CINCINNATI CAPS REGULAR SEASON AT TCU

- The Cincinnati football team will look to end a three-game skid at TCU on Saturday at 3:30 p.m. ET / 2:30 p.m. CT in Fort Worth at Amon G. Carter Stadium. The Bearcats and Horned Frogs are two of the top offenses in the Big 12.
- UC leads the Big 12 in yards per play (7.09), ranking 10th nationally, rushing yards per attempt (5.89; No. 5 in the nation), pass yards per attempt (8.4; No. 23) and pass efficiency (155.92, No. 21). TCU is throwing for 291.5 yards per game, which is second in the conference and 11th in the nation.
- The game will feature two of the Big 12's and the country's top quarterbacks in Cincinnati redshirt junior Brendan Sorsby and TCU redshirt junior Josh Hoover. Sorsby ranks second in the Big 12 in passer rating and has a league-best 33 total touchdowns in 2025. Hoover set the TCU school record with 3,920 passing yards in 2024 and has 3,166 yards this season. Hoover ranks among the Top 10 nationally in passing yards and passing touchdowns (25).
- Sorsby is from Denton, Texas, which is approximately 35 miles from Fort Worth. He starred at Lake Dallas High School.
- Hoover is from Heath, Texas. He starred at Rockwall-Heath High School, which is also near the Dallas area.
- Hoover originally committed to play quarterback at Indiana but decommitted right before signing day in December 2021 and signed with TCU, opening up the Hoosiers to extend Sorsby his first Power 4 college football scholarship offer.

NOTING THE TCU-UC MATCHUP

- The series is tied 2-2 with both teams in Conference USA and playing every year from 2002 to 2004, and facing off last fall.
- Cincinnati ended the 2024 season with a 20-13 loss to TCU on a cold November night in Nippert Stadium. Sorsby threw for 160 yards with one pick and rushed for 93 yards and a score. S Tre Gola-Callard had an interception. Hoover finished 18-of-35 for 212 yards with no touchdowns and one interception.
- The first-ever matchup between the Bearcats and Horned Frogs came in the 2002 season opener. UC trailed 29-14 in the fourth quarter, but came back to win 36-29 in overtime. The win began a home-opener win streak that continues to this day. Guidugli passed for 284 yards and two touchdowns with four interceptions, and had the game-winning 14-yard rushing touchdown.
- The only other matchup in Fort Worth was a 43-10 victory for the Horned Frogs that gave No. 10 TCU a 10-0 record at the time.

SORSBY IN MIDST OF OUTSTANDING SEASON

- In his second year with the program, Sorsby has taken a leap this year and become one of the better dual-threat quarterbacks in the country. He has completed 184-of-303 passes (60.7%) for 2,518 yards, 24 touchdowns, and just five interceptions. On the ground, Sorsby has rushed for 521 yards and nine scores.
- Sorsby has accounted for at least two touchdowns in every game this season, one of three FBS quarterbacks who can say that (Baylor's Sawyer Robertson and Old Dominion's Colton Joseph). He has 33 touchdowns this year, which is tied for fourth in the country and third-most in a season ever by a Cincinnati quarterback. He is four away from breaking Desmond Ridder's all-time record of 36, set in 2021.
- He is PFF's No. 12-rated quarterback (88.7) and the No. 11 quarterback according to ESPN's Total QBR (81.3).
- Sorsby was named a semifinalist for the Davey O'Brien Award, which annually recognizes the best quarterback in the country.
- The two most productive passing games of Sorsby's career have both come on the road in Big 12 play. He threw for 426 yards at Texas Tech in 2024 and had a 388-yard game in a 37-34 comeback win at Kansas on Sept. 27, 2025.

BEARCATS BATTLE NO. 11 BYU CLOSE ON SENIOR NIGHT

- Despite three missed field goals and two second-half turnovers, Cincinnati trailed by only 6 with under five minutes left in the game, but BYU running back LJ Martin bled out the clock before a game-sealing TD run to give the No. 11-ranked Cougars a 26-14 victory over the Bearcats on Senior Night at Nippert Stadium.
- Martin rushed for 222 yards on 32 carries to lead BYU past Cincinnati in the league's marquee game last weekend. FOX's Big Noon Kickoff came to Cincinnati for the second time in history and the close game lived up to the billing.
- Sorsby threw for 300 yards and two touchdowns with one interception, the fifth 300-yard passing game of his career.

CINCY BUILDING A RESUME

- The Bearcats' offense is propelled by Sorsby, who took a leap forward this year and has become one of the top dual-threat quarterbacks in the country. He has recorded at least two touchdowns in every game this season and had an incredible seven-game streak in which he passed for 2+ touchdowns and committed zero turnovers in September and October.
- Led by Gerhardt and PFF's No. 5-rated guard in the nation Evan Tengesdahl, the Bearcats have allowed the fewest sacks (4.0) through 11 games in the 30-year history of the Big 12.
- On defense, linebacker Jake Golday has 102 tackles, which ranks second in the Big 12. He is the first Bearcat with 100+ tackles in a season since Ivan Pace Jr. in 2022 (137 tackles). Golday has led UC in tackles eight times this year.
- Cincinnati ranks second in the nation in fourth-down conversion percentage (.842) and is tied for the national lead with fewest sacks allowed (4.0). The Bearcats' offense has allowed just 35 tackles for loss this year, third-fewest in the country and nine fewer than the next Big 12 program.
- ESPN rates UC as the nation's 11th-most efficient offense, second only to Utah in the Big 12.
- Senior WR Cyrus Allen has 11 TD catches, two more than any other Big 12 player and third-most in the nation. He is two away from tying the single-season school record for TD receptions set by Marcus Bennett in 2007.

BEARCATS BY THE NUMBERS

- Cincinnati, which started playing football in 1885, is in its 138th season and owns an all-time record of 674-619-50 (.521).
- UC is 68-31 (.687) since the start of the 2018 season, which ranks 16th among all full-time FBS programs during that time.
- The NCAA's most recent Graduation Success Rate (GSR) figures were released this week and Cincinnati's mark of 98 ranks third among all FBS programs behind only Northwestern and Wake Forest. The Cincinnati athletic department posted an overall mark of 97, which also ranked third among all FBS institutions.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

A two-time All-American, "The Godfather" earned his third consecutive all-conference nod last season, collecting First Team All-Big 12 honors. He logged 26 tackles, 5.0 tackles for loss, and 3.5 sacks while overcoming a difficult offseason that saw him sidelined with blood clots for three months. Corleone returned to action on Sept. 3 last year and made an immediate impact.

HALL OF FAME LEGACY ON THE AIR

Hoard's longtime broadcast partner Jim Kelly Jr. passed away on Sunday, Oct. 12. The duo spent 26 years calling Cincinnati Football together, providing a voice for many of the most memorable games and moments in program history.

Hoard has been joined by Tony Pike in the booth for the last three games. Best known as UC's quarterback for its 2008 and 2009 BCS Bowl teams, Pike was drafted by the Carolina Panthers in the sixth round of the 2010 NFL Draft and was a former All-BIG EAST performer at UC.

Hoard, Pike, and the late Kelly Jr. are all members of the Cincinnati Athletics Hall of Fame, which is named after Kelly Jr.'s father, James P. Kelly Sr. Pike is a member of the Class of 2025 and was inducted on Friday, Oct. 24.

THE BRENDAN SORSBY FILE



- Quarterback Brendan Sorsby has turned in a terrific 2025 campaign. He has completed 184-of-303 passes (60.7%) for 2,518 yards, 24 touchdowns, and just five interceptions. On the ground, Sorsby has rushed for 521 yards and nine scores.
- His 33 total touchdowns are tied for fourth among FBS quarterbacks and are third-most in a season in school history.
- He is PFF's No. 12-rated quarterback (88.7) and the No. 11 quarterback according to ESPN's Total QBR (81.3).
- Sorsby has had at least two total touchdowns in every game this season, the third-longest active streak among FBS quarterbacks.
- Between his interception vs. Nebraska and his interception at Utah, Sorsby threw 191 straight passes without a turnover. He had a streak of 148 passes without an INT last season as well.
- In his first year at UC in 2024, he emerged as one of the

Big 12's top signal-callers and one of the nation's top dual threat quarterbacks.

- He capped 2024 as one of just four players in the nation to pass for 2,800+ yards and 18 touchdowns and rush for nine touchdowns.
- He spent two seasons at Indiana, redshirting in 2022 before passing for 1,587 yards and 15 touchdowns with only five interceptions in 2023.
- Sorsby was a two-year starter at Lake Dallas [Texas] High School, he passed for 1,271 yards and 14 touchdowns with 791 yards and 15 scores on the ground as a senior in 2021.

FIRST HALF SUCCESS

Cincinnati has done an excellent job of jumping on teams early this season, having outscored opponents 228-107 in the first half.

Brendan Sorsby's play has been a huge part of that, as he's dominated in the first half this year. He has completed 111-of-177 passes (62.7%) for 1,404 yards, 19 touchdowns, and three interceptions in the first half this year. His 19 first-half passing TDs are tied for most in the country.

BEARCATS VS. HORNFROGS

- This Saturday's game will be the fifth meeting all-time between Cincinnati and TCU and the series stands at 2-2.
- The two teams also concluded the 2024 regular season against each other, a 20-13 TCU win at Nippert Stadium.
- The previous three meetings came from 2002-04 when both programs were Conference USA foes.
- UC won both CUSA matchups at Nippert Stadium in 2002 and 2004, while TCU won in Fort Worth in 2003. The Horned Frogs were ranked No. 9 in the Coaches Poll and No. 10 in the AP Poll for that matchup.

UC CRUSHING IT IN THE CLASSROOM

- The latest round of Graduation Success Rates (GSR) from the NCAA were released last week, and the Cincinnati Football program ranks among the best in the country.
- The Bearcats' 98 GSR in football led the Big 12 and ranked third in the country, trailing only Northwestern and Wake Forest.
- The athletic department as a whole posted a 97 GSR, which also ranked third in the country.

THE STORY SO FAR: THE 2025 BEARCATS

- Cincinnati is currently riding a three-game losing streak, but has already made great strides in its third year in the Big 12 Conference.
- Led by Cincinnati natives and Preseason All-Big 12 honorees defensive lineman Dontay "The Godfather" Corleone and tight end Joe Royer - who both spurned the NFL to come back, and quarterback Brendan Sorsby, linebacker Jake Golday and fourth-year starting center Gavin Gerhardt, Cincinnati had a core of leadership to go along with 21 transfers in Scott Satterfield's third season at Cincinnati.
- UC started 5-2 in 2024, including a win vs. CFP participant Arizona State, but dropped five straight to end the season. The scars from last fall fueled the offseason.
- Cincinnati mostly outplayed Nebraska in the season-opening Battle Kansas City Classic at GEHA Field at Arrowhead Stadium in front of 77,000-mostly Huskers' fans, but fell 20-17 as Sorsby's pass was intercepted in the final seconds.
- Cincinnati won seven straight games and vaulted to No. 17 in the AP poll before falling at No. 24 Utah on Nov. 1.
- UC beat Bowling Green 38-20, but lost Corleone to an ankle injury for which he would miss the next two games.
- Sorsby threw five TD passes in the first quarter and finished 15-of-15 in a 70-0 victory against overmatched FCS opponent Northwestern State on Sept. 13.
- Sorsby led a game-winning drive in the final two minutes at Kansas in a 37-34 shootout victory over the Jayhawks. He finished with 388 passing yards and two touchdowns as well as 52 yards on the ground.
- Buoyed by the return of Corleone and game-breaking runs by Evan Pryor, the Bearcats jumped out to 31-7 first-half lead against No. 14/12 Iowa State and outlasted the Cyclones 38-30 for the highest ranked win in Nippert Stadium in 19 years.
- Cincinnati improved its win streak to five with a 20-11 victory over UCF, becoming the first opponent to score in the first quarter against the Knights as Sorsby found wide receiver Jeff Caldwell for two touchdowns.
- Cincinnati's sixth straight win came at Oklahoma State, a 49-17 victory. Sorsby threw for four touchdowns and ran for another in the victory.
- The seventh straight win for UC came on Homecoming vs. Baylor, a 41-20 victory. In the win, Cincinnati's defense held the top passing attack in the country to just 137 yards through the air.
- The Bearcats are fifth in the country in yards per rush (5.89) and 10th in yards per play (7.09). ESPN ranks UC as the 11th-most efficient offense in the country.
- Led by Gerhardt, first-year starting guard Evan Tengesdahl (PFF's No. 5 rated guard in the country) and left tackle Joe Cotton (Outland National Offensive Lineman of the Week for Week 6), Cincinnati's offensive line has allowed just four sacks - tied for fewest in the nation - and has collected Big 12 Offensive Line of the Week three times this season.
- Sorsby has accounted for 33 total TDs (24 passing, nine rushing). He is the Big 12's highest-rated passer per PFF and ranks No. 11 nationally in ESPN's QBR.
- Max Fletcher has pinned three punts inside the opponents' 2-yard line this season. He is averaging 45.6 on 32 punts overall and has placed 13 of 24 punts inside the 20 in conference play.
- Jake Golday has been a star on defense, ranking among the Big 12 leaders in tackles per game (9.3) and looking like a bona fide All-American. He has collected Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week honors twice this season and has four games with at least 12 tackles.

A GLIMPSE AT CINCINNATI'S SEVEN WINS

- Cincinnati's loss at Utah on Nov. 1 snapped the team's seven-game winning streak, its longest since the historic 2021 season that saw UC win its first 13 games en route to the College Football Playoff.
- During their winning streak, the Bearcats averaged 41.3 points per game while allowing just 18.9, and averaged 461.4 yards of offense.
- It was the 12th winning streak of seven games or more in school history. Below is a list of all 12 winning streaks:

- During its seven-game winning streak, Cincinnati found a different way to win in each game, blending explosive offense, clutch defense and standout special teams.

Win #1: 38-20 vs. Bowling Green

- Cincinnati jumped out to a 24-3 lead on the strength of Brendan Sorsby's play and his connection with wide receiver Jeff Caldwell and tight end Joe Royer. The two pass catchers logged 109 and 103 receiving yards, respectively, to be the first 100-yard receiving duo of the season for UC.

Win #2: 70-0 vs. Northwestern State

- The Bearcats totally dismantled the Demons, setting modern-day school records for total touchdowns (10) and largest margin of victory (70). Sorsby put together an historic individual performance, throwing five TD passes in the first quarter. The defense allowed just 102 yards, the fewest since allowing 87 yards vs. Miami (Ohio) in 2013.

Win #3: 37-34 at Kansas

- Trailing 34-30 with 1:45 to go, Cincinnati mounted a 10-play, 75-yard game-winning scoring drive that ended with running back Tawee Walker's plunge into the end zone with 29 seconds to go. It was the Bearcats' first game-winning scoring drive in the final two minutes since the 2020 AAC Championship Game.

Win #4: 38-30 vs. No. 14 Iowa State

- Welcoming its first ranked opponent to Nippert Stadium since 2023, Cincinnati stormed out to a 31-7 lead before seeing its offense stall a bit in the second half. With momentum siding with the Cyclones, Sorsby flipped the script and found wide receiver Caleb Goodie for an 82-yard touchdown that put the game out of reach. The defense also stopped ISU on fourth down three times.

Win #5: 20-11 vs. UCF

- After four straight games scoring 35 points or more, Cincinnati managed just 20 against UCF, 17 of which came in the first half. The defense stood tall though, keeping the Knights out of the end zone until the final minutes of the game while making three fourth-down stops for the second straight game. Perhaps the Bearcats' biggest weapon was punter Max Fletcher, who pinned UCF inside its own 15-yard line four times.

Win #6: 49-17 at Oklahoma State

- Just the second road game of the year for Cincinnati was also its largest scoring output in a Big 12 game since joining the conference in 2023. UC scored on its first possession of the game and didn't look back, and also recorded its first defensive touchdown of the year. Cornerback Matthew McDoom returned an interception 100 yards for a touchdown in the fourth quarter. The Bearcats also had scoring drives of 95 and 94 yards.

Win #7: 41-20 vs. Baylor

- Cincinnati scored the first 24 points of the game and rushed for a season-high 265 yards, but it was the defense that opened eyes vs. Baylor. UC held the Bears, previously the nation's top passing attack, to 137 passing yards and just 266 total yards of offense in the victory. The Bearcats also did a good job of keeping their defense off the field, putting together four scoring drives of at least 10 plays.

BEARCATS ARE GOING BOWLING

- Cincinnati's win vs. Oklahoma State on Oct. 18 clinched bowl eligibility for the program for the first time since 2022.
- The Bearcats have appeared in 22 bowls in school history and are 10-12 all-time in bowl games.
- Their last bowl appearance was the 2022 Wasabi Fenway Bowl, a 24-7 loss vs. Louisville.
- UC has been to a bowl game in 12 of the last 17 seasons, a stretch that includes four New Year's Six bowls and a

BEARCATS' OFFENSE AMONG THE BEST

- Cincinnati's offense has been firing on all cylinders this season, and its a big reason why UC appeared in the Top 25 for five straight weeks.
- A big reason why the Bearcats have been able to move the ball on offense is their ability to avoid negative plays. UC has allowed just four sacks this year, fewest in the country.
- Opponents have just 35 tackles for loss against the Bearcats this year, third-fewest in the nation.
- Cincinnati is averaging 7.09 yards per play this season, which ranks 10th nationally.
- Cincinnati has done a good job of executing chunk plays on offense as well, ranking third in the Big 12 with 58 plays of 20-plus yards.
- The Bearcats have 58 offensive plays of 20 yards or more this season. A comprehensive list of big plays can be found on page 51.
- Against Iowa State, Cincinnati rushed for a season-high 260 yards, its 17th game with 200-plus yards under Scott Satterfield. The Bearcats also ran for 287, their 2024 season high, last year in Ames.
- UC posted 605 yards of offense vs. Northwestern State and 603 vs. Kansas on Sept. 27, the first back-to-back 600+-yard games since 2015. That year, the Bearcats put up 612 yards of offense in a win vs. UConn and 726 yards in a victory vs. UCF.
- The 603 yards at Kansas were the most for Cincinnati against a Power Four opponent since 2010 vs. Rutgers. That game, the Bearcats' offense put up 661 yards in a 69-38 victory.

RED ZONE SUCCESS

- Cincinnati has done a good job in the red zone this year, posting a 90.5% success rate (37-for-39)
- The first time this year that UC did not score after entering the red zone was its final drive vs. Baylor, when it reached the 17-yard line before taking a knee to end the game.

O-LINE EXCELLING IN PASS PROTECTION

- Cincinnati's offensive line has allowed just four sacks this season, tied for fewest in the country.
- Through 10 games this year UC allowed just three sacks, which was a Big 12 record for fewest sacks allowed through the first 10 games of a season.
- On Wednesday, Nov. 12, Cincinnati's offensive line was one of 10 across the country that earned semifinalist recognition from the Joe Moore Award.
- The Bearcats have won three Big 12 Offensive Line of the Week awards, the only team to win the award three times this year.
- The offensive line is led by fourth-year starter and three-time team captain Gavin Gerhardt (47 career starts) at center. The Bearcats added transfer right guard Taran Tyo (Ball State, All-MAC) and transfer left tackle Joe Cotton (South Dakota, FCS All-American) in the offseason and they have started each game at right guard and left tackle, respectively. Redshirt sophomore Evan Tengesdahl won the opening day left guard job after a strong camp following two seasons as a backup at guard and center. Redshirt senior Deondre Buford (31 career starts) and redshirt junior Ethan Green have both started games at right tackle.
- According to PFF, Tengesdahl is the No. 5-ranked guard in the country (81.6) and owns the second-best run-blocking grade (85.5) among all guards.

FUMBLEROOSKII

- Cincinnati was one of the best teams in the Big 12 last year at getting opponents to put the ball on the ground, and that trend has continued this season.
- The Bearcats have forced 11 fumbles so far this season with Antwan Peek Jr. and Logan Wilson both forcing a team-best two. UC's 11 forced fumbles are tied for 13th nationally.

- Cincinnati forced, and recovered, two fumbles in the win vs. Baylor.
- In the win at Kansas, Antwan Peek Jr. forced his second fumble of the season at Kansas in a critical moment. His forced turnover at the one-yard line turned what would have almost certainly been a KU touchdown into a crucial turnover.
- UC forced a Big 12-leading 14 fumbles last season. The 1.17 per game ranked eighth nationally.
- Peek Jr. forced four of those, tying for eighth in single-season school history. The single-season school record holder in forced fumbles is Peek's father (17) and 2024 UC Athletics Hall of Fame inductee Antwan Peek.

FOOTBALL TRIO JOIN UC'S HALL OF FAME

- Cincinnati's James P. Kelly Hall of Fame gained three more gridiron Bearcats on Oct. 24 with the inductions of Tom Marvaso, Mike Mickens and Tony Pike.
- Marvaso is a member of the football program's Ring of Honor and was a First-Team All-American in 1975. He was the team MVP in 1974, which included him scoring on an interception and kickoff return in the same game.
- Mickens, now in his sixth year at Notre Dame as its defensive backs coach and defensive pass game coordinator, was a First-Team All-American in 2008. His 14 career interceptions are a UC record. He was also an assistant coach for the Bearcats from 2018-19.
- Pike, a catalyst behind Cincinnati's first two BCS bowl appearances in 2008 and 2009, serves as both a daily ESPN 1530 radio host in town and sideline reporter for the Bearcats. AD John Cunningham surprised him during a call-in interview on July 31, followed by Pike's family entering the studio for an emotional episode.

CINCINNATI MOURNS THE PASSING OF JIM KELLY JR.

- Jim Kelly Jr., a beloved Bearcat who was a member of the UC Athletics Hall of Fame and was a longtime color analyst for Cincinnati's official radio broadcasts, passed away on Sunday, Oct. 12.
- Kelly Jr. grew up around Bearcats football, serving as a ball boy in the 1960s before following in his father Jim Kelly Sr.'s footsteps and playing wide receiver for UC from 1972 to 1975. He caught 76 passes for 964 yards in his career.
- His father played at UC from 1947-50 and served as a coach and administrator until 1994. Today, the UC Athletics Hall of Fame bears his name. The Kellys join William Keating Sr. and his sons, Charles and William Jr., as the only father-son combinations in the UC Hall of Fame.

POLL POSITION

- Cincinnati appeared at No. 25 in the latest College Football Playoff rankings on Nov. 11, the first time this season it earned a spot in the CFP Top 25.
- Cincinnati joined Texas Tech (No. 6), BYU (No. 12), and Utah (No. 13) as Big 12 programs in the CFP Top 25.
- The Bearcats entered the Top 25 following the UCF game, entering the polls at No. 24. It marked the first since since the 2022 season that UC was nationally ranked.
- Prior to this, the last time Cincinnati was ranked in the AP poll was Nov. 20, 2022 when it was No. 24.
- Before this season, the Bearcats were last ranked in the coaches poll on Nov. 20, 2022 at No. 21.

RANKED OPPONENTS AT NIPPERT

- Cincinnati hosted No. 11 BYU on Nov. 22, the second ranked opponent to visit Nippert Stadium this season.
- UC's win vs. No. 14 Iowa State on Oct. 4 marked the first home ranked win since 2021, and the first home ranked game entirely since 2023.

SHUTOUT TIDBITS

- UC shut out Northwestern State on Sept. 13, 70-0, for the second shutout under Scott Satterfield.
- The 70-point margin of victory marked a modern-era school record.
- When Cincinnati shut out Houston last year, it became

the first team to shut out a "Power 4" opponent in 2024.

- It was UC's first shutout since Nov. 3, 2018 vs. Navy and first shutout of a major-conference opponent was in 1995 at Virginia Tech.

NIPPERT AT NIGHT

- The Nov. 22 game vs. BYU was an 8:00 p.m. ET kickoff at Nippert Stadium, adding another entry to the storied history of "Nippert at Night".
- Cincinnati started playing football in 1885 but moved the program to campus in Clifton in 1901. In 1906, UC invented co-operative education, which meant student-athletes on the football team were working downtown during the day.
- They needed a way to keep practicing when players were on a co-op rotation, so they erected a crude system of lights at Carson Field (where the team still plays today) in 1909.
- This allowed student-athletes to return to campus from co-op jobs and practice at night. In 1910, a more permanent setup was installed. The team painted the football white in order to see it better in the dark. In 1921 the University upgraded to a more modern incandescent lighting system which was, fittingly, designed by electrical engineering student Jack Silverman as his co-op thesis.
- In 1923, UC took it a step further, staging a regular-season game under the lights—the September 29 season opener against Kentucky Wesleyan. As the Bearcats won the game 17-0, the college football world took notice that the experiment had worked. It was the first college football game played under lights in the Midwest and believed to be the first major college football night game in the country.

WIDE RECEIVER ROOM OVERHAUL PAYING DIVIDENDS

- Brendan Sorsby welcomed tight end Joe Royer back into the fold, but almost every other pass catcher is different from a year ago. The new faces in the wide receiver room have done wonders for the passing attack.
- Wide receiver Cyrus Allen leads UC in receptions (46), touchdowns (11), and yards (623).
- Allen leads the Big 12 in receiving touchdowns and is tied for third nationally. He ranks tied for third in single-season school history.
- Caleb Goodie has caught 24 passes for 417 yards and two TDs, and Jeff Caldwell has hauled in 28 passes for 436 yards and five touchdowns.
- Goodie (17.38) and Caldwell (15.57) rank fourth and 10th, respectively, in the Big 12 in yards per reception.
- Isaiah Johnson boasts a two-touchdown game and Noah Jennings has started three games and logged 20 catches this year.
- Allen (75.9, 4th) and Caldwell (72.9, 10th) both rank among the Top 10 wide receivers in the Big 12 according to PFF.
- In total, 148 of the 190 receptions logged by Bearcats this season are from players new to the roster in 2025.

THE SCOTT SATTERFIELD FILE

- Head coach Scott Satterfield enters Year 3 at Cincinnati after he was hired as its 43rd head coach on Dec. 5, 2022.
- He has the Bearcats off to their best start since 2021, and has caught the eye of two major Coach of the Year awards.
- Satterfield has been named to midseason watch lists for the Dodd Trophy and the Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year awards.
- Satterfield's career record stands at 91-68 (.572) in 13 years as a head coach at Cincinnati, Louisville, and Appalachian State, holding a winning mark in seven seasons in addition to a 4-1 record in bowl games.
- He led the Mountaineers from the FCS to the FBS and to three straight conference titles.
- He lifted the Cardinals up from a 2-10 campaign in 2018 to an 8-5 record in his first season in 2019.
- A Durham, N.C., native, Satterfield was the 2018 Sun Belt Coach of the Year at Appalachian State before earning 2019 ACC Coach of the Year honors after leading the

Cardinals to a six-win improvement in his first year.

- Satterfield has deep ties to App State, serving as an assistant coach (1998-08) and quarterback for the Mountaineers (1991-95), helping lead his alma mater to three NCAA Division I FCS national titles and eight conference championships along the way.

QB1: BRENDAN SORSBY

- Redshirt junior quarterback Brendan Sorsby has taken a huge leap forward in 2025 and has been one of the best quarterbacks in the country this season. He has completed 184-of-303 passes (60.7%) for 2,518 yards and 24 touchdowns to just five interceptions. He also has 521 rushing yards and nine rushing TDs.
- He also ranks 12th in the country in passing yards per completion (13.68) and in passing touchdowns (24).
- Sorsby has scored 33 touchdowns this year, throwing for 24 and rushing for nine, which is tied for fourth nationally.
- Sorsby is approaching the school record for total touchdowns in a season by a UC quarterback. Below is a list of every 30-plus touchdown season by a Cincinnati quarterback:

- The Denton, Texas native is PFF's No. 12-rated quarterback (88.7) and the No. 11 quarterback according to ESPN's Total QBR (81.3)
- Sorsby is one of five quarterbacks in the country with two 80-plus yard touchdown passes.
- He has three passes of at least 80 yards in his UC career, more than any other QB in school history. He is also the only Cincinnati quarterback ever with multiple 80-yard completions in a season.
- Sorsby's nine rushing touchdowns are tied for third in school history for a QB in a season. Last year, he also rushed for nine TDs. Below is a list of single-season QB rushing touchdown leaders in school history:

- He has gotten the job done on the ground as well, ranking fourth among all Big 12 quarterbacks in rushing yards (521) and second in yards per carry (5.79) while ranking among the league leaders with nine rushing touchdowns.
- Sorsby threw for 300 yards vs. BYU, his fifth career 300-yard passing game and third of the season.
- Despite throwing for just 111 yards vs. Baylor, Sorsby helped string together four scoring drives that were 10 plays or longer that kept the defense off the field and he accounted for three touchdowns, tossing two and rushing for one.
- Sorsby threw for 284 yards and four scores while rushing for another TD at Oklahoma State, his third game with at least four touchdowns this season.
- Sorsby tallied three total touchdowns in the win vs. Iowa State, propelling an offense that scored 38 points against a stout Cyclone defense.
- His 82-yard touchdown pass to Caleb Goodie that sealed the Iowa State victory was the longest pass by a UC quarterback since Gunner Kiel in 2015.
- Against Kansas, Sorsby threw for 383 yards and two touchdowns, his fourth career 300-yard passing game.
- Against Nebraska in Week 1, Sorsby led UC with 96 rushing yards and two touchdowns. He led the team in rushing for the third time in his Cincinnati career.
- He started all 12 games for Cincinnati last season under center, completing 249-of-389 passes for 2,813 yards and 18 touchdowns while throwing just seven interceptions. His completion percentage (64.0%) was second in school history. Sorsby ranked third in the Big 12 in completion percentage and sixth in pass completions.

SORSBY'S BIG DAY

- Nobody lit up the field vs. Northwestern State quite like redshirt junior quarterback Brendan Sorsby, who posted eye-popping numbers that earned him Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week honors.
- Sorsby completed 15-of-15 passes for 253 yards and five touchdowns, while also rushing for 39 yards and a TD.

- All five of his passing touchdowns came in the first quarter, setting school records for TD passes in a quarter and half, and making him the fifth FBS quarterback since 1995 to throw five touchdowns in a quarter.
- He became just the fifth FBS quarterback in the last 30 years to finish a game with a perfect completion percentage on at least 15 pass attempts.
- His 99.8 QBR is the second-highest in Big 12 history and the highest by a quarterback in the country this year.
- Sorsby was PFF's highest-graded quarterback in Week 3, posting a 95.5 grade.
- In addition to Sorsby's five TDs, Brady Lichtenberg and Samaj Jones each threw a touchdown pass to give UC seven for the game, a school-record for team touchdown passes in a game.

EVEN MORE ON SORSBY

- Sorsby was the only FBS quarterback last season with a 425+ yard passing game and a 125+ yard rushing game. He threw for 426 yards at Texas Tech and rushed for 143 yards at Iowa State.
 - Sorsby's game at Iowa State was one of the most prolific rushing performances by a UC quarterback in school history:

- His 426-yard passing performance in Lubbock marked the highest total by a UC quarterback since 2015, as well, and the ninth-highest in Cincinnati history.
 - Sorsby threw his first interception of the season at Texas Tech last year, snapping a streak of 160 consecutive pass attempts without an interception dating back to 2023. He opened the year with 148 straight passes without a pick, the longest streak among FBS QBs last season.
 - Sorsby played two seasons with the Hoosiers and threw for 1,587 yards and 15 touchdowns in 2023. The Denton, Texas native made seven starts at Indiana and added production on the ground as well as through the air. He rushed for 286 yards and four TDs last season, including 151 yards over the final three games of the year.

LEADING MAN CYRUS ALLEN

- Senior wide receiver Cyrus Allen has been Cincinnati's leading receiver in his first year with the program. He has 46 catches for 623 yards and 11 touchdowns, leading UC in all three categories.
 - He leads the Big 12 and is tied for third in the country in receiving touchdowns, and his 11 TDs are also tied for third on the program's single-season list:

- Six of Allen's touchdown catches have come over the past five games.
 - Allen caught an 88-yard touchdown pass at Utah, the third-longest reception in school history and the longest since 2015.
 - Allen caught three touchdowns at Oklahoma State, tying the program's single-game school record. It was the 10th time a Bearcat has caught three TD passes in a game and the first such instance since Tyler Scott did so in 2022.
 - Allen turned in the best performance of his career at Kansas, catching a career-high 11 balls for 128 yards and two touchdowns.
 - He logged four catches for 59 yards and a touchdown vs. Northwestern State, leading UC in both catches and targets.
 - Allen caught both touchdowns vs. Bowling Green, his second career two-touchdown game.
 - The former Texas A&M (2024) and Louisiana Tech (2022-23) receiver brought 86 career receptions for 1,547 yards and nine touchdowns into his senior season after joining Cincinnati via the transfer portal.
 - During his freshman year at Louisiana Tech, he led all FBS freshmen in scrimmage plays over 30 yards with 10

- Redshirt junior Max Fletcher took over punting duties this year after redshirting last year behind his older brother, Mason. The younger Fletcher has been terrific for the Bearcats this year.
- Fletcher has punted 32 times this year and has placed

16 inside the 20-yard line while booting 13 punts at least 50 yards. His longest punt of the year was a 66-yarder vs. Arizona.

- Fletcher is one of four punters nationally to have at least half of his punts land inside the 20-yard line (min. 30 attempts), joining Jackson Ross (Tennessee), Billy Gowers (Hawaii), and Lachlan Carrigan (Memphis).
- Thirteen of his 24 punts in Big 12 play have been downed inside the 20-yard line.
- Against Arizona, his 66-yard punt was downed at the 1-yard line, his third punt this season that pinned the opponent down inside the 2-yard line.
- Fletcher proved to be a lethal weapon against UCF, placing four of his five punts inside the 15-yard line. He effectively ended the game with a punt downed at the 2-yard line in the final moments of the game, pinning the Knights near their own goal line.
- For his effort vs. UCF, Fletcher was named Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week.
- Fletcher unleashed a beautiful punt in the second half against Iowa State, pinning the Cyclones on their own 1-yard line. It was UC's first punt downed at the 1-yard line since last year at UCF.
- This will be the ninth-straight year in which Cincinnati has had an Australian punter, and the resume is thick.
- Max Fletcher was an All-SEC selection at Arkansas in 2023 before electing a redshirt year with Cincinnati to share the sideline with his brother, Mason Fletcher. He was UC's starting punter in Week 1 vs. Nebraska and punted four times for 181 yards, landing two inside the 20-yard line.
- Mason (2021-24) finished second in school history with 44.0 yards per punt over his four-year career. He was an All-American in 2022 following an excellent rookie season in the CFP year.
- The streak began with four-time All-AAC and 2018 All-American James Smith (2017-20).

FLETCHER'S CHARITY DONATIONS

- Fletcher has taken his challenge as the newest Bearcats punter up a notch by teaming up with Save the Animals Foundation, where he will donate \$20 for every punt he downs inside the 20.
- Entering play vs. TCU, Fletcher has put 16 punts inside the 20-yard line to bring his current total to **\$320**.

GOOD AS GOLD(AY)

- Redshirt senior linebacker Jake Golday has led UC on defense this year. He leads the team with 102 tackles and ranks second in the Big 12 with 9.3 tackles per game. His 102 tackles make him the first Bearcat with 100 or more tackles in a season since Ivan Pace Jr. in 2022, who had 137 stops.
- On Nov. 4, he was named a semifinalist for the Butkus Award, one of 12 semifinalists and one of two from the Big 12 Conference (Texas Tech's Jacob Rodriguez).
- Golday's 82.2 PFF grade puts him third among all linebackers in the Big 12.
- He has led Cincinnati in tackles eight times this season and has five double-digit tackle performances, most recently accomplishing both of those feats with a 13-tackle performance vs. Arizona.
- He was named Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week for the second time this season following the Iowa State game.
- Golday was electric against Iowa State, collecting 13 tackles, a sack, and a pass breakup in the victory. It was his third game this year with double-digit tackles.
- The Arlington, Tenn. native tied his career high with 14 tackles in the win vs. Bowling Green and added a sack.
- Golday earned Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week honors following his performance vs. Nebraska, leading UC with 12 tackles and a sack.
- In his first season with the Bearcats, Golday fit right in with the team's linebacker corps. He was second on the team with 58 tackles. He was also rated the No. 11 senior in the preseason by The Athletic's Dane Brugler heading into this season.
- He had a breakout game at UCF last year with six tackles, 2.5 TFL, 1.5 sacks, and he also forced and recovered a fumble. He earned the Big 12's Newcomer of the Week Award for his efforts.
- One of the fastest players on the team, Golday was registered a top speed of 22.1 MPH during his first fall camp.
- A transfer from Central Arkansas, in 2023 he posted a team-high 84 tackles as well as 7.0 TFL and 4.5 sacks.

TOP TARGET JOE ROYER

- Redshirt junior Joe Royer has been rated a first-round pick by Todd McShay, and the third-best tight end by

The Athletic's Dane Brugler, for 2026.

- Royer has two of the longest receptions by a Bearcat this year: a 73-yard catch vs. Bowling Green and a 67-yard catch vs. UCF.
- He is the only tight end in the country with two receptions of at least 60 yards.
- Among Big 12 tight ends, Royer ranks first in yards per catch (14.27).
- Royer has 76 catches in his career as a Bearcat, which ranks fifth all-time for a tight end in school history:

- Royer posted a team-high five catches at Oklahoma State for 63 yards on a touchdown, his fourth TD catch of the year.
- The Cincinnati native caught four passes, one of which was a touchdown, in the win vs. Iowa State.
- Royer caught two passes for 24 yards at Kansas before leaving the game with an injury.
- He caught two touchdown passes in the 70-0 win vs. Northwestern State, the first multi-TD game of his career.
- Royer collected his first career 100-yard receiving game vs. Bowling Green, catching two passes for 104 yards.
- He hauled in a 73-yard catch in the second quarter vs. BGSU, the longest catch of his career and the longest by a Cincinnati tight end since Josiah Deguara's 73-yard reception at East Carolina in 2019. It was also the longest reception by a Big 12 tight end since 2023.
- Last season, Royer ranked second on the team in catches (50) and receiving yards (521) and led all Big 12 tight ends in receptions and yards.
- Royer's 50 catches broke the single-season school record for catches by a tight end. That mark was held by Kansas City Chiefs superstar Travis Kelce, who caught 45 passes for 722 yards in 2012:

- Even when he's not catching passes, Royer is a valuable part of the offense. His 76.4 pass block grade according to PFF ranked fourth among Big 12 tight ends last year.
- He entered the 2024 season with four career receptions for 24 yards in three seasons at Ohio State. The Cincinnati native (Elder HS) turned heads in his first fall camp as a Bearcat.

- Royer battled through injuries during his three seasons at Ohio State and was a member of the 2022 team that made it to the College Football Playoff.

"THE GODFATHER" OF CINCINNATI

- One of the best and most recognizable players on the team, Dontay "The Godfather" Corleone returned to Clifton this season to continue wreaking havoc on opposing offenses.
- After missing the Northwestern State and Kansas games due to injury, Corleone returned against Iowa State and had two tackles vs. the Cyclones.
- Despite battling through health issues last year, Corleone had 26 tackles and 5.0 TFL, 3.5 sacks, and four QB hurries en route to First Team All-Big 12 honors.
- In honor of his leadership and on-field productivity, he was named a semifinalist for the 2024 Jason Witten Man of the Year Award.
- Last year, Corleone battled blood clots for much of the summer. He was sidelined on June 28, 2024 with a non-football medical issue. He was treated for blood clots found in his lungs, discovered after he reported chest discomfort and shortness of breath to the Cincinnati athletic trainers.
- Led by Senior Associate Athletic Director of Sports Medicine Aaron Himmler and team physician Dr. Jon Divine, Cincinnati sports medicine staff, Corleone and his family met with several physicians and specialists to develop a personal medical plan for the Cincinnati native to return to football activities safely.
- Corleone was cleared to play in games by the Cincinnati Athletics sports medicine staff just five days before the Pitt game on Tuesday, Sept. 3, 2024 when he participated in his first full practice since June.
- Corleone returned to action vs. Pitt, starting the game at defensive tackle and registering six tackles and one tackle for loss.

JEFF CALDWELL: FUTBOL TO FOOTBALL

- Military enlistment. Eight-inch growth spurt. Family dedication. Those are only a few ways to describe 6-foot-6 wide receiver Jeff Caldwell, one of the top portal pickups for the Bearcats this season.
- Caldwell has 28 catches for 436 yards and five touchdowns this year.
- Caldwell caught a 19-yard touchdown vs. BYU, his second straight game with a TD.
- He led UC in receiving vs. Arizona, catching five balls for 68 yards and a touchdown.
- He posted his first multi-TD effort as a Bearcat vs. UCF, catching two first-half touchdowns from Brendan Sorsby.
- After a quiet first game for UC, Caldwell burst onto the scene with five catches for 109 yards and a TD vs. Bowling Green, the seventh 100-yard game of his career.
- The former Lindenwood star, a Walter Payton Award finalist last year, was a soccer and basketball player in high school who finally relented to the gridiron after pleas from the coach.
- A four-game senior season due to COVID and a 5-foot-9 stature (that did become 6-foot-4 by that time) limited his exposure, but at least he was getting to play with his brother, Frank.
- The raw talent refined, and he could have left in 2023 after showing signs of promise. He turned down potential NIL opportunities at Power 5 programs to play one more year with his brother.
- Cincinnati, in addition to Brendan Sorsby's DMs, won him over to the Bearcats.

TAWEE WALKER: THE THUNDER

- Redshirt senior running back Tawee Walker leads UC with 661 rushing yards and has put together an impressive highlight reel of broken tackles this season.
- Walker is the No. 2-graded running back in the Big 12 according to PFF (84.2).
- Walker rushed for a season-best 119 yards on 12 carries vs. Arizona, his fifth career 100-yard game and his first as a Bearcat.
- Walker can punish defenders with the best of them, and had an especially impressive broken tackle vs. Iowa State that went viral on social media.
- His two-yard plunge into the end zone with 29 seconds left turned out to be the game-winning score at Kansas, and was his second touchdown of the game.
- Walker led Cincinnati with 11 carries vs. Bowling Green in his first home game as a Bearcat. However, it was not his first-ever game at Nippert Stadium.
- He rushed five times for 15 yards and caught two passes for 27 yards for Oklahoma in 2023 at Nippert — UC's first-ever Big 12 home game. Walker had 53 yards on seven carries in his UC debut.
- Walker joined the Bearcats this winter via the transfer portal after an All-Big Ten season at Wisconsin in 2024.
- He rushed for 1,438 yards and 17 touchdowns over the last two seasons — at Wisconsin (2024) and Oklahoma (2023). He also played at Oklahoma in 2022, beginning his career as a walk-on, after a standout junior college season at Palomar Junior College.

EVAN PRYOR: THE LIGHTNING

- After missing two games with an injury, running back Evan Pryor returned vs. BYU. He ranks third on the team with 514 yards.
- He is averaging 7.04 yards per carry, which ranks third in the Big 12 among qualified players.
- Pryor had his best game of the season vs. Iowa State, rushing for a career-high 111 yards on 11 carries with two touchdowns. His 30-yard touchdown run on UC's first drive of the game set the tone for the big win.
- His 46-yard rush at Kansas was the longest run by a UC player this season.
- Pryor had quite the debut season for UC in 2024, and he was rewarded this preseason with Doak Walker Award Watch List accolades.
- The former Ohio State back became UC's spark plug on offense, scoring four touchdowns of at least 55 yards.
- He caught an 80-yard touchdown pass in the West Virginia game that was the second-longest pass play in the Big 12 last season.
- Against Arizona State, Pryor broke free on a rush up the middle and blazed his way to a 55-yard TD.
- He started his Cincinnati career with a bang vs. Towson, taking his first carry all the way to the house for a 64-yard touchdown.
- In the Miami game, Pryor outdid himself with a 65-yard TD run in the third quarter, the longest run of his career.
- Pryor rushed for 105 yards vs. Towson on just four carries, ending the game as UC's top rusher while collecting his first career 100-yard performance.

GAVIN GERHARDT: CENTER OF ATTENTION

- Redshirt senior offensive lineman Gavin Gerhardt has been UC's starting center for each of the past two seasons, anchoring the offensive line since 2022.
- Saturday's game will be his 47th career start at center, which will tie Deyshawn Bond (2013-16) for most career starts at center in school history.
- The Xenia, Ohio native has started each of his last 33 games played. He was placed on the Rimington Trophy preseason watch list.
- Gerhardt's 46 starts as a Bearcat are the most on the team.

ANTWAN PEEK JR. FOLLOWING IN HIS FATHER'S FOOTSTEPS

- Redshirt junior safety Antwan Peek Jr. has played as well as anyone on the Bearcats' defense, and he is the fourth-ranked safety in the Big 12 according to PFF (82.9).
- He has been named a semifinalist for the Jim Thorpe Award, annually presented to the nation's top DB.
- A former walk-on and the son of Cincinnati legend Antwan Peek, the younger Peek has 34 tackles, two TFL, and two forced fumbles.
- He has forced six fumbles in his career, which ranks tied for fourth in program history. He is one of seven players to have forced at least six fumbles in a career in school history.
- The man who ranks first in school history in career forced fumbles is his father, Antwan Peek. The elder Peek forced 17 fumbles in his career as a Bearcat.

MATTHEW MCDOOM (MC)ZOOMS HIS WAY INTO THE RECORD BOOK

- Senior cornerback Matthew McDoom broke Cincinnati's interception dry spell in exhilarating fashion at Oklahoma State, picking off a pass in the fourth quarter and returning it for 100 yards for a score.
- It was the longest interception return in school history, besting the previous record of 96 yards that was set by Bob Del Rosa in 1958.
- Incredibly, Del Rosa's pick six *also* came against Oklahoma State in a game at Nippert Stadium. UC and OSU have only met five times in their histories, and two of those meetings have come since they became conference foes in 2023.
- Adding to the Oklahoma-centric nature of McDoom's pick six, it was the first by a Bearcat since Deshaun Pace's INT return for a touchdown at Tulsa in 2022.
- For McDoom, it was his fourth career interception after logging three at Coastal Carolina last season.

SEVEN YEARS FOR NO. 7

- Cornerback Logan Wilson is back for his second year at Cincinnati, which also marks his seventh of college football.
- Wilson blocked a field goal vs. Arizona on Nov. 15, the first blocked field goal by a Bearcat since Jowon Briggs did it vs. Navy on Nov. 5, 2022.
- He started Week 1 vs. Nebraska, but did not play vs. Bowling Green due to injury. Wilson returned to action vs. Northwestern State and had a TFL.
- Wilson forced a turnover vs. Baylor, recovering his own forced fumble to set up a UC scoring drive.
- Wilson, who wore number 13 last season, changed his jersey number to seven to honor his seventh season as a college football player.
- Wilson began his career at Kansas State in 2019 and played two games at ULM during the 2020 season.
- He found his stride at North Texas (2021-23), where he was a two-year starter and team captain.
- He played in all 12 games for UC last year and earned a start against Miami (OH).

TREVON GOLA-CALLARD MAKING THE MOST OF HIS OPPORTUNITY

- After spending the 2022 season at NCAA Division II University of Mary and the 2023 season at the University of Southern Utah, redshirt senior Trevon Gola-Callard joined the Bearcats prior to the 2024 campaign.
- He was a starter at his previous two spots, but played a backup role in his first year at UC.
- Gola-Callard has started all 11 games this year and ranks second on the team with 68 tackles.
- He led UC with 11 tackles in the win vs. Baylor, the second time this season he has led the team in tackles.
- A Las Vegas native, Gola-Callard has come a long way since becoming a college athlete. He started his career at the University of Mary, he weighed just 149 pounds.
- Though he spends his Saturdays protecting the Bearcats' end zone from opposing offenses, Gola-Callard one day hopes to be a protector of greater importance: he plans on becoming a first responder after his playing career

- The redshirt junior and former All-MAC offensive lineman is way more than a football player.
- Tyo's background includes time showing sheep and hogs from fourth-to-eighth grade, including feeding them in early mornings around his lifting schedule. His father, Tim, also grew up on a farm, and Taran's grandmother showed appaloosas (the spotted-pattern horse).
- Tyo's great-great-grandpa was full Cherokee/Miami, and the family has "around 5,000 Native American artifacts in our basement."
- Tyo also has an arrowhead tattoo on his arm that includes a bible verse.

NOTES FROM GAME 11 VS. BYU

- In its final home game of the 2025 season, Cincinnati lost to No. 11 BYU, 26-14.
- For UC, the No. 11-ranked Cougars were the highest-ranked opponent to visit Nippert Stadium since 2016 when No. 6 Houston came to town.
- Prior to the game, Cincinnati honored 22 seniors for its Senior Day recognition: Harris Adams, Cyrus Allen, Ben Blevins, Deondre Buford, Jeff Caldwell, Dontay Corleone, Jack Dingle, Gavin Gerhardt, Trevon Gola-Callard, Jake Golday, Patrick Gurd, Jalen Hunt, Rob Jackson, Brady Lichtenberg, CJ McCray, Matthew McDoom, Isaiah Rogers, Joe Royer, Stephen Rusnak, Tawee Walker, Xavier Williams, Logan Wilson.

NOTES FROM GAME 10 VS. ARIZONA

- Cincinnati hosted Arizona this past Saturday, the first meeting all-time between the two teams. The Wildcats came out on top, 30-24.
- The first play of the game was an uncharacteristic interception from Brendan Sorsby, but the Bearcats' QB bounced back later in the game to lead a 12-play, 75-yard scoring drive that made it a 27-24 game. A 51-yard Arizona field goal with 1:34 to go made it 30-24, and UC was unable to put together another scoring drive to end the game.
- Running back Tawee Walker rushed for a season-best 119 yards on 12 carries, his fifth career 100-yard game and first as a Bearcat.
- Cincinnati's defense tallied a season-high nine tackles for loss, besting the previous high of eight TFLs vs. Bowling Green. UC also added three sacks, its fourth game with at least three sacks this season.

NOTES FROM GAME 9 AT UTAH

- The Bearcats saw their seven-game winning streak come to an end at Utah on Nov. 1, falling to the Utes by a score of 45-14.
- The game was the site of ESPN's College GameDay, the third time UC has played in a game that hosted GameDay and first time since 2021.
- Cincinnati fought to make it a 10-point game in the third quarter, but two quick Utah touchdowns put the game out of reach.
- This was Cincinnati's first ranked matchup since 2022 and its 13th since 2018. UC is 5-8 in those 13 games.
- UC tied its season high with eight pass breakups, matching the output from the UCF game.
- The defense also produced five tackles for loss, the fifth time this season it has had five or more TFLs in a game.

NOTES FROM GAME 8 VS. BAYLOR

- Cincinnati won its seventh consecutive game at home vs. Baylor on Oct. 25, a 41-20 victory.
- It was Homecoming at UC. The win improved the Bearcats to 63-32-4 all-time on Homecoming, winning nine of the last 11 dating back to Nippert Stadium's renovation in 2015.
- The story of the game was Cincinnati's defense, which held Baylor to 137 passing yards, more than 200 yards below their season average. Baylor entered the game with the nation's top passing attack.
- Offensively, Cincinnati rushed for a season-high 265 yards and three scores. It marked the fifth time this year and 18th time of the Scott Satterfield/Big 12 tenure (2023-present) that the Bearcats had 200-plus yards on the ground.

NOTES FROM GAME 7 AT OKLAHOMA STATE

- Cincinnati won its sixth straight game and clinched bowl eligibility at Oklahoma State on Saturday, Oct. 18, winning by a score of 49-17.
- The Bearcats scored on their first drive of the game and never looked back, and used three fourth-quarter TDs to end the game with an emphatic note.
- Senior cornerback Matthew McDoom's 100-yard pick six in the fourth quarter was notable for many reasons. It was

UC's first interception on the season, and also the longest interception return for a touchdown in school history.

- Redshirt junior quarterback Brendan Sorsby was terrific once again, accounting for five touchdowns (four passing, one rushing) in the win. He has accounted for 24 touchdowns this year, the most in the nation.
- The Bearcats' offense was hard to stop, as evidenced by their two 90+-yard scoring drives. They had a 12-play, 94-yard touchdown drive in the second quarter and an 11-play, 95-yard TD drive in the fourth quarter.

NOTES FROM GAME 6 VS. UCF

- Cincinnati improved to 5-1 on the year following its 20-11 win vs. UCF on Oct. 11.
- The Bearcats jumped out to a 17-0 lead thanks to two first-half touchdown passes from Brendan Sorsby to Jeff Caldwell and a field goal from Stephen Rusnak.
- For the fifth time in six games, the offensive line did not allow a sack.
- Cincinnati held UCF to 2-of-5 on fourth down attempts, the second straight game it stopped its opponent on fourth down three times. Last week against Iowa State, UC stopped the Cyclones three times on fourth down as well.
- The meeting was the renewal of a rivalry of sorts between UC and UCF.
- The Knights won 25 straight games and two AAC titles in 2017 and 2018. Cincinnati actually handed UCF its first AAC loss in three years in a historic 27-24 Friday night win 2019 which propelled the Bearcats to back-to-back league titles and AP Top 10 finishes in 2020 and 2021.
- The 2019 win was the coming out party for true freshman cornerback Ahmad "Sauce" Gardner, who had a pick-six in the game that sparked the victory.

NOTES FROM GAME 5 VS. IOWA STATE

- Cincinnati captured its biggest win of the Scott Satterfield era on Oct. 4 with a 38-30 victory vs. Iowa State.
- This marked Cincinnati's highest ranked home win since beating No. 7 Rutgers, 30-11, on Nov. 18, 2006.
- It was also the Bearcats' first top-15 win since No. 9 Notre Dame on the road in 2021.
- It was head coach Scott Satterfield's fourth win against a ranked team as an FBS head coach and his first at UC. He won three games against ranked opponents while at Louisville: Nov. 19, 2022 vs. No. 24 NC State; Oct. 29, 2022 vs. No. 10 Wake Forest; and Oct. 12, 2019 at No. 19 Wake Forest.
- Cincinnati rushed for a season-high 260 yards, its 17th game with 200-plus yards under Scott Satterfield. The Bearcats also ran for 287, their 2024 season-high, last year in Ames.
- UC opened the game with five straight scoring drives, the second time this year it has done that. They scored on their first seven drives vs. Northwestern State.
- The Bearcats stopped the Cyclones on fourth down three times, the first time they've thwarted an opponent at least three times on fourth down in a game since Sept. 24, 2022 vs. Indiana.

NOTES FROM GAME 4 AT KANSAS

- Cincinnati won its Big 12 opener on Sept. 27, mounting a fourth-quarter comeback to win 37-34 at Kansas.
- After the Jayhawks scored a touchdown with 1:45 to go to take the lead, UC QB Brendan Sorsby led a 10-play, 75-yard drive that ended with a two-yard rushing touchdown by running back Tawee Walker. The TD gave the Bearcats a 37-34 lead, which would hold as the final score.
- The game-winning drive was Cincinnati's first in the final two minutes of a game since 2020, when it won the AAC Championship game on a field goal as time expired. Quarterback Desmond Ridder led a 12-play, 51-yard drive to set up the field goal.
- Prior to the win in Lawrence, the Bearcats' last game-winning drive on the road came on Nov. 16, 2019 at USF. That game was also won with a field goal as time expired when Ridder led UC on an 11-play, 60-yard drive.

NOTES FROM GAME 3 VS. NW STATE

- The Cincinnati offense had one of its best games in program history vs. Northwestern State on Sept. 13, winning 70-0 at Nippert Stadium.
- UC set modern-era school records for total touchdowns (10) and largest margin of victory (70).
- Cincinnati's 35 points in the first quarter were tied for the most in a first quarter by any team in the country this season. BYU scored 35 vs. Portland State on Aug. 30 and Minnesota scored 35 vs. Northwestern State on Sept. 6.
- UC and Minnesota are both the only teams to score 50 or more points in a half this year. The Golden Gophers scored 59 in the first half vs. Northwestern State.
- The Bearcats threw seven touchdown passes vs. the Demons, a single-game school record. The previous record

six touchdown passes, which had occurred five times previously, all since 2009.

NOTES FROM GAME 2 VS. BGSU

- Cincinnati won its home opener vs. Bowling Green, 34-20. It was the 24th straight home opener victory for UC; a full list of all 24 victories can be found in the note below.
- Quarterback Brendan Sorsby threw for 333 yards and three touchdowns while running for a TD as well. At the time, it was his third career 300-yard passing game and his fourth career game with at least four TDs.
- Wide receiver Jeff Caldwell (109) and tight end Joe Royer (104) both eclipsed 100 yards receiving, the first duo to do that since Xavier Henderson (127) and Manny Covey (100) did so last year at Texas Tech.
- Linebacker Jake Golday was outstanding, tying a career high with 14 tackles and adding a sack. Golday collected 26 tackles through the first two games of the season, putting him among the national leaders in tackles.
- It was Cincinnati's first-ever win vs. BGSU in five tries. The Falcons won the previous four meetings, all of which took place in the early 1990's.
- Redshirt freshman Daniel James made his first career start at cornerback, logging three tackles.

NOTES FROM GAME 1 VS. NEBRASKA

- Cincinnati opened the 2025 season at GEHA Field at Arrowhead Stadium in Kansas City on Thursday, Aug. 28 against Nebraska. The Cornhuskers came away with a 20-17 victory in front of 72,884 fans.
- The game took place at the home of the Kansas City Chiefs and two former Bearcats that currently play for the Chiefs were in attendance: Travis Kelce and Bryan Cook. Former Bearcat Jason Kelce was also in attendance.
- Quarterback Brendan Sorsby's 96 rushing yards led all Big 12 players during the Week 1.
- Linebacker Jake Golday logged 12 tackles and a sack, his highest single-game tackle total as a Bearcat.
- Safety Trevon Gola-Callard started the game at safety, his first start as a Bearcat.

BEARCATS THRIVING IN PORTAL

- Cincinnati was named one of the "Transfer Portal Winners" by The Athletic following the first week of portal signings in December.
- UC signed FCS All-Americans WR Jeff Caldwell (6-5, Lindenwood) and OT Nolan Latulippe (6-7, 300, Albany) as well as three-time All-Sun Belt DB Matthew McDoom (C. Carolina) and All-AAC K Stephen Rusnak (Charlotte).
- RB Tawee Walker led Wisconsin in rushing (864 yards and 10 TDs, '24 All-Big-Ten); he played for Oklahoma from 2022-23, making an appearance at Nippert Stadium in his second season with the Sooners.
- Cincinnati added FCS All-America LT Joe Cotton (South Dakota) — the spring portal's No. 1 offensive lineman in the country — after adding All-MAC guard Taran Tyo in the winter to solidify the offensive line.
- Many of Cincinnati's top players the last two seasons have come from the portal: OL Luke Kandra, TE Joe Royer, WR Xavier Henderson, LB Jared Bartlett, QB Brendan Sorsby, LB Jake Golday, RB Corey Kiner among them.

101 YEARS OF NIPPERT STADIUM

- Cincinnati celebrated the 100-year anniversary of the dedication of Nippert Stadium during the West Virginia game on Nov. 9.
- James Gamble Nippert Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Nov. 8, 1924 in memory of Jimmy Nippert, who tragically passed away on Dec. 25, 1923.
- On Nov. 29, 1923, during a muddy game vs. Miami University, Jimmy sustained a severe leg injury from a cleat. Despite the injury, he played the rest of the game.
- The injury led to septicemia due to the lack of antibiotics, and despite numerous blood transfusions from teammates, Jimmy's condition worsened.
- In his memory, his grandfather, James N. Gamble, funded the completion of the UC stadium, leading to its renaming as the James Gamble Nippert Memorial Stadium.
- James N. Gamble was the son of the co-founder of Procter & Gamble and was a retired vice president at the time of Jimmy's passing. P&G was founded in 1837 and is still headquartered in Cincinnati.
- Today, Nippert Stadium stands as the centerpiece of the University of Cincinnati's campus. Nippert Stadium's turf is open to all students for recreation when not in use by the football or lacrosse teams for practices or games.

CINCINNATI'S \$134 MILLION PRACTICE FACILITY IS HERE

- The University of Cincinnati cut the ribbon on June 11 to the Sheakley Indoor Practice Facility and Performance Center, culminating a two-year construction process for

the 210,000-square-foot masterpiece that redefines the UC student-athlete experience.

- The transformative project was made possible through the extraordinary generosity of Larry and Rhonda Sheakley.
- A full-length football field, weight room, cutting-edge sports medicine and athletic training wing and performance nutrition fueling station highlights the amenities of the practice field.
- The 96,000-square foot performance center features three levels that include offices for the football program, an athletics-only dining hall and multiple recovery spaces.

TRIO NAMED AMONG BEST AT THEIR POSITIONS FOR 2026 NFL DRAFT

- The Athletic's Dane Brugler has been ranking college football prospects by position ahead of the 2026 NFL Draft, and three Bearcats appear on his list for their respective positions:
 - TE Joe Royer - 3rd
 - DT Dontay Corleone - 9th
 - LB Jake Golday - 11th

CALDWELL, CORLEONE, GOLDAY NAMED TO "FREAKS" LIST

- Three of UC's most impressive physical talents were recognized by The Athletic's Bruce Feldman on his annual "Freaks List". Dontay Corleone (No. 14), wide receiver Jeff Caldwell (No. 29), and linebacker Jake Golday (No. 48).
- Cincinnati, Alabama, Iowa, and Penn State were the only teams with at least three ranked inside the Top 50.
- An honorable mention All-Big 12 honoree a season ago, Golday's 4.24 shuttle time and 1.54 10-yard shuttle were among the numbers Feldman cited regarding the linebacker's spot on the list. Golday was PFF's third-highest-graded linebacker in the Big 12 last season.
- This is the third time Corleone has earned a spot on the list and he is the highest-ranked Big 12 player. Feldman praised "The Godfather" for his combination of strength and agility, noting that Corleone bench presses 485 pounds and squats 615 pounds while still posting a 1.71 10-yard split time, which would have ranked among the defensive tackle leaders at this year's NFL Combine.
- Caldwell, who will be making his Bearcats' debut this fall after transferring from Lindenwood, is a big target (6-4, 208) and former FCS All-American. His 11-9 broad jump figure would have tied for the farthest jump any wide receiver ever logged at the NFL Combine, and he boasts a 36.5 vertical jump as well.

O CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN (3 TIMES)

- Center Gavin Gerhardt and defensive tackle Dontay Corleone are in truly elite company as the third and fourth Bearcats all-time to be three-time team captains.
- The last one with the honor was linebacker Howie Kurnick (1976-78), who later played for the Bengals.
- The one before that? Arch Carson, considered the "Founder of UC football." He was the principle organizer of the school's first teams in the 1880s, whose devotion to football and sports continued during his long administrative career at UC.
- Nippert Stadium's playing surface continues to bear his name based on his role in developing the facility. TQL, which became a field sponsor in 2023, declined naming rights out of respect for tradition.

2021 CFP TEAMMATES REMAIN AT UC

- While the playoff may have expanded, Cincinnati can still lay its immortal claim as the first Group of 6 team to break the glass ceiling, especially in its original four-team format.
- Ben Blevins, Dontay Corleone, Jack Dingle, Gavin Gerhardt, Rob Jackson and Brady Lichtenberg were all part of that esteemed group.

TRIO OF NEW ASSISTANT COACHES

- Scott Satterfield brought in three new assistant coaches this offseason to bolster his staff. Below is a brief capsule on each new assistant coach:
 - Adam Braithwaite (Stars): Braithwaite comes to Cincinnati after spending the 2024 season as the defensive coordinator at Samford. He was also the defensive coordinator at Tennessee Tech (2023) and Richmond (2017-19).
 - Eddie Hicks (Cornerbacks): A former UC football graduate assistant in 2013, Hicks returns to Clifton after spending two years at LSU as its lead defensive analyst. Prior to his time in Baton Rouge, he spent one season as the CB coach at Jacksonville State and three years as the cornerbacks coach at Charlotte.

- Luke Paschall (Special Teams): Paschall was the special teams coordinator at his alma mater, Middle Tennessee, in 2024, and produced all-conference performers at long snapper, punter, and punt returner. Before MTSU, he was the special teams coordinator at Louisiana from 2022-23.

NEW FACES IN THE FOLD

- Between incoming freshmen and transfer additions, UC has 39 new scholarship players on its roster this season.
- Included in that list are 21 players who joined the Bearcats via the transfer portal during the offseason:

GET TO KNOW THE BEARCATS

- The University of Cincinnati Department of Athletics competes at the highest level of intercollegiate athletics with the vision to reach Next Level Success for all 18 varsity teams and more than 400-plus student-athletes. The Bearcats have a proud athletics history, winning eight national championships and 118 conference titles. The Cincinnati men's basketball team is among the 15 winningest programs all-time, while the football team became the first non-Power Five program to compete in the College Football Playoff in 2021. Olympic gold medalist volleyball player Jordan Thompson, NBA Hall of Famer Oscar Robertson and Major League Baseball legend Sandy Koufax are among several luminaries who have competed as Bearcats.
- The Bearcats entered a new era as a Power Five School on July 1, 2023 when they officially joined the Big 12 Conference, positioning Cincinnati among the nation's premier athletics programs.
- Off the field, UC student-athletes continue to find success, collectively posting a 3.52 GPA in Spring 2025 with 77% earning spots on the Honor Roll.
- Under the leadership of Director of Athletics John Cunningham, and supported by more than 150 full-time staff members, UC Athletics' mission is to connect our community, enhance our university and impact the lives of student-athletes as they prepare to change the world on and off the field.

AN ELITE PROGRAM BY THE NUMBERS

- UC has positioned itself as one of the most successful programs in the country over the last several years.
- Cincinnati is 63-28 since the start of the 2018 season, which ranks 15th among FBS programs and is the best record among current Big 12 programs during that span.
- Since the start of the 2013 season, UC has won three conference championships while advancing to eight bowl games. Two of its eight bowl trips have been to New Year's Six bowls: 2021 Peach Bowl and the 2021 Cotton Bowl Classic (CFP Semifinal).

- The Bearcats became the first-ever "Group of Five" team to advance to the College Football Playoff in 2021, defeating No. 9 Notre Dame on the road and finishing undefeated in the regular season along the way.
- Cincinnati (2021) was one of just 15 teams to make the College Football Playoff in the four-team era (2014-23) and one of just two current Big 12 teams (TCU, 2022) to make it. UC was the only non-Power Five program to ever earn a CFP berth in the four-team format.

CFP+MF4 APPEARANCE

- Cincinnati, TCU and Arizona State are the only current Big 12 schools to make the CFP.
- Cincinnati became the first non-Power 5 team to make the College Football Playoff after finishing as the nation's only undefeated team in 2021 and has advanced to six Men's Final Fours.

BEARCATS FIND NFL SUCCESS

- UC has seen 18 Bearcats drafted since 2021 — second-most in the Big 12 in that time span. The list includes Ahmad "Sauce" Gardner, who was selected fourth overall by the New York Jets in 2022 and went on to earn All-Pro and NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year honors.
- While Gardner took the NFL by storm as a rookie, Travis and Jason Kelce turned in dominant seasons once again. The brothers, who both starred for the Bearcats more than a decade ago, each earned All-Pro and faced off in Super Bowl LVIII. The Kansas City Chiefs won the league crown and Travis Kelce was joined by fellow Bearcat Bryan Cook, a rookie safety.

TAKE ME TO HIGHER GROUND

- For the past 27 years, UC football has called the Higher Ground Conference and Retreat Center in West Harrison, Ind., its preseason training home.
- The 280-acre facility is located about 30 miles from campus and has served as the Bearcats training camp location since the lead up to the 1999 season.
- Higher Ground has two 100-yard turf practice fields, including a new surface installed in 2017, ample living and meeting spaces and no distractions from football.
- The Bearcats utilized it for the first week of camp this summer before returning to campus, in part because of the new facility.

CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY

- UC won the 2021 and 2020 AAC Championships, its 15th and 16th league titles, for its first two since 2014 and first outright crowns since 2009.
- UC played in its third-straight AAC title game in 2021.
- Each of the last two were played at Nippert Stadium. UC toppled No. 16 Houston in 2021 after defeating No. 23 Tulsa on Cole Smith's game-ending 34-yard field goal. That first game, played on Saturday, Dec. 19 at Nippert Stadium, marked the latest date a game was played in Nippert since a matchup vs. Xavier on Dec. 7, 1918.

CARSON FIELD AT NIPPERT STADIUM

Carson Field at Nippert Stadium has been the venerable home of the University of Cincinnati football team since 1901 and provides a phenomenal home-field environment.

ALL-TIME RECORD AT NIPPERT STADIUM

365-202-13 (.641)

Since James Gamble Nippert Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Nov. 8, 1924.

OUR HISTORIC HOME

- UC has played at the same site since 1901, making Carson Field the second-oldest playing site in the nation for college football - behind only Penn's Franklin Field. In 1915, a brick and concrete structure replaced wooden stands.
- On Nov. 8, 1924, the completed stadium was dedicated as James Gamble Nippert Memorial Stadium with a capacity of 12,000.
- Today, Nippert Stadium holds just over 38,000 seats, features more than 1,000 club-level seats and over 50 suites, and sits as a bowl below the surface at the center of campus. The "Wrigley Field of college football" provides a unique homefield advantage.
- Since the start of 2015, Cincinnati is 50-20 (71.4%) at Nippert Stadium and 94-32 (74.6%) since 2000.

WHAT'S IN A NAME?

- During the season-ending clash with rival Miami (OH) in 1923, Jimmy Nippert sustained a spike wound injury and died a month later from blood poisoning.
- His grandfather, James N. Gamble of Procter and Gamble, provided the funds needed to complete the horseshoe-shaped structure, and the James Gamble Nippert Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Nov. 8, 1924.
- The stadium's founder was Arch Carson, who as captain and principal organizer played a significant role in starting football on the UC campus in 1885. In 1901 as physical director of the

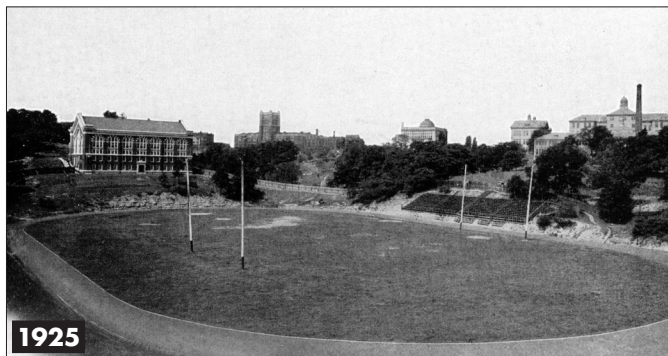
university, Carson guided the construction of the field which was later named for him -- the playing surface is still called Carson Field.

A MODERN CLASSIC

- In 1915, construction was completed on the first sections of a brick and concrete structure to replace the wooden stands and continued for several seasons as funds were raised.
- In 1924, the completed structure was dedicated as James Gamble Nippert Memorial Stadium with a capacity of 12,000.
- UC has used the Nippert site as a playing surface since 1901, making it the second-oldest playing site in the nation for college football behind Penn's Franklin Field (1895).
- UC went from having nearly no premium seating options to the addition of 1,100 scholarship club seats and 53 indoor and outdoor suites of varying sizes. A skywalk connects Tangeman University Center to the West Pavilion with premium area customers able to access the facility on gameday from the other side of campus.

TQL PARTNERSHIP BOLSTERS NIPPERT STADIUM

- Total Quality Logistics (TQL), the second-largest freight brokerage firm in North America and Cincinnati's largest private company, and UC announced in January 2023 a long-term strategic partnership that will include field level and stadium signage and logo assets for TQL as well as specific investment to the Bearcats' indoor practice and performance facility project.
- TQL's logo will appear on Carson Field in two places.
- While field surface branding typically results in renaming the venue, as a Cincinnati company, TQL has chosen to not name the field. It will continue to be named Carson Field in honor of Dr. Arch Carson, who organized the first football team at the university in 1885 and is known as the Father of UC Football.



101 YEARS OF NIPPERT STADIUM

Cincinnati Athletics commemorated the 100-year anniversary of the dedication of Nippert Stadium during the entire 2024 football season, celebrating the life of stadium namesake Jimmy Nippert as the Bearcats' season-long theme. The Nov. 9, 2024 game vs. West Virginia celebrated the 100-year anniversary throughout the game.

Nippert was a center and captain on the 1923 football team when he sustained an injury on Thanksgiving Day against rival Miami (OH). He fell ill with blood poisoning and died on Christmas Day. Nippert's grandfather—James N. Gamble, son of the Procter & Gamble co-founder—donated \$250,000 for the completion of the stadium.

Nippert Stadium was officially dedicated on Nov. 8, 1924 before kickoff of a game against Oberlin. Members of the Nippert family joined UC staff, players from both teams, and representatives from universities in the region in a ceremony at the memorial in the south end of the stadium.

Nippert Stadium stands as the centerpiece of the University of Cincinnati's campus. Through several renovations, the stadium has modernized to feature suite levels and a press box in addition to premium seating. It now seats just under 40,000 fans, but remains in the middle of campus, adjacent to the Tangeman University Center. Nippert Stadium's turf is open to all students for recreation when not in use by the football or lacrosse teams for practices or games.



IT'S HERE: THE SHEAKLEY INDOOR PRACTICE FACILITY & PERFORMANCE CENTER

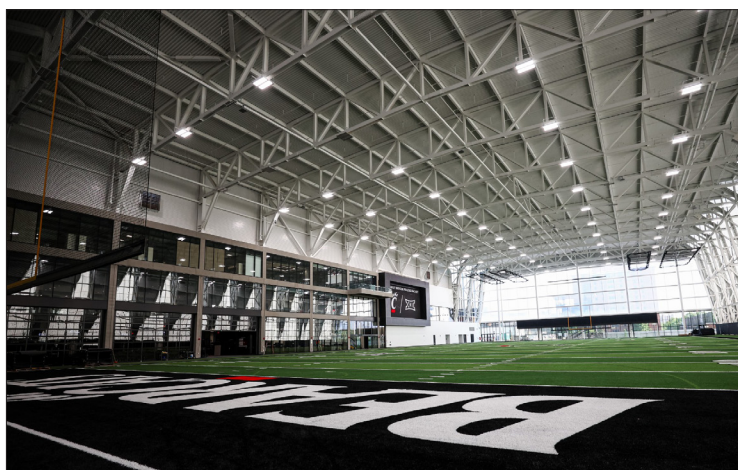

The 84,000 square-foot Indoor Practice Facility features a 120-yard football field equipped for multiple sports. The field provides an all-weather home for Cincinnati football practices and year-round workouts. It is connected to the Performance Center's weight room, cutting edge sports medicine and athletic training wing and performance nutrition fueling stations.

The 96,000 square-foot Performance Center features three levels that will provide nearly everything a student-athlete needs to get competition and practice ready in one place:

- Offices for football program
- Athletics-only dining hall
- Fueling station for football
- Sports performance weight room
- Athletic training room
- Multiple recovery spaces
- Mental health services
- Equipment room
- Creative suite

HEAD COACH SCOTT SATTERFIELD | THIRD SEASON

2018 SUN BELT AND 2019 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR

A two-time conference Coach of the Year, Cincinnati head coach Scott Satterfield enters his third season leading the Bearcats, prepared to elevate the program to new heights in the Big 12.

Hired by Cincinnati Director of Athletics John Cunningham on Dec. 5, 2022 as the 43rd head football coach at Cincinnati, Satterfield has compiled a 91-68 record (.572) in 13 years as a head coach with the Bearcats, Louisville Cardinals and Appalachian State Mountaineers.

He has earned a winning mark in seven seasons in addition to a 4-1 record in bowl games. He led the Mountaineers to three straight conference titles and four bowl appearances from 2013 to 2018 before taking over the Cardinals in 2019.

After a 3-9 debut season in the Big 12, Satterfield led Cincinnati to a 5-7 mark in 2024, showing significant progress. Three Bearcats earned First Team All-Big 12 honors in the highly competitive 16-team league.

A proven offensive strategist, Satterfield calls plays with a balanced approach. In 2024, Cincinnati averaged 420.6 yards per game (36th nationally), with Kiner securing a second straight 1,000-yard rushing season, Kandra earning All-American status the second-straight year, and tight end Joe Royer breaking Travis Kelce's school record for receptions by a tight end (50).

First-year quarterback Brendan Sorsby emerged as a dynamic dual-threat leader, becoming the only FBS quarterback to record a 425-yard passing game and a 125-yard rushing game in the same season. He finished 2024 as one of only four players nationally with at least 2,800 passing yards, 18 passing touchdowns, and nine rushing scores.

Satterfield steered the Bearcats' transition from the American Athletic Conference to the Big 12 in his first season at UC in 2023. Cincinnati's offense had 11 brand new starters for the 2023 season opener, returned only one scholarship wide receiver and featured 23 college transfers. Despite all of the turnover, the Bearcats still finished fifth in the country in rushing (217.1 ypg) and 33rd in total offense (426.1), and running back Corey Kiner authored just the 20th 1,000-yard rushing season in school history.

Additionally, Satterfield's offenses have been among the nation's most balanced, averaging both 200 yards passing and rushing every year from 2019-23.

Prior to coming to UC, Satterfield led Louisville to three bowls in four seasons. He lifted the Cardinals up from a 2-10 campaign in 2018 to an 8-5 record in his first season in 2019.

While at Louisville, he compiled a 25-24 record and saw 32 players collect All-ACC honors. Six Cardinals were selected in the NFL Draft during Satterfield's tenure as well.

In 2022, Satterfield led Louisville to a 7-5 mark and saw 13 players collect all-conference accolades. The Cardinals appeared in the College Football Playoff Rankings and beat two Top-25 teams. Louisville led the nation in total sacks (50), finished third in takeaways (30) and ranked 11th nationally and tops in the ACC in scoring defense (19.2).

The 2021 Louisville squad was led by a potent offense that averaged 31.6 points per game and ranked 21st nationally with 446.2 yards of total offense per game. Cunningham proved to be one of the country's top dual-threat quarterbacks, rushing for 1,031 yards and an ACC-leading 20 touchdowns while passing for 2,940 yards and another 19 scores.

Louisville was also explosive in 2020, leading the nation with nine plays of 60+ yards and six plays of more than 70 yards while ranking fifth in the ACC in total offense (444.2).

In 2019, Satterfield guided Louisville to the biggest turnaround in college football, increasing the Cardinals' win total by six and vaulting UofL to the Top 25 in total offense and rushing in his first year. Individually, Javian Hawkins broke the school record for rushing yards (1,525) by a running back, while wide receiver Tutu Atwell set the Louisville record for receiving yards (1,276) and tied the school mark with 12 TD catches.

Satterfield guided his alma mater to three consecutive Sun Belt Conference Championships and an impressive 51-24 record from 2013 to 2018. The Mountaineers held a 38-10 conference mark over six seasons,



including a 34-6 record over five seasons in the Sun Belt.

Along the way, he became the first coach to lead a school from the FCS level to FBS and immediately earn three consecutive bowl wins. Satterfield directed Appalachian State to three straight conference titles and led the program to four straight bowl appearances.

In 2018, Satterfield led Appalachian State to a 10-2 record and an in-season ranking of No. 25 in the AP poll, capping the season with a 30-19 victory over Louisiana to give the Mountaineers a win in the first-ever Sun Belt Conference Championship Game, securing a third-straight league title.

In 2017, during a 9-4 season that included a 7-1 run through the Sun Belt, the Mountaineers ranked among the Top 20 teams nationally in several categories, including No. 2 in fewest sacks allowed (eight).

The Mountaineers dominated both sides of the ball in 2016, finishing with a 7-1 league mark while allowing just 94 total points in eight Sun Belt games.

The 2015 season saw the Mountaineers finish 11-2—the 11 wins marking the highest total ever by an FBS program in its first season of bowl eligibility. App State completed the transition from the FCS to FBS by ranking among the Sun Belt's top two in 19 statistical categories and defeating Ohio, 31-29, in its first-ever bowl game, the Camellia Bowl in Montgomery, Ala. The 2015 campaign came on the heels of a breakout season in 2014, when Satterfield led the Mountaineers to an impressive 7-5 record in their first full season in the FBS ranks.

Satterfield helped Appalachian State win three consecutive FCS national championships in 2005, 2006 and 2007 as the quarterbacks coach and primary play-caller.

Among his many highlights as an assistant in Boone, N.C., he mentored two-time Walter Payton Player of the Year and FCS All-American Armanti Edwards. He helped lead the Mountaineers to the historic 34-32 upset at No. 5 Michigan to open the 2007 season.

Satterfield started 27 games at quarterback for App State. He collected first-team all-conference honors in 1995 after passing for 1,461 yards and rushing for 649 more to help lead the Mountaineers to the only undefeated, untied regular season (11-0) in school history and a 12-1 final record. He graduated with a degree in physical education in 1996.

He was an assistant coach at App State, beginning as the wide receivers coach in 1998. He moved to running backs from 1999 to 2002. From 2003 to 2008 he coached quarterbacks, including calling plays from 2004 to 2008 and serving as an integral part of the Mountaineers' transition from Power-I to spread offense in 2004.

Satterfield and his wife, Beth, a former track and field athlete athlete at Appalachian State, have a daughter, Alli, and two sons, Bryce and Isaac.

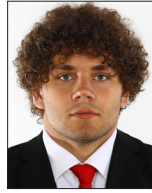

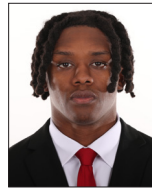

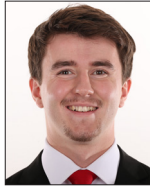
