A DIFFERENT LEAGUE

- The Big I2 Conference has four teams in the top 25 of this week's College Football Playoff rankings, including three in the top I3 with No. 6 Texas Tech, No. I2 BYU and No. I3 Utah in addition to No. 25 Cincinnati.
- Through Week II of the season, nine Big I2 programs are bowl eligible, with two more that are one win away.
- Six Big I2 teams have only one or two Conference losses atop of the standings for a spot in the 2025 Edward Jones Big I2 Football Championship at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas.
- Ten different Big I2 teams have defeated an AP Top 25 opponent this season, which is tied for the most among all FBS conferences.
- Big I2 QB Club: BYU's Bear Bachmeier, Cincinnati's Brendan Sorsby and Houston's Conner Weigman give the Conference three different quarterbacks with at least six games with both a passing and rushing touchdown. All other FBS conferences combine for just one.
- All nine of Texas Tech's wins have been by wins of 22 points or more this season, becoming the first Big I2 school to achieve the feat since 2009.
- Utah and Texas Tech lead all FBS teams, with six or more wins, in margin of victory at 36.4 and 33.2 points per game, respectively.
- BYU has recorded at least three defensive sacks in four different Conference games this season, tied for the second most in the FBS.
- Arizona, Cincinnati, Houston, Texas Tech and Utah give the Conference five programs that have already exceeded their win totals from last season by a combined total of II wins.

Conference News & Notes

- Houston is the only FBS team that is undefeated on the road this season with a minimum of five games played away from home.
- Texas Tech has the nation's leaders in sacks in defensive end David Bailey (II.5 sacks) and forced fumbles in linebacker Jacob Rodriguez (seven).
- Among all FBS teams with just one loss this season, BYU is only one of two with its lone defeat coming on the road to a team ranked in the Top IO of the CFP.
- Utah has six wins by at least 30 points this season, which are the most in the FBS. It also marks the most by a Big I2 team in a single season since 2015.
- Cincinnati has only allowed two sacks this season, tied with Maryland for the fewest in the FBS. The pair of sacks also marks the fewest allowed ever by a Big I2 team through nine games.
- 75% of Big I2 teams have at least three Conference wins this season, which is the highest percentage of any conference in FBS.
- Arizona State has two wins against AP Top 25 opponents this season by four or fewer points, which ties Alabama for the most in FBS in 2025.

College Football Playoff (CFP) Selection Process

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is the event that crowns the national champion in college football. The CFP Selection Committee ranks the top 25 teams at the end of the season, and the I2 playoff participants consist of the five highest-ranked conference champions, plus the next seven highest-ranked teams. The four highest ranked conference champions will be seeded one through four and receive a first-round bye. The schools seeded five through eight will host those seeded nine through I2 in first-round games. The quarterfinals and semifinals rotate annually among six bowl games – the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic, Vrbo Fiesta Bowl, Capital One Orange Bowl, Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, Rose Bowl Game presented by Prudential and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. This year's quarterfinals will take place on December 31, 2025, and January 1, 2026, while the semifinals will be January 8-9, 2026. The College Football Playoff National Championship will be Monday, January 19, 2026, at Hard Rock Stadium in Miami.
