COMMUNICATIONS

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► OPENING TIP

The Hawks are 4-0 in the last four seasons in road openers after delivering a 63-62 win at Maine. Since 2022-23, the Hawks are 19-1 in the month of November.

Gabby Casey led the team against the Black Bears with 19 points and nine rebounds, one of four Hawks to finish with double figures. Faith Stinson had her best game in the Crimson and Gray with 16 points, while Rhain Stokes and Jill Jekot each added 11 points in the narrow win.

Tuesday is the 45th meeting against members in the current iteration of the Big 12 Conference. The Hawks enter the game with a 25-19 record, earning wins over West Virginia (18), Kansas State (2), BYU (1), Texas Tech (1), Kansas (1), Arizona (1) and Houston (1).

The Hawks lead the nation with an 85.4% assist rate, registering assists on 41 of their 48 field goals through the opening two games of the season.

► SAINT JOSEPH'S QUICK FACTS

Saint Joseph's is playing its 53rd season of women's basketball and the 25th under head coach Cindy Griffin.

Saint Joseph's has 15 players on the 2025-26 roster, representing four states and four countries excluding the United States. Amar Mansour (Lebanon) and Emirson Devenie (Australia) are the first Hawks to represent their countries, while Meja Jägerskog (Sweden) and Olivia Lutterodt (Denmark) are each the second player to join the program from their respective countries.

A local influx sees nine of the 15 Hawks on the roster come from Pennsylvania and New Jersey, while Faith Stinson (Ohio) and Cecilia Kay (Massachusetts) round out the squad.

► ONE OR THE OTHER

When referencing our University, it's either abbreviate both words or neither of them - Saint Joseph's or St. Joe's. Do NOT use St. Joseph's or Saint Joe's. It should be Saint Joseph's on first reference and St. Joe's, SJU, or Hawks after that.

► THE HAWK WILL NEVER DIE

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Saint Joseph's Hawk celebrates over 70 years of tradition in 2025-26. The Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die." Years ago, ESPN used a "flap-o-meter" on the national telecast of a Saint Joseph's game to estimate that the Hawk flaps its wings 3,500 times during a regulation game.

► INTERVIEW REQUESTS

All requests for interviews with Cindy Griffin and the Saint Joseph's players must be arranged through Matt Busch. Advance notice of at least 24 hours is preferred, but every attempt will be made to accommodate all requests. Players will not be available for interviews on game day, except for postgame interviews.

► DEBUT DELIGHT

Six of the seven Hawks that made their debut scored their first points for the team in the win over West Chester. Below is program records set in players' debuts.

► START AS YOU MEAN TO GO ON

Over the past seven seasons, the Hawks have won each of their home openers. Coach Griffin has won by an average of nearly 26 points per game in those wins. Overall, Coach Griffin is 20-5 in home openers on Hawk Hill.

The Hawks have also won each of the last four road openers after a 63-62 win over Maine.

► SHARING IS CARING

The Hawks lead the nation with an 85.4% assist rate, registering assists on 41 of their 48 field goals through the opening two games of the season.

► NO NONSENSE IN THE NON-CONFERENCE

Over the last four seasons, the Hawks have recorded a 32-5 record in non-conference play with nine or more wins in the past three seasons prior to 2025-26. During that span, the Hawks are 19-1 in November.

► THE HEART OF HAWK HILL

Head Coach Cindy Griffin was one of 11 active coaches in 2024-25 that led their alma mater to an NCAA Tournament as both a player and a coach.

The other 10 were: Adia Barnes (Arizona), Katie Gearlds (Purdue), Krista Gerlich (Texas Tech), Niele Ivey (Notre Dame), Carolyn Kieger (Penn State), Felisha Legette-Jack (Syracuse), Brooke Stoehr (Louisiana Tech), Amy Vachon (Maine), Amy Williams (Nebraska) and Brooke Wyckoff (Florida State).

► 20-WIN SEASONS

The Hawks are fresh off a third-consecutive season in which they tallied 20+ wins, head coach Cindy Griffin recording the feat for her 10th time in her tenure. The 24-10 record from the 2024-25 campaign comes off the back of a program record of 28 wins set in the 2023-24 season.

► SNEAD AS A STARTER

The Hawks are unbeaten (10-0) when Aleah Snead is in the starting lineup. Prior to the one-point win over Maine, the previous nine wins have all been decided by 10 or more points.

In her 10 starts, Snead has collected 101 points (10.1 ppg), 50 rebounds (5.0 rpg), 28 assists (2.8 apg) and 16 steals (1.6 spg). The Philly native is shooting 39-73 (.534) from the field in those 10 games.

Snead set a new career high with seven assists in the win over Maine.

In last year's win over Davidson, Snead posted a career-high 22 points on 9-12 shooting from the field, adding a then-career-best of five assists - all in the first half. Her eight rebounds against Saint Louis also set a career-high.

The junior recorded 14 points and nine rebounds in the first round of the WBIT, eight coming off the offensive glass. Snead was just the eighth player in the NCAA last season to register at least eight offensive rebounds in a single game, becoming the first Hawk with at least eight offensive boards since Adashia Franklyn (8) against La Salle on Jan. 28, 2018

► CASEY STEPPING UP

Gabby Casey opened the 2025-26 season with a 13-point, 10-rebound effort against West Chester for her first double-double of her career. Casey added a 19-point, 9-rebound effort in the road opener at Maine.

In her first 68 games of her career, Casey registered just one game with double-digit rebounds. The junior guard had also posted 15 games with 10 or more points in her first two seasons.

Casey stepped into a starting role in 2024-25, adding 7.7 points and 4.4 rebounds to complement last year's big three of Brugler, Smith and Ziegler. Casey also led the team with 36 steals, her 76 assists the third-most on the squad.

The rising junior recorded nine points, seven rebounds, four steals, two assists and two blocks in the win over Saint Francis. Only one other Hawk has registered a 7/7/2/4/2 performance in the last 15 seasons.

During last year's Utah road trip, Casey tallied back-to-back games with career highs. The Quakertown, Pa. native opened the trip with a 20-point effort against Southern Utah before recording 21 points in an overtime defeat to Utah.

► PROTECTING HAWK HILL

The Hawks finished 13-4 in 2024-25 on Hawk Hill to finish with a .765 winning percentage. The 13 wins matched the second-most wins in Hagan Arena, equaling the win totals from the 2023-24 and 2005-06 teams (13-3) and the 2001-02 team (13-2).

The Hawks rattled off a program-high 15 wins (15-4) in the 2011-12 campaign.

Over the last four seasons, the Hawks are 39-10 (.796) inside Hagan Arena.

► NEW ERA BEGINS IN 2025-26

The Hawks look to replace four players from last year's starting lineup. Only Gabby Casey (33) entered the season having started seven or more games last season. Aleah Snead (6), Rhian Stokes (4) and Kaylie Griffin (1) also made starts in 2024-25 and will look to fill the void of Talya Brugler, Mackenzie Smith, Laura Ziegler and Emma Boslet.

St. Joe's looks to replace nearly 70 percent of its scoring, Brugler, Smith and Ziegler combining for nearly 1,500 points last season.

Brugler (3rd) and Smith (7th) graduated in the top 10 leaderboard of Saint Joseph's all-time leading scorers.

► GUARDS GOT GAME

St. Joe's opened up 2025-26 with 41 assists on 48 made baskets in the first two games, assisting on 85.4 percent of its makes.

Taking care of the ball has been a staple of the Hawk offense over the prior three seasons. St. Joe's has ranked in the top 30 twice in the last three years in assist-turnover ratio while being a mainstay at the top of the leaderboard among Atlantic 10 teams. The Hawks finished last season 18th in the country with a 1.23 A/TO clip.

Saint Joseph's added 17.0 assists last year, finishing second in the A-10 and 23rd nationally in assists per game. Gabby Casey (76), Rhian Stokes (54), Aleah Snead (35) and Kaylie Griffin (33) are the four Hawks with 30+ assists to return from last year's team.

► QUEEN OF THE CONFERENCE

Cindy Griffin became just the third coach to reach 200 Atlantic 10 wins in a career in the win over Dayton in 2023-24, currently sitting at 215 career wins in the Atlantic 10.

The Hawk head coach now only sits behind Joe McKeown (240) and Stephanie Gaitley (220).

McKeown won all 240 games at George Washington, while 109 of the 220 wins for Gaitley came at St. Joe's, the rest accomplished at Fordham.

► DOMINANT DEFENSE

The Hawk defense stifled teams last season, closing as one of the best scoring defenses in the nation. The 56.4 points allowed per game ranked second in the Atlantic 10 and 21st nationally.

St. Joe's held 12 opponents to 50 or fewer points. The Hawks also held opponents under 40% from the field in 20 of their 34 contests.

► EXTRA BASKETBALL

The Hawks received a postseason invitation for the 15th time under Coach Griffin, marking back-to-back-to-back seasons with postseason play over the last three seasons. The Hawks returned to the WBIT for a second-consecutive season, winning over UAlbany before bowing out in the second round.

► LEGENDARY STATUS

The win over Syracuse on November 10, 2024 marked head coach Cindy Griffin's 400th win at the helm of St. Joe's. Griffin is one of 13 active head coaches in 2025-26 to have reached 400 career wins with a single school. Entering the 25th season in charge of the Hawks, 28th overall, Griffin begins the year with 470 career wins, 422 in charge of her alma mater.

► SHOES TO FILL

The 2024-25 season ended with the departure of three players who all ranked among the program's top 11 all-time scorers, who combined for 4,737 points. Talya Brugler and Mackenzie Smith became the 29th and 30th Hawks to eclipse 1,000 career points for the Crimson and Gray in 2023-24, while Laura Ziegler was the 31st Hawk to reach the mark last campaign.

Faith Stinson joins St. Joe's as the leading scorer on the squad with 565 career points while Gabby Casey's 390 points are the most as a Hawk.

► DAMAGE FROM DISTANCE

St. Joe's set a program record in 2024-25, becoming just the third team in program history to make more than 200 three-pointers in a season. The Hawks' 231 triples surpassed the previous record of 207 set by the 2006-07 squad. The 2023-24 team also eclipsed the 200 mark with 202 makes. Mackenzie Smith led the effort with 67 threes on 40.9% shooting from deep, while Laura Ziegler (52), Gabby Casey (43) and Talya Brugler (25) each added 20 or more.

► NEW FACES ON HAWK HILL

Four freshmen and four transfers joined the squad for the upcoming 2025-26 season.

Jill Jekot | Transfer from Penn State. Played in 21 games for the Nittany Lions last season, scoring 18 points. She was a three-year member and two-time captain at Cumberland Valley High School, averaging 23 points, 7.5 rebounds and 2.9 steals per game as a senior. A 1,000-point scorer, Jekot was First Team All-State twice while being named Ms. PA Top Underclassman in both 2021-22 and 2022-23 seasons while earning Mid-Penn Commonwealth Player of the Year in 2022-23. Sister of Katie Jekot, who ranks eighth in SJU program history in assists and was a 1,000-point scorer at St. Joe's.

Cecilia Kay | Transfer from American. Scored 344 points, leading the Eagles with 19 games in double-digit scoring to earn a spot to the Patriot League All-Rookie Team. Finished second in single-season program history with 268 rebounds on the year, setting an AU freshman program record. She registered eight double-doubles on the season, ranking second in the Patriot League and in the top 100 nationally in rebounds (8.9) and blocks (1.4) per game.

Amar Mansour | A transfer from Missouri Baptist, Mansour spent a gap year back home in Lebanon playing with Azour Sporting Club in the Women's Lebanese Basketball League. Earning Second Team All-WLBL in her lone season home, Mansour averaged 13.3 points, 7.9 rebounds and 6.0 assists per game. She registered a 20-point, 12-rebound, 11-assist triple-double in the final game of the regular season and helped lead Azour to a third-place finish in the WLBL playoffs. She was an All-AMC Third Team, All-Freshman and All-Academic selection in her lone year at Missouri Baptist, averaging 10.5 points per game while leading the team in rebounds (211), assists (141) and steals (46).

Faith Stinson | Transfer from IU Indy. Comes in as the most veteran presence in the Hawk lineup, entering the season with 90 games played in three seasons. In two years at IU Indy, Stinson made 49 starts in 60 appearances. She comes off the back of her best season, averaging 9.2 points, 5.3 rebounds and 1.4 blocks per game in 2024-25. Stinson scored a career-high 22 points against Youngstown State, one of 13 games in which she scored 10+ points.

Kaylinn Bethea | A graduate of Penn Charter, Bethea closed out her high school career as a 1,000-point scorer for the Quakers. She was named to the PA

Sportswriters All-State First Team after averaging 20 points, seven rebounds and five assists in her senior season. A serial winner, Bethea was a three-time Inter-Ac Champion and earned four First Team All-Inter-Ac selections with PC.

Rian Dotsey | A graduate of Haverford, Dotsey was a 2025 McDonald's All-American Game nominee after capping off the school's deepest run in the state playoffs with an Elite Eight appearance as a senior. Haverford made the Pennsylvania 6A State Playoffs in all four seasons while capturing two Central League championships, the only team in school history to achieve the feat. Dotsey was also part of the first team in school history to finish the regular season undefeated, boasting a 27-0 record before postseason play. A Class 6A Second Team All-State selection, Dotsey finished her senior season with 518 points and sits third alltime in scoring in Haverford's program history.

Emily Knouse | A graduate of Archbishop Wood, Knouse was part of a team that won district titles in all four seasons. Knouse helped capture back-to-back-to-back state championships from 2022 to 2024 while being named First Team All-State in 2024 and 2025. In addition to being an All-PCL selection in basketball on three occasions, Knouse was a four-year All-Catholic League First Team selection in volleyball as well.

Olivia Lutterodt | A graduate of Alleroed Gymnasium, Lutterodt comes to Hawk Hill with three seasons of experience in the Danish women's league after most recently playing for Falcon Basketball Klub. She has represented Denmark at multiple youth levels, including the u15, u16, u18 and u20 levels, before making her first appearances for the senior national team in August 2024. She made her competitive debut for Denmark on February 6, 2025 against Sweden and scored her first points for the senior team three days later against the United Kingdom.

► FINAL BOW FOR BRUGLER

Talya Brugler graduated as one of only five Hawks to record 500 points or more twice in a career, joining Susan Moran, Dale Hodges, Teresa Carmichael and Katie Curry. Moran was the last to achieve the feat, and the only Hawk to reach the mark on three occasions (1999-00, 2000-01, 2001-02).

She became just the third Hawk in program history to average 10 points per game in all four seasons, only Moran and teammate Angela Zampella (1997-01) having done so.

The Nazareth, Pa. native finished her career third in program history with 1,736 points. Only Susan Moran (2,340) and Dale Hodges (2,077) scored more than Brugler.

Brugler also finished in the top 10 in program history of the following categories: field goals (661), field goal percentage (.525), free throw percentage (.833) and scoring average (14.1).

The all-time leader in wins at Saint Joseph's, Cindy Griffin '91 enters the 2025-26 season as her 25th season as head coach of the Hawks. A 1991 and 1993 graduate of SJU, Griffin (nee Anderson) has compiled an overall record of 470-354 in 27 seasons as a head coach, and a 422-321 record over 24 years at Hawk Hill that has included 15 postseason appearances.

The eighth coach in NCAA Division I history to lead her alma mater to the NCAA Tournament as a player and a coach, Griffin's squads have posted 20-win seasons on 10 occasions and have earned six victories over nationally-ranked teams, while her players have been honored as Atlantic 10 All-Conference performers 29 times and 20 have gone on to play professionally.

For a third-consecutive year, Griffin recorded a 20-win season after finishing the 2024-25 campaign with a 24-10 record. Griffin made history after earning her 400th career win after a dominating victory against Syracuse on the road, 84-70. The Hawks earned its first championship appearance since the 2017-18 season after a buzzerbeater from Laura Ziegler earned the Hawks a win over top-seeded Richmond in the semifinals. A runner-up finish in the tournament earned the Hawks their second trip to the WBIT in as many years, defeating UAlbany for the third postseason win in the last two years before falling in the second round. The Hawks earned three Atlantic 10 All-Conference selections for the third-consecutive year under Griffin, while Aleah Snead was named Atlantic 10 Sixth Woman of the Year. Griffin helped Ziegler earn national recognition after the forward was named one of five finalists for the Becky Hammon Mid-Major Player of the Year Award. Brugler (3rd, 1,736 points) and Smith (7th, 1,618) finished their careers in the top 10 in program history in career points scored.

In 2023-24, Griffin guided her alma mater to 28 wins - the most in a single-season in program history. The Hawks ended the non-conference campaign as Hawk Classic Champions with an 11-1 record before A-10 action, marking the best start to a season in Griffin's first 23 years on the sidelines. SJU finished in a tie for second place in the conference standings with a 15-3 Atlantic 10 record to best Griffin's previous high of 13 wins in 2002-03. St. Joe's defined itself as one of the best teams in the country away from home, tying for the most road wins in the NCAA (15). Griffin earned Big 5 Coach of the Year honors after leading the Hawks to the first win over Villanova since 2014, helping propel the Hawks to Big 5 Champions for the first time since 2013-14. Wins in the WBIT over Seton Hall and California helped propel the Hawks to match their deepest postseason run in program history with a quarterfinal appearance in the inaugural WBIT. Griffin helped lead three Hawks to Atlantic 10 All-Conference honors for the second consecutive season.

Griffin helped return her squad to a program standard, recording her seventh 20-win season in the 2022-23 season. Griffin led her squad to a 9-0 record to start the year, the longest win streak to start a season under her 22-year tenure and the second-best in program history. St.

Joe's earned a second-round win in the Atlantic 10 Championship before a quarterfinal defeat to eventual champions Saint Louis. For the first time since 2003-04, and the second time under Griffin's tenure, the Hawks posted three players to the Atlantic 10 All-Conference Team. Griffin also helped tutor the second-straight Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Year and fourth in Hawk history after Laura Ziegler added the award as well as All-Rookie honors to her trophy case. The Hawks concluded their season in Griffin's 11th trip to the WNIT as head coach of the Hawks, falling to Big East foe Seton Hall.

After a 2020-21 season interrupted throughout with the COVID-19 pandemic, the Hawks finished the 2021-22 season with a 13-17 record, finishing 7-8 in conference play before back-to-back wins in the A-10 Tournament saw them one game away from a championship appearance before falling in the semis. With a youthful squad, SJU named four Hawks to the Atlantic 10 All-Rookie Team (Brugler, Fair, Nyström, Smith) while Brugler earned Rookie of the Year honors, the third Hawk to ever do so. The four additions to the All-Rookie Team tied an Atlantic 10 record. Brugler and Katie Jekot also tabbed Second Team All-Big 5 honors.

Guiding a veteran squad, Griffin brought SJU back to the postseason in 2017-18 as the Hawks advanced to the second round of the WNIT and finished with a 19-15 overall record, marking the most games played (34) in a single-season in team history. Capturing the Hawk Classic title in November, the Hawks battled back from injuries during conference play to win five of their last six conference games and carried that momentum up to the title game of the A-10 Championship. Along the way, senior Chelsea Woods earned All-Big 5 First Team and A-10 All-Conference Third Team honors, with junior Sarah Velleux being selected Big 5 Scholar-Athlete, named to the All-Big 5 Second Team and joined graduate student Amanda Fioravanti on the A-10 All-Academic Team.

Behind a resilient team, the 2016-17 Hawks battled back from a slow start to become one of the top teams in the Atlantic 10. Finishing third in the conference standings, the Hawks advanced to the semifinals of the A-10 Championship and earned the program's 10th Postseason WNIT berth. Individually, Chelsea Woods was named an A-10 All-Conference honoree and was selected to the All-Big 5 Second Team. Joining Woods on the All-Big 5 Second Team, Adashia Franklyn also garnered Big 5 most Improved Player accolades, while Sarah Velleux was recognized as the Big 5 Scholar Athlete.

Behind a pair of 1,000-point scorers in seniors Sarah Fairbanks and Ciara Andrews in 2015-16, Saint Joseph's finished tied for sixth in the A-10 behind a strong finish to the regular season. Finishing among the attendance leaders in the conference, the Hawks added to their mantle as they claimed the Hawk Classic title. Additionally, Fairbanks was named the Big 5's Scholar-Athlete, while sophomore Chelsea Woods was selected the Big 5's Most Improved Player.

Backed by First Team All-Big 5 selection Natasha Cloud, the Hawks earned a share of the Big 5 title in 2014-15. Cloud, who garnered A-10 All-Conference First Team and All-Defensive Team accolades, also became just the third SJU player to be selected in the WNBA Draft as she was picked by the Washington Mystics in the second round in 2015.

Following up their A-10 Championship the season prior, the 2013-14 Hawks continued to prove themselves as one of the top programs nationally as they earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament and advanced to the Second Round for just the seventh time in team history. Led by Erin Shields and Cloud, Saint Joseph's earned its fifth straight postseason bid and claimed its first outright Philadelphia Big 5 title since 2000-01.

Under Griffin's leadership, Saint Joseph's posted one of its most memorable seasons in team history in 2012-13 as the Hawks claimed the Atlantic 10 Championship for just the third time and earned the automatic NCAA Tournament bid. Led by a senior class that had advanced to the postseason every year, the Hawks finished with a 23-9 record that included wins over #5 Maryland and #11 Dayton.

In addition to the team's success, a trio of Hawks were singled out for their performances, led by NCAA Woman of the Year nominee Chatilla van Grinsven. With Griffin's guidance, van Grinsven turned in one of the more dominant seasons in recent SJU history, becoming just the fifth player in SJU history to average a double-double for the year en route to being named to the A-10 All-Conference First Team and as the Big 5 Player of the Year. The duo of backcourt mates Shields and Cloud helped propel SJU to new heights, with Shields garnering A-10 and Big 5 Most Improved Player honors and IAAA distinction, while Cloud was named the Most Outstanding Player of the 2013 A-10 Championship.

Backed by a veteran-laden team in 2011-12, the Hawks earned their third-straight WNIT berth and posted their most wins (22) since the 2003-04 season. Moving into second place in career victories at her alma mater, Griffin picked up her 200th win as the Hawks topped Boston University in the opening game of the WNIT on March 15, 2012. Leading the Hawks to a 15-4 mark at home, she helped Saint Joseph's become

one of the more efficient teams in the nation, ranking fourth in fewest turnovers per game (12.5), 26th in three-point percentage (.348) and 39th in field goal percentage (.423).

Individually, senior Michelle Baker and Kelly Cavallo had breakout years, both garnering All-Big 5 honors. Behind Griffin's teaching, Baker went on to be named to the A-10 All-Conference Second Team and capped her career as SJU's then all-time leader in games played (127) while ranking in the top 20 for scoring and field goals made. After seeing limited time as a freshman, Cavallo developed into one of the top post players in the A-10, leading SJU and finishing in the top five of the conference in rebounding, blocked shots and field goal percentage. With Griffin's aid, Cavallo finished her career second all-time in blocks and 11th in rebounding at SJU.

Returning just one starter for the 2010-11 season, the Hawks quickly jelled under Griffin's guidance as they went on to win 20 games, earned the program's 700th victory, and advanced to the second round of the WNIT. Led by All-Big 5 honorees Baker and Katie Kuester, Saint Joseph's had its most efficient offensive showing since 2002-03, as the Hawks finished 60th in the nation in field goal percentage (42.1).

Additionally, several Hawks were honored for outstanding seasons in 2010-11, headlined by sophomore Ashley Prim becoming the first SJU player to be named Atlantic 10 Sixth Player of the Year. Baker became just the second Hawk to be named to the A-10 All-Defensive Team, while freshman Erin Shields became the sixth player Griffin has coached to A-10 All-Rookie Team honors.

Earning a postseason berth for the first time in two years, the Hawks surpassed predictions in 2009-10 as they finished tied for fourth in the Atlantic 10 after being picked to finish ninth. Posting a 9-5 mark against conference opponents, Griffin hit two milestones during A-10 play, earning her 150th win at Saint Joseph's in a victory against Dayton and earning her 200th coaching win against George Washington. The Hawks would go on to earn the program's seventh WNIT bid, and play the first postseason game at Hagan Arena.

In 2008-09, Griffin undertook arguably her toughest season to date as Saint Joseph's played every contest away from Hawk Hill for the first time in program history. And in typical SJU fashion, Griffin got her team to respond as Saint Joseph's went on to post an 8-5 record at home venues and earn its first Big 5 title since 2000-01. Individually five Hawks posted career bests in scoring, with Brittany Ford and Marianne Djouara both earning All-Big 5 Second Team honors.

Relying heavily on underclassmen in 2007-08, Griffin guided her Hawks to another winning season, including crowns at the Brown Basketball Classic and the Hilton Philadelphia Hawk Classic. Among the wins, Saint Joseph's posted its biggest win over a non-conference ranked opponent since the 1984-85, topping #15 Auburn for the Hawk Classic title.

Despite losing several experienced players prior to the 2006-07 season, Griffin had her team peaking at the right time. Playing Griffin's style of hard-nosed defense and persistent offense, the Hawks advanced to the Atlantic 10 Championship game, including the program's first win over a top 10 opponent (#8 George Washington) since 1992 along the way. Saint Joseph's capped the season with its fifth WNIT appearance in six years and tied the SJU record for games played in a season with 33.

Fueled by a collection of newcomers and a developed core of upperclassmen, Griffin led the Hawks back to national prominence in 2005-06. The Crimson and Gray engineered the nation's best turnaround (13 games) and received votes in the national polls for the first time since 2003-04. The Hawks advanced to the semifinals of the A-10 Championship and earned a berth in the WNIT.

Led by six seniors, the 2004 team went 22-11 and advanced to the WNIT Elite Eight. Saint Joseph's finished second in the A-10 East and dropped a heartbreaker in the Atlantic 10 Championship to Temple. Four Hawk seniors reached the 1,000-point plateau, marking just the eighth time in NCAA history that a quartet of players had reached the milestone in the same season. Erin Brady, Irina Krasnosniok, Stephanie (Graf) McCaffrey and Amra Mehmedic went on to sign professional contracts.

Following a memorable first year at the helm of her alma mater, Griffin upped the ante in her second season by capturing 2003 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year honors after guiding the Hawks to a 19-11 record. The team sprinted to the conference's Eastern Division title and earned a berth in the WNIT for the second straight season, despite the departure of SJU's all-time leading scorer and a non-conference schedule that ranked fourth nationally.

Griffin helped to reinvigorate the SJU program in her first season, leading the squad to a 24-8 record and the second round of the WNIT. She capitalized on the team's tradition of scrappy play and rugged defense, while releasing the reins and allowing the team to play a more up-tempo style

on the offensive end of the floor. The Hawks finished the year among the national leaders in nine different categories and paced the nation in free throw percentage for the second straight year.

Following her playing career, Griffin spent the 1992-93 season as a graduate assistant at her alma mater. She then accepted an assistant's spot at Vanderbilt University from 1993-95 under former Saint Joseph's head coach Jim Foster. Foster recruited Griffin to SJU and coached her during her playing career on Hawk Hill. In her two years as an assistant at Vanderbilt, the Commodores finished 53-15 overall, won the 1995 SEC championship and reached the NCAA Sweet 16 both seasons. In addition to coaching responsibilities, she was the co-director of the Vanderbilt Basketball Camp and the director of the Black & Gold Club.

Griffin left Vanderbilt after the 1995 season to become an assistant coach at Loyola Maryland. Griffin was promoted to the position of head women's basketball coach at Loyola Maryland midway through the 1998-99 season, becoming the seventh-youngest head coach in Division I at the time, after Coyle left for an assistant coach position with the WNBA's New York Liberty. Loyola Maryland won a team-record 21 games that year, compiling a record of 48-33 with three Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference semifinal appearances in all three years.

One of the top playmakers in Saint Joseph's history, Griffin starred for the Hawks from 1987-88 through 1991-92 (missing the 1988-89 season due to injury). A three-time team captain, Griffin finished her career with 662 points, 278 rebounds, 510 assists and 197 steals. She currently ranks fourth on SJU's all-time assist list. As a junior in 1990-91, she played in 1,178 out of a possible 1,200 minutes to set the school record for minutes played in a single season. The Hawks made three NCAA Tournament appearances and posted three straight 20-win seasons during her playing career. A two-time Second Team All-Big 5 choice, as well as a Third Team All-Atlantic 10 pick as a senior, she was inducted into the Saint Joseph's Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in 1998.

A native of Maple Glen, Pa., Griffin played her high school basketball for Bishop McDevitt, winning two Philadelphia Catholic League titles. A 1987 graduate of McDevitt, she was inducted into its Athletic Hall of Fame in 1997, and in 2002, received the Philadelphia Catholic League's alumni achievement award. She earned a bachelor's degree in accounting from Saint Joseph's in 1991 and completed her M.B.A. from SJU in 1993. She resides in Conshohocken, Pa., with her husband, Curtis, and children, Kaylie, Hannah and Curtis, Jr. Kaylie will be a fifth-year senior on Griffin's roster in 2025-26.

Stinson was a two-time First Team All-Ohio, First Team All-MVL and First Team All-Southeast District standout over her time at Sheridan, helping the Generals to three-consecutive district championships over her high school career.

THE HAWK

MASCOT | 70 SEASONS | HAWK HILL, PHILADELPHIA

► HISTORY OF THE HAWK

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Saint Joseph's Hawk celebrates over 70 years of tradition in 2025-26. The Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die."

Jim Brennan originated the idea for a hawk as mascot during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-Marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched to the costume idea. The student government raised the 120 dollars needed to buy the initial costume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at The Palestra. Since then, and including this season, more than 60 SJU students have donned the costume. The Hawk has not missed a men's basketball game since that first season in 1954-55, with the exception of select contests during the 2020-21 season due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Hawk, who was present at most women's basketball games, became a mainstay in 1989. Since then, 22 SJU students have been 'The Hawk' for the women's basketball team.

In addition to the constant flapping, the Hawk is also recognized by its "flying" in figure eights around the court during timeouts. Years ago, ESPN used a "flap-o-meter" on the national telecast of a Saint Joseph's game to estimate that the Hawk flaps its wings 6,300 times during a regulation game.

The Hawk is unique because it is one of the few mascots in the nation that travels to every game. The student, who is selected through an interview process during the previous spring semester, also has served as a team manager for both basketball teams.

The most decorated mascot in the country, The Hawk has garnered numerous accolades in its history. In 2013-14, NCAA.com named The Hawk as "College Basketball's Best Tradition." The Sporting News, Sports Illustrated, Sports Illustrated for Kids, Street & Smith's Basketball Yearbook and ESPN College Basketball magazine have selected it as the nation's top mascot. Eastern Basketball tabbed The Hawk as the Atlantic 10 Conference's best mascot, while The Hawk won a "Best of Philly" award from Philadelphia Magazine in 2003-04. The Hawk was selected as a nominee for the Mascot Hall of Fame on multiple occasions.

Saint Joseph's athletic teams have been recognized with the nickname "Hawks" since 1929. At that time, the school's yearbook editor, Charlie Dunn, initiated a contest among the student body for a symbol. More than 100 submissions were narrowed to two, with "Hawks" winning out over "Grenadiers" (World War I soldiers who specialized in tossing grenades) by a slim margin in the final vote.

John Gallagher '31, a catcher on the Saint Joseph's baseball team, submitted the winning suggestion. He won a sweater with a special Saint Joseph's monogram for selecting the winning name. According to the Student Annual, the nickname was appropriate because it typified "the fighting spirit of our crimson and gray athletes and it is suggestive of the aerial attack which has made our football team famous." Ironically, football was discontinued at Saint Joseph's following the 1939 season.

But it has been the connection with the storied tradition of the Saint Joseph's men's and women's basketball programs that has given The Hawk mascot its prominence on the national level, making it one of the most recognized mascots in college athletics.
