OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

McKenzie Milton • UCF • Jr. • QB • Kapolei, Hawaii

Milton kept UCF unbeaten and led the Knights to their 19th consecutive victory, a 31-30 come-from-behind win at Memphis. He completed 17 of 29 passes for 296 yards and a touchdown and capped UCF's comeback from a 30-17 halftime deficit with a 7-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter that stood up as the gamewinner. Milton has thrown 16 touchdown passes and has a team-high six rushing TDs in 2018.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Ed Oliver • Houston • Jr. • DT • Houston, Texas

Oliver tied The American's single-game record with 5.0 tackles for loss to go with 2.0 sacks, a quarterback hurry and a forced fumble that produced a Houston touchdown in the Cougars' 42-20 win at ECU. Oliver led a defense that held ECU to 41 rushing yards as the Cougars remain alone in first place in The American's West Division. Oliver has registered 11.5 tackles for loss and nine quarterback hurries this season.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Matthew Wright • UCF • Sr. • K • Lancaster, Pa.

Wright scored seven points, including a key 44-yard field goal at the halftime gun and went 4-for-4 on PATs in UCF's 31-30 win at Memphis. Wright's field goal brought UCF within two scores of the Tigers, while his final PAT, in the fourth quarter, accounted for the winning point.

Coby Weiss • USF • So. • K • Gainesville, Fla.

Weiss scored seven points, including the game-winning field goal with two seconds left, to lift USF to a 25-24 win at Tulsa. Weiss accounted for USF's first and last points as he connected from 22 yards in the first quarter before hitting his gamewinner from the same distance.

Pow6rful Stuff

The American has 33 nonconference victories against other Power 6 opponents (including Notre Dame) since the start of the 2015 season, the first year of The American's current membership. American teams have seven Power 6 wins this season.

Beasts In The East

The American's East Division has three unbeaten teams through seven weeks of the season – UCF, Cincinnati and USF are all 6-0. The American is the only conference in FBS football with three unbeaten teams. Only one other conference (the ACC) has as many as two undefeated teams.

Play On

The American has three bowl-eligible teams (UCF, Cincinnati, USF), which is more than the combined total of the ACC, Big 12 and Pac-12.

Pac Mentality

American Athletic Conference teams are a combined 4-0 against the Pac-12 since the start of last season.

We're Streaking

UCF's 19-game winning streak is the longest active winning streak nationally and is the longest in American Athletic Conference history. UCF broke the old record of 15-game winning streak set by Memphis from Oct. 25, 2014, to Nov. 7, 2015.

The Big Stage

UCF's 34-27 win against Auburn in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl last season improved American Athletic Conference teams to 3-0 all-time in New Year's Six Bowls.

Three For Three

The American Athletic Conference, the Big Ten and the Big 12 are the only conferences that have had at least three 10-win teams in each of the last two seasons.

Perfect 10

The American Athletic Conference has had three 10-win teams in each of the last two seasons. USF, Temple, Tulsa hit double figures in 2016, while UCF, Memphis and USF won at least 10 games each in 2017.

Offensive Outbursts

The American Athletic Conference has two of the top four teams nationally in total offense. UCF is third the nation at 555.5 yards per game, while Houston is fourth at 552.8 ypg.

Keep It Low

Cincinnati ranks third nationally in scoring defense. The Bearcats have allowed an average of 13.7 points per game, trailing only Mississippi State (12.7 ppg) and Fresno State (13.5 ppg).

Ground And Pound

Navy is third the nation in rushing offense at 303.7 yards per game, trailing only Georgia Tech (352.4 ypg) and Army (313.5 ypg).

Ground And Pound (Part II)

Memphis RB Darrell Henderson leads the nation in rushing yards, averaging 161.9 yards per game. USF RB Jordan Cronkrite is third at 151.4 ypg.

Follow The Leader

In addition to his rushing rankings, Darrell Henderson leads the nation in all-purpose yards (205.0 ypg).

At A Loss

ECU DE Nate Harvey leads the nation in both sacks (1.42 per game) and tackles for loss (2.9 per game). Harvey has 9.5 sacks and 17.0 tackles for loss in six games.

Move The Chains

UCF leads the nation in third down conversion percentage (62.0 percent).

Road Sweet Road

Visiting teams went 4-0 in American Athletic Conference games in Week 7.

Bullies

UCF has gone 23-0 as a nationally ranked team as a member of the American Athletic Conference.

Separation Of Powers

In the last four regular seasons (2015-18), the American Athletic Conference is a combined 36-13 against teams from Conference USA, the MAC, the Mountain West and the Sun Belt.

Repeat Performances

For the second consecutive season, The American is the only FBS conference to return its players of the year on offense (UCF QB McKenzie Milton), defense (Houston DT Ed Oliver) and special teams (Memphis WR Tony Pollard).

Heisman Hopefuls

UCF and Houston have launched formal Heisman Trophy campaigns on behalf of their most prominent players. Here is a look at how each has fared in 2018.

McKenzie Milton • QB • UCF

Finished eighth in the Heisman voting in 2017. Of the seven players who finished higher in the voting, only Stanford RB Bryce Love (second) and Wisconsin RB Jonathan Taylor (sixth) return in 2018

Has completed 119 of 200 passes (59.5 percent) for 1,797 yards and 16 touchdowns and four interceptions. Has rushed for six touchdowns and 204 yards.

Has accounted for at least five touchdowns in three of the Knights' six games. Had had back-to-back games with six total touchdowns in wins against Florida Atlantic and Pitt.

Ed Oliver • DT • Houston

Consensus All-America and Outland Trophy winner in 2017.

Tabbed as the No. 1 player in college football by ESPN, CBS Sports and Sports Illustrated

Has 46 tackles, 11.5 tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks nine quarterback hurries and one pass defended.

Had 13 tackles with 1.5 tackles for loss in a win against Tulsa. Had 5.0 tackles for loss against ECU.

Fifth Anniversary Team

Twenty-two players on NFL rosters are among the 30 current and former American Athletic Conference players who have been named to the American Athletic Conference Fifth Anniversary Football Team.

- UCF has gone 23-0 as a nationally ranked team since the formation of The American.
- UCF plays its second straight road game with Saturday's contest at ECU. The Knights have won seven straight road games.

- USF has scored at least 20 points in 36 straight games, the longest streak in the nation.

Cincinnati is off to a 6-0 start for the first time since the 2012 season after the Bearcats topped Tulane 37-21 in Week 6 ... Cincinnati did not play in Week 7 ... COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is a big success. Fans, including many who are new to the sport, enjoy it. The first College Football Playoff semifinals and national championship were the three most-viewed programs in cable television history.

Every Game Counts

The playoff preserves the excitement and significance of college football's unique regular season where every game counts.

Four Teams

The selection committee ranks the teams based on the members' evaluation of the teams' performance on the field, using conference championships won, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, and comparison of results against common opponents to decide among teams that are comparable.

Two Games, One Goal

The kickoff of the new year belongs to college football, with two semifinal games rotating annually among the Cotton Bowl, Fiesta Bowl, Orange Bowl, Peach Bowl, Rose Bowl and Sugar Bowl. The two teams winning the playoff semifinals compete for the College Football Playoff National Championship. That game is in a different city each year, always on a Monday night.

Universal Access

Every FBS team has equal access to the College Football Playoff based on its performance. No team automatically qualifies.

Governance

University presidents and chancellors from all 10 FBS conferences and Notre Dame serve on the CFP Board of Managers and govern the administrative operations, with commissioners (the Management Committee) managing the event. A small staff in the playoff office in Irving, Texas, carries out the detailed responsibilities.

Selection Committee

A talented group of high-integrity individuals with experience as coaches, student-athletes, college administrators and journalists, along with sitting athletics directors, comprise the selection committee. Members of the committee are: Rob Mullens (chair), Frank Beamer, Paola Boivin, Jeff Bower, Joe Castiglione, Herb Deromedi, Ken Hatfield, Chris Howard, Bobby Johnson, Ronnie Lott, Gene Smith, Todd Stansbury, and Scott Stricklin.

Selection Committee Responsibilities

- Rank the top 25 teams and assign the top four to semifinal sites.
- Assign teams to New Year's bowls
- Create competitive matchups
- Attempt to avoid rematches of regular-season games and repeat appearances
- Consider geography

Participants In New Year's Bowls

Both participants in the Orange, Rose and Sugar Bowls are contracted outside the playoff arrangement (Big Ten and Pac-12 to Rose Bowl; SEC and Big 12 to Sugar Bowl; ACC to Orange Bowl against the highest ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten and Notre Dame). If a conference champion qualifies for the playoff, then the bowl will choose a replacement from that conference. When those bowls host the semifinals and their contracted conference champions do not qualify, then the displaced champion(s) will play in one of the other New Year's bowls.

When not hosting semifinals, the Cotton, Fiesta and Peach Bowls will welcome displaced conference champions and the top-ranked champion from a non-contract conference. The highest-ranked available teams will fill any other berths. The selection committee will make the pairings.

The American Bowl Lineup

In addition to the College Football Playoff and New Year's Bowls, The American has either a primary or secondary affiliation with 12 bowl games during its current six-year bowl cycle, which ends following the 2019 season. The American works annually with its member schools and bowl partners to create the most sensible and attractive postseason matchups.

The **Military Bowl presented by Northrop Grumman** takes place at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium in Annapolis, Maryland, while the events and activities surrounding the game are based in Washington, D.C. The American Athletic Conference will face an opponent from the Atlantic Coast Conference each year in the current cycle.

The **Birmingham Bowl** takes place at Legion Field in Birmingham, Alabama. The American/Big East has partnered with the bowl since its inception in the 2006 season. The American Athletic Conference will annually face an opponent from the Southeastern Conference.

The **Bad Boy Mowers Gasparilla Bowl** is played at Raymond James Stadium in Tampa, Florida. The American Athletic Conference will supply a team to the bowl during each year of the six-year cycle. Conference USA will play in the game in 2015, 2017 and 2019, while the Atlantic Coast Conference provides the opposing team in 2014, 2016 and 2018.

The **Cheribundi Tart Cherry Boca Raton Bowl** began in 2014 and will feature an American Athletic Conference team three times during the six-year cycle at FAU Stadium in Boca Raton, Florida. The American representative will play a team from Conference USA in 2018.

The **Frisco Bowl** will be played for the second time in 2018 as the former Miami Beach Bowl was relocated to Toyota Stadium in Frisco, Texas. An American Athletic Conference plays in the bowl each year.

The **AutoNation Cure Bowl** made its debut in 2015 at the newly renovated Camping World Stadium in Orlando, Florida. An American Athletic Conference team will be paired against an opponent from the Sun Belt Conference. Net proceeds from the game will benefit the Breast Cancer Research Foundation.

The **Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl** is played at Amon G. Carter Stadium on the campus of Texas Christian University. The American Athletic Conference sends a team to the bowl in 2014, 2016 and 2018. The opponent will be a Big 12 team in 2016 and 2018, with Conference USA as a secondary affiliation.

In addition to the conference's primary bowl affiliations, The American holds secondary partnerships with the **AutoZone Liberty Bowl** in Memphis, Tennessee, and the **Duck Commander Independence Bowl** in Shreveport, Louisiana, as well as with other ESPN-owned bowls.
