CINCINNATI — The University of Cincinnati volleyball team closes out its regular season with a pair of road matches in the Grand Canyon State. The Bearcats will face No. 9 Arizona State on Nov. 26 at 9 p.m. ET at Desert Financial Arena, then cap off their regular season campaign against Arizona on Nov. 28 at 5 p.m. ET at Richard Jefferson Gymnasium.

Both contests will be streamed on ESPN+.

Last time out the Bearcats swept No. 21 Colorado on Nov. 21 inside Fifth Third Arena.

Cincinnati has posted solid numbers this season, ranking 32nd nationally in hitting percentage (.259-3 rd) in the Big 12) and 38th in blocks per set (2.53-3 rd) in the Big 12). The Bearcats' balance of defensive presence at the net and offensive efficiency has contributed to their success this season. Cincinnati currently holds the No. 43 spot in the RPI rankings.

MILESTONES REACHED AND UPCOMING

- Cincinnati head coach Danijela Tomić earned her 400th career victory as a head coach as she led the Bearcats to a 3-1 win over Illinois State on Sept. 13. She joined an elite group of 47 Division I coaches who have 400 or more victories. Senior outside hitter Carly Glendinning surpassed 1,000 career kills thanks to a 19 kill outing against No. 19 BYU on Oct. 1. Glendinning also eclipsed 150 career blocks versus Kansas State on Oct. 4. Junior outside hitter Sydney Nolan surpassed 800 career kills after a 23 kill performance vs Texas Tech on Nov. 14

- Graduate Student McKenzie Johnson is closing in on 1500 career digs. She currently sits with 1482, just 18 shy of the landmark.

SERIES HISTORY

- Arizona State leads its all time series with Cincinnati, 4-0 UC and ASU first matched up back on Dec. 6, 2002 in the NCAA Tournament. The Sun Devils narrowly escaped with the win, taking the match 3-2. In the last meeting between both programs, the No. 9 Sun Devil's earned a sweep over the Bearcats 3-0 on Nov.

- 16, 2024.
 ASU handedly held the edge in kills (44-31), hitting percentage (.274—.113) and assists (41-29).
 The Arizona Wildcats won the only meeting between these programs, defeating Cincinnati 3-1 at Fifth Third Arena on Nov. 14, 2024.

- NOLAN SPEARHEADING THE ATTACK
 Junior outside hitter Sydney Nolan currently ranks 13th in the country in kills per set (4.63), 20th in points per set (5.03) and 24th in attacks per set (11.68)
 Nolan ranks among the Big 12's best in multiple statistical categories. She sits third in kills per set and fourth in both attacks per set and points per set.
 Against No. 19 BYU, Nolan dominated as she put together 25 kills while hitting .481 on 52 attempts with no errors.
 Nolan has notched 20 or more kills in nine matches this season.
 She leads the Bearcats' offense in kills with an impressive .313 hitting percentage.
 Nolan earned Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week honors on Sept. 9 after notching 52 total kills against three apponents at the Chattanooga Classic.

SPIES DISHING OUT DIMES

- Sophomore transfer Andi Spies has been a strong force at the net this season, leading the offense. Spies has recorded 40+ assists in seven matches this season.

 Against West Virginia, she dished out a season-best 52 assists on Sept. 27, her first match this season with 50+. Spies' currently ranks seventh in the Big 12 in assists per set (9.37). She has recorded a double-double seven times this season.

Spies' career-high in assists comes from Middle Tennessee, where she notched 55 against Louisiana Tech on Oct. 24, 2024.

GLENDINNING'S TWO-WAY IMPACT

• Senior outside hitter Carly Glendinning has delivered across the board this season, leading the team with nine double-doubles.

Glendinning recorded a season-high 20 kills against No. 14 Kansas.

The Lake St. Louis, Mo., native posted a career-high 19 digs in a 3-1 win over Utah.

She has reached 15 or more kills in 11 matches and logged double-digit digs in 11 contests.

TOP-25 TAKEN IN THREE

OP-25 TAKEN IN THREE
Cincinnati closed its home slate with a statement sweep of No. 21 Colorado on Nov. 21 inside Fifth Third Arena.
The Bearcats hit .409 with 48 kills and six blocks, holding the Buffaloes to a .105 clip.
UC honored seniors Caroline Endres, Carly Glendinning, McKenzie Johnson and Paige Pickering post-match.
Nolan led with 19 kills on .531, Glendinning added 13 (.458), Andi Spies posted a 31-assist, 11-dig double-double, and Brooke Crummel hit .857 with six kills and two blocks.
Cincinnati controlled all three sets, fueled by a 7-0 run in the first, a 9-0 swing in the second, and a pair of key scoring bursts in the third to finish off the sweep.

HEAD COACH DANIJELA TOMIĆ | FIRST SEASON



University of Cincinnati Director of Athletics John Cunningham announced on Dec. 23, 2024 the hire of Danijela Tomić as the Bearcats' head volleyball coach. Tomić will be the 13th head coach in program history.

Tomić comes to UC from Bowling Green, where she served as head coach for 13 seasons. She also spent seven seasons as head coach of Florida International. Her record as an NCAA head coach stands at 394-222 (.640).

Overall, she has guided her teams to five NCAA Tournament appearances and seen her players collect nine All-America honors. Tomić is a six-time conference coach of the year.

In 13 seasons as head coach at BGSU, she led the Falcons to five MAC regular-season titles, three MAC Tournament championships and three NCAA Tournament appearances, including the program's first NCAA Tournament win in 2012. She was named MAC Coach of the Year three times at Bowling Green, most recently winning the honor in 2024.

Under her leadership, the Falcons secured seven 20-win seasons, reached the MAC Tournament Championship match five consecutive years (2019-2023), and set program records for winning streaks and overall performance.

Tomić's teams earned All-MAC recognition in each of her 13 seasons at Bowling Green, including at least one All-MAC First Team honoree in nine consecutive years, and posted five straight seasons with an All-Region member.

In 2024, Tomić led the Falcons to 25 victories, the highest single-season total during her tenure, and guided the team to an NIVC runner-up finish. Bowling Green also captured the MAC regular-season title with a 16-2 conference record, tied for the second-most MAC wins in program history during an 18-match schedule.

Under her guidance, Bowling Green produced two AVCA All-Americans—Lauryn Hovey, an Honorable Mention in 2024, and Petra Indrova, who earned Honorable Mention honors in both 2021 and 2022. She led BGSU to back-to-back MAC regular-season titles in 2017 and 2018 as well as 2020-21 and 2022.

During the 2020-21 season, the program saw an 18-0 start in MAC play, marking the best conference start in both MAC and BGSU Athletics history.

In 2012, she guided the Falcons to a MAC Tournament title and an NCAA appearance in her first season at BGSU.

Prior to her arrival at Bowling Green, Tomić was a three-time Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year at Florida International. In seven years as head coach at FlU, she compiled a record of 158-61 (.721).

A 1999 graduate of Arkansas-Little Rock, Tomić was named Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year in 2006, 2008, and 2009, guiding the Panthers to the NCAA Tournament in each of those last two seasons.

Tomić took over at FIU in 2005 and made an immediate impact as her team improved by 12 wins over the previous season and reached the SBC Tournament as the No. 6 seed after missing out in two of the previous three years before her arrival.

Tomić played at UALR from 1995-97 as an outside hitter, right side hitter, and setter, helping to lead the team to the 1996 NCAA Tournament.

ZHENG XIANG ASSOCIATE COACH/RECRUITING COORDINATOR

FIRST SEASON • INDIANA UNIVERSITY, 2000

- Zheng Xiang (pronounced Chung Shawn) joins the Bearcats after two seasons at Michigan State (2023-24), where he helped lead the Spartans to their best win total since 2019
- Before MSU, he spent nine years at Rice, where he was elevated to associate head coach for his final four seasons. A proven recruiter, Xiang played a key role in assembling top-ranked recruiting classes at both Rice and UTSA.
- At Rice, Xiang played a key role in the program's rise, guiding the Owls to five straight NCAA Tournament appearances (2018-22) and multiple Conference USA titles. Rice posted a 199-69 (.742) record during his tenure, including a No. 19 national ranking in 2022. He also developed numerous All-Americans and All-Region players while serving as the team's defensive coordinator.
- Xiang served as a volunteer assistant coach at Texas A&M for one season (2013) in which the Aggies reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament. He was an assistant coach at Texas at San Antonio for five seasons (2008-12) prior to his year in College Station.
- Originally from Chicago, Xiang earned his bachelor's degree in business from Indiana in 2000 and an MBA in marketing from Texas' McCombs School of Business in 2006. Xiang was a member of Indiana's club team from 1997-2000 and was the squad's captain his final season. He also played two years at Texas, where he earned firstteam All-Southern Intercollegiate Volleyball Association honors in 2006.



ALI COOKE ASSISTANT COACH FIRST SEASON • WINGATE UNIVERSITY, 2014

- Cooke reunites with Tomić after spending the past eight seasons at Bowling Green State University, where she most recently served as associate head
- While there, she helped guide the Falcons to multiple championships, including three MAC regular season titles (2017, 2018, 2024) and two MAC Tournament crowns (2020–21, 2022) that led to NCAA Tournament appearances. The program also made five consecutive MAC Tournament Championship appearances
- (2019-2023), the longest streak in over a decade.

 Before BGSU, Cooke was a volunteer assistant coach at Duke (2015-2017), helping the Blue Devils to back-to-back winning seasons, including a 21-9 finish in 2016.
- As a player, she was a standout setter at Wingate, leading the Bulldogs to three NCAA Elite Eight appearances and earning two AVCA All-American honors. A native of Davidson, N.C., Cooke holds a psychology degree from Wingate and a master's in coaching and athletic administration from Concordia University



SEAN DREXL ASSISTANT COACH FIRST SEASON • UNIVERSITY OF CHARLESTON, 2021

- Drexl joins the Cincinnati volleyball staff after working alongside Coach Tomic as Director of Operations at Bowling Green State University for the past two seasons.
- During his tenure, he contributed to the Falcons' historic 2024 campaign, which saw a 25-10 record, a MAC Championship, and an NIVC Runner-Up finish.
- · Before BGSU, Drexl served as an assistant coach at Presbyterian College and Georgia Southern, where he was involved in scouting, film review, statistical analysis, and match preparation.
- His coaching career began as the U16 head coach for MVP Academy in Florida while he played collegiately as a libero at the University of Charleston. A 2021 All-Conference EIVA Second Team selection, Drexl earned his bachelor's degree in exercise science from Charleston.

REVERSE SWEEP IN LUBBOCK

Cincinnati picked up its sixth Big 12 win with a reverse sweep of Texas Tech on Friday night inside

United Supermarkets Arena.
The Bearcats finished with 52 kills on a .247 hitting percentage and 16 blocks, holding Texas Tech to a .207

percentage and 16 blocks, holding Texas Tech to a .207 clip late.
Nolan led the way with 22 kills on .286, her eighth 20-kill match of the season. Glendinning added her team-leading ninth double-double with 12 kills (,306) and 16 digs.
Tatjana Simeunovic posted a career-high 10 blocks, while Pickering added five to anchor the front line. Cincinnati erased a 2-0 deficit with set wins of 25-23, 25-19 and 15-7, sparked by a late 4-1 run in the third, a pair of key bursts in the fourth, and an 8-2 start in the decisive fifth.

BROOMS OUT IN FIFTH THIRD

Cincinnati earned a victory with a sweep of UCF on Nov. 13 inside Fifth Third Arena.

The Bearcats totaled 42 kills on a .278 hitting percentage and nine blocks while holding the Knights to a .163 clip. Nolan led the attack with 16 kills on a .310 hitting

Notan led the attack with 16 kills on a .310 hitting percentage. Senior Carly Glendinning claimed a double-double with 11 kills and 14 digs. Freshman middle blocker Tatjana Simeunovic anchored the front line with six blocks, while sophomore libero Lilly Gillespie collected 16 digs. Sophomore Setter Andi Spies paced the offense with 35 assists.

Cincinnati claimed the sweep with set wins of 25-21, 25-19 and 25-22. The Bearcats used early scoring bursts in each frame, including a 5-0 run in the first set, a 3-0 spurt to take control in the second, and a 5-1 surge late in the third to close out the match.

SEASON SERIES SWEEP• The Bearcats swept their season series vs West Virgina (2-0) thanks to a four set road victory over the Mountaineers on Oct. 8. Nolan shined on the offensive side, as she recorded

13 digs. Cincinnati also held the upper hand throughout the series, outpacing West Virginia in every major category: kills (115—93), assists (107—85), aces (13—7), and digs (117—89). Over the two-match stretch, Nolan totaled 42 kills on a .375 hitting percentage, while Spies dished out 91 assists (11.38 per set). Sophomore Gretchen Sigman added 25 kills and six service aces across both contests.
