CINCINNATI – The University of Cincinnati women's soccer program begins a three-game home stand by hosting the Louisville Cardinals on Thursday inside Gettler Stadium.

Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. and fans can participate in tye dying t-shirts along with Bearcat thunder sticks exclusively for UC students.

Cincinnati enters the match 2-1-0 after falling to Central Michigan, 2-1. The Bearcats could not overcome a quick start by the Chippewas, scoring both their goals in the first 11 minutes of action.

// FELTON'S FEELIN' IT

Freshman Rylee Felton is off to a stellar start of her debut season. Felton has scored in two of the last three games for the Bearcats, including the game winning goal in the season opener vs. Murray State. She recorded Cincinnati's lone goal against Central Michigan this past Sunday.

// SPREADING THE WEALTH

Cincinnati has seen several players contribute to the scoresheet in the early stages of this season. So far, five different players have scored, compared to just eight throughout the entirety of last season. Fifth-year player Ellie Flower brings back her leadership in the offense, having returned as a top scorer and already notched one goal this season.

// SCOUTING THE CARDINALS

Last season showcased significant breakthroughs for the Cardinals, including their first-ever victory over Duke and a historic draw against Virginia. Louisville also set a program record with five draws, underscoring their competitiveness in tough match-

Louisville faces the task of replenishing its offensive firepower after a season that saw limited goal production. Molly Cochran and Emersen Jennings, each with two goals last year, lead the returning scorers. The return of Brooke Dardano and Amber Jackson from injury promises added depth, with Jackson boasting an impressive career tally of eight goals and eight assists.

Defensively, the Cardinals benefit from the return of Karsyn Cherry, known for her scoring ability from the backline with three goals in her freshman season.

In goal, Erynn Floyd returns after starting 32 of the last 34 games across two seasons, setting a career high with 62 saves last year.

Head Coach Karen Ferguson-Dayes enters her 25th season leading a squad marked by a blend of seasoned returners and promising newcomers. Louisville boasts a roster of 14 players returning from the 2023 season, which marked several historic milestones for the program.

NUMBERS TO KNOW

Since the Bearcats' inaugural season in 1980, the team has had eight NCAA Tournament appearances, with the most recent appearance coming in 2015.

The program has won 417 matches, with a winning percentage of .560 since the formation of the team in 1980. The program's 800th game was the team's season opener against Michigan State.

Junior transfer Coley Sidloski will rep the number 3 this year in honor of her sister and former UC student athlete, Ally Sidloski, who passed away in 2021. This will be the first time since 2022 that #3 is worn, last done so by Vanessa DiNardo, also in honor of Ally.

The Bearcats will roster 32 student athletes for the 2024 season. The 32 is made up of 21 returning players, two transfers and nine freshman. Seven of the 32 players are native Ohioians.

Cincinnati sits 12th in the Big 12 Conference Preseason Poll. This will be the programs second year in the 12 after officially joining last

Fifth year goalkeeper Anna Rexford Cincinnati returns great numbers from brings stability to a UC backline that will be replacing key players from last season. The Wilmore, Ky., native has started 64 straight games and has accumulated the sixth-most career wins (23), seventh-most career shutouts (15) and eighth-most career saves (205) in program history.

// A CONFERENCE CHANGE IS **NOTHING NEW**

With UC joining the Big 12, it will mark the sixth new conference the Bearcats have joined since the programs formation in 1980 (note team was independent from 1984-93.) The Bearcats have reached double-digit wins in there previous conference inaugural seasons, including going 15-5-2 as part of the GMC in 1994.

// NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

The Bearcats 2024 roster features eight freshman and three transfers. Coley Sidloski (Ohio State), Ashlyn Basinger (Maryland) and Jenna Daveler (Old Dominion) all come with previous collegiate experience.

// WELCOMING THE WEST

The Big 12 Conference welcomed four new members ahead of the 2024-25 season. The Bearcats will face three of the four new conference members this upcoming season. UC will host Colorado on Oct. 17 for the first match between the two programs since 2015.

In December, the program announced the return of four key fifth year players. tied for the team lead in goals with Vyviene Spaudling (F), Lauren Bastian (M), Ellie Flower (F/M) and Anna Rexford (GK) will suit up in the red and



HEAD COACH ERICA DEMERS | SECOND SEASON



University of Cincinnati Director of Athletics John Cunningham announced the hiring of Erica Demers as the sixth women's soccer head coach in program history on December 7, 2022.

In her first year as head coach of the Bearcats, Demers led UC to the program's first Big 12 Championship Tournament victory, defeating Baylor 3-2 in the first round of the tournament in the team's first year in the conference.

Demers ushers in the new era after elevating the University of Alabama at Birmingham to unrivaled success during six seasons as head coach.

Demers was honored as the 2022 Conference USA Coach of the Year following a 9-4-5 overall and 6-1-3 Conference USA record that featured a program-best 10-match unbeaten streak. The Blazers had a league-best six student-athletes named to All-Conference teams and the conference's Defensive Player of the Year in Asha Zuniga.

During her time in Birmingham, Demers coached the Blazers to 23 All-Conference selections, 16 conference All-Academic honorees and an overall record of 50-38-19.

Hired on May 22, 2017, Demers orchestrated one of the best turnarounds in the NCAA in her first season at the helm by increasing the team's win total by nine games and leading the Blazers to their most wins since 2004.

Prior to her tenure with the Blazers, Demers spent 12 seasons on Dave Dilanni's staff at Iowa and Grand Valley State. She helped lead Iowa to 29 victories, coached three All-Big Ten performers and 31 Big Ten All-Academic selections in three seasons.

At Grand Valley State, she helped guide the Lakers to three NCAA Division II national titles, nine GLIAC championships and nine NCAA regional championships. She spent her final two seasons as associate head coach of the program.

In addition to her coaching duties, Demers served as the school's recruiting coordinator, camps coordinator and instructor, strength and conditioning coach and fundraising director. She also was instrumental in the team's academic success, as she coached two Academic All-American of the Year honorees, eight Academic All-Americans, one Elite 88 Award winner and more than 40 athletes to GLIAC All-Academic honors during her tenure.

Demers started her coaching career at The Citadel, where she served one season as a graduate assistant.

As a student-athlete, Demers led Oakland to four-straight Mid-Continent Conference titles and three-straight NCAA Tournament appearances. She was a two-time First Team All-Conference selection and was named Conference Player of the Year in 2002.

Demers competed for the Canadian U-21 National Team and was part of the 2000 Canadian National Championship Team. In 1997-98, she played for the National Training Centre team and was a member of the Ontario Provincial Team for five seasons.

The Welland, Ontario, Canada native graduated from Oakland with a Bachelor of Health Science in 2004 and earned her Master's in Education while at Grand Valley State in 2009.

- · Paul Babba joined the Cincinnati women's soccer staff in March of 2024 and enters his first season at UC as an assocaite head coach.
- Babba spent the last two seasons as the head coach of Bellarmine's women's soccer program. He has more than 16 years of collegiate soccer coaching experience, including other head coaching roles at Delta State, Bryan College and Kentucky.
- During his two-year stint at Bellarmine, he led one of the top defensive units in the ASUN.
- Prior to joining Bellarmine, he spent two seasons as an assistant coach/recruiting coordinator at Kentucky, where he also assumed the role of interim head coach for the final three games of the fall 2021 campaign.
- Before heading to Lexington, Babba served as an assistant coach/recruiting coordinator at Elon and helped lead the Phoenix to a 12-6-2 season and the program's first-ever berth in the Colonial Athletic Association
- · In 2017 he was recognized as the Appalachian Athletic Conference Coach of the Year as he led Bryan College to its first-ever AAC regular-season championship and berth in the NAIA National Tournament while posting the winningest season in program history at 12-7 overall and 9-2 in conference play.
- Under his guidance that season, the Lions also garnered AAC acknowledgments for Offensive Player of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year and Freshman of the Year. In his two seasons at Bryan College, the program accumulated nine All-AAC and 13 All-Academic Team honors.
- Babba's first head-coaching job at the collegiate level came at Delta State University, a Division II program in Mississippi, and led the program for five years (2011-15).
- He played collegiately from 2003-06 at Belhaven University, where he was a team captain his last two seasons and ranked third all-time at the school in points (92) and tied for third in goals (37). After college, he played two summers for Mississippi Brilla FC.



RACHAEL COLLINS ASSISTANT COACH SECOND SEASON • PEPPERDINE UNIVERSITY 2017

- Collins joined the staff after spending the last two seasons in the same role with Erica Demers at the University of Alabama Birmingham from 2021-22. In her stint with the Blazers, the pair compiled a 16-13-8 record and earned 11 All-Conference
- selections.

 Prior to UAB, Collins served as a volunteer assistant coach for two seasons at Alabama from 2019-20. With the Crimson Tide, she helped develop five All-SEC performers, including midfielder Reyna Reyes who played on the Mexican Senior National Team and was named to the United Soccer Coaches' All-Southeast Region Third Team.
- Collins spent two seasons as an assistant coach at UC Davis from 2017-18. In her time with the Aggies, she coached four All-Big West honorees. Collins was instrumental in the development of goalkeeper Alexis Smith, who finished as UC Davis' all-time leader in shutouts and saves.



OLIVIA SILVERMAN ASSISTANT COACH FIRST SEASON •SAINT LOUIS, 2020

- Olivia Silverman joined the Cincinnati women's soccer coaching staff in March of 2024 and enters her first season as an assistant coach.
- The Cincinnati native, Silverman returns to her hometown after spending the last five years coaching at her alma mater, Saint Louis, working primarily with the goalkeepers.
 Following two seasons as a volunteer assistant for the Billikens, the SLU graduate and former
- Billiken goalkeeper was elevated to assistant coach in 2021.
- During her time as a coach, she has helped lead Saint Louis to five straight Atlantic 10 Tournament Championships and five straight NCAA tournament appearances as the Billikens advanced all the way to the Sweet Sixteen in 2023.
- In 2022, Silverman's work as a goalkeeper coach played a key role in the team breaking the program record for wins in a single season. SLU finished the year with a record of 20-2 and 10-0 in conference play as SLU allowed only 10 goals all season long.

 Silverman played three seasons (2016-18) at Saint Louis and concluded her career sixth in
- shutouts (11), seventh in wins (17), ninth in minutes (2,106) and 10th in saves (50) on SLU's career lists.
- A two-year team captain for Seven Hills School in Cincinnati. She was a four-time All-Conference selection and a two-time All-City choice and she garnered All-America and All-State honors as a senior.
