# FOCUS OF THE MONTH

#### **ELIGIBILITY CENTER REGISTRATION PRICE INCREASE**

Starting September 1st, the Eligibility Center will be increasing registration fees for certification accounts:

- · Academic and Amateurism Certification account (domestic PSAs): From \$100 to \$110
- · Academic and Amateurism Certification account (int'l PSAs): From \$160 to \$170
- · Amateurism-Only Certification account (domestic & int'l PSAs): From \$70 to \$75

# **UNIVERSITY OF MEMPHIS VIOLATION**

An academic counselor at the University of Memphis paid two softball student-athletes to complete course work and provide test answers to a men's basketball player. One softball player was given \$150 through Apple Pay for completing three assignments and another was given \$400 for providing answers to five tests and four quizzes. The student-athlete competed in 20 games while academically ineligible.

#### **Penalties include:**

- 2 years' probation for the university;
- \$30,000 fine;
- A 1% fine of the combined men's basketball and softball budgets;
- Vacation of records for all contests in which student-athletes competed while ineligible,
- The academic counselor was fired and received a 10-year show-cause order for their involvement.

#### IS THIS PERMISSIBLE?

Ima Setter is a volleyball student-athlete at Credits College and is enrolled in 9 hours of undergraduate courses during the first week of class. Her first competition is three days into the first week of school, and Ima is excited to practice and compete. Is it permissible for Ima to practice and compete while enrolled less than full-time during the first week of class?

- A. Yes, because if you can practice you can compete.
- B. No, she is only permitted to practice and not compete.

Answer: B, NO! Ima cannot compete since she is enrolled less than full-time during the first five days of school, but she is


#### **MYTH BUSTERS**
