#### BEARCATS BRING BACK BELL, READY TO HOST HOUSTON

- RB Corey Kiner rushed for 126 yards and a score and walk-on kicker Nathan Hawks became the first Big 12 kicker with two 50-yard FGs in his placekicking debut as Cincinnati brought back the Victory Bell with a 27-16 victory at Miami (Ohio). Cincinnati took a 61-60-7 lead in the country's oldest non-conference rivalry.
- Houston picked up a 33-7 victory over Rice on Saturday to claim its first win of the season.
- The Bearcats have won four straight against the Cougars, including a 24-14 victory in Houston in 2023 that served at UC's first-ever Big 12 victory.
- Cincinnati head coach Scott Satterfield is 1-1 against Houston first-year head coach Willie Fritz, dating back to when Satterfield was the head coach at Appalachian State and Fritz led Georgia Southern in 2014 and 2015. Fritz is 1-3 against the Bearcats all-time with all matchups coming when he was at the helm of Tulane. He led the Green Wave to a 27-24 victory in his last matchup in the regular season finale in 2022.
- The 2024 James P. Kelly UC Athletics Hall of Fame class will be honored during the game, an esteemed class that includes football legends Mardy Gilyard and Mike Woods.

#### VICTORY BELL STARS

- While Kiner led the way in the Miami victory, several other plays were stars, as well.
- Hawks, an Enon, Ohio native and a walk-on from Wittenberg University, had never attempted a field goal in an FBS game entering Saturday. His first attempt came from 55 yards, which he made, tied for the second-longest in UC history. His second, from 50 yards, came with 59 seconds left, sealed the victory, and made him the first Bearcat with two 50-yarders in a single game in the 137-year program history.
- Led by sixth-year defensive end Eric Phillips (two sacks) and sixth-year safety Derrick Canteen (INT), the UC defense held Miami
- to just 24 rushing yards the fewest by an opponent since allowing just five yards to Memphis on Oct. 31, 2020. Fifth-year wide receiver Xzavier Henderson finished with 10 catches for 108 yards. He ranks tied for second in the Big 12 and tied for sixth nationally with 23 receptions this season. He has five 100-yard games at UC and six overall.

#### **RECENT MATCHUPS WITH THE COUGARS**

- Kiner rushed for 129 yards and two touchdowns on a career-high 23 carries in the 2023 victory over the Cougars. UC held Houston QB Donovan Smith to just 102 yards passing and secured three interceptions, including one by current redshirt sophomore DB Ken Willis, while redshirt sophomore CB Kalen Carroll recorded two pass breakups.
- The last time the Cougars traveled to Nippert Stadium, UC and Houston competed for the 2021 AAC Championship a game in which the Bearcats won 35-20. QB Desmond Ridder passed for three touchdowns and RB Jerome Ford rushed for 187 yards and two scores in the landmark program victory that propelled Cincinnati into the 2021 College Football Playoff Semifinals and secured a second consecutive conference championship. P Mason Fletcher, OT John Williams and DE Eric Phillips are the only remaining Bearcats who played in the 2021 game.

#### **BEARCAT FACTS**

- 34 new players (freshmen or transfers) saw their first action as Bearcats in Week 1. Led by S Jiquan Sanks, seven true freshmen have played a total of 226 snaps through three weeks, which is already more than the 2022 and 2023 seasons combined (164).
- TE Joe Royer (Ohio State transfer) leads all Big 12 tight ends in receptions (11), receiving yards (165) and touchdowns (2).
- P Mason Fletcher leads the Big 12 in punting average (47.5), 50+ punts (6) and I20 punts (6).
- DT Dontay Corleone, a 2022 All-American, returned to the starting lineup in Week 2. More on The Godfather on page 6. Corleone (2022), Fletcher (2022) and RG Luke Kandra (2023) are all AP Third Team All-Americans.
- Corleone and Kandra were 2024 preseason All-Big 12 selections.
- RB Corey Kiner has two straight 100-yard games and nine career 100-yard games. UC is 3-1 when he has 20+ carries. He is PFF's second-highest graded Big 12 RB behind UCF's RJ Harvey in 2024.


#### **SORSBY LEADS NEW ADDITIONS**

- QB Brendan Sorsby has completed 65 of 103 passes for 867 yards and six touchdowns with no INTs through three weeks.
- He hasn't thrown an interception in 115 passes dating back to the 2023 season with Indiana. On third down, he has been especially lethal, completing 17 of 25 attempts (68%) for 236 yards and two TDs.
- Sorsby's 658 passing yards in the first half are the most in the Big 12 and fourth-most nationally. He has five 1H TD passes.
- The Indiana transfer started seven games and passed for 15 TDs for the Hoosiers in 2023.
- He collected Big 12 Newcomer of the Week honors for Week 1 after passing 383 yards and four total TDs the most by a Bearcat in a debut since 2014. He led UC to 683 total yards - the most in the Big 12 and fifth-most in the nation in Week 1.

#### AN ELITE PROGRAM BY THE NUMBERS

- Cincinnati, which started playing football in 1885, is in its 137th season and owns an all-time record of 664-609-50.
- 2024 marks the 100th anniversary of the dedication of James Gamble Nippert Memorial Stadium. (See page 11 for more)
- Cincinnati is 58-21 (.734) since the start of the 2018 season, which ranks among the Top 15 best FBS records during the stretch.
- Cincinnati (2021) was the first G5 team and one of just 15 teams to make the College Football Playoff in the four-team era (2014-23) and one of just two current Big 12 teams (TCU, 2022) to make it. UC was the only non-Power Five program to ever earn a CFP berth in the four-team format.
- Since the start of the 2015 season, the Bearcats are 45-16 (.738) at Nippert Stadium and did not lose a home game from 2018-21. Overall, UC is 110-34 (.764) when playing at Nippert since the start of the 2000 season.

#### **DOUBLE DUTY**

• UC radio voice Dan Hoard also serves as the PXP man for the Cincinnati Bengals, making him the only broadcaster in the country to handle radio PXP duties for an NCAA FBS and NFL team. Hoard, entering his 25th season covering Cincinnati Football, will call games alongside Jim Kelly Jr., who is entering his 37th season calling UC Football. ESPN CFB commentators Wes Durham (Atlanta), Dave Pasch (Arizona) and Bob Wischusen (NY Jets) are NFL radio voices.

#### **BEARCATS RING THE BELL IN OXFORD**

- · Cincinnati avenged last season's loss vs. Miami (Ohio) with a 27-16 win against the RedHawks in the Battle for the Victory Bell in Oxford on Saturday.
- UC now holds a 61-60-7 all-time advantage in the rivalry, which dates back to 1888.
- The 128 meetings are the fourth-most among FBS rivalries behind Wisconsin-Minnesota (133), Georgia-Auburn (128), and North Carolina-Virginia (128).
- · Senior running back Corey Kiner finished with 126 yards on 21 carries for his ninth-career 100-yard game. He also added a 1-vard touchdown run, making it three straight years he has scored in the Battle for the Victory Bell.
- · Led by sixth-year senior defensive end Eric Phillips (career-best two sacks), the Bearcats held the RedHawks to only 24 rushing yards.

#### COREY KINER POSTS BACK-TO-BACK **100-YARD GAMES**

- · Corey Kiner led the charge offensively at Miami on Saturday, rushing for 126 yards on 21 carries with a touchdown. It was Kiner's second consecutive 100-yard rushing performance and the ninth of his career.
- The Bearcats are now 3-1 when Kiner records at least 20 carries
- Kiner also led UC in rushing vs. Pitt, carrying the ball 20 times for 149 yards, just four yards away from tying his career-high total.
- · Kiner had three rushes of at least 25 yards vs. Pitt, including a long rush of 28 yards.
- Kiner rushed for 1,047 yards a year ago, securing the 20th 1,000-yard season in UC history. His yardage total marked the 13th-best mark in school history.
- The Cincinnati native (Roger Bacon HS) finished with six 100-yard games in 2023 - tied for the fourth-most in a single season in school history.

#### MILESTONES WITHIN REACH FOR **KINER IN 2024**

- · Kiner can become the first Bearcat to rush for 1,000 vards in back-to-back seasons since Mike Warren in 2018 and 2019 and the fifth to ever accomplish the feat, joining Warren, Isaiah Pead (2010-11), Reggie Taylor (1980-82), and James Bettis (1980-81).
- The Cincinnati native reached an impressive milestone against the RedHawks last Saturday, pushing past 2,000 career rushing yards. His career total now stands at 2,055, while his career total at Cincinnati sits at 1,735.
- · After eclipsing 100 yards against Pitt and Miami, Kiner now has nine 100-yard rushing performances, which ranks tied for eighth in program history.

#### BRENDAN SORSBY COMMANDING THE OFFENSE THROUGH THREE GAMES

- · Redshirt sophomore QB Brendan Sorsby is off to a terrific start as Cincinnati's starting quarterback. Through three games he has totaled 867 passing yards with six touchdowns and zero interceptions while completing 63.1% of his passes (65-103).
- · Sorsby ranks among the Top 25 nationally in both passing yards (17th) and total offense (24th).
- · He threw for 681 yards over his first two games, the most for a Bearcat in his first two starts since Gunner Kiel's 689 yards in 2014.
- Dating back to last year when he was at Indiana, Sorsby has thrown 115 straight passes without an interception.
- Sorsby was 15-of-22 for 124 yards and a TD in the first half agaisnt Miami and has now completed 45-of-67 passes for 658 yards and six touchdowns in the first half of games this season through three games.
- Sorsby threw for 298 yards and three touchdowns vs. Pitt, tying his career-high for touchdown passes in a single game.
- · Sorsby debuted as Cincinnati's starting quarterback vs. Towson and did it all in the Bearcats' win, throwing for 383 yards and accounting for four total touchdowns (2 passing, 2 rushing). For his efforts, Sorsby earned Big 12 Newcomer of the Week honors.
- In the Towson game, the Indiana transfer put up the most passing yards by a Cincinnati QB since Gunner Kiel threw for 386 yards on Nov. 14, 2015 vs. Tulsa.
- · In the first half against Towson, Sorsby completed 17-of-23 passes for 328 yards and two touchdowns. The last UC quarterback to eclipse 300 passing yards in the first half was Emory Jones last season in the season opener vs. Eastern Kentucky. Jones threw for 326 yards in the first half in that game.
- Sorsby was announced as Cincinnati's starting QB on Aug. 22, beating out redshirt junior Brady Lichtenberg and freshman Samaj Jones to earn the job.
- · Sorsby played two seasons with the Hoosiers and threw for 1,587 yards and 15 touchdowns in 2023. The Denton, Texas native made seven starts at Indiana and added production on the ground as well as through the air. He rushed for 286 yards and four TDs last season, including 151 yards over the final three games of the year.

#### **NATHAN HAWKS MAKES GRAND FIRST IMPRESSION**

- · Redshirt senior Nathan Hawks made his debut as Cincinnati's placekicker on Saturday at Miami and had one of the best debuts for a kicker in recent memory.
- · Hawks' first attempt was a 55-yarder near the end of the first quarter, which he comfortably booted through the uprights. It was the longest field goal by a UC kicker since 2007 and tied for the second-longest in program history.
- The Enon, Ohio native connected on a 50-yard field goal with 59 seconds to go in the game, making it a twopossession game and all but clinching the victory for the
- · Hawks, who transferred to UC prior to the 2023 season after two years at Wittenburg, had only four collegiate field goal attempts in his career.
- The performance put Hawks in incredibly rarified air. He is just the fourth FBS kicker since 1996 to have his first two career field goal attempts come from 50-plus yards

### NUMBERS TO KNOW

Offensive linemen Gavin Gerhardt (27), John Williams (18), Deondre Buford (15), Luke Kandra (15), and Dartanyan Tinsley (15) have combined to make 90 career starts on the O-Line at Cincinnati

Running back Corey Kiner has posted back-to-back 100-yard rushing performances and now has nine 100-yard games in his career, tied for eighth all-time in program history.

Cincinnati is averaging 502.7 yards of total offense per game through the first three 502.7 weeks of the season, which is the Big I2 and I4th in the nation. weeks of the season, which ranks third in

Mason Fletcher's career punt average stands at 44.5, which ranks fifth amona all active FBS punters and is second all-time in program history behind Kevin Huber (45.5).

Wide receiver Xzavier Henderson has 23 receptions through the first three games, which is tied for second in the Big 12 and ranks tied for sixth in the nation.

#### **HOMETOWN HEROS**

# and make both, joining South Carolina's Mitch Jeter (2022), North Carolina's Dan Orner (2002), and Texas A&M's Terence Kitchens (1999).

 Additionally, Hawks and Michigan's Quinn Nordin (2017) are the only two FBS kickers since 1996 to make multiple 50-plus yard field goals in their first career FBS contest.

### FEW CAN BOOT 'EM LIKE MASON FLETCHER

- Senior punter Mason Fletcher has already positioned himself as one of the top punters in the country through his first three collegiate seasons, and he's off to another great start this year.
- Fletcher has punted 11 times for an average of 47.5 yards per punt, placing six inside the 20-yard line and booting six kicks longer than 50 yards. He leads the Big 12 in punts of 50+ yards and punts inside the 20.
- His punt average of 47.5 ranks fourth in the nation and leads the Bia 12.
- Against Miami last Saturday, the Melbourne, Australia native punted five times and placed three inside the 20vard line.
- Fletcher's career punt average stands at 44.5, which ranks fifth among all active FBS punters and first among Big 12 punters.
- Fletcher, a 2022 All-American and the 2022 AAC Special Teams Player of the Year, ranked fourth in the Big 12 last season in punting (43.0) while battling injuries. He was one of two Big 12 punters to not record a touchback and also pinned 23 punts inside the 20-yard line.

#### THE X(ZAVIER) FACTOR

- Xzavier Henderson has picked up where he left off last season and has been UC's top WR through three games.
- Henderson leads Cincinnati in receptions (23) and receiving yards (292) and has led the team in receptions and yards in each of the first three games. He is tied for second in the Big 12 in catches and ranks sixth in receiving yards. His 23 receptions are tied for sixth in the nation.
- Henderson set season highs against Miami last Saturday, hauling in 10 catches for 108 yards. The performance was his sixth career 100-yard receiving game, five of which have come at UC, and his second career game with double-diait receptions.
- Henderson's first season with the Bearcats in 2023 was
  a smashing success as the Miami, Fla. native was the
  team's leading receiver and earned All-Big 12 honors.
  He tallied 994 all-purpose yards and caught 58 passes
  for 782 yards as a receiver.
- Henderson was a track star in high school as well, winning the Florida 4A state 400m title in a blazing fast 46.77 time. He was a U.S. Army All-American too.

### JOE ROYER BECOMING ONE OF SORSBY'S TOP TARGETS

- Redshirt junior Joe Royer has positioned himself as one of Brendan Sorsby's top targets through three games.
- Royer has totaled 11 receptions for 165 yards and two touchdowns. He has caught a touchdown in each of the last two games.
- The Cincinnati native leads all Big 12 tight ends in receptions and receiving yards.
- Royer entered the season with four career receptions for 24 yards in three seasons at Ohio State

- Royer joined the program this past offseason as a transfer from OSU, and the Cincinnati native (Elder HS) turned heads in his first fall camp as a Bearcat.
- Royer battled through injuries during his three seasons at Ohio State and was a member of the 2022 team that made it to the College Football Playoff.

#### THE RETURN OF "THE GODFATHER"

- Dontay Corleone returned to action vs. Pitt, starting the game at defensive tackle and registering six tackles and one tackle for loss.
- He totaled 52 snaps in his 2024 debut and an 81.0 rush grade according to PFF, the second-best mark among Big 12 interior defensive linemen last week.
- Corleone, a 2022 All-American and preseason All-Big 12 selection this fall, was cleared to play in games by the Cincinnati Athletics sports medicine staff just five days before the Pitt game on Tuesday, Sept. 3, when he participated in his first full practice since June.
- Corleone was sidelined on June 28 with a non-football medical issue. He was treated for blood clots found in his lungs, discovered after he reported chest discomfort and shortness of breath to the Cincinnati athletic trainers.
- Led by Senior Associate Athletic Director of Sports
  Medicine Aaron Himmler and team physician Dr. Jon
  Divine, Cincinnati sports medicine staff, Corleone and
  his family met with several physicians and specialists
  to develop a personal medical plan for the Cincinnati
  native to return to football activities safely.
- Corleone had been a limited participant in every practice during training camp.

### JIQUAN SANKS MAKING IMMEDIATE IMPACT

- Freshman Jiquan Sanks has started in the secondary for Cincinnati in each of the first three games this season. He ranks fourth on the team with 12 tackles.
- When he took the field for the first defensive snap against Towson, Sanks became the first true freshman position player to start the season opener for the Bearcats since DE Marquise Copeland accomplished the feat against Alabama A&M nine years ago (2015).
- Copeland, a Super Bowl Champion with the Los Angeles Rams in 2022, was the first since DT Terrill Byrd and CB Mike Mickens made their first career starts in the 2005 season opener against Eastern Michigan.

#### **EVAN PRYOR: HOME RUN HITTER**

- Ohio State transfer running back Evan Pryor started his Cincinnati career with a bang against Towson, taking his first carry all the way to the house for a 64-yard touchdown.
- In the Miami game this past Saturday, Pryor outdid himself with a 65-yard touchdown run in the third quarter, the longest run of his career and tied for the longest by a Big 12 player this season. He is the only Big 12 player with multiple 60-yard runs and he ranks second in the nation in that category.
- Pryor rushed for 105 yards vs. Towson on just four carries, ending the game as UC's top rusher while collecting his first career 100-yard performance.

#### CAPTAIN CANTEEN

 Virginia Tech transfer Derrick Canteen has started both games this season and has 14 tackles, an interception,

- and three pass breakups. He ranks second on the team in tackles and is tied with Josh Minkins for most PBUs.
- Despite never taking a snap as a Bearcat, Canteen was voted by his teammates as a team captain prior to the 2024 season.
- Canteen draws inspiration from his father, who spent many years in the military: "Being raised in that environment helped instill discipline and affected my character and the way I treat people. I remember watching my dad get ready in the morning and seeing how detail-oriented he was and the work ethic he showed. I also learned that treating people with respect goes a long way."
- The Georgia Southern and Virginia Tech transfer has impressed coaches and players alike with the way he carries himself on and off the field.
- Canteen, who has played in 42 games in his collegiate career, is entering his sixth season of college football.
- The Evans, Ga. native was tabbed by head coach Scott Satterfield to represent UC at Big 12 Media Days in July, and his teammates voted him as one of four season-long captains at the end of fall camp in August.

#### **CENTER** GAVIN **GERHARDT:** OF **ATTENTION**

- Redshirt senior offensive lineman Gavin Gerhardt has been UC's starting center for each of the past two seasons, anchoring the offensive line since 2022.
- · The Xenia, Ohio native has started 27 games in his career and each of his last 14 games played. He was placed on the Rimington Trophy preseason watch list.
- Gerhardt's 17 starts as a Bearcat are most on the team.
- Gerhardt helped pave the way for UC's outstanding run game last season that ranked fifth in the nation (217.1). He was the third-highest rated center in the Big 12 according to PFF (73.4) and his 79.7 run block grade was the highest of any center in the conference and sixthbest in the country.

#### O-LINE PICKS UP WHERE THEY LEFT **OFF**

- · Cincinnati returns its entire starting offensive line from a season ago as John Williams (LT), Dartanyan Tinsley (LG), Gavin Gerhardt (C), Luke Kandra (RG), and Deondre Buford (RT) are back for the 2024 season.
- · In the season opener against Towson, the O-Line started their 12th-straight game together dating back to last year and did not allow a sack in the 38-20 victory.
- Behind the strength of its O-Line, UC ranked fifth in the nation in rushing in 2023 (217.1 ypg) and Corey Kiner turned in a 1,000-yard season at running back.
- · Cincinnati and Oklahoma State are the only two Big 12 programs to return their entire starting offensive lines and a 1.000-vard rusher.
- · Kandra was an All-American in 2023, earning that distinction from Walter Camp and the Associated Press. He earned preseason All-America distinctions from Walter Camp and ESPN prior to this season.

#### THE NEW GUYS

- · Thirty-four players made their Cincinnati debut in the opener vs. Towson including true freshmen Jiquan Sanks, Gavin Grover, Simeon Coleman, Marqavious Saboor, Dontay Weedon, and Devyn Zahursky.
- · On defense, seven Bearcats (Jared Bartlett, Kamari

Burns, Derrick Canteen, Jake Golday, Rob Jackson, Josh Minkins Jr., Jiquan Sanks) made their first starts in a UC

#### BEARCATS THRASH TIGERS IN OPENER

- · Cincinnati won its 23rd-straight home opener on Aug. 31 against Towson by a final score of 38-20.
- · The Bearcats' offense was humming all game, posting 658 total yards of offense against the Tigers. That total was the fifth-highest of any FBS team in Week 1.
- With the victory, Cincinnati has now won 23 straight home openers dating back to 2002. The streak began with a 36-29 triumph vs. TCU on Sept. 6, 2002.
- · The Bearcats are now 72-32-2 all-time against FCS opponents.
- Cincinnati improved to 43-16 at Nippert Stadium since the start of the 2015 season and 88-28 since 2000.
- UC is now 8-1 all-time in August games and has won its

#### YEAR TWO IN THE BIG 12

- · Cincinnati enters year two of Big 12 play after joining the conference in the summer of 2023.
- UC posted a 3-9 overall record last season in its inagural year in the league and won its first-ever Big 12 game on Nov. 11, 2023 at Houston
- · It was a challenging first season for the league's four new teams in 2023, as their combined record at the end of the season was 18-31 and only UCF reached bowl eligibility.
- · More changes are coming to the Big 12 in 2024 as Texas and Oklahoma have left for the SEC and Arizona, Arizona State, Colorado, and Utah have joined the conference.

#### THE SCOTT SATTERFIELD FILE

- Cincinnati head coach Scott Satterfield enters year two at Cincinnati after he was hired as UC's 43rd head coach on Dec. 5, 2022.
- Satterfield's career record stands at 81-58 (.583) in 12 years as a head coach at Cincinnati, Louisville, and Appalachian State, holding a winning mark in seven seasons in addition to a 4-1 record in bowl games.
- He led the Mountaineers from the FCS to the FBS and to three straight conference titles.
- He lifted the Cardinals up from a 2-10 campaign in 2018 to an 8-5 record in his first season in 2019.
- A Durham, N.C., native, Satterfield was the 2018 Sun Belt Coach of the Year at Appalachian State before earning 2019 ACC Coach of the Year honors after leading the Cardinals to a six-win improvement in his first year.
- Satterfield has deep ties to App State, serving as an assistant coach (1998-08) and quarterback for the Mountaineers (1991-95), helping lead his alma mater to three NCAA Division I FCS national titles and eight conference championships along the way.

- Tyson Veidt was brought in as the Bearcats' new defensive coordinator in the offseason after spending the last eight seasons at lowa State, where he built one of the top defensive units in the Big 12.
- Under his tutelage, the Cyclones led the Big 12 from 2016-23 in several categories:

  - · Yards Per Play Allowed (5.3)
  - · Rushing Yards Allowed (133.4)
  - · Yards Per Carry Allowed (3.8)
- Veidt mentored four NFL Draft picks in the last three years at Iowa State, including 2023 first-round selection and defensive end Will McDonald IV.

### FLETCHER BROTHERS REUNITE IN CLIFTON

- Mason Fletcher welcomed his brother, Max, to the program this past spring as a transfer from Arkansas.
- · A fellow punter, Max ranked seventh nationally with a

- 46.9 punting average at Arkansas this past season.
- He collected All-SEC Second Team honors from the coaches last fall, adding 23 punts of 50+ and 19 punts inside the 20-yard line for the Razorbacks. He tallied 59 punts and his 2,770 total punting yards led the SEC.
- Max is expected to serve as the backup to his older brother while redshirting in 2024 before serving as the Bearcats' starting punter the following two seasons, while he pursues a master's degree.

#### **2024 SCHEDULE PRIMER**

- The Big 12 welcomed four new members for the 2024-25 season and UC will face two of them, hosting Arizona State on Oct. 19 before visiting Colorado on Oct. 26. The game vs. the Sun Devils is also Cincinnati's Homecoming Game.
- Cincinnati will also meet Texas Tech, Kansas State, and TCU for the first time as Big 12 Conference foes.
- At the Nov. 9 game vs. West Virginia, UC will celebrate the 100th Anniversary of the dedication of Nippert Stadium.
- Below are brief capsules on Cincinnati's nine remaining games this season:
- Houston (Sept. 21): The Bearcats picked up their first Big 12 win, 24-14, over the Cougars in Houston last season. Houston returns to Nippert Stadium for the first time since UC used a 35-20 win over UH in the 2021 AAC Championship Game to cap a 13-0 season and propel Cincinnati into the College Football Playoff.
- at Texas Tech (Sept. 28): Cincinnati and Texas Tech will meet for the first time since a 10-10 tie in Lubbock, Texas to open the 1968 season.
- at UCF (Oct. 12): Cincinnati and UCF have seen four of their last five matchups be decided by 4 or fewer points.
   The two teams were the premier Group of 5 programs headed into the last wave of realignment with Cincinnati capturing AAC Championships and New Year's Six bowl

bids in 2020 and 2021 and UCF doing the same in 2017 and 2018

- Arizona State (Oct. 19): The Bearcats will host the Sun Devils for the first time ever in ASU's first season in the Big 12. UC picked up a 34-7 victory in Tempe, Ariz., in 1954, and a 14-0 win at Arizona State in 1976. The victory in 1954 (Nov. 6) marked legendary coach Sid Gillman's final victory as the Bearcats' head coach. He took over as the Los Angeles Rams coach in the NFL the next season.
- at Colorado (Oct. 26): Cincinnati's more-than-1,200-mile trip to Folsom Field in Boulder, Colo. will be its longest away trip of the season as the Bearcats will welcome the Buffaloes back to the Big 12, which they were in from 1996-2010
- West Virginia (Nov. 9): It will be the Mountaineers first trip back to Nippert Stadium since Isaiah Pead rushed for 175 yards and an injured Tony Pike split time at quarterback with Zach Collaros to lead Cincinnati to a 24-21 victory in 2009. The win kept UC a perfect 10-0 on the season.
- at Iowa State (Nov. 16): Cincinnati will make its first trip
  to Ames, Iowa to face the Cyclones in Jack Trice Stadium.
  The Bearcats' new defensive coordinator Tyson Veidt
  served as Iowa State's associate head coach/linebackers
  for the last eight seasons.
- at Kansas State (Nov. 23): Cincinnati travels to Manhattan, Kansas to face the Wildcats for the first time since 1996. UC picked up home-away sweeps over Kansas State in 1951-52 and 1965-66 before falling twice in 1995-96.
- TCU (Nov. 30): TCU (2022) and Cincinnati (2021) the
  last two current Big 12 teams to advance to the College
  Football Playoff will meet for the first time since
  three straight Conference USA matchups from 2002 to
  2004. The Bearcats' 36-29 overtime victory over TCU at
  Nippert Stadium in 2002 kicked off a home-opener win
  streak that continues to this day (22 straight).

### CORLEONE, DINGLE MAKE "FREAKS" LIST

- Redshirt junior defensive tackle Dontay Corleone and redshirt junior linebacker Jack Dingle were both mentioned in Bruce Feldman's annual "Freaks" list.
- It marked the second straight season that Corleone made the list and the fourth straight year that UC had multiple players mentioned.
- Excerpt about Corleone: "The Godfather is a rare talent.
  He's 6-1 and 330 pounds. He wears size 18 shoes and
  has size 11 hands. He benched 485 pounds but moves
  really well, clocking a 1.71-second 10-yard split and a
  2.81 20. He has topped out at 18.7 mph."
- Excerpt about Dingle: Jack Dingle is 6-3 1/2, 240-pounds and built like an Adonis, coaches say. He benched 395 pounds this offseason and did 26 reps at 225. He clocked a 1.54-second 10-yard split, hit 21.99 mph on the GPS and had a 4.21 pro agility shuttle to go with a 33-inch vertical and a 9-11 broad jump."

### ALL-AMERICA TRIO TO LEAD THE WAY IN 2024

- UC returned three All-Americans in 2024 with Luke Kandra (2023), Dontay Corleone (2022), and Mason Fletcher (2022).
- A preseason All-American (Walter Camp and ESPN)
   Kandra returns as the country's top-graded P4 right
   guard.
- Corleone, nicknamed "The Godfather", was an AP All-American in 2022 after ranking as PFF's highest-graded defensive player that year.
- Fletcher was the 2022 AAC Special Teams Player of the Year and a Ray Guy Award finalist after booting 14 punts of 50+ yards and ranking fourth in the nation with a 46.2 punting average. His 53.5 average in Week 1 was the best in the Big 12.

#### **GET TO KNOW THE BEARCATS**

• The University of Cincinnati Department of Athletics competes at the highest level of intercollegiate athletics with the vision to reach Next Level Success for all 18 varsity teams and more than 450 student-athletes. The Bearcats have a proud athletics history, winning eight national championships and 118 conference titles. The Cincinnati men's basketball team is among the 15 winningest programs all-time, while the football team became the first non-Power Five program to compete in the College Football Playoff in 2021. Olympic gold medalist volleyball player Jordan Thompson, NBA Hall of Famer Oscar Robertson and Major League Baseball legend Sandy Koufax are among several luminaries who

- have competed as Bearcats.
- The Bearcats entered a new era as a Power Five School on July 1, 2023 when they officially joined the Big 12 Conference, positioning Cincinnati among the nation's premier athletics programs.
- Off the field, UC student-athletes continue to find success, collectively posting a 3.4 GPA in spring 2023 with 78% earning spots on the Honor Roll.
- Under the leadership of Director of Athletics John Cunningham, and supported by more than 150 full-time staff members, UC Athletics' mission is to connect our community, enhance our university and impact the lives of student-athletes as they prepare to change the world on and off the field.

#### AN ELITE PROGRAM BY THE NUMBERS

- UC has positioned itself as one of the most successful programs in the country over the last several years.
- Cincinnati is 56-20 since the start of the 2018 season, which ranks ninth among FBS programs and is the best record among current Big 12 programs during that span.
- Cincinnati boasts an 89-50 record since the start
  of the 2013 season and has won three conference
  championships while advancing to eight bowl games.
   Two of its eight bowl trips have been to New Year's Six
  bowls: 2021 Peach Bowl and the 2021 Cotton Bowl
  Classic (CFP Semifinal).
- The Bearcats became the first-ever "Group of Five" team to advance to the College Football Playoff in 2021, defeating No. 9 Notre Dame on the road and finishing undefeated in the regular season along the way.
- Since 2009 (last 15 years) the Bearcats rank 17th in FBS with a 125-65 (.658) record and rank third among current Big 12 teams behind Oklahoma State (139-56) and TCU (128-63). They have won seven conference titles during that time, a number only matched by Alabama (9)
   Clemson (8) and Oklahoma (8).
- Cincinnati (2021) was one of just 15 teams to make the College Football Playoff in the four-team era (2014-23) and one of just two current Big 12 teams (TCU, 2022) to make it. UC was the only non-Power Five program to ever earn a CFP berth in the four-team format.

#### **CFP+MF4 APPEARANCE**

- Cincinnati is one of 11 schools and the only Big 12 institution - to have a Men's Final Four and College Football Playoff appearance in it's athletic history.
- Cincinnati became the first non-Power 5 team to make the College Football Playoff after finishing as the nation's only undefeated team in 2021 and has advanced to six Men's Final Fours.

#### **BEARCATS FIND NFL SUCCESS**

- Cincinnati has seen 16 Bearcats drafted since the start of 2021 — second-most in the Big 12 in that time span. The list includes Ahmad "Sauce" Gardner, who was selected fourth overall by the New York Jets in 2022 and went on to earn All-Pro and NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year honors.
- While Gardner took the NFL by storm as a rookie, Travis and Jason Kelce turned in dominant seasons once again.
   The brothers, who both starred for the Bearcats more than a decade ago, each earned All-Pro and faced off in Super Bowl LVIII. The Kansas City Chiefs won the league crown and Travis Kelce was joined by fellow Bearcat

Bryan Cook, a rookie safety.

### KELCE BROTHERS BRING NEW HEIGHTS TO FIFTH THIRD ARENA

- NFL superstars and former Bearcats Travis and Jason Kelce returned to campus on April 11 for a live episode of their podcast, New Heights.
- In front of more than 12,000 fans at Fifth Third Arena, the Kelces entertained for nearly four hours and gave attendees a night they'll never forget.
- The event began with the first-ever edition of the "Lombaby Games", which pitted UC student-athletes against traditional students in a series of mental and physical challenges.
- Following the games, Travis and Jason welcomed special guests Desmond Ridder, Orlando Brown Jr., and Joe Burrow to share stories and plenty of laughs that kept the crowd engaged all night.
- The climax of the event came near the end, when director of athletics John Cunningham held a surprise commencement ceremony for Travis and Jason, who were not able to walk at their own graduation.
- The event had a seismic impact on social media, generating over 14 million impressions and over one million engagements. The final post of the night from the surprise commencement ceremony was the topperforming social media post in UC athletics history, and the top-performing post by any Big 12 main athletics Instagram account since 2021.

### INDOOR PRACTICE FACILITY COMING IN 2025

- On Aug. 16, the final steel beam was installed at Cincinnati's Indoor Practice Facility, which is set to be completed in Spring 2025.
- Spearheaded by Larry and Rhonda Sheakley's transformational giving and leadership, the new state-ofthe art facilities will elevate the Cincinnati student-athlete experience, giving Bearcats an unrivaled advantage on the playing field and on the recruiting trail.
- The 84,000 square-foot Indoor Practice Facility features a 120-yard football field equipped for multiple sports.
   The field will provide an all-weather home for Cincinnati football practices and year-round workouts and have direct access to the Performance Center's weight room, training room and performance nutrition fueling stations.
- The 96,000 square-foot Performance Center features three levels that will provide nearly everything a studentathlete needs to get competition and practice ready in one place, including offices for the football program.

#### **TAKE ME TO HIGHER GROUND**

- For the past 26 years, the UC football has called the Higher Ground Conference and Retreat Center in West Harrison, Ind., its preseason training home.
- The 280-acre facility is located about 30 miles from campus and has served as the Bearcats training camp location since the lead up to the 1999 season.
- Higher Ground has two 100-yard turf practice fields, including a new surface installed in 2017, ample living and meeting spaces and no distractions from football.

#### **CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY**


- UC won the 2021 and 2020 AAC Championships, its 15th and 16th league titles, for its first two since 2014 and first outright crowns since 2009.
- UC played in its third-straight AAC title game in 2021.
- Each of the last two were played at Nippert Stadium. UC toppled No. 16 Houston in 2021 after defeating No. 23 Tulsa on Cole Smith's game-ending 34-yard field goal. That first game, played on Saturday, Dec. 19 at Nippert Stadium, marked the latest date a game was played in Nippert since a matchup vs. Xavier on Dec. 7, 1918.

#### NIPPERT STADIUM DEDICATION 100TH ANNIVERSARY

Cincinnati Athletics will commemorate the 100-year anniversary of the dedication of Nippert Stadium during the entire 2024 football season, celebrating the life of stadium namesake Jimmy Nippert as the Bearcats' season-long theme. The celebration will take center stage Nov. 9, 2024 when the Bearcats face former BIG EAST rival West Virginia on Carson Field.

UC debuted a memorial shield this summer, which will be featured throughout the 2024 season. More information about the logo can be found on the graphic to the left.

Nippert was a center and captain on the 1923 football team when he sustained an injury on Thanksgiving Day against rival Miami (OH). He fell ill with blood poisoning and died on Christmas Day. Nippert's grandfather—James N. Gamble, son of the Procter & Gamble co-founder——donated \$250,000 for the completion of the stadium.

Nippert Stadium was officially dedicated on Nov. 8, 1924 before kickoff of a game against Oberlin. Members of the Nippert family joined UC staff, players from both teams, and representatives from universities in the region in a ceremony at the memorial in the south end of the stadium.

Nippert Stadium stands as the centerpiece of the University of Cincinnati's campus. Through several renovations, the stadium has modernized to feature suite levels and a press box in addition to premium seating. It now seats just under 40,000 fans, but remains in the middle of campus, adjacent to the Tangeman University Center. Nippert Stadium's turf is open to all students for recreation when not in use by the football or lacrosse teams for practices or games.

Various football season graphic elements and marketing materials, including season tickets, will incorporate throwback designs that pay homage to Jimmy Nippert and celebrate the stadium's rich history.

### **COMING IN SPRING 2025: INDOOR PRACTICE FACILITY & PERFORMANCE CENTER**

Spearheaded by Larry and Rhonda Sheakley's transformational giving and leadership, the new state-of-the art facilities will elevate the Cincinnati studentathlete experience, giving Bearcats an unrivaled advantage on the playing field and on the recruiting trail.

The 84,000 square-foot Indoor Practice Facility features a 120-yard football field equipped for multiple sports. The field will provide an all-weather home for Cincinnati football practices and year-round workouts and have direct access to the Performance Center's weight room, training room and performance nutrition fueling stations.

The field will feature WiFi access and a remote-operated camera system for football as well as a scoreboard, state-of-the-art sound system and a built-in Catapult technology system.

The 96,000 square-foot Performance Center features three levels that will provide nearly everything a student-athlete needs to get competition and practice ready in one place:

- Offices for football program
- Performance nutrition station for all sports
- Fueling station for football
- Sports performance weight room
- Athletic training room
- Multiple recovery spaces
- Mental health services
- Equipment room
- Creative suite



#### CARSON FIELD AT NIPPERT STADIUM

Carson Field at Nippert Stadium has been the venerable home of the University of Cincinnati football team since 1901 and provides a phenomenal home-field environment.

#### HARD TICKET TO COME BY

- · In 2021, UC set a record with just over 22,000 season tickets sold, which has been broken in consecutive seasons.
- · The Bearcats sold out 18 straight home games from 2021-23.

#### A MODERN CLASSIC

- · In 1915, construction was completed on the first sections of a brick and concrete structure to replace the wooden stands and continued for several seasons as funds were raised.
- · In 1924, the completed structure was dedicated as James Gamble Nippert Memorial Stadium with a capacity of 12,000.
- UC has used the Nippert site as a playing surface since 1901, making it the second-oldest playing site in the nation for college football behind Penn's Franklin Field (1895).
- · UC went from having nearly no premium seating options to the addition of 1,100 scholarship club seats and 53 indoor and outdoor suites of varying sizes. A skywalk connects Tangeman University Center to the West Pavilion with premium area customers able to access the facility on gameday from the other side of campus.

#### TQL PARTNERSHIP BOLSTERS NIPPERT **STADIUM**

· Total Quality Logistics (TQL), the secondlargest freight brokerage firm in North America and Cincinnati's largest private company, and UC announced in January 2023 a long-term strategic partnership that will include field level and stadium signage and logo assets for TQL as well as specific investment to the Bearcats' indoor practice and performance facility project.

#### WHAT'S IN A NAME?

- During the season-ending clash with rival Miami (OH) in 1923, Jimmy Nippert sustained a spike wound injury and died a month later from blood poisoning.
- His grandfather, James N. Gamble of Procter and Gamble, provided the funds needed to complete the horseshoe-shaped structure, and the James Gamble Nippert Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Nov. 8,
- The stadium's founder was Arch Carson, who as captain and principal organizer played a significant role in starting football on the UC campus in 1885. In 1901 as physical director of the university, Carson guided the construction of the field which was later named for him
  - -- the playing surface is still called Carson Field.
- · TQL's logo will appear on Carson Field in two
- While field surface branding typically results in renaming the venue, as a Cincinnati company, TQL has chosen to not name the field. It will continue to be named Carson Field in honor of Dr. Arch Carson, who organized the first football team at the university in 1885 and is known as the Father of UC Football.

### **HEAD COACH SCOTT SATTERFIELD | SECOND SEASON**

2018 SUN BELT AND 2019 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR

Cincinnati head coach Scott Satterfield heads into his second season at the helm of the Bearcats, primed to elevate the program following the inaugural season in the Big 12 in 2023.

Hired by Cincinnati Director of Athletics John Cunningham on Dec. 5, 2022 as the 43rd head football coach at Cincinnati, Satterfield has compiled a 81-58 record (.583) in 12 years as a head coach with the Bearcats, Louisville Cardinals and Appalachian State Mountaineers.

He has earned a winning mark in seven seasons in addition to a 4-1 record in bowl games. He led the Mountaineers to three straight conference titles and four bowl appearances from 2013 to 2018 before taking over the Cardinals in 2019.

Satterfield steered the Bearcats' transition from the American Athletic Conference to the Big 12 in his first season at UC in 2023. Cincinnati's offense had 11 brand new starters for the 2023 season opener, returned only one scholarship wide receiver and featured 23 college transfers. Despite all of the turnover, the Bearcats still finished fifth in the country in rushing (217.1 ypg) and 33rd in total offense (426.1), and running back Corey Kiner authored just the 20th 1,000-yard rushing season in school history.

Right guard Luke Kandra collected All-America honors from the Associated Press and Walter Camp, while six other Bearcats grabbed all-conference honors.

In Satterfield's 11 seasons as an FBS head coach at Appalachian State, Louisville and Cincinnati, his teams have rushed for an average of 200 yards per game and finished among the nation's Top 30 rushing teams every season.

Additionally, Satterfield's offenses have been among the nation's most balanced, averaging both 200 yards passing and rushing every

Prior to coming to UC, Satterfield led Louisville to three bowls in four seasons. He lifted the Cardinals up from a 2-10 campaign in 2018 to an 8-5 record in his first season in 2019.

While at Louisville, he compiled a 25-24 record and saw 32 players collect All-ACC honors. Six Cardinals were selected in the NFL Draft during Satterfield's tenure as well.

In 2022, Satterfield led Louisville to a 7-5 mark and saw 13 players collect all-conference accolades. The Cardinals appeared in the College Football Playoff Rankings and beat two Top-25 teams. Louisville led the nation in total sacks (50), finished third in takeaways (30) and ranked 11th nationally and tops in the ACC in scoring defense (19.2).

The 2021 Louisville squad was led by a potent offense that averaged 31.6 points per game and ranked 21st nationally with 446.2 yards of total offense per game. Cunningham proved to be one of the country's top dual-threat quarterbacks, rushing for 1,031 yards and an ACC-leading 20 touchdowns while passing for 2.940 yards and another 19 scores.

Louisville was also explosive in 2020, leading the nation with nine plays of 60+ yards and six plays of more than 70 yards while ranking fifth in the ACC in total offense (444.2).

In 2019, Satterfield guided Louisville to the biggest turnaround in college football, increasing the Cardinals' win total by six and vaulting UofL to the Top 25 in total offense and rushing in his first year, Individually, Javian Hawkins broke the school record for rushing yards (1,525) by a running back, while wide receiver Tutu Atwell set the Louisville record for receiving yards (1,276) and tied the school mark with 12 TD catches.

Satterfield guided his alma mater to three consecutive Sun Belt Conference Championships and an impressive 51-24 record from 2013 to 2018. The Mountaineers held a 38-10 conference mark over six seasons. including a 34-6 record over five seasons in the Sun Belt.

Along the way, he became the first coach to lead a school from the FCS level to FBS and immediately earn three consecutive bowl wins. Satterfield directed Appalachian State to three straight conference titles and led the program to four straight bowl appearances.

In 2018, Satterfield led Appalachian State to a 10-2 record and an in-season ranking of No. 25 in the AP poll, capping the season with



a 30-19 victory over Louisiana to give the Mountaineers a win in the first-ever Sun Belt Conference Championship Game, securing a thirdstraight league title.

In 2017, during a 9-4 season that included a 7-1 run through the Sun Belt, the Mountaineers ranked among the Top 20 teams nationally in several categories, including No. 2 in fewest sacks allowed (eight).

The Mountaineers dominated both sides of the ball in 2016, finishing with a 7-1 league mark while allowing just 94 total points in eight Sun Belt aames. App State led the league in scoring defense (17.0 ppg), total defense (326.0 ypg), rushing offense (245.6 ypg), turnover margin (+8) and time of possession (33:25).

The 2015 season saw the Mountaineers finish 11-2--the 11 wins marking the highest total ever by an FBS program in its first season of bowl eligibility. App State completed the transition from the FCS to FBS by ranking among the Sun Belt's top two in 19 statistical categories and defeating Ohio, 31-29, in its first-ever bowl game, the Camellia Bowl in Montgomery, Ala. The 2015 campaign came on the heels of a breakout season in 2014, when Satterfield led the Mountaineers to an impressive 7-5 record in their first full season in the FBS ranks.

Satterfield helped Appalachian State win three consecutive FCS national championships in 2005, 2006 and 2007 as the quarterbacks coach and primary play-caller.

Among his many highlights as an assistant in Boone, N.C., he mentored two-time Walter Payton Player of the Year and FCS All-American Armanti Edwards. He helped lead the Mountaineers to the historic 34-32 upset at No. 5 Michigan to open the 2007 season.

Overall, he won six conference championships as an assistant and two as a player.

Satterfield started 27 games at quarterback for Spp State. He collected first-team all-conference honors in 1995 after passing for 1,461 vards and rushing for 649 more to help lead the Mountaineers to the only undefeated, untied regular season (11-0) in school history and a 12-1 final record. He graduated with a degree in physical education in 1996.

He was an assistant coach at App State, beginning as the wide receivers coach in 1998. He moved to running backs from 1999 to 2002. From 2003 to 2008 he coached guarterbacks, including calling plays from 2004 to 2008 and serving as an integral part of the Mountaineers' transition from Power-I to spread offense in 2004.

After a one-year stint as the passing game coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Toledo in 2009 and a two-year tenure at FIU as the offensive coordinator and auarterbacks coach. Satterfield returned to coordinate the offense and coach QBs in 2012.

Satterfield and his wife, Beth, a former track and field athlete athlete at Appalachian State, have a daughter, Alli, and two sons, Bryce and
