STORY LINES

- The University of Cincinnati men's soccer team travels to Louisville for an important meeting with the No. 5/9 Cardinals on Oct. 28 at 7 p.m. in Cardinal Park.
- Cincinnati is currently seventh in the Red Division with nine points. The top six teams earn spots in the BIG EAST tourney. UC has just two league contests remaining and needs results in its final two matches to earn berth in the BIG EAST Championship.
- UC's 2-0 loss at No. 6/7 USF on Oct. 3 was its second against a Top 10 ranked team this season. UC also dropped a 3-0 decision to No. 1/1 Akron on Sept. 13 in the finale of the adidas Bearcat Classic.
- UC's 1-0 win vs. Notre Dame on Sept. 27 was televised live on CBS College Sports Network. UC's last televised match came at St. John's on Halloween night in 2008. The Bearcats fell, 2-0, to the Red Storm.
- Head coach **Hylton Dayes** is in his ninth season at Cincinnati and 19th season as a head coach overall. Dayes is 176-156-41 overall and 80-71-21 at UC. With the win against Dayton in the 2009 season opener, Dayes moved past Jim McDowell into sole possession of second place in coaching wins in program history. Bob Muro is the program's winningest head coach at 114-111-13.
- After a 5-2 victory over No. 18 Dayton on Sept. 1, UC defeated Canisius 5-0. It marked the first time the Bearcats have scored five or more goals in back-to-back matches since the 1983 season. UC defeated Virginia Tech, 10-2, before falling at Bellarmine by a 7-6 count.
- A 3-0 win over Western Illinois pushed the Bearcats' record to 4-0-0 for the first time since 1989, when UC finished with a school-record 14 wins (14-4-1).
- UC has scored 23 goals in the first 16 matches of the season after tallying just 13 scores in 19 matches in 2008.
- Junior forward **Branden Stelmak** (*Broadview Heights, Ohio/Brecksville-Broadview Heights*) took home two awards in the season's opening week, being named to the BIG EAST Honor Roll on Monday, Sept. 7, and being named to the *Collegesoccernews.com* National Team of the Week. Stelmak scored three goals in the first three matches and is tied for the team lead with three goals, four assists, and 10 points.
- Redshirt freshman defender **Kit North** (*Columbus, Ohio/Bishop Watterson*) was named BIG EAST Rookie of the Week on Sept. 7. North, who scored his first career goal in his first career appearance against Dayton on Sept. 1, helped lead the defense to consecutive shutouts.
- **Miguel Rosales** (*Aurora, Colo./Smoky Hill*) posted three shutouts in his first four appearances of the season. He moved ahead of teammate **Matt Williams** (*Portland, Maine/Cheverus*) and into a tie for seventh in school annals with his 11th career shutout against Pittsburgh. Williams pulled even with his 11th career shutout at Notre Dame.
- The Bearcats return 10 starters from last year's squad, including leading scorer Branden Stelmak and goalkeeper Matt Williams, who posted nine shutouts a season ago.
- The Bearcats have experience in goal as Williams - the 2008 starter - and Miguel Rosales, who started all but one match in 2007, return this season.
- Williams posted his second career assist from his goalkeeper position against Dayton. He cleared a Dayton crossing pass out of his own end and onto the foot of **Nick Weightman** (*Lanark, Scotland/*

Webber International), who scored his second career goal on the breakaway.

- UC is looking for its fifth consecutive trip to the BIG EAST Tournament. The Bearcats have qualified for the conference tourney in each of the first four years of affiliation with the powerful soccer league. UC won the school's first BIG EAST regular season title in 2006.

WEIGHT OF THE WORLD

- Junior Nick Weightman tallied a goal and three assists in UC's season-opening 5-2 win at No. 18 Dayton on Sept. 1. The Scotland native surpassed his 2008 production in one game (2008: 1 goal, 1 assist, 3 points).
- Weightman became the first Bearcat to record three assists in a match since current MLS star Omar Cummings posted three helpers against Louisville on Sept. 26, 2006.
- Weightman is tied for fourth in the NCAA in single-game assists with three vs. Dayton on Sept. 1.

LAST TIME OUT

- UC dropped a 2-1 decision to St. John's on Oct. 24, Senior Night, in Gettler Stadium.
- The Bearcats drop to 8-8-0 overall, 3-6-0 in league play, and sit in seventh place in the Red Division of the BIG EAST, one spot out of a berth in the BIG EAST Tournament.
- St. John's (5-2-8, 4-1-4 BIG EAST) got on the board in the 33rd minute. Tadeu Terra sent a free kick into the box. Matt Williams made the initial save, but the rebound was put in by Sverre Wegge Gundhus for his fourth goal of the season.
- Sophomore D.J. Albert got UC a goal in the 47th minute. The midfielder collected a clearance by the St. John's defense and dribbled through traffic and into the Red Storm box before converting a right-footed shot for his second goal of the season, knotting the match at 1-1.
- In the 69th minute, St. John's netted the winner on another set piece. Nelson Becerra sent a corner kick into the box. A header by Josh Faga was punched aside by Williams, but Trevor Chiduku headed in his first of the season to send UC to its third straight loss.
- Prior to the match, UC honored seniors Luke Henke and Judson McKinney.

UP NEXT

- UC will wrap up the 2009 regular season on Halloween, Oct. 31, at Syracuse. The Bearcats and Orange will kick off at 7 p.m.

HEAD COACH - HYLTON DAYES



Hylton Dayes has compiled a diverse background of experience as both a successful coach and an accomplished player.

Dayes is in his ninth season as head coach at Cincinnati but his 24th in the college coaching ranks. He led the Bearcats to their third-ever appearance in the NCAA championships after winning the program's first BIG EAST title in 2006. As an assistant coach, Dayes helped develop teams that made three appearances in the NCAA championships. As a player, he earned all-

America honors in all four seasons of competition as Wright State University.

In four seasons in the BIG EAST, one of the nation's top soccer conferences, the Bearcats have won a division title, earned eight postseason all-conference awards, and made an NCAA appearance. Dayes has authored seven wins against nationally-ranked opponents over the last four seasons, including a victory against No. 1 Connecticut in 2005.

Dayes led UC to just its second NCAA Tournament appearance in school history and a regular season C-USA title in 2003, garnering C-USA Coach of the Year honors. He produced a winning conference record in each of his first four years at UC.

A 1988 graduate of Wright State, Dayes compiled a 32-37-8 record in four years as head coach of his alma mater's men's team, highlighted by an 11-7-3 slate and the program's first ever appearance in the Midwestern Collegiate Conference Tournament final in 1998.

Dayes began his coaching career at Wright State, serving as the men's assistant in 1986 and the head women's coach from 1987-1994. During his tenure, the Raiders amassed a 64-48-11 slate.

In 1994, Dayes left Wright State to become the men's assistant at James Madison, helping direct the Dukes to a 51-13-6 record and three straight NCAA Tournament appearances, including trips to the Elite Eight in both 1994 and 1995. Dayes returned to Wright State in 1997 to head up the men's program.

Prior to joining the coaching ranks, Dayes enjoyed a distinguished playing career at Wright State from 1982-1985. A four-time all-Mideast, all-Ohio and team MVP selection, Dayes is the only athlete in school history to be named all-American all four years of his career. He also is one of three student-athletes to have his jersey retired at the school.

Dayes played on the professional level for the Dayton Dynamo of the National Professional Soccer League for two seasons and the Orlando Lions of the American Professional Soccer League for one year.

A native of Kingston, Jamaica, Dayes graduated with a degree in electrical systems engineering. He is a former chair of the NSCAA board and chairman of the Black Soccer Coaches Committee, as well as a Region II Olympic Development Program coach. He is accredited with the NSCAA Advanced National Coaching diploma, the USSF National A license, as well as being a member of the NSCAA National Academy Coaching Staff.
