OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

D'Eriq King • Houston • Jr. • QB • Manvel, Texas

King, who also was chosen as the Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week, tied the American Athletic Conference single-game record by figuring in seven touchdowns to lead Houston past No. 21/20 USF 57-36. King completed 28 of 40 passes for 419 yards and five touchdowns with two interceptions (one on a Hail Mary at the end of the first half) and rushed for a game-high 132 yards with two touchdowns on 12 carries. King, who had a career-high 551 yards of total offense against the previously unbeaten Bulls, enters Week 10 as the national leader in points responsible for (236).

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

James Wiggins • Cincinnati • So. • S • Homestead, Fla.

Wiggins made the game-winning play in overtime to give Cincinnati a 26-20 win at SMU, keeping the Bearcats a game out of first place in the American Athletic Conference East Division. With the Bearcats on defense to start overtime, Wiggins picked off a third-down pass over the middle and returned it 86 yards for a touchdown. Wiggins leads the Bearcats with three interceptions and scored his first career touchdown.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Cole Smith • Cincinnati • Fr. • K • Middletown, Ohio

Smith scored eight points, including a pair of second-half field goals, to help Cincinnati to a 26-20 win at SMU. Smith hit from 24 yards in the third quarter to give the Bearcats a 17-7 lead and he made a 41-yard attempt as time expired in the fourth quarter to force overtime.

Pow6rful Stuff

The American has 33 nonconference victories against other Power 6 opponents (including Notre Dame) since the start of the 2015 season, the first year of The American's current membership. American teams have seven Power 6 wins this season.

Fab Four

The American Athletic Conference and the SEC are the only FBS conferences that have four teams with one loss or fewer entering Week 10. The American has 7-0 UCF and 7-1 Cincinnati, Houston and USF. The SEC has Alabama at 8-0 and Georgia, Kentucky and LSU at 7-1.

The American has four bowl-eligible teams (UCF, Cincinnati, Houston, USF) through nine weeks of the season.

Pac Mentality

American Athletic Conference teams are a combined 4-0 against the Pac-12 since the start of last season.

We're Streaking

UCF's 20-game winning streak is the longest active winning streak nationally and is the longest in American Athletic Conference history. UCF broke the old record of 15-game winning streak set by Memphis from Oct. 25, 2014, to Nov. 7, 2015.

The Big Stage

UCF's 34-27 win against Auburn in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl last season improved American Athletic Conference teams to 3-0 all-time in New Year's Six Bowls.

Three For Three

The American Athletic Conference, the Big Ten and the Big 12 are the only conferences that have had at least three 10-win teams in each of the last two seasons.

Perfect 10

The American Athletic Conference has had three 10-win teams in each of the last two seasons. USF, Temple, Tulsa hit double figures in 2016, while UCF, Memphis and USF won at least 10 games each in 2017.

Offensive Outbursts

The American Athletic Conference has four of the top 10 teams nationally in total offense. Houston is the national leader at 571.1 yards per game, while UCF is sixth (537.1 ypg), Memphis is eighth (522.6 ypg) and USF is 10th (500.3 ypg).

Keep It Low

Cincinnati ranks ninth nationally in both total defense and scoring defense. The Bearcats have allowed an average of 289.3 yards and 15.8 points per game.

Ground And Pound

Navy is third the nation in rushing offense at 307.3 yards per game, trailing only Georgia Tech (366.5 ypg) and Army (314.6 ypg).

Ground And Pound (Part II)

Memphis RB Darrell Henderson ranks second nationally in rushing (143.5 ypg), while USF RB Jordan Cronkrite is fifth (133.3 ypg).

Making Their Points

Houston QB D'Eriq King is the national leader in points responsible for (29.5 ppg). King has accounted for 236 points, with 28 touchdown passes and 11 rushing TDs. UCF QB McKenzie Milton is fifth, with 22.0 points per game.

At A Loss

ECU DE Nate Harvey leads the nation in tackles for loss (2.6 per game) and is third nationally in sacks (1.21 per game). Houston DT Ed Oliver is second in tackles for loss (1.9 per game).

Bullies

UCF has gone 24-0 as a nationally ranked team as a member of the American Athletic Conference.

Air Traffic Controllers

Temple (93.89) and Cincinnati (97.98) rank third and fourth nationally in team pass efficiency defense.

Separation Of Powers

In the last four regular seasons (2015-18), the American Athletic Conference is a combined 36-13 against teams from Conference USA, the MAC, the Mountain West and the Sun Belt.

Heisman Hopefuls

UCF and Houston have launched formal Heisman Trophy campaigns on behalf of their most prominent players. Here is a look at how each has fared in 2018.

McKenzie Milton • QB • UCF

Finished eighth in the Heisman voting in 2017. Of the seven players who finished higher in the voting, only Stanford RB Bryce Love (second) and Wisconsin RB Jonathan Taylor (sixth) return in 2018

Has completed 119 of 200 passes (59.5 percent) for 1,797 yards and 16 touchdowns and four interceptions. Has rushed for six touchdowns and 204 yards.

Has accounted for at least five touchdowns in three of the six games he has played. Had had back-to-back games with six total touchdowns in wins against Florida Atlantic and Pitt.

Ed Oliver • DT • Houston

Consensus All-America and Outland Trophy winner in 2017.

Tabbed as the No. 1 player in college football by ESPN, CBS Sports and Sports Illustrated

Has 51 tackles, 13.5 tackles for loss, 3.0 sacks nine quarterback hurries and one pass defended.

Had 13 tackles with 1.5 tackles for loss in a win against Tulsa. Had 5.0 tackles for loss against ECU. Had five tackles, 2.0 tackles for loss and a sack against Navy.

Midseason Form

Memphis RB Darrell Henderson and Houston DT Ed Oliver were named to Midseason All-America teams by the Associated Press, Sporting News, Sports Illustrated, ESPN and CBS Sports. UCF S Richie Grant was named to the Sporting News team.

Fifth Anniversary Team

Twenty-two players on NFL rosters are among the 30 current and former American Athletic Conference players who have been named to the American Athletic Conference Fifth Anniversary Football Team.



Voting for the team was conducted in late June and early July. The team was selected based on three components – a fan vote, a vote of local and national media members, and a vote of the conference's 12 football programs.

Temple has won five of its last six games after the Owls scored a 24-17 overtime win against No. 20 Cincinnati in Week 8 ... The Owls were idle last week ... Temple has scored at least one non-offensive touchdown in six of its first eight games ... RB Ryquell Armstead leads the team with 626 rushing yards and six touchdowns, but has missed the last two games due to injury ... QB Anthony Russo has gone 5-1 as Temple's starter ... Russo has thrown for 1,410 yards and nine touchdowns with 10 interceptions ... WR Branden Mack has 29 catches for 316 yards and a team-high four touchdowns ... COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is a big success. Fans, including many who are new to the sport, enjoy it. The first College Football Playoff semifinals and national championship were the three most-viewed programs in cable television history.

Every Game Counts

The playoff preserves the excitement and significance of college football's unique regular season where every game counts.

Four Teams

The selection committee ranks the teams based on the members' evaluation of the teams' performance on the field, using conference championships won, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, and comparison of results against common opponents to decide among teams that are comparable.

Two Games, One Goal

The kickoff of the new year belongs to college football, with two semifinal games rotating annually among the Cotton Bowl, Fiesta Bowl, Orange Bowl, Peach Bowl, Rose Bowl and Sugar Bowl. The two teams winning the playoff semifinals compete for the College Football Playoff National Championship. That game is in a different city each year, always on a Monday night.

Universal Access

Every FBS team has equal access to the College Football Playoff based on its performance. No team automatically qualifies.

Governance

University presidents and chancellors from all 10 FBS conferences and Notre Dame serve on the CFP Board of Managers and govern the administrative operations, with commissioners (the Management Committee) managing the event. A small staff in the playoff office in Irving, Texas, carries out the detailed responsibilities.

Selection Committee

A talented group of high-integrity individuals with experience as coaches, student-athletes, college administrators and journalists, along with sitting athletics directors, comprise the selection committee. Members of the committee are: Rob Mullens (chair), Frank Beamer, Paola Boivin, Jeff Bower, Joe Castiglione, Herb Deromedi, Ken Hatfield, Chris Howard, Bobby Johnson, Ronnie Lott, Gene Smith, Todd Stansbury, and Scott Stricklin.

Selection Committee Responsibilities

- Rank the top 25 teams and assign the top four to semifinal sites.
- Assign teams to New Year's bowls
- Create competitive matchups
- Attempt to avoid rematches of regular-season games and repeat appearances
- Consider geography

Participants In New Year's Bowls

Both participants in the Orange, Rose and Sugar Bowls are contracted outside the playoff arrangement (Big Ten and Pac-12 to Rose Bowl; SEC and Big 12 to Sugar Bowl; ACC to Orange Bowl against the highest ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten and Notre Dame). If a conference champion qualifies for the playoff, then the bowl will choose a replacement from that conference. When those bowls host the semifinals and their contracted conference champions do not qualify, then the displaced champion(s) will play in one of the other New Year's bowls.

When not hosting semifinals, the Cotton, Fiesta and Peach Bowls will welcome displaced conference champions and the top-ranked champion from a non-contract conference. The highest-ranked available teams will fill any other berths. The selection committee will make the pairings.

BOWL PARTNERSHIPS

The American Bowl Lineup

In addition to the College Football Playoff and New Year's Bowls, The American has either a primary or secondary affiliation with 12 bowl games during its current six-year bowl cycle, which ends following the 2019 season. The American works annually with its member schools and bowl partners to create the most sensible and attractive postseason matchups.

The **Military Bowl presented by Northrop Grumman** takes place at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium in Annapolis, Maryland, while the events and activities surrounding the game are based in Washington, D.C. The American Athletic Conference will face an opponent from the Atlantic Coast Conference each year in the current cycle.

The **Birmingham Bowl** takes place at Legion Field in Birmingham, Alabama. The American/Big East has partnered with the bowl since its inception in the 2006 season. The American Athletic Conference will annually face an opponent from the Southeastern Conference.

The **Bad Boy Mowers Gasparilla Bowl** is played at Raymond James Stadium in Tampa, Florida. The American Athletic Conference will supply a team to the bowl during each year of the six-year cycle. Conference USA will play in the game in 2015, 2017 and 2019, while the Atlantic Coast Conference provides the opposing team in 2014, 2016 and 2018.

The **Cheribundi Tart Cherry Boca Raton Bowl** began in 2014 and will feature an American Athletic Conference team three times during the six-year cycle at FAU Stadium in Boca Raton, Florida. The American representative will play a team from Conference USA in 2018.

The **Frisco Bowl** will be played for the second time in 2018 as the former Miami Beach Bowl was relocated to Toyota Stadium in Frisco, Texas. An American Athletic Conference plays in the bowl each year.

The **AutoNation Cure Bowl** made its debut in 2015 at the newly renovated Camping World Stadium in Orlando, Florida. An American Athletic Conference team will be paired against an opponent from the Sun Belt Conference. Net proceeds from the game will benefit the Breast Cancer Research Foundation.

The **Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl** is played at Amon G. Carter Stadium on the campus of Texas Christian University. The American Athletic Conference sends a team to the bowl in 2014, 2016 and 2018. The opponent will be a Big 12 team in 2016 and 2018, with Conference USA as a secondary affiliation.

In addition to the conference's primary bowl affiliations, The American holds secondary partnerships with the **AutoZone Liberty Bowl** in Memphis, Tennessee, and the **Duck Commander Independence Bowl** in Shreveport, Louisiana, as well as with other ESPN-owned bowls.
