Stephenson Taken in the Second Round of the NBA Draft

Indiana Pacers select Lance Stephenson with the 40th overall pick of the 2010 NBA Draft

NEW YORK — Cincinnati guard and 2010 BIG EAST Rookie of the Year **Lance Stephenson (Brooklyn, N.Y./Lincoln)** was taken in the second round of the 2010 National Basketball Association Draft Thursday at Madison Square Garden in New York.

The Indiana Pacers selected Stephenson with the 10th pick in the second round — 40th overall. He is the first Bearcat to be taken in the NBA Draft since **James White** was taken by Portland in the second round in 2006. Since 1950, 56 Cincinnati basketball players have been drafted by NBA teams, including 10 first-round selections.

"I know that playing in the NBA has been a lifelong goal for Lance and our entire program is excited for him and his family," said fifth-year UC head coach **Mick Cronin**. "I thank Lance for his efforts at Cincinnati and want him to know how much we appreciate his loyalty to us. I personally look forward to watching Lance grow and develop as a professional and as a man."

Stephenson was the sixth BIG EAST Conference player taken in the 2010 NBA Draft. He joins veterans **Jason Maxiell** (Detroit) and **Kenyon Martin** (Denver) as former Bearcats active in the NBA.

In March, Stephenson was named the BIG EAST Rookie of the Year, becoming the first UC men's basketball player to earn the distinction since the Bearcats joined the BIG EAST Conference in 2005-06. He joined **DerMarr Johnson** (1999-00 - Conference USA), **Danny Fortson** (1994-95 - Great Midwest Conference), and **Dontonio Wingfield** (1993-94 - Great Midwest Conference) as the only players in program history to earn freshman/rookie/newcomer of the year honors.

Stephenson led all BIG EAST freshmen in scoring in overall games (12.3 ppg) and conference-only games (12.1 ppg). He also finished in the Top 5 overall among league freshmen in rebounds (5.4 rpg/4th), steals (1.0 spg/5th), and assists (2.4 apg/4th).

Four times this season, the 6-foot-5 guard from Brooklyn, N.Y., was named BIG EAST Rookie of the Week, the most by any incoming player. Stephenson won the weekly award the last two weeks of the regular season after averaging 16.8 points and 8.3 rebounds per game over UC's last four contests. He also added 11 assists and five steals during the stretch.

Stephenson committed to the Bearcats last summer after a highly-decorated prep career at Lincoln High School, where he averaged 28.9 points, 10.2 rebounds, and 3.9 assists to earn Class AA New York State Sports Writers Association (NYSSWA) Player of the Year honors his senior year. He graduated high school as the all-time leading scorer in the history of the state of New York with 2,946 points, passing fellow Lincoln High grad Sebastian Telfair, who was the 13th overall pick in the 2004 NBA Draft and now plays for the Cleveland Cavaliers.

BEARCATS DRAFT QUICK FACTS

- 10 Bearcats have been taken in the first round of the NBA Draft. The first was Connie Dierking in 1958 when he was taken No. 6 by the Syracuse Nationals.
- Oscar Robertson (1960) and Kenyon Martin (2000) are the only Bearcats taken with the No. 1 overall selection in the NBA Draft.
- When Kenyon Martin was taken No. 1 overall in 2000 and his teammate Der-Marr Johnson went No. 6, it marked the highest that two college teammates had been selected since the beginning of the NBA Draft Lottery.
- A total of 14 Bearcats have been selected in the NBA Draft over the 25 years since the league went to the two-round format.

BIG EAST Conference Rookie of the Year ... ranked 28th in the BIG EAST in scoring (12.3 ppg) in overall games and was the top freshman scorer in the league ... finished campaign with 13 points and six rebounds vs. Dayton in the second round of the NIT (3/22) ... added 14 points in first-round NIT game vs. Weber State (3/17) ... notched seventh consecutive double-figure scoring effort with a game-high 19 points in the quarterfinals of the BIG EAST Championship against No. 7/6 West Virginia (3/11) ... poured in 13 points, including the game-winning free throw with less than two seconds to play, and grabbed nine rebounds in the first round of the conference tournament against Rutgers (3/9) ... scored a season-best 23 points and made a season-high 11 field goals in 17 attempts at No. 19/20 Georgetown (3/6) ... registered third consecutive double-figure scoring performance against No. 9/9 Villanova with 12 points (3/2) ... named BIG EAST Freshman of the Week for a third time on March 1 after averaging almost a double-double against DePaul (2/24) and West Virginia (2/27) ... registered first career double-double with 18 points and 10 rebounds, which included a season-best five offensive rebounds, in win over DePaul (2/24) ... posted a team-high 14 points in win at UConn (2/13) ... scored 10 points and added a team-high eight rebounds against Syracuse (2/7) ... added 12 points and nine boards off the bench in win over Providence (1/30) ... scored 12 points and grabbed six rebounds at Louisville (1/24) ... poured in 15 points at Seton Hall (1/9) ... scored 13 of 15 points in the first half to No. 23 Pittsburgh (1/4) ... led UC to a win over No. 10 Connecticut (12/30) with 21 points in BIG EAST debut, including the go-ahead free throws with 0.7 seconds to play ... scored a team-best 19 points and dished out five assists in win over Lipscomb (12/19) ... collected a team-high 22 points, the first 20-point performance of his career, on nine made field goals in Crosstown Shootout against Xavier (12/13) ... poured in a game-high 17 points and tacked on eight rebounds, three assists, and three steals against Miami (OH) (12/10) ... put together a terrific all-around performance with seven points, a careerhigh seven assists, and a career-high 11 rebounds against Texas Southern (12/1) ... scored a team-high 15 points in EA Sports Maui Invitational Championship against Gonzaga (11/25) ... fell just shy of first double-double with 11 points and eight boards against Maryland (11/24) ... scored 16 points on 6-of-13 shooting in win over Toledo (11/18) ... scored seven points, grabbed four boards and dished out two assists in collegiate debut against Prairie View A&M (11/16) ... named BIG EAST Freshman of the Week on Nov. 23 and Dec. 14.
