POSTSEASON HONORS

OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

McKenzie Milton • Jr. • QB • UCF • Kapolei, Hawaii

Milton becomes the first player to repeat as The American's Offensive Player of the Year as he served as the catalyst behind an offense that leads the conference and ranks fifth nationally at 531.5 yards per game and averaged 43.1 points per game, which ranks eighth. Milton, who suffered a serious injury in UCF's win against USF last Friday, threw for 2,663 yards and 25 touchdowns with six interceptions and rushed for 307 yards and a team-high nine TDs in 2018. He ranks 10th nationally in pass efficiency (161.0), third in yards per completion (15.57) and sixth in points responsible for per game (20.4).

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Nate Harvey • Sr. • DE • ECU • Knightdale, N.C.

Harvey enjoyed a breakout season as a senior in 2018. After spending last season primarily on special teams, Harvey emerged as a starting defensive end and enters Saturday's regular-season finale at North Carolina State as the national leader in tackles for loss (24.0). Harvey broke The American's single-season record of 23.0 tackles for loss, set by Houston's Ed Oliver last year, and enters Saturday's game with 13.5 sacks, one shy of the conference's single-season record (14.5 by Louisville's Marcus Smith in 2013). In addition, Harvey has 59 tackles, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery. He is the first ECU player to be chosen as The American's Defensive Player of the Year.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Isaiah Wright • Jr. • WR/KR • Temple • West Hartford, Conn.

Wright becomes the first Temple player to earn Special Teams Player of the Year honors from The American. Wright scored a nation-leading three special teams touchdowns in 2018 and enters the postseason as the conference leader in punt return average (13.9 yards per return). Wright is third in the conference in kickoff return average (25.9 ypr) and fifth in all-purpose yards (119.0 yards per game).

ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

Desmond Ridder • Fr. • QB • Cincinnati • Louisville, Ky.

Ridder is the first Cincinnati player to be named as The American's Rookie of the Year. Ridder took over as the Bearcats' quarterback in the second quarter of the season-opening win at UCLA and has led Cincinnati to a 10-2 record. Ridder has thrown for 2,382 yards and 19 touchdowns with five interceptions and has rushed for 563 yards and five TDs as a redshirt freshman. He ranks fourth in The American in pass efficiency (145.7) and fifth in total offense (245.4 yards per game).

COACH OF THE YEAR

Luke Fickell • Cincinnati

Fickell was chosen by his peers as The American's Coach of the Year after he orchestrated a six-win improvement in his second year on the Cincinnati sideline. After going 4-8 in his first year, Fickell has led the Bearcats to a 10-2 overall record, a 4-0 in mark in nonconference games and a 6-2 conference mark in 2018. The Bearcats returned to the national polls for the first time since 2013, ranking as high as No. 19 in the Nov. 11 Associated Press poll.

AMERICAN NOTEBOOK

Pow6rful Stuff

The American has 33 nonconference victories against other Power 6 opponents (including Notre Dame) since the start of the 2015 season, the first year of The American's current membership. American teams have seven Power 6 wins this season.

The American placed seven teams in bowl games in the 2018 season (UCF, Cincinnati, Houston, Memphis, USF, Temple, Tulane).

Prognostication

The 2018 season is the first in which both preseason favorites in The American's East and West divisions went on to win division titles.

Pac Mentality

American Athletic Conference teams are a combined 4-0 against the Pac-12 since the start of last season.

We're Streaking

UCF's 25-game winning streak is the longest active winning streak nationally and is the longest in American Athletic Conference history.

Getting There

If UCF defeats LSU in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl, the Knights would become the first team to win 26 straight games since Alabama won 26 between the 2015 and 2016 seasons.

The Big Stage

UCF's 34-27 win against Auburn in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl last season improved American Athletic Conference teams to 3-0 all-time in New Year's Six Bowls.

Offensive Outbursts

The American Athletic Conference has three of the top six teams nationally in total offense. UCF is third at 545.4 yards per game. Memphis is fourth at 534.3 yards per game and Houston is sixth (528.6 ypg).

Running Free

Memphis RB Darrell Henderson broke The American's single-season rushing record in the Tigers' win against Houston to close the regular season. Henderson has 1,909 yards this season, surpassing Tulsa's James Flanders, who had 1,629 yards in the 2016 season.

Give Them The Rock

UCF RB Greg McCrae and Memphis RB Darrell Henderson rank second and third nationally in yards per carry. McCrae has 1,101 yards on 123 attempts for 8.95 yards per carry, while Henderson has 1,909 yards on 214 attempts for 8.92 yards per carry.

The Best Offense ...

Temple leads the nation with seven defensive touchdowns.

Ground And Pound

Navy is third in the nation in rushing offense at 288.5 yards per game, trailing only Georgia Tech and Army.

Ground And Pound (Part II)

Memphis RB Darrell Henderson ranks second nationally in rushing (146.8 ypg).

Whatever You Need

Memphis RB Darrell Henderson is the national leader in all-purpose yards (2,328). Henderson has 1,909 rushing yards, 295 receiving yards and 124 yards on kickoff returns.

Give Him Six

Memphis RB Darrell Henderson has scored 25 touchdowns, or three more than any other FBS player in 2018. Cincinnati RB Michael Warren II has 18 touchdowns, which ranks fifth nationally.

Making His Points

Houston QB D'Eriq King is the national leader in points responsible for per game (27.5). King accounted for 302 points in 11 games before suffering a season-ending knee injury.

At A Loss

ECU DE Nate Harvey set the American Athletic Conference's single-season record with 25.5 tackles for loss in 2018. Harvey, who leads the nation with 2.1 tackles for loss per game, also tied the conference record with 14.5 sacks.

Six Picks

UCF S Richie Grant needs one interception to tie for the national lead. Grant has six interceptions in 2018, trailing only Boston College's Hamp Cheevers and Syracuse's Andre Cisco.

Margin Call

UCF is third nationally in turnover margin (1.17). The Knights have registered 26 takeaways and have lost only 12 turnovers in 12 games.

Bullies

UCF has gone 29-0 as a nationally ranked team as a member of the American Athletic Conference.

Turnaround

Cincinnati has registered its seventh 10-win season in program history and its first since 2012. The Bearcats have improved by six wins from last season, when they finished 4-8.

Signal-Calling

Only five American Athletic Conference quarterbacks ended the regular season with the same starting quarterback that they used in their respective opening games.

The AutoNation Cure Bowl will be played for the fourth time in 2018 ... The bowl pairs teams from the American Athletic Conference and the Sun Belt, though this year's game will mark The American's second appearance in the game ... The bowl is estimated to have an annual economic impact of \$20 million on the Orlando community ... Proceeds from the Cure Bowl go directly toward breast cancer research ... UCF enters this year's PlayStation Fiesta Bowl on a 25-game winning streak – the longest active streak nationally – as the Knights went 11-0 in the regular season, finished 8-0 in conference play for the third time in The American's six-year history and won their second straight American Athletic Conference Championship ... UCF's last loss was a 31-13 setback to Arkansas State in the Cure Bowl Dec. 17, 2016, or 746 days prior to this year's Fiesta Bowl ... The Knights scored at least 31 points in all 12 games this year and rank third nationally in total offense at 545.4 yards per game ... UCF has scored at least 30 points in 25 straight games, which is the longest streak in FBS since 1936 ... UCF is 4-5 all-time in bowl games and 2-1 against SEC teams in the postseason ... QB McKenzie Milton, the two-time American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year, suffered a season-ending leg injury in the second quarter of the regular-season finale against USF ... QB Darriel Mack Jr. made his second career start in The American Championship against Memphis and was named the game's Most Outstanding Player after he threw for 348 yards and two touchdowns and rushed for four TDs in the come-from-behind win ... The backfield is led by RB Greg McCrae, who has 1,101 rushing yards and nine touchdowns, while explosive RB Adrian Killins Jr. has 698 yards and four TDs ... WR Gabriel Davis leads the team with 756 receiving yards and six touchdowns on 50 catches, while WR Dredrick Snelson has 41 catches for 664 yards and five TDs ... The Knights' defense is led by S Richie Grant, who has team highs of 102 tackles, a league-leading six interceptions and three forced fumbles ... DE Titus Davis is an impact player up front with 6.5 sacks and 16.0 tackles for loss ... DE Nate Evans has 90 tackles with 9.0 tackles for loss and two fumble recoveries ... UCF has forced at least one turnover in every game this season and in each of the last 31 games, dating to 2016 ... K Matthew Wright is second in The American in kicker scoring (8.7 ppg), while P Mac Loudermilk averages 42.6 yards per punt ... Killins has averaged 21.1 yards on 14 kickoff returns, while RB Otis Anderson has averaged 11.9 yards per punt return.

LSU is making its 50th bowl appearance in program history ... The Tigers have played in a bowl game in every season of the 21st century ... It's 19-year streak of bowl appearances is the fourth-longest active streak in FBS ... LSU has won at least eight games in each of the last 19 seasons as well ... LSU's current bowl streak includes two national championships and four SEC titles ... LSU most recently played in the 2018 Citrus Bowl, where the Tigers fell 21-17 to Notre Dame ... LSU's only losses in 2018 were a 27-19 setback to Florida, a 29-0 decision to No. 1 Alabama, and a wild 74-72 seven-overtime shootout against Texas A&M in the season finale ... UCF quarterback McKenzie Milton, who led the No. 7-ranked Knights to a second consecutive perfect regular season, has been chosen as the American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year for the second straight year, while ECU defensive end Nate Harvey, the national leader in tackles for loss, was named as The American's Defensive Player of the Year by the league's 12 head coaches.

Temple wide receiver Isaiah Wright was named as The American's Special Teams Player of the Year. Cincinnati quarterback Desmond Ridder was chosen as Rookie of the Year, while Bearcat head coach Luke Fickell was named as Coach of the Year.

Milton becomes the first player to repeat as The American's Offensive Player of the Year as he served as the catalyst behind an offense that leads the conference and ranks fifth nationally at 531.5 yards per game and averaged 43.1 points per game, which ranks eighth. Milton, who suffered a serious injury in UCF's win against USF last Friday, threw for 2,663 yards and 25 touchdowns with six interceptions and rushed for 307 yards and a team-high nine TDs in 2018.

Harvey enjoyed a breakout season as a senior at ECU in 2018. After spending last season primarily on special teams, Harvey emerged as a starting defensive end and enters Saturday's regular-season finale at North Carolina State as the national leader in tackles for loss (24.0). Harvey broke The American's single-season record of 23.0 tackles for loss, set by Houston's Ed Oliver last year, and enters Saturday's game with 13.5 sacks, one shy of the conference's single-season record (14.5 by Louisville's Marcus Smith in 2013). He is the first ECU player to be chosen as The American's Defensive Player of the Year.

Wright becomes the first Temple player to earn Special Teams Player of the Year honors from The American. Wright scored a nation-leading three special teams touchdowns in 2018 and enters the postseason as the conference leader in punt return average (13.9 yards per return). Wright is third in the conference in kickoff return average (25.9 ypr) and fifth in all-purpose yards (119.0 yards per game).

Ridder is the first Cincinnati player to be named as The American's Rookie of the Year. Ridder took over as the Bearcats' quarterback during the season-opening win at UCLA and has led Cincinnati to a 10-2 record. Ridder has thrown for 2,382 yards and 19 touchdowns with five interceptions and has rushed for 563 yards and five TDs. He ranks fourth in The American in pass efficiency (145.7) and fifth in total offense (245.4 ypg).

Fickell was chosen by his peers as The American's Coach of the Year after he orchestrated a six-win improvement in his second year on the Cincinnati sideline. After going 4-8 in his first year, Fickell has led the Bearcats to a 10-2 overall record, a 4-0 in mark in nonconference games and a 6-2 conference mark in 2018. The Bearcats returned to the national polls for the first time since 2013, ranking as high as No. 19 in the Nov. 11 Associated Press poll.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is a big success. Fans, including many who are new to the sport, enjoy it. The first College Football Playoff semifinals and national championship were the three most-viewed programs in cable television history.

Every Game Counts

The playoff preserves the excitement and significance of college football's unique regular season where every game counts.

Four Teams

The selection committee ranks the teams based on the members' evaluation of the teams' performance on the field, using conference championships won, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, and comparison of results against common opponents to decide among teams that are comparable.

Two Games, One Goal

The kickoff of the new year belongs to college football, with two semifinal games rotating annually among the Cotton Bowl, Fiesta Bowl, Orange Bowl, Peach Bowl, Rose Bowl and Sugar Bowl. The two teams winning the playoff semifinals compete for the College Football Playoff National Championship. That game is in a different city each year, always on a Monday night.

Universal Access

Every FBS team has equal access to the College Football Playoff based on its performance. No team automatically qualifies.

Governance

University presidents and chancellors from all 10 FBS conferences and Notre Dame serve on the CFP Board of Managers and govern the administrative operations, with commissioners (the Management Committee) managing the event. A small staff in the playoff office in Irving, Texas, carries out the detailed responsibilities.

Selection Committee

A talented group of high-integrity individuals with experience as coaches, student-athletes, college administrators and journalists, along with sitting athletics directors, comprise the selection committee. Members of the committee are: Rob Mullens (chair), Frank Beamer, Paola Boivin, Jeff Bower, Joe Castiglione, Herb Deromedi, Ken Hatfield, Chris Howard, Bobby Johnson, Ronnie Lott, Gene Smith, Todd Stansbury, and Scott Stricklin.

Selection Committee Responsibilities

- Rank the top 25 teams and assign the top four to semifinal sites.
- Assign teams to New Year's bowls
- Create competitive matchups
- Attempt to avoid rematches of regular-season games and repeat appearances
- Consider geography

Participants In New Year's Bowls

Both participants in the Orange, Rose and Sugar Bowls are contracted outside the playoff arrangement (Big Ten and Pac-12 to Rose Bowl; SEC and Big 12 to Sugar Bowl; ACC to Orange Bowl against the highest ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten and Notre Dame). If a conference champion qualifies for the playoff, then the bowl will choose a replacement from that conference. When those bowls host the semifinals and their contracted conference champions do not qualify, then the displaced champion(s) will play in one of the other New Year's bowls.

When not hosting semifinals, the Cotton, Fiesta and Peach Bowls will welcome displaced conference champions and the top-ranked champion from a non-contract conference. The highest-ranked available teams will fill any other berths. The selection committee will make the pairings.

BOWL PARTNERSHIPS

The American Bowl Lineup

In addition to the College Football Playoff and New Year's Bowls, The American has either a primary or secondary affiliation with 12 bowl games during its current six-year bowl cycle, which ends following the 2019 season. The American works annually with its member schools and bowl partners to create the most sensible and attractive postseason matchups.

The **Military Bowl presented by Northrop Grumman** takes place at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium in Annapolis, Maryland, while the events and activities surrounding the game are based in Washington, D.C. The American Athletic Conference will face an opponent from the Atlantic Coast Conference each year in the current cycle.

The **Jared Birmingham Bowl** takes place at Legion Field in Birmingham, Alabama. The American/Big East has partnered with the bowl since its inception in the 2006 season. The American Athletic Conference will annually face an opponent from the Southeastern Conference.

The **Bad Boy Mowers Gasparilla Bowl** is played at Raymond James Stadium in Tampa, Florida. The American Athletic Conference will supply a team to the bowl during each year of the six-year cycle. Conference USA will play in the game in 2015, 2017 and 2019, while the Atlantic Coast Conference provides the opposing team in 2014, 2016 and 2018.

The **Cheribundi Tart Cherry Boca Raton Bowl** began in 2014 and will feature an American Athletic Conference team three times during the six-year cycle at FAU Stadium in Boca Raton, Florida. The American representative will play a team from Conference USA in 2018.

The **Frisco Bowl** will be played for the second time in 2018 as the former Miami Beach Bowl was relocated to Toyota Stadium in Frisco, Texas. An American Athletic Conference plays in the bowl each year.

The **AutoNation Cure Bowl** made its debut in 2015 at the newly renovated Camping World Stadium in Orlando, Florida. An American Athletic Conference team will be paired against an opponent from the Sun Belt Conference. Net proceeds from the game will benefit the Breast Cancer Research Foundation.

The **Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl** is played at Amon G. Carter Stadium on the campus of Texas Christian University. The American Athletic Conference sends a team to the bowl in 2014, 2016 and 2018. The opponent will be a Big 12 team in 2016 and 2018, with Conference USA as a secondary affiliation.

In addition to the conference's primary bowl affiliations, The American holds secondary partnerships with the **AutoZone Liberty Bowl** in Memphis, Tennessee, and the **Walk-On's Independence Bowl** in Shreveport, Louisiana, as well as with other ESPN-owned bowls.
