TOURNAMENT INFORMATION

FORMAT: 54 Holes (36 Monday & 18 Tuesday) of stroke play from the championship Norse tees. Team scores will be calculated by counting the best four (4) of five (5) scores for each round. The final team score is determined by totalling the team score for each round. Play will be continuous on Sunday and coaches should collect scorecards after both rounds, check the cards and return them to the scoreboard as soon as possible. On Tuesday, each group shall return scorecards to the scoring area immediately upon completion of the round.

TIES: If there is a tie for the team title, a play-off with all five women (best 4 of 5 scores per hole) will take place. If there is a tie for the individual title, a play-off will determine the winner. Ties for all-tournament team will be settled by the low score of the final round, then 2nd round, then 1st round and then match cards beginning at hole No. 18.

TEE TIMES & PAIRINGS: 8:00 a.m. on Monday (shotgun) and Tuesday (shotgun). Play will be foursomes throughout the tournament, with Tuesday's pairings determined by team standings. For the purpose of ranking teams for the final round pairings, ties will be broken by using team score for the second round. If a tie still exists, the score of the fifth man for the second round, then the first round will be used. If still a tie, the lowest individual score from all previous rounds will be used. If still a tie, a coin flip will be used.

THE COMMITTEE: Decisions and interpretations will be settled by the Committee in Charge of the competition. Members of the Committee may decide questions of fact and golf rules. They have the authority to act on any breach of rule or local rule which they may observe. Any competitor may appeal a decision to the committee and, if applicable, play a second ball under Rule 3-3. Decisions of the committee are final.

COMMITTEE MEMBERS: Daryl Landrum and two USGA rules officials.

AWARDS: Top team and top individual, plus all-tournament team. Plaques for players and coach of the winning team.

PRACTICE AREAS: The driving range and practice areas are located near the front parking lot. The range will open at 7:00 a.m. on both Monday and Tuesday. Each team will have a designated hitting spot.

ASSISTANCE: During a stipulated round, anyone (spectators, coaches, teammates) may provide a competitor with items such as medicine, food, towels, umbrellas, rain suits, etc. However, the competitor must carry his own bag. The competitor may not employ a caddie for any part of the competition. Parents and spectators may not offer advice to the competitor or anything that could be deemed as giving advice.

TRANSPORTATION: Coaches may use automotive transportation. Any competitor who needs to be returned to where the previous stroke was played may be transported by anyone with automotive transportation. In the event of a suspension of play or at the conclusion of the round, the competitor may utilize any transportation to return to the clubhouse area or rain shelters. Coaches carts are considered automotive transportation.

EATING: Sandwiches, snacks and drinks are available at the clubhouse. Coaches may run a tab, but please settle your account prior to departure. Box lunches on Monday for players and coaches may be picked up beginning at noon in the clubhouse.

LIVE SCORING: Live scoring will be done on the course by volunteers. Please instruct players to look for volunteers in the following areas: Greens 3/5, Turns between 18/1 and 9/10 (located in the grass in the triangle formed by 18 green, 10 tee and 1 tee), and Greens 12/14.
