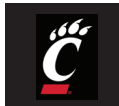

THE RUNDOWN

- The 2025-26 campaign marks the 125th season of competition for Cincinnati men's basketball, and the Bearcats will commemorate the milestone with a year-long celebration honoring the program's rich history, iconic players and cultural legacy. Cincinnati men's basketball, which was named a top-10 program in college basketball history by the Associated Press, boasts 44 All-Americans, 41 conference titles, six Final Four appearances and back-to-back national championships across its history, which dates back to the 1901-02 season.
- Cincinnati head coach Wes Miller is in his fifth season as the University of Cincinnati's men's basketball head coach, poised to take the Bearcats to the next level in their third year of the nation's best basketball conference, the Big 12. The 42-year-old Miller already boasts 14 years of head coaching experience. He spent a decade at UNC Greensboro, posting five-straight 20-win seasons and appearances in the 2018 and 2021 NCAA Tournaments before taking the helm of the Bearcats. Miller boasts seven 20-win seasons (two at Cincinnati) and a 267-194 overall record. He has mentored 25 All-Conference players as a head coach, including six over his first four seasons at UC.
- Cincinnati has won all four of its season openers under Miller, each coming at home. The Bearcats, who have an average margin of victory of more than 32 points in the lid-lifting wins, topped Arkansas - Pine Bluff by a 109-54 score in the opener last year after a 69-58 victory over UIC in 2023, a 98-55 win over Chaminade in 2022 and a 65-43 over Evansville to begin the Miller era in 2021.
- Cincinnati's six scholarship transfers (Jalen Celestine, Sencire Harris, Jalen Haynes, Kerr Kriisa, Baba Miller and Moustapha Thiam) come to Clifton averaging 80 career games played at the college level.

Cincinnati men's basketball, which was named a top-10 program in college basketball history by the Associated Press, boasts 44 All-Americans, 41 conference titles, six Final Four appearances and back-to-back national championships across its history, which dates back to the 1901-02 season. The program has spent 434 weeks ranked in the AP Top 25. Jack Twyman and Oscar Robertson are both members of the Basketball Hall of Fame, with Robertson earning a spot on the NBA's 75th-Anniversary Team in 2021.

BEARCATS VS. CATAMOUNTS

Cincinnati has won all four previous meetings against Western Carolina, with all four coming at home. The series began with a 99-72 Bearcat victory over the Catamounts Nov. 23, 1996 in Clifton, while the most recent matchup was a 102-51 Cincinnati triumph at BB&T Arena in Highland Heights, Ky., Nov. 13, 2017.

SCOUTING THE CATAMOUNTS

Led by second-year head coach Tim Craft, Western Carolina returns eight players, including four starters, from a team that went 8-22 a season ago.

Preseason All-Southern Conference pick Marcus Kell is back after averaging 11.7 points and 5.5 boards per game last year. In addition, redshirt junior guard Cord Stansberry is back after scoring 11.2 points per contest, while connecting on 52 3-pointers.

STAFF UPDATES

Head coach Wes Miller added a trio of experienced staff members for the 2025-26 season. Mamadou N'Diaye, a former NBA veteran and standout at Auburn, was named an assistant coach. Corey Evans, a former scout with the Oklahoma City Thunder, was named the program's first general manager and Kelly Peters, who possesses more than a decade of experience in the professional ranks, was tabbed special assistant to the head coach.

N'Diaye joins the Bearcats following a four-year stint at UCF, where he was elevated to Associate Head Coach in 2024. While in Orlando, he played a pivotal role in developing frontcourt talent and was instrumental in international recruiting. Prior to UCF, N'Diaye served as an assistant coach at Georgia Tech, San Francisco, and Coastal Carolina. During his tenure at San Francisco, the Dons posted consecutive 20-win seasons and reached the postseason in 2020 and 2021. As a player, N'Diaye starred at Auburn from 1996 to 2000, earning All-SEC honors and helping the Tigers to an NCAA Sweet 16 appearance in 1999. He was selected 26th overall in the 2000 NBA Draft and played five seasons in the NBA.

Evans comes to Clifton by way of the Oklahoma City Thunder, where he had served as an amateur evaluation scout since 2021. Evans' role with the Thunder included player evaluations and intelligence work on all pre-draft prospects worldwide. He also helped in the hiring processes of entry-level coaches and interns. The Thunder last year became the youngest team in NBA history to earn a No. 1 seed (23.9 years old) and are in position to do it again this season.

Peters most recently spent time as an assistant coach with USA Basketball's FIBA Americas team and served as an advance scout with the 76ers from 2020-23 after spending a year with the team as a coaching associate and another year as an assistant coach with the team's G-League affiliate, the Delaware Blue Coats. Prior to that, Peters, was an assistant coach for a season with the Santa Cruz Warriors after spending three years as an advance scout with the Golden State Warriors.

THIAM ON KAREEM WATCH LIST

Moustapha Thiam, a sophomore on the Cincinnati men's basketball team, was named to the Naismith Starting 5 — Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Center of the Year Top 20 Preseason Watch List, the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced Oct. 31. The award is annually given to the top center in college basketball.

Thiam, who played his freshman season at UCF, led the Big 12 in total blocks, averaging 10.4 points, 6.4 rebounds and 2.6 blocks per contest a year ago. He was named a Kyle Macy Award finalist as one of the top freshmen in the nation. A native of Dakar, Senegal, Thiam was the only Power 4-plus Big East freshman to average at least 10 points, 5.0 boards and 2.5 blocks per contest. Thiam also shot 49.8% from the field, connecting on 23 3-pointers in his freshman campaign.

CINCINNATI GAINS 12TH MCDONALD'S ALL-AMERICAN

Shon Abaev, one of Cincinnati's two early signees for the upcoming season, was named a McDonald's All-American, becoming the eighth signee and 12th overall to play for the Bearcats. The Broward County, Fla., native averaged 24.1 points, 7.3 rebounds and 3.8 assists per game in the Overtime Elite League.

Abaev had eight points (2-of-3 from deep) with two steals in the 2025 McDonald's All-American Game in Brooklyn.

UNPLUGGED, IF YOU CAN HELP IT

Miller has long discussed not using any social media during the season with the disclaimer that his generation didn't grow up with social media and

have as big a need for it now.

"Since 2006, I felt like I have been in a media and fan base spotlight because I played at North Carolina where there is a ton of eyes on you, and they do the same thing. When you are a head coach even at the mid major level there are still people that write stories, have opinions and say things about you. This is not an uncomfortable situation for me because I am used to it. It is more of a challenge for players with today's social media culture, which I can't relate to as a player."

He even recalled that having a sidekick phone and AOL Instant Messenger had the North Carolina team thinking they were the coolest thing walking around in Chapel Hill.

"We have to find a way to encourage our kids to not listen when it is too good and not to listen when it is negative. That is a real challenge, but I don't blame our fans. I want passionate fans, and I want people to want it. If we are being honest, the support here has been tremendous and the support for our program and for me and our players has been incredible. We owe them a better fight and a better performance, and we all know that."

SPACE TO FILL

With just one starter and a pair of letterwinners returning from the Bearcats' 2024-25 squad, Cincinnati retains only 13.3% of its scoring, 71.6% of its rebounding and 17.5% of its assists from a season ago.

TWYMAN-STOKES CLASSIC

Cincinnati's game against Dayton Nov. 11 will be the 2025-26 Twyman-Stokes Classic.

The game spotlights the story that transcends the city and basketball as a whole. Rising NBA star Maurice Stokes, while playing for the Cincinnati Royals, suffered a life-changing injury at the end of the 1958 season that left him paralyzed and unable to speak. His teammate, Bearcats legend Jack Twyman, became his legal guardian at 23 to give him financial and physical support.

After years of grassroots fundraising nationwide, NBA stars held out at the 1964 All-Star Game to get the players' union recognized, largely in part after seeing what Stokes had gone through. Stokes died in 1970, and when Twyman passed in 2012, the Reverend Jesse Jackson helped lead a call to the NBA to establish the Twyman-Stokes Teammate of the Year award.

JUMPMAN, JUMPMAN, JUMPMAN...

Cincinnati returned to familiar threads in 2023-24 with the Jordan brand. The Bearcats were one of the three original schools rewarded with it in 1997, joining St. John's and North Carolina A&T.

Michael Jordan himself helped present the uniforms to the public on the Rosie O'Donnell Show on Sept. 9, 1997.

Cincinnati is one of 12 schools to wear the Jumpman logo, joining North Carolina, Michigan, Houston, Oklahoma, Florida, Georgetown, Marquette, San Diego State, UCLA, Morehouse and Howard.

CARDIAC CATS' COMEBACKS

The 16-point, second-half comeback against West

Virginia in the Big 12 Tournament marked the eighth game under Wes Miller in which it came back from 10-plus points to win. Three of those were against ranked teams, and five of the eight are this year.

In the WVU game at the Big 12 Championships, Cincinnati wiped out its 16-point deficit in only 4:21. It even came in the same arena as the Illinois game.

Rehfeldt's cutting-edge investments go beyond the plates and into the technology realm. He also helped hire Dillon Frees, the athletics department's first-ever Director of Performance Nutrition.

CINCINNATI HEAD COACH WES MILLER

Wes Miller is in his fifth season as the University of Cincinnati's men's basketball head coach, poised to take the Bearcats to the next level in their third year of the nation's best basketball conference, the Big 12.

The 42-year-old Miller already boasts 14 years of head coaching experience. He spent a decade at UNC Greensboro, posting five-straight 20-win seasons and appearances in the 2018 and 2021 NCAA Tournaments before taking the helm of the Bearcats.

Miller boasts seven 20-win seasons (two at Cincinnati) and a 267-194 overall record. He has mentored 25 All-Conference players as a head coach, including six over his first four seasons at UC.

A former walk-on at North Carolina, Miller became a national champion and team captain for the Tar Heels. He is also one of seven head coaches in 2025-26 to have won a national title as a player. Miller has quickly molded the Bearcats in his own image of toughness and resilience.

MILESTONE MAN

Miller earned 217 wins by his 40th birthday, which ranked him 15th all-time and seventh among head coaches after 1970. Five of the names ahead of him are Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall-of-Famers as well. His 41 over his first two years at UC trail only Ed Jucker, who won national titles in 1961 and 1962, for most at the school, and he has won 20-plus games in six of his last seven seasons.

CINCINNATI SEASON SUMMARIES

Cincinnati's 2024-25 season saw 19 wins, including an 18-point victory over Sweet-16 BYU. The Bearcats also defeated Xavier in the Crosstown Shootout and blew out Georgia Tech on the road, the program's ninth-straight win over the ACC. Sophomore Jizzle James earned All-Big 12 Honorable Mention accolades. Miller and the staff signed Shon Abaev and Keyshuan Tillery for the 2025-26 season. Abaev became the first McDonald's All-American to sign with UC since Lance Stephenson in 2009 and eighth overall, as well as the 12th to suit up for the Bearcats, which included Dillon Mitchell in 2024-25.

The 2023-24 season saw Cincinnati rattle off four ranked wins out of 22 overall in its first Big 12 campaign. The last of those was a 72-52 win over No. 16 Kansas in the Big 12 Tournament, with the others against No. 12 BYU, No. 15 Texas Tech (both on road) and No. 19 TCU. Dan Skillings Jr. and Aziz Bandaogo gained All-Big 12 Honorable Mention accolades, while John Newman III made the All-Defensive Team. Cincinnati advanced to the NIT Quarterfinals and were 37th in the NET.

Cincinnati's 2022-23 squad claimed its 40th, 20-win season while returning to the postseason with a trip to the NIT Quarterfinals, highlighted by an 81-72 first-round win over Virginia Tech. Cincinnati also improved its league-win total by four games. Miller's squad finished in the top-30 for turnovers for the second-straight season after coming in below 267 the previous two. UC's 77.1 ppg marked its highest since 2001-02 and up 7.7 from Miller's first year. Landers Nolley II produced career-highs in every category en route to First-Team honors, while David DeJulius made the Third-Team for the second-straight year as he finished third nationally in assist-turnover ratio and third in

UC single-season history with 192 assists. Cincinnati also broke its three-point records in each of his first two seasons.

The 2021-22 season saw Miller become the first UC coach to start his tenure 5-0, and the fifth win was a 71-51 dismantling of No. 14 Illinois in Kansas City. It marked the Bearcats' largest margin-of-victory over a ranked opponent since 2011. DeJulius earned Third-Team All-AAC honors as well. The team improved in many categories following its 12-11 campaign the year before, including its national rankings in turnovers per game (27 from 267) and field-goal defense (35 from 186) among many others. Not only that, UC set a program record in the fall semester with a 3.484 GPA, seeing nine student-athletes earn Dean's List accolades as well.

ALL-CONFERENCE SELECTIONS

Miller has coached 24 All-Conference players over his career, including the below five from Cincinnati. UNCG's Isaiah Miller was a repeat Southern Conference Player of the Year in 2020 and 2021, while Tevon Saddler (2014) and Keyshaun Langley (2020) earned Freshman of the Year honors.

NATIONALLY-PRAISED

Regarded as one of the top young coaches in college basketball, Miller built UNC Greensboro into perennial championship and NCAA Tournament contenders, was named as ESPN.com's No. 1 Coach Under 40 in May 2020 and also was tabbed for The Athletic's 40 Under 40 list a year ago. His 185-career wins going into the 2021-22 season also put him in the national lead for coaches under 40, ahead of LSU's Will Wade (177) and New Mexico's Richard Pitino (159).

Miller's collegiate head coach and mentor Roy Williams had high praise for his former player.

"Wes Miller is one of the most outstanding young coaches in our game and what he did at UNC Greensboro makes me believe he is THE most outstanding. As a player at North Carolina he came closer to reaching his full potential than any player I've ever coached. His energy, his determination, his intelligence and his care for young people convinces me that he will continue at that level. I am so happy for him and the University of Cincinnati Basketball program and I look forward to being in the stands!"

AT UNCG

The Spartans' all-time winningest head coach, Miller totaled 185 wins in 10 seasons with four Southern Conference Regular-Season Championships. Over the last five years, UNCG has five-straight 20-win seasons, two NCAA Tournament appearances, two NIT appearances, two Southern Conference Tournament Championships, 125 wins and 70-20 record in conference play.

- UNCG won 21 games during the 2020-21 season along with the SoCon regular season and tournament championship and earned its second NCAA Tournament appearance in four years.
- The Spartans won 20 or more games in each of the last five seasons, including a program record 29 in 2018-19. Miller led UNCG to NCAA Tournament appearances in 2017-18 and 2020-21.

PLAYING DAYS

- In three seasons as a player at North Carolina under Coach Williams, Miller helped the Tar Heels to the national championship in 2005, two Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season championships and one ACC Tournament title.
- He was team captain as a senior in 2006-07, leading UNC to 31 wins and the NCAA Elite 8 as well as the ACC regular-season and tournament titles, and a final No. 3 national ranking.
- A fan favorite at UNC, Miller authored a book entitled The Road to Blue Heaven, which was published as a diary of his experiences as a North Carolina basketball player.
- In addition to his success on the floor, Miller excelled off the court, earning ACC

Academic Honor Roll recognition and the UNC Athletic Director's Scholar Athlete-Award. He earned his degree in political science from North Carolina in 2007.

- Upon his graduation from North Carolina, Miller played one season of professional basketball for the London Capitals of the British Basketball League, where he averaged 19.6 points per game to rank eighth in the league.
- Miller was a prep standout at the New Hampton School in New Hampshire. He earned a scholarship to James Madison, where he played one season before transferring to North Carolina to become a walk-on for Coach Williams' squad.

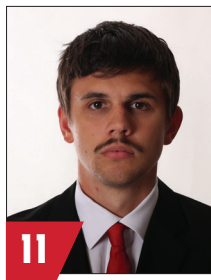

- Also had 19 at eventual national runner-up Houston and in the finale against UCF in Las Vegas, where he was 5-for-9 from deep.

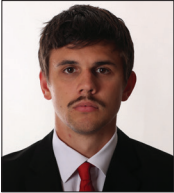

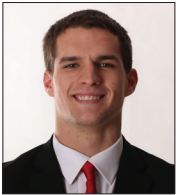

- Cincinnati's seven overtime games in 2019-20 were a school record (previous record was six during the 1966-67 season), AAC record and are one shy of the NCAA record of eight overtime games set by Western Kentucky (1978), Portland (1984) and Valparaiso (1993).
- Cincinnati's four consecutive overtime games from Feb. 9, 2020 through Feb. 19, 2020 tied the NCAA record set by Jacksonville (1982), Illinois State (1985) and Dayton (1988).
- On Dec. 21, 1981 UC & Bradley played an NCAA-record 7OT game (UC won, 75-73)
- Cincinnati has been involved in two of the five NCAA tournament championship games to go into overtime. The Bearcats defeated Ohio State, 70-65, in 1961, but lost to Loyola (Ill.), 60-58, in 1963.
- In 1966-67, Cincinnati played six overtime games, winning five. The Bearcats were 5-0 at home in overtime games that season, an NCAA record.

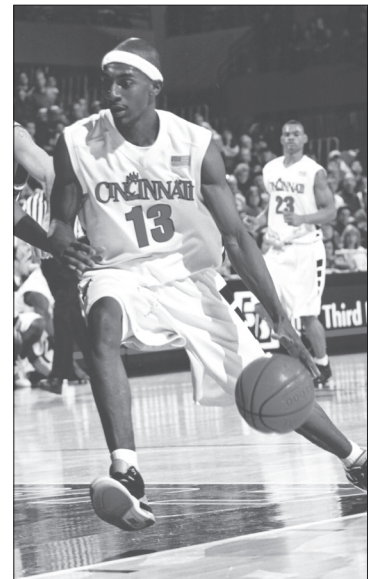
