SERIES HISTORY

// BIG 12 TOURNAMENT BID ON THE LINE

With post-season hopes on the line, the University of Cincinnati women's soccer team (3-7-6) heads to Morgantown W. Va., for its regular season finale against West Virginia (7-7-3) on Monday inside Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium.

// CONFERENCE COMPETITION COMMENCES

The Bearcats are in their inaugural season in the Big 12 since the university joined the conference on July 1. Cincinnati is 2-3-4 in conference play and currently is 10th in the standings with three matches remaining. The top 10 teams in the conference will qualify for the 2023 Sprouts Farmers Market Big 12 Soccer Championship, held in Round Rock, Texas. The tournament begins on Oct. 28.

WIN AND WE'RE IN

Cincinnati enters the match 10th in the conference, holding the final spot for the Big 12 tournament.

Bearcats can claim their tournament bid with a...

Scenario 1: WIN over West Virginia.

Scenario 2: TIE and an Iowa State loss or draw.

Scenario 3: LOSS and BOTH Iowa State and Houston lose.

With every team in the conference to play its final game on Monday, UC controls its destiny and can claim its spot in the tournament with a win. Iowa State is currently one point behind UC and can leapfrog the Bearcats with a win over Texas Tech and a Cincinnati loss. The Bearcats hold the tiebreaker over the Cyclones as UC won the head-to-head match-up.

Houston is three points behind Cincinnati and would be tied for the 10th and final spot with a win over Baylor and a UC loss. Houston would hold the tiebreaker over Cincinnati as they would have more wins against common conference opponents.

If all three schools lose their final match, Cincinnati would remain the final team in the tournament. The Bearcats can finish as high as seventh with a win on Monday.

// LAST TIME OUT

The Bearcats tied Baylor 2-2, then fell to UCF, 1-0, on Senior Day last week. Against Baylor, both Graduate Student Ashley Barron and sophomore Sarah Kate Rath scored their first goals for the season in Cincinnati's second multi-goal game of the season.

The former Big East conference opponents will clash for the first time in 13 years. Monday's match will be the third-ever meeting between the two schools. West Virginia won both previous matches, with the last being a 4-0 victory over Cincinnati inside Gettler Stadium in 2010. The last time the match was played in Morgantown, UC fell 2-0 in 2007.

Fun Fact: Cincinnati holds a record of 3-0-0 in Monday night matches since 2009. The Bearcats last time played on a Monday was in 2016 where they defeated Boston University 2-1 on the road.

NUMBERS TO KNOW

Since the Bearcats inaugural season in 1980 the team has had eight NCAA Tournament appearances, with the most recent appearance coming in

The program has won 416 matches, with a winning percentage of .563 since the formation of the team in 1980. The program's 800th game was the team's season opener against Michigan State.

The Bearcats did not lose a single home regular season match during the 2022 season. Since 2013 the Bearcats only lost 18 of the 92 home matches during that span.

The Bearcats will roster 35 student athletes for the 2023 season. The 35 is made up of 21 returning players. five transfers and nine freshman. Nine of the 35 players are native

MEET THE BEARCATS

FRESHMAN (9)

The Bearcats Brought in nine freshman in the 2023 class. The entire class is made up out-of-state student athletes hailing for seven different states.

TRANSFERS (5)

Cincinnati hit the transfer portal hard bringing in five transfer for this season. Junior Laura Zemberyova and sophomore Clarie Rea followed Coach Demers and her staff from UAB to Cincinnati.

Teni Akindujo (Texas) and Sydney Waiters (Cornell) are two graduate transfers that will finish out their college careers as Bearcats.

RETURNERS (21)

Despite a coaching change, Demers was able to return 21 players from last year's roster including star graduate student Ashley Barron returning for her fifth year and her defensive running mate graduate student Kendall Battle. Other notable returners include leading goal scores from last season, sophomore Megan Smith (4) and junior Paige Miller (4) as well as senior goal keeper Anna Rexford (7 shutouts).

MATCH NOTES

// SCOUTING THE COMPETITION

Last time out, West Virginia (5-3-1) defeated Kansas, 1-0, to earn its fourth straight conference victory. Cincinnati native Taylor White leads the Mountaineers in goals with nine, which is also fied for fifth in the Big 12.

West Virginia is led by head coach Nikki Izzo-Brown, who is in her 28th season at the helm of the Mountaineers. In her 29 years of coaching, she holds a career record of 403-144-71 and is 390-139-71 at WVU.

// TEAM LEADERS

Sophomore midfielder Megan Smith and senior forward Ellie Flower are tied for the team lead in goals with three apiece. Junior Fran Stables has been the team's primary playmaker this season, as she leads the team in Assist with three.

// CAREER HISTORY TO WATCH

Graduate student Ashley Barron moved to third all-time in non-GK minutes played, passing former bearcat Kim Sykes with 6,841 after playing the full time against UCF. She also recorded her 78th career start in her 79th career cap against UCF, the 10th most in program history. She has started 74 straight matches, dating back to 2019.

Senior goalkeeper Anna Rexford continues to climb the UC all-time career top-10 list in three different categories. She claimed her third clean sheet of the season against Oklahoma State and her 15th career shutout, the seventh-most in program history.

The Wilmore Ky., native also ranks sixth in career wins (22) and 10th in career saves (183).

// A NEW FACE TAKES CENTER STAGE

True freshman Emma Gioffre has made quite the impact for the Bearcats this season. She has appeared in all 16 games this season, starting in 14. She became the first true freshman to start in double-digit matches since Ashley Barron started 18 in 2019.

Gioffre has totaled 1,173 minutes this season, which ranks fourth in the Big 12 among freshmen. She is also one of three freshmen to reach the 1,000-minute mark in 14 games.

// RATH, BARRON SCORE AT BAYLOR

Cincinnati battled back late to tie Baylor 2-2 on Thursday inside Betty Lou Mays Stadium. Both Graduate Student Ashley Barron and sophomore Sarah Kate Rath scored their first goals for the season in Cincinnati's second multi-goal game of the season. The Bearcats tied Butler 2-2 back on Sept. 7.

Down 2-1 in the 86th minute, Rath netted the equalizing goal off a rebound shot from senior Ellie Flower The goal marked Rath's second of her career. Flower earned her first career assist on the play.

Goalkeeper Anna Rexford finished the game with seven saves, tying a career-high and bringing her season total to 55. She now has totaled 189 saves in her career, the ninth-most in program history.

// REXFORD NAMED B12 GOALKEEPER OF THE WEEK

Women's soccer senior goalkeeper Anna Rexford was named Co-Goalkeeper of the Week on Wednesday after recording back-to-back shutouts against Oklahoma State and Oklahoma last week.

The senior is also the first Bearcat to earn Big 12 Player of the Week honors this season. This marked her fourth conference weekly award of her career as she earned three AAC Goalkeeper of the Week honors over the past two seasons.

/ ANOTHER SHUTOUT FOR REXFORD AND CO.

Cincinnati tied Oklahoma, 0-0, on Sunday inside Gettler Stadium. It was a physical match for the entire 90 minutes as both teams were focused on limiting opportunities. Cincinnati finished the match leading in shots, 9-8.

Senior goalkeeper Anna Rexford only faced one shot on the goal as she claimed her fourth clean sheet of the season and her 15th career shutout, the seventh-most in program history.

The draw also marked the first time this season that Rexford and the Cincinnati backline recorded back-to-back shutouts as the Bearcats defeated Oklahoma State 1-0 in the match prior. The last time the team did not allow a goal in back-to-back games was in late October of last year.

// BEARCATS STUN COWGIRLS

Late-game heroics from senior forward Ellie Flower led Cincinnati to a 1-0 home victory over Oklahoma State on Thursday. Battling tough rainy conditions, the Bearcats pushed the offensive envelope, outshooting the Cowgirls, 12-5, including supplying the majority of offensive chances in the first half, leading the shot totals 5-1.

After drawing a foul 20 yards out, junior forward Fran Stables sent a free kick shot that bounced off both the crossbar and Oklahoma State goal-

Rexford only faced three shots on the goal as she claimed her third clean sheet of the season and her 14th career shutout, which tied her with former Bearcat Tracy Hale for the seventh-most in program history.

// ZEMBERYOVA RETURNS

Cincinnati forward Laura Zemberyova returns to the team after a four-game hiatus as she was called up to play for the Slovakia Women's National team's first two UEFA Women's National League matches. She played 48 minutes across the team's two matches and earned the start in the team's opening match against Finland.

// DEFENSE SHINES AT No. 6 BYU

Cincinnati bent but never broke against No. 6 BYU's high-powered offense in a Thursday night thriller that ended in a 1-1 draw.

Forward Ellie Flower tapped in a bouncing ball in front of the net to give the Bearcats the lead 1:31 into the match. Flower netted her second goal of the season and the fourth of her career. Anna Rexford led the charge for the defense, tallying six saves, one away from tying a career-high. Rexford has been on a tear of late allowing only two goals, both on penalty kicks, over the past three matches.

Rexford and the defense held their own against one the top-scoring offenses in the nation, limiting BYU to only seven shots on goal, the team's third-lowest total of the season and held the Cougars to only one goal, their second-lowest-scoring output of the season.

THE FIRST BIG 12 WIN

Cincinnati shut out Iowa State, 1-0, to earn the program's first Big 12 victory on Sunday inside Gettler Sta-dium. Senior forward Ellie Flower scored the game-deciding goal on a penalty kick in the 26th minute. The goal was Flower's first of the season and the third of her career.

Senior goalkeeper Anna Rexford only faced two shots on the goal as she claimed her second clean sheet of the season and the 13th shutout of her career, the eighth-most in program history. The victory was also Rexford's 21st career win, which tied her with former Bearcat Tracy Hale for the sixth-most in program history. The Wilmore, Ky., native's two saves moved her into 10th in all-time career saves as she passed Hale with 170.

// HOME OPENER DECIDED ON PK
The Bearcats fell 1-0 to TCU on Thursday in their Big 12 home opener inside Gettler Stadium. Cincinnati suffered their first loss in conference play.

Scoring opportunities were at a premium for both sides as TCU would end the game leading the shot total category, 7-3. The seven shots allowed is tied for the least amount of shots in a game by an opponent

BIG 12 DEBUT ENDS IN DRAW

The Bearcats recorded a season-high 15 shots, seven on goal, as the team tied Kansas State, 1-1, in its Big 12 opener in Manhattan, Kan.

After a physical first half, junior forward Laura Zemberyova netted the first goal of the match with a laser from well outside the box on a feed from teammate graduate student forward Teni Akindoju in the 64th minute. The goal was Zemberyova's second of the season and the eighth of her career.

// SMITH SCORES, REXFORD TIES CAREER HIGH

Sophomore midfielder/forward Megan Smith scored her third goal of the season and the seventh of her career, but ultimately was not enough as Cincinnati leads the team in goals and is the only Bearcat that has netted multiple goals this season.

Senior goalkeeper Anna Rexford tied her career-high seven saves on 16 shots faced. She recorded the career-high mark earlier this season against Bowling

Green on Aug. 24.

NEWCOMERS SHINE AT BUTTLER

Junior forward Laura Zemberyova and freshman Emma Gioffre each scored goals as Cincinnati tied Butler, 2-2. The goals from Zemberyova and Gioffre were their first scores as Bearcats.

Down 2-1 in the 87th minute, standout freshman Gioffre picked the perfect time to score her first collegiate goal. Junior midfielder Fran Stables bent one into the box and found a crashing Gioffre who headed in the equalizing goal.

DEFENSES DOMINATES IN ANN ARBOR

The Bearcats recorded a season-high 13 shots but suf-fered a 1-0 road defeat to Michigan on Sunday at U-M Soccer Stadium. Junior forward Laura Zemberyova led Cincinnati with a season-high three shots. Goalkeeper Anna Rexford recorded four saves on 17 shots faced.

SMITH DOES IT AGAIN

The Bearcats match against Central Michigan ended in a 1-1 draw to close out a two-game homestand. After trailing 1-0 at the half despite multiple good looks, Cincinnati came back onto the pitch with purpose after the break as sophomore midfielder/forward Megan Smith sent a laser to the back of the net in the 46th minute for the equalizer. The tally marked her sixth career goal and her second of the season.

The Springfield, Ohio native scored in back-to-

back games for the first time in her career. She notched the game-winning goal against Bowling Green on Aug.

// A HOME OPENER TO REMEMBER

The Bearcats defeated Bowling Green 1-0, in their season home opener. Sophomore midfielder/forward Megan Smith scored the game's only goal just 1:40 into the match. Her goal was the 11th-fastest goal scored to begin a match in program history.

Anna Rexford recorded a career-high seven saves in the frame for her first clean sheet of the season. The scoreless outing marked Rexford's 12th career shutout, breaking a three-way tie with former Bearcat goalkeepers Julie McCaffrey (1994-95) and Julie Williams (1982-84) for the eighth-most shutouts in program history.

Rexford also became the seventh Bearcat in program history to accumulate 20 career wins. She now boasts a career record of 20-19-13.

STABLES NETS FIRST GOAL

The Bearcats fell on the road against Dayton, 4-1, on Aug. 20, to close their season-opening road trip. Junior transfer Fran Stables notched her first career goal as a Bearcat on a free kick from outside the box.

// REXFORD EXCELS AT MSU

In the closely contested defensive battle against Michigan State to start the season, senior goalkeeper Anna Rexford had a strong performance between the frames despite not getting the win. She finished the match with five saves on 19 shots, six of which were on goal.

ENTERING THE DEMERS ERA

Head coach Erica Demers became the sixth coach of the Cincinnati women's soccer team in December. Her first year at UC will be her seventh career season as a head coach after spending the last six leading the UAB women's team. Joining Demers in Cincinnati will be her assistant coaches from UAB: Rachael Collins and John Robertson. Robertson has been a part of her staff since 2018, while Collins joined her staff in 2019.

// A FIFTH YEAR FOR 22 Three-time American Athletic Conference Player of the Year and four-time AAC First Team All-Conference Honoree Ashley Barron is back for her fifth season as a Bearcat. She is the first Bearcat to earn four First Team All-Conference honors in a career. The anchor on the Cincinnati back line started all 17 games last season. She recorded over 1,400 minutes played for the third time in her career (1,486 minutes). She scored a career high two goals on 24 shots (7 on goal).

CONFERENCE REALIGNMENT

Cincinnati officially joined the Big 12 Conference on July 1, 2023 after spending the last nine years in the AAC.

The season opener will begin the Bearcat's inaugural season in the Big 12 will be the first UC program to compete in a game or match as part of the new conference.

// A CONFERENCE CHANGE IS NOTHING NEW

With UC joining the Big 12, it will mark the sixth new conference the Bearcats have joined since the programs formation in 1980 (note team was independent from 1984-93.) The Bearcats have reached double-digit wins in there previous conference inaugural seasons, including going 15-5-2 as part of the GMC in 1994.

// LEADING SCORERS READY FOR ANOTHER YEAR

Last season the Bearcats had three players tied for the most goals on the team with four. Two of the three players, junior Paige Miller and sophomore Megan Smith, will return for Cincinnati and lead the goal-scoring efforts.

// RECORD BOOK REXFORD

Not only did Anna Rexford start all 17 matches for the Bearcats in 2022, but she had a dominant year doing so. She finished the year with seven shutouts, the 10th most in a single season in program history. The goalkeeper from Wilmore, Ky, also finished the year with a goals allowed average of 0.96, the eighth best in program history.

INTERNATIONAL APPEAL

This year's roster features five international athletes, as well as Demers (Welland, Ontario) across three different countries. All five are also new additions to the roster via the transfer portal. Highlighting the group are UAB transfers junior Laura Žemberyova and sophomore Claire Réa. UC also added graduate transfers Teni Akindoju who played the last four years at Texas and Sydney Waiters who played for

University of Cincinnati Director of Athletics John Cunningham announced the hiring of Erica Demers as the sixth women's soccer head coach in program history on December 7, 2022.

Demers ushers in the new era after elevating the University of Alabama at Birmingham to unrivaled success during six seasons as head coach.

Demers was honored as the 2022 Conference USA Coach of the Year following a 9-4-5 overall and 6-1-3 Conference USA record that featured a program-best 10-match unbeaten streak. The Blazers had a league-best six student-athletes named to All-Conference teams and the conference's Defensive Player of the Year in Asha Zuniga.

During her time in Birmingham, Demers coached the Blazers to 23 All-Conference selections, 16 conference All-Academic honorees and an overall record of 50-38-19.

Hired on May 22, 2017, Demers orchestrated one of the best turnarounds in the NCAA in her first season at the helm by increasing the team's win total by nine games and leading the Blazers to their most wins since 2004.

Prior to her tenure with the Blazers, Demers spent 12 seasons on Dave Dilanni's staff at Iowa and Grand Valley State. She helped lead Iowa to 29 victories, coached three All-Big Ten performers and 31 Big Ten All-Academic selections in three seasons.

At Grand Valley State, she helped guide the Lakers to three NCAA Division II national titles, nine GLIAC championships and nine NCAA regional championships. She spent her final two seasons as associate head coach of the program.

In addition to her coaching duties, Demers served as the school's recruiting coordinator, camps coordinator and instructor, strength and conditioning coach and fundraising director. She also was instrumental in the team's academic success, as she coached two Academic All-American of the Year honorees, eight Academic All-Americans, one Elite 88 Award winner and more than 40 athletes to GLIAC All-Academic honors during her tenure.

Demers started her coaching career at The Citadel, where she served one season as a graduate assistant.

As a student-athlete, Demers led Oakland to four-straight Mid-Continent Conference titles and three-straight NCAA Tournament appearances. She was a two-time First Team All-Conference selection and was named Conference Player of the Year

Demers competed for the Canadian U-21 National Team and was part of the 2000

Canadian National Championship Team. In 1997-98, she played for the National Training Centre team and was a member of the Ontario Provincial Team for five seasons.

The Welland, Ontario, Canada native graduated from Oakland with a Bachelor of Health Science in 2004 and earned her Master's in Education while at Grand Valley State in 2009.


