// CINCINNATI AT THE AMERICAN CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Entering the AAC Swimming and Diving Championships, the men's team will be looking to earn their third conference championship title since claiming back-to-back team titles in 2018 and 2019. The women's team will be looking to claim their first team title.

The men's team have had 26 swimming individual conference titles, six relay titles and two individual diving titles since joining the conferece in 2014. Michael Balcerak is a six-time individual champion and the lone swimmer or diver on the roster that has won a title.

Balcerak is the reigning AAC 200-yard and 500-yard freestyle champion. He was won the 500-yard crown each of the past two seasons and will look to the exclusive company of Dominic Polling (200y IM) and Chris Bready (1650y Free) that has won three straight titles in one event.

Balcerak is the two-time reigning AAC Most Outstanding Men's Swimmer of the Year. He joins SMU's Jonathan Gomez Jr. as the only two male swimmers ever to win the award multiple times. The only swimmer to ever win the award three straight times, male or female, was Cincinnati's Jackie Keire from 2015-17.

Since the creation of the AAC in 2014, the men's team has dominated the 1650-yard freestyle event, winning seven straight event titles from 2015-2021. The seven wins are the most by one school in a singular swimming event in men's conference history. Ido Gal currently leads the conference in the 1650-yard event and will compete to bring home the Bearcats' eighth 1650-yard freestyle title. The men's team will also try to defend conference titles in both the 200-yard breaststroke and 400-yard medley relay.

The women's team will look to recapture some former glory and claim an individual event title for the first time since 2021. Since the creation of the AAC, the women's team has claimed 16 individual swimming event titles, two relay titles, and two diving titles. Former Bearcat Jackie Kerie is the most decorated individual event champion in conference history with nine individual event titles.

Freshman Joleigh Crye will look to become the first Cincinnati women's swimmer to take home the 100-yard breaststroke individual title. She currently has the fastest event time and is the only swimmer in the conference with a sub-one minute mark.

As a program, Cincinnati has earned 169 All-Conference honors (77 from the women and 92 from the men) since joining the AAC. Last season the men had 12 All-Conference honorees, while the women recorded eight. The most honorees the Bearcats have had in one season was 25 in 2018, when the women finished with 12 and the men had 13.

QUICK HITS

GUBENO THREE-PEATS AS AAC MEN"S SWIMMER OF THE WEEK

- Junior Hunter Gubeno earned AAC Male Swimmer of the Week for the third time this season, and second in a row (Weeks of Jan. 17 and Jan. 31). He is the first Bearcat men's swimmer to earn the honor three times in the same season. He joins Cincinnati diving coach Louis Hunt as the only Bearcats to win either male swimming or diving athlete of the week three times in a season.
- Over the past two weeks, Cincinnati competed in three dual meets, and Gubeno collected six individual event wins, including winning the 200-yard backstroke at all three. He now leads the team with 16 individual event wins this season.
- The Howell, Michigan native took first place in the 100-yard backstroke (49.48), 100-yard freestyle (45.59), and the 200-yard individual medley (1:50.71), leading the UC men to a 197-97 victory against Xavier. Against No.17 Louisville, he led all Bearcats with two event wins, winning both the 100-yard backstroke (48 .10) and the 200-yard backstroke (1:42.85).
- Earned the honor for the second time for his two event win performance against Kenyon College. This is the second time this season that he has garnered the award. He is the first UC men's swimmer two earn the honor twice in the same season since Dominic Polling achieved the feat during the 2018-19 season.

CRYE BREAKS RECORD FOR SECOND TIME

In the final meet of the season, Freshman Joleigh Crye broke the Cincinnati 100-yard breaststroke record with a time of 59.57. The Avon, N.Y. native is the first UC women's swimmer ever to break the one-minute mark in the event. This is the second time this season Crye has broken the record, she originally broke the record at the Ohio State Fall Invitational, with a time of 1:00.21 back on Nov. 18, 2022.

BALCERAK AIMS FOR THIRD AAC MEN'S MOST OUTSTANDING SWIMMER OF THE YEAR AWARD

Senior Michael Balcerak has been crowned AAC Most Outstanding Men's Swimmer of the Year for the past two season. In his final AAC championships he has a chance to go down as one of the best swimmers to ever compete at the AAC conference meet. Blacerak and SMU's Jonathan Gomez Jr. as the only two male swimmers ever to win the award multiple times. The only swimmer to ever win the award three times, male or female, was Cincinnati's own Jackie Keire (2015-17).

HOME POOL ADVANTAGE

The Bearcats have been on a tear in 2023, as the both the men's and women's team have tallied 44 events over the course of their first two meets of 2023. In both home sweeps of Kenyon College and Xavier, Bearcats earned 22 event wins in each meet are a season highs. Both win totals are the season high for the Bearcats.

CSCAA COLLEGE NATIONAL OPEN WATER CHAMPIONS

The Cincinnati Men's team won the team championships at the CSCAA Open Water Collegiate National Championships in Biscayne Fla. in the men's 5k freshman Ido Gal placed third (54:45.46) and junior Alex Gonzalez placed fourth (55:30.80). Both Gal and Gonzalez earned invites to the USA Swimming 5K Open Water Championships.

BEARCATS RE-WRITE HISTORY

Through out the nine scheduled meets this season, Bearcats have recorded 46 UC top-10 times and have broken four school records. At the Ohio State Fall Invitational, Bearcats recorded 37 of the 46 top 10 times, including the three records this season.

102 EVENT WINS AND COUNTING

Nineteen different Bearcats have a total of 93 individual events, as well as eight relay races. Junior Hunter Gubeno leads UC with 16 individual event wins, eight coming in the 200-yard backstroke.

GUBENO NAMED MALE SWIMMER OF THE WEEK

Hunter Gubeno earned AAC Male Swimmer of the Week for the first time in his career. Earned honor for his performance against West Virgina, where he had 39 points and tallied three event wins. This was the first time in his career he garnered the honor. He joins teammate Michael Balcerack as the only active Bearcats to earn the distinction and the only one this season.

SIX BEARCATS NAMED TEAM CAPTAINS

The Bearcats have six team captains for the season, seniors Katherine Connolly and Kevin Leibold and juniors Jessica Davis, Drew Hawthorne, Logan Lawhorn and Thomas Matthew.

PLAYER PROFILES

JUNIOR HUNTER GUBENO

- Gubeno has been dominant through the opening portion of the season, posting his best run as a Bearcat. Gubeno has tallied a team-high 16 individual event wins throughout the season, including eight in the 200-yard backstroke. The Howell, Mich., leads the conference in both the 100-yard backstroke and 200-yard backstroke. He has NCAA 'B' standard times in three events, including the 200-yard backstroke at 1:41.47, which also ranks 24th in the NCAA, the 100-yard backstroke at 47.62 and the 200-yard individual medley at 1:45.94. His 200-yard and 100-yard times also stands second in program history.
- Gubeno has been named AAC Men's Swimmer of the Week three times this season, which marks
 the most that any Bearcat has earned in a single season. He enters the postseason as the reigning
 Men's Swimmer of the Week after winning six of seven individual events in dual meets with Xavier,
 Kentucky and Louisville.

FRESHMAN JOLEIGH CRYE

Crye's freshman campaign has been full of outstanding individual performances, including breaking the 100-yard breaststroke school record on two separate occasions. In the last dual meet of the season, Crye reset her 100-yard breaststroke record with a time of 59.57 seconds, becoming the first woman to break the one-minute mark in the event in school history. The time stands as a NCAA 'B' standard mark leads the conference and ranks 23rd in the NCAA. The Avon, N.Y. native leads the women's team with nine individual event wins this season.

SENIOR MICHEAL BALCERAK

Throughout his career at Cincinnati, Balcerak has been dominant come postseason time. He is the reigning two-time AAC Most Outstanding Men's Swimmer of the Year and a six-time AAC Championship individual event champion. Balcerak is currently ranked second in the 500-yard freestyle at 4:25.05 and 100-yard butterfly with his NCAA 'B' standard time of 47.16.

FRESHMAN LILY JONES

Jone ranks second in the conference in the 200-yard backstroke at 1:57.56. Her time is the second-fastest 200-yard backstroke in program history. Jones also holds the fourth-fastest 100-yard backstroke in program history with a time of 54.52. She has compiled four event wins this season, all coming in the 200-yard backstroke.

SENIOR SPENCER SEHLHORST

Individual medley specialist, Sehlhorst, will look for a repeat performance of last year's AAC
Championships when he broke the 400-yard individual medley program record with a time of
3:47.10. Sehlhorst currently stands fourth in the conference in the 400-yard individual medley with
an NCAA 'B' Standard time of 3:49.79.

FRESHMAN IDO GAL

• Distance freestyle swimmer Gal has recorded all-time program top-10 times in both the 1,650-yard freestyle at 15:18.95, which ranks eighth, and the 1,000-yard freestyle at 9:15.17, which ranks ninth. Gal's 1,650-yard time is an NCAA 'B' standard time and leads the conference. Gal's most impressive performance this season was leading the men's team to their second CSCAA College Open Water National Championship, where he swam the 5K race in 54:45.46 to finish third overall and earned an invite to the USA Swimming 5K Open Water Championships.

FRESHMAN GRACE GAVIN

Gavin etched her name in the school record book after breaking the women's 100-yard backstroke
with a time of 54.35. Gavin currently ranks fourth in the conference in the event and has recorded
five individual wins this season.

FIFTH-YEAR SENIOR CONNER FUNKE

Funke has been a force in the breaststroke all season. Funke currently ranks third in the conference with an NCAA 'B' standard time of 1:57.96, the fifth fastest time in program history. Funke also recorded the fifth-fastest 100-yard breaststroke in program history with a time of 54.81. Funke has posted 10 individual wins this season, boasted by six in the 100-yard breaststroke.

JUNIOR TOMMY EATON

Eaton will look to repeat last year's AAC Championships where he set the 200-yard butterfly program record with a time of 1:43.73. Eaton currently ranks second in the conference in the 200-yard butterfly with an NCAA 'B' standard time of 1:45.35. Eaton has won seven individual events this season, five of which came in the 200-yard butterfly.

SOPHOMORE WILL CLAUS

The sophomore diver had his best meet of the season against Kentucky. Claus recorded personal
best in both the 1-meter dive (309.98) and 3-meter dive (332.85), as both scores are NCAA Diving
Zone qualifying marks. This is the second time in his career that he has qualified for the zone
competition.

2022-23 CINCINNATI SWIMMING AND DIVING MEET NOTES

MEET BY MEET REVIEW

UC TAKE ON INDIANAPOLIS

The Bearcats opened the 2022-23 season on the road, taking on, now ranked NCAA D2 program, 1/1 Indianapolis.

The UC women's team won 158 to 136, while the UC men's team fell short 161.5 to 138.5. This is the sixth time in a row that UC women have won the dual since 2017.

The Bearcats picked up 15 event win, eight from the women's team and seven by UC men, throughout the meet.

Six events were won by freshmen making their first appearance as Bearcats, including Joleigh Crye who picked up event wins in both the 100-yard breaststroke (1:04.74) and the 100-yard butterfly (56.62).

Reigning American Athletic Conference Male Swimmer of the Year, senior Michael Balcerak, also claimed two event wins, by winning both the 200-yard freestyle (1:41.17) and the 100-yard freestyle (46.30).

HOME OPENER VS. MIAMI (OH)

Cincinnati found success in their home opener against Miami (OH) university, as the Bearcats racked up 20 event win inside the Keating Aquatic Center.

The Bearcats split the dual with the RedHawks at the Keating Aquatic Center. The men's team won in commanding fashion, 216 to 84, while the women fell just short, 166 to 134.

Junior Hunter Gubeno and fifth-year senior Conner Funke led the way for the men's team that secured 13 total event wins. Both were part of the men's 400-yard medley relay team that won in a time of 3:18.67.

Gubeno also won the 100-yard (49.65) and 200-yard backstroke (1:50.16) while Funke claimed victories in the 100-yard (55.81) and 200-yard breaststroke (55.81).

The women's dual was close throughout the entire meet. Freshmen Grace Gavin and Joleigh Crye picked up three event wins each, including a 400-yard medley relay victory with a time of 3:49.31.

Gavin won the 200-yard individual medley with a time of 2:08.10 and the 100-yard backstroke with a time of 56.75. The Bearcats claimed the top four spots in the 100-yard backstroke.

BEARCATS HEAD TO MORGANTOWN

The Bearcats took on future BIG 12 opponent West Virgina in a two-day dual in Morgan town.

Junior Hunter Gubeno led the men's team with three event wins in the 100-yard backstroke (48.95), 200-yard backstroke (1:46.35) and 200-yard individual medley (1:50.65).

UC swept the 100-yard butterfly, with freshman Ella Chown (56.71) and senior Michael Balcerak (48.95) claiming first.

Both Bearcat teams swam well, collecting 12 event wins, but fell short to the Mountaineers. The men's team lost 179-174 while the women fell 237-110.

OHIO STATE FALL INVITATIONAL

The Bearcat had a historic weekend at the Ohio State Fall Invitational breaking three school records and recording 37 Cincinnati top-10 times.

The Bearcats opened up the three-day invitational with the men's 200 yard free relay, where Michael Balcerak, Jet Fuhrmann, Drew Hawthorne and Hunter Gubeno broke the UC record by .55 seconds with a time of 1:19.43.

Joleigh Crye had quite the meet as she swam the fastest 100-yard breaststroke (1:00.21) in UC history, breaking Helena Pikhartova's (1:01.05) nine-year-old record. The Avon, N.Y. native would also record the sixth-fastest 100-yard butterfly (53.91) in Bearcat history. In total she recorded five UC top-10 times

Grace Gavin also had a meet to remember as she broke the Cincinnati women's 100-yard backstroke record with a time of 54.35. In total Gavin recorded five Bearcat top-10 times throughout the meet.

Ohio State won both the men's and women's team champi-

onships, while the UC men placed sixth with 934 points and the women placed 10th with 416 points.

UC WRAP UP FALL SEASON AT INDIANA

To close out the fall season, the Bearcats made a trip over to Bloomington, Ind. To take on 7/12 Indiana as Bearcats recorded 11 top-10 UC times and won four events.

Freshman Ido Gal and sophomore Collin Singler led the way for the Bearcats by each recording two UC all-time top-10 times. Singler swam the sixth-fastest 200-yard butterfly (1:47.73) and the ninth-fastest 100-yard butterfly (48.12) in school history.

Gal had guite the 1,650-yard freestyle race, swimming the seventh-fastest 1,650-yard (15:18.95) in UC history. His 1,000yard split time of 9:15.17 was also the ninth-fastest 1,000-yard fime in Bearcat history.

Freshman Ella Chown moved up two spots in the record book after swimming the women's 200-yard butterfly in 2:01.10, which is seventh all-time in UC history.

Both Bearcat teams fell to the Hoosiers, as the UC men's team lost 163-121, while the women's team lost 161-110.

CSCAA COLLEGE NATIONAL OPEN WATER CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Cincinnati men's team were crowned team champions after recording three top-15 finishes at the 2022 CSCAA College National Open Water Championships.

UC sent eight athletes, five men and three women, to compete in the open water championships in Biscayne Bay, Fla.

Freshman Ido Gal led the way for the UC men to claim their second Open Water team championship in UC history. Gal swam the 5K race in 54:45.46, placing third overall, tying the best finish by a Bearcat at the meet.

Junior Alex Gonzalez was right behind Gal, placing fourth overall with a time of 55:30.80. One of three UC men's team captains, junior Kevin Leibold, rounded out the Bearcat scorers with a time of 56:56.87, earning 15th overall.

Both Gal and Gonzalez earned invites to the USA Swimming 5K Open Water Championships.

UC SWEEPS DUAL ON SENIOR NIGHT

The University of Cincinnati men's and women's swimming and diving teams swept their dual meet against Kenyon College on senior day on Friday.

Neither UC team disappointed on senior night as the Cincinnati men's team won 193-106 and the Cincinnati women's team won 170-130 against the Owls. In total the Bearcats won 22 events throughout the meet.

Leading the way for the UC men was fifth-year senior Conner Funke who picked up event wins in both the 100-yard (56.29) and the 200-yard breaststroke (2:03.71). Funke now has seven individual event wins this season, including four in the 100-yard breaststroke.

Joining Funke in earning multiple event wins were freshman Joleigh Crye and junior Jessica Davis, whom each picked up two individual event wins and a relay crown.

Crye's outstanding freshman season continued as she won the 100-yard breaststroke (1:02.26) and the 100yard butterfly (56.40). This marks the fourth time this season she has won the 100-yard butterfly in a dual

Davis placed first in both the 100-yard (52.27) and 200yard freestyle (1:52.98). Both Davis and Crye were on the women's 400-yard relay team that won with a time

BEARCATS DOMINATE AT HOME

The University of Cincinnati men's and women's swimming and diving teams swept crosstown rival Xavier in dominant fashion on Jan. 20.

The Bearcats won 22 events, tying a season-high, as the UC men's team won 197-97, and the UC women's team won 181-106. Cincinnati picked up their second home sweep in a row after accomplishing the feat against

Kenyon College on Jan. 13.

Junior Hunter Gubeno was a force inside the Keating Aquatic Center as he won three individual events and was the lead swimmer on the men's 200-yard medley-winning team. The reigning American Athletic Conference Male Swimmer of the Week took first place in the 100-yard backstroke (49.48), 100-yard freestyle (45.59), and the 200-yard individual medley (1:50.71).

The UC women also claim first in their 200-yard medley relay race as freshmen Grace Gavin, Kaylee Nagel and Joleigh Crye and junior Jessica Davis recorded a time of 1:43.71.

Crye would also take first in the women's 100-yard butterfly (56.83) and Nagel won the women's 100-yard breaststroke (1:04.43).

On the diving side, freshmen Preston Landolt, Alex Givens, and sophomore Will Claus each broke the 300-point mark and qualified for the NCAA Diving Zones. In the men's 1-meter dive, Claus won the event with a score of 304.28 points and Landolt placed second, scoring 300.15 points. Givens won the men's 3-meter diving event with a score of 303.60 points.

BEARCATS FINAL HOME DUAL AGAINST KENTUCKY

The Bearcats took home five event wins throughout the meet, including fifth-year senior Conner Funke sweeping both men's breaststroke events.

The UC women fell to No. 14 ranked Kentucky women 210-85 and the UC men fell to the Wildcat men 180-117.

Funke first won the men's 100-yard breaststroke with a time of 56.51 and followed that up with a photo-finish in the 200yard breaststroke, winning by three-tenths of a second with a time of 2:03.14.

Freshman Grace Gavin picked up her fifth event win of the year by winning the women's 200-yard individual medley with a time of 2:07.84.

Junior Hunter Gubeno won his team-leading 14th individual event win after claiming first in the 200-yard backstroke with a time of 1:49:19. He also placed second in the 100-yard backstroke clocking in at 49.41 seconds.

On the diving side, Sophomore Will Claus had a meet to remember. He broke the 300-point mark in both the men's three-meter dive (332.85) and the one-meter dive (309.98). Both marks are season best and he placed second overall in each event.

UC CLOSES OUT SEASON AT 17/6 LOUISVILLE

Freshman Joleigh Crye broke the University of Cincinnati women's 100-yard breaststroke record as both the men's and women's swimming and diving teams fell to Louisville in the Bearcats' final dual meet of the season on Saturday.

The UC men fell, 203-94, while the women lost 198-92 inside the Cardinals' Ralph Wright Natatorium.

Crye capped off her freshman season by winning the women's 100 breaststroke and breaking her own UC record with a time of 59.57. She is the first Bearcat women's swimmer ever to break the 1-minute barrier in the event. The Avon, N.Y. native's time currently ranks inside the top 25 nationally and is an NCAA "B" standard time.

Junior Hunter Gubeno dominated the men's backstroke events.. He won both the 100-yard backstroke (48 .10) and the 200-yard backstroke (1:42.85). Gubeno has now won a team-leading 16 individual events throughout the season.

Freshman Lily Jones took home first place in the women's 200-yard backstroke with a time of 1:58.83. Jones also placed third overall in the women's 100-yard backstroke with a time

Mandy Commons-DiSalle enters her ninth season as head coach and 13th season overall with the University of Cincinnati swimming and diving program in 2022-23.

In 2022, DiSalle lead 16 Bearcats to the CSCAA National Invitational as the men's team placed eighth overall. At the invitational Micheal Balcerack won the 200 butterfly with a time of 1:44.04. Bearcats also racked up seven top-10 finishes.

Commons-DiSalle Since took over the program the Bearcats have excelled in both the pool and in the classroom. She helped grow Jacqueline Keire into a three time NCAA All-American in both the 100 and 200 freestyle events. Keire was the first Bearcats swimmer to earn All-America honors since 2010 (and first female since 2005). Commons-DiSalle also coached Chris Bready to the 2017 NCAA

Championships, marking the first time a UC male swimmer qualified since 2010. The men's team had a historic season under Commons-DiSalle in 2018 when it won its first American Athletic Conference Championship and she was named Male Swimming Coach of the Year. She then backed that up with a men's repeat championship in 2019 and the women's team finished runner-up at the conference championship for the second straight season, along with another Men's Swimming Coach of the Year honor. Cincinnati also has collected a total of 52 individual titles at the American Athletic Conference championships and 30 school records during Coach DiSalle's tenure.

Coach Commons-DiSalle guided the men's team to a second place finish and the women's team to a fourth-place finish at the AAC Championships. Blake Hanna won the 200 backstroke for the second year in a row and Michael Balcerak was named AAC Male Swimmer of the Year. A total of 13 Bearcats found places on the podium throughout the meet.

In 2021, DiSalle guided four Bearcats as they competed at the 2020 Olympic Swimming Trials in Omaha, Nebraska. Blake Hanna qualified in the 100m and 200m backstroke, finished second in Wave 1 with a time of 2:00.11 to earn his way into Wave 2. Hunter Gubeno qualified in the 100m and 200m backstroke and the 200m individual medley. Kevin Leibold qualified for the 200m butterfly and Connor Funke qualified in the 200m breaststroke.

Under head coach Commons-DiSalle, the men's team finished second and the women's team third at the 2021 AAC Championships. The Bearcats finished with a record number of American Athletic Conference podium finishes with a total of 36, with eight of those being conference champions. The men swept the podium in the 500 Free for the third consecutive year, and Michael Balcerak won all three of his individual events (500 free, 100 butterfly, 200 butterfly) to earn American Athletic Conference Men's Swimmer of the Year.

The 2020-21 season was also highlighted with a total of 42 All-Time Top Ten Times in school history and six school records broken: Blake Hanna in the 100m breaststroke and 200 breaststroke, the men's 200m freestyle relay, the men's 400m freestyle relay, the men's 200m medley relay, and the men's 400m medley relay.

Commons-DiSalle also led the Bearcats to academic success, with the highest men's and women's GPA in program history. The men finished the year with a 3.459 GPA and the women with a 3.727 GPA. There were also three UC One Team Award winners, with Matea Sumajstorcic earning Newcomer of the Year, Camryn Streid the Student Athlete Award Winner, and Zach Baecker earned the Nancy Hamant Scholar-Athlete of the Year

At the 2020 AAC Championships, the men's swimming & diving finished first runner-up, taking home the silver with a total of 5 podium finishes, while the women's team finished third with 1 podium finish. Men's swimming & diving also continue to excel not only in the water but in the classroom as well by earning 20 AAC All-Academic Team selections and the women's team earning 26. Din Selmanovic brought home multiple awards including scholar-athlete-of the year, postgraduate leadership award, UC's 2020 Presidential Leadership Medal of Excellence, and was given the Jimmy Nippert Award at the 2020 One Team Honors. His success continues to bring light to the men's swimming & diving team and head coach Commons-DiSalle.

At the 2019 AAC Championships, ten men took home gold medals with a total of 24 podium finishers. Din Selmanovic became the first Bearcat to be named Most Outstanding Male Swimmer. The women maintained success with another runner-up finish after a big final-day push to jump to the second spot on the leader board. Outside of the pool, 29 women and 14 men received a spot on the AAC All-Academic Team. The women's team earned the AAC Team Academic Award after posting a program record 3.671 GPA in the spring. Once again, Commons-DiSalle saw the program recognized by the CSCAA for academic excellence. The women's spring GPA sat just outside the top-ten nationally while the men barely missed the highest GPA in the conference.

Commons-DiSalle led the Bearcats to one of its most historic seasons during the 2017-18 school year and was tabbed the AAC Men's Swimming Coach of the Year for her efforts. The men's team won the conference tournament title and the women placed second at the AAC meet for one of the best postseason performances in school history. 25 Bearcats were named to the All-Conference Teams following the meet with eight athletes earning individual championships. The men won their first relay championships in UC's AAC history.

Academic achievements also broke records during the 2017-18 school year. Both the men and women's teams posted their highest GPA's in program history in the spring. The women's team tied for the 15th-highest GPA in the nation. 13 individuals were recognized for strong academics by the CSCAA, more than any other program in the conference. The AAC honored 29 women and 21 men with AAC All-Academic Team distinction. Senior Chris Bready was named the American's Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year for swimming and diving, making it two Bearcats in a row to earn the honor.

Besides Keire and Bready making waves at the NCAA Championships, the 2016-17 saw a lot of success for the Bearcats. Nineteen student-athletes earned All-Conference recognition for the Bearcats with a total of 41 conference accolades. Keire was named the Most Outstanding Swimmer following the conference meet, making her the only athlete, male or female, to win the award for three consecutive years in league history. UC won six events at the conference meet including its first-ever women's relay victories. Academically, Connor Davis was named the 2016-17 Scholar-Athlete Sport Excellence Award winner for men's swimming from the conference and also earned CoSida Academic All-District honors. 43 members of the swimming and diving program were placed on the AAC All-Academic Team for achieving a GPA of 3.00 or higher.

The 2015-2016 season was a historic one for the Bearcats with 34 program Top-10 times, 14 NCAA B cuts, 11 school records, five individual American Conference titles, one NCAA zone qualifier and one NCAA A cut. There also were a record 18 new school record holders, with 15 of those record holders returning for the 2016-2017 season.

Commons-DiSalle also led the Bearcats to academic success, ending the

year with a cumulative 3.401 team GPA. In total, 46 athletes were nominated to UC's honor roll, 31 of which also were on the Dean's List. Additionally, 36 individuals earned a spot on The American All-Academic Team and four earned NCAA Academic All-America titles.

The Bearcats continued their successful 2015-16 season into the summer where Commons-DiSalle helped produce junior Gege Huffner to a 13th-place finish in the 200 breaststroke and a 6th-place finish in the 100 breaststroke at the French Olympic Trials. She also led Keire to a 6th-place finish in both the 100 and 200 freestyle at the Canadian Olympic Trials, placing her just shy of qualifying for the 2016 Canadian Olympic Team. In addition to the team's international athlete, Coach Di-Salle also had sophomores Ryan DePietro (400 IM) and Chris Bready (400 & 1500 FR) qualify for the United States Olympic trials. Former Bearcats student-athletes and 2010 NCAA national champion Josh Schneider also competed in both the 50 and 100 freestyle events at the U.S. Olympic trials, capping his career with a 5th-place finish in the 50 freestyle under the coaching of Commons-DiSalle.

Before being appointed as the head coach for Cincinnati on July 1, 2014, she spent five seasons as an assistant coach for the team from 2010-14. During her time as an assistant, Commons-DiSalle served as the recruiting coordinator for both the men's and women's programs. She was responsible for recruiting the eagerly anticipated 14-member signing class for the 2014-15 season which added depth to the UC roster in several events.

"Cincinnati is a great swimming town," Commons-DiSalle says. "There are great youth programs, which I was a part of growing up, strong high school teams and a wealth of prospective student-athletes and fans. We are going to do our best to keep those kids in Cincinnati while reaching out nationally and internationally to put together the best team we can."

Prior to arriving at UC she spent one season as a coach with the Cincinnati Marlins, developing swimmers aged 6-14, and two years as the owner of Varsity Athletic Consulting, a firm designed to help guide Cincinnati-area athletes through the college recruiting process.

Before entering the private sector, Commons-DiSalle began her collegiate coaching career as an assistant at the University of Toledo. While with the Rockets, she coordinated the budget, team travel and scholarship distribution while helping oversee the program's fundraising efforts.

Commons-DiSalle swam collegiately at Clemson where she was a four-time NCAA Championship qualifier, earning Honorable Mention All-America status in 2001 and 2002. She also was a National Strength & Conditioning All-American in 2000. She majored in economics with a minor in human resource management, receiving her degree from Clemson in 2003. She earned an MBA while coaching at Toledo.

Commons-DiSalle was a three-time Ohio High School Athletic Association (OHSAA) state champion at Sycamore High School, where she is enshrined in the school's athletic hall of fame. She and her husband, Eric, reside in Cincinnati.

KEATING AQUATICS CENTER

The University of Cincinnati opened the Keating Aquatic Center in early 2006. The Keating Aquatics Center is named after Bill Keating, Sr., who was a Bearcats student-athlete (BBA 1950, JD 1950), member of the UC Athletic Hall of Fame, a recipient of the NCAA Silver Anniversary Medal, and a former Chairman of the Board of the University of Cincinnati Board of Trustees.

Part of the \$113 million Campus Recreation Center, the natatorium features an eight-lane, 50-meter swimming course with an integrated diving well. The pool contains 12,000 square feet of water surface and includes a movable bulkhead that will provide a high degree of flexibility in training course configuration.

In March 2013, UC's Campus Recreation Center was ranked the No. 1 most amazing campus student recreation center in America by bestcollegereviews.org.

The Campus Recreation Center, as well as the natatorium, was designed locally by KZF Design, Inc., working with internationally renowned architect Thom Mayne of Morphosis, based out of Santa Monica, Calif. It was built by Turner Construction, and features a leisure pool as well as the varsity pool, a six court gymnasium, locker rooms, recreation offices, a food court, a juice bar overlooking the gym, a study lounge, administrative offices, weight/fitness areas and a climbing wall.

In the 2022-23 season the Bearcats are set to hold four home meets, three in the spring season. The meets not ticketed and attendance is free. Seating is first come, first serve.
