

- Younger brother of NFL quarterback, Blaine Gabbert.
- Gabbert was named the 2019 MAC Freshman of the Year, joining Ben Roethlisberger (2001) and Deland McCullough (1992) as the only other RedHawks to capture this award.
- When Miami opened the 2019 season at Iowa, Gabbert became the first true freshman quarterback to open the season as the starter in Miami football history.
- Is responsible for 54 touchdowns (49 passing, 5 rushing) in his Miami career.
- Ranks fourth in program history with 6,688 passing yards and is sixth in completion percentage (.588) and tied for fifth in passing touchdowns (49).

GABBERT VERSUS GUS

Back in 2018, senior quarterback star Gus Ragland helped recruit Brett Gabbert to Miami. Five years later, Ragland is now coaching quarterbacks for Miami and will soon see Gabbert surpass many of his career numbers. Gabbert ranks fourth in career passing yards and passed Ragland in week one at Miami (FL). Gabbert's completion percentage (.588) is just two spots behind Ragland (.602) and with eight touchdown passes, Gabbert will move into third all-time in program history ... ahead of Ragland.

"GAGE"ING INTEREST

Coming from a smaller school (Southeast Louisiana), Gage Larvadain did not receive much interest from the major programs, something Miami is thankful for. In his debut with the RedHawks, Larvadain had a game-high eight grabs for 80 yards versus the Hurricanes. He followed that up with eight catches for 273 yards and three scores versus UMass. Larvadain currently ranks eighth in the NCAA with 16 catches and is first with 353 receiving yards.

Retired Miami Numbers

#7 Ben Roethlisberger

Ben Roethlisberger took his place in Miami Football history when his jersey No. 7 was retired on October 13, 2007. Roethlisberger ended his three-year playing tenure (2001-03) as the most prolific passer in program history.

#40 Bob Hitchens

No. 40 was retired in 1973 to mark the accomplishments of tailback Bob Hitchens, who concluded his career as the most prolific runner in Miami history. At the end of his three-year tenure (1971-73), Hitchens owned Miami's season and career records for points, rushing touchdowns, rushing attempts and rushing yards.

#41 Travis Prentice

No. 41 was retired to honor Travis Prentice. Prentice ranks sixth all-time in NCAA history with 5,596 rushing yards and second in total touchdowns with 78. He continues to own four NCAA records.

#42 John Pont

Worn by halfback John Pont through three varsity football campaigns, No. 42 was retired by the Athletic Advisory Council following his senior season in 1951. Pont thus became the first athlete in Miami history to have his jersey retired.

TRENCH WARFARE

Miami's offensive line has two major holes to fill along the offensive line after losing both Rusty Feth and Caleb Shaffer to the transfer portal. Combined, those two started 69 games, dating back to 2019. Miami still has plenty of experience returning in 2023. Reid Holskey has started each of the last 28 games for the Red and White, followed by Sam Vaughan (14), Will Jados (12), Kolby Borders (11), Ben Jackson (4) and John Young (2).

TACKLING MACHINE

Linebacker Matt Salopek has 268 career tackles and has surpassed 100 stops in each of the past two years. With 100 tackles in 2023 he would become the first Miami player to secure 100-plus tackles in three-straight seasons since Matt Pusateri did the same from 2002-04.

NOTHING BUT NET

In his first year with the football program, Graham Nicholson did not disappoint. He finished the season 15-20 on field goals, including 6-of-7 on attempts between 40-49 yards. He added 30 touchbacks on 65 kickoffs in 2021. He was 18-for-22 on field goals in 2022. He also had his first game-winning field goal, connecting on a 36-yard field goal with 21 seconds to go in the 17-14 win at Northwestern. This season he is a perfect 3-for-3.

NEW-FACES NEW PLACES

The transfer portal has changed college football and Miami is no different. The RedHawks have 20 players on the team that transferred from other schools: Rashad Amos (South Carolina), Jordan Brunson (Virginia Tech), Jeremiah Caldwell (Louisville), Michael Dowell (Michigan State), William Hardrick (Mississippi State), Maddox Kopp (Colorado), Jackson Kuwatch (Ohio State), Gage Larvadain (Southeastern Louisiana), Miles Marshall (Indiana), Cade McDonald (Michigan State), Yahsyn McKee (Mercer), Keyon Mozee (Kansas State), Jalen Peterson (Indianapolis), Corey Suttle (Iowa State), Brian Ugwu (Rutgers), Joe Wilkins Jr. (Notre Dame), Cameron Williams (Indiana), Jayden Williams (Southern California), Ty Wise (Indiana) and John Young (Kentucky).

BROTHERLY LOVE

Miami's Kenny Tracy has been with the RedHawks since the 2020 season, while his brother Javon Tracy, redshirted in 2022 after competing in two games.

SEAN MCVAY JOINS CRADLE OF COACHES

This summer Miami added a 10th bronze statue to its Cradle of Coaches in Sean McVay. McVay, the current head coach of the Los Angeles Rams, joined Ara Parseghian, Paul Brown, Weeb Ewbank, John Harbaugh, John Pont, Carm Cozza, Bo Schembechler, Red Blaik, and Paul Dietzel in the south end of Yager Stadium.

GRADUATING CHAMPIONS

Before Miami even takes the field in 2023, 12 different RedHawks have already completed their undergraduate degree: Brendan Beattie, Jack Coldiron, Michael Dowell, Austin Ertl, Brett Gabbert, Ben Jackson, Miles Marshall, Cade McDonald, Camden Rogers, Matt Salopek, Sam Vaughan and Joe Wilkins Jr.

GAME 3 • CINCINNATI

Miami University, known world-wide as the “Cradle of Coaches,” contributed four alumni to *Sporting News Magazine’s* 50 Greatest Coaches, dominating all other universities.

PAUL BROWN (‘30) was named as the 12th greatest coach of all time by The Sporting News (TSN). Miamians WALTER ALSTON (‘35) and BO SCHEMBECHLER (‘51) ranked 35th and 36th on the list, while ARA PARSEGHIAN (‘49) was selected as sports’ 44th greatest coach. A fifth man with Miami ties, WOODY HAYES, ranked 27th on TSN’s list. Hayes served as Miami’s football coach from 1949-50.

The August 3, 2009 publication asked a panel of 118 top coaches, media and sports administrators to choose the Top 50 list.

Altogether, only four universities contributed more than one alumnus to the list. Miami’s four alumni topped Alabama (Paul “Bear” Bryant and Bobby Bowden), Minnesota (Bud Wilkinson and Herb Brooks) and Kansas (Dean Smith and Adolph Rupp), which each had two alums ranked among the Top 50. Purdue graduate John Wooden, the famed “Wizard of Westwood”, was ranked as the No. 1 coach of all time.



PAUL BROWN

An Ohio native who was a two-year football letter winner (1928-29), **Paul Brown** is a member of Miami’s “Cradle of Coaches” and excelled as a coach at the collegiate and professional levels. Brown was head coach at Ohio State (1941-43) and led the Buckeyes to their first national title in 1942. **Brown** then served as head coach at the professional level with the Cleveland Browns (1946-62) and Cincinnati Bengals (1968-75), winning championships in the All-America Football Conference and National Football League. **Brown** was elected into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1967.



WALTER ALSTON

Always displaying a calm, professional demeanor, the unflappable **Walter Alston** managed the Brooklyn and Los Angeles Dodgers for 23 seasons (1954-76), winning seven National League pennants and four World Series championships. His squads would win 2,040 games during his tenure, the seventh-highest win total among major league managers. He helped to establish a “Dodger Way,” which many of his former players later used to become successful managers themselves.



BO SCHEMBECHLER

A member of Miami’s “Cradle of Coaches” and the College Football Hall of Fame, **Bo Schembechler** was a two-year letter winner (1949-50) and head coach (1963-68) with the Red and White. During his six seasons as head coach, **Schembechler** led Miami to a 40-17-3 record and back-to-back conference co-championships (1965-66). **Schembechler** then became the head coach at the University of Michigan (1969-89) and led the Wolverines to 13 Big Ten titles.



ARA PARSEGHIAN

A member of Miami’s “Cradle of Coaches” and the College Football Hall of Fame, **Ara Parseghian** was a football letter winner (1946-47) before moving to the sidelines as an assistant coach (1950) and head coach (1951-55). During his five seasons as Miami’s head coach, **Parseghian** compiled a 39-6-1 record and won back-to-back Mid-American Conference Championships (1954-55). **Parseghian** went on to coach at Northwestern (1956-63) and Notre Dame (1964-74) where he was named National Coach of the Year in 1964.



WOODY HAYES

A member of Miami’s “Cradle of Coaches” and the College Football Hall of Fame, **Woody Hayes** served as the head coach of Miami during the 1949-50 and 1950-51 seasons. In his last year as head coach he led Miami to a 9-1 record and a MAC Championship, and also led his team to a victory in the Salad Bowl. Hayes went on to coach at the Ohio State University (1951-78) where he became a fixture for the Scarlet and Grey and quickly became recognized as one of the greatest coaches of all time. At OSU he compiled a 205-61-10 record (.761) and led the Buckeyes to five national titles, 13 Big Ten championships, and four bowl victories. He is a three-time winner of the College Football Coach of the Year Award.

In his career, Chuck Martin has more than 30 years in college coaching experience, including 15 years as a head coach. He has twice been named the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) National Coach of the Year, earning the honor in 2005 and 2006, and has coached in seven national championship games. In addition to his head coaching experience, Martin has served as a coordinator on both sides of the ball. Of those seven national championship game appearances, he has been a part of four national championship wins, with two titles under his direction as head coach/offensive coordinator and one as a defensive coordinator.

After taking over a team that had just gone 0-12, Miami was 4-18 in Martin's first 22 conference games. From there, the rest is history. Martin and the RedHawks are 34-16 in the MAC, best in the conference since 2016. The RedHawks won the 2019 MAC Championship with a 26-21 win over Central Michigan and advanced to the LendingTree Bowl. Miami has now been bowl eligible in six of the last seven years, including a trip to the Bahamas Bowl in 2022.

This was done year after year with strong recruiting classes. Miami's classes have been some of the best the school has ever seen. Over the last eight years, Miami's recruiting classes have ranked first each of the past two years (2021, 2022), second (2020), second (2019), sixth (2018), second (2017), second (2016) and third (2015) in the MAC. Those recruiting efforts have shown up at the highest level as well. Dating back to 2019, Miami has had a player selected in the NFL Draft three of the past four years.

Miami's turnaround began back in 2016 as Martin orchestrated something that had never been done in college football. Miami rattled off six straight wins to become the first team in college football history to begin a season 0-6 and finish 6-6. The six-game win streak also moved Miami to 6-2 in the MAC, finishing in a tie for first in the East and helped the RedHawks advance to the St. Petersburg Bowl versus Mississippi State, Miami's first bowl appearance since 2010.

Prior to joining Miami, Martin spent four seasons at Notre Dame, serving as the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach (2012-13) and defensive backs/recruiting coordinator (2010-11). In 2012, he orchestrated an offense that played in the BCS National Championship game versus Alabama. In 2011, he was named one of the top 25 recruiters in the nation by ESPN.com and was named to Rivals.com's Second-Team Assistant Coach Dream Team.

In Martin's two years calling plays, Notre Dame combined to go 20-5 overall and was one of the most balanced offenses in the country, averaging 26.4 points, 170.0 rushing and 235.6 passing per game.

Prior to arriving in South Bend, Martin was head coach and offensive coordinator for Grand Valley State University from 2004-2009 and compiled a 74-7 (.914) record, including an impressive 16-4 record in the NCAA Division II Playoffs. He and the Lakers won back-to-back national championships in 2005 and 2006 and finished runner-up in 2009. He directed Grand Valley State to 48 consecutive regular-season victories and 45 straight wins in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC). He also guided the Lakers to a Division II record 40-game winning streak from 2005-07. Martin produced seven Associated Press First-Team All-America players as head coach.

At GVSU, Martin's offenses averaged 35.1 points, 208 rushing and 427 total yards per game. The Lakers ranked among the top-25 nationally in total offense in five of six seasons and ranked in the top-27 in scoring offense in all but one season. In that time, his offense scored at least 30 points in 56 of 81 games and scored at least 40 points in 34 contests.

Many of those offenses were led by quarterbacks who were developed under

Martin. In six years, GVSU produced four Harlon Hill finalists, given annually to the NCAA Division II Player of the Year (Cullen Finnerty in 2006 and Brad Iciek from 2007-09). In that span, Laker quarterbacks threw 184 touchdown passes and just 41 interceptions.

His offenses were not just about the quarterback. In all six seasons, he produced a 1,000-yard rusher. In four of those seasons, a running back finished as a top-10 rusher in Grand Valley State history.

Before becoming head coach, Martin served as the defensive coordinator for the Lakers in 2003, helping GVSU win a national championship. Martin's defense allowed just nine total points in the final three games of the playoff run and among the ranked top-10 nationally in scoring, rushing and total defense that season.

Martin served as the defensive backs and outside linebackers coach at GVSU from 2000-02. Prior to arriving in Allendale, Mich., Martin spent time at Eastern Michigan (1998-1999, linebackers), Millikin University (1996-97, defensive coordinator/defensive backs), Wittenberg University (1994-95, linebackers) and Mankato State University (1992-93, graduate assistant/linebackers).

While attending Millikin (1986-90), Martin was an All-American safety and was selected as a GTE Academic All-American. He doubled as an All-American place kicker, received Academic All-District honors for the Millikin baseball team and was inducted into the Millikin Hall of Fame in 2008.

He graduated in 1990 with a degree in accounting and earned his master's degree in physical education from Mankato State University in 1993.

Martin and his wife Dulcie have two children, Max and Emma.
