WEEKLY HONORS

OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

D'Eriq King • So. • QB • Houston • Manvel, Texas

King led Houston to a 28-24 win against No. 17/14 USF, snapping the Bulls' winning streak at 12 games. King took over at quarterback midway through the first quarter and completed 12 of 20 passes for 137 yards and a touchdown and rushed for 83 yards and two fourth-quarter touchdowns. With Houston trailing by three points, King converted a fourth-and-24 with 1:07 left in the fourth quarter to keep the final drive alive, a drive capped by King's 20-yard touchdown run with 11 seconds left to give the Cougars the winning points.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Genard Avery • Sr. • LB • Memphis • Grenada, Miss.

Avery becomes the third straight Memphis player to earn Defensive Player of the Week honors after he turned in a record-breaking performance in the Tigers' 56-26 win against Tulane. Avery finished with eight tackles, which included an American Athletic Conference-record 5.5 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks to go with quarterback hurry. Avery led a Memphis defense that set a school record with 13 tackles for loss and had seven sacks against the Green Wave.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Mike Hughes • Jr. • CB • UCF • New Bern, N.C.

Hughes had 105 yards on returns to help UCF to a 73-33 win against Austin Peay as the Knights improved to 7-0 for the first time in program history. Hughes had a 91-yard kickoff return for a touchdown and had a 14-yard punt return against the Governors. Hughes, who had three tackles on defense, enters this week as the national leader in punt return average (20.5 ypr). He is the only player in school history to have scored touchdowns on a kickoff return, a punt return and an interception return in his career and is the only player nationally to have done that this season.

In the last three regular seasons (2015-17), the American Athletic Conference is a combined 30-6 against teams from Conference USA, the MAC, the Mountain West and the Sun Belt.

Perfection

UCF is one of five remaining unbeaten teams nationally. The Knights, at 7-0, join Alabama (8-0), Georgia (8-0), Miami (Fla.) (7-0) and Wisconsin (8-0) as the FBS teams without a loss in 2017.

All Good Things ...

USF saw its 12-game winning streak snapped Saturday with a 28-24 loss to Houston. It had been the longest active winning streak nationally and was the second-longest winning streak in American Athletic Conference history (behind only Memphis' 15-game streak from 2014-15).

One If By Land

Navy leads all NCAA FBS teams in rushing offense (376.1 yards per game).

You Make Many Good Points

UCF leads the nation in scoring offense, averaging 51.0 points per game.

Caretakers

Three American Athletic Conference teams rank among the top eight nationally in turnover margin. USF is second in the nation at 1.75, while UCF is fourth (1.71) and SMU is eighth (1.25).

We'll Take That

USF leads the nation with 16 defensive interceptions, or two more than any other NCAA FBS team.

New Territory

UCF is 7-0 for the first time in program history.

Play On

At 6-2, SMU has clinched bowl eligibility for the first time since the 2012 season.

Which Of These Is Not Like The Others

Navy QB Zach Abey is ranked second among all NCAA FBS players in rushing (163.1 yards per game), trailing only Stanford's Bryce Love (198.1 ypg). Abey is the only quarterback among the top 10 rushers nationally.

Thirtysomething

USF saw its streak of consecutive games with at least 30 points end at 24 games following the loss to Houston. It was the longest such streak in the AP poll era of college football (since 1936).

The Company We Keep

Three American Athletic Conference teams (UCF, Memphis and USF) were ranked in the Oct. 29 Amway Coaches poll.

Multiplicity

The American has had at least three teams ranked in the same week 12 times in its history as of Oct. 29. The American had a record four teams ranked in the polls of Nov. 15, 2015.

American Strong

USF head coach Charlie Strong is a combined 19-2 as an American Athletic Conference coach. Strong went 12-1 with Louisville in the 2013 season when the Cardinals were members of the conference and is 7-1 with USF.

Body Of Work

USF LB Auggie Sanchez ranks third among active FBS players in career tackles (357). Tulane CB Parry Nickerson is fourth with 13 career interceptions. Memphis WR Anthony Miller is fourth in career receiving yards (2,987).

Rank And File

USF finished the 2016 season ranked No. 19 in the Associated Press and USA Today national polls. It was the first time in school history that USF was ranked in the final poll of a season.

Poll Positions

Along with the ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12 and SEC, The American is one of six leagues to have at least one ranked team in the final national polls in each of the last four years.

Rank And File

Temple (No. 24) and Navy (No. 25) were ranked in the final College Football Playoff poll of the 2016 season, marking the second straight season that The American finished with at least two ranked teams.

December Plans

Four American Athletic Conference teams have clinched bowl eligibility in 2017. USF, UCF, Memphis and SMU have assured themselves of postseason play thus far.

Navy won its first five games of the season, but the Midshipmen enter Thursday's game looking to shed a two-game slide ... Navy fell 31-21 at UCF Oct. 21 and had a bye in Week 9 ... The Midshipmen have committed an uncharacteristic eight turnovers in the last two games after having only six turnovers in the five previous games in 2017 ... COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is a big success. Fans, including many who are new to the sport, enjoy it. The first College Football Playoff semifinals and national championship were the three most-viewed programs in cable television history.

Every Game Counts

The playoff preserves the excitement and significance of college football's unique regular season where every game counts.

Four Teams

The selection committee ranks the teams based on the members' evaluation of the teams' performance on the field, using conference championships won, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, and comparison of results against common opponents to decide among teams that are comparable.

Two Games, One Goal

The kickoff of the new year belongs to college football, with two semifinal games rotating annually among the Cotton Bowl, Fiesta Bowl, Orange Bowl, Peach Bowl, Rose Bowl and Sugar Bowl. The two teams winning the playoff semifinals compete for the College Football Playoff National Championship. That game is in a different city each year, always on a Monday night.

Universal Access

Every FBS team has equal access to the College Football Playoff based on its performance. No team automatically qualifies.

Governance

University presidents and chancellors from all 10 FBS conferences and Notre Dame serve on the CFP Board of Managers and govern the administrative operations, with commissioners (the Management Committee) managing the event. A small staff in the playoff office in Irving, Texas, carries out the detailed responsibilities.

Selection Committee

A talented group of high-integrity individuals with experience as coaches, student-athletes, college administrators and journalists, along with sitting athletics directors, comprise the selection committee. Members of the committee are: Kirby Hocutt (chair), Frank Beamer, Jeff Bower, Herb Deromedi, Chris Howard, Tom Jernstedt, Bobby Johnson, Jeff Long, Rob Mullens, Dan Radakovich, Gene Smith, Steve Wieberg and Tyrone Willingham.

Selection Committee Responsibilities

- Rank the top 25 teams and assign the top four to semifinal sites.
- Assign teams to New Year's bowls
- Create competitive matchups
- Attempt to avoid rematches of regular-season games and repeat appearances
- Consider geography

Participants In New Year's Bowls

Both participants in the Orange, Rose and Sugar Bowls are contracted outside the playoff arrangement (Big Ten and Pac-12 to Rose Bowl; SEC and Big 12 to Sugar Bowl; ACC to Orange Bowl against the highest ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten and Notre Dame). If a conference champion qualifies for the playoff, then the bowl will choose a replacement from that conference. When those bowls host the semifinals and their contracted conference champions do not qualify, then the displaced champion(s) will play in one of the other New Year's bowls.

When not hosting semifinals, the Cotton, Fiesta and Peach Bowls will welcome displaced conference champions and the top-ranked champion from a non-contract conference. The highest-ranked available teams will fill any other berths. The selection committee will make the pairings.

BOWL PARTNERSHIPS

The American Bowl Lineup

In addition to the College Football Playoff and New Year's Bowls, The American will have either a primary or secondary affiliation with 12 bowl games during its current six-year bowl cycle. The American works annually with its member schools and bowl partners to create the most sensible and attractive postseason matchups.

The **Military Bowl presented by Northrop Grumman** takes place at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium in Annapolis, Maryland, while the events and activities surrounding the game are based in Washington, D.C. The American Athletic Conference will face an opponent from the Atlantic Coast Conference each year in the current cycle.

The **Birmingham Bowl** takes place at Legion Field in Birmingham, Alabama. The American/Big East has partnered with the bowl since its inception in the 2006 season. The American Athletic Conference will annually face an opponent from the Southeastern Conference.

The **Bad Boy Mowers Gasparilla Bowl** is played at Tropicana Field in St. Petersburg, Florida. The American Athletic Conference will supply a team to the bowl during each year of the six-year cycle. Conference USA will play in the game in 2015, 2017 and 2019, while the Atlantic Coast Conference provides the opposing team in 2014, 2016 and 2018.

The **Boca Raton Bowl** began in 2014 and will feature an American Athletic Conference team three times during the six-year cycle at FAU Stadium in Boca Raton, Florida. The American representative will play a team from either the Mid-American Conference or Conference USA in 2016.

The **Frisco Bowl** will be played for the first time in 2017 as the former Miami Beach Bowl was relocated to Toyota Stadium in Frisco, Texas. An American Athletic Conference plays in the bowl each year.

The **Hawai'i Bowl** is played on Hawaiian Airlines Field at Aloha Stadium on the campus of the University of Hawaii. The American Athletic Conference will participate in the bowl in 2015, 2017 and 2019, facing an opponent from the Mountain West.

The **AutoNation Cure Bowl** made its debut in 2015 at the newly renovated Citrus Bowl in Orlando, Florida. An American Athletic Conference team will be paired against an opponent from the Sun Belt Conference. Net proceeds from the game will benefit the Breast Cancer Research Foundation.

The **Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl** is played at Amon G. Carter Stadium on the campus of Texas Christian University. The American Athletic Conference sends a team to the bowl in 2014, 2016 and 2018. The opponent will be a Big 12 team in 2016 and 2018, with Conference USA as a secondary affiliation.

The **Bahamas Bowl** is played in at Thomas A. Robinson Stadium in Nassau, Bahamas. The American Athletic Conference will face the Mid-American Conference or Conference USA in 2016 and 2018.

The **RSL Carriers New Orleans Bowl** is held at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome in New Orleans. The American Athletic Conference has agreed to play in the bowl in 2018 and 2019.

In addition to the conference's primary bowl affiliations, The American holds secondary partnerships with the **AutoZone Liberty Bowl** in Memphis, Tennessee, and the **Independence Bowl** in Shreveport, Louisiana, as well as with other ESPN-owned bowls.
