THE RUNDOWN

- The University of Cincinnati lacrosse team hosts 10th-ranked Michigan in its home opener on Wednesday inside Nippert Stadium.
- Opening draw is set to begin at 3 p.m. Admission is free for fans.
- Sophomore attacker Camryn Callaghan was named to the American Athletic Conference Weekly Honor Roll following her performance in the Bearcats' season opener.
- Against 2023 NCAA tournament qualifier Marquette, the Upper Arlington native recorded six goals, ranking her an early second in the conference.
- Her nine shots on goal also put her second in the conference. She went 3-for-3 in free position goals against the Golden Eagles.
- This will be the fourth overall meeting between the two schools. The series began in 2019 where the Wolverines came out on top 19-9.
- Last time out, Michigan defeated Cincinnati 16-3, with senior midfielder Ava Goeller earning two goals for the Bearcats.
- Graduate student defender Dani Milkvy had eight draw controls.
- Michigan comes into the match-up ranked 10th in the most recent ILWomen/WLCA Division I poll after holding Jacksonville to one goal in their season opener.
- The Wolverines earned goals from 10 different players, with three recording hat tricks.
- Junior attacker Jill Smith led the team with four goals, six points and two assists.
- On the defensive side, junior attacker Jane Fetterolf picked up three ground balls to pair with her three goals.
- Cincinnati returns seven of its eight top scores from the 2023 season.
- Senior midfielder Julie Rose played in 18 matches with six starts last season. She found success in all three of UC's overtime games, scoring five goals.
- Rose was named a captain alongside Callaghan and graduate student defender Kimora Baile7.
- Sophomore attack Kylie Gioia will bring the Bearcats strength on the offense as she ranks second on the team with 27 goals on 47 shots and 16 assists.
- On the defensive side, graduate student Sophia Finotti brings leadership to Cincinnati with 16 caused turnovers and 25 groundballs, ranking second on the team.

SHE'S BACKKKK

- Dani Mlkvy returns to the Bearcats lineup for another season as a graduate student. Mlkvy was named of the AAC Preseason All-Conference Team on Jan 30. Her 6.33 draw controls per game led the AAC and ranked 18th nationally. Mlkvy's 218 career draw controls are second to her sister, Sam's, 280 in program history. She started all 18 contests and had four matches of 10 or more DCs, with UC winning each of them.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

- Cincinnati welcomed 11 newcomers including 10 freshman and one transfer.
- Freshman Hailey Simpson was named by unanimous midfielder All League Division A team selection in 2023. She helped lead Flint Hill High School to a runner-up finish in the ISL Division A Championship. Simpson is a two-time Under Armour All-American and finished as the UA All-America South Super Regional "Stat Leader" in goals and was a part of the Under Armour 150 Championship Team.
- Freshman Malia Adams helped lead her team to their first ever appearance in the Maryland state finals with a team-high 70 goals in her junior season.
- As a senior, she led her team to the regional championship and was named First Team All Montgomery County Midfielder 4A. She earned All-State Midfielder and Player of the Year accolades with 68 goals and 78 percent draw control.
- Freshman Ava LaRuffa was named a three-time All-District Defender in 2021, 2022 and 2023. She earned back-to-back All-Region Defender and All-State Defender in 2022 and 2023.
- The Centreville High School alum was awarded the 2023 Washington Post All-Met Midfielder and 2023 District Defensive Player of the Year. LaRuffa was also named a USA Lacrosse Academic All-American in 2022 and 2023.

GUARDING THE GOAL

- The Bearcats added two new goalkeepers to the roster, freshman Hailey Darko and grad student Victoria Marces.
- Macres is a graduate transfer goalie who drew action in two NCAA tournament games with 2023 Final Four participant Denver last spring. She appeared in 11 games and posted a 4-0 record in 2023.
- During her time at Denver, she notched a career-high seven saves versus Marquette and recorded a save percentage of 0.529 in 2023. A four-year letter winner at Granite Bay High School, Macres was also a three-time Varsity Scholar Athlete and earned First Team All-League selection in 2018. She was also selected to the Tenacity Elite Lacrosse All-American Team in 2018.
- Darko was the starting goalie and four-year team captain for Cherokee High School. She was named MVP All-County Defensive Player of the Year as well as being selected for the All-Star DiVarsity Georgia Team. She helped her team to the program's first ever Elite Eight appearance and concluded her high school career with over 500 career saves.
- Darko was rated the number one goalie in Georgia two years in a row in 2022 and 2023. She was named to the GHSA 7A All-Area First Team, a two-time US All-American and US All-American watch list.
- Senior Ashley Lapp returns for Cincinnati, notching the fifth-best save percentage in the AAC (.347 avg/g) and 6.83 saves per game which ranks fourth. Her 11.09 GAA was second as well and the best since 2016.
- Also had 11 saves in victory over Temple to earn AAC Goalkeeper of the Week in that 12-9 decision.

FAREWELL AAC

- The Big 12 Conference has announced it will add women's lacrosse for the 2024-25 academic year, completing Cincinnati's athletics-wide move to the league. This spring will be the Bearcats' final one in the AAC, which began offering the sport in 2019.
- UC was previously in the Big East from 2009-18 and independent in its inaugural 2008 season.

2024 CAPTAINS

- Graduate Student Kimora Bailey, senior Julie Rose and sophomore Camryn Callaghan were chosen as team captains for the 2024 season. Bailey was a key defender last season, collecting 15 ground balls, six draw controls and six caused turnovers. Rose scored five goals, all over UC's three overtime games.

Callaghan posted 56 goals to lead all freshman nationally, as well as set a new UC rookie record and marked the third-most in program history. She tied the school-record with eight goals against eventual top-25 Marquette.

REPPIN' THE RED WHITE AND BLUE

- Rising sophomore attacker Camryn Callaghan earned a place on the USA U20 Lacrosse training team.
- Head coach Gina Thomas, who is entering her 12th year at the helm, made the training team in 2005 and later played in the 2009 and 2013 World Cups.
- The 42 players named to the training team (out of 99 at the event) come from high schools from 12 states and the District of Columbia and represent 20 colleges with their current enrollment or commitment.
- The U20 training team will be back at USA Lacrosse for a training camp in August and will compete at the USA Lacrosse Fall Classic in October before the final roster is ultimately selected to represent the country at the 2024 World Lacrosse Women's U20 Championship in Hong Kong, China next summer.

SUCCESS OFF THE FIELD

- UC has earned team academic honors (3.2 GPA or higher) in nine of Head Coach Gina Thomas' 11 years at the helm as well. This past fall, the team earned a 3.6 team GPA with 32 Dean's List recipients and six TopCats (4.0 GPA).

AAC PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE HONORS

- Sophomore attack Camryn Callaghan, senior midfielder Ava Goeller and grad student defender Dani Mlkvy were named to the AAC Preseason All-Conference team.
- Callaghan was the unanimous selection for 2023 AAC Freshman of the Year. She recorded 56 goals to lead all freshmen nationally, as well as setting a new program freshman record. She ranks fifth in the AAC for free-position goals (0.67 avg/g) and tied the school-record with eight goals against eventual top-25 Marquette.
- The Upper Arlington native earned a spot on the USA U20 Lacrosse training team this past July where she will be in contention to make the 2024 team that competes in Hong Kong.
- Goeller earned the accolade for the second year in a row alongside teammate, Dani Mlkvy. She led the Bearcats with 18 assists while ranking second with 42 goals and 60 points. Her 29 draw controls ranked second to Mlkvy's school-record 114. She ranked fourth in the AAC for goals per game (2.50) and second for shots per game (6.67).
- Mlkvy was a unanimous selection. Her 6.33 draw controls per game led the AAC and ranked 18th nationally. Her 218 career draw controls are second to her sister, Sam's, 280 in program history. She started all 18 contests and had four matches of 10 or more DCs, with UC winning each of them.

WE'RE ALL IN THIS TOGETHER

- Cincinnati had five or more players score in 14 of their last 18 games.
- In their 24-9 victory over Robert Morris on Feb. 17, 2023, 10 different Bearcats scored a goal, led by Lauren Ottensmeyer and Camryn Callaghan each having five.

NEW AND OLD BOSSES

- Head coach Gina Thomas (Oliver) enters her 12th season at the helm. UC, which played in the first round of the AAC Conference Tournament last year, is picked fourth in the league.
- Both Haley Hardy and Jamie Redding enter their third year assistant coaches.
- Hardy was previously the head coach at Radford, announced in October 2014 to usher in the new program. Hardy (formerly Marvine) was a standout goalkeeper at UC from 2008-11 and a team captain.
- Redding was a former All-BIG EAST selection at Louisville and spent two seasons at Niagara. She was at Holy Cross for the three years before that.

NUMBERS TO KNOW

Last spring, the Bearcats notched 11 wins, seven of those being at home. The most since 2019, 12 overall wins and 10 at home.

Cincinnati outscored their opponents 221-192 last season with .739 shoots on goal percentage. The Bearcats also recorded 513 shots compared to their opponents 438.

MILWAUKEE, Wis. — The Cincinnati lacrosse team fell to Marquette 18-12 in Sunday's season opener in Milwaukee, Wis.

The Golden Eagles took an early lead, scoring two goals within the first five minutes of play.

Cincinnati bounced back in the second quarter with goals from senior midfielder Lauren Ottensmeyer and sophomore attacker Camryn Callaghan to make the score 6-2.

Sophomore midfielder Lexie Wolfe grabbed herself a goal to close out the first half with Marquette in front, 8-3.

The Bearcats came out of the break strong with junior attacker Kylie Gioia finding the net with the assist by senior midfielder Lindsey Durdota.

Callaghan followed by recording her second goal of the day.

Ottensmeyer's second goal came with 2:30 left in the third quarter, with an assist from senior attacker Elizabeth Murphy.

Cincinnati found rhythm in the fourth quarter, recording four unanswered goals, two from Callaghan and one each from Wolfe and Ottensmeyer.

Callaghan ended with six goals alongside Ottensmeyer's hat trick.

The Bearcats' last-minute spurt would end up not being enough to overcome the Golden Eagles.

Junior attack/midfielder Meg Birely led Marquette with seven goals.

HEAD COACH GINA THOMAS (OLIVER) | 12TH SEASON

ALL-AMERICAN AND TWO-TIME WORLD CHAMPION

Gina Oliver is heading into her 12th season as the head coach at the University of Cincinnati in 2024.

Thomas in May 2021 was elected as vice president of the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Association (IWLCA), which includes a three-year service term. She has mentored 22 All-Conference selections over her Bearcat tenure, including seven in 2019 and four in 2021. The former season saw her and assistants Shannon Witzel and Caitlin Prince named the AAC's Coaching Staff of the Year. Prior to the 2019 campaign, Cincinnati had just five conference postseason honors, all since 2015.

UC has earned team academic honors (3.2 GPA or higher) in nine of her 11 years at the helm as well.

The 2023 season saw a breakthrough for the Bearcats, improving their win total by four from the previous season. Their 11 regular-season wins matched the program record from 2019 as well. Camryn Callaghan was named the AAC Freshman of the Year, UC's second since 2019, and Dani Mlkvy and Ava Goeller joined her on the AAC's First Team. Callaghan's 56 goals helped her to a USA U20 Team tryout as well. Cincinnati also earned a road overtime win at Louisville, its first-ever over the Cardinals or an ACC foe, while defeating Vanderbilt, 19-6, for its largest-ever margin of victory against the Commodores.

In 2022, the Bearcats claimed their eighth team IWLCA Academic Award out of Thomas' 10 years at the helm, while Kylie Nause was named the AAC's Lacrosse Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Nause, en route to also earning First-Team All-AAC honors, broke the single-season school records for goals (63) and hat tricks (15). Dani Mlkvy's prowess at midfield also earned her First-Team honors, while sophomore transfer attacker Ava Goeller made the Second Team.

The Bearcats also had four All-AAC members in 2021 (Alyssa Adams, Monica Borzillo, Morgan Dukes, Sam Mlkvy) after COVID wiped out much of the 2020 season. Borzillo's career numbers reached incredible heights over her five seasons with 197 goals and 145 assists, among others.

The 2019 campaign, coming off the best season in its then-12-year program history that saw the Bearcats reach the postseason for the first time as well as finish as the runners-up in the inaugural American Athletic Conference season.

In 2018, the Bearcats strung together six wins in a row early in the year for the longest streak in program history on their way to records for wins (8) and winning percentage (.471). To get there, UC produced solid stats on both sides of the ball throughout the year, including 501 ground balls and an average of 29.47 per game, both of which led the NCAA. Offensively, the Bearcats broke single season program records for points (287), goals (201), assists (86), shots (504), shots on goal (371), man-up goals (12) and free-position goals (43). Along with their ground ball numbers, the defense also caused 187 turnovers, also a program record.

Individually, several Bearcats were solid once again, including Monica Borzillo, who was named All-BIG EAST Second Team for the second year in a row after accumulating 69 points on 42 goals and 27 assists, all of which ranked in the Top 10 of the conference. Two players recorded nearly 50 ground balls each on the year with freshman Morgan Dukes leading the way with 49 and Sam Mlkvy posting 48. Also on the defensive end, Giuliana Durso turned in a single-season record 161 saves and a 44.7 save percentage to help the Bearcats to several big wins, most notably a 17-12 win over Ohio State, the first victory in the series in program history.

UC increased its win total in 2017 and had Borzillo and Amanda Donovan named Second-Team All-BIG EAST Conference. Borzillo finished the season with 39 goals, a school-record 34 assists and 73 total points, leading the team in all categories, and ranking fourth in the BIG EAST with 2.00 assists per game, was second on the team with 33 points off 25 goals and seven assists while also ranking first in caused turnovers (28), fourth in ground balls (33) and fourth in draw controls (26).

The 2016 season saw the Bearcats double their win total from a season ago, while defender Kyara Byner became the first player in program history to earn first team All-BIG EAST honors, as well as All-Region honors from the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association.

The 2015 campaign saw a UC player earn postseason honors from the BIG EAST Conference for the first time in program history. Courtney Curtis was named second team All-BIG EAST after leading the team in goals at 37.

In 2014, Oliver coached the Bearcats to six victories, including a program record five-game winning streak that saw the team receive



votes in the Brine/Inside Lacrosse Media Poll for the first time ever. This was after losing the team's top scorer, Megan Bell, to injury in just the seventh game of the year. Five different Bearcats earned weekly honor from the BIG EAST Conference during the season, including Bell as Offensive Player of the Week and goalie Meg Gulmi as Defensive Player of the Week.

Her debut season in Cincinnati saw the 2013 Bearcats match the program record with seven wins, highlighted by the school's first-ever BIG EAST victory over Rutgers to cap the season. Bell led the team in scoring, while Gulmi started every game as a rookie and averaged a league-best 8.88 saves per game. The win totals in 2013 and 2014 marked the best consecutive seasons in program history until the 2017-18 campaigns came along when UC won six and eight, respectively.

Oliver spent the previous five seasons at Duquesne (2008-2012) as the Dukes' defensive coordinator, where she produced a 2012 Atlantic-10 Defensive Player of the Year and Rookie of the Year. During her time at Duquesne, Oliver coached six IWLCA All-Region players, 21 all-conference honorees, 13 members of the A-10 All-Rookie Team and 12 student-athletes who won academic all-conference accolades.

A 2005 graduate of Ohio State, Oliver spent the 2006 and 2007 seasons on the Buckeyes staff, working under OSU head coach Sue Stimmel. While in Columbus, Oliver served as co-director of the Ohio State Women's Lacrosse Camp, while also assisting with recruiting, budgeting and scholarship duties, as well as travel and team practice planning.

Oliver was one of 18 players on the U.S. Women's National Team that won gold at the Federation of International Lacrosse (FIL) World Cup in 2013. Playing as a defender at the World Cup, Oliver recorded 10 ground balls and caused seven turnovers. The highlight came as she was named the player of the game in Team USA's 21-8 semifinal win over England after causing three turnovers and picking-up four ground balls. It was the second FIL World Cup gold for Oliver, who also won the World Cup in June 2009 and was named to the All-World Team, which is awarded to the best 12 players in the world.

A standout midfielder at Ohio State (2002-05), Oliver was a four-year letter winner for the Buckeyes and earned All-America honors three times. During her career, she collected All-America honors from the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association (second team in 2003 and third team in 2004), WomensLacrosse.com (first team in 2003 and third team in 2005) and Warrior/Inside Lacrosse (first team in 2003). She was the American Lacrosse Conference Player of the Year in 2003 as Ohio State won the American Lacrosse Conference Championship and the league's rookie of the year in 2002. Oliver was also a four-time, First-Team All-ALC selection.

The Pottstown, Pa., native closed out her time at OSU as the program's career leader in ground balls (236) and caused turnovers (201) and was second in draw controls (121). She also was third in career points with 166 while ranking second in goals scored (125) and sixth in assists (41).
