THE RUNDOWN

- Cincinnati welcomes the Marquette Golden Eagles to Nippert Stadium on Thursday. Opening draw is set for 3 p.m.
- The Bearcats are looking to win two-straight after defeating Robert Morris. 18-4, on Saturday.
- Marquette leads the overall series, 3-9, but in Cincinnati, the series is tied 3-3.
- The Bearcats, now 1-2 on the season, boasted nine different goal scorers against the Colonials. Graduate student Lauren Ottensmeyer and junior Camryn Callaghan led the way each recording four. Cincinnati out shot their opponent 29-9, including 24 shots on goal to Robert Morris' seven.
- Sophomore Hailey Joy Simpson quickly found her rhythm, securing her first hat trick of the season. Freshman Paige Selhorn continued to impress with two goals and three assists.
- Selhorn currently ranks third in the Big 12 in assists per game (2.33 avg/g).
- Joining her in the rankings is Ottensmeyer who is second in shots per game (7.67 avg/g) and fifth in goals per game (3.00 avg/g).
- Sophomore goalkeeper Hailey Darko sits fourth in the conference for saves per game (5.67 avg/g). She notched a career high 11 saves vs. Louisville.
- On the defensive side, Alexis Rich ranks third in the Big 12 in caused turnovers per game with 2.33 avg/g.
- Head coach Gina Thomas heads into her 13th year at the helm as the Bearcats embark on their inaugural season in the Big 12 Conference.
- Cincinnati completed its full transition to the Big 12 with the addition of lacrosse, marking a significant milestone for the athletic department.
- The Bearcats return 23 letterwinners, including seven starters. Key returners include three of the top five scorers from last season: Lauren Ottensmeyer (57 goals), Camryn Callaghan (56 goals) and Hailey Joy Simpson (20 goals).
- The Bearcats welcome 12 freshmen and two transfers to the 2025 roster.
- Freshman Paige Selhorn looks to make an immediate impact in the attacker role.
 The New York native finished her high school career with 155 goals, Conference Player of the Year and Academic All-American honors.
- Junior attack Camryn Callaghan, named to the First Team All-AAC in 2024, continues to shine with preseason All-Big 12 honors. She became the quickest freshman in program history to achieve 100 career goals.
- Graduate student Lauren Ottensmeyer and senior Alexis Rich also earned preseason honors, with Ottensmeyer ranking second in the AAC for goals per game (3.35) and leading in shots per game (8.35).

YEAR IN REVIEW

• During the 2024 season, the Bearcats continued to shine as they recorded 10 total wins including four against Ohio opponents. Cincinnati standouts Camryn Callaghan, Lauren Ottensmeyer, Alexis Rich and Hailey Joy Simpson received All-AAC Honors alongside Callaghan and Ottensmeyer grabbing the program's first national award after being named USA Lacrosse Honorable Mention All-Americans. Against Youngstown State, the program recorded its largest-ever margin of victory. The 25 goals also matched a March 8, 2020 win over Kent State for the most in program history. It was also the first-ever Leap Day win for the team and first-such contest since its inaugural 2008 season.

BACK FOR MORE

- Graduate students Lauren Ottensmeyer and Julie Rose are returning to the program for a final year. Ottensmeyer brings offensive strength back for the Bearcats as the leading scorer for the 2024 season with 61 goals, 11 assists and 72 points. She recorded a goal in every game, with 13 of those being hat tricks. The Missouri native notched a career-high six goals twice, against Louisville and Ohio State.
- Rose appeared in every match, starting four. She recorded four goals, 12 ground balls and 27 draw controls. The Baltimore native enters her second year as a team captain.

ALL-AMERICAN STATUS

- Junior Camryn Callaghan and graduate student Lauren Ottensmeyer received Honorable Mention All-American recognition, USA Lacrosse announced this past May. The duo accounted for 113 of the teams 224 total goals from the 2024 season.
- The two became the program's first national award recipients with this honor.
- Ahead of the 2025 season, the pair was named to the USA Lacrosse Preseason All-American list as well. Ottensmeyer earned Third Team honors, while Callaghan received Honorable Mention.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

- The Bearcats welcome 12 freshmen and two transfers to the 2025 roster.
- Juniors Sophia Passa and Gillian Smith add experience to the program after spending two seasons at Longwood and Old Dominion, respectively.
- Passa played and started in all 17 matches at Longwood and ended the season with 36 goals, seven assists averaged a .784 SOG%. She was the second leading scored on the team for two years in a row.
- Smith received ODU's Breakout Season honor her freshman year.
 She is also a member of the Ireland Lacrosse Senior Women's National Team.
- Freshman Paige Selhorn finished her senior year of high school with 55 goals, 32 assists and was named Conference Player of the Year and Academic All-American.

GUARDING THE GOAL

- After the departure of graduate student Victoria Macres and senior Ashley Lapp, sophomore Hailey Darko moves into the starting goalie role for the 2025 season.
- Darko appeared in 12 games last season, starting three. She helped the Bearcats record their first program shutout against Robert Morris.
 Darko finished the 2024 season with 23 saves and four groundballs.

FAREWELL AAC

- The Big 12 Conference has announced it will add women's lacrosse for the 2024-25 academic year, completing Cincinnati's athleticswide move to the league.
- UC was previously in the Big East from 2009-18 and independent in its inaugural 2008 season.
- Cincinnati is joined by Arizona State, Colorado, Florida, San Diego State and UC Davis.

AYE AYE CAPTAIN

- Graduate student Julie Rose, senior Megan Young and junior Camryn Callaghan were named the 2025 team captains, the program announced earlier this fall.
- Callaghan steps into the role for the third season alongside Rose enters second year in the leadership position, previously serving with former Bearcat Kimora Bailey who graduated last spring.

REPPIN' THE RED WHITE AND BLUE

- Junior attacker Camryn Callaghan earned a place on the 2024 USA U20 Lacrosse training team.
- Head coach Gina Thomas, who is entering her 13th year at the helm, made the training team in 2005 and later played in the 2009 and 2013 World Cups.
- The 42 players named to the training team (out of 99 at the event) come from high schools from 12 states and the District of Columbia and represent 20 colleges with their current enrollment or commitment.

SUCCESS IN THE CLASSROOM

 UC has earned team academic honors (3.2 GPA or higher) in 10 of Head Coach Gina Thomas' 13 years at the helm as well. This past fall, the team earned a 3.4 team GPA with 27 Dean's List recipients and five TopCats (4.0 GPA).

WE'RE ALL IN THIS TOGETHER

- Cincinnati had five or more players score in 13 games, highlighted by eight or more in five.
- In their 25-4 victory over Youngstown State on Feb. 29, 2024, 15 different Bearcats scored a goal, led by Lauren Ottensmeyer and Camryn Callaghan each having four.

NEW AND OLD BOSSES

- All-American and two-time World Champion Gina Thomas is heading into her 13th season as the head coach at the University of Cincinnati in 2025.
- Jamie Redding enters her fourth season on the Bearcats staff after joining in August 2021.
- Tamburello enters his first season after joining the Bearcats' lacrosse staff in August. He comes to Cincinnati with a diverse coaching background, having served in various roles at multiple institutions.
- Most recently, Tamburello spent the 2024 season at Stanford University where he served as an assistant coach. During his tenure, he played a pivotal role in the team's achievements, notably contributing to a PAC-12 conference championship. He was instrumental in coaching the offense to achieve a No.14 national ranking with an impressive average of 15.11 goals per game. His coaching efforts also fostered the development of a PAC-12 Freshman of the Year and Goalie of the Year.

PRESEASON HONORS

- Camryn Callaghan, Lauren Ottensmeyer and Alexis Rich were named to the Preseason All-Big 12 Team, the league announced Tuesday.
- The Bearcats were ranked fourth overall, with former AAC opponent Florida taking the top spot.
- The trio was unanimously selected as they prepare for the program's inaugural season in the Big 12 conference.

NUMBERS TO KNOW

Cincinnati is one of six teams in the inaugural season of Big 12 lacrosse. Former AAC member, Florida, made the move alongside Arizona State, Colorado, San Diego State and UC Davis.

Cincinnati outscored their opponents 224-173 last season with .718 shots on goal percentage. The Bearcats also recorded 535 shots compared to their opponents 419.

UC recorded a game-high and season high 25 goals against Youngstown State on 2/29/24. The Bearcats also notched 35 points, 10 assists and 33 SOG against the Penguins. All are also game and season-highs.

The Bearcats will roster 37 student athletes for the 2025 season. The 37 is made up of 23 returning players, two transfer and 12 freshman. Six of the 37 players are native Ohioians.

Alexis Rich, Camryn Callaghan and Lauren Ottensmeyer were named to the Preseason All-Big 12 team by unanimous selection. Cincinnati, overall, was ranked fourth among the league.

Head coach Gina Thomas (Oliver) enters her 13th season leading the Bearcats. She is joined by assistant coaches Jamie Redding (3rd) and Zach Tamburello who begins his first season at Cincinnati.

MARQUETTE LEADS, 3-9 CINCINNATI - The University of Cincinnati TIED, 3-3 lacrosse team cruised past Robert Morris, 18-4, MARQUETTE WON, 18-012, 2/11/24 on Saturday afternoon inside Nippert Stadium.

The Bearcats, now 1-2 on the season, boasted nine different goal scorers. Graduate student Lauren Ottensmeyer and junior Camryn Callaghan led the way each recording four. Cincinnati outshot their opponent 29-9, including 24 shots on goal to Robert Morris' seven.

Sophomore Hailey Joy Simpson quickly found her rhythm, securing her first hat trick of the season. Freshman Paige Selhorn continued to impress with two goals and three assists.

Cincinnati's defense shined, limiting Robert Morris to just one goal per quarter and forcing 26 total turnovers. Sophomore Ally Keith and freshman Alyse Keels each contributed with two caused turnovers.

Although Robert Morris scored first, Cincinnati dominated the rest of the game. Selhorn opened UC's scoring, followed by back-to-back goals from Simpson for an early lead.

Cincinnati didn't look back as they scored four-straight to grab a 7-1 lead heading into the second quarter. To close out the first half, the duo of Callaghan and Ottensmeyer went back and forth each recording two goals in the Bearcats' 4-0 scoring run.

Junior Sophia Passa earned her second-straight game with a goal, extending Cincinnati's led to 12. Senior Lindsay Sparago joined the scoring with her first goal of the season, securing the Bearcats' commanding victory.

Sophomore goalkeeper Hailey Darko secured the win with two saves in 45 minutes of play, while freshman Bella Kerr added her first collegiate save in the final 15 minutes.

HEAD COACH GINA THOMAS | 13TH SEASON

ALL-AMERICAN AND TWO-TIME WORLD CHAMPION

All-American and two-time World Champion Gina Thomas is heading into her 13th season as the head coach at the University of Cincinnati in 2025.

Thomas, in May 2021, was elected as vice president of the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Association (IWLCA), which includes a three-year service term. She has mentored 26 All-Conference selections over her Bearcat tenure, including seven in 2019 and four in 2024 and 2021. In 2021 her and assistants Shannon Witzel and Caitlin Prince named the AAC's Coaching Staff of the Year. Prior to the 2019 campaign, Clncinnati had just five conference postseason honors, all since 2015.

UC has earned team academic honors (3.2 GPA or higher) in 10 of her $\!\!$ 13 years at the helm as well.

During the 2024 season, the Bearcats continued to shine as they recorded 10 total wins including four against Ohio opponents. Cincinnati standouts Camryn Callaghan, Lauren Ottensmeyer, Alexis Rich and Hailey Joy Simpson received All-AAC Honors alongside Callaghan and Ottensmeyer grabbing the program's first national award after being named USA Lacrosse Honorable Mention All-Americans. Against Kent State, the program recorded its largest-ever margin of victory. The 25 goals also matched a March 8, 2020 win over Kent State for the most in program history. It was also the first-ever Leap Day win for the team and first-such contest since its inauqural 2008 season.

The 2023 season saw a breakthrough for the Bearcats, improving their win total by four from the previous season. Their II regular-season wins matched the program record from 2019 as well. Camryn Callaghan was named the AAC Freshman of the Year, UC's second since 2019, and Dani Mlkvy and Ava Goeller joined her on the AAC's First Team. Callaghan's 56 goals helped her to a USA U20 Team tryout as well. Cincinnati also earned a road overtime win at Louisville, its first-ever over the Cardinals or an ACC foe, while defeating Vanderbilt, 19-6, for its largest-ever margin of victory against the Commodores.

In 2022, the Bearcats claimed their eighth team IWLCA Academic Award out of Thomas' 10 years at the helm, while Kylie Nause was named the AAC's Lacrosse Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Nause, en route to also earning First-Team All-AAC honors, broke the single-season school records for goals (63) and hat tricks (15). Dani Milkvy's prowess at midfield also earned her First-Team honors, while sophomore transfer attacker Ava Goeller made the Second Team.

The Bearcats also had four All-AAC members in 2021 (Alyssa Adams, Monica Borzillo, Morgan Dukes, Sam Mlkvy) after COVID wiped out much of the 2020 season. Borzillo's career numbers reached incredible heights over her five seasons with 197 goals and 145 assists, among others.


The 2019 campaign, coming off the best season in its then-12-year program history that saw the Bearcats reach the postseason for the first time as well as finish as the runners-up in the inaugural American Athletic Conference season.

In 2018, the Bearcats strung together six wins in a row early in the year for the longest streak in program history on their way to records for wins (8) and winning percentage (.471). To get there, UC produced solid stats on both sides of the ball throughout the year, including 501 ground balls and an average of 29.47 per game, both of which led the NCAA. Offensively, the Bearcats broke single season program records for points (287), goals (201), assists (86), shots (504), shots on goal (371), man-up goals (12) and free-position goals (43). Along with their ground ball numbers, the defense also caused 187 turnovers, also a program record.

Individually, several Bearcats were solid once again, including Monica Borzillo, who was named All-BIG EAST Second Team for the second year in a row after accumulating 69 points on 42 goals and 27 assists, all of which ranked in the Top 10 of the conference. Two players recorded nearly 50 ground balls each on the year with freshman Morgan Dukes leading the way with 49 and Sam Mlkvy posting 48. Also on the defensive end, Giuliana Durso turned in a single-season record 161 saves and a 44.7 save percentage to help the Bearcats to several big wins, most notably a 17-12 win over Ohio State, the first victory in the series in program history.

UC increased its win total in 2017 and had Borzillo and Amanda Donovan named Second-Team All-BIG EAST Conference. Borzillo finished the season with 39 goals, a school-record 34 assists and 73 total points, leading the team in all categories, and ranking fourth in the BIG EAST with 2.00 assists per game, was second on the team with 33 points off 25 goals and seven assists while also ranking first in caused turnovers (28), fourth in ground balls (33) and fourth in draw controls (26).

The 2016 season saw the Bearcats double their win total from a season ago, while defender Kyara Byner became the first player in program history to earn first team All-BIG EAST honors, as well as All-Region honors from the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association.



The 2015 campaign saw a UC player earn postseason honors from the BIG EAST Conference for the first time in program history. Courtney Curtis was named second team All-BIG EAST after leading the team in goals at 37.

In 2014, Thomas coached the Bearcats to six victories, including a program record five-game winning streak that saw the team receive votes in the Brine/Inside Lacrosse Media Poll for the first time ever. This was after losing the team's top scorer, Megan Bell, to injury in just the seventh game of the year. Five different Bearcats earned weekly honor from the BIG EAST Conference during the season, including Bell as Offensive Player of the Week and goalie Meg Gulmi as Defensive Player of the Week.

Her debut season in Cincinnati saw the 2013 Bearcats match the program record with seven wins, highlighted by the school's first-ever BIG EAST victory over Rutgers to cap the season. Bell led the team in scoring, while Gulmi started every game as a rookie and averaged a league-best 8.88 saves per game. The win totals in 2013 and 2014 marked the best consecutive seasons in program history until the 2017-18 campaigns came along when UC won six and eight, respectively.

Thomas spent the previous five seasons at Duquesne (2008-2012) as the Dukes' defensive coordinator, where she produced a 2012 Atlantic-10 Defensive Player of the Year and Rookie of the Year. During her time at Duquesne, Thomas coached six IWLCA All-Region players, 21 all-conference honorees, 13 members of the A-10 All-Rookie Team and 12 student-athletes who won academic all-conference accolades.

A 2005 graduate of Ohio State, Thomas spent the 2006 and 2007 seasons on the Buckeyes staff, working under OSU head coach Sue Stimmel. While in Columbus, Thomas served as co-director of the Ohio State Women's Lacrosse Camp, while also assisting with recruiting, budgeting and scholarship duties, as well as travel and team practice planning.

Thomas was one of 18 players on the U.S. Women's National Team that won gold at the Federation of International Lacrosse (FIL) World Cup in 2013. Playing as a defender at the World Cup, Oliver recorded 10 ground balls and caused seven turnovers. The highlight came as she was named the player of the game in Team USA's 21-8 semifinal win over England after causing three turnovers and picking-up four ground balls. It was the second FIL World Cup gold for Oliver, who also won the World Cup in June 2009 and was named to the All-World Team, which is awarded to the best 12 players in the world.

A standout midfielder at Ohio State (2002-05), Thomas was a fouryear letter winner for the Buckeyes and earned All-America honors three times. During her career, she collected All-America honors from the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association (second team in 2003 and third team in 2004), WomensLacrosse.com (first team in 2003 and third team in 2005) and Warrior/Inside Lacrosse (first team in 2003). She was the American Lacrosse Conference Player of the Year in 2003 as Ohio State won the American Lacrosse Conference Championship and the league's rookie of the year in 2002. Oliver was also a four-time, First-Team All-ALC selection.

The Pottstown, Pa., native closed out her time at OSU as the program's career leader in ground balls (236) and caused turnovers (201) and was second in draw controls (121). She also was third in career points with 166 while ranking second in goals scored (125) and sixth in assists (41).

Thomas earned her bachelor's degree in education from Ohio State in 2005.
