Cincinnati at UAB | Feb. 19-22 | Birmingham, Ala. | Young Memorial Field

CINCINNATI – Coming off the thrill of its 8-0 win at No. 9 Auburn on Tuesday, the University of Cincinnati baseball team is heading to Birmingham for a four-game series at UAB.

Game one on Thursday and game two on Friday are both set for 3:00 p.m. starts, while game three on Saturday and game four on Sunday will both begin at 2:00. All four games at UAB will be broadcast on ESPN+.

Cincinnati is coming off its ninth ranked win of the Jordan Bischel era. It was a 2-0 ballgame entering the top of the eighth before UC scored six over the final two innings to make it 8-0, which held as the final.

Once again, the Bearcats' brand of baseball did some heavy lifting. UC had four stolen bases and three bunt hits, with Jackson Smith accounting for three of those plays himself. He stole two bases, and eventually scored both times, and added a bunt hit as well. Derrick Pitts laid down a bunt single in the ninth inning and redshirt junior Luke Sefcik had a pinch-hit bunt single the previous inning.

The pitching staff had an outstanding night as well. Dillon Schueler made the start and struck out four in his two innings of work. Brendan Garula followed and punched out two in two scoreless frames, then Dominic Mauro tossed two scoreless innings as well. Carson Marsh earned the win by pitching an outstanding seventh and eighth, then redshirt Pineiro finished things off in the ninth.

HISTORY OF UC VS. UAB

The Bearcats and Blazers have faced off 58 times in their history, the bulk of which came when both were members of Conference USA. From 1992-2005 the two teams played every year except for 2002. The last time they met was in 2005 for a three-game series in Birmingham, which UAB won 2-1. One of the most offensively productive games in program history came against UAB in 1993, a 26-8 win that set the school record for most runs scored in a game.

ABOUT UAB

UAB is 2-2 entering play this weekend and is coming off a 15-3 triumph at North Alabama on Tuesday. The Blazers opened their season with an upset victory of their own, winning 9-7 in 10 innings at No. 13 Florida before dropping games two and three. Right-handed pitcher Riley Miller was named American Conference Pitcher of the Week on Monday, pitching the final three innings of the win vs. the Gators.

NEXT UP

UC's home opener is set for Tuesday, Feb. 24 vs. Bowling Green at 4:00 p.m. That will kick off a 10-game homestand that will feature games vs. Austin Peay (Feb. 27-March 1), Western Kentucky (March 3), UC San Diego (March 5-8), and Evansville (March 10).

NOTING AUBURN WIN

The Bearcats captured a huge road win on Tuesday, beating No. 9 Auburn 8-0 at Plainsman Park. The biggest non-conference test for UC turned into one of its most impressive wins in recent memory.

They never trailed, scoring the first run of the game in the top of the first inning, and kept Auburn hitless with runners in scoring position (0-for-9). The Tigers were coming off a 17-run outburst in their last game on Sunday and UC's pitchers held them to just five hits on Tuesday.

Below are a few notes about the win:

- It's the highest-ranked opponent UC has beaten since a 13-12 win vs. No. 5 Louisville in 2021.
- The win is also tied for the highest-ranked opponent Cincinnati has ever defeated on the road, matching an 11-10 win at No. 9 Houston in 2002.
- The win was also Cincinnati's first against an SEC team since a 2-1 victory at No. 25 Tennessee on March 10, 2017.
- The last time UC shut out a ranked opponent was 2018, a 1-0 win vs. No. 24 UConn.
- Cincinnati's win was the first of several upsets in midweek action on Feb. 17. Other unranked teams to win against ranked opponents included: College of Charleston beating No. 6 Coastal Carolina (4-3); UT Arlington beating No. 7 TCU (11-8); and Morehead State beating No. 18 Kentucky (8-6).

NOTING JACKSONVILLE STATE SERIES

Cincinnati opened the 2026 season on the road at Jacksonville State this past weekend, taking the first two games before dropping game three.

- UC has now won its season-opening series in back-to-back seasons after taking two out of three at #11 Duke to open to 2025 season.
- Game one vs. Jax State was a perfect showcase for Cincinnati's brand of baseball. They combined to draw 15 walks and HBP, stole seven bases, and had two bunt base hits.
- UC's 11 runs in the first game were its most on Opening Day since an 11-5 win vs. Ohio State in 2011.
- Jack Natili must have instilled some fear in the Jax State pitching staff, as he drew five walks and was plunked twice over the course of the weekend.

BISCHEL BALL!

Head Coach Jordan Bishel's teams have an easily identifiable style of play: they run the bases well and aggressively, they are expert bunters, they work to make things hard on the opposing pitchers and defenses, and they play with the three E's: Energy, Enthusiasm, and Excitement. The numbers are there to back it up, too.

Bischel Ball has helped Cincinnati start the year 3-1 and has been a big part of each victory. On Opening Day, UC logged seven stolen bases and a pair of bunt hits. In the win at No. 9 Auburn, Cincinnati laid down three bunt hits and stole four bases en route to the 8-0 win.

Few teams in the country utilize the bunt as well as the Bearcats. As a matter of fact, UC led all Power 4 teams in bunt hits last season - by a wide margin:

Cincinnati was 134-for-148 on stolen base attempts last season, ranking first in the Big 12 and second among Power Four programs. Cincinnati's 134 stolen bases were a single-season school

record, besting the previous total of 133 from 2008.

Cincinnati had five true freshmen make their collegiate debuts at Jacksonville State last weekend:

- Enzo Infelise started Friday and Sunday's games at designated hitter. The freshman produced more loud contact than just about anyone in the fall, and he collected his first collegiate hit on Friday, a double.
- Joe DuSell entered Friday's game as a defensive replacement and started in left field on Saturday. He went 1-for-4 with a walk.
- Jackson Reardon started at third base in the finale on Sunday and recorded one of UC's two hits, he also walked and stole a base.
- Connor Blue pitched the seventh and eighth innings on Sunday and struck out three.
- Chad Brown was the first reliever out of the bullpen on Sunday and threw three scoreless frames, striking out five while not allowing a hit.
- In addition, redshirt freshman Ryan Tyranski started on Opening Day in left field and started there on Sunday too.

2025 IN REVIEW

The 2025 season was one of the best in Cincinnati history. UC won 33 games and earned an at-large NCAA Tournament berth, its first tournament trip since 2019 and first at-large berth since 1974. Some highlights and notes from last season:

- The 33 wins gave the program back-to-back 30-win campaigns for the first time since 1999-01, when it reached that benchmark three straight seasons.
- Cincinnati also won six games against ranked opponents, the most in a season in school history.
- After opening the year with a series win at No. 11 Duke, the Bearcats were ranked No. 25 in the D1Baseball Top 25 the following week. It was the first time UC was ever ranked by D1Baseball, and it rose to No. 23 in the next poll.
- Cincinnati's third win against a ranked opponent came on March 25 at home vs. No. 18 Louisville, a 12-2 triumph over the Cardinals.
- The Bearcats' first Big 12 series win came at the end of March, a series sweep of UCF. They would go on to win their next three conference series.
- After spending some time on the NCAA Tournament bubble, Cincinnati went on the road and swept No. 25 Kansas in emphatic fashion, its first sweep of a ranked opponent since at least 2000. UC combined to score 40 runs in the sweep in Lawrence, the most since scoring 40 in a three-game series sweep vs. Georgetown in 2006.
- The Bearcats' NCAA Tournament berth landed them in the Knoxville Regional as the No. 3 seed. They came out and defeated No. 2 seed Wake Forest, 11-6, in the opening game, bashing three home runs in the victory.
- Cincinnati was led by 2025 Big 12 Player of the Year and All-American Kerrington Cross. Cross turned in a remarkable 2025 season, hitting .396 with 12 homers, 50 RBI, 65 runs, 50 walks, and a .647 slugging percentage.

BEARCATS ON THE BIG (12) STAGE

When the University of Cincinnati officially joined the Big 12 Conference on July 1, 2023, the move brought the Bearcats Baseball program into one of the three best leagues in all of college baseball. The numbers say that UC has stood up to the task.

Since the start of the 2024 season, Cincinnati is

fourth in the league with 33 Big 12 wins, trailing only West Virginia (38), Kansas (35), and Oklahoma State (35).

The only three programs with winning conference records the last two seasons are UC, West Virginia, and Oklahoma State.

Compared to the other three teams that joined the league prior to the 2024 season, Cincinnati's 33 wins rank above UCF (23), Houston (19), and BYU (18).

JACK NATILI EARNS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA HONORS FROM PERFECT GAME, NCBWA

Junior catcher Jack Natili earned a pair of Preseason All-America honors from Perfect Game and NCBWA.

Natili is one of three Big 12 position players to earn Preseason All-America honors from both outlets, joining TCU outfielder Sawyer Strosnider and Kansas first baseman Brady Ballinger.

He was also named to the Buster Posey Award Preseason Watch List.

To start the season, Natili is hitting .273 (3-for-11) with eight free bases, having walked six times and two HBP. He has also thrown out both would-be base stealers who have tried to run on him this year.

Natili received second team All-Big 12 honors last year, his first season as a Bearcat, after hitting .338 with nine home runs, 53 RBI, 14 doubles, 36 runs scored, and 13 HBP. He drove in 30 runs during Big 12 play, which ranked second on the team. Natili's .451 on-base percentage ranked sixth in the Big 12 and first among all catchers in the conference. He went on a tear in the month of May, hitting .464 with four homers, 20 RBI, and six doubles while helping Cincinnati reach its first NCAA Tournament since 2019.

Natili was named to the Big 12 All-Tournament Team and earned Player and Newcomer of the Week honors on May 12 last year. He hit .556 (10-for-18) across four games that week with two home runs and nine RBI.

Natili joined the program from Rutgers, where he spent the 2024 season and started 44 games. Coming out of high school, he was the No. 16-ranked prospect in Pennsylvania and the top prep catcher in his class from the state according to Perfect Game.

NATHAN TAYLOR = WORKHORSE

Now in his third season at Cincinnati, junior right-handed pitcher Nathan Taylor has become one of the best starting pitchers in the Big 12.

Taylor was UC's Opening Day starter this season, the first time he's earned that distinction in his college career.

He has been named honorable mention All-Big 12 each of the last two seasons. He started 15 games on the mound last year and recorded 91 strikeouts, which are tied for fifth-most in a season in school history. Taylor became the first UC pitcher with at least 90 K's in a season since 1999, and had eight starts with at least seven strikeouts. He earned the start in Cincinnati's NCAA Tournament win vs. Wake Forest, punching out seven in six innings of work.



TEN GAMES

You may have noticed that social media posts from @GoBearcatsBASE end with #TenGames.

Ten Games is not just a motto, it is something that Head Coach Jordan Bischel and his team live by. Each letter stands for an important aspect of a winning program.

From Bischel: "Most teams have the ability to play .500 baseball, which is 28-28 at our level. To be truly great, you need to win ten games more than that. If we're really good in these eight areas, somewhere along the line we're going to pick up an extra win here and there and give ourselves a chance to win 10 more games."

The eight areas are:

- T** - Being a good **teammate**
- E** - **Energy, Enthusiasm, Excitement**
- N** - What are we doing when **nobody** is looking?
- G** - **Grades**
- A** - **Hitting approach**
- M** - **Make it hard to score**
- E** - **Elevate**
- S** - **Short game**

One of Taylor's biggest starts last year came on May 2 at #25 Kansas. Pitching against preseason Big 12 Pitcher of the Year Dominic Voegele, Taylor struck out seven across eight innings to help lead UC to a win that set the tone for a series sweep and set the stage for the program's at-large NCAA Tournament berth.

Taylor was terrific in his first season in 2024 and was named honorable mention All-Big 12 and earned a spot on the all-freshman team. He made 16 starts and two relief appearances, posting an 8-2 record with 70 strikeouts in 72.2 innings pitched. His eight victories were tied for second in the Big 12 and tied for ninth-most in a season in school history.

CARSON MARSH STEADIES THE BULLPEN

Junior Carson Marsh has been Cincinnati's most-used pitcher the last two seasons, combining to pitch in 48 games over his first two collegiate seasons.

Marsh has been electric this season; in two outings, the junior right-hander has combined to throw 5.0 scoreless frames while allowing just one baserunner and recording five strikeouts. He earned the win in the upset victory at No. 9 Auburn.

Last year, Marsh ranked second on the team with 24 appearances, making nine starts.

Marsh was thrust into a high-leverage bullpen role as a true freshman in 2024 and responded about as well as one could hope for a true freshman. He appeared in 24 games and posted a 4.30 ERA in 44.0 innings of work, striking out 52 while walking 15. The local product made his collegiate debut on Opening Day last season and came up big in one of the most important wins of the season, striking out four in 2.2 scoreless frames against Texas in the Big 12 Tournament.



NOTES

QUINTON COATS, DERRICK PITTS LOOKING TO BUILD OFF STRONG 2025 SEASONS

Sophomores Quinton Coats and Derrick Pitts will figure to be key lineup pieces for Cincinnati in 2026. Their strong finishes to 2025 have set them up to take another step forward this season.

Pitts has started all four games in right field and is hitting .313 with four stolen bases so far. His ninth-inning bunt hit on Tuesday at Auburn helped spark a four-run inning that sealed the win.

Coats has started all four games at first base and has hit cleanup every game too. He hit the first home run of the season for Cincinnati on Saturday at Jax State.

Coats hit a game-tying, pinch hit home run in the bottom of the ninth inning vs. Arizona State on April 13 last year, which proved to be a seminal moment for him. After that game, he made 23 starts and ranked third on the team with a .330 batting average while adding five home runs and 13 RBI.

Pitts took over a starting spot in center field on April 23 last year, and hit three home runs with 16 RBI, 16 runs scored, and played flawless defense in the outfield.

Fittingly, both Coats and Pitts homered in the second inning of Cincinnati's 11-6 win vs. Wake Forest in the NCAA Tournament last year.

CONLAN DANIEL COMES BACK HOME

One of the prizes out of the transfer portal for Cincinnati was outfielder Conlan Daniel.

Daniel has started all four games in center field and started his Bearcat career off with a bang. He had a triple on Opening Day and stole two bases in game two at Jax State, eventually scoring both times he was on base.

A sophomore outfielder, Daniel played in 36 games for Wright State last season, hitting .314 with six home runs, 18 RBI, and 14 stolen bases. He was the starting center fielder in all four of the Raiders' NCAA Tournament games, homering against No. 1 seed Vanderbilt in their first game of the tournament.

A Cincinnati native, Daniel starred at Moeller High School, helping the team win a state championship in 2023. He was high school teammates with current Bearcats Carson Marsh and Charlie Niehaus.

Daniel's father, Cary, played baseball at Cincinnati as well (1996-97) and is currently the head coach of Indian Hill High School.

SEFCIK BROTHERS REUNITE IN CLIFTON

Neither Luke nor Cal Sefcik began their career at Cincinnati, but both of them will enjoy their second season together as Bearcats in 2026.

Cal was one of Cincinnati's best hitters last season, slugging seven home runs while adding 43 RBI, 29 walks, 32 runs scored, and nine doubles. He has been dealing with a lower body injury and should be considered day-to-day.

Luke started his collegiate career at Central Michigan and followed head coach Jordan Bischel to Cincinnati prior to the 2024 season. Cal was a freshman at Indiana in 2024 before transferring to UC in 2025.

Luke and Cal shared a cool moment on Opening Day last year when they hit back-to-back in the Bearcats' order. Luke hit sixth and started at second base, while Cal hit seventh and started at DH.

Kevin Sefcik, father of Cal and Luke, spent seven years in the big leagues, six with the Philadelphia Phillies. Kevin coached Cal and Luke at Marist High School in suburban Chicago as well.

CHARLIE NIEHAUS BLOSSOMING INTO STELLAR SHORTSTOP

After redshirting in 2024, shortstop Charlie Niehaus grabbed the reins of the position last year and served as a steady presence in the Bearcats' lineup.

Niehaus started the first two games of the weekend at shortstop and reached base three times on Opening Day.

Niehaus was rewarded with a spot on the Brooks Wallace Award Watch List last season.

Head coach Jordan Bischel has stated that he thought Niehaus had a terrific fall, and the numbers back it up. The shortstop posted a 26.2% barrel rate this fall, which ranked third on the team.

Niehaus started 48 games at shortstop last season and ranked among the team leaders in batting average, runs scored, and stolen bases. Earlier in the season he had a stretch of 107 total chances at shortstop with just one error.

LOGAN KNIGHT SLIDES INTO WEEKEND ROTATION

Tall right-hander Logan Knight was one of Cincinnati's biggest gets out of the transfer portal, and he earned the win in Saturday's 6-5 victory at Jacksonville State.

In the win, he struck out three across six innings while allowing two runs on five hits.

Knight was a two-time All-Summit League selection at North Dakota State and earned a spot on the league's all-tournament team last year. He started 15 games this past season and pitched two complete games, which led all pitchers in the conference. One of his complete games was a three-hit shutout vs. Oral Roberts in the conference tournament. Off the field, Knight is a two-time CSC Academic All-District honoree.

SWISS ARMY KNIFE CHRISTIAN MITCHELLE CAN DO IT ALL

Senior Christian Michelle is one of the most versatile players on the diamond whenever he takes the field. He has started 46 games last year at five different positions, and he also pitched in nine games. He hit up and down the order, hitting in the three, five, six, seven, eight, and nine spots in 2025.

Mitchelle is hitting .333 (4-for-12) and has not struck out in three games this year.

Mitchelle's versatility has been noticed on a national level as he has been named to the watch list for the John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year

each of the last two seasons.

Mitchelle received second-team All-Big 12 distinctions in 2024 as a two-way threat. He started 42 games (25 at SS, 11 at DH, six at 2B) and pitched in 22 games out of the bullpen. Michelle hit .319 at the dish with four home runs, 22 RBI, 34 runs scored, and nine stolen bases. Out of the bullpen, he led UC with six saves and totaled 39.1 innings of work.

ENZO INFELISE EXPECTED TO MAKE IMPACT

Freshman catcher Enzo Infelise may be behind Preseason All-American Jack Natili on the depth chart, but his explosive bat should give him plenty of opportunities to play this season.

Infelise was terrific at Auburn, going 3-for-5 at the plate with an RBI, and he stole a base as well.

Ranking No. 40 on D1Baseball's Top 150 Impact Freshmen list, Infelise had the team's highest barrel rate in the fall, second-highest hard-hit rate, and three of the top ten exit velocities.

A native of New Lenox, Ill., he helped lead Providence Catholic to a state title in 2024 and was a two-time all-conference performer in high school.

NEW FACES FOR 2026

Nineteen newcomers are on the roster this season, 11 true freshmen and eight additions from the transfer portal.

Cincinnati's freshman are: RHP Chad Brown, RHP Connor Blue, OF Joe Dusell, RHP Alex Gonzalez, C Enzo Infelise, 1B Nolan Jaworowski, RHP Tucker King, OF Luke Kosko, OF Quincy Mazeke, INF Jackson Reardon, and INF Ben Voegele.

The eight transfer additions are: RHP Adam Brouwer (Northern Illinois), OF Conlan Daniel (Wright State), RHP Charlie Dieruf IV (Miami (OH)), LHP Brennan Eager (Louisiana Monroe), RHP Logan Knight (North Dakota State), RHP Dominic Mauro (Northwood), RHP Dillon Schueler (UIC), and INF Jackson Smith (Bradley).

GET TO KNOW THE BEARCATS

The University of Cincinnati Department of Athletics competes at the highest level of intercollegiate athletics with the vision to reach Next Level Success for all 18 varsity teams and more than 450 student-athletes.

The Bearcats have a proud athletics history, winning eight national championships and 118 conference titles. The Cincinnati men's basketball team is among the 15 winningest programs all-time, while the football team became the first non-Power Five program to compete in the College Football Playoff in 2021.

Olympic gold medalist volleyball player Jordan Thompson, NBA Hall of Famer Oscar Robertson and Major League Baseball legend Sandy Koufax are among several luminaries who have competed as Bearcats.

The Bearcats entered a new era as a Power Five School on July 1, 2023 when they officially joined the Big 12 Conference, positioning Cincinnati among the nation's premier athletics programs.

Off the field, UC student-athletes continue to find success, collectively posting a department-record 3.54 GPA in fall 2025 with 897% earning spots on the Honor Roll.

Under the leadership of Director of Athletics John Cunningham, and supported by more than 150 full-time staff members, UC Athletics' mission is to connect our community, enhance our university and impact the lives of student-athletes as they prepare to change the world on and off the field.

BISCHEL INKS CONTRACT EXTENSION THROUGH 2031 SEASON

Following an outstanding season that ended with an at-large NCAA Tournament berth, University of Cincinnati baseball head coach Jordan Bischel announced a contract extension on August 26, 2025.

“Extending Coach Bischel’s contract was a top priority for our department,” Director of Athletics John Cunningham said. “We believe we have the ideal leader for Cincinnati Baseball. The culture Jordan has established and the buy-in from his student-athletes has been remarkable, and the energy around the program these past two years has been undeniable. With Coach Bischel at the helm, this is only the beginning of what’s ahead for Bearcats Baseball.”

“Cincinnati has quickly become home for Katie, myself and our family,” Bischel said. “Along with our coaching staff, I am incredibly excited about the trajectory of our baseball program and athletics department. This agreement is a reflection of a shared vision of President Pinto, John Cunningham and his team, and our baseball staff. I am incredibly grateful and excited to be leading our baseball program for years to come.”

PUTTING IN THE WORK IN THE CLASSROOM

Not only have the Bearcats been getting it done on the field, they’ve gotten it done in the classroom as well. UC received its 10th straight ABCA Team Academic Excellence Award last summer.

Even better, last semester the baseball program posted a cumulative 3.5768 GPA, the highest semester GPA in program history. Thirty-six players earned a spot on the Honor Roll with a GPA of 3.0 or higher, 28 made the Dean’s List at 3.5 or higher, and four earned a perfect 4.0 semester GPA.

In addition, Jack Natili, Joel Pineiro, Brandon Scheurer, and Carson Marsh all earned CSC Academic All-District honors last summer.

2026 SCHEDULE

The Bearcats’ schedule is highlighted by 27 home games at UC Baseball Stadium and 18 games against programs that made the NCAA Tournament last year.

This year’s home Big 12 opponents include Utah, Kansas, Baylor, West Virginia, and Texas Tech. Cincinnati visits BYU, Oklahoma State, UCF, Houston, and Kansas State.

UC will battle rival Xavier twice in 2026, once as the away team on March 24 and again on April 14 at UC Baseball Stadium.

Following the regular season, the 2026 Big 12 Baseball Tournament presented by Allstate will be played at Surprise Stadium, the spring training home of the Kansas City Royals and Texas Rangers, located in Surprise, Arizona. The top 12 teams in the regular season standings will compete in the tournament.

KERRINGTON CROSS, LANDYN VIDOUREK PICKED IN 2025 MLB DRAFT

Cincinnati had two players picked in the 2025 MLB Draft in Landyn Vidourek and Kerrington Cross. Vidourek was a third round selection by the Los Angeles Dodgers and Cross was picked by the San Diego Padres in the seventh round.

It marked the first time since 2018 that UC had multiple players selected in the same draft, and just the second time ever that it had two players drafted within the Top 10 rounds. In 2008, former MLB All-Star Josh Harrison went in the sixth round and Dan Osterbrock went in the seventh round.

An electric player, Vidourek earned honorable

mention All-Big 12 honors this season and contributed in all facets of the game. The Hamilton, Ohio native started 51 games and hit .304 with 14 home runs, 43 RBI, 39 stolen bases, 56 runs scored, 10 doubles, and 43 walks. His 39 thefts led the Big 12 and tied for 13th nationally, and were the third-most ever in a season in school history.

Cross put together one of the best seasons ever by a Bearcat in 2025, earning Big 12 Player of the Year honors and four All-America nods, the most since Ian Happ’s six All-America honors in 2015. One of the best third basemen in the country, Cross was a Golden Spikes Award and Dick Howser Trophy semifinalist as well.

COACHING STAFF TIES

Bischel has a long history with assistants Tom Winske and Kyle Schroeder, having spent a lot of time with both of them at different institutions.

Winske and Schroeder were both on staff at CMU with Bischel from 2019-23, helping the Chippewas win four Mid-American Conference championships and earn three NCAA Tournament berths.

Schroeder also coached under Bischel for four years at Northwood University (2015-18) and for two seasons at Midland University (2013-14).

Winske was a successful coach at St. Norbert College in De Pere, Wis. From 1999-2018 and coached Bischel as a player from 2000-03. Bischel also served as an assistant coach under Winske from 2007-09.

WINSKE INDUCTED INTO ST. NORBERT COLLEGE ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME

Assistant coach Tom Winske’s former school, St. Norbert College, inducted him into its athletics hall of fame last fall, a much-deserved honor for the former head coach.

Winske, who coached at St. Norbert from 1999-2018, compiled a career record of 444-287-1 and led the program to five NCAA Division III berths. His 444 career wins were the most in the history of the Midwest Conference at the conclusion of his tenure, and he was named Midwest Conference North Division Coach of the Year nine times. Winske led St. Norbert to conference titles in 2003, 2012, 2014, and 2017.

BEARCATS SIGN HIGHEST-RATED RECRUITING CLASS IN PROGRAM HISTORY

For the second consecutive season, Cincinnati signed its highest-rated recruiting class in program history.

Led by the efforts of assistant coaches Kyle Pettoruto and Tayler Sheriff, UC signed the No. 26-ranked class according to Perfect Game.

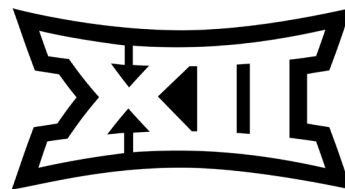

2026 BIG 12 CHAMPIONSHIP MOVING TO SURPRISE STADIUM

IRVING, Texas - The Big 12 Conference has selected Surprise Stadium, the spring training home of the Texas Rangers and Kansas City Royals, as the new host site for the Big 12 Baseball Championship beginning in 2026. Located in Surprise, Arizona, Surprise Stadium was recently ranked #1 in USA Today's Best Spring Training Facility rankings.

"We are excited to continue our partnership with REV Entertainment as the Big 12 Baseball Championship moves to a world-class venue in Arizona," said Big 12 Chief Competition Officer Scott Draper. "Surprise Stadium is a premier facility that will create a great atmosphere and experience for our student-athletes and fans."

The 10,714-seat venue offers lawn seating, air-conditioned suites and other premium seating areas. Surprise Stadium has hosted MLB spring training for two decades as well as the Arizona Fall League and an annual college baseball tournament that will be operated by REV Entertainment in partnership with the City of Surprise beginning in 2026.

The Big 12 Baseball Championship has been hosted at Globe Life Field in Arlington, Texas since 2022 in conjunction with REV Entertainment. The Big 12 will continue its partnership with REV Entertainment for the planning and operation of its baseball championship at Surprise Stadium.

"Bringing the Big 12 Baseball Championship to Surprise Stadium represents an exciting new chapter in our partnership with the Big 12 Conference and the City of Surprise," said Jared Schrom, Senior Vice President of REV Entertainment. "We look forward to creating a new tradition in Arizona starting in 2026."

The 2026 Big 12 Baseball Championship will make its debut at Surprise Stadium with its 12-team field May 20-23.

HEAD COACH JORDAN BISCHEL



**JORDAN BISCHEL • HEAD COACH
THIRD SEASON • ST. NORBERT '03**

The 2026 season will be Jordan Bischel's third as the head coach at the University of Cincinnati. It was announced on August 26, 2025 that Bischel agreed to a contract extension through the 2031 season.

UC ended the 2025 season with a 33-26 overall record and

earned an at-large berth into the NCAA Tournament, the seventh tournament trip in program history and the first at-large berth since 1974. The Bearcats were the No. 3 seed in the Knoxville Regional and won their opening game against No. 2 seed Wake Forest, 11-6.

Cincinnati reached the 30-win plateau for the second straight season, the first time the program had won at least 30 games in consecutive seasons since doing it three straight years from 1999-2001. UC also captured six ranked wins, the most in a season in school history.

Under his watch, Bischel's Bearcats have reclaimed a home field advantage that is hard to ignore. UC is 38-14 at home under Bischel since he took over the program has won eight of 10 Big 12 series at home since the start of the 2024 season.

Bischel's preferred style of play has become a calling card for Cincinnati, which led all Power Four programs in bunt hits and ranked second in stolen bases. UC was one of the most successful teams on the bases, posting a 90.5% success rate on stolen bases (134-for-148). The 134 stolen bases broke the previous single-season school record set in 2008, and the pitching staff tallied 496 strikeouts, breaking the single-season mark from 2019.

Individually, Bischel helped mentor 2025 Big 12 Player of the Year and Golden Spikes Award and Dick Howser Trophy semifinalist Kerrington Cross to one of the best seasons ever by a Bearcat. Cross was one of six players to earn all-conference honors, joining second-team selection Jack Natili, all-freshman team pick Quinton Coats, and honorable mention winners Landyn Vidourek, Kellen O'Connor, and Nathan Taylor.

The 2024 season was Bischel's first at Cincinnati, and he led the Bearcats to a terrific year in their inaugural Big 12 campaign. UC posted a 32-25 overall record and a 17-13 mark in conference play, the program's first 30-win season since 2019. Cincinnati finished the regular season in fifth place in the Big 12 after being picked to finish in last in the preseason coaches poll.

The Bearcats claimed six series wins in conference play including series vs. TCU, West Virginia, and UCF, and also posted an 18-8 record at home.

Bischel helped coach seven All-Big 12 players in 2024, including first-team selection Josh Kross. Christian Mitchell was named to the second team while Nathan Taylor, Lauden Brooks, Kerrington Cross, Josh Hegemann, and Tommy O'Connor were all honorable mention.

In his first year at UC, Bischel successfully implemented his style of play and saw his players buy in as well. The Bearcats were among the national leaders in walks (320, most in school history) and stolen bases (109) and ranked atop the league in HBP (91). Cincinnati's ability to get on base and take extra bases led to an average of 7.4 runs per game, which ranked fourth in the league.

Bischel was announced as the 33rd head coach in program history on June 18, 2023.

The Green Bay, Wis., native came to UC from Central Michigan, where he served as head coach for five seasons. He also spent four seasons as head coach of Northwood, an Division II program in Midland, Mich., and two seasons at the helm of NAIA program Midland University in Fremont, Neb.

He has previously won eight conference championships: four at Central Michigan, four at Northwood.

"Jordan Bischel is the perfect fit to lead the University of Cincinnati baseball program and we are thrilled to welcome he and his family to UC," Cunningham said. "As a head coach, he has won conference championships and consistently guided his teams to the postseason. He's a proven program builder and winner who has found success at every level. He is a leader who will demand the best on and off the field of our student-athletes. We couldn't be happier to have him as our head coach."

Bischel led the Chippewas to four Mid-American Conference (MAC) championships -- two regular season and two tournament -- and three NCAA Regionals. The Chippewas

went 177-80 (.689) during Bischel's tenure.

"I couldn't be happier and more excited to be the head baseball coach at the University of Cincinnati," Bischel said. "I'm honored to be part of this incredible athletic department. I'm looking forward to building this program and contending for championships in the Big 12. I was impressed right away by John Cunningham's overall vision and have always loved everything about this city. It was going to take an incredibly special opportunity for our family to leave Central Michigan. This is that opportunity."

In five seasons as head coach at CMU, Bischel had a 102-32 MAC record and posted three consecutive 40-win full seasons for the first time since 1986-88. Bischel's teams won a combined 132 games in 2019, '21 and '22, marking the winningest three-year stretch in program history.

Bischel's CMU teams went a combined 31-8 against the five other Michigan Division I programs, Michigan State, Eastern Michigan, Western Michigan and Oakland, and Bischel led his Chippewas to 12 victories over opponents from Power 5 conferences.

In 2022, the Chippewas finished 43-19, including 30-7 and in second place in the MAC. They made a remarkable run to the league tournament crown, starting 1-1 and then winning three consecutive elimination games, the final two against host and regular season champion Ball State.

That put the Chippewas in the NCAA Tournament for the third straight season, where they went 1-2 and bowed to No. 13-ranked Florida in the Gators' home stadium in Gainesville.

The Chippewas posted a 42-18 ledger in 2021, capped by a 2-2 finish in the NCAA Regional in South Bend, Ind. The Chippewas were the No. 4 seed in the four-team tournament and posted victories over No. 2 Michigan and No. 3 UConn.

Bischel electrified CMU baseball from the word go in 2019, leading it to its first MAC Tournament championship and its first NCAA Tournament berth since 1995. The 2019 squad posted a 47-14 mark -- an 18-win improvement over the 2018 squad -- and a dramatic 6-5 victory over Miami (Fla.) in an NCAA Regional game in Starkville, Miss. It was CMU's first NCAA Tournament victory since 1988.

The Chippewas earned their first MAC regular season title since 2015, tied the program record for victories in a season (47), and its .770-win percentage was fifth best in the nation.

Prior to his time at CMU, Bischel was the head coach of Northwood from 2014 to 2018. The Timberwolves posted a combined 137-76 record and won two Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) Championships as well as two GLIAC Tournament titles. Over his last two seasons, Northwood won 84 games -- the best two-year stretch prior to Bischel's arrival featured 55 wins (1989-90).

Before Northwood, Bischel coached at Midland University in Fremont, Neb., for two seasons, leading the Warriors to a combined 74-45 record. In his first year at Midland, the

Warriors won 31 games, an 18-victory improvement over the previous year.

Bischel also coached in the Northwoods League for five seasons, four with the Green Bay Bullfrogs and one with the Wisconsin Woodchucks. He also served as the pitching coach for three seasons at Northwest Missouri State and was an assistant coach at John Carroll University in Ohio and at St. Norbert College in Wisconsin.

Bischel was an academic all-conference first baseman and pitcher at St. Norbert from 2000 to 2003. He earned all-conference honors and served as the team captain as a senior.

Bischel and his wife Katie have three sons, twins Luke and Parker, and Chase.

**TAYLER SHERIFF**

ASSISTANT COACH (PITCHING)

Taylor Sheriff is entering his third season at Cincinnati in 2026. He was promoted to serve as the team's pitching coach in August 2024 after spending the previous season as the director of pitching development.

Sheriff mentored a pair of 2025 All-Big 12 pitchers in Nathan Taylor and Kellen O'Connor. Taylor, who earned his second straight all-conference nod, was 7-2 with a 3.93 ERA in 87.0 innings pitched. O'Connor, in his first year with the program, totaled 70.2 innings pitched and logged 60 strikeouts.

UC broke the single-season school record for strikeouts in 2025, racking up 496 K's. Taylor accounted for 91 strikeouts, the first Bearcat pitcher with at least 90 strikeouts in a season since 1999.

During his first season with the Bearcats in 2024, the team posted a 32-25 overall record and a 17-13 mark in conference play, the program's first 30-win season since 2019. UC finished the regular season in fifth place in the Big 12 after being picked to finish in last in the preseason coaches poll.

The Bearcats claimed six series wins in conference play including series vs. TCU, West Virginia, and UCF, and also posted an 18-8 record at home.

Working with the pitching staff, Sheriff helped mentor freshman right-hander Nathan Taylor to an All-Big 12 campaign. Taylor was named to the league's all-freshman team and was an honorable mention all-conference selection.

In addition to Taylor, Sheriff helped two-way player Christian Mitchell to a Second-Team All-Big 12 accolade. Mitchell appeared in 22 games on the mound and totaled six saves, while throwing 39.1 innings for the Bearcats.

Cincinnati also saw its team ERA drop by nearly a full run in 2024 from the previous season, and it posted its lowest single-season ERA since 2019.

Sheriff came to UC from Western Illinois where he served as interim head coach of the baseball program for the 2023 season. He was the pitching coach and recruiting coordinator during the 2022 season, which was his first with the program.

In his first season, the Leathernecks saw an improvement in overall wins, Summit League victories and conference finish. Western Illinois also had improvements in nearly every major statistical category.

Prior to joining Western Illinois, Sheriff spent three years working for the baseball program at Spalding University as a pitching coach and recruiting coordinator. He oversaw three pitchers who were named All-SLIAC in 2019.

In 2017-18, Sheriff contributed as a volunteer assistant coach at Indiana University of Pennsylvania. Prior to that, he worked nearby at Penn State - New Kensington as an assistant coach.

Since 2014, Sheriff has spent his summer days functioning as a general manager and head coach for Paul Carpenter Capital Advisors AAABA Baseball in his home state of Pennsylvania. He started his coaching career in 2015 with United High School in Armagh, Pa.

**KYLE PETTORUTO**

ASSISTANT COACH (INFIELD/RECRUITING)

Kyle Pettoruto is entering his third season with the Bearcats in 2026.

His roles include overseeing the recruiting efforts of the program, instructing infield play, and assisting in all areas of the offense.

In his role as recruiting coordinator, Pettoruto has helped bring top-level talent to Cincinnati. Each of the last two transfer portal classes have ranked in the Top 30 (15th in 2024, 29th in 2025) and the last two recruiting classes have been the highest-ranked ever in school history as well. The class signed in the fall of 2025 was ranked 26th nationally according to Perfect Game. Pettoruto's eye for talent has helped him coach and/or recruit 27 MLB Draft selections in his 12 years as a college coach.

The Bearcats were the top fielding team in the Big 12 in 2025 and one of the best in the country. UC's .979 fielding percentage led the league and ranked 20th in the nation.

Pettoruto coached Jack Natili and Landyn Vidourek to excellent 2025 campaigns. Natili, who transferred to UC prior to the season, was a second team All-Big 12 performer, and Vidourek earned honorable mention all-conference honors. Vidourek was drafted in the third round by the Los Angeles Dodgers in the 2025 MLB Draft.

Pettoruto's helped mentor Big 12 Player of the Year and Golden Spikes Award and Dick Howser Trophy semifinalist and 2025 MLB Draft seventh-round selection Kerrington Cross to one of the best seasons ever by a Bearcat. Freshman Quinton Coats also took over the starting duties at first base midway through the season and earned Big 12 All-Freshman Team honors, and shortstop Charlie Niehaus was named to the Brooks Wallace Award midseason watch list, an award that annually honors the top shortstops in the country.

In total, Pettoruto has coached three Bearcats to MLB Draft selections, with first team all-conference honoree Josh Kross being taken in the sixth round by the St. Louis Cardinals in 2024.

Six UC hitters earned All-Big 12 honors in 2024, including first-team selection Josh Kross. Two-way player Christian Mitchell was named to the second team while Lauden Brooks, Kerrington Cross, Josh Hegemann, and Tommy O'Connor were all honorable mention.

Under his tutelage, UC scored 423 runs in 2024, the highest single-season total since the 2008 campaign. UC averaged 7.4 runs per game, which ranked fourth in the Big 12. The Bearcats were also among the national leaders in walks (320, most in school history) and stolen bases (109) and ranked atop the league in HBP (91).

Pettoruto officially joined the Cincinnati baseball program on July 11, 2023. He came to UC after following a four-year stint as the hitting coach/assistant coach for Rutgers (2020-23).

He helped lead Rutgers to back-to-back top-5 league finishes, rebuilding a program that had not finished better than 10th in its entire Big Ten history prior to his arrival. The Scarlet Knights went 77-38 (.670) overall and 31-17 (.646) in the Big Ten over the 2022 and 2023 seasons.

Eleven players Pettoruto recruited to come to Rutgers went on to be drafted. That includes third-rounder Josh Kuroda (2024), 16th-rounder Nick Cimillo (2022), and 19th-rounder Tony Santa Maria (2024), who he coached while with the program.

Prior to his time at Rutgers, Pettoruto spent six seasons at Bryant and was a part of six straight Northeast Conference regular season championships and two NCAA Tournament appearances.

He played a role in producing 40 All-NEC selections, 46 All-New England selections, six ABCA All-Northeast selections, two NEC and New England Players of the Year, four NEC Rookies of the Year, two New England Rookies of the Year, one Collegiate Baseball Freshman Player of the Year and four Freshman All-Americans in his six seasons at Bryant.

While at Bryant, he coached six players who went on to be MLB Draft selections: Matt Albanese (2016, 7th Round), Ryan Ward (2019 8th Round), Carl Anderson (2014, 19th Round), Tom Gavitt (2014, 19th Round), Jimmy Titus (2019, 22nd Round), and Mickey Gasper (2018, 27th round). Six others that he recruited to come to Bryant went on to be drafted as well.

Prior to Bryant, Pettoruto worked as an assistant coach with the North Shore Navigators in the Futures Collegiate Baseball League in the summer of the 2012. Following the summer, Pettoruto was hired as an assistant coach at Merrimack. He worked with the outfielders and the hitters, helping the Warriors set a school record for wins in the spring of 2013.

Pettoruto was a four-year letterwinner at the University of New Haven and helped the Chargers earn a spot in the 2010 NCAA Tournament.

**TOM WISKE**

ASSISTANT COACH (OUTFIELD/BASERUNNING)

The 2026 season will be Tom Winske's third as an assistant coach at Cincinnati. He works with the Bearcat catchers and outfielders as well as overseeing bunting and baserunning.

Under Winske's tutelage, Cincinnati led all Power Four programs in bunt hits and ranked second in stolen bases. UC was one of the most successful teams on the bases, posting a 90.5% success rate on stolen bases (134-for-148). The 134 steals broke the previous single-season school record set in 2008.

Outfielder Landyn Vidourek earned honorable mention All-Big 12 honors and was an incredible 39-for-40 on stolen bases, leading the Big 12 and ranking third among Power Four players in steals.

Catcher Jack Natili had a terrific season as well, earning Second Team All-Big 12 honors and Big 12 All-Tournament Team distinctions. Natili hit .338 with nine home runs, 53 RBI, 14 doubles, and a .451 on-base percentage.

Wiske helped mentor one of the most exciting offenses in the Big 12 in 2024. The Bearcats were among the national leaders in walks (320, most in school history) and stolen bases (109) and ranked atop the league in HBP (91). Cincinnati's ability to get on base and take extra bases led to an average of 7.4 runs per game, which ranked fourth in the league.

His work with outfielder Josh Hegemann led to an honorable mention all-conference accolade for the senior, one of seven Bearcats to earn All-Big 12 honors in 2024.

Wiske was hired as an assistant coach on July 11, 2023, resuming his longtime affiliation with head coach Jordan Bischel when the latter was named to lead the Cincinnati baseball program.

Wiske came to Cincinnati from Central Michigan, where he served as a volunteer assistant coach from 2019 to 2023. He combined with Bischel to lead the Chippewas to four Mid-American Conference (MAC) championships -- two regular season and two tournament -- and three NCAA Tournament berths.

With Winske on the coaching staff, the Chippewas compiled an 102-32 MAC record and posted three consecutive 40-win full seasons for the first time since 1986-88. They won a combined 132 games in 2019, '21 and '22, marking the winningest three-year stretch in program history.

Wiske came to CMU after a highly successful two-decade run as the head coach at NCAA Division III St. Norbert College in De Pere, Wis. He amassed a 444-287-1 career mark from 1999 to 2018 and is the Midwest Conference's all-time leader in both conference and overall wins. In January 2025, he was inducted into the St. Norbert College Athletics Hall of Fame.

Wiske was named the Midwest Conference North Division Coach of the Year nine times in his 20 years at St. Norbert and led the Green Knights to four conference championships and five NCAA Tournament berths. His 2017 team won 30 games, the most victories in a season by any men's athletics team in St. Norbert history.

Bischel, a pitcher, played for Winske at St. Norbert from 2000 to 2003 and served as an assistant under his mentor from 2007-09.

ASSISTANT COACHES

**KYLE SCHROEDER**

DIRECTOR OF PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT

Kyle Schroeder is entering his third season as the director of program development for Cincinnati Baseball in 2026. He joined the Bearcats prior to the 2024 season after a four-year stint as an assistant coach at Central Michigan.

Schroeder is considered one of the top catching instructors in college baseball, having worked with college catchers for over 16 years. In just the last six seasons he has mentored four catchers who are now playing professional baseball, including former Bearcat and 2024 MLB Draft selection Josh Kross.

Schroeder helped mold Jack Natili into a Second Team All-Big 12 performer. Natili hit .338 with nine home runs, 53 RBI, 14 doubles, and a .451 on-base percentage.

During his first season with the Bearcats in 2024, the team posted a 32-25 overall record and a 17-13 mark in conference play, the program's first 30-win season since 2019. UC finished the regular season in fifth place in the Big 12 after being picked to finish in last in the preseason coaches poll.

The Bearcats claimed six series wins in conference play including series vs. TCU, West Virginia, and UCF, and also posted an 18-8 record at home.

Prior to his time at UC, Schroeder played a major role in helping lead CMU to four Mid-American Conference championships -- two regular season and two tournament -- and three NCAA Tournament berths.

He previously served under Bischel for four years at Northwood University, where they combined to lead the program to unprecedented success, capped by back-to-back Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference regular season and tournament championships in 2017 and 2018.

Prior to his four years at Northwood, Schroeder served as an assistant under Bischel at Midland University in 2013-14. Together, they led Midland to a league championship and an appearance in the NAIA National Tournament.

Schroeder began his coaching career as an assistant in 2008 at Luther College, worked as a graduate assistant at Northwest Missouri State and served as an assistant with the Green Bay Bullfrogs of the Northwoods League.

As a player at Luther from 2004 to 2007, Schroeder led the Norse to Iowa Intercollegiate Athletic Conference regular season and tournament championships during his senior year. He was named the 2007 IIAC Most Valuable Player and remains the program leader in several offensive categories, including career home runs (30) and career RBI (172).

Schroeder earned a bachelor's degree from Luther and a master's from Northwest Missouri State.

**CHRIS KREPLINE**

DIRECTOR OF PITCHING DEVELOPMENT

Chris Krepline joined the Cincinnati Baseball coaching staff as the director of pitching development in September 2024. The 2026 season will be his second with the Bearcats.

Krepline helped coach a pair of All-Big 12 pitchers in Nathan Taylor and Kellen O'Connor. Taylor, who earned his second straight all-conference nod, was 7-2 with a 3.93 ERA in 87.0 innings pitched. O'Connor, in his first year with the program, totaled 70.2 innings pitched and logged 60 strikeouts.

UC broke the single-season school record for strikeouts in 2025, racking up 496 K's. Taylor accounted for 91 strikeouts, the first Bearcat pitcher with at least 90 strikeouts in a season since 1999.

Krepline came to Cincinnati following a successful stint as the head coach at Lawrence University. From 2019-24, he earned two Midwest Conference Coach of the Year awards and held Lawrence to two conference titles (2022 and 2024).

In 2024, Krepline's squad posted a 31-11 record, the most wins in a season in school history, and four of his student-athletes earned All-America recognitions. Outfielder Jacob Charon was named the league's player of the year and pitcher Quinn Berglin was named the pitcher of the year.

His 2022 team also won the Midwest Conference and took the conference tournament crown as well, earning the school's first trip to the NCAA Division III Tournament since 1979. He earned D3Baseball and ABCA Region 9 Coach of the Year accolades that season.

Overall, Krepline coached 21 all-conference players, 12 all-region selections, and 6 All Americans during his time at Lawrence.

Krepline, who also had a stint as an assistant coach at Lawrence in 2013 and 2014, was an assistant coach at St. Norbert college from 2015-18. During that time, he coached six All-Midwest Conference and four All-Central Region pitchers. St. Norbert also won three Midwest Conference North Division titles, a Midwest Conference championship and played in the NCAA Division III Regional Tournament.

During the summer Krepline spent his time in the prestigious Northwoods League as the Field Manager for the Green Bay Rockers. In 2023, his team set a franchise record for wins and won its first Northwoods League Championship in its 17-year history.

Krepline is a 2009 graduate of Carthage College, where he earned his bachelor's degree in exercise and sport science. He received a master's degree in applied exercise science from Concordia University-Chicago in 2015.

He was a pitcher at Carthage College, helping lead his team to the NCAA Division III World Series in 2007. A two-sport star, Krepline was also a wide receiver on the football team, winning a CCIW Championship in 2004, and making the National Quarterfinals.

Krepline played professional baseball for two years in the Frontier League.

Krepline and his wife, Bri, have two sons, Boe and Crewe, and a daughter, Sadie.

**TYLER DELLERMAN**

DIRECTOR OF OFFENSIVE SKILL DEVELOPMENT

Tyler Dellerman is entering his third season with Cincinnati in 2026. He serves as the program's offensive skills coordinator. His duties include assisting with baserunning and hitting scouting reports and working with infielders and catchers.

Dellerman's work with Cincinnati's baserunners helped the team swipe a school-record 134 bases, breaking the previous record set in 2008. UC was one of the most successful teams on the bases, posting a 90.5% success rate on stolen bases (134-for-148).

During his first season with the Bearcats in 2024, the team posted a 32-25 overall record and a 17-13 mark in conference play, the program's first 30-win season since 2019. UC finished the regular season in fifth place in the Big 12 after being picked to finish in last in the preseason coaches poll.

The Bearcats claimed six series wins in conference play including series vs. TCU, West Virginia, and UCF, and also posted an 18-8 record at home.

Prior to his arrival at UC, Dellerman starred at the University of Charleston for three seasons. In 153 games he hit .371 and tallied 38 home runs, 167 RBI, 49 doubles, and 157 runs scored while slugging .704. He was named Mountain East Conference Player of the Year in 2023 and was a NCBWA Division II All-American. He also holds the program's single-season RBI record (67), which he set in 2022.

Dellerman played at Urbana University in 2019-20, earning MEC Freshman of the Year honors in 2019. In 57 games spread across two seasons he hit .315 with 10 home runs and 50 RBI.

Dellerman is from Maineville, Ohio and attended St. Xavier High School.
