A WESTERN CAROLINA WIN WOULD:

- Be a historic victory, marking WCU's first-ever victory over a NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision team and the first over a Power Four Conference opponent ... the Catamounts enter Saturday 0-64 against the FBS;
- Be WCU's first-ever over a Big 12 opponent;
- Even the all-time series between the Catamounts and Bearcats at one win apiece after Cincinnati won the first meeting, 7-3, back in 2005;

A WESTERN CAROLINA LOSS WOULD:

- Relegate the Catamounts to a 1-2 seasonal record, marred in a two-game losing skid;
- Stretch WCU's winless mark against NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FBS) teams to 65-straight, relegating the Catamounts to 0-65 against the FBS;
- Drop WCU 0-3 all-time against teams that are currently playing in the Big 12 Conference (0-2 vs. Cincy; 0-1 vs. Kansas).

CATAMOUNT QUICK SLANTS:

- Western Carolina's 2026 football roster features players from 13 different states and the District of Columbia, with a pair of international students from Ireland and Spain ... A combined 45 of the student-athletes are from Florida and 30 hailing from North Carolina ... Georgia is represented by 18 players and South Caro-

lina has 10 on roster. The others include Illinois (2) and one from Alabama, Louisiana, Michigan, Mississippi, North Dakota, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, and Virginia;

- With the NCAA's new participation models, this year's Catamount roster is predominantly underclassmen, featuring 32 freshmen and 35 sophomores (57%) ... the Catamounts have 25 juniors, eight seniors, and 17 players in their fifth-year of competition;

WCU BY THE NUMBERS:

- 28 wins since 2022 (best 4-year stretch in program history)
- 4 consecutive winning seasons
- 3 straight seven-win campaigns
- 5 consecutive 5,000-yard offensive seasons
- Nearly \$40 million in home facility enhancements
- The Catamount "pro-spread" offense has amassed 5,000 yards of total offense for five straight seasons, rewriting the program record books ... WCU passed for over 4,000 yards in back-to-back seasons, including a program benchmark 4,268 in 2025 ... Since 2021 during the **KERWIN BELL** coaching era in Cullowhee, the Catamounts LEAD the FCS with an average of 485.1 offensive yards per game;

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WCU INTERVIEW POLICY

Western Carolina's Office of Athletics Media Relations will assist media personnel with interview requests of Catamount student-athletes, coaches and administrators. To arrange interviews, please contact **DANIEL HOOKER**, the Associate Athletic Director for Media Relations at least **24 hours in advance**.

Head Coach **KERWIN BELL** will be available for interviews following each practice and following games – **Wednesday's practice is the best media availability**. Other interviews with Coach Bell must be set-up in advance and it is requested that the nature of the interview be submitted to WCU Media Relations in writing at least 24 hours prior.

Student-athletes will be available for interviews after practices through Wednesday. Unless special permission is granted well in advance, **the cut-off time for student-athletes during game weeks will be Noon on Thursday**.

WCU FOOTBALL PRACTICE POLICY

WCU football practices in 2024 are open to the public – though it is respectfully requested that attendees watch from the stands and avoid being on the field. Media members are asked to refrain from contacting student-athletes at their home or residence – and student-athletes' phone numbers will not be released by the Media Relations Office. Out-of-town media may set up phone interviews to be conducted in the Department of Athletics. Coach Bell may be reached weekday mornings, however, it is asked that a specific interview time be scheduled through the Media Relations office.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

The WCU locker room is **CLOSED** postgame. However, following a 10 minute "cooling off" period, head coach Kerwin Bell and requested players will be brought to the media room on the first floor of the Ramsey Center.

The availability of the visiting locker room will be announced in the press box after conferring with the visiting SID. The visiting locker room is located in the back portion of the Jordan-Phillips Field House. A space for interviews will be available outside the locker room or up on the Field House patio, if available.

WORKING CREDENTIALS

Media representatives planning to cover football games at Western Carolina University are asked to request in written form (e-mail) working credentials from WCU's Media Relations Office. Season passes will be issued to those who cover the Catamounts on a permanent basis. Our limited working space in the press box will be assigned by priority to WCU beat writers, beat writers of the opponents, metropolitan media filing for deadline and specialty publications.

Credentials are assigned by zones and will outline designated areas of the stadium the pass will allow the bearer.

If time permits, credentials will be mailed. If not, credentials can be picked up on game day (**two hours prior to kickoff**) at the media will call either with the parking attendant at the St. David's Church Lot or in the Larry & Mary Arbaugh Atrium in the Phillips Football Center. Credentials will be issued only to those attending the game in a working capacity – spouses, dates, children and other nonworkers will not be permitted in the press box.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Credentials for sideline photographers will be issued on a first-come, first-serve basis with agencies covering the participating schools on a regular basis receiving priority. Free-lance photographers may request credentials on a game-by-game basis. All free-lance photographers must submit proofs featuring game or sideline action to the Media Relations Office no later than four days following the game. Each photographer must pick up a photo pass from the press box or media will call prior to the game.

PHOTOGRAPHERS, VIDEOGRAPHERS & OTHER MEDIA PERSONNEL ARE NOT PERMITTED TO STOP OR STAND IN THE TEAM AREAS – PLEASE KEEP MOVING

MEDIA PARKING

Media parking for Western Carolina football home games is available in a designated parking areas – **BY PERMIT ONLY** – in the **ST. DAVID'S CHURCH PARKING LOT** located directly behind the East Side of E.J. Whitmire Stadium on Forest Hills Road. Media wishing to obtain media parking for

a home game in Cullowhee must contact the WCU Office of Athletics Media Relations in advance for more information on credential availability.

Entry to the St. David's Church Parking lot will be managed by a member of the WCU Athletics game day support staff, granting access with St. David's Church Lot passes and through a checklist of those authorized to park in the lot.

PRESS RELEASES/STATISTICS

- ▶ **SHORTENED WEEK AFTER SUNDAY MATINEE:** With last week's weather delay and electrical issues at Barker-Lane Stadium, Western Carolina and Campbell were forced to play on Sunday (Sept. 6) ... It was just the **SECOND TIME** WCU played on a Sunday in program history, falling to 0-1-1 all-time ... WCU tied The Citadel at Williams-Brice Stadium in Columbia, S.C., back in 1989 following the aftermath of Hurricane Hugo;
 - ▶ **SECOND HALF SHUTOUT:** Western Carolina's defense pitched a second-half shutout against Campbell last Sunday, holding the Fighting Camels off the scoreboard and won the turnover battle with a +3 margin;
 - ▶ The Catamount defense recorded three interceptions in a game for the first time since picking off three Furman passes last October ... WCU's defense has four picks on the season after recording 12 all last season;
 - ▶ Two of the interceptions were made by defensive linemen, **CALEB TURNER-ALLEN** and **FERNANDO JEANTY** ... the interceptions by WCU's linemen mark the **first for the Catamounts since 2008** when Gene Singletary intercepted a pass against Georgia Southern, returning the pick 31 yards for a touchdown;
 - ▶ **FAMILIAR FACES:** Though WCU and Cincinnati have only met once back in 2005, there are several familiar ties between the Catamounts and Bearcats entering Saturday:
 - ▶ **ASSISTANT HEAD COACH MARK SPEIR** – Veteran coach returned to Cincy this year under longtime friend Scott Satterfield after spending two seasons back at Appalachian State ... Spent **NINE** seasons as the head coach in Cullowhee, from 2012 through 2020 ... Speir earned 33 wins at WCU, including three, 7-win seasons in 2014, 2015, and 2017 ... **Speir was among 20 finalists for the 2014 Eddie Robinson Award**, given annually to the FCS Coach of the Year;
 - ▶ **ASSISTANT COACH LARRY MURPHY (CB)** – Spent **FOUR** seasons on the Catamount coaching staff from 2021-25 under head coach Kerwin Bell, whom he also worked for at Valdosta State, winning the 2018 NCAA Division II National Championship ... Mentored former Catamount Hasaan Sykes (now at Kentucky) and current Catamount All-SoCon performer, Ken Moore Jr.
 - ▶ **WR ISAIHAH JOHNSON** – second-year Bearcat wide receiver started his collegiate career in Cullowhee in 2024 ... He played in 11 games with 24 catches for 303 yards and was second on the team with five TDs ... Recorded one 100-yard receiving game with six catches for 117 yards and two TDs at Furman;
 - ▶ **WR KALE WOODBURN** – transferred to WCU after two seasons at Cincinnati, playing in just two games ... Has not played for the Catamounts this year.
 - ▶ **SUNDAY SCORING STRUGGLES:** Western Carolina's offense was held to its lowest point total against NCAA FCS competition since the last meeting against Campbell, a 24-16 home loss back in 2024 ... Against like competition, WCU's 19 points were the sixth lowest under head coach Kerwin Bell during his tenure in Cullowhee:
6 pts, at Mercer (2022); 12 pts, at Samford (2022); 16 pts, vs. Campbell (2024); 17 pts, vs. Furman (2023) and at Chattanooga (2021); 19 pts, at Campbell (2026)
 - ▶ **GROUND GAME GROUNDED:** WCU was held to just one rushing yard on Sunday when factoring in the yardage lost on three sacks ... It was by far the fewest rushing yards by a Catamount offense under **KERWIN BELL** – the previous low was just 34 rushing yards at Wake Forest (2025) and 46 against FCS opponent Chattanooga (2021);
 - ▶ WCU only rushed 18 times at Campbell, the fewest under Kerwin Bell, just one less than the 19 attempts against Mercer in 2023 and 19 at NC State in 2024;
 - ▶ WCU's one yard on 18 carries were the lowest since 2014 when WCU was held to -8 yards on the ground on just 13 carries in a road loss at Alabama ... It's the lowest rushing output against the FCS since Georgia Southern limited WCU to -12 yards on just 12 rushes in 2009 when both were still members of the SoCon;
 - ▶ **TROUBLE WITH NUMBERS:** Dating back to 2023, WCU has **dropped its last 11 games as a nationally-ranked NCAA FCS team** ... WCU's last victory when entering a game with a number next to its name came in the "Blue Ridge Border Battle" with ETSU when the No. 17 Catamounts dismantled the Buccaneers, 58-7, at home on Nov. 11, 2023:

NOTES ENTERING SATURDAY'S GAME AT CINCINNATI:

- ▶ **WESTERN CAROLINA VS. CINCINNATI– ALL-TIME SERIES:**
 The Catamounts and Bearcats meet for just the **SECOND TIME** on the football gridiron – and the first time since a close-call, 7-3, decision back in 2005
 - ▶ WCU held Cincinnati to its lowest point production in a home game since 1998, but could not overcome two interceptions and a holding penalty on a touchdown run as the Bearcats held on for a 7-3 victory before 22,637 at Nippert Stadium;
- ▶ **WESTERN CAROLINA VS. THE BIG 12 CONFERENCE:**
 Catamount football has only played **TWO** of the current 16 teams in the Big 12 Conference – with neither of the previous meetings coming with the team carrying the Big XII banner ... WCU lost to Kansas 46-3 back in 1993 with the Jayhawks in the Big Eight Conference ... Cincinnati was a member of the Big East conference when the two teams met back in 2005 ... WCU is 0-2 against teams currently in the Big 12.
- ▶ **WESTERN CAROLINA VS. THE NCAA FOOTBALL BOWL SUBDIVISION:**
 Dating back to 1977 when WCU went NCAA Division I-AA – now the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) – the Catamounts are 0-64 against teams playing up a level in the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS);
 - ▶ WCU's closest two games against the FBS came at Cincinnati in 2005 – a narrow, 7-3 defeat – and a close call at South Florida in 2014, falling 36-31, after leading 14-3 in the first quarter and carrying a 17-16 lead into halftime – WCU's only FBS halftime lead;
 - ▶ WCU has managed to take leads over FBS competition a handful of times over the years – most recently, WCU carried a 21-17 lead into the fourth quarter in Raleigh in 2024 ... Under Bell, WCU also led twice – 7-0 and 14-7 – at Georgia Tech in 2022;
 - ▶ WCU has scored a program-best 31 points against NCAA FBS foes twice in recent years – at USF in 2014 (L, 36-31) and in 2016 at SEC-foe South Carolina (L, 44-31) in the season finale ... WCU also posted 31 points at Florida State in 1981;
 - ▶ **DID YOU KNOW:** Western Carolina has the distinction of being the **FIRST-EVER** opponent for **NICK SABAN** at TWO of his collegiate stops ... In 2000, the Catamounts faced the Saban-led LSU Tigers on the Bayou ... then in 2007, Saban won his first game with the Alabama Crimson Tide against the Catamounts in Tuscaloosa.

WESTERN CAROLINA – NOTES ENTERING 2026:

- ▶ **TRENDING IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION:** Western Carolina won seven games in 2025 giving the Catamounts three-consecutive seven-win seasons ... WCU posted a final record above .500 for the fourth-straight season ... It was WCU's sixth seven-win season over the past 12 years – and third in three seasons (2014, 2015, 2017, 2023, 2024, 2025);
 - ▶ WCU is riding the momentum of its **fourth-consecutive winning season** – (6-5 in 2023; 7-4 in 2024; 7-5 in 2024; 7-5 in 2025) – matching the program's longest string since 1976-79 (6-4 in 1976; 6-4-1 in 1977; 6-5 in 1978; 6-5 in 1979);
 - ▶ The past four seasons have been the **BEST FOUR-YEAR STRETCH** in Western Carolina football history, as the Catamounts have won **28 games** since 2022, usurping the 24 win stretch from 1976-79.

- **COACHING STAFF CHANGES: NICK REVEIZ** (*pronounced ruh-VASE*), who spent the past three seasons as the defensive coordinator at Charleston Southern, was named to the same position at Western Carolina in late February ... Reveiz is a 13-year collegiate coaching veteran with additional stops at VMI (2022), Albany State, and Carson-Newman;

- The Catamount defense has had **FOUR** different coordinators over the past FIVE seasons – Justin Hinds, 2021; Chaz Scales, 2022-23; Jerry Odom, 2024-25; and **NICK REVEIZ** in 2026;
- WCU held ECU to just 21 points, the **fewest allowed by a WCU defense in a season opener** since holding Mars Hill to 14 points back in 2015 – and the fewest allowed to a NCAA Division I team in an opener since 2002, when the Catamounts held Liberty (then FCS) to just three points;
- WCU's defense held ECU to just seven points in the second half and limited the Colonels to 174 yards of total offense over the final two quarters ... **WCU pitched a second-half shutout at Campbell**;
- Reveiz is among FIVE new full-time assistant coaches on the Catamount staff entering 2026 – **DEFENSE: Malik Chevy** (cornerbacks), **Ty Phillips** (bandits), **Ross Pryor** (linebackers), and **Mike Welch** (defensive line / run-game coordinator) ... **OFFENSE: Parish Metzger** (quarterbacks), who assumed a full-time role ... WCU's offense moved **Corey Headley** (wide receivers) ... **Kerry Webb** (special teams) was elevated to Associate Head Coach;

- **LOOKING BACK:** Western Carolina secured its first season-opening victory since a 52-38 road win over Charleston Southern back in 2022 ... the win over Eastern Kentucky was WCU's first season-opening win at HOME since a 33-26 win over Newberry back in 2018 – and the program's first season-opening home victory over an NCAA Division I team since a 23-3 victory over Liberty (then still in the NCAA FCS) on Aug. 31, 2002;

- **SPINNING 45s:** Western Carolina posted 45 points in its season opener in each of the past two seasons – winning 45-21 in 2026 against ECU and falling to Gardner-Webb last season, 52-45, at home;

- **CATAMOUNTS REMAIN AMONG NATIONAL CONVERSATION:** Catamount football remained in the national conversation despite Sunday's tough road loss at Campbell ... Western Carolina continued to receive votes in **BOTH** the Stats Perform FCS Top 25 media poll and the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Coaches poll.

- Including the preseason rankings, it's the **THIRD STRAIGHT WEEK** the Catamounts have received votes, falling outside of the national Top 25 after debuting at No. 24 in the Stats Perform FCS Top 25 last week;

- **HIT THE GAS WITH WCU'S RECORD-SETTING OFFENSE:** For a fifth-straight season, WCU eclipsed 5,000 yards of total offense – and a fourth-straight year it broke the program record, finishing the year with 5,920 total yards to edge the 2023 team (5,545) by 375 yards and 2024 squad (5,665) by 255 yards ... WCU's offensive average of 472.1 yards per game ranked **THIRD** in the NCAA FCS in 2024 and ranked **SECOND** in the NCAA FCS with a 493.3 yards per game average in 2025;

- **FOUR-SPOT IN SOCON PRESEASON:** Finishing as the runner-up the past two seasons, Western Carolina was picked fourth in the official preseason coaches' poll. After being picked third each of the past two seasons, this year's prediction is the lowest preseason selection for the Catamounts since a fifth-place pick in both the 2022 and 2023 polls.

- **TRIO NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SOCON:** Three Catamounts landed on the 2026 Preseason All-Southern Conference teams released as part of the SoCon Football Media Day festivities at the Hotel Hartness on July 21 ... Preseason All-America selection **KEN MOORE JR.** was named a first-team All-SoCon selection at defensive back, with wide receiver **AJ COLOMBO**, who returns from an injury that sidelined him in 2025, and offensive lineman **ZACH WATSON** earning second-team plaudits;

- **PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA:** Western Carolina fifth-year defensive back **KEN MOORE JR.** was a **THREE-TIME** FCS All-America selection entering 2026, including a first-team nod from FCS Football Central and second-team honors from Stats Perform and Phil Steele;

- ▶ Moore Jr. was a first-team All-SoCon selection in 2025, finishing sixth on the WCU squad with 43 tackles, including 28 solo stops and a career-best 5.5 tackles for loss, including a sack ... He had three interceptions, tied for the third-most in the SoCon, returning a pick 64 yards for a TD in the home win over Furman, earning **SoCon Defensive Player of the Week** honors ... Moore added seven seasonal pass breakups, tied for sixth in the conference;
- ▶ It's the fifth-straight season WCU has landed a player on the Stats Perform Preseason All-America team, joining QBs **Taron Dickens** (2025) and **Cole Gonzales** (2024), transfer linebacker **Antoine Williams** (2023), and **Calvin Jones** (2022) as a kick returner.

▶ **MORE FOR MOORE – NAMED TO BUCK BUCHANAN WATCH LIST:** Ken Moore Jr. was included on the preseason watch list for the **2026 Buck Buchanan Award**, given annually by Stats Perform FCS to the nation's top defensive player ... He is one of 30 defensive players on this year's preseason watch list, which features five previous finalists, including last year's runner-up, Furman DL Joshua Stoneking, and the only other Southern Conference player ... Moore Jr. is the third Catamount to land on the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List, joining defensive back **Marvin Tillman** (2018) and linebacker **Antoine Williams** (2023).

- ▶ **YOU'LL ALWAYS REMEMBER YOUR FIRST** – Catamounts with first career TD on first career catch:
 - ▶ WCU has TWO players on its 2026 roster who scored their FIRST career touchdown on their FIRST collegiate career reception – RB **JOSH PERRY** and WR **TREY WALKER**;
 - ▶ RB **JOSH PERRY** caught his first career touchdown pass on a nine-yard strike from QB Taron Dickens in the second quarter of WCU's home win over Furman in 2025;
 - ▶ WR **TREY WALKER** caught a 25-yard TD pass from QB Bennett Judy late in the 2nd quarter against Gardner-Webb in 2025 ... It was Walker's first reception, first TD catch, and just the second TD pass for Judy on the exchange.

▶ WESTERN CAROLINA FOOTBALL IN SEASON OPENERS:

Western Carolina improved to 19-32 in season openers since joining the SoCon in 1976 – though 26 of those 51 games were against NCAA I-A or now FBS competition ... WCU has only won FOUR of its last 13 season-openers – most coming against South Atlantic Conference members in Mars Hill (2012, 2015) and Newberry (2018) before this year's season-opening win over Eastern Kentucky ... Five of the seven losses have come to NCAA FBS competition;

- ▶ Since 1977, WCU has opened a season at HOME just 17 times, posting a 13-4 record – all four losses were to NCAA FCS opponents with just two of the 13 wins coming in the same division (VMI, 1980; ECU, 2026).

RECAPING WESTERN CAROLINA'S 2025 SEASON:

- ▶ For a third consecutive season, Western Carolina football watched with hope as the NCAA FCS Football Selection Committee unveiled the playoff Field of 24 on Selection Sunday in 2025. The Catamounts had hopes that winning seven of its last nine games after returning its starting quarterback and a second-straight second-place finish in a balanced but cannibalizing Southern Conference would lead to the end of a 42 year hiatus of postseason play. However, like in 2023 and 2024, WCU was left on the outside of the playoff field after the three early-season defeats and a consecutive late-season league losses extended Western Carolina's postseason drought;
- ▶ Western Carolina won seven games in 2025 giving the Catamounts three-consecutive seven-win seasons ... WCU posted a final record above .500 for the fourth-straight season ... It was **WCU's sixth seven-win season over the past 12 years** – and third in three seasons (2014, 2015, 2017, 2023, 2024, 2025);
- ▶ WCU finished in sole possession of second place in the SoCon – one of the nation's Top Five toughest NCAA FCS league – in consecutive seasons in 2024 and 2025 ... the Catamounts scored **a program-best six league victories** at 6-2 in SoCon play in 2024 and 2025 ... the squad's second-place finish was the best for WCU since 1986 when the Catamounts also finished second ... It was WCU's FIFTH runner-up finish since joining the league in 1976;
- ▶ WCU was among the national rankings OR received votes in NINE of the 13 weeks of 2025, carrying a number by its name for four games – twice in the Stats Perform FCS Top 25 and four times in the AFCA Coaches poll ... WCU ranked as high as No. 18 last year;
- ▶ In 2025, the Catamounts eclipsed the 3,000 passing yards mark for just the SIXTH time in program history – and for the **FIFTH consecutive season**, throwing for a **program single-season record 4,268 yards** – WCU's second-consecutive 4K passing total and the most in the NCAA FCS in 2025 ... **WCU LED THE NCAA FCS with 355.7 passing yards per game**, finishing as the NCAA Champion in 2025, its second-straight season ... the Catamounts tossed a program record 48 TD passes, a fifth-straight season with 24-or-more aerial scores;
- ▶ WCU eclipsed the 300 point plateau as a team for a FIFTH-straight season, finishing with a program-record 463 points ... the Catamounts averaged a SoCon-leading 38.6 points per game, SEVENTH in the NCAA FCS;
- ▶ **WESTERN CAROLINA'S 2026 SCHEDULE:** WCU's 2026 schedule features 12 games for a third-consecutive season, equally split between E.J. Whitmire Stadium / Bob Waters Field and six road contests that include four in Southern Conference play ... the Catamounts playing eight-straight league games from the end September through November, interrupted once by the Oct. 17 bye week ... WCU faces a pair of NCAA FCS playoff teams from a season ago and a pair of double-digit win teams, as seven of the 12 opponents finished .500 or better in 2025.
 - ▶ Western Carolina's six road games this fall will span SIX different states – North Carolina (at Campbell), Ohio (at Cincinnati), Tennessee (at ETSU), Georgia (at Mercer), South Carolina (at Furman), and Alabama (at Samford) ... Last year, the Catamounts did not leave the Old North State until Week Six at Wofford, and visited just three states – South Carolina (at Wofford; at The Citadel), Tennessee (at Chattanooga), and Virginia (at VMI).;
 - ▶ With the unbalanced league in 2026, WCU faces all but ONE team in SoCon play, missing its annual scheduled date against VMI ... this year's absence halts a streak of 12 straight seasons of playing, with WCU leading in that stretch 10-2 – but it's not the first break in the series as the Keydets and Catamounts did not play from 2003 through 2013 when the Keydets left the SoCon for the Big South Conference.

'PLAY FAST, SCORE FASTER' – MORE NOTES ON WESTERN CAROLINA'S OFFENSE:

- Under **KERWIN BELL**, the Catamounts have scored 30-or-more points in **37 of the 59 (62.7%)** games and have recorded 40-or-more points a combined 22 times ... Over the past SIX seasons, WCU has amassed 2,025 total points in 58 games (356 in 11 games in 2021; 351 in 11 games in 2022; 413 in 11 games in 2023; 397 in 12 games in 2024; 463 in 12 games in 2025; 64 in 2 games in 2026), averaging **34.6 points per game under Bell**;
- The Catamount offense has amassed 5,000+ yards in each of the five seasons under **KERWIN BELL**, eclipsing the school record each of the past three seasons, including **a program-best 5,920 total yards in 2025** (5,181 in 2021; 5,339 in 2022; 5,545 in 2023; 5,665 in 2024) ... WCU has averaged 5,529.8 yards of total offense each season under the Bell offense – **and an average of 482.8 yards per game over the 59 total games**;
- WCU has recorded 500 or more yards of total offense a combined **30 times** under the Bell offense – averaging 5.8 games per season ... WCU has **NINE** games over 600 yards of offense and 700+ yards **THREE** times, including a school-record 801 yards at Furman (2024), 766 against Presbyterian in 2022, and a high of 733 in 2025:

WHAT IS A CATAMOUNT?

Western Carolina University's unique mascot and nickname for its athletics teams seem to always bring about the same question when WCU plays on the road ... "What is a Catamount?" Webster's Dictionary defines "catamount" as "any of various wild cats, such as a cougar or lynx." Cats of the catamount variety, including the bobcat, roam the southern Appalachian Mountains where Western Carolina University is located.

The nickname evolved from a contest that was held on the Cullowhee campus in 1933. The school was called Western Carolina Teachers College at that time and its teams were known as "the Teachers."

Everyone on campus was invited to participate, and the usual names were suggested — Bears, Indians, Panthers. However, the college wanted an unusual name; a name that few others had and that everyone would not copy.

The contest came down to Mountain Boomers, a small ground squirrel that scampers about the woods and is extremely difficult to catch, and Catamounts. Catamounts was the favorite of Head Football Coach C.C. Poindexter and was the nickname chosen. Poindexter wanted his players to be Catamounts with "fierce spirit, savage attacks, and lightning quick moves."

2026 CATAMOUNT FOOTBALL – SEASON GAME-BY-GAME PREVIEW IN BRIEF

GAME 1		EASTERN KENTUCKY Saturday, Aug. 29 CULLOWHEE W, 45-21	CULLOWHEE – Lex Thomas threw for 320 yards and three touchdowns, including a pair to Josh Perry, and added a fourth-quarter rushing score as Western Carolina rallied for a 45-21 season-opening victory over Eastern Kentucky at E.J. Whitmire Stadium / Bob Waters Field. WCU overcame a 14-10 halftime deficit, outscoring the Colonels 35-7 in the second half to earn its first season opening win since 2022. A crowd of 13,482, the 10th largest in Whitmire Stadium history, was on hand to witness the debut of the stadium's latest facility enhancements.
GAME 2		at Campbell Sunday, Sept. 6 Buies Creek, N.C. L, 28-19	BUIES CREEK, NC – Campbell QB Kamden Sixkiller threw for 330 yards and two touchdowns, Spencer Jones had a career-high 126 yards receiving and a score, and Campbell upset No. 24 Western Carolina 28-19 on Sunday in a game postponed after a power/lighting issue at Barker-Lane Stadium. Lex Thomas was 25-of-44 passing for 326 yards and two touchdowns for Western Carolina. Both of Jai Boyd's catches were for touchdowns. WCU was held to 1-yard rushing – the second fewest allowed in Campbell's program history. WCU was also 2 of 13 on third down.
GAME 3		at Cincinnati Saturday, Sept. 12 Cincinnati, Ohio 7 pm	Western Carolina and Cincinnati meet for just the second time in program history, 21 years after the Catamounts nearly pulled off their first upset victory over an NCAA FBS team. WCU dropped a tight, 7-3, decision at Nippert Stadium in 2005, upended by a pair of interceptions and a holding penalty on a would-be go-ahead TD run by Lamont Reid midway through the fourth quarter. Cincinnati is now in the Big 12 Conference. WCU has faced just one other Big 12 team, falling at Kansas back in 1993. Former Catamount WR Isaiah Johnson plays for the Bearcats.
GAME 4		PRESBYTERIAN Saturday, Sept. 19 CULLOWHEE 2:30 pm	The Catamounts look to 'White Out Whitmire' as the University celebrates its Family Weekend, welcoming the Presbyterian Blue Hose to Cullowhee. WCU holds an all-time 11-9 series lead over PC, and the Catamounts have won 10 of the last 11 head-to-head series meetings dating back to 1970, including all five meetings in Cullowhee. Western Carolina matched a program-record with 77 points scored coming on a Whitmire Stadium record of 766 yards of total offense in a 'White Out' game in 2022. WCU QB coach Parish Metzger tossed his first career TD pass in the win.
GAME 5		at ETSU * Saturday, Sept. 26 Johnson City, Tenn. 3:30 pm	The mountain-rivalry shifts to Johnson City when Western Carolina and ETSU close September in the "Blue Ridge Border Battle." The Bucs maintained possession of the traveling trophy, "the Rock," with last year's 52-35 win in Cullowhee, a week after WCU fell to Mercer in a first-place showdown. The all-time record in the highly-competitive head-to-head series stands tied at 27 wins, 27 losses apiece, with one tie. Five of the last eight series meetings have been decided in one-possession games, including a pair in overtime. WCU has won three-straight SoCon openers.
GAME 6		TENNESSEE TECH * Saturday, Oct. 3 CULLOWHEE 6 pm	October opens with Western Carolina hosting its football alumni weekend – and welcoming new chromatic conference counterpart, Tennessee Tech, in Cullowhee. The SoCon's newest member and the two-time defending OVC–Big South Association champion Golden Eagles visit as the two Purple & Gold squads rekindle a series that has lain dormant since 2000. TTU holds a slim, 7-6-1, edge in the all-time series with this year's meeting marking the eighth in Cullowhee with the home series tied, 3-3-1. Tech has won the last two meetings in 1998 and 2000.
GAME 7		at Mercer * Saturday, Oct. 10 Macon, Ga. 3 pm	The Catamounts look to put the clamps on a 10 game series losing skid when it visits two-time defending SoCon champion, Mercer. After winning the first two meetings in 2014 and 2015, WCU hasn't been able to solve the Bears, trailing 2-10 in the series. Last year in Cullowhee, QB Taron Dickens tied the SoCon single-game record with seven TD passes as the Catamounts rallied from a trio of double-digit second half deficits. However, No. 10/12 Mercer pulled in front in the final 90 seconds and WCU missed a last second FG before the third-largest Cullowhee crowd of 14,513.
GAME 8		CHATTANOOGA * Saturday, Oct. 24 CULLOWHEE 2:30 pm	Coming off the bye week (Oct. 17) for a second-straight season, the Catamounts host Chattanooga on Homecoming 2026. The last four series meetings – each WCU victories – have been decided by an average of four points and 16 total points. In 2022, WCU scored the game-winning TD in the final minute, 32-29. Richard McCollum nailed a walk-off 32-yard FG to cap an instant classic between two ranked teams in WCU's 52-50 win in 2023. Ken Moore in 2024 and Cam'Ron Dabney in 2025 intercepted red-zone passes to preserve wins. WCU is 16-6 after the bye under Kerwin Bell.
GAME 9		at Furman * Saturday, Oct. 31 Greenville, S.C. 2 pm	Western Carolina travels to Greenville, S.C., to face chromatic rival Furman in a Halloween edition of the "Battle for Purple Supremacy" in the Southern Conference. WCU has outscored the Paladins, 104-27 in the last two meetings, scoring 52 points in back-to-back seasons. Cole Gonzales threw for 620 yards as part of 801 yards of total offense in the 52-20 win in 2024. WCU rushed for 302 yards in last year's 52-7 win in Cullowhee. Though WCU has two-straight wins, Furman has won seven of the last nine series meetings. WCU trails in the series, 15-36-2.
GAME 10		WOFFORD * Saturday, Nov. 7 CULLOWHEE 1 pm	November opens with the Wofford Terriers making the short trip up the mountain to face WCU on Heroes and EBCI Day in Cullowhee. The Catamounts have won five-straight in the head-to-head series with Wofford, though the last four meetings have been decided in one-possession games and a combined 16 total points. It's WCU's longest series win streak between the two since Wofford joined the SoCon in 1997. WCU trails in the all-time series, 19-28, with the series standing 12-12 in Cullowhee. WCU downed Wofford, 21-17, without fans post Hurricane Helene in 2024.
GAME 11		at Samford * Saturday, Nov. 14 Birmingham, Ala. 3:30 pm ET / 2:30 pm CT	Western Carolina wraps up the road portion of its regular season with a trip to Birmingham to face Samford in mid-November. The Catamounts are riding their longest series win streak over the Bulldogs with three-straight victories, including an exciting 47-42 road win in 2024 in Birmingham, just the second for WCU and its first since 1969 that halted a 10 game road losing skid against the 'Dogs. Western Carolina has averaged 42.3 points on 538.7 offensive yards per game during its three-game series winning streak, amassing 733 yards (582 pass, 151 rush) last year.
GAME 12		THE CITADEL * Saturday, Nov. 21 CULLOWHEE 1 pm	The Catamounts close the regular-season on Hall of Fame and Senior Day in Cullowhee in the 51st series meeting and 26th overall in Cullowhee. An accomplished player who worked his way from walk-on to All-American to the National Football League, and a 12-year veteran head coach who won a combined four conference championships and the 2018 NCAA Division II National Championship, **KERWIN BELL** was named the 14th head football coach at Western Carolina University on April 27, 2021.

Bell came to Cullowhee having served as the offensive coordinator at the University of South Florida under head coach Charlie Strong in 2019. He had most recently walked off the field as a head coach following the 2018 NCAA Division II national championship, leading the Valdosta State Blazers where he coached for three seasons, twice making playoff appearances.

- Bell enters with **125 career victories**, eclipsing the century mark with the 38-17 home win over VMI in Cullowhee on Oct. 2, 2022;
- Western Carolina posted a second-straight seven win season in 2024 – matching the most for the program since 2017, that included a school-record SIX Southern Conference wins ... His squad finished with five SoCon wins in 2023, matching the most since that same 2017 campaign;
- Bell scored his first victory as Catamount head coach on Oct. 23, 2021 – a 45-31 victory at The Citadel that halted a six-game seasonal slide in his first season in Cullowhee;
- Over a 12-year head coaching career prior to Cullowhee, Bell led the football programs at Valdosta State (2016-18) and Jacksonville University (2007-15). He did this coming on the heels of a 13-year playing career in professional football that included several stops in the NFL and the Canadian Football League;
- Bell served three seasons as the head coach at Valdosta State where he also guided the offense. He led the Blazers to a 27-7 record during his tenure including a school-record 15 straight victories, two Division II playoff appearances, and won both a conference and a national championship in 2018. He was **named the 2018 Don Hansen NCAA Division II Co-Coach of the Year** and the **Gulf South Conference Co-Coach of the Year** after leading VSU to a 14-0 record – the first unbeaten season in program history that included a thrilling 49-47 victory over Ferris State in the D-II National Championship game. Picked fifth in their conference in the preseason and the No. 3 seed entering the playoffs, the Blazers finished No. 1 nationally in the final AFCA Division II poll;
- Bell's 2018 offense led the nation in scoring (52.0 ppg), ranked second in first downs (341), and was fourth in total offense (523.9 ypg), red-zone offense (.901), and pass efficiency (167.37). The Blazers scored 728 points on the year, the most in NCAA Division II history, as they posted 7,334 yards (3,676 rushing/3,658 passing) and 7.9 yards per play on the year;
- Within Bell's system at Valdosta State, QB Rogan Wells finished as the runner-up for the Harlon Hill Trophy, presented to the Division II Player of the Year, and was named both the Region Two and Gulf South Conference Offensive Player of the Year. Wells accounted for 50 touchdowns on the year (including one receiving), led the nation in points responsible for (300), was second in passing touchdowns (38) and points responsible for per game (21.4 ppg), 10th in passing yards (3,075), 12th in passing efficiency (160.6) and 25th in total offense (271.9 ypg). He finished second on the team with 732 yards rushing and led the team with 11 rushing touchdowns;
- Bell led Valdosta State to runner-up conference finishes in his first two years guiding the program and went 8-3 with a playoff appearance in his first season at the helm in 2016 as the Blazers led the nation with 27 interceptions on defense;
- Prior to Valdosta, Bell led Jacksonville University for nine seasons, guiding the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) program to a 66-35 record and **three Pioneer Football League (PFL) championships**. Serving as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach as well as head coach, Bell was named the **2008 PFL Coach of the Year** and was a **finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award** after leading the Dolphins to a 9-4 seasonal record and conference title;
- He also led Jacksonville to a school-best 10-1 record and conference championship in 2010 as the Dolphins led the nation in total (486 ypg) and scoring (42.2 ppg) offense. JU also posted a 9-2 overall mark and won a conference title in 2014.
- Originally from Mayo, Fla., Bell was a quarterback at the University of Florida from 1983-87 where he completed over 57 percent of his 953 pass attempts for 7,585 yards and 56 touchdowns. A former walk-on, Bell concluded his collegiate career as the SEC Player of the Year in 1984 after leading Florida to a 9-1-1 record and a conference championship, and both a first-team All-SEC selection and All-America honorable mention in 1985, a season that saw the Gators earn the programs first-ever No. 1 national ranking in the Associated Press poll. Garnering a second honorable mention All-America honor in 1986, Bell was a 1987 team captain and earned the program's Fergie Ferguson Award.
- Bell was ranked the No. 26 Greatest Gator of all-time from the first 100 years of football at Florida in 2006 by The Gainesville Sun. Bell later served as a graduate assistant for the 1990 season under Steve Spurrier at Florida after earning a degree in psychology in 1987.
- Bell was selected in the seventh round (pick No. 180) of the 1988 NFL Draft by the Miami Dolphins, beginning his 13-year professional career that saw stops with NFL teams in Miami, Atlanta, Tampa Bay, and Indianapolis as well as stops in the Canadian Football League ... Passed for 19,538 yards and 101 touchdowns in nine seasons in the CFL ... Also played in the World League of American Football (WLAFL).

CULLOWHEE – Lex Thomas threw for 320 yards and three touchdowns, including a pair to Josh Perry, and added a fourth-quarter rushing score as Western Carolina rallied for a 45-21 season-opening victory over Eastern Kentucky on Saturday night at E.J. Whitmire Stadium / Bob Waters Field.

The Catamounts rallied from seven-point deficits twice and erased a 14-10 halftime deficit, outscoring the Colonels 35-7 after intermission to secure their first season-opening victory since 2022. A crowd of 13,482 fans, the 10th-largest in E.J. Whitmire Stadium history, was on hand to witness the debut of the stadium's latest facility enhancements, including the new playing surface, new lights, updated videoboard, and premium seating additions.

Thomas, who earned the starting nod out of fall camp, connected on 10 of his first 11 passes on the night on the way to finishing 27-of-35 through the air. Despite the early completion success, the Raleigh, N.C., transfer had just 67 passing yards at the break. He found his rhythm after halftime, completing 11-of-15 passes in the third quarter for 180 yards and three touchdowns on the way to a career-best 320-yard passing performance.

Thomas added a team-best 69 yards rushing with a score, and even recorded a reception and four receiving yards as he collected a batted ball for the completion.

Eight different receivers caught passes with three posting six receptions apiece. Michael Rossin finished with six catches for a team-best 94 yards, while AJ Colombo made his return to the turf, going for 90 yards on six touches. Perry caught six passes, including two touchdowns, finishing with 29 receiving yards while adding 31 yards rushing. Bode Burns finished with four catches for 51 yards.

Behind Thomas on the ground, Marlin Cochran ran five times for 60 yards and rumbled 34 yards for WCU's first touchdown of the season. Anthony Benjamin capped the scoring with a 14-yard sprint in the game's final minute to provide the final tally.

Western Carolina amassed 508 yards of total offense, including 320 through the air and 188 on the ground, while recording 28 first downs.

For Eastern Kentucky (0-1), quarterback Tyler Travers finished 22-for-34 with three touchdown passes and one interception that came on a deflection in his first collegiate start. He targeted receiver Elijah Caldwell 12 times, completing six for a game-high 102 yards and a touchdown, with Jarvis Hayes finishing with 47 yards and a score on five catches.

Joshua Collins led all Catamount defenders with seven total stops, including 1.5 tackles for loss with a QB sack. Ken Moore Jr. and Alant'e Reese were both credited with five stops apiece, with Moore halving a TFL. Transfer defensive lineman Trystan Anderson and Ashenafi both had four tackles in the win, Anderson adding the second of two WCU sacks and Ashenafi recovering a fumble.

Transfer corner Andre Jackson Jr. impressed in his Catamount debut, recording three pass breakups and four tackles. Marseille Taylor collected his first interception in a Catamount uniform.

BUIES CREEK, NC – Western Carolina's defense pitched a second-half shutout Sunday afternoon and intercepted reigning FCS National Offensive Player of the Week Kamden Sixkiller three times, but No. 24 Western Carolina couldn't overcome a slow start, falling 28-19 to Campbell at Barker-Lane Stadium.

Jai Boyd hauled in two touchdown receptions, while Bryan McCollum connected on field goals of 23 and a career-long 40 yards. However, the Catamounts were held to their lowest scoring output against an NCAA FCS opponent since Campbell limited WCU to 16 points in 2024.

The Catamount defense picked off Sixkiller three times, including two interceptions by defensive linemen, but Western Carolina was unable to turn those takeaways into a road victory.

The teams were forced into a rare Sunday contest after weather delays Saturday kept both squads in their locker rooms following pregame warmups. With a night kickoff anticipated, Campbell officials then discovered an electrical issue affecting the stadium lights, forcing the game to be postponed until Sunday morning.

It was just the second Sunday game on record for the Catamounts. Western Carolina previously played on a Sunday in October 1989, when Hurricane Hugo damage in Charleston forced The Citadel's game against WCU to be relocated to Williams-Brice Stadium in Columbia, S.C., where the teams played to a 22-22 tie.

Quarterback Lex Thomas finished 25-of-44 passing for 326 yards and two touchdowns, both to Boyd from 48 and 1 yard out. AJ Colombo led the Catamounts with six receptions for 91 yards, while tight end Bode Burns added five catches for 42 yards. Matthew Keener recorded career highs with four receptions and 53 receiving yards.

Western Carolina struggled to establish the run, managing just one net rushing yard on 18 attempts. Looking to rally late, the Catamounts did not record a rushing attempt in the fourth quarter. WCU was outgained in the road loss, 528-to-327, including a decisive 197-yard edge on the ground, 198 to just one-yard for the Catamounts.

Defensively, Joshua Collins posted a career-high nine tackles, including his second sack of the season. Braylon Jones, who missed much of the season opener due to an early disqualification, finished with eight tackles and a pass breakup. Andre Jackson Jr. also collected a career-best eight tackles while adding a pass breakup, giving him four through two games.

Caleb Turner-Allen secured the first takeaway after Ken Moore Jr. pressured and hit Sixkiller in the backfield, forcing an errant throw. Both Turner-Allen and Moore Jr. also recorded sacks. Jayden Cornelius nearly took his first career interception to the house, returning it 47 yards, while Fernando Jeanty's interception at the 2-yard line halted a potential fourth-quarter scoring drive.

Sixkiller finished 29-of-44 passing for 330 yards, two touchdowns and three interceptions. Spencer Jones caught seven passes for a game-high 126 yards and a score, while Brady Ambrose added three receptions for 52 yards and a touchdown. Stevie Keener totaled six catches for 47 yards for the Camels.
