CINCINNATI — The University of Cincinnati baseball team opens a six-game homestand on Tuesday against Toledo at 3:00 p.m. at UC Baseball Stadium.

The Bearcats' home opener vs. the Rockets will be broadcast on ESPN+. The game was rescheduled from Wednesday to avoid potential weather that in the area that day.

New for 2025 at UC Baseball Stadium is a dedicated student section, Section 6, right behind the visiting dugout. The first 500 fans in attendance on Tuesday will also receive a Cincinnati Baseball 2025 magnet schedule.

Fans who have already purchased tickets to the game can attend Opening Day on Tuesday, March 4 using the same ticket, otherwise they can exchange their seat for an upcoming game this season by contacting the Bearcats Ticket Office at (513) 556-2287 or by email at uctickets@uc.edu.

Tuesday marks the 47th meeting all-time between Cincinnati and Toledo, with UC holding a 25-20-1 all-time record in the series. The last time these two teams faced off was March 16-18, 2018 when the Rockets visited for a three-game series. The Bearcats took two out of three that weekend.

The Bearcats, who just concluded an eight-game road trip out west, will be starting a six-game homestand on Tuesday that also includes a four-game series vs. Canisius next weekend (March 7-9) and a midweek matchup vs. Miami (Ohio) (March 11).

ABOUT TOLEDO

Toledo (4-6) spent the weekend in Richmond, Va. at the Central Virginia Challenge, facing VCU, William & Mary, and Richmond, capturing wins against the Rams and Tribe. Prior to that, the Rockets faced No. 12 Oregon (Feb. 14-16) and High Point (Feb. 22-24) on the road, capturing a victory against the nationally ranked Ducks on Feb. 15. The 5-3 win was UT's first against a ranked opponent since 2015. Toledo has seen success against Power Four opponents under head coach Rob Reinstetle, having defeated at least one in each of the last four seasons.

BEARCAT TIDBITS

- Sophomore Nathan Taylor has been terrific to start the season. In three starts this year, Taylor is sporting a 1.59 ERA and has 26 strikeouts in 17.0 innings with just seven walks. His 26 K's lead the Big 12 and rank 16th nationally.
- Cincinnati's 22 stolen bases are tied for second in the Big 12, and junior Landyn Vidourek ranks third in the league with seven thefts.
- · Senior Donovan Ford has started all 11 games in center field, the lone Bearcat to start all 11 games at the same position this season.
- Sophomore Jack Natili is UC's leading hitter at .316 and has been an ironman behind the plate, starting all four games at catcher at UC San
- · Cincinnati is 8-2 in its last 10 home openers. UC defeated Northern Kentucky, 10-2, last year in its home opener.
- · Three Bearcats have fathers that played Major League Baseball: Joel Pineiro's father, Joel, enjoyed a 12-year career in the big leagues with the Seattle Mariners, St. Louis Cardinals, Los Angeles Angels, and Boston Red Sox. Cal and Luke Sefcik's father, Kevin, played six years with the Philadelphia Phillies and one with the Colorado Rockies.

LAST TIME OUT

Cincinnati recently wrapped a long road trip out west with a four-game series at UC San Diego. UC left to head west on Thursday, Feb. 20 and returned home immediately after its series finale at UCSD on Sunday, March 2.

The Bearcats dropped three out of four games in San Diego, winning game two by a score of 5-2 but dropping games one, three, and four.

Cincinnati had a difficult time figuring out UC San Diego's pitching, as the Tritons posted a 1.75 ERA in the series. Tommy O'Connor (.400), Jack Natili (.375), and Charlie Niehaus (.308) were all able to hit above .300 against the stout UCSD pitchers.

The highlight of the win in game two was Nathan Taylor, who struck out nine in seven innings to earn the win. His performance tied for the longest outing of his career, matching his seven-inning game against TCU last season.

Following its statement-making series win at No. 11 Duke during opening weekend, Cincinnati was ranked No. 25 in the D1Baseball Top 25 poll for the first time ever.

The following week, UC moved up two spots to No. 23 in the poll. The Bearcats were the highestranked Big 12 team in the poll, just ahead of No. 25

NOTING OPENING WEEKEND AT DUKE

The Bearcats opened the 2025 season in exciting fashion, winning two out of three games at No. 11 Duke. After winning 8-3 on Opening Day and dropping game two in extra innings, Cincinnati exploded for a 19-5 win in game three.

Plenty of impressive notes came out of opening weekend:

- Cincinnati became ranked in the D1Baseball Top 25 for the first time in program history. D1Baseball's Top 25 poll began in 2015. The Bearcats have been nationally ranked before, ending the 1961 (No. 18) and 1971 (No. 13) seasons ranked in the Collegiate Baseball yearend Top 25.
- · UC's win on Opening Day was its first victory

- against a ranked non-conference opponent since March 30, 2021 against No. 5 Louisville.
- In defeating the No. 11 Blue Devils, the Bearcats won a series against a ranked opponent for the first time since No. 22 UConn on April 5-7, 2019.
- Game three's 14-run margin of victory was UC's highest against a ranked opponent since at least
- Eighteen Bearcats made their Cincinnati debuts last weekend.

KERRINGTON CROSS LEAVING HIS MARK AT UC

Senior Kerrington Cross is the most experienced player (171 career games played) on Cincinnati's roster and also one of its best.

Head Coach Jordan Bischel called Cross "one of the most valuable players in college baseball" and he lived up to that name at Duke. Cross hit .438 with two home runs and six RBI that weekend while also stealing two bags and starting all three games.

For his efforts, Cross was named to the NCAA's Week 1 Lineup of the Week.

Last season he hit .321 with 11 home runs, 53 RBI, 63 runs scored, 46 walks, and 16 stolen bases and led UC in hits (71) and walks. Cross ended the season ranking in the top ten in the Big 12 in walks, runs, and stolen bases.

Cross enters the weekend ranking seventh all-time in program history in runs scored (162).

NATHAN TAYLOR OFF TO BLAZING START

One of the best pitchers in the Big 12 so far this season is Cincinnati sophomore Nathan Taylor. The big right-hander is sporting a 1.59 ERA and has 26 strikeouts in 17.0 innings with just seven walks.

He turned in one of the best outings of his career this at UNLV, striking out 11 in six shutout innings against the Rebels. Taylor then followed that up by striking out nine in seven solid innings to earn the win at UC San Diego.

Taylor was terrific in his first collegiate season last year and was named honorable mention All-Big 12 and earned a spot on the all-freshman team. He made 16 starts and two relief appearances, posting an 8-2 record with 70 strikeouts in 72.2 innings pitched. His eight victories were tied for second in the Big 12 and tied for ninth-most in a season in school history.

DONOVAN FORD MAKES IMMEDIATE **IMPACT**

A transfer from Division II Newberry, Donovan Ford has started all 11 games in center field, the only player on the team to have started in all 11 games this season, let alone at the same position.

One of Cincinnati's most accomplished transfer portal additions, Ford had an extraordinary career at Newberry. He left as its all-time leader in career batting average (.396) and was second in stolen bases (91). Ford was an ABCA Second Team All-American in 2024 after hitting .421 and getting onbase at a .506 clip. When he got on base he was

dangerous, stealing 35 bases. Ford was an All-American in 2023 as well, starting all 58 games while hitting .406 and driving in 70 runs. He had 42 stolen bases and a school-record 86 runs scored in 2023 as

SEFCIK BROTHERS SHINE AT DUKE

Brothers Luke and Cal Sefcik shared a cool moment on Opening Day when they hit back-toback in the Bearcats' order. Luke hit sixth and started at second base, while Cal hit seventh and started at designated hitter.

Luke, in his second year with the program, started all three games at second base against the Blue Devils and was a huge part of UC's bunt game. Cal Started at DH and left field and hit a huge three-run homer in the decisive game three victory.

Kevin Sefcik, father of Cal and Luke, spent seven years in the big leagues, six with the Philadelphia Phillies. Kevin coached Cal and Luke at Marist High School in suburban Chicago as well.

TOMMY O'CONNOR LOOKING TO SLUG IN 2025

Senior Tommy O'Connor left the yard for the first time this season in game two at UNLV, lauching a solo homer. It was the 21st home run of his career after hitting 12 last season and eight in 2023.

O'Connor earned honorable mention All-Big 12 honors last season, playing in 55 games while making 52 starts (29 at 1B, 23 at DH). The slugger hit 12 home runs and drove in 43 while tallying 42 walks, eight doubles, and 46 runs scored. He tended to homer in bunches and had three separate occasions where he homered in back-to-back games.

KELLEN O'CONNOR JOINS CINCINNATI'S **ROTATION**

Senior left-handed pitcher Kellen O'Connor has served as Cincinnati's Friday/Game 1 starter each of the first three weekend series and has put up impressive numbers thus far. He owns 12 strikeouts and a 1.86 ERA while holding opponents to a .176 batting average in 9.2 innings.

O'Connor was one of Cincinnati's biggest gets in the transfer portal this past offseason. The Portland, Ore. Native spent the last five seasons at CSU-Bakersfield, missing the 2023 campaign due to injury. He was Bakersfield's Sunday starter last season, logging a 2.89 ERA and 64 punchouts in 81.0 innings. His best performance of the season was a complete-game victory at UC Davis on May 25 when he allowed just one earned run while scattering eight hits and one walk.

FOR JOEL PINEIRO, IT'S IN HIS GENES

Redshirt junior right-handed pitcher Joel Pineiro has been terrific out of the bullpen through the first two weekends. He owns a sparkling 1.74 ERA and has nine strikeouts across 10.1 innings of work.

In his Cincinnati debut at Duke, he turned in a stellar performance by striking out three in 4.0 shutout frames to earn the win in the 8-3 victory on Opening Day.

Pineiro transferred to UC from FIU, where he started 19 games on the mound.

Pineiro's father, Joel, spent 12 seasons in the major leagues (2000-2011) as a pitcher with the Seattle Mariners, St. Louis Cardinals, Los Angeles Angels, and Boston Red Sox. He won 104 games and collected 1,058 strikeouts in his MLB career.

LAUDEN BROOKS FILLS THE BOX SCORE

Though he has battled injuries early this season, senior Lauden Brooks is an integral part of the Cincinnati lineup.

An honorable mention all-conference selection last season, Brooks made 49 starts (22 at 2B, 21 at SS, six at DH). He hit .301 with two home runs, 34 RBI, 10 doubles, 44 runs scored, and 13 stolen bases. Brooks collected 20 multi-hit efforts, tied for second on the team. His father, Marc Brooks, pitched for the Bearcats in 1984-85.

SWISS ARMY KNIFE CHRISTIAN MITCHELLE **CAN DO IT ALL**

Junior Christian Mitchelle received second-team All-Big 12 distinctions last year as a two-way threat. He started 42 games (25 at SS, 11 at DH, six at 2B) and pitched in 22 games out of the bullpen, and earned a spot on the John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year Award midseason watch list. Mitchelle hit .319 at the dish with four home runs, 22 RBI, 34 runs scored, and nine stolen bases. Out of the bullpen, he led UC with six saves and totaled 39.1 innings of work.

At Duke opening weekend, Mitchelle recorded the final out on the mound in the game one victory and also started all three games in the outfield. He has started games this year in left field and right field and also at third base and second base.

CARSON MARSH LOOKING TO ANCHOR **BACK OF BULLPEN**

Sophomore Carson Marsh has been a reliable and oft-used bullpen option through the first three weekends. He leads UC with six pitching appearances and has multiple strikeouts in four of his six outings.

Marsh was thrust into a high-leverage bullpen role last season and responded about as well as one could hope for a true freshman. He appeared in 24 games and posted a 4.30 ERA in 44.0 innings of work, striking out 52 while walking 15. The local product made his collegiate debut on Opening Day last season and came up big in one of the most important wins of the season, striking out four in 2.2 scoreless frames against Texas in the Big 12 Tournament.

ADAM MRAKITSCH REUNITES WITH BISCHEL

Senior left-hander Adam Mrakitsch has made two starts with the Bearcats so far, starting game three in each of the first three series.

Mrakitsch joined the Bearcats this past offseason from Central Michigan, where he played under Jordan Bischel for two seasons. His best season came in 2023, when he was a First-Team All-MAC honoree after finishing 8-4 with a 3.59 ERA and 80 strikeouts while holding opposing hitters to a miniscule .196 batting average. Mrakitsch was D1Baseball's preseason MAC Pitcher of the Year in 2024 and made nine starts before being shut down with an injury. He fields his position well too, receiving an All-Defensive Team nod in 2023.

BISCHEL BALL ERA ENTERS YEAR TWO

Head Coach Jordan Bischel enters his second season with Cincinnati in 2025.

UC posted a 32-25 overall record and a 17-13 mark in conference play, the program's first 30-win season since 2019. Cincinnati finished the regular season in fifth place in the Big 12 after being picked to finish in last in the preseason coaches poll.

The Bearcats claimed six series wins in conference

play including series vs. TCU, West Virginia, and UCF, and also posted an 18-8 record at home.

Bischel helped coach seven All-Big 12 players in 2024, including first-team selection Josh Kross. Christian Mitchelle was named to the second team while Nathan Taylor, Lauden Brooks, Kerrington Cross, Josh Hegemann, and Tommy O'Connor were all honorable mention.

Kross was selected by the St. Louis Cardinals in the sixth round of the MLB Draft last summer.

In his first year at UC, Bischel successfully implemented his style of play and saw his players buy in as well. The Bearcats were among the national leaders in walks (320, most in school history) and stolen bases (109) and ranked atop the league in HBP (91). Cincinnati's ability to get on base and take extra bases led to an average of 7.4 runs per game, which ranked fourth in the league.

2024 HIGHLIGHTS

Cincinnati's first year in the Big 12 saw several big moments that made year one unforgettable:

- UC's first-ever Big 12 Conference win came on March 9 at Kansas State.
- The next weekend, Cincinnati took two out of three from Kansas at home to claim its first Big 12 Conference series. The weekend was highlighted by Tommy Boba's performance in game two when he took a no-hitter into the ninth inning.
- One of the biggest statements made by the Bearcats last year came on April 5-7 at home when they swept TCU, capping the series with a 13-2 run-rule victory.
- Cincinnati took two out of three at home vs. West Virginia, a team that would go on to advance to a Super Regional.
- One of the most electric moments in the history of the program came in the final game of the regular season. With the score tied at 6-6 in the bottom of the eighth inning vs. No. 12 Oklahoma,

senior Josh Hegemann blasted a two-out grand slam to give UC a 10-6 lead in the eventual victory. It was Hegemann's first career collegiate home run and came on Senior Day.

Facing elimination in the Big 12 Tournament, Cincinnati defeated Texas, 8-7, to send the Longhorns home in their final Big 12 baseball game.

COACHING STAFF UPDATES

Cincinnati had a couple updates to its coaching staff during the offseason. Tayler Sheriff was promoted from director of pitching development to pitching coach, and Chris Krepline joined the program as the new director of pitching development.

During Sheriff's first season with the Bearcats in 2024, the team posted a 32-25 overall record and a 17-13 mark in conference play, the program's first 30-win season since 2019. UC finished the regular season in fifth place in the Big 12 after being picked to finish in last in the preseason coaches poll.

Cincinnati also saw its team ERA drop by nearly a full run in 2024 from the previous season, and it posted its lowest single-season ERA since 2019.

Krepline comes to Cincinnati following a successful stint as the head coach at Lawrence University. From 2019-24, he earned two Midwest Conference Coach of the Year awards and held Lawrence to two conference titles (2022 and 2024).

In 2024, Krepline's squad posted a 31-11 record, the most wins in a season in school history, and four of his student-athletes earned All-America recognitions. His 2022 team won the Midwest Conference and took the conference tournament crown as well, earning the school's first trip to the NCAA Division III Tournament since 1979. He earned D3Baseball and ABCA Region 9 Coach of the Year accolades that season.

Cincinnati will begin the year with three straight road series at Duke (Feb. 14-16), UNLV (Feb. 21-24), and UC San Diego (Feb. 27-March 2) before returning home.

UC's home opener is set for Tuesday, March 4 vs. Toledo, which will begin a six-game homestand. It will be followed by a four-game series vs. Canisius (March 7-9) and a Tuesday contest vs. Miami (Ohio) (March 11).

Big 12 play begins the following weekend at Arizona (March 14-16). Cincinnati's other road Big 12 series are at Texas Tech (April 4-6), West Virginia (April 17-19), Kansas (May 2-4), and TCU (May 9-11). The Bearcats' Big 12 home opener is Thursday, March 20 vs. BYU to kick off a three-game series. Other Big 12 home opponents are UCF (March 28-30), Arizona State (April 11-13), Oklahoma State (April 25-27), and Kansas State (May 15-17).

Cincinnati will also host Louisville (March 25), Xavier (April 15), and Indiana (May 13) in nonconference action and will visit, Miami (Ohio) (April 1), Xavier (April 22), and Oral Roberts (May 6) for midweek contests.

Once again, Cincinnati will participate in the Joe Nuxhall Classic at Prasco Park. The event is scheduled for April 8-9 and the Bearcats will open against Wright State. The winner of that game will play the winner of the Xavier vs. Miami (Ohio) game in the championship contest.

COACHING STAFF TIES

Bischel has a long history with assistants Tom Winske and Kyle Schroeder, having spent a lot of time with both of them at different institutions.

Winske and Schroeder were both on staff at Central Michigan with Bischel from 2019-23, helping the Chippewas win four Mid-American Conference championships and earn three NCAA Tournament berths.

Schroeder also coached under Bischel for four years at Northwood University (2015-18) and for two seasons at Midland University (2013-14).

Winske was a successful coach at St. Norbert College in De Pere, Wis. From 1999-2018 and coached Bischel as a player from 2000-03. Bischel also served as an assistant coach under Winske from 2007-09.

WINSKE INDUCTED INTO ST. NORBERT **COLLEGE ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME**

Assistant coach Tom Winske's former school, St. Norbert College, announced that he would be inducted into the athletics department's Hall of Fame later this year.

Winske, who coached at St. Norbert from 1999-2018, compiled a career record of 444-287-1 and led the program to five NCAA Division III berths. His 444 career wins were the most in the history of the Midwest Conference at the conclusion of his tenure, and he was named Midwest Conference North Division Coach of the Year nine times. Winske led St. Norbert to conference titles in 2003, 2012, 2014, and 2017.

PUTTING IN THE WORK IN THE CLASSROOM

Not only have the Bearcats been getting it done on the field, they've gotten it done in the classroom

UC received its ninth straight ABCA Team Academic Excellence Award last summer.

Even better, last semester the baseball program posted a cumulative 3.429 GPA, the highest semester GPA in program history. Thirty-four players earned a spot on the Honor Roll with a GPA of 3.0 or higher, 25 made the Dean's List at 3.5 or higher, and five earned a perfect 4.0 semester GPA.

BEARCATS SIGN **HIGHEST-RATED RECRUITING CLASS IN PROGRAM HISTORY**

Cincinnati's success last season helped pave the way for a successful signing day last fall. The Bearcats added 11 signees during the early signing period, putting together a class that ranked 46th nationally, the highest-rated recruiting class in program history.

The 2025 recruiting class is comprised of pitcher Connor Blue (O'Fallon, III.), outfielder/first baseman/pitcher Joe DuSell (Elgin, III.), pitcher Scott DiMarco (Medina, Ohio), catcher Enzo Infelise (New Lenox, III.), pitcher Tucker King (Western Springs, III.), outfielder Luke Kosko (Jefferson Hills, Pa.), first baseman/outfielder Nolan Jaworowski (St. Louis, Mo.), outfielder Quincy Mazeke (Glenoak, Ohio), pitcher Brandon Menser (Sesser, III.), infielder Jackson Reardon (Hebron, Ky.), and infielder Ben Voegele (Hamilton, Ohio).

PHILLIPS 66 BIG 12 CHAMPIONSHIP RETURNS TO ARLINGTON

The Big 12 Conference announced a new championship format last fall.

The top 12 teams in the regular season standings will advance to the 2025 Phillips 66 Big 12 Baseball Championship at Globe Life Field in Arlington, Texas, Wednesday, May 21 to Saturday, May 24. In the new format, the top four seeds will receive a bye while the No. 5-12 seeds play four single elimination games in the first round. The winners will take on the top four seeds in the quarterfinals on Thursday, May 22 with a chance to advance to the semifinals on Friday, May 23. The Championship final will be played on Saturday, May 24. All games in the tournament will be single elimination.

Arlington has hosted the Big 12 Baseball Championship five times, with the event taking place at Globe Life Field each year since 2022. The venue, which is home to the 2023 World Series-champion Texas Rangers, opened in 2020 and has hosted the 2020 World Series, 2023 World Series, and 2024 MLB All-Star Game. The Big 12 remains the only Conference to crown its postseason champion in a Major League Baseball stadium, as well as in a retractable roof facility.

HEAD COACH JORDAN BISCHEL

Jordan Bischel is entering his second season as the head coach at Cincinnati in 2025.

The 2024 season was Bischel's first at Cincinnati, and he led the Bearcats to a terrific year in their inaugural Big 12 campaign.

UC posted a 32-25 overall record and a 17-13 mark in conference play, the program's first 30-win season since 2019. Cincinnati finished the regular season in fifth place in the Big 12 after being picked to finish in last in the preseason coaches poll.

The Bearcats claimed six series wins in conference play including series vs. TCU, West Virginia, and UCF, and also posted an 18-8 record at home.

Bischel helped coach seven All-Big 12 players in 2024, including first-team selection Josh Kross. Christian Mitchelle was named to the second team while Nathan Taylor, Lauden Brooks, Kerrington Cross, Josh Hegemann, and Tommy O'Connor were all honorable mention.

In his first year at UC, Bischel successfully implemented his style of play and saw his players buy in as well. The Bearcats were among the national leaders in walks (320, most in school history) and stolen bases (109) and ranked atop the league in HBP (91). Cincinnati's ability to get on base and take extra bases led to an average of 7.4 runs per game, which ranked fourth in the league.

Bischel was announced as the 33rd head coach in program history on June 18, 2023.

The Green Bay, Wis., native came to UC from Central Michigan, where he served as head coach for five seasons. He also spent four seasons as head coach of Northwood, an NCAA Division II program in Midland, Mich., and two seasons at the helm of NAIA program Midland University in Fremont, Neb.

He has previously won eight conference championships: four at Central Michigan, four at Northwood.

Bischel led the Chippewas to four Mid-American Conference (MAC) championships -- two regular season and two tournament -- and three NCAA Regionals. The Chippewas went 177-80 (.689) during Bischel's tenure.

In five seasons as head coach at CMU, Bischel had a 102-32 MAC record and posted three consecutive 40-win full seasons for the first time since 1986-88. His teams won a combined 132 games in 2019, '21 and '22, the winningest three-year stretch in program history.

Bischel's CMU teams went a combined 31-8 against the five other Michigan Division I programs, Michigan, Michigan State, Eastern Michigan, Western Michigan and Oakland, and Bischel led his Chippewas to 12 victories over opponents from Power 5 conferences.

In 2022, the Chippewas finished 43-19, including 30-7 and in second place in the MAC. They made a remarkable run to the league tournament crown, starting 1-1 and then winning three consecutive elimination games, the final two against host and regular season champion Ball State. That put the Chippewas in the NCAA Tournament for the third straight season, where they went 1-2 and bowed to No. 13-ranked Florida in the Gators' home stadium in Gainesville.

The Chippewas posted a 42-18 ledger in 2021, capped by a 2-2 finish in the NCAA Regional in South Bend, Ind. The Chippewas were the No. 4 seed in the four-team tournament and posted victories over No. 2 Michigan and No. 3 UConn.

Bischel electrified CMU baseball from the word go in 2019, leading it to its first MAC Tournament championship and its first NCAA Tournament berth since 1995. The 2019 squad posted a 47-14 mark — an 18-win improvement over the 2018 squad — and a dramatic 6-5 victory over Miami (Fla.) in an NCAA Regional game in Starkville, Miss. It was CMU's first NCAA Tournament victory since 1988.

The Chippewas earned their first MAC regular season title since 2015, tied the program record for victories in a season (47), and its .770-win percentage was fifth best in the nation.

Prior to his time at CMU, Bischel was the head coach of Northwood from 2014 to 2018. The Timberwolves posted a combined 137-76 record and won two Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) Championships as well as two GLIAC Tournament titles. Over his last two seasons, Northwood won 84 games — the best two-year stretch prior to Bischel's arrival featured 55 wins (1989-90).

Before Northwood, Bischel coached at Midland University in Fremont, Neb., for two seasons, leading the Warriors to a combined 74-45 record. In his first year at Midland, the Warriors won 31 games, an 18-victory improvement over the previous year.

Bischel also coached in the Northwoods League for five seasons, four with the Green Bay Bullfrogs and one with the Wisconsin Woodchucks. He also served as the pitching coach for three seasons at Northwest Missouri State and was an assistant coach at John Carroll University in Ohio and at St. Norbert College in Wisconsin.

Bischel was an academic all-conference first baseman and pitcher at St. Norbert from 2000 to 2003. He earned all-conference honors and served as the team captain as a senior.

Bischel and his wife Katie have three sons, twins Luke and Parker, and Chase.

Tayler Sheriff is entering his second season with Cincinnati in 2025. He was promoted to serve as the team's pitching coach in August 2024 after spending the previous season as the director of pitching development.

During his first season with the Bearcats in 2024, the team posted a 32-25 overall record and a 17-13 mark in conference play, the program's first 30-win season since 2019. UC finished the regular season in fifth place in the Big 12 after being picked to finish in last in the preseason coaches poll.

The Bearcats claimed six series wins in conference play including series vs. TCU, West Virginia, and UCF, and also posted an 18-8 record at home.

Working with the pitching staff, Sheriff helped mentor freshman right-hander Nathan Taylor to an All-Big 12 campaign. Taylor was named to the league's all-freshman team and was an honorable mention all-conference selection.

In addition to Taylor, Sheriff helped two-way player Christian Mitchelle to a Second-Team All-Big 12 accolade. Mitchelle appeared in 22 games on the mound and totaled six saves, while throwing 39.1 innings for the Bearcats.

Cincinnati also saw its team ERA drop by nearly a full run in 2024 from the previous season, and it posted its lowest single-season ERA since 2019.

Sheriff came to UC from Western Illinois where he served as interim head coach of the baseball program for the 2023 season. He was the pitching coach and recruiting coordinator during the 2022 season, which was his first with the program.

In his first season, the Leathernecks saw an improvement in overall wins, Summit League victories and conference finish. Western Illinois also had improvements in nearly every major statistical category.

Prior to joining Western Illinois, Sheriff spent three years working for the baseball program at Spalding University as a pitching coach and recruiting coordinator. He oversaw three pitchers who were named All-SLIAC in 2019.

In 2017-18, Sheriff contributed as a volunteer assistant coach at Indiana University of Pennsylvania. Prior to that, he worked nearby at Penn State - New Kensington as an assistant coach.

Since 2014, Sheriff has spent his summer days functioning as a general manager and head coach for Paul Carpenter Capital Advisors AAABA Baseball in his home state of Pennsylvania. He started his coaching career in 2015 with United High School in Armagh, Pa.



Kyle Pettoruto is in his second season with the Bearcats in $2025\,$

His roles include overseeing the recruiting efforts of the program, instructing infield play, and assisting in all areas of the offense.

UC posted a 32-25 overall record in 2024 and a 17-13 mark in conference play, the program's first 30-win season since 2019. Cincinnati finished the regular season in fifth place in the Big 12 after being picked to finish in last in the preseason coaches poll.

The Bearcats claimed six series wins in conference play including series vs. TCU, West Virginia, and UCF, and also posted an 18-8 record at home.

Six hitters earned All-Big 12 honors in 2024, including first-team selection Josh Kross. Two-way performer Christian Mitchelle was named to the second team while Lauden Brooks, Kerrington Cross, Josh Hegemann, and Tommy O'Connor were all honorable mention.

Under Pettoruto's tutelage, UC scored 423 runs in 2024, the highest single-season total since 2008. UC averaged 7.4 runs per game, which ranked fourth in the Big 12. The Bearcats were also among the national leaders in walks (320, most in school history) and stolen bases (109) and ranked atop the league in HBP (91).

Pettoruto officially joined the Cincinnati baseball program on July 11, 2023. He came to UC after following a four-year stint as the hitting coach/assistant coach for Rutgers University (2020-23).

Pettoruto helped lead Rutgers to back-to-back top-5 league finishes, rebuilding a program that had not finished better than 10th in its entire Big Ten history prior to his arrival. The Scarlet Knights went 77-38 (.670) overall and 31-17 (.646) in the Big Ten over 2022 and 2023.

Under Pettoruto's guidance in 2022, Rutgers had one of the most prolific lineups in all of college baseball. The Scarlet Knights led the country with 9.6 runs per game and were top-5 nationally in runs (565) and doubles (147). In addition, the 2022 recruiting class was ranked No. 25 by D1Baseball.com and Top 35 by Baseball America.

Prior to his time at Rutgers, Pettoruto spent six seasons at Bryant and was a part of six straight Northeast Conference regular season championships and two NCAA Tournament appearances.

He played a role in producing 40 All-NEC selections, 46 All-New England selections, six ABCA All-Northeast selections, two NEC and New England Players of the Year, four NEC Rookies of the Year, two New England Rookies of the Year, one Collegiate Baseball Freshman Player of the Year and four Freshman All-Americans in his six seasons at Bryant.

Prior to Bryant, Pettoruto worked as an assistant coach with the North Shore Navigators in the Futures Collegiate Baseball League in the summer of the 2012. Following the summer, Pettoruto was hired as an assistant coach at Merrimack. He worked with the outfielders and the hitters, helping the Warriors set a school record for wins in the spring of 2013.

Pettoruto was a four-year letterwinner at the University of New Haven and helped the Chargers earn a spot in the 2010 NCAA Tournament. He also played for the Joplin Outlaws of the MINK League and the Rome Thunderbolts during the summer.



Tom Winske is in his second season as an assistant coach with Cincinnati. He works with the Bearcat catchers and outfielders as well as oversee bunting and baserunning.

UC posted a 32-25 overall record and a 17-13 mark in conference play, the program's first 30-win season since 2019. Cincinnati finished the regular season in fifth place in the Big 12 after being picked to finish in last in the preseason coaches poll.

The Bearcats claimed six series wins in conference play including series vs. TCU, West Virginia, and UCF, and also posted an 18-8 record at home.

Winske helped mentor one of the most exciting offenses in the Big 12 in 2024. The Bearcats were among the national leaders in walks (320, most in school history) and stolen bases (109) and ranked atop the league in HBP (91). Cincinnati's ability to get on base and take extra bases led to an average of 7.4 runs per game, which ranked fourth in the league.

His work with outfielder Josh Hegemann led to an honorable mention all-conference accolade for the senior, one of seven Bearcats to earn All-Big 12 honors in 2024.

UC collected 109 stolen bases in 2024, the most in a single season since swiping a school-record 133 in 2008.

Winske was hired as an assistant coach on July 11, 2023, resuming his longtime affiliation with head coach Jordan Bischel when the latter was named to lead the Cincinnati baseball program.

Winske came to Cincinnati from Central Michigan, where he served as a volunteer assistant coach from 2019 to 2023. He combined with Bischel to lead the Chippewas to four Mid-American Conference (MAC) championships -- two regular season and two tournament — and three NCAA Tournament berths.

With Winske on the coaching staff, the Chippewas compiled an 102-32 MAC record and posted three consecutive 40-win full seasons for the first time since 1986-88. They won a combined 132 games in 2019, '21 and '22, marking the winningest three-year stretch in program history.

Winske came to CMU after a highly successful twodecade run as the head coach at NCAA Division III St. Norbert College in De Pere, Wis. He amassed a 444-287-1 career mark from 1999 to 2018 and is the Midwest Conference's all-time leader in both conference and overall wins. In January 2025, he was inducted into the St. Norbert College Athletics Hall of Fame.

Winske was named the Midwest Conference North Division Coach of the Year nine times in his 20 years at St. Norbert and led the Green Knights to four conference championships and five NCAA Tournament berths. His 2017 team won 30 games, the most victories in a season by any men's athletics team in St. Norbert history.

Bischel, a pitcher, played for Winske at St. Norbert from 2000 to 2003 and served as an assistant under his mentor from 2007-09.



Kyle Schroeder is in his second season as the director of program development for Cincinnati Baseball. He joined the Bearcats prior to the 2024 season after a four-year stint as an assistant coach at Central Michigan.

Schroeder is considered one of the top catching instructors in college baseball, having worked with college catchers for over 16 years. In just the last five seasons he has mentored four catchers who are now playing professional baseball. including former Bearcat and 2024 MLB Draft selection Josh Kross.

During his first season with the Bearcats in 2024, the team posted a 32-25 overall record and a 17-13 mark in conference play, the program's first 30-win season since 2019. UC finished the regular season in fifth place in the Big 12 after being picked to finish in last in the preseason coaches poll.

The Bearcats claimed six series wins in conference play including series vs. TCU, West Virginia, and UCF, and also posted an 18-8 record at home.

Schroeder played a major role in helping lead CMU to four Mid-American Conference championships -- two regular season and two tournament -- and three NCAA Tournament berths.

He previously served under Bischel for four years at Northwood University, where they combined to lead the program to unprecedented success, capped by back-toback Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference regular season and tournament championships in 2017 and 2018.

Prior to his four years at Northwood, Schroeder served as an assistant under Bischel at Midland University in 2013-14. Together, they led Midland to a league championship and an appearance in the NAIA National Tournament.

Schroeder began his coaching career as an assistant in 2008 at Luther College, worked as a graduate assistant at Northwest Missouri State and served as an assistant with the Green Bay Bullfrogs of the Northwoods League.

As a player at Luther from 2004 to 2007, Schroeder led the Norse to Iowa Intercollegiate Athletic Conference regular season and tournament championships during his senior year. He was named the 2007 IIAC Most Valuable Player and remains the program leader in several offensive categories, including career home runs (30) and career RBI (172).

Schroeder earned a bachelor's degree from Luther and a master's from Northwest Missouri State.



Chris Krepline joined the Cincinnati Baseball coachina staff as the director of pitching development in September 2024.

Krepline comes to Cincinnati following a successful stint as the head coach at Lawrence University. From 2019-24, he earned two Midwest Conference Coach of the Year awards and held Lawrence to two conference titles (2022 and 2024).

This past season. Krepline's sauad posted a 31-11 record. the most wins in a season in school history, and four of his student-athletes earned All-America recognitions. Outfielder Jacob Charon was named the league's player of the year and pitcher Quinn Berglin was named the pitcher of the year.

His 2022 team also won the Midwest Conference and took the conference tournament crown as well, earning the school's first trip to the NCAA Division III Tournament since 1979. He earned D3Basebal and ABCA Region 9 Coach of the Year accolades that season.

Overall, Krepline coached 21 all-conference players and had 12 all-region selections during his time at Lawrence.

Krepline, who also had a stint as an assistant coach at Lawrence in 2013 and 2014, was an assistant coach at St. Norbert college from 2015-18. During that time, he coached six All-Midwest Conference and four All-Central Region pitchers. St. Norbert also won three Midwest Conference North Division titles, a Midwest Conference championship and played in the NCAA Division III Regional Tournament.

His previous experience also includes coaching the Green Bay Rockets of the Northwoods League and a stint at Reedsville High School from 2011-13.

Krepline is a 2009 graduate of Carthage College, where he earned his bachelor's degree in exercise and sport science. He received a master's degree in applied exercise science from Concordia University in 2015.

He was a pitcher at Carthage, helping lead his team to the finals of the NCAA Division III Baseball Championship in 2007. A two-sport star, Krepline was also a wide receiver on the football team and won a CCIW Championship in 2004.

Krepline played professional baseball for two years with stints on the Lake County Fielders, Macon Pinetoppers, Saskatchewan Silver Sox and Rockford River Hawks.

Krepline and his wife, Bri, have two sons, Boe and Crewe, and a daughter. Sadie.



Tyler Dellerman is in his second season with the Bearcats in 2025. He serves as the program's offensive skills coordinator.

His duties include assisting with baserunning and hitting scouting reports and working with infielders and catchers.

During his first season with the Bearcats in 2024, the team posted a 32-25 overall record and a 17-13 mark in conference play, the program's first 30-win season since 2019. UC finished the regular season in fifth place in the Big 12 after being picked to finish in last in the preseason coaches poll.

The Bearcats claimed six series wins in conference play including series vs. TCU, West Virginia, and UCF, and also posted an 18-8 record at home.

Prior to his arrival at UC, Dellerman starred at the University of Charleston for three seasons. In 153 games he hit .371 and tallied 38 home runs, 167 RBI, 49 doubles, and 157 runs scored while slugging .704. He was named Mountain East Conference Player of the Year in 2023 and was a NCBWA Division II All-American. He also holds the program's singleseason RBI record (67), which he set in 2022.

Dellerman played at Urbana University in 2019-20, earning MEC Freshman of the Year honors in 2019. In 57 games spread across two seasons he hit .315 with 10 home runs and 50 RBI.

Dellerman is from Maineville, Ohio and attended St. Xavier High School.






