THE SERIES

- This is the 12th-ever meeting between the two programs.
- Cincinnati leads the all-time series 9-2-0. The Bearcats are an undefeated 6-0-0 at home, 2-2-0 on the road and 1-0-0 in neutral site matches.
- Cincinnati is currently on a five-match winning streak over Tulsa, the longest of any team in the series.

 The two programs last played on Sept. 16, 2021, where Cincinnati defeated Tulsa 1-0 off a game winner from Va-
- nessa DiNardo, assisted by Paige Miller, in the 29th minute at Gettler Stadium.

 Nine of the 11 matches between the two teams have come in head coach Neil Stafford's tenure (2013-Present).

LAST TIME OUT

- Lauren Bastian notched a late equalizing goal in the 83rd minute in a 2-2 draw against Memphis at Gettler Stadium on Sept. 22.

- The Bearcats are now 3-4-3, 1-2-2 at home in AAC Openers under Stafford.

 Bastian is the 10th different Bearcat to score this season; compared to 12 all of last season.

 After Memphis got on the scoreboard first in the 2nd minute, the Bearcats were able to even the match when Megan Smith found herself on the receiving end of a set piece from Ashley Barron in the 60th minute. Memphis quickly took the lead back two minutes later in the 62nd minute until Bastian's late equalizing goal.
- Cincinnati outshot Memphis 12-8, improving to 4-0-2 this season when holding the shot advantage.

LONG AWAITED RETURN

- When the Bearcats take the pitch on Thursday, it will be their first match in 14 days. The Memphis match on Sept. 22 is the only contest that Cincinnati has played in almost a month (Sept. 11-Oct. 6) after a preseason cancellation from Washington and postponement at UCF due to Hurricane Ian.

 With the postponement of the UCF match from Sept. 29 to Oct. 13, the Bearcats will play seven games in October, four on the grad and throp of Cottler Chadium. The four road matches in the final month of the regular pages are
- four on the road and three at Gettler Stadium. The four road matches in the final month of the regular season are the most since 2016.

MEGAN SMITH AND LAUREN BASTIAN EARNED AAC WEEKLY HONORS ON SEPT. 26

- Smith secured AAC Rookie of the Week distinction for the second time (Sept. 5/Sept. 26) this season, while Bastian was named to the honor roll on Sept. 26. The Bearcats have earned a weekly conference award in four weeks this season, including three straight to open the season.
- Bastian notched the equalizing goal in the 83rd minute to secure a draw against Memphis on Sept. 22. It was the first goal of the season for Bastian, who became the 10th different Bearcat to score this fall. She played 86 of the 90 minutes in the match.
- Smith recorded the first Bearcat goal of the match off a set piece from Ashley Barron, chipping it over the goalkeeper
- for her third goal of the season in the 60th minute. She totaled 75 minutes in her third straight start. In addition to Smith and Bastian, Vanessa DiNardo was named to honor roll on Sept. 12, Anna Rexford was named Goalkeeper of the Week on Aug. 29 and Ashley Barron was named Defensive Player of the Week on Aug. 22

COMPARED TO THE CONFERENCE

- Cincinnati has the best margin of victory in the conference (+1.00).

 At .667, Cincinnati have the second best win percentage in the AAC, trailing only SMU's .682 (6-2-3).

 Cincinnati ranks first in the AAC in goals per game (1.89) and points per game (5.00) and is tied for second in goals (17) and third in points (45) depsite playing fewer matches.

 The Bearcats are second in the conference in home attendance average (576/Game).
 - Cincinnati (4-0-2) is one of two teams (Memphis; 3-0-2) that remains undefeated at home.
- Cincinnati has the fewest offside penalities in the conference (11).

 Anna Rexford is tied for second in the conference with four shutouts. Vanessa DiNardo is second in goals per game (0.44) and is one of six players with at least four goals on the season. DiNardo is also tied for second in points per game (1.00), third in total points (9), fifth in shots per game (2.33) and is one of three players with at least one point per game (1.00).

- CONTRIBUTIONS ACROSS THE PITCH OFFENSE MOVING FAST, DEFENSE HOLDING STRONG
 Ten different players have scored a goal through nine matches this season compared to 12 all of last season.
- Four players have recorded their first collegiate goal this season Maddie Swingle, Megan Smith, Sarah Kate Rath and Ellie Flower.
- Eight newcomers (five freshman, three transfers) have recorded at least one start.
- Nine players have recorded an assist this season. Brandi Thomsen and Mackenzie Tucker are two of 21 AAC players who have tallied at least two assists.
- Anna Rexford and the defense has recorded four clean sheets this season. Rexford is tied for second in the AAC
- with four shutouts.

 Every goal in the Stony Brook match was scored by a player in their first or second collegiate season.

 The five goals scored against Stony Brook ties the second-most under head coach Neil Stafford. The Bearcats also scored five against Eastern Illinois [5–0 win on Sept. 5, 2021] and Saint Francis [PA] (5–0 win on Sept. 7, 2014]. The most was a 9–0 win against Eastern Kentucky on Sept. 5, 2014.
- The 24 shots against Morehead State were the most in a game since the Bearcats recorded 26 against Temple on Sept. 23, 2021

CINCINNATI HEAD COACH: NEIL STAFFORD

Neil Stafford is in his 10th season at the helm, 20th year in collegiate coaching, and carries a 79-76-25 mark through the 2021 season.

Over his nine years, Stafford has mentored 22 All-AAC honorees [11 First Team]. Ashley Barron became the program's sixth and seventh first team selection in 2020 and 2021, and first since Gilles in 2017, while also winning AAC Defensive Player of the Year honors. Barron, who earned CoSIDA Academic All-District honors as well, became the program's second-ever to earn three First-Team All-Conference selections. In addition to Barron's major honors, Vanessa DiNardo earned Second-Team accolades after scoring nine goals, the second-most by a Bearcat since 2002, and Paige Miller became the fifth member of the current roster to earn All-Freshman achievements.

The 2021 season saw the Bearcats produce a 7-7-3 record against one of the toughest non-conference schedules nationally. UC defeated Virginia Tech at home, 2-1, with the Hokies ultimately making the NCAA Tournament Second Round. An early lead and close defeat to No. 16 Michigan at home followed, which ultimately made the Elite Eight. UC also tied No. 20 SMU and defeated (RV) UCF to end the season.

Vanessa Gilles, a standout defender from 2014-17 and Academic All-American under Stafford, also earned a spot on Team Canada for the 2021 Tokyo Olympics.

Prior to taking the reigns of the Bearcats program, Stafford spent two years at the helm of the Central Michigan program (2011-12) following two years as an assistant coach (2009-10). As head coach, Stafford's Chippewas went 30-10-4 and advanced to the semifinals of the Mid-America Conference Tournament in 2011 before reaching the finals in 2012. In 2012, following a 15-7-1 record, CMU earned an at-large berth into the NCAA Tournament, a first for a member of the MAC. Prior to taking over head coaching duties, the Chips won back-to-back MAC titles and earned a pair of NCAA berths.

Stafford got his start in the collegiate coaching ranks in 2000 as the associate head coach for the men's and women's programs at Assumption College. That was followed in 2001 when he spent eight seasons as the head women's soccer coach at Assumption College, where he is the program's all-time winningest coach with a 72-61-15 ledger

At Assumption, he was named the Northeast-10 Conference Coach of the Year in 2004 after guiding the Greyhounds to their first NE-10 conference final, NCAA Division II Tournament berth and NCAA Regional final appearance. Assumption finished the season 14th in the nation with a final record of 15-6. Stafford's squad followed up the breakthrough 2004 campaign with another NCAA Tournament appearance in 2005, finishing 15-4-4 and returning to the NCAA Regional finals, climbing as high as third in the nation.

Stafford attended Norwich University, competing in both tennis and soccer, and was named an all-region NESCAC player before transferring to Southern New Hampshire. He led the Penmen to a two-year record of 29-4-4 and then joined the coaching staff as an assistant coach for

three years (1995-97), during which the team advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight. He also played with the Boston Storm (USL).

Stafford was named the Director of Operations with the Boston Renegades (W-League) in 1998 and was also Director of the W-1 National Championships in Boston that year. He later served as the head assistant coach of the Boston Renegades. The Renegades advanced to three national final fours and won two W-League National Championships in his final three years. His U-18 Renegades were the national runner-ups in 2000.

Stafford also worked with Seacoast United Soccer Club in Hampton, N.H., as the Girls Coaching Director (2002-05). In the summer of 2004, Stafford's Seacoast United Girls 15 squad won its first Super Y-League National Championship.

Stafford earned his bachelor's degree from Southern New Hampshire in 1996 while majoring in sociology. He and his wife, the former Jacquie Lacek, a 2017 inductee into the CMU Hall of Fame, have three children: Kayden Kvnlee and Kamdyn.
