## WEEKLY HONORS

### OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

McKenzie Milton • UCF • Jr. • QB • Kapolei, Hawaii

Milton had a hand in six touchdowns and finished with 389 yards of total offense to lead UCF to its conference-record 16th straight victory, a 56-36 win against Florida Atlantic. Milton completed 21 of 32 passes for 306 yards and three touchdowns and was the Knights' leading rusher with 81 yards on 13 carries and three more TDs.

### DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Quincy Roche • Temple • So. • DE • Randallstown, Md.

Roche led a Temple defense that forced five turnovers in the Owls' 31-17 win against Tulsa in the conference opener for both teams. Roche finished with a pair of forced fumbles among his 2.0 sacks and eight tackles, including a strip sack in the third quarter that was returned for a 50-yard touchdown.

### SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Reggie Roberson Jr. • SMU • So. • WR • DeSoto, Texas

Roberson had 167 all-purpose yards and scored two touchdowns, including a key 98-yard kickoff return, to help SMU to a 31-30 win against Navy in the Mustangs' conference opener. Roberson, whose kickoff return gave the Mustangs a 17-14 lead in the third quarter, also had four receptions for 38 yards and a TD.

### HONOR ROLL

Desmond Ridder • Cincinnati • Fr. • QB

Completed 19 of 29 passes for 274 yards and two touchdowns and had a rushing TD in a 34-30 win against Ohio.

Darrell Henderson • Memphis • Jr. • RB

Rushed for 188 yards and two touchdowns and finished with 249 all-purpose yards in a 52-35 win against South Alabama.

Jordan Cronkrite • USF • Jr. • RB

Rushed for 129 yards on 15 carries, including an 80-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter that stood up as the game-winning points, in a 20-13 win against ECU.

Jordon Williams • SMU • Jr. • LB

Had a game-high 15 tackles with 1.5 tackles for loss, 0.5 sacks and a forced fumble in a 31-30 win against Navy.

Ryquell Armstead • Temple • Jr. • RB

Rushed for 108 yards and a touchdown on 24 carries and added a key third-down sack on defense in a 31-17 win against Tulsa.

## Pow6rful Stuff

The American has 32 nonconference victories against other Power 6 opponents (including Notre Dame) since the start of the 2015 season, the first year of The American's current membership.

## Beasts In The East

The American's East Division has three unbeaten teams through four weeks of the season – Cincinnati and USF are 4-0, while UCF is 3-0. The only other division in FBS football with three undefeated teams is the ACC Atlantic Division (Clemson and Syracuse at 4-0 North Carolina State at 3-0).

## We're Streaking

UCF's 16-game winning streak is the longest active winning streak nationally and is the longest in American Athletic Conference history. UCF broke the old record of 15-game winning streak set by Memphis from Oct. 25, 2014, to Nov. 7, 2015.

## The Big Stage

UCF's 34-27 win against Auburn in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl last season improved American Athletic Conference teams to 3-0 all-time in New Year's Six Bowls.

## Three For Three

The American Athletic Conference, the Big Ten and the Big 12 are the only conferences that have had at least three 10-win teams in each of the last two seasons.

## Perfect 10

The American Athletic Conference has had three 10-win teams in each of the last two seasons. USF, Temple, Tulsa hit double figures in 2016, while UCF, Memphis and USF won at least 10 games each in 2017.

## Offensive Outbursts

The American Athletic Conference has three of the top teams nationally in total offense. Houston is second at 608.5 yards per game, Memphis is fourth at 593.0 ypg, while UCF is fifth with 587.7 ypg.

## Ground And Pound

Navy leads the nation in rushing offense at 355.8 yards per game. Memphis is fifth nationally at 309.5 ypg.

## Ground And Pound (Part II)

Memphis RB Darrell Henderson leads the nation in rushing yards, averaging 177.3 yards per game. Navy QB Malcolm Perry is fourth nationally at 132.5 ypg.

## Bend, But Don't Break

Temple is the national leader in red zone defense through Week 4. The Owls have allowed points on 53.8 percent of opponents' red zone possessions.

## Move The Chains

UCF leads the nation in third down conversion percentage (65.7 percent).

## Road Warriors

Navy will travel 26,496 miles for its eight games away from Annapolis this season, the most mileage for any college football team in the continental United States.

## Separation Of Powers

In the last four regular seasons (2015-18), the American Athletic Conference is a combined 36-12 against teams from Conference USA, the MAC, the Mountain West and the Sun Belt.

## Repeat Performances

For the second consecutive season, The American is the only FBS conference to return its players of the year on offense (UCF QB McKenzie Milton), defense (Houston DT Ed Oliver) and special teams (Memphis WR Tony Pollard).

## Including Postseason

Including bowl games, The American has had a combined 66 games with more than one million television and streaming viewers since the start of the 2015 season. The American had four games with a million viewers through the first two weeks of the 2018 season.

## Heisman Hopefuls

UCF and Houston have launched formal Heisman Trophy campaigns on behalf of their most prominent players. Here is a look at how each has fared in 2018.

### McKenzie Milton • QB • UCF

Finished eighth in the Heisman voting in 2017. Of the seven players who finished higher in the voting, only Stanford RB Bryce Love (second) and Wisconsin RB Jonathan Taylor (sixth) return in 2018

Has completed 66 of 103 passes (64.1 percent) for 895 yards and nine touchdowns and three interceptions. Has rushed for three touchdowns and 147 yards.

Threw for 306 yards and three touchdowns and rushed for 81 yards and three TDs in a 56-36 win against Florida Atlantic.

Threw for 346 yards and five touchdowns in the season-opener at UConn.

### Ed Oliver • DT • Houston

Consensus All-America and Outland Trophy winner in 2017.

Tabbed as the No. 1 player in college football by ESPN, CBS Sports and Sports Illustrated

Has 27 tackles, 5.0 tackles for loss, seven quarterback hurries and one pass defended in four games.

## Fifth Anniversary Team

Twenty-two players on NFL rosters are among the 30 current and former American Athletic Conference players who have been named to the American Athletic Conference Fifth Anniversary Football Team.

Memphis improved to 3-1 with a 52-35 win against South Alabama at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium ... The Tigers opened the season with a 66-14 win against Mercer and dropped a 22-21 decision at Navy in Week 2 before bouncing back with a 59-22 win against Georgia State ... Memphis is averaging 49.5 points and 593.0 yards in four games ... RB Darrell Henderson leads nation in rushing at 177.2 yards per game ... # COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is a big success. Fans, including many who are new to the sport, enjoy it. The first College Football Playoff semifinals and national championship were the three most-viewed programs in cable television history.

## Every Game Counts

The playoff preserves the excitement and significance of college football's unique regular season where every game counts.

## Four Teams

The selection committee ranks the teams based on the members' evaluation of the teams' performance on the field, using conference championships won, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, and comparison of results against common opponents to decide among teams that are comparable.

## Two Games, One Goal

The kickoff of the new year belongs to college football, with two semifinal games rotating annually among the Cotton Bowl, Fiesta Bowl, Orange Bowl, Peach Bowl, Rose Bowl and Sugar Bowl. The two teams winning the playoff semifinals compete for the College Football Playoff National Championship. That game is in a different city each year, always on a Monday night.

## Universal Access

Every FBS team has equal access to the College Football Playoff based on its performance. No team automatically qualifies.

## Governance

University presidents and chancellors from all 10 FBS conferences and Notre Dame serve on the CFP Board of Managers and govern the administrative operations, with commissioners (the Management Committee) managing the event. A small staff in the playoff office in Irving, Texas, carries out the detailed responsibilities.

## Selection Committee

A talented group of high-integrity individuals with experience as coaches, student-athletes, college administrators and journalists, along with sitting athletics directors, comprise the selection committee. Members of the committee are: Rob Mullens (chair), Frank Beamer, Paola Boivin, Jeff Bower, Joe Castiglione, Herb Deromedi, Ken Hatfield, Chris Howard, Bobby Johnson, Ronnie Lott, Gene Smith, Todd Stansbury, and Scott Stricklin.

## Selection Committee Responsibilities

- Rank the top 25 teams and assign the top four to semifinal sites.
- Assign teams to New Year's bowls
- Create competitive matchups
- Attempt to avoid rematches of regular-season games and repeat appearances
- Consider geography

## Participants In New Year's Bowls

Both participants in the Orange, Rose and Sugar Bowls are contracted outside the playoff arrangement (Big Ten and Pac-12 to Rose Bowl; SEC and Big 12 to Sugar Bowl; ACC to Orange Bowl against the highest ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten and Notre Dame). If a conference champion qualifies for the playoff, then the bowl will choose a replacement from that conference. When those bowls host the semifinals and their contracted conference champions do not qualify, then the displaced champion(s) will play in one of the other New Year's bowls.

When not hosting semifinals, the Cotton, Fiesta and Peach Bowls will welcome displaced conference champions and the top-ranked champion from a non-contract conference. The highest-ranked available teams will fill any other berths. The selection committee will make the pairings.

# BOWL PARTNERSHIPS

## The American Bowl Lineup

In addition to the College Football Playoff and New Year's Bowls, The American has either a primary or secondary affiliation with 12 bowl games during its current six-year bowl cycle, which ends following the 2019 season. The American works annually with its member schools and bowl partners to create the most sensible and attractive postseason matchups.

The **Military Bowl presented by Northrop Grumman** takes place at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium in Annapolis, Maryland, while the events and activities surrounding the game are based in Washington, D.C. The American Athletic Conference will face an opponent from the Atlantic Coast Conference each year in the current cycle.

The **Birmingham Bowl** takes place at Legion Field in Birmingham, Alabama. The American/Big East has partnered with the bowl since its inception in the 2006 season. The American Athletic Conference will annually face an opponent from the Southeastern Conference.

The **Bad Boy Mowers Gasparilla Bowl** is played at Raymond James Stadium in Tampa, Florida. The American Athletic Conference will supply a team to the bowl during each year of the six-year cycle. Conference USA will play in the game in 2015, 2017 and 2019, while the Atlantic Coast Conference provides the opposing team in 2014, 2016 and 2018.

The **Cheribundi Tart Cherry Boca Raton Bowl** began in 2014 and will feature an American Athletic Conference team three times during the six-year cycle at FAU Stadium in Boca Raton, Florida. The American representative will play a team from Conference USA in 2018.

The **Frisco Bowl** will be played for the second time in 2018 as the former Miami Beach Bowl was relocated to Toyota Stadium in Frisco, Texas. An American Athletic Conference plays in the bowl each year.

The **AutoNation Cure Bowl** made its debut in 2015 at the newly renovated Camping World Stadium in Orlando, Florida. An American Athletic Conference team will be paired against an opponent from the Sun Belt Conference. Net proceeds from the game will benefit the Breast Cancer Research Foundation.

The **Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl** is played at Amon G. Carter Stadium on the campus of Texas Christian University. The American Athletic Conference sends a team to the bowl in 2014, 2016 and 2018. The opponent will be a Big 12 team in 2016 and 2018, with Conference USA as a secondary affiliation.

In addition to the conference's primary bowl affiliations, The American holds secondary partnerships with the **AutoZone Liberty Bowl** in Memphis, Tennessee, and the **Duck Commander Independence Bowl** in Shreveport, Louisiana, as well as with other ESPN-owned bowls.
