Bye Week: #12/14 Texas Tech and Utah

- The Big I2 has eight wins versus Power Four opponents, which ties the 2002 season as the most non-conference wins against major conference opponents in league history.
- The Conference's eight non-conference wins against Power Four opponents in 2025 are the second most in FBS.
- Seven of the 30 undefeated FBS programs entering Week Five are from the Big I2, tied for the second most of any conference.
- Big I2 QB Club: Baylor's Sawyer Robertson, Kansas' Jalon Daniels, TCU's Josh Hoover, and Texas Tech's Behren Morton all rank in the top IO nationally in passing touchdowns.
- Big I2 QB Club: Josh Hoover from TCU and Sawyer Robertson from Baylor rank first and third in FBS in passing yards at 333.3 and 330.0 yards per game, respectively.
- TCU (7 wins T-2nd), BYU (5 wins T-9th) and Iowa State (5 wins T-9th) give the Big I2 Conference three of the I3 longest active win streaks in FBS.
- BYU (T-Ist), Arizona (T-6th), UCF (T-6th), Houston (IIth), Texas Tech (I4th) and Cincinnati (20th) give the Conference six of the top 20 scoring defenses in the country.
- TCU's Eric McAlister's 254 receiving yards vs. SMU are the most in an FBS game this year and made him the seventh Big I2 player ever to have at least 250 receiving yards and three receiving touchdowns in a game.

Conference News & Notes

- Last Week, CU's Kaidon Salter became the sixth different Big I2 quarterback to have a game this season with at least 300 passing yards and three passing touchdowns with zero interceptions. No other FBS conference has more than four such players this season.
- The Big I2 Conference will publicly provide player availability reports for all Conference games this season at BigI2Sports.com/FBReporting, beginning three days prior to kickoff.
- The Big I2 had five I5-point wins against FBS opponents this week, which tied for the most among all conferences in Week Four.
- BYU's I6 points allowed and 5.3 points allowed per game this season are both tied for the fewest in the FBS with Ohio State. It's the fewest points allowed by a Big I2 team through three games of a season since TCU in 20I2 set the conference record with just I3.
- In KU's win on Saturday, Emmanuel Henderson Jr. became the first Big I2 player to have a kickoff return touchdown of at least 90 yards and at least six catches in the same game since Texas Tech's Jakeem Grant had two such games during the 2015 season.
- Arizona's Genesis Smith and BYU's Tanner Wall represented the Big I2 on the 2025 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team. Established in I992 by the College Football Association, the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team recognizes the extra efforts made off the field by college football players and student support staff who go the extra mile for those in need.

College Football Playoff (CFP) Selection Process

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is the event that crowns the national champion in college football. The CFP Selection Committee ranks the top 25 teams at the end of the season, and the I2 playoff participants consist of the five highest-ranked conference champions, plus the next seven highest-ranked teams. The four highest ranked conference champions will be seeded one through four and receive a first-round bye. The schools seeded five through eight will host those seeded nine through I2 in first-round games. The quarterfinals and semifinals rotate annually among six bowl games – the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic, Vrbo Fiesta Bowl, Capital One Orange Bowl, Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, Rose Bowl Game presented by Prudential and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. This year's quarterfinals will take place on December 31, 2025, and January 1, 2026, while the semifinals will be January 8-9, 2026. The College Football Playoff National Championship will be Monday, January 19, 2026, at Hard Rock Stadium in Miami.
