GAME STORYLINES

- ✓ Pitt and newly minted Big 12 member Cincinnati renew ties for the first time in 11 years. The Panthers and Bearcats met annually as Big East foes from 2005-12.
- ✓ The Panthers have won six consecutive games dating back to last season, their longest winning streak since also winning six straight in 2009.
- ✓ The Cincinnati game begins a stretch of 11 consecutive "Power Conference" opponents for Pitt. The Panthers are one of just six teams that will play 11 such foes in 2023, joining Colorado, Louisville, Purdue, Utah and West Virginia.
- ✓ Pitt's last seven-game winning streak bridged the 2001-02 seasons. The Panthers have not won eight straight since the 1981-82 campaigns.
- ✓ Cincinnati is under the direction of new head coach Scott Satterfield, who previously coached at Louisville. Satterfield was 1-1 against Pitt as the Cardinals' head coach.
- ✓ Pat Narduzzi spent three years as defensive coordinator at Cincinnati (2004-06) under Coach Mark Dantonio, helping the Bearcats to a pair of bowl appearances.
- ✓ The Panthers hold an 8-4 series edge against Cincinnati. The Bearcats, however, have won the past two encounters (2011-12).
- ✓ Pitt linebacker coach Ryan Manalac was a standout player at that same position for Cincinnati from 2005-08, compiling nearly 200 career tackles and helping the Bearcats to the 2008 Big East title.
- ✓ Pitt will play Big 12 foes in consecutive weeks. In addition to Cincinnati, the Panthers travel to West Virginia for the "Backyard Brawl" on September 16.

√ The 2023 season marks Pat Narduzzi's ninth as Pitt's Chris Bickell '97 Head Football Coach. During his tenure, Narduzzi has led the Panthers to an ACC championship (2021) and two ACC Coastal Division titles (2018 and 2021).

√ Narduzzi has compiled a 63-41 overall record. His 63 victories rank second all-time at Pitt, trailing only the legendary Jock Sutherland, who compiled 111 wins from 1924-38.

√ Since 2015, Narduzzi has directed Pitt to 41 victories in ACC play, the second-highest win total during that span. The Panthers trail only Clemson (60).

√ Narduzzi directed the Panthers to a combined 20 wins over the past two seasons (2021-22). Pitt last achieved 20 wins over a two-year span in 1981-82.

√ In 2022, Pitt finished 9-4, including a stirring 37-35 win over nationally ranked UCLA in the Sun Bowl. Pitt was one of the nation's hottest teams at season's end, closing with five consecutive wins by an average margin of 14 points.

√ Pitt finished 2022 in the national Top 25 for the second consecutive season, placing No. 22 in both major polls. It marked the first time since 1979-83 that Pitt earned Top 25 finishes in back-to-back years.

√ In 2021, Narduzzi led Pitt to one of the most accomplished seasons in school history. The Panthers' stormed to 11 victories—their most since 1981—and claimed their first outright conference title with a 45-21 triumph over Wake Forest in the ACC Championship Game.

√ Pitt earned a No. 13 ranking in the final 2021 polls, its highest finish since 1982. Pitt placed No. 12 in the final College Football Playoff ratings, their highest ever.

√ Narduzzi has coached nine first team All-Americans at Pitt. In 2022, defensive tackle Calijah Kancey earned unanimous All-America status, the Panthers' first unanimous pick since defensive tackle Aaron Donald in 2013.

√ Over the past three seasons (2020-22), Pitt ranks third nationally (first in the ACC) with four consensus All-Americans. In addition to Kancey, wide receiver Jordan Addison (2021) and defensive ends Patrick Jones II (2020) and Rashad Weaver (2020) were consensus picks.

√ In 2021, quarterback Kenny Pickett won the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award (nation's top upperclassman quarterback) and was a Heisman Trophy finalist, wide receiver Jordan Addison won the Biletnikoff Award (nation's outstanding receiver) and specialist Cal Adomitis earned the Patrick Mannely Award (nation's top long snapper).

√ Under Narduzzi's watch, Pitt continues to produce high-level NFL prospects. Over the past three drafts (2021-23), the Panthers' 14 picks are the most of any ACC program. (Clemson is second with 13.)

√ Six Pitt products—defensive tackle Calijah Kancey, offensive tackle Carter Warren, running back Israel Abanikanda, linebacker SirVocea Dennis and safeties Erick Hallett II and Brandon Hill—were selected in the 2023 NFL Draft, the most in the ACC (tied with Clemson) and fifth most nationally.

√ Kancey was drafted in the first round by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, marking the second consecutive year Pitt produced a first-round pick. In the 2022 draft, quarterback Kenny Pickett was a first-round selection of the Pittsburgh Steelers—the first Pitt QB to be picked in the opening round since Dan Marino in 1983.

√ Narduzzi's Panthers have a well-earned reputation as a dangerous opponent for highly ranked foes. In 2019, Pitt scored a 35-34 triumph over UCF, which visited Heinz Field riding a 27-game non-bowl winning streak. The winning touchdown—a gadget-play pass caught by quarterback Kenny Pickett—has been immortalized as the "Pitt Special."

√ In 2017, Pitt closed the season with a 24-14 victory over No. 2 Miami, which entered the game undefeated and on the cusp of the College Football Playoff.

√ In 2016, the Panthers defeated two teams that finished in the top 5 of the final CFP rankings. Pitt gave No. 2 Clemson—that year's national champion—its only loss (43-42) and kept No. 5 Penn State out of the playoff field by defeating the Nittany Lions, 42-39.

√ Pitt has also thrived off the field under Narduzzi's watch. During the 2021-22 academic year, Pitt led all college football programs in community service hours per Helper Helper.

- √ During Narduzzi's tenure, Pitt has two recipients of the Disney Spirit Award, presented to the most inspirational figure in college football: James Conner (2016) and Tre Tipton (2021). Additionally, Deslin Alexandre was honored as the Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year and the male collegiate recipient of the Coach Wooden Citizenship Cup for 2022.
- √ In 2020, Pitt earned an NCAA Public Recognition Award for achieving an Academic Progress Rate (APR) score that ranked in the top 10% of all football programs. The Panthers' multi-year 988 APR set a Pitt football program record and was 24 points higher than the national average.
- √ Narduzzi arrived at Pitt following eight highly successful years as the defensive coordinator at Michigan State under Mark Dantonio. The Spartans were the only team to rank in the nation's top 10 in total defense and rushing defense each season from 2011-14.
- √ Michigan State boasted the nation's top rushing defense in 2014, yielding just 88.5 yards per game. The Spartans finished with a No. 5 national ranking and 11-2 record following a 42-41 victory over Baylor in the Cotton Bowl.
- √ In 2013, Michigan State finished No. 3 in the country following a Big Ten title and 24-20 victory over No. 5 Stanford in the Rose Bowl. Narduzzi was named the 2013 recipient of the prestigious Broyles Award, annually presented to the country's top assistant coach.
- √ Narduzzi tutored an impressive list of decorated defensive players at Michigan State, including first team All-Americans in cornerback Darqueze Dennard, safety Kurtis Drummond, linebacker Greg Jones and defensive tackle Jerel Worthy.
- √ Dennard was a unanimous All-American in 2013, becoming the first Michigan State cornerback to earn that distinction. He also was the school's first winner of the Jim Thorpe Award, given annually to college football's top defensive back.
- √ Dennard was a first-round NFL Draft pick of the Cincinnati Bengals in 2014, the first Spartans defensive back taken in the initial round since 1961. In the 2015 draft, another Narduzzi pupil, Michigan State cornerback Trae Waynes, was a first-round pick of the Minnesota Vikings.
- √ Prior to Michigan State, Narduzzi spent three years (2004-06) as defensive coordinator under Dantonio at Cincinnati, helping the Bearcats to a pair of bowl invitations.
- √ In 2003, Narduzzi was the defensive coordinator at Miami of Ohio under the late Terry Hooppner. The RedHawks stormed to a 13-1 record that season, capturing the Mid-American Conference (MAC) championship and defeating nationally ranked Louisville in the GMAC Bowl to finish No. 10 in the Associated Press poll.
- √ While quarterback Ben Roethlisberger headlined Miami's offense, Narduzzi's stout unit topped the MAC in rushing defense (19th nationally), scoring defense (22nd nationally) and pass efficiency defense (34th nationally).
- √ Narduzzi served as linebackers coach at Northern Illinois for three seasons (2000-02). NIU won a pair of MAC divisional titles during his tenure and in 2002 had the league's top rushing defense.
- √ From 1993-99, Narduzzi coached at his alma mater, Rhode Island, serving as the Rams' defensive coordinator his final two seasons. He began his coaching career at Miami of Ohio, working as a graduate assistant in 1990 and 1991, before earning his first full-time position as receivers coach for the 1992 season.
- √ Narduzzi was an All-Ohio performer at Youngstown's Ursuline High School, leading the Irish to the Steel Valley championship and state playoffs as a senior in 1984.
- √ Narduzzi was a starting linebacker under his father, the late Bill Narduzzi, as a freshman at Youngstown State in 1985 before transferring to Rhode Island, where he became a three-year starter for the Rams from 1987-89.
- √ Bill Narduzzi was head coach at YSU from 1975-85. He led the Penguins to two NCAA Division II playoff appearances, including the national championship game in 1979, and twice was named the Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year. One of Bill's first coaching posts was as a freshman line coach at Pitt in 1962.

SERIES NOTES

Pitt and Cincinnati renew ties for the first time in 11 years...the Panthers and Bearcats were annual foes from 2005-12 when both schools were members of the Big East Conference...Pitt leads the overall series, 8-4...the Panthers won the initial seven games of the series, but enter the 2023 encounter having lost four of the past five...Pitt is 5-2 against the Bearcats in Pittsburgh and 3-2 on the road...the last game was a 34-10 Cincinnati win played on Sept. 6, 2012 at Nippert Stadium...the last time the two teams met in Pittsburgh, the Bearcats overcame a 10-point deficit to score a 26-23 win on Nov. 5, 2011...that victory helped Cincinnati claim a share of the 2011 Big East title...Pitt fell to the Bearcats in 2008 (28-21) and 2009 (45-44) with both games impacting the Big East's BCS berth...propelled by those victories, Cincinnati went on to win the Big East championship and play in the 2009 Orange Bowl and 2010 Sugar Bowl...the Panthers' last win in the series came on Dec. 4, 2010, a 28-10 decision in Nippert Stadium that secured a share of the Big East title for Pitt...but due to tiebreakers, the Panthers went to a non-BCS postseason destination in Birmingham's BBVA Compass Bowl.

- ✓ On the strength of a five-game winning streak and Sun Bowl victory over No. 18 UCLA, Pitt finished in the national Top 25 for a second consecutive season in 2022.
- ✓ The Panthers finished No. 22 in both the Associated Press and USA TODAY AFCA coaches polls. It marked the first time since 1979-83 that Pitt earned Top 25 finishes in consecutive years.
- ✓ The Panthers concluded the 2021 season No. 13 in the AP and coaches polls, their highest final ranking since 1982.

ACC EXCELLENCE:

- ✓ Since taking over as Pitt's head coach in 2015, Pat Narduzzi has directed the Panthers to 41 victories in ACC play, the second-highest win total during that span. The Panthers trail only Clemson (60).
- ✓ Pitt's 2021 ACC championship marked the first outright conference title in program history. Pitt twice shared the Big East championship (2004 and 2010).

- ✓ The program's rich legacy includes 99 first team All-Americans, 55 consensus All-Americans, 24 College Football Hall of Famers, 10 Pro Football Hall of Famers and nine national titles.

- ✓ Phil Jurkovec, one of the most prolific passers in Western Pennsylvania high school history, signed with Pitt as a December graduate transfer and is playing his final collegiate season in his hometown.
- ✓ In his Pitt debut against Wofford (Sept. 2), Jurkovec threw for 214 yards and a touchdown on 17-of-23 passing, while rushing for 41 yards and a score on seven attempts.
- ✓ A product of nearby Pine-Richland High School, Jurkovec threw for 8,202 yards and 71 touchdowns during his prep career. His 11,144 total yards ranked second in WPIAL history.
- ✓ In three seasons at Boston College (2020-22), he threw for 5,184 yards on 59% passing (404 of 679) with 35 touchdowns and 17 interceptions. He also rushed for nine TDs.
- ✓ His most productive season came in 2020, when in 10 starting assignments he threw for 2,558 yards on 61% passing (205 of 336) with 17 TDs and five INTs.
- ✓ Jurkovec is reunited at Pitt with his former offensive coordinator, Frank Cignetti Jr., who worked at Boston College over the 2020-21 seasons before joining Pat Narduzzi's Pitt staff in 2022.

- ✓ The graduated Kenny Pickett (2017-21), now of the Pittsburgh Steelers, had 16 career games with more than 300 passing yards, the most in Pitt history. He had a Pitt single-season record eight in 2021.
- ✓ Among Pitt's current crop of quarterbacks, only graduate transfer Phil Jurkovec has a 300-yard passing game to his credit, accomplishing the feat eight times at Boston College over the 2020-22 seasons.

- ✓ Pitt ranked third nationally and first in the ACC with five defensive touchdowns last season.
- ✓ It marked the second consecutive year Pitt scored five defensive TDs. In 2021, the Panthers led the ACC and ranked fourth nationally in defensive touchdowns.
- ✓ Pitt led the country in combined defensive touchdowns (10) and pick sixes (eight) over the past two seasons (2021-22).
- ✓ The Panthers' active leaders in defensive touchdowns are cornerbacks M.J. Devonshire and Marquis Williams with two each (all via interception returns).
- ✓ Pitt has scored 21 defensive touchdowns under Pat Narduzzi since the 2015 season. Pitt is 15-5 under Narduzzi when scoring a defensive TD.
- ✓ Pitt has scored 45 defensive TDs since the 2000 season. The Panthers are 37-5 when scoring at least one defensive TD in a game since 2000.

NOSE FOR THE END ZONE:

- √ Cornerbacks M.J. Devonshire and Marquis Williams led the Panthers with two defensive touchdowns each last season. All four of their combined scores came on pick sixes.
- √ Devonshire and Williams became the first Pitt players with multiple pick sixes in a season since Darrelle Revis also had two in 2006.
- √ In its 37-7 win at Virginia (Nov. 12, 2022), Pitt returned interceptions for touchdowns on the first two plays from scrimmage.
- √ Devonshire's interception of Brennan Armstrong and 29-yard return gave the Panthers a 7-0 lead just five seconds in. Following a touchback, Williams picked off Armstrong, returning it for a 39-yard score and 14-0 lead at the 14:44 mark.
- √ Pitt had two pick sixes in a game for the first time since Sept. 2, 2006. Coincidentally, that game was also against Virginia. Revis (19 yards) and Clint Session (78 yards) both had INTs for TDs in the 38-13 win.
- √ The Panthers' most dramatic defensive score last season occurred in their pulsating 38-31 win over West Virginia in the Sept. 1 opener. Two plays after Pitt tied the score at 31, Devonshire picked off a tipped pass, returning it 56 yards for the game-winning touchdown with 2:58 left.

SACK MASTERS:

- √ The Panthers annually boast one of college football's most potent pass rushes. Pitt has finished in the top two nationally in sacks per game each of the past four seasons (2019-22).
- √ Pitt collected 199 sacks over the past four seasons, the highest total in the nation over that span. The Panthers had 21 more sacks than the next team (Clemson with 178).
- √ In 2022, Pitt finished second nationally with an average of 3.69 sacks per game. The Panthers compiled 48 total sacks in 13 contests.
- √ Pitt collected four sacks in this year's season-opening 45-7 win over Wofford.

- ✓ Kicker Ben Sauls was perfect on six placements (5-5 PAT, 1-1 FG) for eight points in the Panthers' season-opening 45-7 win over Wofford.
- ✓ Sauls has now made 11 consecutive field goals and 16 of his last 17 dating back to last year. (His lone miss was from 54 yards.)
- ✓ The Pitt record for consecutive field goals is 12 set by Chris Ferenik in 1995 and tied by Conor Lee in 2007.

POINTS APLENTY:

- ✓ In 2022, Ben Sauls compiled 107 points—converting 20-of-24 field goals (83%) and each of his 47 PATs—the third-highest kick scoring total in a season at Pitt.

SUN BOWL HERO:

- √ Ben Sauls had a heroic performance in Pitt's 37-35 win over UCLA in the 2022 Sun Bowl, converting each of his seven placements (five field goals and two PATs) in windy conditions, including a game-winning 47-yard kick with just four seconds left.
- √ He was named the John Folmer Sun Bowl Special Teams MVP and to the Associated Press All-Bowl Team.
- √ Sauls set Sun Bowl records for field goals made (five) and kick scoring (17 points), breaking marks originally set by Nebraska's Paul Rogers in 1969 (four field goals, 15 points).
- √ Sauls tied the Pitt single-game record for field goals made (Conor Lee at Notre Dame, 2008).

BIG FOOT:

- √ In Pitt's 28-26 win over Duke (Nov. 19, 2022), Ben Sauls converted a 51-yard field goal, the Panthers' longest since Nov. 21, 2020, when Alex Kessman made kicks of 52 and 53 yards against Virginia Tech.
- √ There are only 25 field goals of 50 yards or more on record at Pitt.

HISTORIC PUNT:

- √ Caleb Junko made history against UCLA in the 2022 Sun Bowl when he boomed an 85-yard punt, setting a Pitt and all-time collegiate bowl record.
- √ Junko eclipsed the all-time bowl mark set by SMU's Kyle Rote (84 yards) against Oregon in the 1949 Cotton Bowl.
- √ The previous Sun Bowl mark was 78 yards (Oklahoma's Scott Blanton against Texas Tech in 1993).
- √ Junko broke the Pitt record of 80 yards set by Nate Cochran in 1996 against Kent State.
- √ Junko appeared in seven games overall last year, averaging 48.7 yards on 12 punts. He placed four punts inside the 20-yard line and had one result in a fair catch.
- √ In the 2023 season opener against Wofford, Junko averaged 46 yards on two punts. He had a long of 47.

LEGENDARY COMPANY:

- √ In 2022, M.J. Devonshire became the first Pitt player to score touchdowns via both punt and interception returns in the same season since Darrelle Revis in 2006.
- √ Devonshire had three return touchdowns last season, including two pick sixes.
- √ He had a game-winning 56-yard pick six in the Panthers' 38-31 victory over West Virginia (Sept. 1, 2022) and then had a 29-yard interception return TD in the 37-7 win at Virginia (Nov. 12, 2022).
- √ Devonshire opened the scoring against Rhode Island (Sept. 24, 2022) with an 82-yard punt return touchdown.
- √ Revis also had two interception return touchdowns and one punt return TD in 2006.

BLOCK PARTY:

- √ Pitt led the ACC (tied) and ranked 14th nationally with two blocked punts last season.
- √ The Panthers were 19th (third in the ACC) with three blocked kicks overall.
- √ Pitt blocked two kicks in its 45-29 win over Virginia Tech (Oct. 8, 2022): an extra point by Deandre Jules and a punt by Habakkuk Baldonado.
- √ It was the first time Pitt blocked two kicks in a game since Nov. 22, 2008 (at Cincinnati).
- √ Phillip O'Brien Jr. was responsible for the other blocked punt (against Tennessee, Sept. 10, 2022).
- √ Under Pat Narduzzi, the Panthers have blocked 18 kicks since the 2015 season.
