NOTES

East Carolina leads the series 10-9, and 5-4 overall in Greenville, N.C. Last time out, IImar'I Thomas became the second player in University of Cincinnati basketball history to score 50 or more in a game with her career-best, 51-point performance in the 76-61 win on the road at East Carolina. It was the first 50-plus point game in American Athletic Conference women's basketball history. Caitlyn Wilson added 10 points, knocking down three triples to give her 27 three-pointers made over the last seven games. Jada Scott pulled down a career-best 11 rebounds.

Junior point guard Akira Levy ranks first in the conference and 11th in the nation in assists (88) and 17th in the nation with assists per game (5.9). She is third in the conference and 30th in the nation in steals (37) and is also first in the conference and 32nd in the nation with free throws made (60).

Levy leads the team in points (206), points per game (13.7), field goals a game (11.3), free throws made (60), assists (88), and steals (7).

Sophomore guard Jillian Hayes leads the team in rebounds (102) and blocks (21) while junior forward Caitlyn Wilson leads the team in three point shots (26) and three point shots a game (1.7).

This season is the 50th anniversary of the Women's Basketball program. Then known as the Lady Bearcats, the team finished its first season in 1971 with a 9-6 record. The Bearcats have been led by Mary Jo Huismann, former men's basketball player Tom Thacker (1974-1978, 55-43), Ceal Barry (1979-1981, 83-42), Sandy Smith (1983-1986, 49-37), Laurie Pirtle (1986-2007, most wins in program history with 310), and Jamelle Elliott (2009-2017, 113-162).

AAC ALL-FRESHMAN TEAM

Sophomore Jillian Hayes was the fourth UC player to be named to the 2021 AAC All-Freshman Team, joining Iimar'I Thomas (2018), Bianca Quisenberry (2014) and Anna Owens (2015). Prior to the AAC Championship tournament, Hayes averaged 7.7 points, 5.1 rebounds, 2.9 assists and 1.4 steals.

RECRUITING LOCAL TALENT

Head Coach Michelle Clark-Heard has made it a priority to bring local talent to play for the Bearcats. She recruited both sophomore Jillian Hayes (Love-land) and freshman Clarissa Craig (Roger Bacon) right out of high school. She added sophomore transfer Nevaeh Dean (Lakota West) this past off-season. Sophomore Taziah Jenks hails from Louisville, Ky. and Malea Williams from Georgetown, Ky. - both within driving distance.

OVERSEAS TALENT

Five members of the 2021-22 Bearcats squad come to Cincinnati from overseas. Freshman Emerita Mashaie comes from Findlay and played on the Findlay U20 National Team. Freshman Lojain Elfatairy also played for her hometown national team, the Egypt U17 National Team.

OFF THE COURT TALENT

Junior Akira Levy is known for more than her basketball skills on the court. She is well-known for her moment in the spotlight when she sang on stage with Kenny Chesney back when she was at Missouri. Levy used to sing the national anthem before home and some road away games in high school. She even tried out for The Voice and made it to the second to last round.

LIKE A FAMILY

Head Coach Michelle Clark-Heard is also known for making valuable connections with recruits. So much so, after she took the head coaching job at Cincinnati graduate student Arame Niang transferred from Western Kentucky to come play for Coach Heard. Akira Levy, originally recruited by Coach Heard to play for her at Western Kentucky, decommitted when Coach Heard left for Cincinnati. After stops at Vanderbilt and Missouri, the SEC All-Freshman Team point guard transferred to Cincinnati to now play for Coach Heard.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

Sophomore Jillian Hayes' father, Jonathan, was a former NFL player with the Kansas City Chiefs (1985-1993) and Pittsburgh Steelers (1994-1996), assistant coach with the Cincinnati Bengals (2003-18) and recent head coach with the XFL's St. Louis BattleHawks (2020). Her mother, Kristi, was the 1995 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Player of the Year at Drake and scored over 3,400 points in high school. Hayes' brother, Jaxson, who played at Texas, was the eighth overall pick in the 2019 NBA Draft by the Atlanta Hawks and currently plays for the New Orleans Pelicans.

COACH TO WATCH

Assistant coach Surina Dixon was selected as one of 12 finalists for the Next Up Head Coaches Training Initiative. The DEI Alliance is made up of 12 different minority coaches and social justice organizations. SCOUTING EAST CAROLINA

The Pirates are 7-9 overall on the season, 0-3 in American Athletic Conference action. They have lost three in a row to UCF, Tulsa, and SMU.

Last time out, the Pirates fell short to SMU after a 20-point fourth quarter effort behind the play of Taniyah Thompson, who scored a team-high 15 points, but eventually lost 60-49 Thursday night. Da'Ja Green added 11 points going 5-of-14 after playing 22 minutes.

Since Kim McNeill arrived in Greenville, the Pirates have been consistently near the top of the country in steals and turnovers forced. However this season, the Pirates have added another wrinkle to their defense, blocked shots. East Carolina currently leads the AAC and is ranked 19th in the country in rejections with 70. The two biggest reasons for that are Tiara Chambers and Tylar Bennett.

Junior guard Taniyah Thompson leads the team, averaging 17.4 points per game and 29.5 minutes.

2021-22 GAME RECAPS

ALABAMA A&M GAME RECAP

The team opened up their 2021-22 season with a 73-60 win over Alabama A&M. The Bearcats shot 42.4% from the field and out-rebounded Alabama 50-41 and never trailed at any point in the game. Cincinnati held their opponents to only 26.8% from the field and 35.7% from three-point range.

- Cincinnati held Alabama A&M scored only six points in the first quarter, lowest in a quarter since they allowed four to UCF on February 15th, 2020.
- Jillian Hayes had 17 points, nine rebounds, five assists, four blocks, and two steals.
- Akira Levy led the team with six assists and four steals to go along with 12 points.

BELLARMINE GAME RECAP

Four Bearcats players scored in double-digits as Cincinnati started the season 2-0 after beating Bellarmine 72-59. The Bearcats shot 44.6% from the field goal line and were 5-15 (33.3%) from three point range. They out-rebounded the Knights 42 to 32 and had 13 steals along with eight blocks in the game.

- Akira Levy played 33 minutes and led the team with 18 points, going 2-3 from three point range, 6-11 from the field goal line and 4-5 from the free throw line
- Arame Niang added another 16 points to along with eight rebounds and four blocks in 29 minutes of play.
- Two other members of the Bearcats team scored in double digits: Taziah Jenks (11) and Caitlyn Wilson (10)

OHIO GAME RECAP

The University of Cincinnati Bearcats fell at home to the Ohio University Bobcats 73-62 and fall to 2-1 on the season.

- Jillian Hayes led the Bearcats with 17 points and also contributed with five rebounds, five assists, two blocks, and two steals.
- AAC's conference player of the week Akira Levy had 13 points, three rebounds, two assists, two blocks, and two steals before being fouled out of the game in the 4th quarter.
- Jadyn Scott led Cincinnati with nine rebounds and also contributed with nine points and three assists.
- Niang had her season-best 12 points and also collected five rebounds.

UTAH GAME RECAP

The University of Cincinnati Bearcats fell at on the road to Utah 45-78. They were led by Taziah Jenks, who had a season and career high 14 points in the game.

WESTERN CAROLINA RECAP

UC forced a season-high 23 turnovers to edge Western Carolina, 46-45, on Tuesday night to improve to 3-2 on the season.

- Akira Levy led the way for the Bearcats with nine points, three rebounds, seven assists, and four steals.

- Braylyn Milton had nine points in the second half and contributed with one rebound and one block.

OHIO STATE GAME RECAP

The Bearcats lost in Columbus, 86-50. UC shot 63% from the free throw line, going 10-for-16. Sophomore Jillian Hayes led the way with 16 points. The Bearcats outscored the Buckeyes 15 to 14 in the second quarter, highlighted by back-to-back threes by junior point guard Akira Levy and freshman guard Braylyn Milton. Hayes had a team leading six points with two layups and two made free throws in the quarter.

CENTRAL MICHIGAN GAME RECAP

The team held off Central Michigan on Wednesday night for a 59-54 win in Fifth Third Arena. Cincinnati improved to 4-3 on the season, with all four of their wins coming at home.

The Bearcats shot 43.1% from the field and 81.8% from the free throw line while holding the Chippewas to 35.2% field goal shooting. Sophomore guard Jillian Hayes led the team with a season and career high 23 points on 9-of-15 shooting. Junior point guard Akira Levy also scored a new career and season high of 19 points to go along with seven assists. She made 3-of-4 from three point range.

It was all about the defense in the second quarter as Cincinnati held Central Michigan to five points, which is tied for lowest in a quarter this season (five vs. Western Carolina on 11/23/21). Cincinnati forced two 10-second violations and a shot clock violation during an impressive defensive stand. Levy contributed on 10 out of the 16 first half baskets with 14 points and five assist before the break. Hayes led all scorers in the first half with 15 points on 6-of-8 shooting.

OLE MISS GAME RECAP

The Bearcats fell to the Rebels 75-63 after a tough battle all game. UC shot 65.7% from the free throw line.

- Junior point guard Akira Levy led the team with 21 points, a new season and career high.

- Braylyn Milton scored a new season and career high 19 points.

- Emerita Mashaire went 2-2 from three point range, scoring a new season and career high six points.

XAVIER GAME RECAP

The Bearcats beat Xavier 82-73 in the 43rd Annual Skyline Chili Crosstown Shootout and improve to 5-4 on the season.

The Bearcats shot 42.4% from the field and 74% from the free throw line. The Bearcats tied their season-best six made three pointers with four coming from junior guard Caitlyn Wilson alone.

Sophomore forward Malea Williams had a career-day with 14 points, two rebounds, and two blocks in 18 minutes. Junior point guard Akira Levy continued to play well with 13 points, seven assists, four rebounds, a block, and a steal.

CHATANOOGA GAME RECAP

The Bearcats beat Chattanooga 63-52 and earned their first road victory of the season on 12/15 and improve to 6-4 on the season.

The team shot 43.1% from field goal range and 77.8% from the free throw line, with 29 points coming off the bench.

Freshman Braylyn Milton led the team with 18 points, going 6-for-10 from field goal range in 25 minutes of play. Two other Bearcats scored in double figures - Akira Levy (14) and Caitlyn Wilson (10) and Malea Williams played a season high 24 points and recorded a season high 10 rebounds in the game.

NORTH CAROLINA A&T GAME RECAP

The Bearcats improved to 7-4 after a thrilling 87-77 win in double-overtime Sunday afternoon. Cincinnati shot a season-best 47.9% from the field and made 81% of their free-throws all while holding their opponent to 34.6% from the field.

- Akira Levy set a new season and career high in points (22) and assists (12) in a double-double effort, the first of the season for the Bearcats. She also finished a perfect 11-for-11 from the free throw line.

- Jillian Hayes contributed 18 points and eight rebounds. She had eight out of the first 17 points to start the second half.

- The Bearcats 87 points were the most scored in a game since their last home win v. Xavier on 12/12.

- Two other Bearcats scored in double digits: Arame Niang (13) and center Clarissa Craig (10), which marks a new career high for the freshman .

MARQUETTE RECAP

The Cincinnati women's basketball team fought hard, but fell on the road at Marquette 60-49 on Decemeber 22nd. The Bearcats record falls to 7-5 on the season after they shot 90.9% from the free throw line and muscled 26 points in the paint.

- Akira Levy led all Bearcats with 14 points and tallied two rebounds and four steals. This is her 10th double-digit scoring game this season.

- Malea Williams scored 13 points, 11 coming in the fourth quarter, to go along with two rebounds and two steals.

- Jillian Hayes collected eight rebounds, and Hayes also contributed with 11 points and two blocks.

SOUTH FLORIDA RECAP

The Bearcats fought hard at the end, but fell in the AAC opener against South Florida 61-46 on Jan. 5. The Bearcats record falls to 7-6 on the season after holding their oponents to 39.3% from the field and forcing 16 turnovers to go along with seven blocks.

- Junior guard Caitlyn Wilson had a team high 12 points on four three-pointers along with her four rebounds.

- Sophomore guard Jillian Hayes shot 50% from the floor en route to her 11 points.

- The Bearcats outscored their opponents in each quarter after the first - 12-11 in the second, 15-13 in the third quarter, and 15-14 in the fourth quarter.

- Nevaeh Dean scored six points, five rebounds, and two assists which are all season-highs for the sophomore.

TEMPLE RECAP

The University of Cincinnati women's basketball team came back late, but ultimately fell at home to Temple 75-68 on Saturday at Fifth Third Arena. The Bearcats' record moves to 7-7 on the season as they held the Owls to just 40.6% from the floor and only 20% from three-point range.

- Junior guard Caitlyn Wilson put in 17 points in four three-pointers
- Junior guard Akira Levy poured in 15 points, dishes out seven assists and had two steals
- Sophomore guard Jillian Hayes and sophomore forward Malea Williams flirted with double-doubles, each had eight points and eight rebounds.

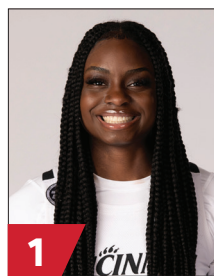
WICHITA STATE RECAP

The Bearcats' record falls to 7-8 overall and 0-3 in American Athletic Conference play. Cincinnati held its opponents to 6.3% from the three point range and 36.1% from the floor.

- Jillian Hayes recorded her second double-double of the season, recording 21 points and 11 rebounds. She was 8-for-13 from the floor, her best shooting performance of the season. The 11 rebounds also tied her season-high set against Bellarmine on 11/12/21/ She leads the team with 102 rebounds.
 - Akira Levy recorded eight assists, the most in a game since she recorded 12 against NC A&T and leads the AAC in assists.
- Caitlyn Wilson recorded five three point shots, a new season high for the junior, and leads the team with 26 made shots. This was Wilson's third straight game with four-plus made three pointers.

The University of Cincinnati women's basketball program has continued to reach new heights under Head Coach Michelle Clark-Heard since her hiring in March 2018.

Now in her fourth season, Clark-Heard owns a 61-45 mark at Cincinnati and a 239-125 record in her 12th campaign as a collegiate head coach.

Clark-Heard, who was a UC assistant from 2002-05 and also spent six seasons as the head coach at Western Kentucky University before returning to UC, amassed 46

wins in her first two years at the helm and is the only coach in program history to open a tenure with back-to-back 20 win seasons. Overall, her 10-year coaching career has seen her teams average more than 20 wins per campaign (22.4) with seven postseason appearances, including four NCAA Tournaments and three WNIT berths.

Her third season with the Bearcats (2020-21) was a season unlike any other due to COVID-19. Even with an 8-16 finish, Clark-Heard continued to showcase the talent on the court. Iimar'I Thomas was tabbed as the AAC Player of the year, receiving all 50 voting points from the league's coaches to be the only conference player to earn unanimous First Team All-AAC honors for the second consecutive season. Thomas earned national player of the week honors from the United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) after she set the UC women's basketball record and the AAC record for most points in a game when she poured in 51 points to go with 12 rebounds at East Carolina on Feb. 24. The effort still stands as the most points in a Division I men's or women's basketball game this season. She joined Oscar Robertson as the only two player in UC history to score 50 or points in a game.

Jillian Hayes was tabbed as the AAC Freshman of the year and is the fourth UC player to be named to the AAC All-Freshmen Team, joining Iimar'I Thomas (2018), Bianca Quisenberry (2014) and Anna Owens (2015).

Her second season with the Bearcats (2019-20) produced many big moments for the program. On a team level, UC posted a 22-10 record overall and went 11-5 in the American to finish tied for second, UC's best league finish in its seven-year membership in the AAC. Seeded third in the tournament, the Bearcats reached the final for the first time in the AAC as well as their first final appearance since the 2003 Conference USA Championship game. Additionally, the Bearcats finished the year 14-3 at home with a 12-game winning streak at Fifth Third Arena as well.

Individually, Clark-Heard's players enjoyed a great deal of success as well as a trio of players – Iimar'I Thomas, Antoinette Miller and Angel Rizer – all joined the program's 1,000-point club during the season, the 27th, 28th and 29th members, respectively. When it came time for awards and honors, that trio also made a big splash as each was honored by the AAC as Thomas was a unanimous selection to the first team, Miller was a second-team honoree and Rizer was twice honored as she was named the AAC Most Improved Player of the Year while earning third-team all-conference accolades as well. The honors didn't end there, however, as Thomas and Miller both were voted Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) All-America Honorable Mention selections. The awards stand as just the second and third All-America honors earned in program history, joining Debbie Merrill, a 2003 WBCA All-America Honorable Mention.

In her first season at the helm at UC in 2018-19, Clark-Heard led the Bearcats to 24 wins – the most victories in a head coach's first season in program history, and the most triumphs in 17 years (27 in 2001-02). The Red & Black's historic accomplishments also included the first time with consecutive postseason wins in program history (WNIT quarterfinals), its first 20-win season since 2003, first time with 12 conference wins since 1999, (at the time) highest-ever finish in the American (third place), and first time with three or more regular-season conference honorees since 2003 (Thomas - First Team All-AAC, Miller - Second Team All-AAC, Florence Sifa - Newcomer of the Year).

In six seasons at WKU, Clark-Heard reached four NCAA Tournaments, won four conference tournament championships and two regular season conference titles while posting 154 wins, becoming the second-fastest Lady Topper coach to reach 100 victories with the program. Clark-Heard took over a program with a 9-21 record in 2011-12 and she led the Hilltoppers to a 22-11 mark in her first season (2012-13), a 13-win improvement, which was the largest in Sun Belt Conference history.

WKU finished the 2017-18 campaign with a 24-9 record and captured the 2018 Conference USA Tournament title and qualified for its third NCAA Tournament in four years. Tashia Brown was tabbed as an Associated Press Honorable Mention All-American and the C-USA Player of the Year.

The 2016-17 campaign saw WKU claim its second sweep of the C-USA regular season and tournament championships in just three seasons as a member of the league. The Lady Toppers put together a 27-7 record and a 16-2 mark in C-USA play; the team also pieced together a 12-game winning streak entering the NCAA Tournament, culminating in a 67-56 win over Southern Miss in the C-USA championship game on March 11.

Following the season, Clark-Heard was invited to serve as an assistant coach for the United States U-23 National Team in the inaugural Four Nations Tournament in Tokyo, Japan. During her second stint with the red, white and blue, Clark-Heard helped to push the Americans to an undefeated record and the championship in the event, defeating their opponents by an average of 32 points along the way.

Following the 2014-15 season, Clark-Heard was recognized for her outstanding accomplishments, earning Conference USA Coach of the Year and 2015 United States Marine Corps/WBCA

NCAA Division I Regional Coach of the Year honors. Her selection as a WBCA Regional Coach of the Year also made her a finalist for the Pat Summitt Trophy, awarded annually to the United States Marine Corps/WBCA NCAA Division I National Coach of the Year.

Clark-Heard was named an assistant coach for the 2015 U.S. Pan American Women's Basketball Team, joining head coach Lisa Bluder of the University of Iowa and fellow assistant coach Scott Rueck of Oregon State University on the staff. In Toronto, Clark-Heard helped lead the Americans to a silver medal in her international coaching debut, falling just short in the gold medal game against the host Canadians.

In 2013-14, Clark-Heard helped WKU win its final seven regular season games before reeling off three straight in New Orleans, La., in March 2014 to win the Sun Belt Conference Championship with a 61-60 win over Arkansas State after WKU faced a 14-point deficit in the second half. The season also saw WKU defeat Georgetown in the Puerto Rico Classic after facing a 16-point deficit in the second half. The season was capped by an 87-74 loss to fifth-ranked Baylor in Waco, Texas, in the opening round of the 2014 NCAA Tournament, ending the longest NCAA Tournament appearance drought in program history.

The run to the tournament helped WKU secure a 24-9 record and finish with 20-wins for the second straight season. Her consecutive 20-win seasons to begin her time at WKU marked the first time in Sun Belt Conference history that a team had won 20 games in back-to-back years following a season in which it had won less than 10 games.

Her success in 2013-14 followed a massive improvement on the floor in 2012-13. In her first year as a Division I coach, Clark-Heard helped WKU to a 13-win improvement over the 2011-12 season output. It was the largest in Sun Belt Conference history as WKU turned a 9-21 mark into a 22-11 record. WKU's eight win improvement in conference play from five wins to 13 wins was tied for the largest in league history. The Lady Toppers also became the first team in Sun Belt Conference history to win 20 games in the season following a year in which the team won less than 10 games earlier this season.

Her first season at WKU also showcased her ability to develop players. The duo of Chastity Gooch and Alexis Govan averaged a combined 12.7 ppg in 2011-12 but posted 36.5 per outing in 2012-13. The duo combined for 1,203 points after posting 381 last season. The team also saw major improvement in nearly all statistical categories, including improving free throw shooting by over 11 percent to .739, the third highest mark in school history.

Prior to taking the reigns at WKU, Clark-Heard spent five years as an assistant coach to Jeff Walz at Louisville (2007-12). During her time with the program, the Cardinals made three Sweet 16 appearances and their first Final Four appearance, finishing as the National Runner-Up in 2009.

Showing her prowess as a recruiter, she was instrumental in bringing in the No. 12 recruiting class to UofL in 2008, then followed with three consecutive Top 10 classes in 2009, 2010 and 2011. The 2010 recruiting class was the highest ranked class in school history, No. 5 nationally.

Among the most notable players Clark-Heard coached at Louisville was overall number one pick in the 2009 WNBA Draft, Angel McCoughtry and overall number eight pick in the 2013 WNBA Draft, Shoni Shimmel. Overall, she coached five players at Louisville that went on to be drafted in the WNBA Draft.

Prior to her time at Louisville, Clark-Heard spent two seasons as the head coach at Kentucky State, taking the reigns of the program in June 2005. She took over a program that had won just one game during the 2004-05 season. In her first season, she led the Thorobrettes to a 5-23 record, four of the wins were against Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference opponents. Her team was picked to finish 11th in the SIAC but ended the season in ninth place. In her second season at KSU, she guided the Thorobrettes to an impressive 19-9 record, finishing tied for fourth place in the SIAC. Clark-Heard earned SIAC Coach-of-the-Year honors after the impressive turnaround. Her 2006-07 Thorobrettes were the second most improved team in NCAA Division II women's basketball during the 2006-07 season.

Before being named head coach at Kentucky State, Clark-Heard spent three seasons at Cincinnati as an assistant and four years at Nebraska in the same role. The Bearcats advanced to postseason play in two of her three seasons there while she helped Nebraska reach the NCAA Tournament twice during her time with the team. She was also responsible for helping sign McDonald's All-American Janice Bright for the Cornhuskers in 2001 while coaching alongside current Louisville coach Jeff Walz and under former WKU coach Paul Sanderford.

A four-year letter-winner on the Hill (1987-90), Clark-Heard was part of four NCAA Tournament teams during her Lady Topper career. She also helped guide the Lady Toppers to a pair of Sun Belt Conference Tournament championships (1988 and 1989) and two conference regular-season titles (1989 and 1990). She played in 118 games during her four years on the Hill, scoring 790 points and pulling down 615 rebounds. WKU amassed 89 victories during her four years in uniform, winning 70 percent of the games over that span and putting together three 20-win seasons.

Upon graduation from WKU, she spent eight years working within a recreational setting in Kentucky, including five years in Bowling Green and three with the Louisville Metro Parks Department.

While in Louisville, she served as head junior varsity coach and assistant varsity coach at DuPont Manual High School for the 1994-95 season. Additionally, she played professionally with the Kentucky Marauders of the Women's Basketball Association in 1994-95.

The Louisville native earned Kentucky High School State Player of the Year (1986) while playing at Atherton High School and was inducted into the Atherton Hall of Fame in 2003.

She married Luther Heard on August 16, 2003.

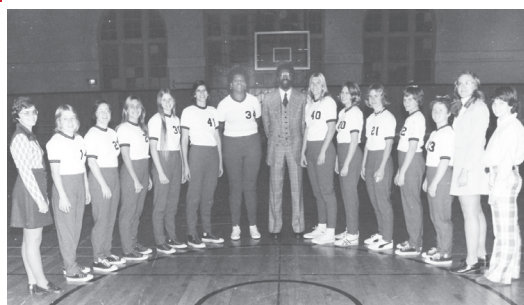
