In 16 seasons at the University of Cincinnati, Brian Cleary has established himself as one of the top coaches in UC baseball history. After taking over a struggling program in 1997, Cleary has led the Bearcats to 412 wins in his career, breaking the school record for all-time wins previously owned by the legendary Glenn Sample.

In his 16th season leading the Bearcats, Cleary became just the second head coach in program history to reach the 400-win plateau when UC defeated Chicago State 6-0 on March 10, 2012. He would later surpass Sample on the school's all-time wins list with No. 405 after the Bearcats topped Ohio University 11-2 on April 3 in Athens, Ohio.

Despite the young 2012 Bearcats struggles in the win-loss column, three Bearcats - pitchers Zach Isler and Christian McElroy, and outfielder Jake Proctor - were taken in the Major League Baseball draft, while sophomore outfielder Justin Glass was named All-BIG EAST Conference First Team and ABCA/Rawlings NCAA Mideast Region Second Team. Glass was one of six players to finish the season fourth in the BIG EAST Conference in batting with a .366 average, while his 15 stolen bases were tied for 11th, while his 83 hits are 13th all-time in the UC single-season record book, and his 21 doubles were tied for fourth. Nationally, his double and hit totals ranked 15th and 23rd, respectively, in all of NCAA Division I baseball.

For the fourth consecutive year, UC advanced to the BIG EAST Championship in 2011 after tying for fourth place with a 14-13 conference record. The Bearcats' 30-27 overall record in 2011 marked their sixth straight non-losing season. The '11 campaign saw the development of several young players, highlighted by freshman DH Justin Glass and junior LF/C Braden Kline, who were named second and third-team All-BIG EAST selections, respectively, in their first full-time seasons. It also featured the further skill advancement of multiple veterans, such as seniors Justin Riddell and Dan Jensen. Riddell was named an All-BIG EAST First Team selection after finishing second in the conference in RBI. Jensen was one of the league's most dominant pitchers after finishing third in strikeouts on his was to being drafted by the Cincinnati Reds in the 20th round of the MLB First-Year Player Draft.

Cincinnati produced back-to-back 29-29 overall records in 2009 and 2010, advancing to the conference tournament both seasons. Three Bearcats - Andrew Burkett, Brian Garman and Jimmy Jacquot - were named third-team All-BIG EAST honorees following the 2010 season. Burkett set the single-season school records for saves with 14. Freshman RHP Andrew Strenge was named a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American after setting the BIG EAST single-season record with a 0.62 ERA. Strenge finished 2010 as the league leader in conference-only play not only in ERA, but in opponents' batting average (.208), hits allowed (22), runs allowed (5), earned runs allowed (2), and walks allowed (1).

Regarded as one of the top coaches in country to develop hitters, Cleary has coached 43 position players that have either been drafted or signed as a free agents, only seven of which were drafted out of high school. One of those 43 players was Mike Spina, who cemented himself as one of the top hitters in Bearcats history in just two years of action. After breaking UC's single-season home run record and tying the program's single-season RBI record with 21 home runs and 79 RBI in 2008, Spina drove in 69 runs and broke his own single-season home runs record with 23 in 2009. Additionally, Spina ranks in the Top 10 in UC's career record books in slugging percentage (.703, 1st), home runs (44, 3rd), on-base percentage (.443, 4th), and RBI (148, 6th).



The fortunes of the Bearcats were never better in 2008 as Cleary's charges set a school record for wins in a season (39) and conference wins in a season (19). UC battled for the BIG EAST Regular Season Championship all year, finishing second in the standings and advancing to the Championship game of the postseason tournament. At the conclusion of the year, another mark was matched as four of Cleary's players were selected in the MLB Draft (Josh Harrison, Dan Osterbrock, Tony Campana and Mike Spina). None of those players were drafted out of high school.

The progression began to show dividends during the 2006 season as Cleary guided the Bearcats to their sixth 30-win season ever and first post-season appearance since 2001. Following the season, Logan Parker became the 11th draft pick in the Cleary era when the Cincinnati Reds selected him in the 12th round of the MLB Draft.

The 2005 season brought an improvement of 10 victories from the year before, as the Bearcats finished the campaign with a 25-30 mark. The season concluded with Josh Kay and Mark Haske both being selected in the MLB Draft. Later in 2005, UC's recruiting class received honorable mention nationally from Collegiate Baseball magazine.

In 2001, UC garnered 34 wins, the second-most in school history, and went 16-11 in Conference USA to finish tied for third. That finish is the best ever by a Bearcat team in Conference USA. Kevin Youkilis was a third-team all-American and one of three Bearcats taken in the 2001 Major League Baseball Amateur Draft. Tony Maynard was named a freshman All-American, and Chris Hamblen was a finalist for the Johnny Bench Award, given to the top catcher in the nation. That season, Baseball America named Cleary one of the Top-10 coaches on the rise in Division I.

In 2000, the Bearcats won a school record 35 games and advanced to the finals of the C-USA Tournament. The squad also set four individual and eight school records.

The 1999 squad posted a breakthrough 30-29 season, shattering 17 individual and eight team records and finishing as the eighth most improved team in the nation (12-game improvement). The 30 wins marked just the third 30-win season in UC's 115 years of baseball and the first winning campaign since 1995.

Cleary made an immediate impact upon joining the Bearcat family. After inheriting a team that won only five games in 1996, Cleary pushed his teams to increased win totals each of his first four years. After winning 12 games in his first year, he increased that total to 15 in 1998, 30 in 1999 and 35 in 2000.

Alongside his experience on the collegiate level, Cleary has also served three stints coaching on the international level. Cleary coached the British National Team in the Baseball World Cup (2009 and 2012) and the European Championships (2007). During his time with the teams, Cleary served as an assistant coach and worked primarily with the pitchers, helping the squad capture a second-place finish at the European Championships in 2007 and a second-round appearance at the Baseball World Cup in 2009.

Cleary came to UC after three seasons at Tulane, where he helped the Green Wave to a 116-70 mark and two NCAA Tournament appearances. Cleary's efforts as an associate head coach, assistant coach and recruiting coordinator helped Tulane to the 1996 C-USA championship and a top-25 national ranking. In addition to his duties as recruiting coordinator, Cleary coached the hitters, infielders and baserunners and served as the team's third-base coach.

A 1990 graduate of Fairfield University, Cleary, a native of Boca Raton, Fla. earned four letters and was a two-time Metro Atlantic Conference All-Academic team pick.

THE BRIAN CLEARY RECRUITING PHILOSOPHY

Brian Cleary's recruiting philosophy is simple. Start by keeping the best local talent at home. During Cleary's tenure, he has aggressively recruited the area and his energy and passion for UC baseball has rubbed off on recruits who want to play for their hometown team. Of the local products that have played at Cincinnati, nine have gone on to play professionally. Former Bearcats and local products Jake Proctor (Minnesota Twins), Lance Durham (Toronto Blue Jays), Tony Campana (Chicago Cubs), Josh Harrison (Pittsburgh Pirates), Curtus Moak (Cincinnati Reds/Oakland A's), Chris Hamblen (Texas Rangers), Dan Osterbrock (Minnesota Twins), Steve Pickerell (Tampa Bay Devils Rays), Matt Singer (New York Yankees), and Kevin Youkilis (Boston Red Sox) have all played minor league baseball in various organizations in recent years. Youkilis has achieved success in Major League Baseball, winning two World Series titles and playing in two All-Star games, while Campana and Harrison both made their MLB debuts in 2011.

From there, Cleary attracts top players from across the country, including Mike Spina (Newberry, Fla./Oakland A's), Josh Kay (Park Ridge, Ill./Oakland A's), Mark Haske (Fairgrove, Minn./Detroit Tigers) and Logan Parker (Odessa, Texas/Cincinnati Reds) who have all been selected in the last six MLB drafts. Cleary's first three recruiting classes were ranked among the best in the nation by Collegiate Baseball magazine, the only program in Ohio so honored. His most recent efforts recruiting the 2012 class were tabbed by Baseball America as a top class in the Upper Midwest/Great Plains.

2013 UNIVERSITY OF CINCINNATI BASEBALL

NOW PITCHING FOR UC...

- » UC will send redshirt junior right-hander Christian McElroy to the mound Tuesday against Wright State.
- » McElroy was selected in the 32nd round of the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft by the Cincinnati Reds, but opted to remain at UC.
- » Last season, McElroy appeared in 13 ballgames with nine starts, posted a 4.41 ERA with four wins and 46 strikeouts in 63.1 innings pitched. He finished sixth in the BIG EAST Conference in fewest hits allowed (59) and 12th in opponent batting average (.252), and did not allow a triple the entire season. In three of 13 appearances, he did not allow an earned run.
- » In his lone appearance last week, a midweek start vs. Ohio on Wednesday, McElroy pitched five shutout innings, allowing just three hits, while striking out three and holding Ohio to a .188 batting average.
- » True freshman left-handed pitcher Mike Conrad will make his first start as a Bearcat on Wednesday vs. Toledo.
- » In five appearances out of the bullpen totaling 11 innings pitched, the West Chester, Ohio native owns a 2.45 ERA with seven walks and six strikeouts.

OPPONENT BREAKDOWN

- » Wright State went 37-21 overall in 2012, including 20-10 in the Horizon League, which was good for a second-place finish.
- » WSU was picked to finish third in the 2013 Horizon League coaches poll.
- » Raiders Śr. catcher Garrett Gray was named to a 2013 Preseason all-Horizon League selection. Last season, Gray was named WSU's Comeback Player of the Year, as well as a first-team all-Mideast Region by the American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA) and Rawlings after hitting .354 in 43 games with 27 runs, three home runs and 36 RBIs while slugging .512.
- » Toledo went 30-27 overall in 2012, including 19-8 in Mid-American Conference play, which was good for a second-place finish.
- » The Rockets were picked to finish second in the MAC West Division in the 2013 preseason coaches' poll and received one vote to win the MAC postseason tournament.
- » Junior LHP Ryan Wilkinson and senior IF Matt Delewski were named preseason first-team all-MAC performers by CollegeSportsMadness.com. Junior catcher James Miglin was named to the second team.

THE SERIES VERSUS WSU

- » Cincinnati and Wright State have played 71 ballgames all time.
- » The Raiders own a slight 37-33-1 advantage in the all-time series
- » The first meetings occurred during a May 1, 1971 doubleheader in Clifton, with the Bearcats winning both games by counts of 4-1 and 9-1.
- » Since 2007, Wright State and Cincinnati have played at least once, with the exception of the 2009 season.
- » During that span, the Bearcats won six of the first eight games before Wright State won the three most recent contests.
- » Last year, Wright State beat UC 3-2 on April 10 and 10-1 on May 2, both at Marge Schott Stadium.

THE SERIES VERSUS TOLEDO

- » Cincinnati and Toledo have played 37 ballgames all time.
- » The all-time series record is tied 18-18-1.
- » The first meeting occurred during the 1952 season, with UC winning 3-0.
- » The most recent matchup between UC and UT took place on March 23, 2011, with UC winning 7-5.

GLASS NAMED TO BIG EAST HONOR ROLL

- » Junior outfielder Justin Glass was named to the BIG EAST Conference weekly honor roll on March 25 for his performance in four games.
- » Glass batted an impressive .444 (8 for 18) with two runs scored and five RBIs while slugging .444 and reaching base at a .474 clip in four contests versus Northern Kentucky and South Florida.
- » For the year, Glass is tied for third in the BIG EAST in hits with six and also tied for third in RBIs with five during conference games. The 6-foot-2 slugger leads the Bearcats in batting average, RBIs, slugging percentage and hits.
- » Glass is the second Bearcat to receive this honor in 2013 after freshman infielder Forrest Perron received the award March 4.

WHAT'S HAPP'NIN

- » Freshman infielder Ian Happ has reached base in the past 19 ballgames.
- » Happ leads the BIG EAST Conference in walks (23) and is tied for third in the league lead in doubles (9).
- » Happ also ranks tied for sixth in the conference in stolen bases with 10.
- » He ranks fourth on the team with five multi-hit ballgames.

PERRON NAMED TO BIG EAST HONOR ROLL

- » Freshman infielder Forrest Perron was named to the weekly BIG EAST Honor Roll on March 4.
- » In three starts vs. New York Tech, he batted .500 (5 for 10) with five runs scored, two doubles, seven RBIs and a .700 slugging percentage.
- » Perron also recorded a .706 on-base percentage, went 2 for 2 in steals and posted a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage.

MONSTER GAME FOR WENZEL

- » Freshman third baseman Devin Wenzel drove in six runs on March 2, 2013 to become the first Bearcat to do so in a single game since Mike Spina totaled six RBIs on March 8, 2009 vs. Bradley.
- » The last Bearcat to drive in five runs in a ballgame was Braden Kline on May 17, 2012 vs. Georgetown.
- » Wenzel totaled four RBIs with his grand slam home run in the fifth inning. The last Bearcat to hit a grand tater was Ronald Cotton on March 10, 2012 vs. Chicago State.

BOMBS AWAY

- » In the opening weekend of the 2013 season, Cincinnati totaled four home runs in three games, which ranked second in the BIG EAST Conference as a team.
- » Freshmen Ian Happ and Devin Wenzel, as well as juniors Justin Glass and Brendon Neel each clubbed their first longballs of the season.
- » Last season, UC did not hit four home runs as team until the 11th game of the season. The Bearcats did not hit their first homer until the fourth game when Sr. 1B Nic Spence belted a HR against Georgetown on Feb. 24, 2012.

UC TO PLAY FIRST NCAA GAME AT GABP

- » Cincinnati Reds Chief Operating Officer Phillip J. Castellini announced Feb. 8 that the UC baseball team will host Louisville in the inaugural Reds Collegiate Invitational as part of a doubleheader on Saturday, April 6, 2013 at Great American Ball Park.
- » In a matchup between 2012 National League division champions, the Reds play the Washington Nationals at 1:10 p.m. Following a 30-minute intermission, the Bearcats and the Cardinals will begin a BIG EAST Conference tilt, marking the first NCAA game played at GABP in its 11th season as the home of the Reds.
- » The Reds Collegiate Invitational is an opportunity to

- introduce college baseball to a larger fan base, as eight of the 10 highest attended games in collegiate baseball history have been played at Major League Baseball stadiums since the 2004 season.
- "This is another example of the commitment by Reds ownership to the greater Cincinnati community," said Brian Cleary, UC baseball head coach. "Our players are excited about the opportunity to play a heated rival in a major-league venue. This is a significant event in the development of UC baseball as we will have an opportunity to introduce our program and college baseball to an even greater number of people. I know that all associated with this game are anxious to play in front of as many baseball fans as possible. Our community can make this a game that is noticed across the nation."

GLASS A PRESEASON FIRST-TEAMER

- » Junior outfielder Justin Glass was named to the 2013 Preseason All-BIG EAST Conference Team, as voted by the league's 11 head coaches.
- » Glass, a 6-foot-2 junior, was a 2012 All-BIG EAST First Team selection after he finished last season as one of six players among the BIG EAST leaders in batting average and steals. The left-handed slugger finished fourth in the conference with a .366 batting average, while his 15 stolen bases were tied for 11th.
- » His 83 hits are 13th all-time in the UC single-season record book, while his 21 doubles are tied for fourth. Nationally, his double and hit totals ranked 15th and 23rd, respectively, in all of NCAA Division I baseball.
- » Glass also finished in the BIG EAST Top 10 in several other categories after tying for second in hits and doubles, third in at-bats (227), sixth in total bases (115), and 10th in both slugging (.507) and total plate appearances (255).

SMARTY CATS

- » The baseball team led all UC men's teams with a 3.336 grade point average (GPA) during the 2012 fall semester
- » Senior INF/C J.P. Jackson had a perfect 4.0.
- » 26 baseball players recorded a GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- » Having transitioned from an academic calendar of quarters to semesters, the Bearcats had a departmental GPA of 3.028, marking its eighth consecutive grading period with a 3.0 GPA or higher and 14 of the last 15 quarters in which the department had a 3.0 GPA or higher
- » Overall 11 of 17 teams achieved a GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- » Women's golf had the highest team GPA of 3.495
- » Nearly 60 percent of all UC student-athletes had a 3.0 GPA or better semester
- » Men's basketball posted its highest team GPA since the 2007 spring quarter

STUFFIN' THE SCHOTT

- » In the final 2012 attendance standings, Cincinnati rated No. 48 in Division I with an average of 1,218 fans per game at Marge Schott Stadium.
- » This was ranked second best in the Big East, behind only Louisville, which finished 40th overall with a 1,497 average.

WELCOME BACK, BEARCATS

- » Cincinnati returns just 14 letterwinners from 2012, including only two of eight position players from a UC team that went 18-38 and finished 12th in the BIG EAST with a 7-20 record.
- » UC returns 25 percent of its home runs from last year, led by OF Justin Glass' three.
- The Bearcats also return 79 of 244 RBIs from last season (32.4 percent), led by Glass (26) and Matt Williams (19).
- On the mound, 236 of Cincinnati's 395 strikeouts (59.7 percent) return, led by Sr. LHP Thomas Gentile, who posted a team-high 60 Ks.

UC NINTH IN LEAGUE PRESEASON POLL

- » The Bearcats were picked to finish ninth in the BIG EAST Preseason Coaches Poll. Last season UC finished 12th overall with a 7-20 conference record.
- » Prior to the previous two seasons, UC was predicted to finish seventh
- » Louisville was chosen as the favorite to take the 2013 title in the BIG EAST preseason coaches' poll.

GLASS NAMED TEAM CAPTAIN

- » Junior outfielder Justin Glass was officially named team captain of the University of Cincinnati baseball team for the upcoming 2013 season, as announced to the team by head coach Brian Cleary on Dec. 3, 2012
- » "Justin is one of several strong leaders among our upperclassmen who this young team will rely on to provide a daily example of how to play hard and with great effort," said Cleary, whose roster features 27 first and second-year players.
- » Glass, a 2012 All-BIG EAST Conference First Team selection, is the first designated team captain for the Bearcats since 2010 when then-senior right-handed pitcher Tyler Smith held the title.

TRAINING WITH THE FEW, THE PROUD

- » UC baseball's training with on-campus Marines for the majority of the 2012 fall semester culminated with the U.S. Marine Corps IronCat Challenge on Dec. 1, 2012.
- » Junior infielder Ryan Quinn emerged as the champion.
- » The six-event challenge was designed and ran by USMC Lance Cpls. Sam Kurtz and Zach Smith, as well as Officer Candidate Ian McCarty.
- » Thirty-four members of the UC Baseball team entered the challenge, which began with a timed three-mile run. The 30 players with the top running times advanced to the sound round of the challenge, which consisted of seeing how many USMC "burpees" (squat thrusts) each remaining player could execute in 5 minutes. Of the 30 remaining players from round one, the 24 players who did the most burpees moved on to the next round.
- » The third round of the challenge saw each of the 24 remaining players hold a USMCA plank position (abdominal bridge). The first six players to fall from their plank position were eliminated from the challenge.
- » With 18 players remaining, Round 4 consisted of a USMC wall sit. The first six players who fell from their wall sit position were eliminated from the challenge.
- » With just 12 players remaining, Round 5 saw the players do as many pushups as possible in two minutes. Of the 12 remaining players entering round five, the six players who did the most pushups moved on to the sixth and final round.
- » Round 6 consisted of the six remaining players completing a timed "Maneuver Under Fire Course." The players were timed running, crawling and weaving in and out of cones while carrying two 50 pound sandbags. The top two "Maneuver Under Fire Course" times were recorded by Quinn and junior outfielder Ethan McAlpine.

RECRUITING PRAISE

- » The UC baseball team earned praise from Baseball America for having one of the top 2012-13 recruiting classes in the nation in the publication's online recruiting notebook on Oct. 25.
- » Aaron Fitt, Baseball America's national college baseball writer, listed the Bearcats as a top class in the Upper Midwest/Great Plains Region.
- "Cincinnati brought in its best recruiting class in years—and one of the best in the Big East," wrote Fitt. "The anchor is two-way talent Mitch Patishall, who touched 92-93 from the right side in the spring and features a promising 75-77

WELL-TRAVELED BEARCATS

- » UC baseball head coach Brian Cleary and former Bearcats catcher Ryan Baker reunited at Qualifier 2 of the World Baseball Classic as members of the Great Britain national team Sept. 20-24 at Armin-Wolf Baseball Arena in Regensburg, Germany.
- » Cleary, the Bearcats' all-time winningest coach, and Baker, who caught at UC from 2007-2008, joined Great Britain to compete against Canada, Czech Republic and Germany in a four-team, double-elimination tournament.
- » Cleary served team Great Britain as an assistant coach for the third time in his coaching career. This time around, he will serve primarily as the hitting coach for the Brits.
- » Previously, Cleary served as pitching coach for the British, helping the team capture a second-place finish at the 2007 European Championships and a second-round appearance at the 2009 Baseball World Cup.
- » Baker is one of two full-time catchers listed on the British roster. After signing with the New York Yankees as a nondrafted free agent on June 12, 2008, Baker has since moved up the minor-league ranks and is currently is a member of the Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre Yankees.
- » Another former Bearcat who competed in a WBC Qualifier was Nate Fish, who played baseball at the UC from 1999-2002
- » Fish coached the Israeli national team, which played in the WBC Qualifier 1 at Roger Dean Stadium in Jupiter, Fla. from Sept. 19-23 against France, South Africa and Spain.

BEARCATS TOP OF BIG EAST MLB DRAFT

- » UC had three student-athletes selected in the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft: RHP Zach Isler, 8th round, Chicago White Sox; OF Jake Proctor, 14th round, Minnesota Twins; and RHP Chris McElroy, 32nd round, Cincinnati Reds.
- » Cincinnati's three drafted players were tied for second most in the BIG EAST Conference, trailing only St. John's University, which had five players selected.
- » UConn, Louisville, Notre Dame and USF tied for second with Cincinnati with three picks apiece.

- » Marge Schott Stadium has been the home of the Cincinnati Bearcats baseball team since the end of the 2004 season.
- » The first game played at the 3,085-seat, on-campus facility occurred on May, 20 2004 when the Bearcats hosted UAB in the final series of 2004. The opening game was played on a Thursday night, before a crowd of 2,200.
- » The facility was later named Marge Schott Stadium in the spring of 2006 after the Marge and Charles J. Schott Foundation made a \$2 million gift to the Richard E. Lindner Varsity Village. Marge Schott was a well-known Cincinnati philanthropist who held controlling interest of the Cincinnati Reds from 1985 to 1999. She passed away in March, 2004, leaving the majority of her estate to the foundation.
- » Recently voted the favorite road stadium in the BIG EAST Conference to visit, Marge Schott Stadium is located directly east of the spot where Johnny Bench Field, the Bearcats' previous home, sat for a number of years.

- » A fully equipped pressbox with private viewing areas
- » A player's clubhouse and lounge
