



THE STORYLINES . . .

- Tulsa is in its 125th season of Tulsa football.
- Tulsa has the smallest FBS enrollment with 2,929 undergraduate students (based off 2020-21 statistics) ... Tulsa's overall enrollment is 3,961 ... Cincinnati's enrollment is 46,798 students.





THE SERIES . . .

- This is the 36th meeting between Tulsa and Cincinnati.
- Tulsa leads the overall series 17-16-2, including an 11-4-2 record at home and a 6-12 mark on the road.
- Cincinnati has won the last two meetings, both in Cincinnati ... Tulsa's last win was in the 2016 season with a 40-37 overtime win at home.
- Tulsa's longest winning streak in the series is 8 games (1965-75) and Cincinnati's is 5 games (1993-2015).

REMATCH OF AAC CHAMPIONSHIP...

- After two regular season contests were postponed and then eventually canceled, the two teams finally met in the American Athletic Conference Championship game on Dec. 19 in Cincinnati.
- Cincinnati took a 10-0 lead after one guarter and led at the half 17-10 ... the Hurricane knotted the score at 17-17 on an 8-yad Deneric Prince run at the 10:05 mark of the third quarter.
- Cincinnati went ahead at 7:14 mark of the third period 24-10.
- After Jaxon Player blocked a UC field goal attempt in the 4th quarter, Tulsa marched 80 yards in seven plays and quarterback Zach Smith capped the drive with a 13-yard TD toss to JC Santana with 3:41 remaining in the game.
- Cincinnati took the ensuing kickoff and held onto possession for a game-winning 34-yard Cole Smith field goal as time expired.

QUICK HITS . . .

- Tulsa has five players who have played in 50 career games Robert Revels III (55), Adam Higuera (53), Tyarise Stevenson (52), Cristian Williams (51), Tiller Bucktrot (51).
- Tulsa has had five plays for scrimmage of 60 yards or more 88, 78, 75, 63 and 61 including three that went for touchdowns.
- Anthony Watkins had a 78-yard run from scrimmage and a 97-yard kickoff return last week against Navy.
- Davis Brin is the 15th different quarterback in school history to reach 2,000+ passing yards in a single season.
- Last week, Navy completed 0-of-4 passes against Tulsa's defense.
- On his third carry vs. Memphis, Shamari Brooks surpassed 3,000 career rushing yards, making him only the fifth player in school history to do so.





PHILIP MONTGOMERY IN SEVENTH SEASON LEADING TULSA FOOTBALL PROGRAM . . .

- Philip Montgomery is in his 7th season as the Golden Hurricane head coach and has an overall 34-45 head coaching record.
- He became the 29th head coach in school history on Dec. 11, 2014.
- Montgomery grabbed his first coaching win against a ranked opponent in his 14th game against a top-25 team with a 34-26 win over #11 UCF in the 2020 season ... he became the first TU coach to defeat two top-25 ranked teams in the same season when Tulsa defeated #19 SMU.
- Montgomery was named The Dodd Trophy Coach of the Week, as named by the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Foundation after Tulsa's 21-point comeback over SMU.
- He ranks 8th on the school's all-time head coaching wins list with 31 victories.
- * He took his third Tulsa team to a Bowl game in 2020 with an appearance in the Lockheed-Martin Armed Forces Bowl.
- Montgomery completed his second season in 2016 leading the Tulsa football program to a 10-3 record and a win in the Miami Beach Bowl.
- Montgomery claimed his first career head coaching victory in the 2015 season opener with a 47-44 overtime win over FAU.
- In his first year, he led Tulsa to six wins and to the 2015 Camping World Independence Bowl.
- Before coming to Tulsa, he spent seven years at Baylor, where he spent the final three seasons as the offensive coordinator/QB coach.

MISSING PIECES...

- · Tulsa has missed some integral pieces of its offense and defense this year.
- Defensively, starters DE Cullen Wick (2), NKL Cristian Williams (4), SAF Kendarin Ray (2), SAF TieNeal Martin (1), LB Justin Wright (1) have all missed games this season ... Ray (Ohio State 1st half) and Jaxon Player (Houston 1st half) missed one half of a game due to targeting calls.
- On offense, WR Keylon Stokes (4), RB Deneric Prince (2) and LT Tyler Smith (1) have missed games.

100 . . .

- Tulsa has had three different runners rush for 100+ yards this season for a total of six 100+ rushing games.
- In addition, three Hurricane receivers have combined for six 100+ receiving games.
- On the ground, Shamari Brooks has three 100-yard rushing games (155 vs. Arkansas State, 126 vs. Memphis and 145 at South Florida) ... Deneric Prince had 151 yards against UC Davis and 110 vs. South Florida ... Anthony Watkins had 115 yards against Arkansas State.
- Thru the airways, Josh Johnson has had over 100 yards in three games 149 vs. Ohio State, 127 vs. Arkansas State and 140 vs. Memphis.
- Sam Crawford had back-to-back receiving games with 105 vs. Arkansas State and 101 vs. Houston, while JC Santana has his first 100+ receiving game of the season with 109 yards against Navy.

IN THE AMERICAN . . .

- DE Cullen Wick's 7.5 TFL ranks second in The American for tackles for loss yards.
- Sophomore punter Lachlan Wilson is ranked second in the AAC for punting with a 47.3 average, trailing Tulane's Ryan Wright's 47.7 average.
- WR Josh Johnson is fourth in the AAC for receiving yards per game (71.6 ypg) ... Johnson is second for receptions per game with a 6.14 average.
- WR Sam Crawford Jr. is ranked 10th (57.1 ypg) and JC Santana 11th (56.9) for receiving yards per game
- PK Zack Long is one of two place-kickers with more than one attempt that is tied for the league's lead for field goal percentage (10-of-10).
- CB Travon Fuller has team-highs of eight pass breakups and two interceptions to rank fourth in the AAC for passes defended per game with 10 (1.25 pg)
- RBs Shamari Brooks (5th) and Deneric Prince (6th) are ranked among the AAC's top-10 for rushing yards per game ... Anthony Watkins ranks 16th.
- QB Davis Brin is third in the league for average passing yards per game (261.9) ... Brin is also ranked third for total offense (262.8).

WATKINS BUSTS OUT...

- Tulsa runners have 12 runs for 20+ yards this season, while Anthony Watkins has four of those, including the two longest runs from scrimmage.
- Watkins had a 75-yard TD run against Arkansas State and a 78-yard run against Navy.
- He also added the longest kickoff return since 2012 when he took a kickoff against Navy back 97 yards for a touchdown.
- On the year, Watkins averages a 9.0 average on 40 rushing attempts and a 27.0 return average on six kickoff returns.

MISLEADING STAT...

- Statistically, Tulsa ranks 102nd nationally for points allowed, giving up 30.9 points per game.
- A closer look at the stats show that Tulsa's defense has allowed 6.2 points less at 24.7 points (198) per game.
- Tulsa opponents have scored four times on special teams for 28 points and three times on defense for another 21 points for a total of 49 points.
- Without the defensive and special teams scores, the 24.7 points allowed per game would rank Tulsa 63rd nationally.

NOT THE GOOD KIND OF RETURNS . . .

- Tulsa opponents have returned three kicks, one punt and three interceptions for scores this season against the Hurricane.
- Tulsa gave up a kickoff (93) and punt return (63) against Arkansas State, and a kickoff return (100) and interception return (69) by South Florida for touchdowns ... despite the scores, Tulsa won both games.
- Against Oklahoma State, a 98-yard kickoff return in the fourth quarter was the difference in a 5-point loss to the Cowboys.
- Opponents average 30.9 points against the Hurricane this season, but only 24.7 of those points has been given up by the defense ... an average of 6.2 points this season for the opposition has come special teams or defensive returns.

TWO OF OUR OWN . . .

- Tulsa has scored two times off an interception and on special teams as well this year.
- LB Justin Wright had a 55-yard interception return for a TD against Oklahoma State, and Anthony Watkins had a 97-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the Navy game this season.
- In school history, Tulsa has had 10 more kickoff returns longer than Watkins' 97-yard, including four 100-yarders and six covering 98 yards.

500+ IN TOTAL OFFENSE . . .

- Tulsa has gone over 500 yards in total offense in three games and over 400 in five contests.
- Tulsa gained a season-high 663 yards on 74 plays for a 9.0 average per play against Arkansas State ... the Hurricane gained 343 yards passing and 308 yards on the ground.
- A week before, Tulsa totaled 501 yards against No. 9-ranked Ohio State, throwing for 428 and rushing for 73 yards.
- The last time Tulsa had back-to-back 500+ total offensive games came in 2017 with 667 vs. Louisiana and 548 yards at Toledo.
- The last time Tulsa went over 600 yards in a game came in the 2019 season finale with 669 yards at East Carolina.
- Tulsa also had 535 yards against South Florida.
- Tulsa has now gone over 500 yards in the Philip Montgomery era in 27 games, registering an 18-9 record.

ON THE OTHER SIDE OF 500 . . .

- In the last 41 games, Tulsa's defense has given up more than 500 total yards just three times
- Two teams Ohio State and Memphis have accomplished that feat this year ... OSU gained 508 yards and Memphis had 614 on 99 plays.
- Currently, Ohio State ranks second in the nation for total offense (548.1 ypg) and Memphis is ranked 20th (462.6 ypg)
- The previous 500+ total offensive game in that stretch was by Oklahoma State with 506 yards in 2019.

COMEBACK WINS...

Since Philip Montgomery took over as head coach in 2015, Tulsa has had 19 games in which the Hurricane has trailed and come back to win . . . in the 2015 season, 11 points against SMU was the biggest deficit that Tulsa came back to win Tulsa also trailed by 10 points vs. FAU in the season opener, and twice against Tulane to come back to win . . . in 2016, Tulsa had its biggest come-from-behind win in school history and second-biggest in NCAA Division I history (now 3rd), trailing 31-0 at Fresno State in the second quarter and winning 48-41 in overtime ... the next largest comeback win was 21 points in 2020 against SMU.

QUICK STRIKE . . .

- Tulsa has had six scoring drives under one minute this season ... three against Arkansas State, one vs. Memphis and two at South Florida.
- Against Arkansas State, Tulsa had four scoring drives less than 1:20, including one that covered 1:13 and three drives under one minute.
- Before that game had zero drives under one minute and only four under two minutes.
- Tulsa's three sub-one-minute drives in the ASU game were also one-play drives ... Tulsa scored 21 points in 0:29 on those one-play drives.
- Tulsa scored in 0:12 on an 88-yard pass from Davis Brin to Sam Crawford ... Brin hit JC Santana on a 34-yarder in 0:06 ... Anthony Watkins' 75-yard run took just 0:11 off the clock.
- Tulsa's fourth sub-one-minute scoring drive vs. Memphis came right before halftime, taking only 0:27 off the clock.
- The Hurricane turned in a 4-play scoring drive that took 0:58 off the clock and another one-play, 37-yard drive in 0:06, both at South Florida.

UNDER MONTY...

- In 79 games under Philip Montgomery, Tulsa has scored over 40 points 25 times and has posted a 20-5 record when doing so.
- Tulsa has gone over 500 yards of total offense in 27 games under Montgomery for an 18-9 record.
- The Golden Hurricane has gone over 600 yards 10 times under Montgomery, including this year's 663 this year against Arkansas State ... Tulsa had a high game of 667 yards in 2017 against Louisiana-Lafayette.
- Tulsa has 14 300+ yard rushing games in the Montgomery era, with a school record eight in 2016, three in 2017, two in 2019 and one this season (308 vs. Arkansas State).
- Tulsa is 12-1 when two players have gone over 100 rushing yards in the same game since 2015 under Montgomery ... the last time that happened came this year against South Florida with 145 yards by Shamari Brooks and 110 yards by Deneric Prince.
- Tulsa has three 400+ rushing games under Montgomery, two coming in back-to-back games in 2017 (424 vs. Louisiana, 423 at Toledo) and one in 2016 (470 vs. UConn).

BROOKS SURPASSES 3,000 YARDS...

- Running back Shamari Brooks, who missed the 2020 season with an ACL injury, became just the fifth player in school history to surpass 3,000 career rushing yards ...
- He reached the 3,000-yard mark on his third carry against Memphis (10/9) and now has totaled 3.288 vards on 694 career attempts in 40 career games.
- The senior from Tulsa's Union High School came into the 2021 season ranked 5th on the school's career rushing list with 2,700 yards.
- Brooks had his 15th career 100+ rushing game with 145 yards on 23 carries at South Florida ... he also added 126 yards on 26 carries against Memphis and 155 yards on 22 carries against Arkansas State.
- He has scored four rushing TDs this season to give him 27 career touchdowns ... he is now in 5th place on the school's career list for rushing TDs.
- Brooks is now 227 yards shy of moving into a 4th place tie with Trey Watts (2010-13 3,515 yards) on the school's all-time rushing chart.

DEFENSE TOTALING UP TACKLES FOR LOSS...

- In eight games, Tulsa's defense has totaled 50 TFL for -154 yards to rank 33rd nationally.
- Among Tulsa's total TFL this season, 16 have been credited as sacks for -87 yards.
- A total of 17 players have recorded at least one TFL for lost yards, while defensive end Cullen Wick leads the way with 7.5 for -23 TFL ... fellow lineman Jaxon Player is next with seven TFL for -18 yards.
- Tulsa turned in high games of 10 TFL for -31 yards vs. Arkansas State and six sacks for
- The Hurricane had nine TFL in each of the first two games, including nine TFL for -20 yards in the season opener against UC Davis and nine TFL for -32 yards at Oklahoma State.





MAYO CLINIC COMEBACK POY CANDIDATE BURNETT HAS CAREER BEST...

- Tulsa senior linebacker Yohance Burnett is a nominee for the Mayo Clinic Comeback Player of the Year Award
- Burnett has suffered two ACL injuries since joining the Tulsa football team from Navarro Junior College in 2018.
- He suffered his first ACL injury to his right knee during the 2018 preseason camp ... last year in preseason camp, Burnett tore his left ACL forcing him to miss his second season in three years.
- · In Tulsa's last outing, Burnett had a career-high 13 tackles against Navy.
- In eight games, Burnett now has totaled 52 tackles to rank second on the team this season ... he has career totals of 86 tackles and six TFL for -11 yards in 20 career games.
- Ten times during the 2021 college football season, three inspiring student-athletes from all levels of college football who have overcome injury, illness, or other challenges, will be recognized as Mayo Clinic Comeback Player of the Year Nominees.

THE WRIGHT CHOICE . . .

- Junior linebacker Justin Wright ranks third on the team in tackles with 45, despite missing the season opener.
- * Over the last 3 games, Wright has totaled 29 tackles, 4.5 TFL for -17 yards, 3.5 sacks for -16 yards, one forced fumble and one QB hurry.
- In a 32-31 win at South Florida, Wright had a team-high 7 tackles, 2.5 TFL for -9 yards and one QB hurry ... he was named the AAC's Defensive Player of the Week for his performance.
- Against Memphis, Wright had a career-high 14 tackles, while adding two TFL for eight yards, one sack for -7 yards and one forced fumble.
- He has 8 tackles in Tulsa's last outing against Navy.
- Wright has been in the starting lineup since last year for 15 games and has tallied 99 tackles in those starts ... he has also totaled 13.5 TFL for -40 yards in those 15 starts and earlier this year had his first career interception, a 55-yard TD return against Oklahoma State.

WICK MAKES A DIFFERENCE...

- After an injury-riddled 2020 season that saw him play in only six of Tulsa's nine games, senior defensive end Cullen Wick has been a nuisance for opposing offenses this year despite only playing in six of Tulsa's eight games.
- Wick came into the season with 9.5 TFL for -59 yards in 30 career games.
- In six games this year, Wick has compiled 7.5 TFL for -23 yards to lead the Hurricane ... he ranks 15th nationally for tackles for lost yards ... Wick missed the Memphis and South Florida games ... he also missed most of the Navy contest.
- He has had at least a half TFL in 5 games this year and has two or more in two games.
- Wick had a season-high 2.5 TFL for -7 yards against Arkansas State.
- In his career, Wick now has 17 TFL for -82 yards and 6.5 sacks for -59 yards.

DAVIS LEADING THE WAY

- Senior cornerback Tyon Davis has taken over the team lead for tackles with a total of 53 stops, including 41 solos.
- He had a career-high 11 tackles twice this year Arkansas State and Memphis ... Davis had nine solos and two assists vs. ASU and 10 solos and one assist vs. Memphis.
- He also has seven pass breakups, which ranks second on the team ... Davis had a career-high three PBUs against South Florida.

FULLER, THE DEFENDER...

- Texas A&M transfer Travon Fuller is in his first season at Tulsa and has started all seven games at cornerback.
- Thru eight games, Fuller has 21 tackles, including 13 solos, and team-highs of eight pass breakups and two interceptions.
- He ranks fourth in the AAC and 12th nationally for passes defended with 10.
- Against Memphis, Fuller had a 44-yard interception return and four pass breakups, while adding four tackles.



DREW PEARSON IS FOURTH-TULSA PLAYER TO JOIN PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME...

- Dallas Cowboy legend and Tulsa star receiver Drew Pearson was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame as part of the Class of 2021 on Aug. 8.
- Pearson became the fourth former Tulsa student-athlete to receive induction into the Hall of Fame.
- The Tulsa alumni that Pearson joined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame are Bob St. Clair, a 1990 inductee, and 1995 inductees Jim Finks and Steve Largent.
- Pearson became just the 22nd undrafted player to ever make the Pro Football Hall of Fame.
- Mr. Clutch as he became known signed as an undrafted free agent by the Dallas Cowboys in 1973.
- He went on to an 11-year NFL career and had 489 receptions for 7,822 yards and was selected to the All-Pro team three years.
- Pearson was named to the NFL's 1970s
 All-Decade team and played on three Super
 Bowl teams with the Cowboys.

WHERE TULSA'S FOOTBALL HALL OF FAMERS RANK ...

- Tulsa is one of 173 schools with at least one Pro Football Hall of Fame inductee.
- Tulsa has 4 inductees Bob St. Clair, Jim Finks, Steve Largent and Drew Pearson.
- There are only 21 schools that have 5 or more Pro Football Hall of Fame inductees, and another 10, including Tulsa with 4 inductees.
- Pro Football Hall of Famers from schools in the State of Oklahoma Oklahoma (5), Tulsa (4), Oklahoma State (2).
- Here's the count in the American Athletic Conference ... SMU (5), Tulsa (4), Navy (2) and Memphis (1) ... Wichita State, which no longer sponsors football, has one.



JAXON'S A PLAYER . . .

- Senior defensive tackle Jaxon Player has been a solid force for the Tulsa defense since his true freshman season of 2018.
- Player has totaled 110 career tackles, 24 TFL for -57 yards, 4.5 sacks for -15 yards, two fumble recoveries, one PBU and one forced fumble in 36 career games.
- He has totaled 27 tackles, 7 TFL for -18 yards, 1.5 sacks for -9 sacks, five QB hurries, one PBU and one fumble recovery this season.
- Against South Florida with the Bulls leading 31-26 and 3rd-and-1 from their own 42-yard line he and teammate Treyvon Reeves shut down Jaren Mangham for no gain ... on the next play, 4th-and-1 from the same spot, Player made the stop on Mangham again for no gain ... Tulsa took possession at the USF 42 and scored the game-winning TD in a nine-play drive.
- Player was a first-team all-AAC performer last year.
- He has been named to the watch lists for the 2021 Chuck Bednarik Award and the Bronko Nagurski Trophy, going to college football's top defender.

BRIN GOES OVER 2,000 . . .

- Before this year, Davis Brin's only significant playing time resulted in a 266-yard performance last year against Tulane.
- Brin became the 15th different player in school history to surpass 2,000 passing yards in a single season and the 25th time it has happened.
- In his eight career starts, all coming this year, Brin has completed 149-of-257 passes for 2,095 yards and 11 TDs.
- He has thrown for over 200 yards in six of eight starts, including two games over 350 yards.
- Brin threw for 355 yards against Arkansas State, giving him his second straight game throwing for over 350 yards ... he also threw for a career-high three TDs in the ASU game, as his TD throws covered 88, 34 and 17 yards.
- A week before, Brin had a career-best 428 yards and two TDs against No. 9-ranked Ohio State in just his 7th career game.
- The 428 yards is the 11th best passing performance in school history and just the 19th time a Tulsa quarterback went over the 400-yard plateau.
- Brin's 31 completions and 54 attempts at OSU were also career highs for the Tulsa junior.
- His 428 yards was the most passing yards for a Tulsa quarterback since Dane Evans threw for 421 yards against Memphis on Oct. 23, 2015 against #17 Memphis.

GROUP EFFORT BY RECEIVERS...

- With 2,500+ career receiver Keylon Stokes missing four games this year due to injury, the Hurricane passing game has been a group effort by Tulsa receivers.
- Three Tulsa receivers have combined for six 100+ receiving games and have also combined for 1,512 yards and eight TDs on 101 receptions.
- Josh Johnson leads the way with 45 receptions for 600 yards and three TDs, followed by 457 yards and 4 TDs on 25 receptions by Sam Crawford Jr. and JC Santana with 455 yards and one TD on 21 catches.

STOKES SURPASSES 4,000 CAREER ALL-PURPOSE YARDS . . .

- Senior receiver and kick return specialist Keylon Stokes entered the 2021 season ranked third on the school's career all-purpose vardage chart with 3,956 yards.
- In the opener, Stokes totaled 116 all-purpose yards and went over the 4,000-yard plateau.
- Stokes now has 4,148 career all-purpose yards thru four games this season ... Stokes has missed the Ohio State, Arkansas State, South Florida and Navy games with an injury.
- Damaris Johnson (2008-10) ranks first on the all-purpose chart with 7,796 yards and Trey Watts (2010-13) is second with 5,877 career yards.
- In 46 career games, Stokes has caught 166 passes for 2,549 yards, has 61 kickoff returns for 1,253 yards, 227 rushing yards and 119 punt return yards.
- Stokes is ranked ninth on the school's career receiving chart with 2,549 yards and is 794 yards shy of Howard Twilley's (1963-65) school record of 3,343 yards.

- Junior Deneric Prince opened the season with a career-best 151 yards and one TD vs. UC Davis.
- He averaged 10.8 yards per carry in the opener with his second career 100+ rushing game.
- Prince also had his second career rushing TD of 55+ yards with a 59-yard touchdown run in the third quarter ... he had a career-long 62-yard TD run last season against USF.
- Prince missed the Houston and Memphis games but returned against South Florida and had his second 100+ rushing game of the year and third of his career with 110 yards on 19 carries.
- In six games this season, Prince has totaled 406 yards and three TDs on 74 carries for a 5.5 average per carry.

GRADUATE TRANSFERS DEBUT...

- Tulsa had two graduate transfers in the starting lineup defensively in the season opener.
- Jon-Michael Terry, a transfer from Oklahoma, started at linebacker and Texas A&M graduate transfer Travon Fuller was a starting cornerback.
- Terry had nine tackles and one sack for a 3-yard loss against UC Davis.
- Fuller had three tackles, all solos, one TFL for -4 yards and two pass breakups for the Hurricane.
- Fuller started at Oklahoma State and Ohio State, while Terry came off the bench at linebacker in those two contests.
- Before coming to Tulsa, Terry played in 42 games and had eight starts at Oklahoma with 52 tackles ... Fuller played in 40 games at A&M but did not have a start ... he totaled 21 stops in his A&M career.
- Terry has since been sidelined with a season-ending injury. ... in four games, Terry has 15 tackles, two TFL for -5 yards and one sack for -3 yards.
- On the year, Fuller has 21 tackles, 2.5 TFL for -6 yards, eight pass breakups and two interceptions in eight games.

GRADUATES...

- Tulsa has 20 total players this season who have already graduated, including 17 who have spent their entire careers at Tulsa.
- There are three graduate transfers among the group of 20 graduates playing this season.
- The offensive players include Abe Anderson (TE), Dante Bivens (OG), Seth Boomer (QB), Dylan Couch (OG), Sam Crawford Jr. (WR), Cannon Montgomery (WR), Ezra Naylor II (WR) and Josh Stewart (WR).
- * Defensively, the graduates are Yohance Burnett (LB), Tyon Davis (CB), Deven Lamp (DL), TieNeal Martin (S) Bryson Powers (NKL), Treyvon Reeves (LB) Robert Revels III (LB), Jon-Michael Terry (LB), Elijah Taylor (DL) and Cristian Williams (NKL).
- Special Teams players include Adam Higuera (DS) and Zack Long (PK).
- The graduate transfers are Naylor II, Terry and Taylor.

LONGEVITY FOR CRISTIAN...

- Tulsa's nickel safety Cristian Williams is in his seventh season in a Tulsa uniform.
- Williams redshirted as a freshman in 2015, played in 13 games in 2016 and 12 in 2017.
- He played in the first two games of the 2018 season and following the second game (Texas), it was revealed that his playing career would come to an end when diagnosed with Arnold Chiari Type 1 malformation.
- He had taken to the whistle helping coach the rest of the season, but in February 2019 decided to have a surgery that could land him back in uniform.
- Williams was cleared to return to the football field in July 2019.
- Since then, he has started all 24 games that he has played in, 12 in 2019, eight in 2020 and four this season ... Williams has missed the Oklahoma State, Ohio State, South Florida and Navy games.

- Only 9 teams in the nation came into the season with 9 or more players with starts, including Minnesota with 10 each ... other schools with 9 are Arkansas State, Florida State, Fresno State, Miami (Fla.), Michigan State, SMU and UTSA.
- Tulsa entered the year with 121 starts among its 9 players on the offensive line, with 110 at Tulsa and 11 by Bryce Bray at Oklahoma State ... among those 9 players, Tulsa now has 161 starts among the offensive linemen.
- Tulsa starts looks like this ... Chris Paul (36), Gerard Wheeler (28), Dylan Couch (25), Tyler Smith (18), X'Zauvea Gadlin (16), Dante Bivens (16), Bryce Bray (16 including 11 at OSU), Tiller Bucktrot (5) and Jaden Muskrat (1).

NEVER PLAYED FOOTBALL UNTIL COMING TO TULSA...

- Tulsa punter Lachlan Wilson and place-kicker Zack Long never played American football before coming to Tulsa.
- Long was already attending Tulsa when in the spring of 2019 he decided to give kicking on the collegiate level a try and walked on to the Hurricane roster ... he played prep soccer in Missouri and came to Tulsa in 2017 to attend school.
- He handled kickoff duties in 2019 and added placements in the 2020 season.
- Long is a graduate student working on his MBA... he was put on scholarship the week of the season opener.
- Wilson came to Tulsa in 2019 from Melbourne, Australia, without a scholarship and redshirted that year before receiving a scholarship.
- He had never played American football, but did play Australian Rules Football for the Heidelberg Football Club.

A HIGUERA IN 9 OF THE LAST 10 YEARS . . .

- The 2021 season is the fifth straight year that Adam Higuera handles Tulsa's long snapping duties.
- It's the ninth season out of the last 10 that a Higuera has been Tulsa's long snapper.
- Adam's older brother, Rey, was Tulsa's long snapper from 2012-15, playing in 51 career games since starting his first game as a freshman at Iowa State.
- The only year there wasn't a Higuera snapping on placements and punts was in 2016 when those chores were handled by Robert Hill.
- The younger Higuera started his first career game as a true freshman in 2017 at Oklahoma State as he scored a TD in that game on a fumbled punt.
- Adam Higuera has now played in 53 career games.
- A Higuera has handled long snapping duties at Tulsa in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020 and now 2021.

CHRIS PAUL MORE THAN A FOOTBALL PLAYER . . .

- A three-year starter, Chris Paul has started 36 contests in 40 career games played ... he has started games at right tackle, left guard, right guard and left tackle in his career.
- Paul was a second-team American Athletic Conference selection in 2020 at right tackle.
- Paul is a member of the NCAA Division I Football Oversight Committee, a committee he was named to this past July.
- Last February, he was added to the NCAA Committee to Promote Cultural Diversity and Equity (CPCDE).
- Paul also serves as the chairperson of The American's SAAC executive board through the 2021-22 academic year and is the AAC's representative to the NCAA Division I Student-Athlete Advisory Committee.
- Paul has personified the meaning of student-athlete, excelling academically and athletically while serving the community.
- A top-10 freshman in 2018-19, Paul has volunteered at the Children's Hospital at Saint Francis, Read Across America, Lift Up America and at the Community Food Bank of Eastern Oklahoma.

- Elijah Taylor is in his first year at Tulsa as a graduate transfer and is in his seventh year on a college football roster ... he began his career in 2015 at Notre Dame and played there through the 2017 season.
- Taylor went to Eastern Kentucky and played in 21 games with 49 career tackles from 2018 to 2020.

FIVE OR MORE...

- Tulsa has a total of 10 players playing in at least their fifth season, including 7 at Tulsa and 3 graduate transfers.
- NKL Cristian Williams has now played in 6 seasons after redshirting in 2015.
- LB Robert Revels III has now also played games in 6 seasons ... he received a medical redshirt season in 2018 after playing in 2 games.

- Other finalists for the award included Jeff Casteel and Jeff Koontz from West Virginia, Notre Dame's Clark Lea, Auburn's Travis Williams and Georgia coaches Dan Lanning and Glenn Schumann.
- Gillespie tutored Consensus All-America linebacker and the 2020 Chuck Bednarik, Bronko Nagurski Trophy and the Lombardi Award Winner Zaven Collins.
- Under Gillespie's direction, the Tulsa defense was ranked second in The American for total defense, scoring defense, rushing defense, pass defense and pass defense efficiency.

DEFENSIVE IMPROVEMENT SINCE MOVING TO 3-3-5...

- Since the 2018 season when Tulsa's defense transitioned to the 3-3-5 scheme, the Hurricane has shown immense improvement since the 2017 campaign.
- In that first season of the 3-3-5, Tulsa held opponents to 121.2 yards less in total offense, 89.3 yards less in passing, 31.9-yards less in rushing and 10.4 less points.
- The Hurricane finished that 2018 season ranked 8th in NCAA for fewest passing yards allowed, 10th for 4th down conversions, 22nd for fumbles recovered, 41st for pass efficiency defense and 44th for red zone defense.
- Since the start of the 2018 season, Tulsa has allowed only three of its last 41 opponents over 500 yards of total offense as compared to 7 games in 2017 (506 yards by OSU in 2019; Ohio State 508 yards and 614 yards by Memphis, both in 2021).
- In 2019, Tulsa held the opposition to 394.8 yards of total offense, which was the first sub-400+ yearly offensive total since the 2012 season (347.8 ypg).
- Tulsa allowed 333.6 yards in 2020 which was the fewest for an opposing offense since 296.8 yards in 2006.
- In the 2020 season, Tulsa's defense ranked among the nation's best 18th for passing yards and 19th for total defense.

WHY GOLDEN HURRICANE?

Enter the name Howard Acher as the Tulsa head coach in 1922. When he took over the position, Acher saw great potential in his team and wanted to publicize it by creating a new identity with a new nickname. Sports writers and others had called the school by any number of names from the Presbyterians to the Orange and Black, to the Kendallites.

After an opening day win against a strong Texas Christian University team in 1922, Acher put his mind to work. The press had claimed that the Kendall football team blew through its opponents like a tornado. So, it figured that Tornadoes, would be the nickname with "golden" added to identify the color of the uniforms. However, it was later found that Georgia Tech had claimed that name, so from tornado it was evolved meteorologically to a hurricane. Thus the squad voted, and the name "Golden Hurricane" became the new team moniker with the gold added because of the jersey color.

TU lived up to its nickname as the Golden Hurricane blew through the Texas A&M defense in the next game with pass after pass from quarterback Rex Thomas. TU won its first game as the Golden Hurricane by a score of 13-10.

WHAT YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT TULSA'S FOOTBALL TRADITION . . .

- Tulsa was the first school to play in five straight New Years Day Bowl Games
 Sun Bowl (1-1-42), Sugar Bowl (1-1-43), Sugar Bowl (1-1-44), Orange Bowl (1-1-45) and Oil Bowl (1-1-46).
- Ellis Jones, an All-American guard in 1945, was a one-armed player. He was the defensive standout for the College All-Star team vs. the Chicago Bears in 1945.
- Four former TU football players are enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame. They are Bob St. Clair, Jim Finks, Steve Largent and Drew Pearson
- Two former Tulsa players finished runner-up in the Heisman Trophy voting
 quarterback Jerry Rhome in 1964 and receiver Howard Twilley in 1965.
- Perhaps the greatest Tulsa football player of all-time is Glenn Dobbs (1940-42). He was also head coach of the Hurricane teams in the 1960's. Eighth Street which runs north of H.A. Chapman Stadium was dedicated as Glenn Dobbs Drive on Oct. 21, 2000. A statue of Dobbs was erected outside the stadium and dedicated before the 2013 spring game.
- Zaven Collins may have staked claim to the greatest Tulsa football player when the consensus All-America linebacker was also named college football's top defender in 2020 by winning the Chuck Bednarik and Bronko Nagurski awards.
- Former TU players Glenn Dobbs, Howard Twilley and Jerry Rhome — are enshrined in the College Football Foundation Hall of Fame.
- Other former TU players went on to the NFL — Steve Largent, Drew Pearson, Rickey Watts, Don Blackmon, David Alexander, Jerry Ostroski, Gus Frerotte, Dennis Byrd, Tom Miner, Steve August and Gus Frerotte — to name a few.
- Coaching in the NFL Tulsa has had four former players serve as head coaches in the NFL — Tommy Hudspeth (Detroit Lions); Sam Rutigliano (Cleveland Browns); Ray Rhodes (Philadelphia Eagles and Green Bay Packers); and Lovie Smith (Chicago Bears and Tampa Bay Buccaneers).
- Tulsa has three former players and two former coaches who have been inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame. The players are Glenn Dobbs, who also coached the Hurricane, Howard Twilley and Jerry Rhome . . . the coaches are Francis Schmidt (1919-21) and John Cooper (1977-84).

A LOOK AT TULSA'S CONFERENCE HISTORY

- Tulsa is in its 7th season as a member of the American Athletic Conference
- Tulsa began its membership in The American on July 1, 2014 after nine years as a member of Conference USA
- Tulsa opened its' tenure in the American Athletic Conference with a 38-31 double overtime victory against Tulane in the 2014 season opener.
- The American is the sixth conference affiliation for the Tulsa football program, while the previous five include: Oklahoma Collegiate Conference (1914-28), Big Four Conference (1929-32), Missouri Valley Conference (1935-85), Western Athletic Conference (1996-2004) and Conference USA (2005-13).
- Tulsa was an independent for 12 years, coming between the Missouri Valley and its entrance into the WAC in 1996.
- In nine years as a C-USA member, Tulsa compiled a 49-23 regular season league record and a 2-2 mark in C-USA Championship Games – Tulsa was 2-1 against UCF in C-USA title games and 0-1 against East Carolina, both now members of the American Athletic Conference.
- Tulsa made its first AAC Championship game appearance in 2020, falling to No. 6-ranked Cincinnati 27-24 on a field goal as time expired.

As Dickson watched football team practices in 2020, he often times was teased by student-athletes as being the "OG AD" (old guy AD) and "we need hats like that". That's when Dickson went to work taking one of his Panama hats and turned to Shameka Wilkerson and her sister Shaee, who owns Perfect PartiZ, to decorate the hat 'blue and gold' with a red feather added, and so began Tulsa's "Panama 'Cane JuJu Hat", which is simply called by TU players as the 'Juju' hat.

The "Juju" hat debuted in Tulsa's 42-13 win over USF. The hat is used as a reward for scoring a touchdown and any other game-turning play.

UC Davis 19, Tulsa 17

Sept. 2, 2021 (Thursday) • H.A. Chapman Stadium

TULSA, Okla. — Three turnovers and 122 yards in penalties was enough to seal defeat for the Tulsa Golden Hurricane on Thursday night against the FCS' 23rd-ranked UC Davis Aggies by a score of 19-17 at H.A. Chapman Stadium.

The Aggies scored its lone touchdown on the game's opening possession and were held to four field goals the remainder of the game. Tulsa scored on a 41-yard Zack Long field goal, a one-yard run by Steven Anderson and a 59-yard rush by Deneric Prince.

Prince ended the contest with a game-high 151 yards, while Shamari Brooks added 80 yards as the Hurricane outgained UC Davis on the ground 247 yards to 88. UC Davis did its damage through the air, collecting 311 yards.

Tulsa held a 448 to 399-yard edge in total offense. The Aggies converted 10-of-19 third downs, while Tulsa managed just 2-of-10 on third downs.

The Hurricane threatened to take control of the game several times but turnovers came at the UC Davis 18, 47 and 8-yard line.

With the score tied 10-10 at halftime, Tulsa's opening second-half drive went just 13 yards in six plays. The Aggies took its possession 87 yards in nine plays and took a 13-10 lead on an Isaiah Gomez's 22-yard field goal. Tulsa wasted little time in taking the lead, scoring 1:20 later, when Deneric Prince raced 59 yards for a touchdown, capping a 4-play, 78-yard drive.

UC Davis cut Tulsa's lead to one point, 17-16, on Gomez's third field goal of the night with 11:09 remaining.

The Aggies second interception put the ball at the Tulsa 5-yard line, and again the Hurricane defense bowed up and held UC Davis to three points, but it was enough for the visitors to take a two-point lead at 19-17 with 7:35 remaining in

Tulsa took the subsequent possession 74 yards in eight plays to the UCD 12yard line when Keylon Stokes hauled in a reception at the 8-yard line but a forced fumble saw the ball bounce out of the end zone, thus ending any Tulsa scoring

STILLWATER, Okla. — Tulsa made it a five-point game with three minutes remaining in the contest but fell 28-23 to the Oklahoma State Cowboys in the Bank of Oklahoma Turnpike Classic.

Tulsa held the Cowboys to just seven points in the first 45 minutes, but the home team scored 21 in the fourth quarter to claim its ninth straight series win in front of 52.127 fans at Boone Pickens Stadium.

The Hurricane took a 17-14 lead at the 10:56 mark on the game clock, but OSU returned the kickoff 98 yards to take a four-point lead, 21-17. Ohio State 41, Tulsa 20 Sept. 18, 2021 • Ohio Stadium

COLUMBUS, Ohio — Tulsa had the No. 9-ranked Ohio State Buckeyes on the ropes late in the fourth quarter before the home team added two scores in the final three minutes for a 41-20 victory Saturday afternoon at Ohio Stadium.

The Hurricane amassed 501 total yards with 428 of those coming through the air. Davis Brin completed 31-of-54 yards and added two touchdown tosses.

TreVeyon Henderson led the Ohio State offense with 277 rushing yards and three touchdowns, but the heralded Buckeyes receiving corps was held intact with only 185 yards through the air.

Ohio State led 13-6 at halftime, but Henderson put some separation on the scoreboard with a 48-yard scamper on the Buckeyes' first second-half possession to give the home team a 20-6 lead.

The Hurricane scored its first TD of the game when Brin connected with Cannon Montgomery on a 21-yard catch and run to cut its deficit to seven points at 20-13, capping a 48-yard, 5-play drive with one minute remaining in the third quarter. But, the Buckeyes relied on their offensive star of the day when Henderson tallied his third rushing TD with a 52-yard jaunt to put the Buckeyes up by a score of 27-13.

Tulsa responded at the 12:07 mark of the fourth quarter with 22-yard toss from Brin to Johnson to bring the score to within seven points at 27-20. The score capped a 75-yard, six play drive for the Hurricane.

Tulsa's defense shut down the Buckeyes on their next possession and the Hurricane offense got to the OSU 43-yard line when a sack on 3rd-and-7 forced the visitors to punt. Ohio State responded with a 65-yard, 7-play drive to make the score 34-20 and then an interception returns of 61 yards capped the scoring for the Buckeyes with less than two minutes to play.

TULSA, Okla. — The Navy Midshipmen scored 17 second-half points to grab a 20-17 victory over Tulsa in front of 16,279 fans at H.A. Chapman Stadium.

Navy scored on all three of second-half possessions to overcome a 10-3 deficit. After a first half that saw the Hurricane defense limit the Midshipmen to just three points, the Navy option attack came alive after halftime and scored 17 points. On its first two second-half scores, Tulsa totaled 155 yards in 25 plays and taking 13:53 off the clock.

The Midshipmen took that possession from their own 20-yard line for its second straight touchdown, going 80 yards in 15 plays to take its first lead of the game, 17-10, at the 11:25 mark of the fourth period.

It was a defensive struggle in the first 30 minutes as the two teams combined for 292 yards, but 142 of them came on just two plays. Tulsa's Watkins had a 78-yard run and Navy's Carlinos Acie had 64 yards on a run from scrimmage.
