

Postgame Notes Cincinnati 28, Tulsa 20 Nov. 6, 2021 | Nippert Stadium | Attendance: 37,978

Highlights

- Cincinnati improves to 9-0 for second-straight season and the fourth time in school history.
- The win marks Cincinnati's 12th-straight win against AAC opponents and third-straight against Tulsa. It also marks UC's 35th-straight win against unranked opponents.
- Cincinnati improved to 15-5 (.750) in road games since 2018.
- The Bearcats are 18-2 (.900) since 2019 against AAC opponents, which is the best mark in the conference.
- UC is now 40-6 (.870) since 2018, ranking among the top six teams in CFB in winning percentage during that span.
- Head Coach Luke Fickell is now 44-14 (.759) in five seasons at Cincinnati. This is the Bearcats' second consecutive 9-0 start under him and fourth all-time (also 1951 and 2009).
- UC is 33-2 when leading at the half under Fickell.
- Today's captains were Desmond Ridder, Coby Bryant, Vincent McConnell and Joel Dublanko.
- Cincinnati won the coin toss and elected to defer.
- UC improved its all-time record to 646-594-50 (.520).

Charting Quarterback Desmond Ridder

- With 43 rushing yards today, Desmond Ridder became only the second active player in the FBS with over 2,000 rushing yards and 8,000 passing yards (D'Eriq King, Miami).
- With two touchdown passes today, Ridder now has 77 career TD passes. UC quarterbacks coach Gino Guidugli is the school-record holder with 78 (2001-04).
- With 317 total yards today, Ridder has 11,064 yards of total offense. He is just 17 yards away from passing Greg Ward Jr. for third place in AAC history.
- With his 12-yard strike to Alec Pierce in the third quarter, Ridder continued a 19-game streak where he has thrown a touchdown pass.
- Ridder's three-yard rushing TD on the opening drive was his school-best 26th of his career.
- Ridder remains the winningest quarterback in college football with a 40-5 (90%) record.

Offensive Notes

- Before leaving with an injury in the second quarter, Jerome Ford found the end zone for his 15th rushing touchdown of the season. That moves him into third place with DeMarco McCleskey for single-season rushing touchdowns in Bearcats history. That touchdown also gave him 16 total touchdowns on the year, vaulting him into fourth place for single-season total touchdowns, tying him with Michael Warren.
- Ford also had a career-high 67 receiving yards despite his injury. His two catches of 33 and 34 yards were both career-highs at the time of the catch.
- Alec Pierce's 113 receiving yards marked his second game over the century mark this season and fourth of his career. It's also his second-straight game against Tulsa with over 100 yards (five for 146 in 2020 AAC Championship Game).
- Michael Young Jr. caught his second touchdown of the season on a 31-yard pass from Desmond Ridder. It was Young's fifth touchdown catch of his career.
- Cincinnati's 390 yards of total offense is the most since the UCF game on Oct. 16.

Defense

• Cincinnati's defense has not given up points on the opponents' opening drive since UCF on Nov. 21, 2020, as well as any to start a half this season.

- Coby Bryant's forced-fumble and Ja'von Hicks' recovery marked UC's 20th forced turnover of the season.
- Curtis Brooks' strip-sack gives him 3 ½ on the year in addition to two forced fumbles.
- Joel Dublanko set a new-career high with 17 tackles, which led the team.
- Bryan Cook's 14 tackles marked a career-high.
- Jabari Taylor recovered a fumble in the end zone with 36 seconds left. Darrian Beavers was the Bearcat to hit the ball carrier last.
