THE RUNDOWN

Cincinnati never trailed, led by as much as 23 in the first half, then weathered an ECU comeback for an 87-69 victory on Sunday, its third in a row to start the season. UC is averaging 84.7 ppg, its best over a three-game span since November 2017. UC so far is also averaging 23.3 free-throw attempts a game, up from 18.0 last season. The squad's +15.0 rebound margin comes after -0.3 last year, with the 51 boards against ECU serving as UC's most since Nov. 15, 2019.

David DeJulius earned his first AAC Player of the Week honor after leading the Bearcats in scoring (21.3 ppg), three-point shooting (78 percent), assists (11) and steals (6). The grad student, with 948 collegiate points, has had four 20-point games out of his last six dating back to last year and 12 since the 2021-22 season. Landers Nolley II also added 14 points (7-for-8 from foul line) with three assists, and he is second with 16.3 ppg while shooting 62 percent from inside the arc.

The bench has been a valuable asset this young season, and two new faces emerged Sunday in second-year members Jarrett Hensley (UC career-highs of 11 points, two blocks and 20 minutes) and Ody Oguama (matched career-high 12 rebounds). Oguama's clip made him one of four Bearcats since 2010-11 to record 12-plus boards off the bench. Hensley in particular, as well as freshman Dan Skillings Jr. and fifth-year senior Rob Phinisee, among others, will have heavier responsibilities to come as defensive star John Newman III faces an extensive injury stay.

CINCINNATI TRADITION

Cincinnati, ranked the No. 9 basketball program all-time by CBS' Matt Norlander in 2019, boasts 1,866 all-time wins, good for No. 12 nationally (both entering the season). The Bearcats have produced 32 All-Americans (last: Jarron Cumberland's Honorable Mention in 2019), 86 All-Conference selections, 57 NBA Draft picks (last: Jacob Evans III in 2018) and 54 members of the 1,000-Point Club. The program has spent 434 weeks Ranked in the AP Top 25, 212 in the Top 10 and 45 at No. 1. Jack Twyman and Oscar Robertson are both members of the Basketball Hall of Fame, with Robertson earning a spot on the NBA's 75th-Anniversary Team last fall.

SCOUTING THE BEARCATS

BIG 12-BOUND

Cincinnati in September was announced as one of four new members of the Big 12 Conference. It will join AAC mates Houston and UCF, as well as BYU, for the 2023-24 season.

DAVID DEJULIUS: ALL-AAC

DeJulius, named to the league's Third Team and picked to this year's Second-Team, led the Bearcats in scoring (14.5 ppg) and free-throw percentage (82.4 percent, sixth in the AAC), energizing the team on both ends of the floor. The Detroit native produced 10, 20-point games, including seven against AAC foes.

The most-notable element of DeJulius' season has been his improvements from last year, namely his improvements in field-goal percentage (4.9 percent), three-pointers (9.4 percent), free-throws (4.9 percent) and scoring (5.4 ppg).

YOUNG, WILD AND FREE

Head coach Wes Miller is the nation's winningest coach under 40.

In fact, Miller already has the most Division I wins of any active coach by their 40th birthday, which he will celebrate Jan. 28.

GUARDS ARE HIS FORTE

Wes Miller is one of three active head coaches in Division I to have been at the helm for 10-plus seasons while coaching an All-Conference guard in every season.

BRINGING IN WINNERS

Out of the three transfers, all fifth-years, that Cincinnati signed this offseason, all of them have proven track records of success and NCAA Tourney appearances.

Rob Phinisee, an Indiana captain, helped Indiana go 72-57 and make the NCAA Tournament last season, Mike Woodson's first at the school.

Landers Nolley II helped Memphis to a 42-19 ledger over two years, grabbing NIT Most Outstanding Player honors in 2021 as the Tigers claimed the title, then helping Memphis to nearly knocking off No. 1 Gonzaga in last year's NCAA Second Round.

Kalu Ezikpe was also a captain at Old Dominion, helping the Monarchs to a 67-55 record and the 2019 Conference USA title. He improved his scoring, rebounding and minutes in each year of his career.

EYE-OPENING DEBUTS

Three new faces made quite the impression in the team's season-opening win over Chaminade, leading off with Dan Skillings Jr.'s jump-shot block and ensuing fastbreak dunk for his first collegiate points.

Nolley made his first three shots and assisted on a triple, accounting for 11 of the team's first 16 points. His 19 were the most by a Bearcat in their debut since Sean Kilpatrick's 21 against Mt. St. Mary's in 2010. To take it back even further, Nolley's career-high was 30 points for Virginia Tech at Clemson (and John Newman III) to open the 2019-20 season.

Rob Phinisee's eight assists (off the bench) were the most for UC since Mike Saunders Jr. against ECU on Jan. 12, 2022. It also tied his career-high, set twice before against Marquette and UC Davis in the first six games of his career at Indiana in 2018.

YOU CAN CALL HIM "CHEZ"

Those listening to Wes Miller interviews will often hear him refer to Landers Nolley as "Chez." That is a nickname that has followed Nolley since high school and relates to his middle name being Sanchez.

LAKHIN EARNS FIRST-CAREER START

Viktor Lakhin, a former AAC Freshman of the Week last December, earned his first start after 29 reserve appearances (10.9 mpg) last season. He finished 3-for-3 from the field with a team-high six rebounds.

Lakhin's torn left meniscus sidelined him the whole 2020-21 season, his first in the States. He has said the academics weren't overly difficult, but it was a matter of translating to English. Lakhin credits (current Boston College guard) Mason Madsen and Mika Adams-Woods with getting him out of his shell and even said Landers Nolley is his favorite part of the UC program, based on his "always pushing me to do better when I am being sloppy and fighting over the training room table."

LAKHIN'S CAREER NIGHT BEATS CSU

Viktor Lakhin picked up where he left off in his first-career start, notching career-highs of 14 points, 12 rebounds and three blocks in a 69-58 win over Cleveland State. It was his second-career double-double, also coming against NCAA Tourney team Bryant (13 points, 11 rebounds) last season.

DEJULIUS GETS FIRST POTW HONOR

David DeJulius led UC in scoring (21.3 ppg), three-point shooting (78 percent), assists (11) and steals (6) as the Bearcats went 3-0 on Opening Week. It was his first-such award after claiming six AAC Honor Roll nods over the previous two years, as well as the first under Wes Miller. Lakhin was also a Freshman of the Week in December 2021.

NOLLEY SAYS "ALOHA!"

Landers Nolley II has achieved the rare status of being a repeat visitor to the Maui Invitational, and he has quite the resume and experiences to boot.

As a redshirt-freshman (2019-20) at Virginia Tech, Nolley averaged 19.7 points and 5.7 rebounds per game to earn All-Maui Invitational honors. His 22 points in the opening win over No. 3 Michigan State included a trey in the final minute that made it a four-point lead.

HENSLEY, NEWMAN FOLLOW MILLER

Jarrett Hensley played his freshman season at UNCG under Wes Miller, while John Newman III was

committed as a transfer before ultimately following Miller to the Queen City.

ABDUL ADO JOINS STAFF

One year with Wes Miller was all Abdul Ado needed to make enough of an impression to earn a GA spot the following season. Ado, a former four-year starter at Mississippi State and All-SEC defender, played throughout injury all season and provided invaluable veteran leadership through his experience and positive mindset.

His mother, who runs a restaurant in Nigeria, would wake up in the middle of the night to watch his game broadcasts live.

KALU THE ARTIST

Graduate transfer forward Kalu Ezikpe boasts an incredible knack for drawing and painting. This past season, he designed shoes that his Old Dominion coach, Jeff Jones, wore for their annual Coaches vs. Cancer game. Ezikpe's emphasis is on Japanese anime style, and he hopes to one day produce his own animated show.

EZIKPE'S UNCONVENTIONAL PATH

Kalu Ezikpe had his fair share of offers out of high school, ultimately choosing a strong Old Dominion Monarchs' program.

Ezikpe was cut from his eighth-grade middle school team and asked his parents for a basketball goal from Walmart. The rest has been history.

Ezikpe is also an accomplished artist, first realizing his skill in kindergarten. His speciality is Japanese anime (drawing and painting), and he even designed shoes for ODU coach Jeff Jones to wear in the team's Suits and Sneakers game last season.

TOLENTINO THE TALLEST

Freshman Sage Tolentino's 7-foot-1 stature matches him for the tallest player in program history. Others include Hayden Koval last year, Chris Vogt (2019-21) and David Nyarsuk (2012-14). Tolentino, however, is the only one to start his career with the Bearcats and was originally an Auburn commit.

WHAT WRIST?

Jarrett Hensley had the most fascinating season's end of anyone on the team, and yet it wasn't realized till it was all over. He broke a bone in his right (non-shooting) hand during the team's penultimate regular-season game at Houston (March 1), but shook it off and played his most inspired ball over the final three contests.

He drove and posterized a defender with a dunk at SMU (out of a season-high 20 minutes), then collected season-highs of seven points and three assists in a first-round AAC win over ECU.

"Jarrett Hensley might work as hard in all facets of development as any player I've ever coached," Miller told The Athletic. "For a couple years I kept saying he's the hardest-working freshman I've ever seen, then the hardest-working sophomore. This will be Year 3, and I've never had a player who is more committed than Jarrett Hensley day to day."

HENSLEY GOES TO SPAIN

Jarrett Hensley got the trip of a lifetime when he competed with USA East Coast, a collegiate all-star team, August in Spain. The team spent two days training at Columbia University before flying out for a three-game series that emulated the 30th anniversary of the Dream Team's run there.

Hensley's teammates ranged from Cal State Northridge to Duke and Providence, with Utah Jazz assistant Alex Jensen serving as the head coach. Hensley totaled 20 points, nine rebounds, four assists and one steal in 35 minutes over the three games.

"Coach Miller and I had an end-of-the-year meeting like how he does with every player," Hensley said. "He brought it up to me about an opportunity to play in Spain, and I was really interested. I knew immediately it would be a good opportunity to play against grown men and meet new people as well to connect with. I was real excited. Shoutout to him for that."

CAPTAIN CLUTCH

DeJulius knocked down the team's only buzzer-beating shot of the season on Feb. 1 at ECU. Trailing by one, he secured an offensive rebound off his own missed runner, dribbled once and rolled one around the rim and in for a 60-59 lead with 3.7 seconds left. ECU, with no timeouts left, missed a contested three from the wing.

DeJulius, against Houston at home last season, became the sixth Bearcat to be perfect on 12 or more free-throw attempts. It was the best showing since Sean Kilpatrick (school-record 16-for-16) against Iowa State in 2012.

PHINISEE THE PHINISHER

You can't talk "clutch" without also mentioning Indiana transfer Rob Phinisee. His buzzer-beating triple in Gainbridge Fieldhouse defeated Butler as a freshman, and twice in his career he had 20 and 18 points in wins over the No. 4 team in the country.

His career-high 20 against Purdue last season was one of his three double-figure scoring games in his final year as a Hoosier, while his 18 at Iowa in the 2020-21 campaign also served as a season-high.

SHOEY'S STABILITY

Mika Adams-Woods has had the nickname "Shoey" since his AAU days, when he was described as keeping the ball on a string and taking opponents' shoelaces.

He and Jeremiah Davenport are the only four-year members of the program, and he has started 66 of 83 games played. Adams-Woods had a 2.81 assist-turnover ratio last season, which ranked 15th nationally and second in the AAC. It was the highest clip since Troy Caupain (3.36 and fifth) in 2016-17. Shoey also had three turnovers over his final seven games, 190 minutes in all.

GREETINGS FROM THE GRANITE STATE

Four different members of the program are alumni of New Hampton Prep in New Hampshire, starting with Wes Miller and assistant coach Mike Roberts, who were teammates for two seasons.

Syracuse native Mika Adams-Woods, previously recruited strongly by Miller and Co. at UNC Greensboro, played a season there as well, in addition to

first-year graduate assistant Malik Massey, a four-year letterwinner for Miller at UNCG.

MONSTER FACTORY LEGACY

Mike Rehfeldt, UC's Associate Athletic Director for Sports Performance, has become a beacon within the men's basketball program. He first served the Bearcats from 2012-20 before joining Miller's inaugural staff after a one-year stint at UConn.

Rehfeldt's cutting-edge investments go beyond the plates and into the technology realm. He also helped hire Dillon Frees, the athletics department's first-ever Director of Sports Nutrition.

Notable performers on this year's roster include:

- Rob Phinisee with the fastest 3/4 court sprint time (3.01)
- Jarrett Hensley with the highest max touch (12 feet, 1.5 inches)
- Viktor Lakhin decreasing his body fat by 3.5 percent from last year
- Daniel Skillings adding 15 lbs to his frame since stepping on campus

ALL IN THE FAMILY

Davenport is one of four siblings in his family to play collegiate basketball. His mother played at Morehead State, while his brothers Michael (St. Bonaventure), Joshua (Winthrop) and sister Naomi (West Virginia) all played at the Division I level.

PUBLISHED AUTHOR

Few coaches, or anyone in particular, can say they published a book while in school. Wes Miller authored "The Road to Blue Heaven," a diary of his senior season as a Tar Heel.

ROBERTS, MORGAN RECOGNIZED

Assistant coaches Mike Roberts and Andre Morgan were selected to participate in the TopConnect Basketball Virtual Symposium in June, a prestigious program that provides the nation's top assistant coaches with leadership development and networking opportunities.

DAVENPORT CHASING IK

Jeremiah Davenport enters the season with 734 points for his hometown Bearcats, seeking to become the school's 55th member of the club. The last entry was Keith Williams (1,156 from 2017-21), whom Davenport played with his first two years.

In fact, Davenport ranks high in the AAC for most points at his current school. Numbers are preseason and will be updated weekly.

FALL TOUR OF THE BUCKEYE STATE

DOLLAR PROMOTED

Second-year UC coach Chad Dollar earned a promotion this fall to associate head coach. Dollar has built a national reputation at the highest levels of the game.

"He's been the guy whose counsel and advice has really helped me and part of it was, he's earned it," Miller said. "I want him to have the confidence to know that I want him to speak up more, whether it's with our players, whether it's on the court, whether it's in the locker room, or whether it's in staff meetings, or whether it's opening my door, when I need to hear something that maybe I don't want to hear, I want him to know that I have the confidence and I'm putting him in a role that I expected to do that."

BEST GPA IN PROGRAM HISTORY

The Fall 2021 semester saw UC post a 3.484 GPA, its highest ever. All 15 players earned Honor Roll accolades for earning a 3.0, while nine more made the Dean's List with a 3.4 or higher (Mika Adams-Woods, Abdul Ado, Rob Banks, Jarrett Hensley, Hayden Koval, Mason Madsen, Sam Martin, Ody Oguama, Mike Saunders Jr.).

MADE IT RAIN IN FEDEXFORUM

UC's 16-for-30 showing from deep on Jan. 9, 2022 at Memphis tied a FedExForum collegiate team record, as well as tying for fourth in school history. Combined with 11 threes the previous Thursday against SMU, it marked the team's most makes in a two-game stretch since Dec. 21-23, 2011. Jeremiah Davenport made his first seven attempts, the most by a Bearcat since Sean Kilpatrick in 2012.

RULING THE AAC

- » UC has won more AAC games (114) than any other league member since the conference formed prior to the 2013-14 campaign.
- » The UC men's basketball program has been a member of nine leagues (not including three stints as an independent) during its 121-year history. The Bearcats have 100 or more conference wins in two other leagues: 128 in the Missouri Valley Conference (1957-58 through 1969-70) and 123 in Conference USA (1995-96 through 2004-05).
- » Cincinnati has claimed three AAC regular-season crowns (2014, 2018, 2020) and two AAC Tournament titles (2018, 2019).

THREE-POINT LEADERS (SINCE 2011-12)

Jeremiah Davenport last season had the most threes by a Bearcat since Sean Kilpatrick in 2014, the year he claimed the AAC's inaugural Player of the Year award. The full UC record book features seven players with 90 or more.

LAST TIME OUT

CINCINNATI - Led by 22 points from senior guard David DeJulius, five Bearcats scored in double figures, including 11 points from junior forward Jarrett Hensley off the bench, as the Cincinnati men's basketball team defeated Eastern Kentucky, 87-69, on Sunday at Fifth Third Arena.

Joining DeJulius and Hensley in double figures were junior forward Jeremiah Davenport (19 points), senior wing Landers Nolley II (14 points) and senior guard Mika Adams-Woods (11 points).

The Bearcats dominated the glass in the game, holding a 51-35 edge on the boards. Senior forward Ody Oguama registered a career-best-matching 12 boards in just 17 minutes off the bench.

UC led by as many as 23 in the first half thanks to red-hot shooting from Davenport (14 points before the break), but ECU fought back in the second half, using a full-court press and 3-point barrage to bring its deficit within 5, 57-52, on Michael Moreno's second triple in a two-minute stretch with 13:55 left in the game.

UC answered the 13-2 Colonels' run with a DeJulius 3-pointer and big plays by Hensley to extend the Bearcats' lead back to double figures. A layup, free throws and block from the junior combo forward gave Cincinnati a 66-55 lead at the 10-minute mark.

Eastern Kentucky cut the deficit to 6 with six minutes left, but Davenport buried his third 3-pointer of the game on the other end.

The Colonels wouldn't quit, though. Cooper Robb answered back with a 3 of his own as UC led 73-67 with 5:31 left.

A DeJulius jumper extended the UC lead to 75-67 with four minutes left, and a Viktor Lakhin dunk pushed the advantage to 10.

Lakhin's behind-the-back pass to DeJulius for a layup in the closing seconds made the score to 87-69 and provided an exclamation point on the win.

The Bearcats held a 29-16 advantage on the boards in the first half, scoring 19 second-chance points en route to a 49-34 lead at the break.

Cincinnati jumped out to a 8-0 lead two minutes into the game as ECU missed its first four shots and Davenport made a putback and buried a 3-pointer.

After Eastern Kentucky cut its deficit to 1, 8-7, a long DeJulius 2-pointer sparked a 15-1 Bearcats' run.

Nolley made back-to-back buckets, drilling a trey and a turnaround jumper, while Hensley added a putback and DeJulius buried a triple from the top of the key following another offensive rebound as UC held a commanding 22-8 lead at 12:04 on the strength of 11 second-chance points.

The Bearcats continued to use rebounding and timely 3-pointers to control the first half. UC took a 36-15 lead at 6:44 on a 9-0 run thanks to three consecutive treys from DeJulius, Davenport and Adams-Woods. UC led by as many as 23 in the first half, 38-15, six minutes before the intermission.

EKU made a run on the end of the half, however, but the Bearcats held a 15-point lead at halftime.

CINCINNATI HEAD COACH WES MILLER

Wes Miller was named the 28th University of Cincinnati men's basketball head coach on April 14, 2021 after a decade as the head coach at UNC Greensboro.

The 2021-22 season saw Miller become the first UC coach to start his tenure 5-0, and the fifth win was a 71-51 dismantling of No. 14 Illinois in Kansas City. It marked the Bearcats' largest margin-of-victory over a ranked opponent since 2011. David DeJulius earned Third-Team All-AAC honors as well. The team improved in many categories following its 12-11 campaign the year before, including its national rankings in turnovers per game (27 from 267) and field-goal defense (35 from 186) among many others. Not only that, UC set a program record in the fall semester with a 3.484 GPA, seeing nine student-athletes earn Dean's List accolades as well.

"I am incredibly excited to welcome Wes into the Bearcats family," Cunningham said upon Miller's hiring. "He is an extremely dynamic coach and mentor who impressed me with his drive, focus and attention to detail. He's a proven winner as a head coach and was able to rebuild a program and lead a remarkable turnaround at UNCG over the last decade. We cast a very wide net in this search and Wes emerged as the right coach to lead the Bearcats into the future."

Regarded as one of the top young coaches in college basketball, Miller built UNC Greensboro into perennial championship and NCAA Tournament contenders, was named as ESPN.com's No. 1 Coach Under 40 in May 2020 and also was tabbed for The Athletic's 40 Under 40 list a year ago. His 185-career wins coming into the 2021-22 season also put him in the national lead for coaches under 40, ahead of LSU's Will Wade (177) and New Mexico's Richard Pitino (159).

"I'm absolutely thrilled to be the head coach at the University of Cincinnati," Miller said. "I'm thankful for President Pinto and (AD) John Cunningham for bringing me into the Bearcats family. I am honored to lead such a storied program and excited to get to work. I also can't thank UNCG enough because I wouldn't be here without my players and athletic director Kim Record. This last decade coaching the Spartans has been extremely rewarding."

Miller's collegiate head coach and mentor Roy Williams had high praise for his former player.

"Wes Miller is one of the most outstanding young coaches in our game and what he did at UNC Greensboro makes me believe he is THE most outstanding," Williams said. "As a player at North Carolina he came closer to reaching his full potential than any player I've ever coached. His energy, his determination, his intelligence and his care for young people convinces me that he will continue at that level. I am so happy for him and the University of Cincinnati Basketball program and I look

forward to being in the stands!"

AT UNCG

- The Spartans all-time winningest head coach, Miller totaled 185 wins in 10 seasons with four Southern Conference Regular-Season Championships. Over the last five years, UNCG has five-straight 20-win seasons, two NCAA Tournament appearances, two NIT appearances, two Southern Conference Tournament Championships, 125 wins and 70-20 record in conference play.
- UNCG won 21 games during the 2020-21 season along with the SoCon regular season and tournament championship and earned its second NCAA Tournament appearance in four years.
- The Spartans won 20 or more games in each of the last five seasons, including a program record 29 in 2018-19. Miller led UNCG to NCAA Tournament appearances in 2017-18 and 2020-21.

AS AN ASSISTANT COACH

- Miller, who also spent the 2010-11 season as an assistant coach at UNCG, also spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Elon and High Point. Miller also ran his own basketball camps in Charlotte and Greensboro for two summers.

PLAYING DAYS

- In three seasons as a player at North Carolina under Coach Williams, Miller helped the Tar Heels to the national championship in 2005, two Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season championships and one ACC Tournament title.
- He was team captain as a senior in 2006-07, leading UNC to 31 wins and the NCAA Elite 8 as well as the ACC regular-season and tournament titles, and a final No. 3 national ranking.
- A fan favorite at UNC, Miller authored a book entitled *The Road to Blue Heaven*, which was published as a diary of his experiences as a North Carolina basketball player.
- In addition to his success on the floor, Miller excelled off the court, earning ACC Academic Honor Roll recognition and the UNC Athletic Director's Scholar Athlete-Award. He earned his degree in political science from North Carolina in 2007.
- Upon his graduation from North Carolina, Miller played one season of professional basketball for the London Capitals of the British Basketball League, where he averaged 19.6 points per game to rank eighth in the league.
- Miller was a prep standout at the New Hampton School in New Hampshire. He earned a scholarship to James Madison University, where he played one season before transferring to North Carolina to become a walk-on for Coach Williams' squad.


