UC RENEWS 'RIVER CITY RIVALRY' AFTER 66-POINT, 667-YARD OPENER

- Fresh off a 66-point, 667-yard offensive explosion to open the season, the Cincinnati football team will hit the road to renew its 'River City Rivalry' with Pitt on Saturday night at Acrisure Stadium.
- The Bearcats and Panthers were BIG EAST rivals, playing every year from 2005 to 2012. The 2009 matchup served as the de
 facto BIG EAST Championship game with UC overcoming a 21-point first-half deficit to win 45-44 on a touchdown pass from
 Tony Pike to Armon Binns with 33 seconds left at Heinz Field in Pittsburgh. The win propelled Cincinnati into the Sugar Bowl.
- The game will be televised on The CW Network at 6:30 pm. and over radio on 102.7 FM WEBN.

SATTERFIELD ERA STARTS FAST, FEATURES PLENTY OF SCORING

- Cincinnati routed EKU, 66-13, to win its 22nd straight home opener at Historic Nippert Stadium on Saturday, giving first-year head coach Scott Satterfield the victory in his debut for the Bearcats.
- The first TD of the Satterfield era couldn't be more fitting. On fourth-and-5 from midfield, Satterfield dialed up a 49-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Emory Jones to wide receiver Xzavier Henderson for the first score of the season.
- Cincinnati scored the ninth-most points (66) in school history, totaled the seventh-most yards (667) and tossed for the
 sixth-most passing yards in school history (438) with starter Emory Jones hanging 345 on the Colonels and backup Brady
 Lichtenberg adding 94 yards on 4-of-4 passing. Six different receivers scored touchdowns, including Henderson, Braden Smith,
 Dee Wiggins and Barry Jackson Jr., who all had TD catches of at last 35 yards.
- Junior running back Corey Kiner rushed for his second 100-yard game of his career, totaling 105 yards on 13 carries.
- · On defense, senior outside linebacker Daniel Grzesiak had a team-best seven stops, two TFLs, a forced fumble and a FR.

JONES CAPTURES BIG 12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS AFTER 7 TDS

- Quarterback Emory Jones collected Big 12 Offensive Player and Newcomer of the Week honors after throwing more touchdowns (5) than incompletions (4) and setting a school-record with 7 TDs in a 66-13 win over EKU in his Cincinnati debut.
- Jones started 10-for-10 and ended up leading the Bearcats to touchdowns on all six possession in the first half.
- The La Grange, Ga., native had 325 yards and four TDs before the break and finished 19-of-23 for 325 yards and five touchdowns to go along with 26 yards and two TDs rushing. It marked his second career seven-TD game (Samford, 2021).
- The former UF QB also collected SEC Offensive POTW after passing for 209 and rushing for 144 against Tennessee in 2021.

SERIES AT A GLANCE

- Pittsburgh leads the all-time series 8-4 overall and 5-2 at home. However, the Bearcats have won the last two meetings in the Steel City, a 26-23 win in 2011 and the classic Pike-to-Binns victory that secured the 2009 undefeated regular season.
- The Bearcats have actually won four of the last five meetings in the series.
- In the last meeting, UC opened the 2012 season with a resounding 34-10 win over Pitt in Nippert Stadium. The Bearcats were led by current defensive line coach Walt Stewart, who finished with nine tackles, 3.5 TFLs and two sacks.
- Satterfield faced Pitt twice as the head coach at Louisville, winning 24-10 at home in 2022 and falling 23-20 at Pitt in 2020.
- Cincinnati RG Luke Kandra made his first career start vs. Pitt while at Louisville last season.

BEARCATS RETURN TWO ALL-AMERICANS, INCLUDING THE GODFATHER

- Cincinnati returns a pair of Associated Press Third Team All-Americans in redshirt sophomore nose tackle Dontay Corleone and junior punter Mason Fletcher. The pair is on the 2023 All-Big 12 preseason team.
- Corleone, nicknamed The Godfather, burst on the scene as a redshirt freshman in 2022, finishing as the nation's highest-graded defensive player (93.8) by Pro Football Focus. His 94.7 run grade from PFF was the best mark since Micah Parsons in 2019.
- Fletcher is arguably the nation's best punter. The Melbourne, Australia native was a Ray Guy Award finalist in addition to collecting AAC Special Team Player of the Year honors in 2022.
- Fletcher's 46.3 average ranked fourth nationally and is the best 2022 average among returning punters in college football.
- · His lone punt in the season opener (45 yards) nearly was downed inside the 5-yard line before rolling into end zone.

NUMBERS AND NOTES ...

- QB Emory Jones has 55 career total TDs, two 7-TD games, two 300-yard passing games, 21 starts, two P5 conference POTW awards.
- The Bearcats went to back-to-back NY6 Bowls from 2020-21, and are the only G5 team to advance to the CFP (2021).
- · Cincinnati is 660-599-50 (.523) all-time and is playing its 136th football season in 2023 (since 1885, one of 10 oldest in FBS).
- UC returned only one starter on offense: center Gavin Gerhardt, who started all 13 games in 2022.
- Fifth-year senior Jowon Briggs is married and just had his third child on Friday, Aug. 25, with his wife, Nyjae. He was a First Team All-AAC defensive tackle in 2022. A Cincinnati native, he started his career at Virginia before transferring to UC in 2021.
- Defensive Coordinator Bryan Brown's Louisville defense led the nation with 50 sacks in 2022.

Following the game, a complete postgame statistics package will be distributed via email and will contain a scoring summary, final team statistics, final individual statistics, complete play-by-play, drive charts for both halves, halftime statistics, defensive statistics, substitution chart, postgame quotes from both head coaches and players and postgame notes.

Head Coach Scott Satterfield will be available to the media every Tuesday at noon ET during the season with the exception of UC's bye week. The press conference is streamed live on ESPN+ and @GoBearcats. Players will be made available at the discretion of the coaching staff.

- Pitt's quarterback Phil Juerkovec completed 17 of 23 passes for 214 yards and scored two touchdowns, one in the air and one one on the ground. Running back Rodney Hammond Jr. ran for a pair of touchdowns. As a team, Pitt rushed for 217 yards on 45 carries (4.8 avg.).
- The Panthers improved to 28-6 under head coach Pat Narduzzi when rushing for at least 200 yards.

JONES' NAMED BIG 12 POTW

- Jones was named the Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week and Newcomer of the Week on Monday following his seven-touchdown performance in his Bearcats' debut on Saturday in the 66-13 victory over EKU.
- Jones had more touchdown passes (five) than incompletions (four) and finished 19-of-23 for 345 yards and five touchdowns with no interceptions through the air.
 He added two rushing scores and 26 yards on the ground.
- While at UF, he was the SEC Co-Offensive Player of the Week following a standout performance in a win over Tennessee in 2021. He led the Gators to a 38-14 victory over the Volunteers by totaling 209 yards and two touchdowns passing and 144 yards rushing.
- Saturday marked the second seven-touchdown game of Jones' career, as well. He totaled seven touchdowns (six passing, one rushing) during a 550-total-yard performance against Samford in 2021.

JONES FEEDS EVERYONE

- Emory Jones' 49-yard, 4th-and-5 touchdown pass on the opening drive to former Florida teammate Xzavier Henderson was a sign of things to come.
- Jones accounted for a school-record 7 TDs (5 pass, 2 rush), and all five passes were to different receivers. The last UC QB with 5 passing TDs was Gunner Kiel in 2015 vs UCF.
- He also he had three more TDs accounted-for than the next-closest Big 12 quarterback in Week 1.
- Henderson postgame said "I have to call him the lunch lady today, because he was feeding everybody."

SATTERFIELD ERA BEGINS ON FIRE

- Freshman Barry Jackson Jr. scored on a 65-yard catch-andrun from redshirt-sophomore Brady Lichtenberg on his firstcareer reception, capping a historic offensive performance.
- The 667 yards were seventh in school history, while the 66 points were ninth and the most since 2013. The program record for the latter is 124 against Transylvania in 1912.
- Satterfield now has 12 games of 600-plus yards as a head coach. While at Louisville, he had 687 against Duke in 2021 and 600-plus against Boston College and Syracuse in 2019 (full listing on page 10).

RIVER CITY RIVALRY RETURNS

- Cincinnati and Pitt are meeting for the first time since 2012 and 13th overall.
- The Bearcats took the last meeting, 34-10, in 2012 in the final Big East football season.
- The 2009 matchup served as the de-facto Big East championship game, as the Bearcats came back from a 31-10 deficit and won 45-44 to complete an undefeated regular season and earn a berth in the Sugar Bowl against Florida. Tony Pike's winning deep-ball touchdown pass to Armon Binns in the snow lives in UC lore.

THAT CINCINNATI CONNECTION

- Pittsburgh has a pair of coaches that have spent time in
 the Cincinnati football program. Pittsburgh's head coach
 Pat Narduzzi spent three years (2004-06) as defensive
 coordinator under head coach Mark Dantonio at Cincinnati
 helping the Bearcats to a pair of bowl invitations. He
 would lead the defenses that secured bowl wins in the Fort
 Worth Bowl (2003) and the International Bowl (2005), the
 second and third bowl victories in UC program history.
- Pitt linebackers coach Ryan Manalac was a standout linebacker for UC from 2005-2008. A walk-on who would earn a scholarship, he compiled nearly 200 tackles during his career. As a senior he collected a team-high 82 stops to help Cincinnati win the 2008 Big East title and advance to the Orange Bowl.
- Other Cincinnati connections include Pitt's head strength and conditioning coach Michael Stacchiotti, who was the associate director of football sports performance at Cincinnati during the 2017 season and redshirt sophomore defensive back Tamarion Crumpley, who is a Cincinnati native.

THE X-FACTOR

- Senior WR Xzavier Henderson totaled a career-best 149
 yards on a career-best-tying seven catches, including the
 first TD of the 2023 season for the Bearcats a 49-yard
 touchdown on a 4th-and-5 pass from Emory Jones. He
 added 26 yards on kick returns to lead all Big 12 players
 with 174 yards of all-purpose yards during Week 1 action
- He was PFF's highest-graded receiver (92.5) in Week 1.
- A transfer from Florida, he led the Gators in receptions (38) in 2022 and was a coveted recruit who held offers from Alabama, Georgia and LSU among others. He won the Florida 4A state 400m title in a blazing fast 46.77 time and was a U.S. Army All-American.

GET TO KNOW THE BEARCATS

- The University of Cincinnati Department of Athletics competes at the highest level of intercollegiate athletics with the vision to reach Next Level Success for all 18 varsity teams and more than 450 student-athletes. The Bearcats have a proud athletics history, winning eight national championships and 118 conference titles. The Cincinnati men's basketball team is among the 15 winningest programs all-time, while the football team became the first non-Power Five program to compete in the College Football Playoff in 2021. Olympic gold medalist volleyball player Jordan Thompson, NBA Hall of Famer Oscar Robertson and Major League Baseball legend Sandy Koufax are among the several luminaries who have competed as Bearcats.
- The Bearcats entered a new era as a Power Five School on July 1 when they officially joined the Big 12 Conference, positioning Cincinnati among the nation's premier athletics programs.
- Off the field, UC student-athletes continue to find success, collectively posting a 3.4 GPA in spring 2023 with 78% earning spots on the Honor Roll.
- Under the leadership of Director of Athletics John Cunningham, and supported by more than 150 full-time staff members, UC Athletics' mission is to connect our community, enhance our university and impact the lives of student-athletes as they prepare to change the world

NUMBERS TO KNOW

Cincinnati had 79 players appear in the 66-13 season-opening win over EKU on Saturday, Sept. 2, including eight transfers who earned starts on offense and defense.

Cincinnati's 667 total yards vs EKU is the seventh-highest total in school history and marked the most since UC tallied 741 yards vs. Alabama A&M in 2018. The total ranks fifth in college football in 2023.

Cincinnati tied a school record with six touchdown passes (to six different receivers) on Saturday against EKU. Emory Jones became the first UC QB to account for seven total TDs (5 pass, 2 rush).

Cincinnati had seven plays of 30 yards or more in the season opener, including four TDs. Only USC and New Mexico State have more 30+ plays this season, and they have each played two games.

HOMETOWN HEROS

- A dozen players from Cincinnati appeared on the seasonopening two-deep on offense and defense.
- 26 players from Ohio are also on the initial two-deep.
- This speaks to the program's philosophy to heavily recruit "the State of Cincinnati" and the 50-mile radius around campus.
- UC also features Cincinnati native and legendary Colerain high school coach Kerry Coombs on staff as the cornerbacks coach and special teams coordinator.

THIS IS BIG

- Cincinnati joined the Big 12 on July 1, 2023, along with UCF, Houston and BYU.
- After 25 years as a football independent (1970-1995), Cincinnati joined Conference USA in 1996 before becoming a member of the BIG EAST in 2005 and then The American in 2013.

AN ELITE PROGRAM BY THE NUMBERS

- Any way you look at it over the last five, 10, 15 and 20 years — Cincinnati has proven to be one of the nation's top programs.
- UC ranks as the sixth-winningest program in the FBS since 2018 (last five years) with a 54-11 (83%) mark. Cincinnati joins Alabama (63), Georgia (61), Clemson (60) Ohio State (56), Notre Dame (55) and Oklahoma (51) as the only teams to average at least 10 wins per season since 2018.
- Cincinnati is the 14th winningest program since 2013 (the last 10 years) with a record of 87-41 (68%), winning three conference championships and advancing to eight bowls, including two New Year's Six bowls in that time frame.
- The Bearcats became the first-ever "Group of Five" team
 to advance to the College Football Playoff in 2021,
 defeating No. 9 Notre Dame on the road and finishing
 undefeated in the regular season along the way.
- Since 2008, Cincinnati has the 12th-most wins in college football (last 15 years) with a 134-59 (69%) mark. The Bearcats have won an astounding seven conference championships over the last 15 years with only Oklahoma (nine), Ohio State (eight), Alabama (eight) and Clemson (seven) matching that feat. UC also has four NY6 bowl appearances and three AP Top 10 finishes in that time.
- Cincinnati (2021) is one of only 15 teams ever to play in the College Football Playoff and join Oklahoma (2016, 2019, 2020) and TCU (2022) as the only current Big 12 teams to ever qualify for College Football's Final Four.

LOOKING AT THE 2023 SCHEDULE

- The Bearcats joined the Big 12 on July 1, setting up what will be the most exciting football schedule in school history.
- Cincinnati hosts seven games at Nippert Stadium.
- Cincinnati's first conference game as a member of the Big 12 will be a marquee matchup against Oklahoma on Sept. 23 inside Nippert Stadium.
- Other highlights include renewing old BIG EAST rivalries with road contests at Pitt and West Virginia.

NOTING THE 2023 SCHEDULE

- EKU (Sept. 2): Cincinnati claimed its 22nd-straight homeopening win behind 667 yards (seventh in school history) and 66 points (ninth-most). QB Emory Jones accounted for school-record 7 TDs while throwing TD passes to five different receivers.
- Pitt (Sept. 9): River City Rivalry resumes with former Big East foe; Bearcats won the last two meetings in 2011-12.
- Miami (Ohio) (Sept. 16): The Battle for the Victory Bell remains the longest continuous non-conference rivalry in FBS college football and the oldest rivalry in the FBS with the first game played in 1888. UC leads 60-59-7.
- Oklahoma (Sept. 23): Sooners' first trip to Nippert Stadium; two of only 15 programs to appear in CFP meet for first time since 2010. UC and OU are two of only seven

teams to win 50 games since 2018.

- BYU (Sept. 29): Big 12 newcomers previously had homeand-home series in 2015 and 2016 with the Cougars winning both matchups.
- · lowa State (Oct. 14): First meeting
- · Baylor (Oct. 21): First meeting
- Oklahoma State (Oct. 28): Fourth all-time meeting and first since 1983.
- UCF (Nov. 4): Bearcats have won three of the last four matchups, but dropped the 2022 contest in Orlando. The Bearcats and the Knights spent recent years as the top two G5 teams. UCF won 25 straight games and two AAC titles in 2017 and 2018. Cincinnati actually handed UCF its first AAC loss in three years in a historic 27-24 Friday night win in 2019 which propelled the Bearcats to back-to-back league titles and AP Top 10 finishes in 2020-21.
- Houston (Nov. 11): 29 meetings are the most among any 2023 opponent; UC has won three in a row from 2019-21, including the 2021 AAC Championship Game which secured the first ever 13-0 start in school history.
- West Virginia (Nov. 18): Former Big East rivals meet for 21st time and first since 2011.
- Kansas (Nov. 25): Cincinnati won 34-7 in Nippert Stadium in 1997, one of two matchups all-time.

26-1 AT HOME: BEST IN THE NATION

- UC is tied with Alabama and Clemson for the national lead with a 26-1 (96.3 percent) home record since 2019.
- The EKU win and white-out also marked UC's 12th-straight sellout, and Scott Satterfield became the third-straight UC coach to win his debut. AD John Cunningham presented him a commemorative ball in the locker room postgame.

BEARCATS FIND NFL SUCCESS

- Cincinnati has seen 16 Bearcats drafted since the start of 2021 — second-most in the Big 12 in that time span. The list includes Ahmad "Sauce" Gardner, who was selected fourth overall by the New York Jets in 2022 and went on to earn All-Pro and NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year honors.
- While Gardner took the NFL by storm as a rookie, Travis
 and Jason Kelce turned in dominant seasons once again.
 The brothers, who both starred for the Bearcats more than
 a decade ago, each earned All-Pro and faced off in Super
 Bowl LVIII. The Kansas City Chiefs won the league crown
 and Travis Kelce was joined by fellow Bearcat Bryan
 Cook, a rookie safety.

SATTERFIELD SYNOPSIS

- Cincinnati head coach Scott Satterfield begins his first spring at the helm of the Bearcats. He was hired as UC's 43rd head coach on Dec. 5, 2022.
- Satterfield brings an outstanding 77-48 record (.616) in 10 years as a head coach at Louisville and Appalachian State, holding a winning mark in seven seasons in addition to a 4-1 record in bowl games.
- He led the Mountaineers from the FCS to the FBS and to three straight conference titles.
- He lifted the Cardinals up from a 2-10 campaign in 2018 to an 8-5 record in his first season in 2019.
- A Durham, N.C., native, Satterfield was the 2018 Sun Belt Coach of the Year at Appalachian State before earning 2019 ACC Coach of the Year honors after leading the Cardinals to a six-win improvement in his first year.
- · Satterfield has deep ties to App State, serving as an

assistant coach (1998-08) and quarterback for the Mountaineers (1991-95), helping lead his alma mater to three NCAA Division I FCS national titles and eight conference championships along the way.

- · After the 2022 season, Cincinnati had 15 players enter the transfer portal and leave the program and another 17 either graduated or declared for the NFL Draft.

· Of Cincinnati's 22 starters in the season opener, eight were making their UC debuts, including five on offense. Three others (OL Dartanyan Tinsley, RB Corey Kiner, TE Payten Singletary, LB Jack Dingle) made their first-career starts.

KINER CRACKS 100 FOR SECOND TIME

- · Cincinnati native and 2020 Ohio Mr. Football honoree Corey Kiner had a game-high 105 yards on the ground, including a career-long 54-yard burst up the middle.
- It was his second-career 100-yard game (106 at Tulsa in 2022). He had just 16 carries over his final four games last vear
- Kiner had 79 carries for 324 yards and two TDs for LSU as a freshman in 2021.

MARRIED BRIGGS LEADS DEFENSE

- · Fifth-year senior Jowon Briggs leads UC with 18 career starts at Cincinnati. A former Walnut Hills High School star, he originally played at Virginia, where he started 14 games over two seasons and was a Midseason Freshman All-American in 2019.
- In 2022, he started all 13 games and finished with 61 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss and three sacks en route to All-AAC First Team honors.
- Briggs has a degree in interdisciplinary studies with a focus on physics and music. He will have his certificate in computer science in December.
- · He and his wife, Nyjae, have three children, Jowon, Reine and new-born baby Zane (born Aug. 25, 2023).

BY RUSH AND BY PASS

· In nine seasons as an FBS head coach, Satterfield's rush offense has always averaged at least 200 yards per game and his teams have ranked in the Top 30 nationally in rushing every year. Louisville's offense was the only FBS program to average both 200 yards passing and 200 yards rushing each of the last four seasons.

TWO ALL-AMERICANS RETURN

- Redshirt sophomore defensive tackle Dontay Corleone burst onto the national scene in 2022, earning Third Team All-American honors from the Associated Press and Pro Football Focus. He was famously nicknamed "The Godfather," and rated PFF's top defensive player in the country for 2022 (94.7) and the No. 2 returning interior defensive lineman for 2023. His 94.7 percent run-grade was the best by PFF since Micah Parsons in 2019 and the fifth-highest for a single season by a defensive lineman, edge or linebacker since 2014. The Cincinnati Colerain High School product tallied 45 tackles, 5.5 TFLs, three sacks, two fumble recoveries and two forced fumbles in
- Corleone was also named the No. 7 draft-eligible DT underclassman by The Athletic's Dane Brugler in the preseason.
- Junior Mason Fletcher also collected Third Team All-American honors from the AP and was a Ray Guy Award finalist. He will arguably the top returning punter in the country after earning AAC Special Teams Player of the Year honors and ranking fifth in the country with a 46.2 average. The Melbourne, Australia native booted 14 50+ punts and his long of 84 yards set against SMU shattered the Cincinnati and AAC record for longest punt.

WEALTH OF KICK AND PUNT RETURNERS

- · Cincinnati returns fifth-year running back Ryan Montgomery, whose 684 punt return yards rank third in school history. He is joined by several transfers with solid special-teams resumes.
- Defensive back D.J. Taylor, a three-year letterwinner at Arizona State, had a 107-yard KR score against Arizona in 2020 while ranking third in the nation with a 36.9-yard average.
- Braden Smith had a 30-yard punt return against Kentucky in 2022 and a career-long 49-yard touchdown versus EKU
- · Xzavier Henderson had 34 punt and nine kickoff returns in his three years at Florida, including returns of 48 yards against Missouri and 28 at Texas A&M in 2022. He also returned a punt 33 yards against FAU in the 2021 opener.

PERMANENT CAPTAINS

Head coach Scott Satterfield announced four permanent captains for the 2023 season on Sunday, Aug. 27 - the start of the first game week.

- Scott Satterfield's offenses have been among the nation's best during his time at Appalachian State, Louisville, and now. Cincinnati.
- The Satterfield-led 66-point offense explosion against EKU is tied for the second most points scored in his coaching career and is the sixth time his offense has scored more than 60 points in a game. In his second year at the helm of Appalachian State (2014) he led the Mountaineers to a 66-0 victory over Campbell. His most recent 60-point win was during his tenure at Louisville as the Cardinals defeated Duke 62-22 in 2021.
- It also marks the 12th time a Satterfield-coached team has amassed 600 yards of total offense in a game.

DON'T FORGET ABOUT ERIC PHILLIPS

Preseason All-America redshirt sophomore nose tackle
Dontay "The Godfather" Corleone and senior defensive
end Jowon Briggs get the bulk of the media attention, but
Eric Phillips has proven to be star in his own right. Entering
his second year as a starting defensive end, the Cincinnati
native finished with 2 TFL, a sack and forced fumble versus
EKU. For his career, he has 10 TFL and four sacks, all over
the last two seasons.

GRZESIAK LEADS DEFENSE IN DEBUT

- Another solid Week 1 performer was Daniel Grzesiak, rated the 20th-best available transfer by The Athletic's Max Olson, who had a team- and career-high seven tackles in his UC debut, including a strip-sack and fumble recovery on the same play. The Los Angeles native came by way of Utah State and Nevada before then.
- Taj Ward also had a career-high six tackles, while Justin Harris and Bryon Threats earned their first and third-career interceptions, respectively.

UC DEFENSE SHOULD CAUSE HAVOC

- Cincinnati associate head coach / defensive coordinator Bryan Brown's defense should cause havoc after his Louisville team led the nation with 50 sacks in 2022.
- Brown has plenty of weapons at his disposal with All-American nose tackle Dontay Corleone and fellow all-conference defensive lineman Jowon Briggs pairing with newcomer Daniel Grzesiak, an edge rusher who transfers in from Utah State where he had had 8.5 sacks last season, and sixth-year senior defensive end Malik Vann (nine career sacks) to lead the Bearcats' front seven.
- Brown's Cardinals defense also finished third in turnovers forced (30), seventh in TFLs (97) and 11th in points allowed (19.2) in 2022.

CHEF MYLES MONTGOMERY

- Redshirt sophomore running back Myles Montgomery, one
 of the fastest players on the team, has proven that he is
 ready to take on a larger role this fall after totaling 14
 attempts for 120 yards and a touchdown in six games in
 2022.
- Another element to his game, even if off the field, is his cooking.
- This fall, he said his favorite thing to make is pasta and that
 he is trying to perfect steak. He also previously cited his pot
 roast, potatoes and carrots as a staple. He and tight end
 Chamon Metayer, a classmate and fellow Floridian, were
 roommates, with Montgomery saying teammates would
 always come over for different meals the two cooked.

WHO IS NEW AT QUARTERBACK

- Cincinnati signed transfer quarterback Emory Jones in the early signing period in December. He has started 20 games at Arizona State and Florida, and thrown for 4,880 yards and 33 touchdowns over 45 career games. He started 12 games at Florida in 2021 and finished with 2,734 yards and 19 touchdowns to go along with 758 yards and four touchdowns on the ground.
- Brady Drogosh, a 6-4 true freshman, joins the Bearcats as a four-star recruit and Michigan's No. 1 prospect. He was named Michigan's Mr. Football in 2022 after throwing for 2,264 yards and 35 touchdowns to go along with 1,340

- rushing yards for De La Salle Collegiate.
- RS sophomore Brady Lichtenberg went 4-for-4 for 93 yards as the second-stringer against EKU, his first-career passing attempts. He hit freshman Barry Jackson Jr. for a 65-yard score late in the game.

DUAL-THREAT DROGOSH

- True freshman quarterback Brady Drogosh turned heads in his first collegiate spring and fall camp, despite coming in as arguably UC's top high-school signee.
- The Warren, Mich., native was a consensus four-star recruit and rated the No. 1 player in the state, a top-five quarterback and top-50 national prospect by On3. While the 6-foot-4, 215-pound gunslinger has displayed a fluid throwing motion, he also unleashed a 99-yard touchdown run in a fall-camp scrimmage at Nippert Stadium in front of several fans.
- He and redshirt-sophomore Brady Lichtenberg have battled for the No. 2 spot behind Emory Jones.

BRADEN SMITH TAKES TO THE AIR

- Louisville transfer wide receiver Braden Smith is not only a 4.4 40-yard dash extraordinaire; the 23-year-old is a certified pilot. He took up the journey shortly after his three-catch, 45-yard Fenway Bowl performance against Cincinnati in December.
- Smith's long-term goals include flying cargo for UPS or FedEx, but says he remains open to airlines.
- "I just enjoy the thrill of being hands-on and being in control and going through procedures and things of that nature," Smith said to the Cincinnati Enquirer. "The first time I went up I was kind of shakin' at the knees. I didn't know what to expect. Luckily, I had a really good instructor and was able to keep flying. I got more confident with it, and once I was able to get my license, I really built up that confidence in myself."
- Smith, who had a 48-yard touchdown catch in his debut last week, had 59 receptions for 653 yards for Louisville from 2020-22 after transferring from Northwest Mississippi

NEW FACES AT WIDE RECEIVER

- The Cincinnati wide receiver room returns just one scholarship receiver in redshirt junior Chris Scott, but it added loads of experience to offensive coordinator/wide receivers coach Brad Glenn's room.
- <u>O Braden Smith (Louisville)</u> Appeared in 29 games as a wide receiver and kick specialist for Louisville, where he hauled in 59 receptions for 653 yards and two touchdowns from 2020-22 after transferring from Northwest Miss. CC.
- 2 Dee Wiggins (Louisville) Veteran who brings 22 games of starting experience during stints at Louisville and Miami.
 Spent four seasons at Miami from 2018 to 2021 where he appeared in 40 games at wide receiver. Totaled 791 receiving yards on 62 receptions for seven touchdowns as a Hurricane. Played three games at Louisville in 2022 before a season-ending injury.
- 3 Evan Prater (QB at UC) Started two games behind center for the Bearcats in 2022 and was previously a backup for Desmond Ridder. Moved to wide receiver this summer. Had 166 yards on the ground as a quarterback and is a natural athlete.
- 8 Xzavier Henderson (Florida) Led Florida with 38 receptions in 2022, while also totaling 410 receiving yards and two touchdowns. He appeared in 35 games,

- recording 73 catches for 835 yards and five touchdowns with the Gators from 2020-22. Former teammate of UC starting quarterback Emory Jones.
- 9 Aaron Turner (UConn) Appeared in all 25 games for UConn from 2021-22, totaling 90 receptions for 759 yards and three touchdowns, in addition to 75 more yards on the ground. Led the Huskies in receptions, his second straight season with a team-high in catches, yards and touchdowns in 2022, finishing with 57 catches for 527 yards and three scores after hauling in in 33 catches for 232 yards in 2021.
- 11 Donovan Ollie (Washington St.) Experienced receiver who brings 24 career starts, 70 receptions, 807 yards, four touchdowns and two years of eligibility to the Bearcats following four seasons as a member of the Washington State program. Made 11 starts and appeared in 12 games in 2022, tallying 43 receptions for 491 yards and three scores. Overlapped one season with the late Mike Leach, whose Texas connections brought him to Pullman.
- 14 Barry Jackson (High School) Four-star recruit according to Rivals and one of the top 50 prospects in the state of Georgia according to 247Sports.
- 84 Sterling Berkhalter (NC A&T) Cincinnati native who played in 16 games with 13 starts over two seasons (2021-22) at North Carolina A&T. Totaled 35 receptions for 476 yards and two scores. Made 10 starts in 2022, tallying 28 receptions for 414 yards and both career touchdowns. Attended Georgia Prep Academy prior to college.

CONTINUING THE PACE

- · Deshawn Pace moved from linebacker to the "Star" DB position in Bryan Brown's defense. The "Star" is a hybrid nickel back / linebacker position meant to utilize Pace's elite athleticism.
- Pace is poised to be a leader on UC's defense following a productive last two seasons. He started 12 games over 2021-22, tallying 157 tackles and 14.5 for loss to go with five interceptions. He was also an AAC Honorable Mention performer during the 2021 CFP season as sophomore.
- · In 2021, he finished sixth in the AAC with 94 tackles, while adding nine TFLs and a team-high four interceptions as a playmaking force on the best team in program history.

HALL OF FAME BLOODLINES

- Redshirt-sophomore safety Antwan Peek Jr. is following in his father's Cincinnati Athletics Hall of Fame footsteps.
- The elder Peek is UC's all-time leader in sacks (27.0). tackles for loss (56.0), forced fumbles (17) and blocked kicks (7). He was a third round pick (No. 67 overall) by the Houston Texans in the 2003 in the NFL Draft and played five seasons in the NFL, including four with the Texans and one with the Browns, finishing with 28 starts.
- Peek, a walk-on who was put on scholarship, was cited by Satterfield prior to the season-opener as someone to
- · "The guy that's kind of stuck out this August camp was Antwan Peek. He's a guy who was down the depth chart and now after the spring, he's number two safety. He a guy that will get to play, I mean he's going to get some good playing time."

HE COULD BE THE NATION'S BEST

- · Junior punter Mason Fletcher ranked fourth in the nation and second in the AAC with a 46.2 average and was named to the Ray Guy Award watch list, in addition to multiple Preseason All-America honors.
- · His lone EKU punt went for 45 yards and was the 47th of his career downed inside the 20.
- 29 of his 62 punts (47%) in 2022 were downed inside the 20-yard line with 12 downed inside the 10.
- He has 14 punts of 50+ and three 60-yarders, including a school and AAC record 84 on his first SMU attempt.
- · His 65.0 average at SMU also set AAC and UC records and gave Fletcher AAC Special Teams honors.
- The Melbourne, Australia native faced his brother, Max Fletcher, a freshman punter for Arkansas, in the 2022 season opener at Arkansas. Mason and Max's parents. Dustin and Suzanne, flew from Australia for the game. It marked the first time in nearly two years that Mason had seen his brother and mother. Fletcher's father, Dustin, a 23-year veteran in Australian Rules Football, came to the Cotton Bowl last season.

HARD TICKET TO COME BY

- · Cincinnati football officially sold out of season tickets for the 2023 football season, selling more than 25,300 to set a new school record in August.
- · It's the second time in history that UC has sold out of season tickets.
- · Last season, UC set a record with just over 22,000 season
- Cincinnati has sold out 12 consecutive home games dating back to the third home game of 2021, as well.

LT AN AEROSPACE ENGINEER

- · The offensive line is a cerebral position, and redshirtjunior offensive lineman John Williams has proven it as he pursues a starting job at left tackle.
- Williams, an aerospace engineering major, played in 12 of 13 games last year and 12 more in 2021, including starting the first three for the eventual CFP Bearcats. He cites NASA and Boeing as two places he would like to work for once his career is over.
- "I do take a good amount of pride in it." he told Sports Illustrated about his heavy academic balance, "It's hard to juggle, and I'll say I don't sleep much, but I like to work hard and it is what it is."

BUFORD HAS SEEN THE BEST

- Redshirt junior and Kentucky transfer Deondre Buford is set to take on the starting right tackle spot.
- The Detroit native, who went to the same Martin Luther King HS as Ahmad "Sauce" Gardner, appeared in all 13 games for UK in 2022 at both guard and tackle. while earning a pair of starts. One of those was against defending and eventual national champion Georgia.

THE LONE RETURNING STARTER ON OFFENSE

- · The coaching change and transfer portal has made for a completely different offensive depth chart this season.
- Redshirt-junior center Gavin Gerhardt is the only returning offensive starter, having taken on all 13 games last year and proving to be one of the Bearcats' best on the line. He snapped for two quarterbacks with vastly different styles and paved the way for three different running backs to tally 100-yard rushing games.
- Not only that, he was emerging as a starting guard in 2022 fall camp before a season-ending injury to incumbent center Jake Renfro.

ANDERSON JR. GOES FROM NB2 TO CB1

- · Redshirt junior Sammy Anderson Jr. has made quite the impression on his new defensive coaches, poising himself to be a breakout performer.
- He previously backed up sixth-year nickel Taj Ward but has since moved over to a starting cornerback role. He credits position coach Kerry Coombs, one of two assistants to stay on from Fickell to Satterfield, as a key influence in staying at Cincinnati, even referring to him as a father figure.
- Last year was Anderson Jr.'s first as a main contributor, appearing in all 13 games while rotating with Ward as the first-string nickel. He finished with 19 tackles, 2.5 TFLs and once forced fumble, as well as earning his first corner start in the Wasabi Fenway Bowl.

CARTER BROWN STAYS PERFECT

- Arizona State transfer Carter Brown was 9-for-9 on PATs in his debut (second-most in UC history as well), remaining perfect on all 42 tries of his career.
- His lone field-goal attempt was a 46-yard make, putting him 6-for-8 from 40-plus in his career.

BEARCATS IN SEASON OPENERS

· Cincinnati has won 22-straight home openers, beginning with an overtime win over TCU in 2002. This season was a 66-13 win over Eastern Kentucky.

FREAKS LIST

- · UC boasted three members of Bruce Feldman's annual "Freaks" list for the third-straight season.
- · Tyler Scott, Tre Tucker and Josh Whyle earned the honors in 2022, while Desmond Ridder, Alec Pierce and Myjai Sanders garnered 2021 nods. All six are now on NFL rosters.
- Defensive lineman Jowon Briggs, an eclectic music persona with the piano, guitar, bass, drums, sax, flute, cello, violin, viola. harmonica and his tenor voice, squatted 700 in high school. He deadlifted 655 this offseason and did 31 bench-press reps at 225. He also hit 18.6 MPH and 4.89 in the pro shuttle

TAKE ME TO HIGHER GROUND

- · For the past 25 years, the UC football has called the Higher Ground Conference and Retreat Center in West Harrison, Ind., its preseason training home.
- The 280-acre facility is located about 30 miles from campus and has served as the Bearcats training camp location since the lead up to the 1999 season.
- · Higher Ground has two 100-yard turf practice fields, including a new surface installed in 2017, ample living and meeting spaces and no distractions from football.

CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY

- · UC won the 2021 and 2020 AAC Championships, its 15th and 16th league titles, for its first two since 2014 and first outright crowns since 2009.
- UC played in its third-straight AAC title game in 2021.
- · Each of the last two were played at Nippert Stadium. UC toppled No. 16 Houston in 2021 after defeating No. 23 Tulsa on Cole Smith's game-ending 34-yard field goal. That first game, played on Saturday, Dec. 19 at Nippert Stadium, marked the latest date a game was played in Nippert since $\boldsymbol{\alpha}$ matchup vs. Xavier on Dec. 7, 1918.



CARSON FIELD AT NIPPERT STADIUM HAS BEEN THE VENERABLE HOME OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CINCINNATI FOOTBALL TEAM SINCE 1901 AND PROVIDES A PHENOMENAL HOME-FIELD ENVIRONMENT.

HARD TICKET TO COME BY

- · Cincinnati football officially sold out of season tickets for the first time ever prior to the 2022 football season, selling more than 23,500 to set a new school. The Bearcats accomplished the feat again in 2023.
- · The Bearcats are currently on single-game sellout streak spanning 11 contests entering 2023.

A MODERN CLASSIC

- · In 1915, construction was completed on the first sections of a brick and concrete structure to replace the wooden stands and continued for several seasons as funds were raised.
- · In 1924, the completed structure was dedicated as James Gamble Nippert Memorial Stadium with a capacity of 12,000.
- · UC has used the Nippert site as a playing field since 1901, making it the second-oldest playing site in the nation for college football behind Penn's Franklin Field (1895).
- · Among NCAA FBS schools, Nippert is the third-oldest stadium still in use, behind Bobby Dodd Stadium (Georgia Tech - 1913), Davis Wade Stadium (Mississippi State - 1914) and ahead of Ole Miss' Vaught-Hemingway Stadium (1915) and Wisconsin's Camp Randall Stadium (1917).
- Through numerous renovations, the structure situated in the middle of the Clifton campus has retained its early-century brickwork, wrought-iron gates, and trim giving Nippert a comfortable old-time stadium charm and appeal, while remaining a classic showplace for college football.
- The third-oldest NCAA FBS stadium entered a new era in 2015 following the completion of a 20-month, \$86-millon, privately funded renovation and expansion project.
- · The post-renovation season in 2015 coincided with the 100th anniversary of the original 1915 construction.

FOR THE FANS

- · Both concourses were renovated and widened and now feature nearly 75 permanent point-of-sale concession locations are available on game days.
- Concession stands feature the usual stadium staples along with offerings from premium local vendors, including Frisch's, Montgomery Inn and Skyline Chili.
- Enhancements were added in 2019, including: new tailgating spots, social gathering spaces, fans-first pricing and a seasonlong DJ for in-game entertainment.

WHAT'S IN A NAME?

- During the season-ending clash with rival Miami (OH) in 1923, Jimmy Nippert sustained a spike wound injury and died a month later from blood poisoning.
- His grandfather, James N. Gamble of Procter and Gamble, provided the funds needed to complete the horseshoe-shaped structure, and the James Gamble Nippert Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Nov. 8, 1924
- The stadium's founder was Arch Carson, who as captain and principal organizer played a significant role in starting football on the UC campus in 1885. In 1901 as physical director of the university, Carson guided the construction of the field which was later named for him -- the playing surface is still called Carson Field.

THE WEST PAVILION

- · The most striking changes sit five stories above the west concourse. At 105,000 square feet and 130 yards long, the West Pavilion rises out of the stadium concourse in glass and angles which contain a host of new premium seating along with state-of-the-art press facilities.
- The curvature of the facility matches that of Herschede-Shank Pavilion on the east side of the stadium and contains four levels; the Margaret & Michael Valentine press and suite level, suite level, scholarship club level, and patio mezzanine level.
- UC went from having nearly no premium seating options to the addition of 1,100 scholarship club seats and 53 indoor and outdoor suites of varying sizes. A skywalk connects Tangeman University Center to the West Pavilion with premium area customers able to access the facility on gameday from the other side of campus.

TQL PARTNERSHIP BOLSTERS NIPPERT STADIUM

- · Total Quality Logistics (TQL), the second-largest freight brokerage firm in North America and Cincinnati's largest private company, and UC announced in January 2023 a longterm strategic partnership that will include field level and stadium signage and logo assets for TQL as well as specific investment to the Bearcats' indoor practice and performance facility project.
- · TQL's logo will appear on Carson Field in two places.
- · While field surface branding typically results in renaming the venue, as a Cincinnati company, TQL has chosen to not name the field. It will continue to be named Carson Field in honor of Dr. Arch Carson, who organized the first football team at the university in 1885 and is known as the Father of UC Football.

HEAD COACH SCOTT SATTERFIELD | FIRST SEASON

2018 SUN BELT AND 2019 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR

Bringing a history of success as the leader of two programs, Scott Satterfield was hired as Cincinnati football's 43rd head coach on Dec. 5, 2022

Satterfield holds a 76-48 record (.612) in 10 years as head coach at Louisville and Appalachian State, earning a winning mark in seven seasons and a 4-1 record in bowl games. He led the Mountaineers' transition to the Football Bowl Subdivision and to three straight conference titles and four bowl appearances from 2013 to 2018 before taking over the Cardinals in 2019.

Employing an explosive offensive attack, Satterfield led Louisville to three bowls in four seasons. He lifted the Cardinals from a 2-10 campaign in 2018 to an 8-5 record in his first season in 2019.

A Durham, N.C., native, Satterfield was the 2018 Sun Belt Coach of the Year at Appalachian State before earning 2019 ACC Coach of the Year honors after leading the Cardinals to a six-win improvement

Satterfield, who is 50, led Appalachian State from the FCS into the FBS as the head coach after serving as an assistant coach (1998-08) and augrterback for the Mountaineers (1991-95), helping lead his alma mater to three NCAA Division I FCS national titles and eight conference championships along the way. Famously, Satterfield was the offensive play-caller and guarterbacks coach for App State's historic 34-32 upset of No. 5 Michigan to open the 2007 season.

Under Satterfield, Louisville was the only team in the country to average more than 200 yards rushing and 200 yards passing each vear from 2019 to 2022.

Additionally, Satterfield's rushing attacks have averaged more than 200 yards and ranked in the nation's top 30 in all eight years he has been an FBS head coach.

While at Louisville, he compiled a 25-24 record and saw 32 players collect All-ACC honors. Six Cardinals were selected in the NFL Draft during Satterfield's tenure as well, including 2023 selections YaYa Diaby (third round), Yasir Abdullah (fifth round) and Kei'Trel Clark (sixth round).

Louisville quarterback Malik Cunningham signed a guaranteed free-agent contract with the New England Patriots in 2023.


In 2022, Satterfield led Louisville to a 7-5 mark and saw 13 players collect all-conference accolades. The Cardinals appeared in the College Football Playoff Rankings and beat two Top-25 teams. Louisville led the nation in total sacks (50), finished third in takeaways (30) and ranked 11th nationally and tops in the ACC in scoring defense (19.2).

The 2021 Louisville squad was led by a potent offense that averaged 31.6 points per game and ranked 21st nationally with 446.2 yards of total offense per game. Cunningham proved to be one of the country's top dual-threat quarterbacks, rushing for 1,031 yards and an ACC-leading 20 touchdowns while passing for 2,940 yards and another 19 scores.

Louisville was also explosive in 2020, leading the nation with nine plays of 60+ yards and six plays of more than 70 yards while ranking fifth in the ACC in total offense (444.2).

In 2019, Satterfield guided Louisville to the biggest turnaround in college football, increasing the Cardinals' win total by six and vaulting UofL to the Top 25 in total offense and rushing in his first year. Individually, a pair of Cardinals posted the best statistical seasons in school history, Javian Hawkins broke the school record for rushing yards (1,525) by a running back, while wide receiver Tutu Atwell set the Louisville record for receiving yards (1,276) and tied the school mark with 12 TD catches.

Satterfield guided his alma mater to three consecutive Sun Belt



Conference Championships and an impressive 51-24 record from 2013 to 2018. The Mountaineers held a 38-10 conference mark over six seasons, including a 34-6 record over five seasons in the Sun Belt.

Along the way, he became the first coach to lead a school from the FCS level to FBS and immediately earn three-consecutive bowl wins. Satterfield directed Appalachian State to three-straight conference titles and led the program to four straight bowl appearances.

In 2018, Satterfield led Appalachian State to a 10-2 record and an in-season ranking of No. 25 in the AP poll, capping the season with a 30-19 victory over Louisiana to give the Mountaineers a win in the first-ever Sun Belt Conference Championship Game, securing a thirdstraight league title.

In 2017, during a 9-4 season that included a 7-1 run through the Sun Belt, the Mountaineers ranked among the Top 20 teams nationally in several categories, including No. 2 in fewest sacks allowed (eight).

The 2015 season saw the Mountaineers finish 11-2--the 11 wins marking the highest total ever by an FBS program in its first season of bowl eligibility. App State completed the transition from the FCS to FBS by ranking among the Sun Belt's top two in 19 statistical categories and defeating Ohio, 31-29, in its first-ever bowl game, the Camellia BowL.

The 2015 campaign came on the heels of a breakout season in 2014. when Satterfield led the Mountaineers to an impressive 7-5 record in their first full season in the FBS ranks.

He took over the reins at his alma mater in 2013.

Satterfield helped Appalachian State win three consecutive FCS national championships in 2005, 2006 and 2007 as the quarterbacks coach and primary play-caller.

Among his many highlights as an assistant in Boone, N.C., he mentored two-time Walter Payton Player of the Year and FCS All-American Armanti Edwards. He helped lead the Mountaineers to the historic 34-32 upset at No. 5 Michigan to open the 2007 season.

Overall, he won six conference championships as an assistant and two as a player.

Satterfield started 27 games at quarterback for Appalachian State. He collected first-team all-conference honors in 1995 after passing for 1,461 yards and rushing for 649 more to help lead the Mountaineers to the only undefeated, untied regular season (11-0) in school history and a 12-1 final record. He graduated with a degree in physical education

Satterfield and his wife. Beth, a former track & field athlete at App State, have a daughter, Alli, and two sons, Bryce and Isaac.




