### KICKOFF:

The University of Cincinnati men's soccer team will look to rebound from a 1-0 loss to defending Missouri Valley Conference champion Bradley on Sept. 16 when they return home to kick off their BIG EAST slate against Georgetown on Friday, Sept. 21 at 8 p.m. On Sunday, Sept. 23, the Bearcats welcome Seton Hall to Gettler Stadium for a 1 p.m. tilt, marking the first ever match between the two schools.

### BEARCAT BITES:

- UC opens the 2007 season in search of defending its 2006 BIG EAST Red Division Championship, the first BIG EAST team title in school history.
- The Bearcats finished 2006 with a 11-6-2 overall record and a 7-3-1 mark in BIG EAST play.
- Head coach Hylton Dayes is in his seventh season at UC with a 56-44-18 record with the Bearcats and a 152-129-37 record as a head coach.
- UC was picked to finish fourth in the Red Division in the BIG EAST preseason coaches poll.
- Senior defender Amir Ikner was named to the Preseason all-BIG EAST team after earning all-BIG EAST second team and NSCAA/adidas all-Great Lakes honors in 2006.
- UC's eight-member recruiting class was ranked No. 26 by *CollegeSoccerNews.com*.
- Newcomers Miguel Rosales and Branden Stelmak were named to the *CollegeSoccerNews.com* Top 100 Freshman to Watch.

### LAST TIME OUT:

UC dropped a 1-0 decision to defending Missouri Valley Conference champion Bradley on Sept. 16 at Shea Stadium. The Bearcats, who scored four goals on Sept. 13 in disposing of Xavier, fell to 1-4-0 on the season, with all four losses coming away from home. The Braves improved to 4-1-1.

Bradley's Grant Campbell scored the game winner in the 78th minute amongst some congestion in front of the UC goal. He was assisted by Chris Cutshaw and Justin Bigelow.

The Braves outshot UC, 14-9, including a 9-4 margin in the decisive second half.

Bearcat goalkeeper Miguel Rosales made four saves. His counterpart, Mike Haynes, made three saves and posted his second shutout of the season.

### SCOUTING THE HOYAS:

- Georgetown dropped a hard-fought 1-0 overtime decision at Connecticut last Saturday night to drop to 1-4-0 on the year. GU held the Huskies, the BIG EAST's highest scoring offense, scoreless for 96 minutes in the OT loss in Storrs.
- Georgetown senior goalkeeper Joe Devine is averaging four saves per match. Devine has played every minute in net for the Hoyas and posted his fourth career shutout in the team's 1-0 victory over Marshall on September 2.
- The Hoyas have only allowed six goals through the season's first five games, their best goals against output since 2000.
- Ten freshmen and sophomores have seen considerable playing time, including six freshmen who have appeared in all five games.
- Head coach Brian Weise is in his second season at Georgetown, holding a 7-15-0 mark.

### SCOUTING THE PIRATES:

- SHU enters the weekend with a 3-3-0 mark, having snapped a three-match losing skid against Princeton on Sept. 17 with a 4-3 win.
- Preseason all-BIG EAST selection Eliseo Giusfredi leads the Pirates and ranks second in the BIG EAST with four goals and nine points.
- Seton Hall has yet to win away from home, losing at St. John's, at Hartwick and against Syracuse at a neutral site.
- Head coach Manny Schellscheidt is in his 20th season at Seton Hall, holding a 211-129-37 record.

### SERIES HISTORY:

- UC and Georgetown have met just once, a 3-2 GU win in 1987.
- The Bearcats and Pirates are meeting for the first time.

### CINCINNATI STATE CONNECTION:

Scott Stockum is the next in line of former Cincinnati State standouts to make the transition to the Division I level. Omar Cummings (2005) and Patrick Baxter (2006) preceeded the junior to Clifton, with Cummings becoming UC's first first-team all-American in 2006. Stockum has been productive immediately, scoring a pair of goals and adding two assists for six points, which is second on the team.

### FAST START FOR ANABA:

Senior forward Kenny Anaba scored a pair of goals in UC's season opener on Aug. 31. He added two more against Xavier on Sept. 13. The team's leading goal-scorer each of the last two seasons, Anaba is ascending the career records list at UC. With his four goals this season, Anaba is ninth in school history with 20 tallies. He is also tied for eighth with 50 career points (20 G, 10 A).

### FRESH FACE IN GOAL:

Freshman goalkeeper Miguel Rosales has started each of the last four matches in goal for the Bearcats, posting his first career shutout against Xavier on Sept. 13. A two-time Colorado Player of the Year as a prep star at Smoky Hill High School, Rosales holds a 1.00 goals against average and has carded 11 saves.

### OH, SO CLOSE:

Of the Bearcats four losses, all but one has come by just one goal. In the season opener, Loyola-Chicago topped UC, 4-2. The Bearcats fell to UCF, 2-1, dropped a tight 1-0 decision at No. 17 New Mexico and fell 1-0 at defending MVC champ Bradley.

### NEXT UP:

UC takes to the road for a pair of BIG EAST contests next weekend, taking on Notre Dame on Sept. 28 at 7 p.m. ET and traveling to Marquette on Sept. 30 for a 2 p.m. CT kickoff.

Hylton Days has compiled a diverse background of experience as both a successful coach and an accomplished player.

Days is in his seventh season as head coach at Cincinnati but his 22nd in the college coaching ranks. He has served as a head coach for 17 seasons, during which time he has compiled a 152-129-37 record, and led the Bearcats to their second ever appearance in the NCAA championships in 2003. As an assistant coach, Days helped develop teams which made three appearances in the NCAA championships. As a player, he earned All-America honors in all four seasons of competition.

A native of Kingston, Jamaica, Days graduated from Wright State University with a degree in electrical systems engineering. He holds the NSCAA Advanced National Coaching Diploma, and the USSF National A License. He is also a member of the NSCAA National Academy Coaching Staff.
