CINCINNATI - The University of Cincinnati women's soccer program will face Toledo for its home opener at 1 p.m. on Sunday inside Gettler Stadium.

The Bearcats will then travel out to South Bend, Ind., to face Notre Dame on Thursday, Aug. 21 inside Alumni Soccer Stadium.

Cincinnati's match versus Toledo will be broadcast nationally on ESPN+.

SERIES HISTORY

- Cincinnati and Toledo have met four times in their history, with the Bearcats holding a 3-1-0 edge.
- The two teams faced off last year at Paul Hotmer Field, resulting in a 3-2 win for Cincinnati. Megan Smith and Ellie Flower scored in the win for the Bearcats.

LAST TIME OUT

- Cincinnati won its season opener, defeating Eastern Michigan, 4-0, on Thursday night inside Scicluna Field. Cincinnati's four goals marked its highest output in a season opener since Aug. 31, 1999, when UC defeated Xavier, 4-2.
- Senior Maddie Swingle buried a penalty kick in the 11th minute before heading in her second goal in the 61st for the first multi-goal game of her career.
- UC broke the match open after halftime, scoring three times in a 10-minute stretch. Faith Broering and Swingle delivered back-to-back headers in the 56th and 61st minutes, both off assists from Claire Rea. Broering also assisted Swingle's second goal.
- Freshman Bryana Gaynor capped the scoring in the 65th minute with her first collegiate goal.
- Goalie Camryn Miller, making her Cincinnati debut, was the only Bearcat to play the full 90 minutes and recorded two saves in the shutout.
- Freshmen Dru Dorsey, Kailey Shannon, Bryana Gaynor, Kayla Gaynor, Christa Gibbons and Ava "AJ" Hendrick made their collegiate debuts.

RETURNING STRENGTH

- Cincinnati brings back eight starters from last season, including Emma Gioffre, Faith Broering, and Megan Smith, each of whom started all 19 matches. Twelve of UC's 17 returners appeared in double-digit games for the Red & Black.
- While the Bearcats will miss five-year starting goalkeeper Anna Rexford, they return their entire defensive line, featuring Broering, Oubs, Swingle, and Daveler.

NEW CATS ON THE BLOCK

- The Bearcats welcome four transfers and eight freshmen to the 2025 roster. Cincinnati's freshman class includes Lexi O'Shea, Christa Gibbons, Ava "AJ" Hendrick, Kailey Shannon, Lily DiBernardo, Dru Dorsey and twins Kayla and Bryana Gaynor.
- Transfers Camryn Miller (Virginia), Molly Cochran (Louisville), Karson Yon (Minnesota) and Joy Kimwemwe (USF) also join the Bearcats.

Graduate student Ellie Flower is just two appearances shy of reaching 50 career matches.
 She also needs nine goals to hit the 20-goal milestone.

NUMBERS TO KNOW

The sophomore class this season features six returners (Oubs, Felton, Barber, Arthurs, Helfen and Brandon) and two transfers (Yon and Kimwemwe). Four returners played over 10 games last season, totaling nine goals, four assists, and 3,000+ minutes played.

The Bearcats roster features six international players, bringing global experience and diverse playing styles to the team. Five athletes represent Canada and one hails from Slovakia. Laura Zemberyova, from Slovakia, has appeared in over 50 international matches.

Junior transfer Coley Sidloski reps the number 3 in honor of her sister and former UC student athlete, Ally Sidloski, who passed away in 2021. The number 3 was first worn in Ally's memory by Vanessa DiNardo during the 2022 season.

The Bearcats will roster 29 student athletes for the 2025 season. The 29 is made up of 17 returning players, four transfers and eight freshmen. Five of the 29 players are native

Sophomore Rylee Felton led the team in goals (seven) in her debut season. Which was the most goals in season by a Bearcat since 2021.

Graduate student Ellie Flower is two games away from making 50 appearances in her career. She returns for her sixth season with the Bearcats.

LAST TIME VS. TOLEDO

TOLEDO, Ohio - The University of Cincinnati women's soccer program defeated Toledo in its first road match of the year, 3-2, on Aug. 18, 2024 inside Paul Hotmer Field.

The Bearcats move to 2-0-0 on the season for the first time since 2017.

Several new faces were featured in today's lineup including freshmen Anna Barber, Rylee Felton and Carly Oubs. All three showed strong potential in the Bearcats' season opener versus Murray State.

The first 18 minutes of play were pretty quiet until junior Megan Smith nailed it right past the goalie in a free-kick opportunity.

Toledo's Morgan Spitler found an opening in the 47th minute but the shot was ultimately blocked by fifth-year goalkeeper Anna Rexford.

The Rockets tied the match up in the 65th minute with a first-time collegiate goal from freshman Gabby Anulare.

The Bearcats regained the lead when fifthyear Ellie Flower sped past the defender and found the back of the net in the 71st minute.

Fifth-year Vyviene Spaulding nailed one right off a defender's head into the goal to extend Cincinnati's lead in the 78th minute.

One minute later, Anulare responded with another goal to close in on the Bearcats but was not enough to overcome the UC offense.

// TRANSFERS TO NOTE

Transfers Miller, Cochran, Yon and Kimwemwe bring experience to the 2025 crew and look to make a big impact on the field.

Kimwemwe, a 5-foot-3 forward, appeared in eight games for the Bulls, where she recorded five shots (two on goal) and one assist.

Cochran, a 5-foot-8 midfielder, made 28 appearances for the Cardinals in her two years there, securing three goals and 21 shots (12 on goal).

Miller, a 5-foot-9 redshirt senior goalkeeper, made three appearances with one start at UVA.

Yon, a sophomore defender, did not see action her freshman year at Minnesota.

// FELTON-FLOWER CONNECTION

Sophomore forward Rylee Felton and graduate student forward/midfielder Ellie Flower have established themselves as a potent offensive duo for the Bearcats. They combined for 13 goals, five assists, and 31 points last season. Felton led the team with a .609 shots-on-goal percentage, while Flower contributed six goals and a team-high four assists over 19 games.

Together, Felton and Flower contributed 54% of Cincinnati's goals, nearly 28% of the team's assists, and accounted for 47% of the Bearcats' total points last season. They assisted each other's goals in three consecutive games.

Flower's team-high 16 points were the most since Vanessa DiNardo had 19 in 2021.

// FELTON'S BACK

Sophomore Rylee Felton made a significant impact in her freshman season despite missing five Big 12 games due to illness, tallying seven goals, 23 shots (14 on goal), three game-winning goals, and one assist. She led the team in goals and game-winners, while ranking second in points (15) and shots on goal (14). Felton earned Big 12 Co-Freshman of the Week honors for September 4, 2024 — her first weekly accolade and Cincinnati's only one of the

// ZEMBERYOVA RETURNS

Graduate student Laura Zemberyova returns to the pitch after missing the 2024 season with an injury suffered before the year began — her second season-ending setback in the last three years. A primary offensive weapon in 2023, she started all 15 games she played in, leading the Bearcats with a career-high four goals and adding an assist. She clinched Cincinnati's first-ever Big 12 conference tournament appearance, scoring the game-tying goal against West Virginia. She came to UC with head coach Erica Demers from UAB, where she earned All-Conference USA honors as both a freshman and sophomore despite also missing the 2022 season due to injury.

// SOPHOMORE RISE

The sophomore class this season features six returners (Oubs, Felton, Barber, Arthurs, Helfen, and Brandon) and two transfers (Yon and Kimwemwe). Four of the returners appeared in 10 or more games last season — including Oubs (19), Barber (19), Felton (14), and Arthurs (14) — while Kimwemwe saw action in eight games for USF. They combined for nine goals, four assists, and over 3,000 minutes played.

Felton led the team in goals scored (seven) and was second on the team in points (15). Oubs played 1,447 minutes as the one of the team's starting defenders.

// BIG SHOES TO FILL

The Bearcats will look to replace the steady presence of Anna Rexford, who graduated after playing every one of the team's 1,710 minutes in goal last season. Rexford earned 83 consecutive career starts (second in program history) and ranks fourth all-time at UC in both saves and shutouts.

Cincinnati's goalkeeping crew now features returning sophomores Kate Helfen and Amber Brandon, along with transfer Camryn Miller from Virginia. Miller made three appearances with one start in 2024, combining for shutouts against Utah Valley (8/25) and NC State (10/10). She earned a solo shutout in her first career start vs. Howard (9/8).

// FAMILIAR FACES

Sophomore midfielder Anna Barber reunites with fellow NC Courage alum Karson Yon, a North Carolina native who transferred from Minnesota. They are the only two North Carolina natives on the 2025 roster. Barber appeared in all 19 matches as a freshman, starting twice (against Toledo and West Virginia). She logged 590 minutes on the pitch and finished the season with nine shots.

// TWINS FROM TORONTO

Freshman twins Bryana and Kayla Gaynor join the Bearcats from Toronto, Ontario, where they developed their game with NDC Ontario. Bryana, a forward, has also been part of Canada's U-17 Women's National Team program, competing in the 2023 Concacaf U-17 Qualifiers and an international series in Portugal. The duo won the League 1 premiere championship in 2023.

// BEARCATS WORLDWIDE

Cincinnati's 2025 roster boasts six international players representing two countries. Canadians Claire Rea, Jada Arthurs, Kayla Gaynor, Bryana Gaynor, and Joy Kimwemwe continue a growing branch of head coach Erica Demers' deep recruiting ties to her home country.

Laura Zemberyova, from Slovakia, has been a member of her country's youth national team since 2015, appearing in over 50 international matches.

// WE PLAY FOR 3

Senior Coley Sidloski proudly wears the number 3 jersey in honor of her sister and former UC student-athlete, Ally Sidloski, who passed away in 2021. The number 3 was first worn in Ally's memory by Vanessa DiNardo during the 2022 season. After DiNardo, the number remained unworn until Coley transferred to Cincinnati in 2024.

Each year, the Sidloski family awards a memorial scholarship to a player who embodies the spirit of "Playing for 3." Maddie Swingle was the recipient last year. Along with this presentation, 150 UC student-athletes were awarded the "Bearcat Strong" award — a yearly award in honor of Ally's memory.

// THE SPIRIT OF 3

In last year's "Play for 3" game, Coley Sidloski sealed Cincinnati's 2-1 victory over Kansas State by scoring the game-winning goal in the 68th minute. "That moment was surreal. I had tears in my eyes as soon as the ball hit the back of the net," Sidloski reflected.

Vanessa DiNardo, who wore number 3 in honor of Ally in 2022, scored the team's first goal of the season against NKU. Last season, Sidloski scored the first goal for Cincinnati in a 2-1 win over Murray State.

// CLIFTON CONFIDENCE

Head coach Erica Demers and her staff adopted a saying at the beginning of the 2024 season to help the team adapt to the changes at hand and embody the team's mindset and playing style, which is to play with "Clifton Confidence." The effect of Clifton Confidence became a reality during the match against then-ranked No. 6 BYU on Sept. 28, 2023, where the team went and shocked the Cougars and 5,000 fans in attendance, walking away with a 1-1 draw against one best scoring teams in the nation, and a team that advanced all the way to the 2023 College Cup Final Four.

// PROFESSIONAL BEARCATS

Vanessa Gilles, a former student-athlete at UC from 2014-17 was recently inducted into the James P. Kelly Hall of Fame in 2024. Gilles was named Canada Soccer's 2024 Player of the Year, marking her first time receiving the national honor. She anchored the Canada Women's National Team (CANWNT) defense throughout 2024, starting in 14 matches and showcasing her offensive talents with four goals and one assist. Vanessa is a 2021 Olympic gold medal-ist.

Ashley Barron, a former UC student-athlete from 2019-23, began her professional career in Örebro, Sweden, as she gained a one-year contract with KIF Örebro DFF in February of 2024.

Lauren Bastian, a former UC student-athlete from 2020-24, begins her professional career this year with Odysseas Moschatou Women's FC in Moschato, Athens, Greece.



HEAD COACH ERICA DEMERS | THIRD SEASON



University of Cincinnati Director of Athletics John Cunningham announced the hiring of Erica Demers as the sixth women's soccer head coach in program history on December 7, 2022.

In her first year as head coach of the Bearcats, Demers led UC to the program's first Big 12 Championship Tournament victory, defeating Baylor 3-2 in the first round of the tournament in the team's first year in the conference.

During her second season, she led the team to a overall record of 6-9-4. Under Demers' leadership, Cincinnati has secured back-to-back appearances in the Big 12 Championship.

Demers ushered in the Bearcats' new era after elevating the University of Alabama at Birmingham to unrivaled success during six seasons as head coach.

Demers was honored as the 2022 Conference USA Coach of the Year following a 9-4-5 overall and 6-1-3 Conference USA record that featured a program-best 10-match unbeaten streak. The Blazers had a league-best six student-athletes named to All-Conference teams and the conference's Defensive Player of the Year in Asha Zuniga.

During her time in Birmingham, Demers coached the Blazers to 23 All-Conference selections, 16 conference All-Academic honorees and an overall record of 50-38-19.

Hired on May 22, 2017, Demers orchestrated one of the best turnarounds in the NCAA in her first season at the helm by increasing the team's win total by nine games and leading the Blazers to their most wins since 2004.

Prior to her tenure with the Blazers, Demers spent 12 seasons on Dave Dilanni's staff at Iowa and Grand Valley State. She helped lead Iowa to 29 victories, coached three All-Big Ten performers and 31 Big Ten All-Academic selections in three seasons.

At Grand Valley State, she helped guide the Lakers to three NCAA Division II national titles, nine GLIAC championships and nine NCAA regional championships. She spent her final two seasons as associate head coach of the program. In addition to her coaching duties, Demers served as the school's recruiting coordinator, camps coordinator and instructor, strength and conditioning coach and fundraising director. She also was instrumental in the team's academic success, as she coached two Academic All-American of the Year honorees, eight Academic All-Americans, one Elite 88 Award winner and more than 40 athletes to GLIAC All-Academic honors during her tenure.

Demers started her coaching career at The Citadel, where she served as a graduate assistant.

As a student-athlete, Demers led Oakland to four-straight Mid-Continent Conference titles and three-straight NCAA Tournament appearances. She was a two-time First Team All-Conference selection and was named Conference Player of the Year in 2002.

Demers competed for the Canadian U-21 National Team and was part of the 2000 Canadian National Championship Team. In 1997-98, she played for the National Training Centre team and was a member of the Ontario Provincial Team for five seasons. The Welland, Ontario, Canada native graduated from Oakland with a Bachelor of Health Science in 2004 and earned her Master's in Education while at Grand Valley State in 2009.

- Paul Babba joined the Cincinnati women's soccer staff in March of 2024 and enters his second season at UC as an assocaite head coach
- In his two years at Cincinnati, Babba has played a big role in the development and consistency of the Bearcats defense.
- Babba spent two seasons as the head coach of Bellarmine's women's soccer program (2022-2023). He has more than 17 years of collegiate soccer coaching experience, including other head coaching roles at Delta State, Bryan College and Kentucky.

 During his two-year stint at Bellarmine, he led one of the top defensive units in the ASUN.
- Prior to joining Bellarmine, he spent two seasons as an assistant coach/recruiting coordinator at Kentucky, where he also assumed the role of interim head coach for the final three games of the fall 2021 campaign.
- Before heading to Lexington, Babba served as an assistant coach/recruiting coordinator at Elon and helped lead the Phoenix to a 12-6-2 season and the program's first-ever berth in the CAA tournament. In 2017 he was recognized as the Appalachian Athletic Conference Coach of the Year as he led Bryan
- College to its first-ever AAC regular-season championship and berth in the NAIA National Tournament while posting the winningest season in program history at 12-7 overall and 9-2 in conference play. Babba's first head-coaching job at the collegiate level came at Delta State University, a Division II
- program in Mississippi, and led the program for five years (2011-15). He played collegiately from 2003-06 at Belhaven University, where he was a team captain his last two seasons and ranked third all-time at the school in points (92) and tied for third in goals (37). After college, he played two summers for Mississippi Brilla FC.





OLIVIA SILVERMAN ASSISTANT COACH SECOND SEASON • SAINT LOUIS, 2020

- Olivia Silverman joined the Cincinnati women's soccer coaching staff in March of 2024 and enters her second season as an assistant coach.
- During her two years at Cincinnati, she brought a lot of growth and success to the goalkeepers at UC. Her work with Anna Rexford over the years helped Rexford finish her career in the top 10 in several program records.
- The Cincinnati native, Silverman returns to her hometown after spending the previous five years coaching at her alma mater, Saint Louis, working primarily with the goalkeepers.
- Following two seasons as a volunteer assistant for the Billikens, the SLU graduate and former Billiken
- goalkeeper was elevated to assistant coach in 2021.
 During her time as a coach, she has helped lead Saint Louis to five straight Atlantic 10 Tournament Championships and five straight NCAA tournament appearances as the Billikens advanced all the way to the Sweet Sixteen in 2023.
- In 2022, Silverman's work as a goalkeeper coach played a key role in the team breaking the program record for wins in a single season. SLU finished the year with a record of 20-2 and 10-0 in conference play as SLU allowed only 10 goals all season long.

 Silverman played three seasons (2016-18) at Saint Louis and concluded her career sixth in shutouts (11),
- seventh in wins (17), ninth in minutes (2,106) and 10th in saves (50) on SLU's career lists.

 A two-year team captain for Seven Hills School in Cincinnati, she was a four-time All-Conference
- selection and a two-time All-City choice and she garnered All-America and All-State honors as a senior.
- She is a 2020 graduate of Saint Louis University and earned a bachelor's degree in public health.

- Ella Rogers joined the Cincinnati's women's soccer coaching staff in July of 2025 and enters her first season as a assistant coach.
- Returning to her home state of Ohio, Rogers joins Cincinnati after spending her senior year at Arkansas, where she played as a midfielder.
- During her season with the Razorbacks, she recorded one goal, three assists, and posted a .429 shots-
- on-goal percentage.

 Prior to Arkansas, Rogers spent three seasons at Xavier, where she started 65 games, tallied eight goals, 93 shots (39 on goal), and three game-winning goals.

 Rogers earned Big East Freshman of the Year, Second Team All-Big East, and All-Freshman Team honors.

 That year, she helped Xavier capture the 2021 Big East Regular Season Championship and secure the program's first at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament.
- In her sophomore year, she was named to the NCAA Division I All-Ohio Second Team. Rogers contributed four assists in conference play as Xavier went unbeaten in Big East action for the first time in program history and earned another NCAA Tournament appearance.
